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### Posts — Vacant

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

**Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

**2. Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

**3. Terms of Engagement.**—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

**4. New Entrant Officers—**

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made

or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

**Note.**—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

**5. Qualifications required.**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

#### Post of Government Engineer & Ship Surveyor

APPLICATIONS are invited for a post of Additional Government Engineer and Ship Surveyor in the Customs Department. Applications, both local and overseas, which should be on printed forms provided by this office, should reach me on or before Friday, the 20th February, 1959. *Note*: Overseas candidates may obtain printed forms of application from the offices of the Ceylon Representatives abroad.

2. The selected candidate will be sent for a course of training in the United Kingdom not exceeding one year. He will be granted free passages from Colombo to the United Kingdom and back in accordance with Government regulations (no outward passage will be allowed if the candidate is already in the United Kingdom). He will also be entitled to the following during the period of study:—

(I) A married officer will receive, either—

(a) (i) Salary with cost of living allowance and special living allowance but no rent allowance; *and*

(ii) a special allowance equal to the scholarship allowance or stipend that the trainee would have received had he been sent under the auspices of the Colombo Plan, less an amount equal to one-third of the amount at (I) (a) (i);

OR

(iii) the salary together with cost of living allowance, special living allowance and a family allowance of Rs. 125 per mensem (or rent allowance in lieu of family allowance if it exceeds the amount of the family allowance), whichever terms are more favourable.

(II) An unmarried officer will receive, either—

(a) (i) The salary together with cost of living allowance and special living allowance but not rent allowance; *and*

(ii) a special allowance equal to the scholarship allowance or stipend that he would have received had he been sent under the auspices of

the Colombo Plan, less two-third of the amount at (II) (a) (i);

OR

(iii) the salary together with cost of living allowance, special living allowance and rent allowance, whichever terms are more favourable.

3. The post carries a salary of Rs. 8,400—480 & 600—Rs. 15,600 per annum with Efficiency Bar before Rs. 11,760 and a two years' halt on Rs. 11,280.

(ii) To be promoted over the Efficiency Bar before Rs. 11,760 per annum, the officer should have obtained the Extra First Class Certificate in Marine Engineering issued by the Ministry of Transport of the United Kingdom.

4. (i) The post is permanent and non-pensionable. It is likely that the post will be declared pensionable shortly. The appointment, in the first instance, will be on trial for a period of three years. If his services are unsatisfactory while he is on trial, he is liable to be discontinued at any time during such period or at the end of it.

(ii) The selected candidate will be required to enter into an agreement and bond with two sureties undertaking, *inter alia*, to serve the Government of Ceylon for a period of at least 5 years of his obtaining the training in United Kingdom. Failure to comply with this requirement will make the trainee and/or the sureties liable to refund all expenses incurred on the training by the Ceylon Government.

(ii) a B.Sc. degree in Engineering of a recognised University plus a first Class Certificate of Competency as a Marine Engineer.

(II) The selected candidate will be required to pass a Medical Examination by a Government Medical Board as to his physical fitness to undergo

a course of study in the United Kingdom and afterwards to serve as a Government Engineer and Ship Surveyor in any part of the Island.

(III) Candidates should have served at sea as Engineer in Foreign-going ships propelled by steam or by heavy oil engines, for at least three years. Experience of heavy oil engines is desirable. Service in home trade ships propelled by steam or heavy oil engines if not less than 66 N.H.P. will be accepted to a limited extent in lieu of service in foreign-going ships (eighteen months service in home trade ships being regarded as equivalent to twelve months service in foreign-going ships), but a candidate must have served for a period of at least two years in foreign-going ships.

2. The selected candidate will be granted a regular Commission in the Ceylon Army in the rank of Lieutenant.

**CEYLON ARMY—OTHER RANK APPOINTMENTS**

VACANCIES exist in the Other Rank appointments in the Regular Force of the Ceylon Army as shown in paragraph 4 below. Applications are invited from persons who possess the undermentioned qualifications.

2. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration;
- (b) is between the ages of 18 and 40 years on February 20, 1959;
- (c) has passed the fifth standard in English, Sinhalese or Tamil;

In addition to the above qualifications, no person shall be enlisted in the Regular Force, unless—

- (d) he has passed a medical test to the satisfaction of the Commander of the Army; and
- (e) he is not less than 5 feet 4 inches in height.

Provided, however, that the Army Commander may, in his discretion, in exceptional cases, enlist persons who are more than 40 years of age or who are less than 5 feet 4 inches in height or who are both more than 40 years of age and less than 5 feet 4 inches in height.

3. An Ex-Serviceman seeking preference for these appointments must, in addition to qualifications mentioned in paragraph 2 above, furnish proof that—

- (i) he has had not less than one year's service in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth including the Ceylon Defence Force;
- (ii) his military conduct has been graded not less than "Very Good" when discharged or released from the Armed Forces.

4. *Special Qualifications required.*—Preference will, however, be given to applicants who, in addition to the qualifications mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs, also possess the "Special Qualifications" as stated against the following appointments:—

7. *Period of Engagement.*—The first engagement is to serve a period of 12 years of which 5 years will be served in a regular unit and the remaining 7 years on the Reserve of the Army, after which a soldier may be discharged. It is possible, however, for a soldier to serve up to the full pensionable period in a regular unit, provided he is recommended by his Commanding Officer.
