### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the
- 3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates to pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers-

- (i) The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

  (ii) "New Entrant Officers" will be required
- to comply with any rules already made

- or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
- (iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.
  - (b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, inter alia, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

- Officers who qualify for (iv) New Entrant entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.
- Note.—The term "New Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.
- required.—Every applicant 5. Qualifications must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

- 6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

- the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

### Fellowships under the W. H. O. for Training as Public Health Nurse Tutors

APPLICATIONS are invited from Public Health Nurses of the Department of Health for the award of fellowships under the World Health Organization for training as Public Health Nursing Tutors for a period of one year in U. K. or U. S. A. or Canada.

- 2. The conditions of eligibility are as follows:—
- (a) should be under 40 years of age on closing date of applications.
- (b) should possess the J. S. C. (English) or its equivalent with either Sinhalese or Tamil as a subject.
- (c) should have on closing date of applications at least three years experience in Public Health Nursing after qualifying as a Public Health Nurse.
- 3. All applicants must be Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" means a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration.
- 4. A high standard of both mental and physical fitness is necessary. The successful candidate will be required to pass a medical examination by a Board of Government Medical Officers as to her mental and physical fitness.
- 5. Candidates will be required to present themselves for an interview at this office at an appointed time and date which will be notified later. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.
  - 6. The selected candidate will be required to—
  - (a) enter into an agreement with the Government of Ceylon undertaking among other things to follow the prescribed courses and complete satisfactorily her course of studies and to serve the Government in the respective speciality for a specified period (which will be determined by Government) after completion of her course of studies;
  - (b) enter into a personal bond undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the total cost of training (i.e. salary, if any, allowances, cost of passages, &c., paid on account of the Fellowship from Ceylon Government funds and/or by the World Health Organisation) in the event of her failure to comply with the terms and conditions in the agreement.
- 7. The award of the Fellowships includes cost of travel to and from country of study, a monthly stipend depending on country of study, cost of internal travel, cost of tuition fees and an allowance of U. S. \$ 50 for books.
- 8. The selected candidate will be granted study leave on full-pay, half-pay and/or no pay as may be decided on by the Treasury taking into consideration the allowance granted by the World Health Organization.
- 9. The proposed training will not entitle the selected candidate for enhanced emoluments or promotion to higher grades.

### CADETSHIPS IN THE CEYLON ARMY

APPLICATIONS are invited for four cadetships in the Ceylon Army. Upon selection the cadets will be sent to the Royal Military Academy at Sandhurst for training.

- 2. After successful completion of the period of training at Sandhurst, cadets will return to Ceylon and will be commissioned as officers in the commencing rank of Second Lieutenant in an arm of the Service of the Army suited to their aptitude as well as the needs of the Army. Officers will be expected to serve in the Army for a minimum period of ten years after commissioning. The prospects and conditions of pay and service for officers of the Army are as published in the Government Gazette and reproduced in the Press.
- 3. Applicants for cadetships must fulfil the following conditions:—
  - (a) Nationality.—Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon;
  - (b) Age.—Candidates must be not less than 19 years and not more than 21 years of age on March 27, 1959;
  - (c) Education.—Candidates should have obtained the Senior School Certificate at the ordinary level of the General Certificate of Education Examination (English medium). Subject to general suitability, preference will be given to candidates who have passed the examination with credits in English, Physics and Mathematics;

- (d) Status.—A candidate must be unmarried.
  No cadet will be permitted to marry
  while at the Royal Military Academy,
  Sandhurst;
- (e) Medical Standard.—A candidate must conform to the required medical standard.
  All candidates selected for final interview by the Selection Board will be medically examined under Ceylon Army arrangements at the time of the interview.
- 4. Application for cadetships should be submitted in writing in the terms of the form given in paragraph 9 below and should be forwarded to Army Headquarters, P. O. Box 553, Colombo, so as to reach there not later than March 27, 1959. The envelope enclosing the application should be marked "APPLICATION FOR ARMY CADETS".
- 5. Applications should be accompanied by two certificates of character, one of which should be from a responsible person of mature age who has known the applicant for the previous one year in private life. The other should be from the principal of the last school attended by the applicant.
- 6. A preliminary selection will be made from amongst applications received from those who fulfil the above conditions, and a final selection will be made after interview of these selected candidates by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Defence. Candidates selected for interview by the Selection Board will be informed in writing of the place, time and date of such interview. The interviews will take place in Colombo. No travelling or other expenses will be paid by the Ceylon Government in this respect. Candidates not selected for interview by the Selection Board will be so informed.
- 7. The following procedure and rules will apply in respect of candidates selected for vacancies:—
  - (a) candidates will be enlisted as Army Cadets on a normal regular engagement for a period of five years with the Colours and seven years with the Reserve;
  - (b) on enlistment, candidates will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed by the Commander of the Army;
  - (c) on successful completion of the training in Ceylon, cadets will be sent at Government expense to the United Kingdom, and be admitted to the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, for a course of training lasting 23 months;
  - (d) during the period of training at Sandhurst, all tuition and maintenance fees will be paid by the Ceylon Government. The status of cadets during this period will be that of other ranks and cadets will be subject to Military Law. Their basic rate of pay while under training in the United Kingdom will be 8 shillings per day at the commencement of their training, and 11 shillings per day on completion of 12 months training. No cost of living allowance is payable. All expenses, such as pocket money, maintenance during compulsory leave periods between terms at Sandhurst, the cost of civilian clothes which may be worn when off duty, &c., will be the responsibility of the parents or guardians of the individual cadet. Such expenses should be about Rs. 2,000 per annum for the period during which

- the cadet is away from Ceylon. Cadets will also be entitled to approximately £1—0s—10d per diem as holiday allowance during compulsory leave periods (i.e. period of non-attachment to a Mess);
- (e) (i) in the event of a cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a commission during his course at Sandhurst, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on the cadet's account. The cadet will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense;
- (ii) if at any time during his course, a cadet is reported by the authorities at Sandhurst to be unsuitable, for reasons of misconduct or for causes within his own control, for the issue of a commission, his parents or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government;
- (f) parents or guardians will be required to sign declarations as shown in paragraph 10 below in respect of sub-paragraphs (b) and (c) above and these should be forwarded with the application. Parents or guardians of selected candidates will be required to enter into a bond substantially in the form of the declaration with the Ceylon Government prior to the appointment of these candidates;
- (g) upon successful completion of the period of training at Sandhurst, cadets will return to Ceylon at the expense of the Ceylon Government. On their appointment to commissions, cadets will be discharged from the Regular Army engagement they entered into as Other Ranks.
