Co-Cabinet Spokesman Mass Media Minister Keheliya Rambukwella said Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa had informed the Cabinet that the Indian High Commissioner to Sri Lanka Gopal Baglay had informed him that the consignment of vaccines will arrive in Sri Lanka tomorrow (28). In view of the longstanding relationship between Sri Lanka and India and the cooperation between two countries in the face of the COVID-19 epidemic over the past year, India has

The Cabinet has approved a proposal made by the Labour Minister to take necessary measures to increase the daily wage of an estate sector employees to Rs.1,000. The estate sector employees are eligible for a daily wage of Rs. 750 including a fixed price allowance of Rs. 50 and another allowance named over-kilo rate if the fixed weight of kilograms exceeds productivity.

Budget proposals presented to the Parliament in November 2020 suggested a daily wage of Rs. 1,000 for estate sector workers.
