With the arrival in Sri Lanka of 500,000 doses of the Oxford/AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine from India last morning, the islandwide vaccination drive will start today itself, the Presidential Secretaria announced. Around 250,000 individuals from the health and Security Forces and Police secres will be the first in line to get the vaccine, as two full doses are needed to complete the vaccination course.



President Gotabaya Rajapaksa accepted the free 500,000 doses of the Oxford AstraZeneca Covishield vaccine that arrived in the country yesterday from Indian High Commissioner Gopal Baglay and handed them over to State Ministers Dr.Sudharshani Fernandopulle and Dr.Channa Jayasumana to begin vaccination from today onwards.
