The 160 years old Columbian printing press, which was badly destroyed by a fire in November 2012, has been restored to working condition with the support of local engineers and a financial donation from Thailand.

Thai Ambassador in Sri Lanka Chulamanee Chartsuwan graced the occasion of opening the renovated press. This UK-made printing press was imported to Sri Lanka in 1860 with a donation by the then Thai King along with a set of valuable books and Buddha statues.
