By-laws relating to ferries

- 1. The following ferries are hereby established across the Mahaweli Ganga:—
- (a) the Elpitiya-Gangewatte ferry, between Morawake and a point on the bank of the Mahaweli Ganga at which the Elpitiya Gamameda Road meets that river;

(b) the Elpitiya-Pussetota ferry, between the aforesaid point on that river bank and Udowita Gannilegedera Watte; and

- (c) the Udowita-Hakirillewele ferry, between the aforesaid Udowita Gannilegedera Watte and Kahatapitiya.
- 2. No person other than a ferryman appointed by the person duly authorized by the Committee to collect the tolls levied at the Elpitiya-Gangewatte ferry, the Elpitiya-Pussetota ferry or the Udowita Hakirillewela ferry, shall carry by boat or other vessel any passenger, goods, vehicles or animal for fee or reward across the Mahaweli Ganga either at or within a distance of half a mile above or below the Elpitiya-Gangewatte ferry, the Elpitiya-Pussetota ferry or the Udowita-Hakirillewela ferry, respectively.

3. The costs of construction and maintenance of each of the ferries referred to in by-law 2 shall

be borne by the Committee.

4. In these by-laws, "Committee" means the Village Committee of the Udapalata Ganga Pahala village area in the Kandy District.
