PART I: SECTION (I)—GENERAL

Price Orders

Food Price Order No. KE 46

RICE AND PADDY

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, read with section 3 (2) of that Act, I, Nagamuttu Pulendiran, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), for Kegalla District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from January 5, 1959, Food Price Order No. KE 35 dated May 27, 1958, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,335 of June 2, 1958;
- (2) (a) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the first Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices per hundredweight nett above which rice shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (b) fix the prices specified in column 3 of the first Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices per hundredweight nett above which paddy shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (3) (a) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices per pound nett above which rice shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (b) fix the prices specified in column 3 of the second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices per pound nett above which paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;

- (4) (a) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

Any sale of any quantity of any rice or paddy for the purpose of resale, or

any sale of rice or paddy in a quantity of one hundredweight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

(b) any sale of any quantity of rice or paddy less than one hundredweight nett for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(c) "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;

(5) direct that no person shall sell rice or paddy which is mixed with any other article;

(6) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has any rice or paddy in his possession or under his control at any place, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area; and

(7) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rice or paddy by wholesale shall, and every person who sells rice or paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the date of sale;

(b) the quantity of rice or paddy sold;

(c) the price paid for the quantity of rice or paddy sold; and

(d) the nature of transaction, i.e., whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
