SUBSIDIARY FOODSTUFFS (MALDIVE FISH)

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Kotuwe Muhandiram Dharmasena Jayanetti, Controller of Prices (Food), do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from February 1, 1959, Food Price Order No. C-275 dated August 11, 1958, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,472 of August 11, 1958, in so far as it relates to the importer's maximum wholesale price, the wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price and the retail dealer's maximum retail price mentioned in columns 2, 3 and 4 respectively of the Schedule thereto of Maldive Fish mentioned in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (ii) fix with effect from February 1, 1959, the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be a wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett, and a retail dealer's maximum retail price per pound nett to a consumer, respectively, above which Maldive Fish shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of Maldive Fish for purpose of re-sale, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of Maldive Fish for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(c) the maximum amount that is payable for any quantity of Maldive Fish which is less than or more than one cwt. nett and sold by wholesale should as usual be calculated proportionately from the maximum wholesale price per cwt. nett specified hereto.

- (iv) direct that within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo no person shall sell Maldive Fish which is adulterated with any other article;
- (v) direct that, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, every trader, who has any Maldive Fish in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for Maldive Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule fixed by this Order;
- (vi) direct that for the purpose of this Order, "pound" or "lb.", shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;
- (vii) direct that within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, every person who sells Maldive Fish by wholesale shall, and every person who sells Maldive Fish by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity of Maldive Fish sold (by weight);
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;

(viii) direct that when Maldive Fish, is sold; the the maximum prices referred to in columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall include the price of the wrapper or the container, if any, in which such Maldive Fish is sold.

PADDY

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Thambiah Sivagnanam, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) for the Administrative District of Hambantota, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from January 5, 1959, the Food Price Order No. H. 24 dated 2nd July, 1958, and published in Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 11,417 of 8th July 1958;
- (ii) fix with effect from January 5, 1959, the prices specified in column 2 of the first Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price for one hundredweight (cwt.) nett above which paddy shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the first Schedule hereto;
- (iii) fix with effect from January 5th, 1959, the prices specified in column 2 of the second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per pound (lb.) nett above which

paddy shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the second Schedule hereto;

(iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

(a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

(b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(c) "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight; and

(d) the maximum amount that is payable for any quantity of paddy which is less than or more than one cwt. nett and sold by wholesale should, as usual, be calculated proportionately from the maximum wholesale price per cwt. nett specified hereto;

(v) direct that no person shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article.

(vi) direct that when any paddy is sold the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which such paddy is sold;

(vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any paddy in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or in that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area; and

(viii) direct that every person who sells paddy by wholesale shall, and any person who sells any paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which shall be set out—

- (a) the date of sale;
- (b) the quantity of paddy sold (by weight);
- (c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
- (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
