THE WAGES BOARDS ORDINANCE, No. 27 OF 1941

Notification

IT is hereby notified under section 27 (3) of the Wages Boards Ordinance, No. 27 of 1941, as amended by Ordinance No. 40 of 1943, that the decisions of the Wages Board for the Engineering Trade, made under section 28 of that Ordinance and specified in the Schedule hereto, have been approved by the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social

The decisions shall come into force on the first day of February, 1959.

- (d) every day of absence due to any occupational disease specified in Schedule III of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 117); and
- (e) every day on which the employer fails to provide work to such learner or apprentice;

but not including the day fixed as a weekly holiday under section 24:

Provided, however, that the aggregate number of days included under clauses (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) men. tioned above shall not exceed 77 in respect of any such year ".
