THE FOOD CONTROL ACT, No. 25 OF 1950 Order No. 114

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (1) (i) of the Food Control Act, No. 25 of 1950, I, Don Philip Rupasinghe Gunawardena, Minister of Agriculture and Food, do by this Order—

- (1) Prohibit the transport or removal without a permit from the Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna District, of any quantity of Red Onions or Bellary Onions except for 7 lb. taken by any person :—
 - (a) by boat or sailing vessel from any point of the sea or lagoon coast around the Jaffna Peninsula ;
 - (b) from the Jaffna Peninsula ;
 - (c) on the Kandy-Jaffna Road between the Elephant Pass Bridge (No. 167/1) and the culvert known as No. 167/2 culvert ;
 - (d) on the Navatkuli-Kerativu Road between the culvert known as No. 10/1 culvert and the end of the road on the Kerativu side.

“Jaffna Peninsula” for the purpose of this Order means the revenue district of Jaffna exclusive of Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Punakari and the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Karachchi-Thunukkai.

- (2) Revoke my Order No. 95 published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,527 of 19th September, 1958.

Price Orders

Food Price Order No. MT/2/59

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, NO. 29 OF 1950 ORDER

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Hettige Don Tudor Bodidasa, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Matara District do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from March 9, 1959, the Food Price Order No. MT. 25 dated May 31, 1958, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,345 of June 6, 1958.
- (ii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the first schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices per hundred-weight nett above which rice shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in corresponding entries in column 1 of the same schedule with effect from March 9, 1959.

- (iii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the second schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices per pound nett above which rice shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in corresponding entries in column 1 of the same schedule with effect from March 9, 1959.
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any rice for the purpose of resale or any sale of rice in a quantity of one hundred-weight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any rice less than one hundred-weight nett for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.
- (v) direct that no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article.
- (vi) direct that when any rice is sold the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which such rice is sold.
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader who has any rice in his possession or under his control at any place shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area.
- (viii) direct that for the purpose of this Order “pound” shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight and
- (ix) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any rice by wholesale shall and every person who sells rice by retail shall on demand give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale.
 - (b) the quantity of rice sold.
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity or rice sold and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, i.e., whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
