THE AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950.

2. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services has, by virtue of the powers vested in him under section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, referred to me for settlement, sitting as an Industrial Court, this dispute arising over the non-employment of Mr. R. E. L. de Fonseka by the Times of Ceylon Limited, Colombo.

3. Mr. de Fonseka was a member of the Times Sevaka Sangamaya, and was employed as the Manager of the Garage belonging to the Times of Ceylon Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") as from the 13th of February, 1957. He was promoted to be in sole charge of the garage of the Company and directly responsible to the Managing Director of the Company as from 1st April, 1958.

4. Mr. de Fonseka went on a week's leave as from 9th of July, 1958, and when he returned from this leave or soon thereafter, certain charges were framed against him at the instance of Mr. L. E. J. Fernando who has been referred to as the Managing Director of the Company. A copy of these charges dated 22nd August, 1958, and sent under registered cover to Mr. de Fonseka has been produced and marked P. 3. This charge sheet, P. 3, consisted of three items:—

The first is gross neglect of duty or inefficiency in that Mr. de Fonseka as Garage Manager did fail to attend to certain matters or to see that they were attended to in his capacity as Garage Manager.

The second charge was neglect of duty and discreditable conduct in that he played cards for money stakes with his subordinate staff during working hours in early April, 1958.

The third and last charge was that he was guilty of discreditable conduct in that he habitually played cards for money stakes with his subordinate staff during the luncheon interval.

5. Details of what constituted gross neglect of duty by Mr. de Fonseka which formed the basis of the first charge were given under several heads in the charge sheet, P.3. The very first item under sub-head (a) in this first charge was that out of a total of 31 vehicles he had 10 under repairs on 9.7.58, thereby impeding the service. On this point, I have no option but to accept the evidence of Messrs. K. Landesberger and V. C. Herft who had given evidence before Mr. L. E. J. Fernando at the inquiry into the charges against Mr. de Fonseka on different dates from 26th September to the 9th of October, 1958. This evidence was, by consent of parties, to be regarded as evidence led before me. Mr. Landesberger's evidence was that out of a fleet of vans, some were 8 years old, 3 were 7 years old and the bulk of them 4 years old, and that the service was not impeded at all. Mr. Herft's evidence was also almost to the same effect. I find that several of the vans were due for major repairs at the time Mr. de Fonseka went on leave; the other vans which came into the garage on the morning of the day Mr. de Fonseka went on leave were due for minor repairs like adjusting brakes only. This was the normal state of affairs on a working day in the Times of Ceylon garage. I hold that this charge has not been proved.

The next item under the first charge under sub-head (b) was that Mr. de Fonseka had failed to collect some extra petrol chit orders issued by the drivers of vans and which were found with the petrol shed Manager on the 14th of July, 1958, though it was his (Mr. de Fonseka's) responsibility to have collected these chits the day following the issue and to have issued official

petrol orders. One of the petrol chits produced was not signed by any driver. Some other chits had been issued during the period when Mr. de Fonseka was on leave and as regards the other chits also I accept the explanation as given by Mr. de Fonseka in the document P.11A as elaborated in the submissions made by Mr. Deshapriya at the hearing before me. If anything, Mr. de Fonseka was over-careful about honouring these chits alleged to have been issued by drivers for extra petrol taken from the petrol dealer over and above the quantity taken by them on official petrol orders signed by Mr. de Fonseka. I find that this was a frivolous charge.

6. The charges under sub-head (c) were dropped and Mr. de Fonseka was acquitted of the charges under sub-heads (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (k) and (l). He was found guilty on charges under sub-heads (j), (m), (n) and (o). I accept the explanation as regards these other charges also as contained in P.11A and I find that all items in the first charge against Mr. de Fonseka as contained in P.3 have failed completely.

7. As regards the 2nd and 3rd charges, namely, neglect of duty and discreditable conduct over playing of cards with subordinate staff during working hours and discreditable conduct in habitually playing cards with the subordinate staff during the luncheon interval, I find that Mr. de Fonseka has been guilty of discreditable conduct in this respect. Mr. Laurensz or somebody else making inquiries on behalf of the Company found that Mr. de Fonseka had shown this weakness for cards and joined others working in the same garage, who were his subordinates, in card games both during working hours as well as during the luncheon interval. This was not the sort of conduct of a manager of a garage that could have been condoned by the management of the Company; there are some persons to whom the lure of the pack is so irresistible that they will throw all discretion to the winds and join in a game of cards under all sorts of conditions. There is no evidence that the management had taken Mr. de Fonseka to task over this weakness of his and warned him against this sort of behaviour before he was summarily dealt with and drastically punished with discontinuance of service.

8. In my opinion, it was due to these card playing propensities of Mr. de Fonseka that the management of the Company thought of getting rid of him and advertising for his post in June, 1958, and interviewing applicants in July without warning Mr. de Fonseka even once against his weakness. Once the management had set its heart on getting rid of Mr. de Fonseka because of his weakness for cards, they tried to bolster up the case against him by adding the other charges against him which as I have said earlier have not been made out. The Company tried to do what they thought was the right thing in what they themselves

knew was the wrong way. Mr. de Fonseka's conduct in his card playing activities referred to earlier, though not to be admired, cannot be said to have been tinged with dishonesty or gross insubordination towards superior authority which alone would, in my opinion, merit discontinuance from service. Mr. de Fonseka should have been given at least one severe warning before he was dealt with in such a drastic fashion, but this does not appear to have been done.

9. I find that Mr. de Fonseka's discontinuance from office was too drastic a punishment to have been meted out to him under the circumstances, and I find that he should be reinstated in the employment of the Company though not necessarily in his former office as manager of the garage, at the same salary as he was drawing when he was discontinued from office. He should also be paid all arrears of salary from the date of his discontinuance, together with all other allowances which went with his salary, up to the date of his reinstatement.

10. Should the Company, for any reason, find it impracticable or inconvenient to find him employment, Mr. de Fonseka will be entitled to one year's salary computed as at the date of his discontinuance from service for loss of career and as damages; he will also be entitled to draw his monthly salary up to the time of his being paid this lump sum for loss of career, etc. As Mr. de Fonseka's conduct has not been altogether free from blame I order each party to bear its own costs of the inquiry before me.

THE EXCISE ORDINANCE

Excise Notification No. 479

THE Minister of Home Affairs has, under section 24 of the Excise Ordinance (Chapter 42), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, directed that, with effect from the date of publication of this Notification in the *Gazette*, Excise Notification No. 462 published in *Gazette* No. 11,074 of February 22, 1957, shall be amended, in the Schedule thereto, as follows:—

(1) in Form A, in paragraph 5 thereof, by the substitution, for the word "unslaked", of the word "slaked";

(2) in Form B, in paragraph 8 thereof, by the substitution, for the word "unslaked", of the word "slaked";

(3) in Form C, in paragraph 5 thereof, by the substitution, for the word "unslaked", of the word "slaked"; and

(4) in Form D, in paragraph 8 thereof, by the substitution, for the word "unslaked", of the word "slaked".
