Regulations

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the National Housing (No. 1) Regulations, 1958.
- 2. (1) Every person who has been selected by the Commissioner to occupy any building provided by the Commissioner shall, if required by the Commissioner—
 - (a) enter into an agreement with the Commissioner undertaking to abide by the terms and conditions specified in such agreement;
 (b) deposit in the National Housing Fund such sum of money as the Commissioner may determine;

 - (c) pay as an advance of rent such sum of money as the Commissioner may determine; and
 - (d) pay all expenses incurred by the Commissioner in connection with the grant of the tenancy of such building to such person.
- (2) Different terms and conditions may be specified in the agreement referred to in clause (a) of paragraph (1) in respect of different classes or descriptions of buildings.
- (8) The sum of money deposited in the National Housing Fund under clause (b) of paragraph (1) may be forfeited by the Commissioner for any breach of the terms and conditions specified in the agreement referred to in clause (a) of that paragraph.
- 3. Where any money is due to the Commissioner from any person in respect of any building provided to that person by the Commissioner, the Commissioner may issue a certificate specifying
 - (a) the exact amount due.
 - (b) the name of the person from whom such amount is due, and
 - (c) the date on which such amount fell due.
- In these regulations, "Commissioner" and "building" all have the same meaning as in the National Housing Act, No. 37 of 1954.

STATEMENT OF MATTERS IN DISPUTE

The matters in dispute between the Democratic Workers' Congress and the Superintendent of Pettiagalla Estate, Balangoda, are the following demands made by the aforesaid Congress:

- (1) Over pound rate to tea pluckers should be increased to 9 cents per pound on a daily intake of over and above 23 pounds.
- (2) Weeding contract rate should be increased to Rs. 11 per acre.
- (3) Spraying workers should be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage rate.
- (4) Pruners should be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage
- (5) Letchumanen Kg should be given back Supervisory Kangany work with back wages.

THE AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950 (as amended by Acts Nos. 25 of 1956, 14 of 1957 and 62 of 1957). It relates to an industrial dispute between the Ceylon Press Workers' Union, No. 124, Kumaran Ratnam Road, Colombo 2 (hereinafter referred to as the "Union"), and Messrs. D. P. Dodangoda and Company, No. 61, Main Street, Moratuwa (hereinafter referred to as the "Company").

- 2. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services by his order dated 20th November, 1958, under section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, has referred this industrial dispute to this Court for settlement. The dispute, as set out by the Commissioner of Labour in his statement dated 14th November 1958, refers to the non-employment
 - (1) K. Cyril Peiris,
 - (2) K. Lionel Pieris,
 - (3) M. M. A. Gunadasa,
 - (4) Samson Mendis.
 - (5) K. Robert Perera,
 - (6) M. D. Jinoris,
 - (7) H. Nonis, and
 - (8) P. Anthony.
- 3. The inquiry commenced on the 23rd of January, 1959, and was continued on various dates suitable to Court and the parties, and was concluded on the 28th of March, 1959. At the inquiry the Union was represented by Mr. N. Shanmugathasan, and the Company was represented by Mr. Dudwell Fernando, Proctor, and on the final date by Mr. Advocate A. C. Gooneratne, instructed by Mr. Dudwell Fernando.
- 4. At the commencement of the inquiry the case of P. Anthony was withdrawn.
- 4. At the commencement of the inquiry the case of P. Anthony was withdrawn.

 5. It would appear according to the evidence led at this inquiry that the above-mentioned persons, viz., K. Cyril Peiris, K. Lionel Pieris, M. M. A. Gunadasa, Samson Mendis, K. Robert Perera, M. D. Jinoris and H. Nonis were employees of Messrs. D. P. Dodangoda & Company which, according to Mr. D. P. Dodangoda, the proprietor of the Company, was "carrying on a business of printing and publishing for the last twenty-five years". It was stated that this business was started with an initial capital of Rs. 5,000 and with about eight employees. It was in evidence that at present he had about sixty employees, and on a perusal of the balance sheets produced at this inquiry marked (7A), (7B) and (7C) for the years 1955, 1956 and 1957 respectively, it would appear that his business had been a great success. The Company's main business had been the printing of school text-books and the printing of bus tickets and other stationery for the Panadura Bus Company. However, due to a change in the educational policy of the Government, some of the text-books which were printed at this establishment became unsaleable, and due to the nationalisation of the bus services the Company lost the work of the Panadura Bus Company. The Union agreed that in view of these circumstances retrenchment of employees in these sections had become necessary, but it contended that the principle of "first to come, last to go" was not adhered to by the Company, and as such the employees who were retrenched were entitled to compensation. Mr. La Brooy, an Assistant Commissioner of Labour, in his report marked (P3), which was produced by him at this inquiry, had observed that this principle was not followed by the Company, and Mr. W. T. Fernando, the Labour Inspector who had conducted the departmental inquiry too was of the same view. However, a finding

by me on this point became unnecessary as the Company was agreeable to pay compensation to the seven employees whose services were terminated, and the inquiry proceeded as to the quantum of compensation which should be paid to them.

- 6. The Company offered to pay a sum of Rs. 1,500 to the seven employees, but the Union maintained that compensation on the basis of two weeks' wages for each year of service was fair and reasonable compensation to be paid to each of the seven fair and reasonable compensation to be paid to each of the seven employees. In calculating the quantum of compensation which should be paid in cases of this nature, one should take into consideration the capacity of the employer to pay, and I have examined this position very carefully with particular reference to the documents produced by the Company and the Union and the oral evidence led on this point. The Company has produced Balance Sheets and Profit and Loss Accounts marked (7A), (7B) and (7C) duly audited for the years 1955, 1956 and 1957 respectively. The publication of the contents of these documents in this award would undoubtedly be not in the business interests of the Company, but on a careful examination of these documents I was satisfied that the Company had made substantial profits during these three years. I requested the Company to produce the Balance Sheet and the Profit and Loss account for the year 1958, but although an undertaking was given to Court to produce these accounts, they were not forthcoming. In these circumstances one had to presume that the production of these accounts would not have supported the Company's case that its circumstances one had to presume that the production of these accounts would not have supported the Company's case that its business was run at a loss. At the same time, the non-production of these documents throw considerable doubt on the truth of Mr. Dodangoda's evidence that he borrowed various sums of moneys on post-dated cheques and promissory notes to run the business. The production of these accounts would certainly have helped me to get a true assessment of the capacity of the Company to pay compensation, for it was unsafe to act on the bare statement of Mr. Dodangoda, unless it was supported by his books of account which were kept in the course of his business. His excuse that his books of account were with the auditors could not be accepted. No effect was made to call the auditors, nor was any application made for a date to produce them. On the other hand, there was evidence that Mr. Dodangoda had employed some unskilled labourers after the termination of the services of these seven persons; there was evidence that he On the other hand, there was evidence that Mr. Dodangoda had employed some unskilled labourers after the termination of the services of these seven persons; there was evidence that he had bought an embossing machine during 1958 as "there was a demand for that type of work"; there was also evidence that he spent a sum of Rs. 2,000 on a pandal in fulfilment of a vow to the Lunawa Temple; there was also evidence that he paid a sum of Rs. 2,000 to some unskilled women labourers who were discontinued by him during the year 1958. All these circumstances did have a bearing on Mr. Dodangoda's financial position, and I was constrained to conclude that the financial position of the Company was not in a bad way as he tried to make out. It was laid down in I. D. 70 and I. D. 75 of this Court that two weeks' wages for each year of service was fair and reasonable compensation which should be paid to employees who are retrenched. Mr. La'Brooy, an Assistant Commissioner of Labour, who gave evidence before me stated that it was the practice in large and middle-size business establishments to pay two weeks' wages for each year of service to employee who were retrenched, and he further stated that this Company could be classified as a middle-size business concern as it had about sixty employees. In view of all these facts, I would hold that each employee who was retrenched by this Company would receive as compensation two weeks' salary for each year of his service.

 8. Gunadasa in his evidence stated that he was employed by the Company on 6.1.50. The Company, on the other hand, maintained that he joined the Company on 1.1.54. Gunadasa produced a carbon copy of a receipt dated 7.11.53 (marked P.4) issued to him by the Company in proof of the payment of his salary of Rs. 45.55 for the month of October, 1953. This receipt bore a serial number 2169. It was urged on behalf of the Company that document (P.4) should be rejected as it was a fabricated document. The Company has produced the check-roll for the year 1953 marked (R.3) and on a careful examination of the wages paid to the employees of the Company for the month of October, 1953, it was found that Gunadasa had been paid a sum of Rs. 45.55 on a receipt No. 2169 dated 7.11.53. These entries in document (R.3) are identical with the contents of document (P.4) produced by Gunadasa. Therefore it could not be said that P.4 is a fabricated document. It was also noted on an examination and perusal of checked-roll marked (R.2) that Gunadasa's name had been entered in the check-roll as an employee of the Company on 1.1.1951. Gunadasa had been employed in "Class F" and had continued to be in that class till 31.12.1953. On 1.1.1954 Gunadasa had been promoted and had been designated as "1st year ruler". It was quite obvious that Gunadasa, who was in Class "F" and was later designated as a "1st year ruler", was one and the same person, although the Company tried to take advantage of this change of designation to show that they were different persons and fix the date of Gunadasa's employment as from 1.1.54. For these reasons I would hold that Gunadasa joined the Company on 1.1.51. joined the Company on 1.1.51.
- 8. K. Lionel Pieris stated in his evidence that he was first employed by the Company on 13.1.51. He was, however, not in a position to produce any receipt or documents to prove his contention. I have preferred to accept Mr. La Brooy's evidence that K. Lionel Pieris according to the books of the Company joined on 1.3.54.

9. K. Cyril Peiris stated in his evidence that he joined the Company on 10.3.49. He produced a bundle of carbon-copy receipts marked (P.5), the first of which bore a serial number 971 dated 10.2.50. The entries on document (P.5) showed that a sum of Rs. 32.40 was received by him in payment of his salary for the month of January, 1950. It was urged on behalf of the Company that the documents (P.5) were also fabricated ones. On a perusal of the check-roll for 1950 marked (R.2) produced by the Company, it was found that Cyril Peiris did receive a sum of Rs. 32.40 upon receipt No. 971 dated 10.2.50, which entries were identical with the contents of document (P.5). Therefore it could not be said that documents (P.5) were fabricated ones. On a perusal of (R.2) it was found that Cyril Peiris was first employed in Class "F" on 1.1.50, and continued to be in that class till 31.12.50, when in January, 1951, he was promoted as a "1st year binder apprentice". In this case too it was obvious that the Company was trying to take advantage of this change of designation to deprive Cyril Peiris of one year of service. In view of these facts I would hold that Cyril Peiris joined the Company on 1.1.50. In fairness to the two witnesses, Gunadasa and Cyril Peiris, I would make special mention that I have no reason whatsoever to doubt the genuineness of documents (P4) and (P5) and I reject the allegation of fabrication made against them as unfounded and unjustified.

I further award that the Company will make these payments to the above-mentioned employees in two equal monthly instalments, the first of which will be paid within a month of the publication of this award, and such payments to be made through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo (conciliation).

Pitchey Rawther, was represented by his Proctor, Mr. Hari Hara Aiyar. Mr. Hari Hara Aiyar handed over to Court a copy of the notes of a conference held by Mr. Isidore Fernando, Assistant Commissioner of Labour, on 16th April, 1959, embodying the following terms of settlement arrived at between the parties and requested that award be made accordingly:—

Demand No. 1—"It is agreed that W. Martin, I. William, W. Sediris, Y. Charles, W. Jayah, K. A. Seebel Singho and L. Upasena would all be re-employed as from the 20th April, 1959, and would be given at least four days' work per week having distributed work accordingly amongst the workers.

As regards I. P. Themis, it is agreed that if and when work is available for a substitute driver, he would be re-employed.

Demand 2 (e)—In view of the settlement of Demand 1, this demand is dropped."

This is a decision under section 28 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950.

- 2. In accordance with the provisions of section 27 of the said Act, the Hon. Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services has referred to this Court for decision an application dated 12th March, 1959, made by the Employers' Federation of Ceylon for the variation of the award made in proceedings No. I. D. 48 of this Court on 2nd April, 1958, in the following manner:—
 - (1) To vary the Award dated 2nd April, 1958, and effective from the 1st day of January, 1958, so as to provide for the payment to workers covered by such Award, of special allowance and special living allowance at the same rate as is paid by the Government to its employees but under terms whereby the Company shall cease to be liable to provide a free midday meal or to make a cash payment in lieu thereof.
 - (2) Provided further, that if any employer bound by the Award has in the past been providing a free midday meal, such employer shall, if so requested by the workers, continue to provide a midday meal of the value of 50 cents and shall in that event be entitled to recover from the wages and allowances of the worker a sum of 50 cents for each meal so provided, and
 - (3) Provided further, that if the Award shall not be so varied as to relieve the employer of the obligation to provide a free midday meal then the amount of the aforesaid special allowance payable under the variation proposed above shall be reduced by 50 cents per day.
- 3. The application was taken up for consideration on 9.4.59. At the request of Mr. N. Sanmugathasan for the Tea, Rubber, Coconut and General Produce Workers' Union and the United Engineering Workers' Union which are parties to the awards in proceedings Nos. I. D. 49 and I. D. 50 of this Court which dealt with identical questions, these two unions were joined as parties in this matter. parties in this matter.
- 4. After discussion the parties to the dispute in proceedings Nos. I. D. 48, I. D. 49 and I. D. 50 agreed to the following terms of settlement:—
 - (a) that as on and from the 1st day of May, 1959, the employers shall not be under any obligation to provide a midday meal free of cost or charge to the workers;
 - (b) that as on and from the 1st day of May, 1959, any of the employers bound by the Award, who had immediately prior to that date provided a free midday meal, shall continue to provide or cause to be provided a midday meal to the value of 50 cents, for which the workers should pay 50 cents. The employers shall be entitled to recover by deduction from wages or allowances from each worker a sum of 50 cents for each meal provided for such workers: for such workers;
 - (c) that as on and from the 1st day of May, 1959, employers bound by the Award shall pay to their workers covered by the Award special allowance and special living allowance at the same rate as is paid by the Government to its employees, such dearness allowance and special living allowance being in lieu and in substitution of the special allowance and additions to the special allowances heretofore paid.
- 5. We consider the above terms just and equitable and we make decision accordingly. This decision will not apply to the British Ceylon Corporation Ltd., who has since ceased to be a member of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon.
