EXAMINATION FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF PROBATIONARY DIVISIONAL REVENUE OFFICERS, 1959

AN open Competitive Examination will be held in Colombo in or about June 1959, for the recruitment of Probationary Divisional Revenue Officers. The actual dates will be notified later. The Public Service Commission reserves the right to cancel this examination if it considers it expedient in the public interest to do so. It is open to the Public Service Commission to postpone the Examination should it consider it necessary.

2. Probationers will be selected for the Maritime (Low Country) area, the Kandyan area and the Tamil speaking area. Each Probationer will be attached to a Kachcheri and will rank as a Junior Staff Officer.

It is estimated that the number of vacancies will be as follows :—

The Public Service Commission may omit to fill any or all these vacancies if it considers this necessary in the public interest.

Method of Application

3. (a) Applications on forms to be obtained from the Office of the Secretary, Public Service Commission, must be forwarded by registered post, addressed to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, and must reach that officer on or before April 24, 1959.

No application received after that date will be considered.

(b) The fee for the examination is Rs. 15. This fee should be paid before the closing date for applications at the nearest Kachcheri or at the General Treasury, Colombo, and credited to Revenue Head VI, Sub-head 3, Item 4. The Kachcheri or Treasury receipt should be attached to the application form.

(c) Two referees must be named in the form, who, from their personal knowledge of the candidate, can testify to his character and capacity.

Salary and Conditions of Service

4. (i) A Probationer, while on training, will be paid at the rate of Rs. 3,000 per annum. He will receive payment at the rate of Rs. 3,360 per annum on passing the General and Chief Language Examinations and on being given at the end of his period of training a certificate by the Government Agent to the effect that he is fully capable in all respects of acting as a Divisional Revenue Officer ; Rs. 4,080 to Rs. 8,400 per annum by annual increments—12 of 360—on being appointed to be in charge of a Division in a probationary capacity, but will not receive the third increment until he has passed the Second Language Examination. Failure to pass the Second Language Examination before the completion of three years will operate as a deferment of third increment. The chief Language Examination will be of the J. S. C. standard.

(ii) A Divisional Revenue Officer will, on confirmation, be allowed to proceed along the scale Rs. 4,080 to Rs. 8,400 per annum by twelve annual increments of Rs. 360 subject to the passing of efficiency bars before Rs. 5,520 and Rs. 6,960.

(iii) Confirmation will not take place until a Divisional Revenue Officer has been in sole charge of a Division for a period of not less than three years, has passed all his examinations and has been certified fit for confirmation by the Government Agent. Pending confirmation an Acting Divisional Revenue Officer will not be allowed to proceed beyond Rs. 4,800 per annum in the scale of a confirmed Divisional Revenue Officer.

(iv) The posts are permanent and pensionable. Contribution is made to the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme.

(v) The Probationers are subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Administrative Regulations and any other orders or regulations which may be issued from time to time by the Government. The Probationers are required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(vi) Each Probationer will be attached to a Kachcheri during the period of training. He will undergo a period of training in Kachcheri as well as in District work. The normal period of training will be 12 months, but this period may be extended, if necessary. During the training period a Probationer will be required to pass—

- (a) a general examination in the subjects learnt during his training including law and accounts ; and
- (b) an exacting test in the language chiefly spoken in the administrative area for which he has been selected. The examination will be of J. S. C. standard.

(vii) The Probationer will also be required to pass a test of a less exacting standard in the other language ; this examination in the Second Language may be taken during the period of training, if the Probationer so wishes, but must be passed within four years of appointment. The scope of the General, Chief Language and Second Language Examinations is laid down in the scheme of training.

(viii) The General Examination is held twice a year, generally in the second week of April and October. A Probationer will not be allowed to take this Examination until he has completed at least six months' training. Thereafter he will be required to take the examination every six months until he passes in all subjects. Should he fail to pass in all subjects after three attempts, the question of his removal from service will be considered.

(ix) The examination in languages is held four times a year, generally in the third week of February, May, August and November.

(x) A Probationer will not be allowed to take this examination until he has completed at least six months training. After that he will be required to take the examination every three months until he passes it which he must do within three years of first appointment.

(xi) During the period of training and until a Probationer completes four months' service as Acting Divisional Revenue Officer, his attendance at the Second Language Examination will be optional but thereafter attendance at this examination will be compulsory until he succeeds in passing the examination, which he must do within four years of appointment.

(xii) If a Probationer fails to pass the General and Chief Language Examinations within three years of appointment, or if he passes those Examinations but fails to pass the Second Language Examination within five years of appointment, the question whether he should be continued in service will be considered.

Selection Grade.—There is a Selection Grade on the salary scale Rs. 8,400 to Rs. 11,280 per annum by 6 annual increments of Rs. 480, to which appointment is made by promotion from the Grade of Divisional Revenue Officer on merit.

Divisional Revenue Officers with not less than 10 years in the grade will also be eligible for appointment to staff posts at Kachcheries of Departments which make use of Government Agents as district heads for the purpose of their functions.

Qualifications for Candidates

5. Every candidate who must be a male must possess the following qualifications :—

- (a) He must be a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- (b) He should have attained the age of 21 and should not have attained the age of 25 on August 1, 1959. Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services on their own accord), will be allowed to deduct period of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- (c) He must possess a degree of a recognised University.

Note.—No candidate will be allowed to sit for the examination conducted under these conditions on more than two occasions. For the purpose of this proviso a candidate who sat for one paper at an examination and failed to sit for the other papers in the same examination for any reason whatsoever will be regarded as having completed the examination.

Method of Selection

6. For the purpose of recruitment of Probationers, for the three administrative areas, viz. Maritime (Low Country) Kandyan and Tamil speaking the successful candidate will be selected for service in one of these three areas and an officer will subsequently be transferable only within the area for which he was originally selected. The candidates scoring the highest marks in the competitive examination (written examination and *viva voce* examination) will be selected for appointment.

Note.—Only Kandyan Sinhalese will be eligible for selection for the Kandyan area. The claims of candidates to be Kandyan Sinhalese will be investigated by a special Board appointed for this purpose by the Public Service Commission. This Board will accept as Kandyan Sinhalese—

- (a) any son of a Kandyan father, or
- (b) any son of a Kandyan mother, whether she has been married in *binna* or *digga* under Chapter 96 (Volume III, Legislative Enactments) or under the general (*i.e.* non-Kandyan) law, provided that his parents are permanently resident in a Kandyan District.

Candidates rejected by the Board will be allowed to enter for the Maritime area provided they are otherwise eligible.

Scheme of Examination

7. A competitive examination will be held for the selection of candidates wishing to join the Divisional Revenue Officers' Service. The examination will be in two parts, viz. (a) written examination, and (b) *viva voce* examination.

- (a) The written examination will be held in Colombo in or about June 1959. The actual dates will be notified later.
- (b) The *viva voce* examination will be held in Colombo on a date which will be communicated to candidates after the written examination. This examination will be restricted to candidates who reach a satisfactory standard in the whole of the written examination. Candidates selected for interview will be required to forward before the date of the interview the original certificate granted to them in respect of the examination they have passed which qualified them for admission to the competitive examination, three character certificates in original, and birth certificate. Ex-Servicemen will also be required to forward in original their discharge certificate.

Note.—Baptismal certificates or certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code of Regulations for Assisted Schools will not be accepted. Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

SYLLABUSES

All papers will be of three hours' duration except where specified.

SECTION A

Essay—An essay to be written in English on one of several specified subjects. The essay will be judged not only according to language, style and arrangement but also according to the degree of thought and originality in its treatment of the subject.

General Knowledge.—A paper designed to test the candidate's general knowledge of the history, geography, politics, economics, social system, culture, flora and fauna of Ceylon.

Sinhalese (Special) or Tamil (Special)—A paper of two hours' duration, containing translation into English, translation into the language of English sentences chosen to test grammatical knowledge and translation into the language of easy passages of continuous English prose.

SECTION B

Sinhalese—Two papers.—Translations from Sinhalese texts belonging to the Kotte and later periods, including modern, with questions on language and subject matter.

The History of Sinhalese Literature from the 15th century to the present day. Prose composition.

Tamil—Two papers.—Translations from mediaeval and modern texts with questions on their language and subject matter.

The history of Tamil Literature from the earliest times. Prose composition.

Arabic—Two papers.—Translation from Post-Islamic and modern Arabic texts into English including questions on subject matter and grammar.

Prose composition in Arabic. The history of Arabic Literature.

Sanskrit—Two Papers.—Translations from easy Vedic and Classical Sanskrit texts, including the epics, with questions on their language and subject matter.

The history of Sanskrit Literature, prosody and poetics, and prose composition in the Devanagari script.

Pali—Two Papers.—Translations from easy canonical texts and postcanonical Literature, excluding the *pakarana*-Literature, with questions on their language and subject matter.

Prose composition, the history of Pali Literature in Ceylon and the history of Buddhism in Ceylon.

English—Two Papers.—English Literature from 1600—1832, with special reference to any *four* of the following—

Shakespeare, Dryden, Dr. Johnson,
Jane Austen, Wordsworth, Keats.

English Literature from 1832 to the present day with special reference to any *four* of the following :—

Arnold, Tennyson, Shaw, Conrad,
D. H. Lawrence, T. S. Eliot.

Candidates will not be expected to have a detailed knowledge of all the work of the writers selected for special study nor to identify extracts taken from their work. "Shakespeare", for instance, would mean such representative phases, of his work as the candidate is familiar with through his study of typical plays, e.g., As you Like It—for Comedy, King Lear—for Tragedy, The Tempest—for a later play, and so on. Candidates will be expected to illustrate their answers on the work of any of the writers set for special study from their reading of a selection of the major works of these authors. A knowledge of literary development in the two broad general periods will not be required of candidates. They will, however be expected in their answers to show that they have a good grasp of the language.

Latin—Two Papers.—Unprepared translation from Latin Texts, with questions on their language and subject matter.

Prose composition and the history of Latin Literature.

Greek—Two Papers.—Unprepared translation from Greek Texts, with questions on their language and subject matter.

Prose composition and history of Greek Literature.

History—Two Papers.—Three papers of which candidates must offer Paper I *and* either Paper II or Paper III.

Paper I.—Ceylon History.

Paper II.—The History of India from 320 A.D. to 1526 A.D.

Paper III.—European History from 1789.

Economics—Two Papers.—The principles of economics, including definition, scope and method, economic systems, the theory of production, forms of productive enterprises, the market system, determination of price, implications of monopoly and competition, national income forces which determine its size, the role of saving and investment, the distribution of national income, the role of the state in economic life, public finance.

Banking and currency, including the nature and definition of money, the theory of price changes, monetary systems, the functions of banks, central banking, problems of monetary organisation and policy, international economic transactions, balance of payments, exchange rates.

Modern economic history, including the economic history of England, France, Germany, Russia and the U. S. A. during the 19th and 20th centuries.

Geography—Two Papers.—Paper 1 (a) The principles of *both* Physical Geography (landforms, drainage, natural vegetation, soils, climate, weather), *and* Human Geography (man's distribution, migration, societies, economics).

(b) The regional Geography of (i) Ceylon, and (ii) the Indian Area (India, Pakistan, Burma) *or* Europe *or* Anglo-America : physical, human, economic.

Paper 2—General Map work : topographical maps (Ceylon, United Kingdom, United States) ; elementary surveying (chain, plane table, prismatic compass) ; projections (" Properties ", simple construction) ; and graphics (presentation of elementary statistical data).

Philosophy—Two Papers.—The history of Western Philosophy—

(a) Greek Philosophy, with special emphasis on the Scientific period, the Sophists, Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, the later ethical period, Neo-Platonism.

(b) The middle ages, with special emphasis on St. Augustine, Scotus Eugene, Anselm, Thomas Aquinas, St. Bonaventure, Duns Scotus, the revival of Aristotlism, the problem of Universals.

(c) Modern Philosophy, with special emphasis on the Renaissance (Bruno, Bacon, Hobbes) systems of Rationalism (Descartes, Spinoza, Leibnitz), Empiricism, and the Enlightenment (Locke, Berkeley, Hume), German Idealism (Kant, Ficher, Schelling, Hegel).

Ethics.—The nature and scope of Ethics, Morality and Religion, the problem of moral knowledge, Moral progress and a belief and a fact Customary Morality, General principles of moral theory, Rationalism, Hedonism, Eudaemonism, Moral practice, the system of Human values, the nature of human rights, duties, virtues and their place in Ethics, justice, ethical and legal, economic life and morals, the sex life, the family, the state and other social institutions.

Pure Mathematics—Two Papers.—Algebra (including complex numbers) Trigonometry, Geometry (including Analytical Geometry of two and three dimensions), Differential and Integral Calculus, and Differential Equations in one independent variable. Each of the two papers will be based on the entire syllabus.

Applied Mathematics—Two Papers.—Statics and Dynamics of a particle and of a rigid body. Hydrostatics and Gravitation. Each of the two papers will be based on the entire syllabus.

Physics—Two Papers.—General Physics, Heat, and Thermodynamics, Acoustics, Geometrical and Physical Optics, Electricity and Magnetism, Modern Physics.

Chemistry—Two Papers.—Paper I.—General and Inorganic Chemistry and Physical Chemistry.

Paper II.—Physical Chemistry and Organic Chemistry.

Botany—Two Papers.—Will cover paragraph A below, in reference to the various major groups of plants.

Will cover formal histology and anatomy from paragraph A below, together with paragraph B.

The general field of the syllabus is—

A.—Structure, function, reproduction, classification and evolution in the Plant Kingdom (both contemporary and extinct plants).

B.—Cytology and Genetics, Plant Physiology, the principles of plant Ecology and Geography.

Note.—The allocation of subject matter to papers is subject to appropriate cross-references. In relation to classification—especially for orders and families of Angiosperms—and to ecology and geography (particular reference will be had to the plants and vegetation of Ceylon).

Zoology—Two Papers.—Invertebrata, Evolution, Geographical distribution of animals, Vertebrata, General Embryology, Cytology, Heredity, Ecology.

SECTION C

Viva Voce.—Physique and personality will be taken into consideration at the *viva voce* examination and the *viva voce* Board will endeavour to ensure that no candidate is selected for appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer who is temperamentally or physically unsuited to stand the strain of the exacting field work expected of these officers.

Alteration of Subjects

9. No alteration in the selection of subjects will be allowed after the closing date for applications. No marks will be taken into account in respect of the subjects for which the candidate has not entered.

Refund of Fee

10. A candidate who withdraws or absents himself from the examination for any reason whatsoever shall not be entitled to a refund of the whole or a portion of the fee.

Canvassing

11. Any form of canvassing on behalf of a candidate or any attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will render that candidate liable to disqualification.

12. Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.
