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#### Posts—Vacant

#### 4. **New Entrant Officers**—

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officer who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

*Note*—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

6. **War Service Concession**—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

#### APPENDICES

*Appendix B.1.*— The following new Appendix B. 1 was inserted immediately after Appendix B :—

“ *Appendix B. 1.*—Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale by Auction of Tea ex-Estate, ex-Galle and ex-Trincomalee.

#### BYE-LAWS

1. Sales shall be held at the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Sale Room on such occasions and at such time and under such arrangements as the Committee of the Colombo Tea Traders' Association, (hereinafter referred to as the “Association”) shall from time to time decide.

2. Prices realised for individual lots at such sales shall not be published.

3. (a) No teas for sale ex-Estate shall be catalogued until 4 lb. samples have been received in Colombo.

(b) No teas for sale ex-Trincomalee shall be catalogued until advice has been received from the Trincomalee Tea Administration Co. Ltd., of their arrival at Trincomalee in merchantable condition.

(c) No teas for sale ex-Galle shall be catalogued until advice has been received from the Seller's Agent of their arrival at Galle in merchantable condition.

(d) 4 lb. samples of teas catalogued for sale ex-Trincomalee or ex-Galle shall be sent to Colombo immediately after notice of their arrival has been given.

(e) Catalogues shall be closed and samples and catalogues delivered to buyers at such time and dates as the Committee of the Association shall from time to time decide.

4. (a) No Tea shall be put up for sale at the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Sale Room except by members of the Association as owners or as duly appointed agents acting for and on behalf of owners.

(b) only first hand teas on estate account shall be offered.

(c) Any tea which in the opinion of any member of the Association is unsuitable for offering at an Auction shall be referred for approval or rejection to a sub-Committee appointed by the Committee of the Association consisting of one Buyers' and one Sellers' representative. In the event of disagreement between these two representatives, the final decision shall rest with the Chairman of the Association who shall be entitled to consult such person or persons as he may think fit.

5. No lot of less than 18 packages shall be offered. No unbulked tea shall be offered.

6. Lot money at Rs. 1.50 per lot shall be payable by the Seller to the Selling Broker and the Selling Broker shall pay 50 cents per lot to the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce for the use of the Sale Room.

#### Conditions of Sale

1. The highest bidder whose offer is accepted shall be the purchaser and any dispute that may arise between bidders shall be settled by the Selling Broker. The name of the highest bidder shall be declared by the Selling Broker before the lot is knocked down. The Seller of the tea or any agent employed by him shall have the right to bid.

2. All teas shall be sold by the lot at so much per lb. All export duty, if any, and any cess shall be for and on account of and be payable by the Buyer. No advance of less than 1 cent per lb. shall be made on any previous bid.

3. If the highest bid for any lot is not accepted, but is registered by the Selling Broker at the request of the bidder, then the bidder shall have the right to claim the lot at any advance in price, which may be made for that lot before noon on the day following the sale, and the original bid shall hold good until noon on the day following the sale, unless it is cancelled by mutual agreement between the Seller and the bidder.

4. No deposit shall be required.

5. (a) All teas sold ex-Estate shall be paid for on catalogued weights (less 4 lb. sampling allowance) on proof of good delivery. “Good delivery” means the approval by the buyer of a sample drawn from the bulk at the port of delivery. The sample shall be drawn without delay by a representative of the Trincomalee Tea Administration Co. Ltd., at Trincomalee or by the buyer's agent at Galle, as the case may be.

(b) Teas sold ex-Trincomalee or ex-Galle shall be paid for in full on catalogued weights (less 4 lb. sampling allowance) on the day following the sale.

(c) Should payment not be made on demand, the Seller shall have the right, on giving notice in writing to the Buyer, to re-sell the lot or lots at the risk of the Buyer, who shall be liable for any loss resulting from such re-sale, and the Buyer so defaulting shall also be precluded from bidding in the Auctions for a period of three months from prompt day. If settlement of any loss resulting from such re-sale is not effected on or before the termination of the aforesaid period of three months, the Buyer shall be further precluded from bidding in the auctions thereafter until such time as settlement is effected.

(d) Except in special circumstances interfering with delivery, in which event the Association may extend the period, teas sold ex-Estate shall be delivered at the selected port within 14 days of sale, failing which the buyer shall have the right to repudiate the contract. Delivery shall be made only at such port or ports as may be named and designated by the Association. The port or ports at which delivery is to be made shall be notified to the Seller within 3 days of the sale.

(e) All teas sold ex-Estate shall be at Seller's risk absolutely only until physical delivery to Warehouse at the selected port has been made.

(f) All teas sold ex-Trincomalee or ex-Galle shall be at Seller's risk absolutely until the time of the sale.

6. The Seller shall ensure that the sample on which the tea is offered consists of 4 lb. of tea, 2 lb. exactly of which shall have been drawn from each of two chests of the break after packing. All packages from which a sample has been drawn shall be stencilled prominently with the letter “S”. Catalogues shall state whether packages are hooped or not.

7. All teas offered for sale shall be packed in good merchantable packages and the Selling Broker shall declare in his catalogue whether such packages are “patent” “momi”, or “Ceylon wood”, and if made of Ceylon wood, the packages shall be free

from borer and manufactured from well seasoned timber of varieties approved by the Association. The type of all packages and linings shall be declared.

8. (a) All packages shall have the gross and nett weights marked thereon previous to being offered for sale, and in the event of a shortage in weight being proved, the seller shall be liable for such shortage and also for the cost of weighing. In the event of any dispute Condition 10 shall apply.

(b) All objections as to the quality, description, packing or weights shall be made in writing within seven days of the delivery in Colombo of the sample drawn in terms of Condition 5(a).

(c) Such objections shall be lodged with the Seller and unless the seller and the buyer agree among themselves what compensation or allowance, if any, is to be made by the seller to the buyer, the matter shall be referred to arbitration.

(d) The provisions of clauses (b) and (c) of this Condition shall not apply to teas sold ex-Trincomalee or ex-Galle.

9. Brokers buying or selling tea shall declare in writing their principals immediately after the sale; otherwise they themselves shall be held responsible as principals.

10. (a) Should any dispute or disagreement arise between Buyer and Seller the same shall be referred to the arbitration of one arbitrator to be appointed by both parties, or, if the parties cannot agree as to an arbitrator, to the arbitration of two arbitrators, one to be appointed by each party. The arbitrators shall, before proceeding with the business of the arbitration, appoint an umpire, to the arbitration of whom shall be referred all questions on which the arbitrators are unable to agree. The award of such arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire (as the case may be) shall be final, conclusive and binding on all parties. If either party shall refuse or neglect to appoint an arbitrator within three days after the other party shall have appointed an arbitrator on his part and shall have served or Posted under registered cover written notice requiring him to make such appointment, then the arbitrator appointed as aforesaid shall, at the request of the party appointing him, proceed to arbitrate on the matter in dispute as if he were an arbitrator appointed by both parties for that purpose.
