Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Village Committee Clerical Service, Grade II Examination, June 27, 1959

A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter Grade II of the Village Committee Clerical Service will be held at Colombo, Kandy, Galle and Jaffna, on June 27, 1959.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations. Candidates are bound by the Rules for Candidates framed by the Commissioner.

2. (i) *Salary*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to serve Village Committees on the salary scale of Rs. 750 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,296 per annum. An efficiency bar operates before Rs. 1,080 per annum. Rent allowance, temporary cost of living allowance and a temporary special living allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

(ii) *Conditions of Service*—(a) The posts are permanent and pensionable and the selected candidates will be eligible for the Local Government Service Widows and Orphans' Pension benefits.

(b) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the by-laws of the Village Committee, the Village Committee Rules framed under the Village Communities Ordinance and the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations framed thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years probation. They will be subject to the provisions of Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(d) Successful candidates may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through guarantee associations approved by the Local Government Service Commission in sums which may be decided upon by the Local Authorities to which they will be appointed.

3. The names of the successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments, as and when vacancies occur.

4. *Eligibility*—(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least, either—

(a) the Junior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination with English as one of the subjects; or

(b) the Junior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil) Examination and the 5th Standard (English).

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph (6) (iv) (a) except that if necessary—provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct the period of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

(v) Candidates must furnish satisfactory proof that they have been resident in an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, for at least three years immediately prior to June 1, 1959.

5. (a) Candidates in the permanent employ of a Local Authority with not less than five years' service on June 1, 1959, will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above.

(b) Temporary full-time clerks employed in Village Committees with more than one year's continuous satisfactory service on April 1, 1959, will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age and educational qualifications prescribed above.

6. *Applications*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the Office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Fort, Colombo, and forwarded by Registered post to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo 1, to reach him not later than May 12, 1959. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or Local Authorities, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of Departments or the Chairmen, Special Commissioners or Commissioners of the Local Authorities in which they are serving. Any candidates who fails to do so, will be disqualified.

(iii) The applications must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 3.

(iv) Candidates should be born not earlier than June 27, 1936, and not later than June 27, 1942.

(v) Candidates will be required to produce the following documents when called upon to do so:—

(a) Certificate of Registration of Birth (*N.B.*—Baptismal Certificates or Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code or Regulations for Assisted Schools will not be accepted.)

(b) Certificates in support of educational qualifications.

(c) Two Certificates of Character. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School one Certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he had attended; otherwise, it may be from the candidate's teacher or school master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary Public, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

(d) Certificate of highest examination passed in Sinhalese and/or Tamil.

N.B.—NO DOCUMENTS OR COPIES OF DOCUMENTS SHOULD BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM. CANDIDATES SHOULD PRODUCE THEM WHEN REQUESTED TO DO SO.

(vi) The following document should be attached to the Application form:—

A Certificate of residence from the Divisional Revenue Officer, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary Public, to the effect that the candidate has been resident in an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, for at least 3 years immediately prior to June 1, 1959.

N.B.—(1) APPLICATIONS NOT MADE ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM WILL BE REJECTED.

(2) CERTIFICATES OF RESIDENCE WHICH ARE NOT FURNISHED STRICTLY IN TERMS OF SUB-PARAGRAPH 6 (vi) OF THE NOTIFICATION WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

(3) APPLICATIONS NOT CONFORMING IN EVERY RESPECT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS NOTIFICATION WILL BE REJECTED.

(vi) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to the candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination, their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination hall.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the supervising examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should, without delay, write to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars:—

(1) Name of Examination.

(2) Full name.

(3) Full address.

(4) Examination centre at which candidate applied to take up the examination.

7. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during, or after the examination.

If any of the particulars furnished by a candidate are found to be false within his knowledge, or if he has wilfully suppressed any material fact, or if it is found at any time, during the period of his service, that he was ineligible to sit for this examination, he will be liable to immediate dismissal from the service.

8. *Withdrawals and Refunds*—In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

9. *Leave to Officers to attend Examination*—Heads of Departments, Chairmen, Special Commissioners and Commissioners of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves at the examination.

10. *Identity Cards*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

(A) Identity Cards—Candidate will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose, any one of the following documents will be accepted:

(a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General;

- (b) A valid passport issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination;
- (c) Any certificate, licence or other document embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination on the authority of a Government department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination hall without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

11. Subjects—The subjects for the examination are as follows:

(1) Sinhalese or Tamil Language and Composition— a one and a half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and question to test the correct use of the language	200
(2) General Intelligence (in Sinhalese and Tamil)— a 45 minutes paper	100
(3) English—a one and a half hour paper which will include—	
(i) exercises on the comprehension of easy passages and on composition	
(ii) questions to test the correct use of the language	150
(4) " Viva Voce " Test	100

(Candidates are required to produce at the " Viva Voce " test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to this examination).

12. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held, and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the " Viva Voce " test. The number to be called for the " Viva Voce " test will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission.

In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates, whose writing is illegible, are liable to be disqualified. The " Viva Voce " test will be held in Colombo.

13. Medical Examination—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.
