ENTERTAINMENT TAX (AMENDMENT) ACT, No. 2 OF 1952

THE Jaffna Municipal Council at its meeting held on 13.3.59, resolved as follows:—

"Entertainments as contemplated under section 8A (1) of the Entertainment Tax (Amendment) Act, No. 2 of 1952, shall be exempted in terms of section 8A (2) (a) of the same Act, provided that they are conducted by a recognized Sports-Association of a representative character such as the Jaffna School Sports Association, the Jaffna Sports Association, the Northern Province Government Service Sports Association, the Jaffna Girls School Sports Association, &c. The powers to determine whether an association is of such representative character is delegated to the Mayor.

All associations of such representative character claiming exemptions from payment of entertainment tax should strictly comply with section 8A(3) and (4) of the Entertainment Tax (Amendment) Act, No. 2 of 1952
