# **COVAX VACCINES** ERE BY MONTH END

18 MN VACCINE **DOSES ALSO** TO BE ORDERED

**4,000 CENTRES** FOR VACCINATION

600.000 TO **BE INOCULATED PER DAY**

The first consignment of COVID vaccines donated under the World Health Organisation's COVAX facility is to be received by the end of this month, stated Deputy Director-General of Public Health Services, Dr. Hemantha Herath.

Dr.Herath was speaking at a special media conference held yesterday at the Government Information Department.

"A consignment of free vaccines for 20 per cent of the country's population is to be received under the COVAX initiative and the first consignment is to be received by the end of this month. We hope that the rest of the vaccine will also be received soon," he said.

He further said the Government has taken measures to purchase 18 million doses of the Oxford AstraZeneca vaccine, which will be sufficient to inoculate nine million persons as two doses are needed per person.

The AstraZeneca vaccine can be kept at normal refrigerator temperatures (Celsius 2 to 8), which will facilitate storage and transport logistics. TO PAGE 02







## **Indian fishers seek** end to dry fish ban

Fishermen and traders of Kasimedu want the Sri Lankan Government to lift the ban on Karuvaadu (dry fish) imports from

The Kasimedu fishing harbour sends around 500 tonnes of dry fish to Thoothukudi, from where it is sent to Sri Lanka.

Nanjil Ravi of Akhila Indhiya Meenavar Sangam said there were at least 10 traders, who depended on the dry fish trade with the island nation. "The ban on dry fish imports from India was supposed to be only for 100 days and it began in November.

The time limit is over now,

which is why we are asking that the ban be lifted," he said. Many types of Dry fish, includ-

ing maasi karuvaadu, made from Yellowfin and Skipjack tuna, thenna koni and nethili, are processed and sent from Kasimedu. "About 150 containers of dry fish at the Thoothukudi harbour are waiting to be sent to Sri Lanka. The government is asking us to take up deep sea fishing but if we do not have the market for our catch, what is the use? Fishermen have stopped going on deep sea trips since we already have a lot of unsold dry fish," a trader said. (The Hindu)

It has branches in Kandy, Kurunegala, Anuradhapura, Bandarawela, Koggala, Ratnapura, Pasikudah and Jaffna. The Government plans to establish hotel schools in other districts of

the country. The Minister pointed out that various courses related to the tourism and hotel industry offered by hotel schools should be upgraded to degree level courses. The Minister said that discussions are already underway with the University Grants Commission in this

Minister Ranatunga also instructed the authorities to introduce a new diploma course in addition to the existing courses for youth who do not possess GCE Ordinary Level qualifications but are currently employed and interested in this field.

'The Government has already planned to utilize 4,000 vaccine centres for this purpose and these centres will administer a total of 300 vaccinations each day, with 2.000 centers in operation per day. So we will be able to administer vaccines for about 600,000 people per a day," he said. This programme, which will target the general population aged 30-60, will probably start in the first week of

Joining the media conference via Zoom technology, Consultant Dr Ananda Wijewickrema stated that the AstraZeneca COVISHIELD vaccine made by the Serum Institute of India, the world's largest vaccine manufacturer, is a safe vaccine since no adverse reactions or sideeffects have been reported so far in Sri Lanka or in other countries where it is currently used. Dr Abeywickrema urged people not to panic

over this vaccine and not to be misled by any myths or rumours.

The Oxford-AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine appears to substantially reduce transmission of the virus, rather than simply preventing symptomatic infections, UK researchers have suggested. The rate of positive PCR tests declined by about half after two doses, according to preliminary results by researchers at the University of Oxford that have yet to be peer reviewed. Their analysis, released as a preprint Tuesday, also supports spacing out doses and estimates good efficacy after just one shot of the Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine. The study did not measure transmission directly - for example, by tracing contacts who were infected by study volunteers. But the researchers did collect regular nasal swabs from some participants and found that the rate of

positive PCR tests fell by half after two doses of the vaccine. After one dose only, the rate of positive tests fell by 67%.

A total of 161,773 individuals mainly from the health sector and the Security Forces/Police have been given the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine so far in Sri Lanka since the commencement of the COVID-19 vaccination drive on January 29, following the donation of 500,000 doses of the COV-ISHIELD vaccine by India the previous day. According to available statistics a total of 3,838 and 1, 625 individuals have been vaccinated on Feb 6 and 7 respectively. The COVID-19 vaccination programme was started on January 29 and 5, 286 were vaccinated on the first day alone. Accordingly the progress of the immunization programme remains at a percentage of 64.7 by the end of Sunday.

petition seeking an interim order staying the validity of approvals granted to the Mahaweli Authority for the proposed Agriculture and Livestock Development Project. The petitioners are further seeking an order to halt the clearing of the lands at Pallebedda-Rambakan Oya, one of the traditional homelands of the indigenous population.

Filing this petition through counsel Ravindranath Dabare, the petitioners have named Central Environmental Authority, Mahaweli Development Authority, Department of Forests, Department of Wild Life Conservation, Minister of Wildlife and Forest Conservation, RAN Plantations (Pvt) Ltd and several others as respondents.

The petitioners are also seeking an order in the nature of a Writ of Mandamus directing Central Environmental Authority to take actions in terms of the National Environmental Act for the illegal clearing of the lands without conducting an Environmental Assess-

The Petitioners state that Pallebedda is a remote village in the dry zone situated at Mahaoya and is found on the way to the Rambakan Oya Reservoir. Pallebedda is one of the traditional homelands of indigenous population known as Veddhas of Sri Lanka. The petitioners said that deforestation and development have greatly contributed to the shrinking of their traditional lands. This has caused a progressive decline in their number, and the community is at risk of losing its ancient traditions, which have been handed down from generation to generation. The Petitioners

state that an area of approximately 500 ha had already been cleared for the Proposed Agricultural and Livestock Development Project at Pallebedda-Rambakan Oya according to the site inspection carried out by the petitioners.

The petitioner states the Central Environmental Authority is the apex body for the protection of the Environment in Sri Lanka and they have failed in their statutory duties to take cognizance of the clearing taking place in the said area and had permitted to proceed with the proposed project without an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) instead of taking action against the relevant parties for clearing 500 acres of forest cover in a water catchment area without obtaining approval in terms of the National Environmen-

The Finance Ministry Secretary explained that the interest rates of the housing loans already

taken by the Government servants and those to be taken will be dropped up to 7 percent and the same is then similar to a Rs.2,500 to Rs.3,000 salary increase.

The Government has also planned to grant loans up to Rs.800,000 for both Government and non government employees at an interest rate of 4 percent to fix solar panels to increase the use of renewable energy and hence reduce the expenditure on fossil fuels for thermal energy.

Minister Alahapperuma was addressing the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) Youth Front meeting held at Kamburupitiya on Saturdav.

The Minister said in keeping with President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's election manifesto, the Power Ministry has been tasked with increasing the use of renewable energy in electricity generation. "We were asked to rely on hydro power, solar power and wind power", he added.

"Nearly 35 per cent of the country's power generation depends on diesel," Minister Alahapperuma pointed out.

"It is the responsibility and the duty of politicians to eradicate the root causes of the issues other than eradicating the particular issue," he further said.

He also said that it was ridiculous for politicians who created a fear psychosis in the country during 88/89 insurgency period to speak of human rights.

## **Indian FM** presents digital **Budget for 2021/22**

Indian Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the first digital Budget on February 1. The budget for the Fiscal Year 2021/22 coincides with India's V-shaped economic recovery overcoming the hurdles posed by COVID-19.

India is slated to be the fastestgrowing economy in the next two years with its real GDP estimated to attain a new record of 11.5% growth in the Fiscal Year 2021/22 and 6.8% in the Fiscal Year 2022/23. India has also set a USD 5 trillion target for its economy in the Fiscal Year 2024/25. With a strong rebound expected in the second half of the Fiscal Year 2020/21(October 2020 to March 2021), the Indian economy is well on course towards realising these figures.

Strong performance of the economy translated into increased attractiveness among investors. FPI inflows reached an all-time monthly high of USD 9.8 billion in November, 2020. Forex reserves also stood at a record high of USD 586 billion, which is sufficient to cover India's import bill for 18 months. Performance of stock market indices have been robust and capitalisation to GDP ratio crossed 100% after more than 10 years.

India's sterling bounce back is attributable to the Government's disciplined and mature policy response to COVID which was guided by four principles: strategy of containment, fiscal, financial, and long-term structural reforms. These were coupled with other measures such as cushioning vulnerable sections of the society during lockdown and boosting consumption and investment while unlocking.

Total outlay for the Fiscal Year 2021/22 Budget is close to USD 500 billion. 



# **Dutch Fort at Kalpitiya**

# WELL CONCEALED YET FORMIDABLE

he coastal areas of Sri Lanka have some stunning historic forts. Some are massive and imposing. Other forts are not that big but served their purpose of a fortified defensive bastion. With the tranquil Puttalam lagoon opening out to the sea, Kalpitiya is one of the most beautiful destinations in the country. A cluster of 23 islands, 14 of which are major islands, enhances the appeal of this resplendent location.

A few metres from the main town is a historic architectural gem - the Dutch Fort. As we entered through the main gate of SLNS Vijaya, the naval quartermaster greeted us and directed us to the fort. The first view from the right side of the Base is the majestic rock wall that has stood here for three centuries. The cool breeze of the lagoon was refreshing. A sailor accompanied us to this historic fortified structure. The fort is not large like Fort Fredrick in Trincomalee or the massive Dutch Fort in Galle; yet we would soon discover its defensive elements that helped it achieve its security objective.

The arched-entrance has two large wooden doors, which is the only point of entry. Above the arch is a pediment which is common in Classical and

Baroque architecture. I noticed the emblem of the Dutch East India Company - the letters 'VoC'. The fort's crest displays two elephants that signify strength and a palm tree in the centre as a reflection of prosperity. The year 1676 is engraved on the wall. Old records say that before this fort was built here there was a small chapel built by the Portuguese priest of the Jesuit Order. The Portuguese had arrived here in 1544 and named the area as Kardiv Island.

The priests from the Jesuit Order served and lived here. Later on, the Dutch moved into this area and called it Calpentyn. They set their sights on the lucrative cinnamon trade which was bountiful in the Puttalam area. By 1666, they managed to chase away the Jesuit priests and began to build this fort. The Dutch initially informed the king that their intention was to build a church, for which he kindly granted permission.

However, they were quite cunning. They began building a fortified structure using granite rocks and coral stones. In fact, they did not build a church on this site. Once the fort was completed in 1676, they added three cement crosses on the topmost walls (one on the entry gate) to misguide the king and other potential seaborne foreign enemies that this was only a fortified church. After building other majestic forts along the

coastal areas, I wondered, why the Dutch would want to conceal the presence of this fort. But, as we explored this mysterious building it was intriguing to understand their security perspectives from a bygone era.

The prudent Dutch engineers had deployed their second security feature to fool the enemy. To understand this we must realize the mode of seaborne assault in that era. An invading ship would fire her canons at the fort well away from the shoreline - focusing on the spot where they believed the troops would be gathered, before sending in 'landing parties' to physically raid the fort. In order to misdirect such fire the Dutch engineers had put up four large granite columns, and erected triangularshaped walls on top of them, that gave the illusion of a church from a distance. This misleading structure is about 75 metres long. When the enemy fired, there was nothing of significance here and the cannon balls would land and explode onto a large open field. The field is in the centre of this old fort.

We climbed an angled ramp that took us to the ramparts. The walls were about eight feet wide and interspaced with gun turrets. The top of the walls are sloped to reflect a 20-degree angle a defensive tactic where under siege, Dutch sailors would pour hot oil that would burn anyone trying to mount the walls. Back in the day, there were five bastions on this fort.

Four at the edge of each side and the fifth was placed outside the fort - forming the outer perimetre defence. There were 16 cannons on the wall directed towards the lagoon and 14 cannons aiming at the landside. Unfortunately, with time, not a single canon is found today. Naval sources assume that each gun had a two-man crew. Thus, there would have been 60 Dutch men who manned these 30 guns, making this a formidable fort with a destructive fire wall. In addition, there would have been another 20 men working as cooks, clerks, horse keepers and storekeepers. We descended some steps and encountered a tunnel.

The Kalpitiya Fort has two tunnels, one leading to the sea and the second leading to the old Dutch church. The first is on the left flank of the fort. As we entered it was almost pitch black and some large bats excitedly made their exit. Using our mobile phone lights, we were able to see the tunnel which runs to a length of about 10 feet, before it had been sealed decades ago. There is some speculation as to where it exactly leads. The second tunnel is even more mysterious and is adjacent to the fake church structure. It is believed that it definitely went past the shore connect-

ing the fort to a nearby island. It was a tunnel for a tactical retreat in case of an intense assault. The other buildings in the fort include a commander's residence, dining hall, armoury, two prison cells and a storeroom. Drinking water was obtained from two wells. Years after erecting the fort the Dutch did build a real church for worship about 400 metres away from the fort, in 1706. The church belongs to the Dutch Reformed denomination, and we took time to visit the church in the evening. The old belfry is still standing. By 1795,

the British took control of this fort.

Initially, a naval detachment was set

up here in 1973 to guard the lagoon and in 1982, this Base was commissioned as SLNS Vijaya. In the Dutch era, this was a vital trading point. There were boats that took cinnamon from here to Puttalam and then ferried via Hamilton Canal to the Colombo Port. For many years, the Navy has maintained this beautiful fort, protecting its historic value. On weekdays prior to the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak, busloads of schoolchildren would visit this fort on study tours. Tourists also visited this fort. The Sri Lanka Navy has done a commendable task by teaching the visitors about the maritime history of old Ceylon in Kalpitiya.

Towards late afternoon, I boarded a boat with a naval petty officer and set off to discover some of the islands. These lush islands are home to a variety of marine bird species. We went to one particular island where it is believed the tunnel from the fort emerged. We got onto the island with much expectation. The place was partly covered by mangroves and I noticed many tropical birds nesting amidst the clusters of trees. A snake slithered into the network of roots. I walked with caution but there was no trace of the tunnel's exit point, perhaps it has been sealed by nature's own process. On our return to the fort, I realized that the formation of islands around this fort could easily mislead a first-time visitor, thus concealing the real presence of this ancient formidable Dutch Fort. The view of the sunset was a bonus.



# DR Congo announces 'resurgence' of Ebola

**DR CONGO:** The Democratic Republic of Congo (DR CONGO) on Sunday announced a "resurgence" of Ebola in its troubled east after a woman died of the disease, just three months after authorities declared the end of the country's latest outbreak.

The World Health Organization (WHO) said it had dispatched a team of epidemiologists to the scene of the latest death to inves-

'We have another episode of the Ebola virus" in the Biena health zone of North Kivu province, Health Minister Eteni Longondo told state television RTNC.

"It was a farmer, the wife of a survivor of Ebola, who showed typical signs of the disease on February 1," he added.

She died on February 3, after which a sample of her blood tested positive for Ebola, the health ministry said.

DR Congo had on November 18 declared that epidemic, which lasted nearly six months in the northwestern province of Equateur, to be over. It was the country's eleventh Ebola outbreak, claiming 55 lives out of 130 cases.

The last person declared recovered from Ebola in Equateur was on October 16.

The widespread use of vaccinations, which were administered to more than 40,000 people, helped curb the disease.

The return of the virus in the country's northeast -- a region plagued by violence between armed groups -- comes as the vast African country is also fighting its own COVID-19 outbreak, with 681 deaths to date.

A previous Ebola outbreak in the DRC's east, which ran from August 1, 2018 to June 25, 2020, was the country's worst ever, with 2,277 deaths.- AFP

#### India provides Afghanistan 500,000 COVID-19 vaccines, China delivers 600,000 doses to Cambodia

**AFGHANISTAN:** Afghanistan received half a million doses of Astra-Zeneca's COVID-19 vaccine from India Sunday, the first consignment to arrive in the country that was hit hard by the virus last year.

Kabul plans to ultimately cover 60 percent of the population and was working with international agencies like the World Bank, Asian Development and the European Union to procure more jabs.

In August last year a Health Ministry survey revealed that 10 million people -- nearly a third of the country's population -had been infected with the coronavirus.

The country of 32 million people has limited testing capacity, but recent months have seen a decline in new infections, with officials registering about 55,300 confirmed

cases so far and about 2,400 deaths.

Meanwhile, China delivered 600,000 doses of its Sinopharm coronavirus vaccine to Cambodia on Sunday, making the kingdom the latest country to use Chinese jabs despite concerns about their efficacy compared to Western alternatives.

Cambodian leader Hun Sen announced last month that China would donate one million doses of its coronavirus vaccine to the kingdom - which will cover 500,000 people because two doses are required. Cambodia plans to vaccinate at least 10 million of its 16 million population with shots from both China's Sinopharm and Sinovac as well as the British-Swedish AstraZeneca. - AFP

# "Legendary" US Secretary of **State George Shultz dead**

**US:** George Shultz, Ronald Reagan's genial Secretary of State who identified a diplomatic opening that helped end the Cold War but contributed to a new brand of conflict by advocating preemptive strikes, has died. He was 100.

An economics professor who saw himself more as a data-driven expert than an ideologue, Shultz had the rare distinction of serving in four different Cabinet positions -- including Treasury Secretary as Richard Nixon dismantled the post-World War II Bretton Woods monetary system.

President Joe Biden said "few people did as much to shape the trajectory of American diplomacy and American influence in the 20th century" as Shultz.

"I regret that, as President, I will not be able to benefit from his wisdom, as have so many of my predecessors," Biden said

in a statement. Secretary of State Antony Blinken described Shultz as a "legend" and a "visionary."

In the Reagan White House, notorious for infighting, Shultz was one of the least controversial figures, cultivating cordial ties with Congress and the press and -most crucially -- rock-solid backing from the President himself, who kept Shultz as his top diplomat for six and a half years.

In early 1983, half a year into his tenure, Shultz returned from China to a snowedunder Washington and was invited by Nancy Reagan to a casual dinner at the White House, where he was intrigued to hear the famously anti-Communist president sound eager to meet the Soviets.

"He had never had a lengthy session with an important leader from a Communist country, and I could sense he would relish such an opportunity," Shultz wrote in his memoir, "Turmoil and Triumph."

Days afterward, Shultz brought the Soviet ambassador to the White House in an unmarked car for a secret meeting with Reagan, who pressed for Moscow to allow the emigration of Pentecostal Christians who had sought refuge in the US embassy.

The Soviets quietly followed through. Reagan's unlikely role as a negotiator with the superpower he termed an "evil empire" had begun.

In 1985, Mikhail Gorbachev ascended to the helm of the Communist Party, and Shultz - joining then-vice president George H.W. Bush -- flew to Moscow and met him at the funeral of his predecessor, Konstantin Chernenko.

Shultz immediately detected opportunities with Gorbachev.

"Gorbachev is totally different from any Soviet leader I've met," Shultz told report-

A former Marine who fought the Japanese in World War II, he recalled the trust he built with the Soviets as Treasury secretary when he offered a sincere salute at a memorial to their war dead.

Shultz's approach with Gorbachev encountered deep skepticism from Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger and CIA chief Bill Casey, but Reagan overruled

By 1987, Reagan and Gorbachev signed the landmark Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty. The Soviet Union soon began disintegrating after Gorbachev initiated liberal reforms and dissent grew.

Shultz later played down Gorbachev's role, pointing to underlying weaknesses in the Soviet system and crediting the US leader's massive boost in defense spend-

He also hailed European allies, especially West Germany, that defied public protests against NATO missile deployments

While Secretary of State, Shultz's policies in the Middle East were more moderate. He repeatedly clashed with ally Israel, especially over Lebanon, and opened contacts with the Palestine Liberation Organization. - AFP

# Dozens missing after glacier breaks in Himalayas

**INDIA:** At least 140 people are missing and nine were killed in India after a portion of a glacier broke in the Himalayas on Sunday, sending powerful floods into nearby hydroelectric plants.

Part of the Nanda Devi glacier snapped off

Sunday morning, dispensing a deluge of trapped water down into other bodies of water in the northern state of Uttarakhand, The Associated Press reported.

Rescue crews, including more than 2,000 military members, paramilitary members and

police, were deployed to attempt to save those trapped by the disaster that experts attributed to climate change and warming temperatures.

Vivek Pandey, a spokesperson for the paramilitary Indo Tibetan Border Police, said the surge of water and debris wiped out the hydroelectric plant on the Alaknanda River and damaged a plant that was being built on the Dhauliganga River, according to the AP.

He said at least 42 workers were stuck in tunnels at the Dhauliganga plant, with 12 of those being rescued.

'The rescuers used ropes and shovels to reach the mouth of the tunnel. They dug through the debris and entered the tunnel. They are yet to come in touch with the stranded people," Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat, Uttarakhand's head elected official, said, according to the AP. The flood led to the evacuations of several

villages along both rivers, and Ravi Bejaria, a government spokesman, said it had damaged homes without releasing information on whether residents were injured, missing or

India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Twitter that he is "constantly monitoring the unfortunate situation."

"India stands with Uttarakhand and the nation prays for everyone's safety there," he

"From April, postal items that do not bear a Palestinian postal code will not be processed," Palestinian Minister of Communications Ishaq Sidr told reporters in Ramallah, the West Bank headquarters of the Palestinian "It is a question of asserting

Palestinian rights," he said. Palestinian postal codes would also help put an end to the seizure of shipments from abroad, Sidr said.

He said six tonnes of packages had been held up in Jordan since 2018, and accused Israel of obstructing deliveries.

Using postcodes "will prevent Israel from seizing postal items that come to Palestine, and will help make the services more efficient," Imad al-Tumayzi, head of international relations at the Palestinian Post, told

"In 2020, we recorded more than 7,000 violations of postal equipment on the Israeli side, whether by opening packages, seizing them or summoning their owners for investigation," he said.

Palestinians have complained that they are forced to use costly private courier services to send or receive parcels.

But it was not clear if the application of postal codes would cut mailing costs.

## **London's thinnest house for sale**

**UK:** Blink and you could easily miss it. Wedged between a doctor's surgery and a hairdressing salon, London's thinnest house is only identified by a streak of dark blue paint.

But the five-floor house in Shepherd's Bush - which is just 5ft 6ins (1.6 metres) at its narrowest point -- is currently on the market for £950,000 (\$1.3 million, 1.1 million euros).

The unusual property, originally a Victorian hat shop with storage for merchandise and living quarters on its upper floors, was built sometime in the late 19th or early 20th century.

In a nod to its past, the house still has an old-fashioned glass shopfront with a lamp in the shape of a bowler hat.

David Myers, an assistant sales manager at Winkworth estate agents which is selling the property, said the house was worth its price tag because it's "a unique part of London history".

"It's a bit of London magic," he told AFP. The dimensions of the house differ throughout.

While the kitchen at the end of the lower ground floor is the house's narrowest spot, it opens up into a dining area that's nearly double the size. A 16 foot-wide garden lies beyond behind French windows. The ground floor, which now

contains a reception where the old shop would have been, and the first floor are of similar sizes. The first floor -- where a bed-

room and study can be found -also has a roof terrace with commanding views over the roofs and chimney pots of west London.

Spiral stairs lead from the second floor -- the location of a bathroom and shower room -- up to the master bedroom on the third. The price of the house is prohibitive for most in Britain, where the average house price is £256,000, but typical of London's property market.

# Hungarian journalists protest drone law

**HUNGARY:** When Hungarian journalist Gabi Horn was called in by police last October about her investigative news site's drone footage of a business tycoon's estate, at first she thought a corruption probe had been opened.

"It turned out instead we had been reported for suspected 'illegal acquisition of data'," said Horn, 53, who works for the Atlatszo.hu outlet.

While that criminal case was eventually dropped by prosecutors, it came as a new law was adopted that Horn is convinced is aimed at hindering such investi-

The Government says the new regulation on aerial drones, in force since January 1, protects privacy and sets safety standards. But it also punishes the publication of drone footage of property without the owner's permission with up to one year in jail.

"That makes it harder for journalists to investigate suspected misuse of public money and EU

funds," Horn told AFP at Atlatszo's office in Budapest.

According to Zoltan Helmeczi, manager of a shop in Budapest selling drones from Chinese brand DJI, few of Hungary's estimated 10,000 drone users adhered to the previous looser

rules. The law adds to press freedom and corruption concerns that have dogged Prime Minister Viktor Orban's government since it came to power in 2010.

In 2019 the Reporters Without Borders watchdog described the degree of media control in Hungary as "unprecedented in an EU country".

Corruptionmonitor Transparency International meanwhile relegated Hungary in its latest annual index to

joint bottom place in the EU alongside Romania and Bulgaria.

Budapest dismisses both organisations' reports, as they are part-funded by the liberal US billionaire George Soros, who the anti-immigration Orban has long accused of leading "pro-migration" forces.

The EU recommended a lower weight threshold for drone registration of 250 grammes (about nine ounces), but Hungary set this at 120 grammes, and has brought in mandatory pilot training and registration of all drones with cameras regardless of weight.

# 'Hope' probe approaches Mars

**UAE:** The first Arab interplanetary mission is expected to reach Mars' orbit Tuesday in what is considered the most critical part of the journey to unravel the secrets of weather on the Red Planet.

The unmanned probe - named "Al-Amal", Arabic for "Hope" -blasted off from Japan last year, marking the next step in the United Arab Emirates' ambitious space programme.

Here are some facts and figures about the oil-rich nation's project, which draws inspiration from the Middle East's golden age of cultural and scientific achievements.

The UAE, made up of seven emirates including Dubai and Abu Dhabi, has 12 satellites in orbit, with plans to launch several more in coming

In September 2019 it sent the first Emirati into space, Hazza al-Mansouri, who was part of a three-member crew. They blasted off from Kazakhstan, returning home after an eight-day mission in which he became the first Arab to visit the International Space Station. But the UAE's ambitions go much further, with a goal of building a human settlement on Mars by 2117.

In the meantime, it plans to create a white-domed "Science City" in the deserts outside Dubai to simulate Martian conditions and develop the technology needed to colonise the planet. The UAE has plans to launch an unmanned rover to the moon by 2024 and is also eyeing future mining projects beyond Earth, as

well as space tourism. It has signed a memorandum of understanding with Richard Branson's space tourism company Virgin Galactic and announced

# Growing protests against Myanmar coup

**MYANMAR:** Tens of thousands of anti-coup protesters in Myanmar poured back on to the streets Sunday, as an internet blackout failed to stifle growing outrage at the military's ouster of elected leader Aung San Suu Kyi.

The fresh rally followed large protests on Saturday across the country condemning the coup that brought a 10-year experiment with democracy to a crashing halt.

Backed by a din of car horns, tens of thousands of chanting protesters in Yangon held up banners saying "Justice for Myanmar" and "We do not want military dictatorship", while others waved the signature red flags of Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) party.

In Yangon, many also flashed the threefinger salute inspired by the "Hunger Games" films, which became a symbol of resistance during the pro-democracy protests in Thailand last year.

Around 300 people gathered at the United Nations office in Bangkok Sunday to protest against the coup, prompting Thai authorities to deploy riot police though there was no clash.

On Sunday, live Facebook video feeds showed the Yangon protesters as they marched through the streets. It was not immediately clear how they bypassed the government block.

The military had widened its efforts to quell organised dissent on Friday when it demanded new blocks on other social media services including Twitter.

Monitoring group Netblocks said Sunday that Myanmar "remains in the midst of a nation-scale internet blackout", with connectivity at 14 percent of usual levels.

Rumours that Suu Kyi had been released triggered brief but raucous street celebrations among her supporters on Saturday, before they were denied by her lawyer who said she remained in

An immensely popular figure despite a tarnished reputation in the West, Suu Kvi has not been seen in public since the coup, but a party spokesman said Friday she was "in good health".

ri Lanka was one of the first countries in this region to begin the vaccination of frontline health workers and Security Forces personnel, using the Oxford/Astra Zeneca vaccines donated by India under its "Vaccine Maitri" programme. According to Government statistics, more than 161,000 health workers and Security Forces/Police personnel have been vaccinated up to February 7, which still leaves around 90,000 more personnel waiting to be vaccinated as we had received 500,000 doses from India and each person needs two doses for the vaccine to fully take effect.

However, the biggest question on everyone's mind is "when will the rest of the population be vaccinated?". There is no argument whatsoever that our valiant healthcare and Security Forces personnel deserved to be vaccinated first, because they are in the frontlines of the battle against COVID-19 and could potentially be exposed to the deadly virus in the course of their duties. However, various opinions have been expressed with regard to the sequence to be followed next.

Most observers are of the view that those above 60 who also suffer from Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs) should be next in line, followed by those in the general population above 60, then over 50s and so on. There is also a counter proposal to vaccinate the working population (25-55 years) first, as being done in some countries, because this is the demographic that can actually spread the disease, due to their mobility and increased social interactions. Right now, only three groups have been left out of the calculations – infants and toddlers, schoolchildren (5-19 years) and pregnant women, since none of the vaccines currently on the market is recommended for these groups.

Sri Lanka, being a part of the World Health Organisation's (WHO) COVAX initiative, will receive around eight million vaccine doses from the facility, which would be sufficient to inoculate around four million persons. Sri Lanka is also negotiating with Chinese and Russian authorities to get down their Sinopharm/ SinoVac and Sputnik V vaccines either on a free or paid-for basis. The State Pharmaceuticals Corporation (SPC) has been appointed as the official agent of the Gamaleya Institute of Russia, the manufacturer of the Sputnik V Vaccine, with a view to packaging or even producing the vaccine here. That would be a landmark development in pharma production in this county, in line with the Government's vision of making at least 70 per cent of the medicines locally. The number of doses pertaining to these negotiations is still not definitely

That still leaves around 14 million Sri Lankans needing to be inoculated. The good news in this regard is that the authorities are planning to order vaccines sufficient for vaccinating around nine million people initially. Dr. Sudarshini Fernandopulle, State Minister for Primary Health Services, Infectious Diseases and Covid-19 Prevention has said that people between the ages of 30 to 60 will be vaccinated against COVID-19 from March 1, 2021. The State Minister said 4,000 centres would be set up for this task and it is also planned to operate 2,000 centres out of it per day for vaccination.

This is a step in the right direction and a direct answer to critics in the Opposition and other forums who had pointed out that the Government had "no plan" to bring down vaccines other than those donated by COVAX and various other countries. Besides, it is always better to wait a few months and consider all scenarios before settling on a vaccine candidate most suitable for our general population from cost, efficacy, storage, transport and logistics perspectives. For example, some of the RNA-based vaccines require storage and transport temperature of around -70 Celsius. Such ultra cold medical grade freezers are available only in a few hospitals in the country and using such vaccines here could be a logistical challenge. There is also the chance that the latest versions of the vaccines will be engineered to be more effective against new variants of the Coronavirus that have emerged in the UK, Brazil and South Africa.

Another lacuna in our COVID testing regimen is that there is almost no genomic sequencing to identify the prevalence of these new strains, which are more transmissible and reportedly more lethal. Right now, only the Sri Jayewardenepura University is apparently equipped with the facilities needed for such genomic sequencing of viruses. We not only need more Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) machines to speed up testing, but also more sequencing machines as well. We will be able to tailor appropriate health responses if we know more about the various variants in circulation.

However, even if 70 percent of the population is vaccinated (the threshold necessary to achieve herd immunity), there will be no free pass to go back to the "Before Times". This is because we do not know whether vaccinated individuals can still pass on the disease and the duration of the effectiveness of the vaccine(s). It could be three months, one year or two years. Some scientists say the COVID jab could be an annual affair, like the flu shot. As always, prevention is better than cure.

# Myanmar: 'Domestic political stability, essential'

oth coverage in the Asian press and statements by neighbouring Asian governments reported in the media on the grabbing of exclusive power by the military in Myanmar, reflects the traditional Asian adage that democracy should go hand in hand with economic and political stability. Thus, sanctions and external funding of protest groups (usually urban elites and the young) are discouraged.

Myanmar is a member of the Association of South East Nations (ASEAN) regional grouping, which was instrumental in guiding Myanmar to transit from military rule to civilian rule a decade ago. The ASEAN secretariat issuing a statement through its current chair Brunei reiterated that "domestic political stability is essential to a peaceful, stable and prosperous ASEAN Community".

Sharon Seah, coordinator at the ASEAN Studies Centre at the National University of Singapore noted that the ASEAN statement this week is a slight deviation from the one that ASEAN made after the 2014 coup d'etat in Thailand. "What is new in this iteration is the fact that the grouping recognises that collective goals can be undermined by a member state's political ructions," she noted.

Seah, in a commentary published by Singapore's *TODAYOnline* news portal, points out that the current ASEAN statement "sounds familiar except that this time, ASEAN is far further along the process of regional integration and community-building, since the ASEAN Community blueprint was launched in 2015". Further, she says, "Pax Americana, as Southeast Asia knows it, is over and the global world order has changed irrevocably", thus external pressure (from outside the region) is not the way to go.

Interestingly, China's media – both Xinhua news agency and Global Times – have described the latest coup in Myanmar as a "reshuffle of Cabinet". Their logic may have some substance. "Myanmar military announced a major cabinet reshuffle hours after a state of emergency was declared on Monday," February 1, reported Xinhua from Yangon.

It referred to a military statement that "new union ministers were appointed for 11 ministries, while 24 deputy ministers were removed from their posts". It added that Union Chief Justice and Judges of the Supreme Court of the Union, Chief Justices and Judges of Regional or State High Courts are allowed to remain in office as well as members of Anti-Corruption Commission, chairman, vice-chairman and members of the Myanmar National Human Rights Commission.

The military used sections of the 2008 constitution, to which Aung San Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) had agreed when they took part in the 2015 elections and won on a landslide. This constitution allows the military to take over the government in the event of an emergency that threatens Myanmar's sovereignty leading to "disintegrating the Union (or) national solidarity". It is debatable if such a situation exists and this could be the subject of argument in coming months.

#### Nine years ago

Luv Puri, a member of UN Secretary-General's good offices on Myanmar writing in *Japan Times* (as a private citizen) this week noted that nearly nine years ago, Aung San Suu Kyi reluctantly decided to participate

in a by-election to the parliament and after being elected she was resolute in her cautiousness as the western leaders sought her advice on how to approach the then President Thein Sein's government.

"She had earlier termed the whole process an instance of sham democracy," recalls Puri, adding, "on February 1, 2021, she proved to be right as the military or Tatmadaw, as it is locally known, staged a coup in the wee hours".

Puri noted that the military's grouse is that at least 8.6 million irregularities were found in voter lists and the ruling NLD government and its appointed election commission failed to review the 2020 elections results, with the latter saying that there was no evidence to support the military's claims. The ruling NLD party won 396 out of 476 seats in the November 8 election, allowing the party to govern for another five years.

"The contesting positions are symptoms of a deeper institutional malaise. Constitutionally, three important ministries relating to national security, namely defence, home and border, are held by the military. The military nominates 30 per cent of the members of parliament," notes Puri. "In an environment in which the military is fighting an existential battle for political survival, after ruling the country directly or indirectly since the formation of the republic, a military coup was an imminent possibility."

China has taken issue with western media reports that it supported the military takeover in Myanmar. *Global Times* reported that China's foreign ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin has refuted such claims at a media briefing. "Such allegations are not factual," he said in Beijing. He has also added that China was puzzled by a leaked document from the UN Security Council that China is supposed to have vetoed.

"Any action taken by the Security Council should contribute to Myanmar's political and social stability, help Myanmar realize peace and reconciliation, and avoid intensifying contradictions," he told the media.

"For India, which had cultivated a careful balance, between nudging along the democratic process by supporting Ms. Suu Kyi, and working with the military to ensure its strategic interests to the North East and deny China a monopoly on Myanmar's infrastructure and resources, the developments are unwelcome," noted India's *The Hindu* in an editorial. "The government will need to craft its response taking into consideration the new geopolitical realities of the U.S. and China as well as its own standing as a South Asian power."

## "Share of uncertainties"

The Indian Express also expressed similar sentiments in an editorial noting that new developments "will create its share of uncertainties" for India. "It must continue its engagement with Myanmar and leverage its influence with the Army to persuade it to step back," added the Express.

While Myanmar's expat populations in places like Bangkok, Tokyo and Sydney have demonstrated calling for international intervention, within Myanmar people have taken a different strategy to confront the military takeover. *Myanmar Times* (MT), that is locally owned and published from Yangon, carried a number of reports on how this is shaping up. They reported about various aspects of civil disobedience campaigns initiated by trade unions, leading artistes and the medical profession.

MT reported that a movement, which urged Myanmar citizens to not buy and use products affiliated with the Tatmadaw has gone viral since February 3. The military has been linked to a large number of businesses in various sectors. They have been associated with food and beverage products, cigarettes, the entertainment industry, internet service providers, banks, financial enterprises, hospitals, oil companies, and wholesale markets and retail businesses, among others, the newspaper pointed out.

MT also reported that "Myanmar celebrities, who usually make headlines for their latest albums, haircuts and fashion choices, have used their social media profiles for an entirely different purpose this week". Since the military seized power on February 1, "Myanmar's singers, actors and artists changed their topic of interest from cosmetics to disobedience to the rule of the junta" noted MT. Among the celebrities are Paing Takhon who started his modelling career in 2014 and has amassed over 1 million followers on Facebook and filmmaker Daung with 1.8 million.

Meanwhile, the Confederation of Trade Unions Myanmar (CTUM) and Myanmar Industry Craft and Service-Trade Unions Federation (MICS) announced that they had resigned and are no longer part of government, employers and workers' groups. The 'Civil Disobedience Campaign' that was launched on February 2 is also joined by health-care workers in 40 townships including doctors and nurses from 80 hospitals.

Meanwhile, Seah argues that this month's events are a big setback for ASEAN community building and to help in any democratic retransformation, an ASEAN-led commission to investigate the military junta's allegations of electoral fraud could be set up, headed by a mutually respected senior ASEAN personality trusted by all sides. "For the commission's findings to be accepted at the international level, support must come from ASEAN's external stakeholders," she argues.

"The selection of the commission members must be transparent from the get-go and may require consultations with key stakeholders both inside and outside Myanmar (while) ASEAN should secure the agreement of the military junta to dial down to a state of limited emergency, refrain from the use of force against civilians and allow the functioning of government with specified conditions between the NLD and the military".

# ENHANCING PRODUCTIVITY IN A LANGUAGE

#### LANGUAGE MATTERS

ast week, we discussed some of the features such as redundancy and structure dependency that characterize language. In today's article, we will talk about some more features of language such as productivity semanticity and reflexivity. This will serve to broaden our knowledge and understanding of the nature and character of language.

#### PRODUCTIVITY

Language is a productive system in two perspectives. First, we can produce an infinite number of sentences and infinitely long sentences in a language. Second, we can create new words and sentences in a language which adds to the productivity in that language. We will discuss each of these in detail as in the following.

As we know, we have a limited number of words and grammar rules in a language to produce sentences. For instance, the English language has about half a million words. However, as we also know the number of sentences that one can produce in the English language is unlimited or infinite. Think about the number of sentences that you have spoken so far since your childhood and the number of sentences you will speak into your adulthood.

Think about the number of sentences that the speakers of the English language have spoken so far and will speak into the future. That is limitless. So, what is wonderful about language is that by means of a finite number of words and grammar rules, language serves to produce an infinite number of sentences. This productive capacity totally relies on the fact that language is a structure dependant phenomenon as we dis-



cussed in the last week's article. That is, a finite number of sentence structures such as SVO (Subject Verb Object), etc. and PNp (Preposition Noun phrase), etc. are utilised to produce an unlimited number of sentences in a language. For instance, the SVO structure in English can be exploited to produce any number of sentences as shown in the following.

Mary ate a sandwich. (SVO) Saman met Maala. (SVO) Paul painted the house. (SVO) Nimal brushed his teeth. (SVO), etc. In the same way, the SOV structure in Sinhala is used to produce a limitless num-

ber of sentences as shown in the following.

Siri ambe kaewa. "Siri ate mangoes."



sent the letter." (SOV)

Miniha sindu-wak kiwa. "The man sang a song." (SOV), etc.

This productive capacity totally At the same time, the structure dependence also allows us to produce infinitely long sentences. For example, a sentence formed with the SVO pattern can be combined with another sentence as shown here to produce another sentence.

Tom knows that Mary ate a sandwich. In the sentence above, the clause/sentence Mary ate a sandwich is combined with the clause/sentence Tom knows to produce the sentence Tom knows that Mary ate a sandwich. In turn, this sentence can be combined with another clause/sentence to produce a new sentence as in the following.

Saman thinks that Tom knows that Mary ate a sandwich.

In turn, this sentence can be combined with another clause/sentence to produce a new sentence as in the following.

Mala assumes that Saman thinks that Tom knows that Mary ate a sandwich.

And we can go on and on as there is no limit to the length of a sentence that we can

At the same time, language can be and is used creatively. This creative aspect of language adds to productivity. Language has the capacity to produce new items (i.e., words/sentences) in creative ways. Language allows us to create new words and add

them to it. For instance, the words such as laptop, software, did not exist in the English language 40 years ago and at least 10 words a day are said to be added to the English language. This is common to any language and some people even assume language to be a living thing that grows. Thus, language is a pro-

SEMANTICITY

Items produced in language at the word or sentence level are used to mean things. What this means is that language has semanticity. Words and sentences processed in our minds are used to refer to ideas, feelings, concepts, states, physical objects, events, etc. in the actual world which we refer to as the meaning of these

words and sentenc-For

instance, the word tree in the English language or gasa in the Sinhala language refer to the physical object with the roots, trunk, branches, twigs, leaves etc, in the world. The word *happiness* in the

English language or sathuta in the Sinhala language refer to the abstract feeling that we experience in the world. A sentence such as Saman ate an apple refers to an event in the world whether it is true or false. A sentence such as Saman loves Mala refers to a feeling experienced by two people in the world whether it is true or false. Thus, the thing that establishes a connection between a form (a combination of sounds/letters in the form of a word/sentence) and meaning (the things, ideas, feelings, events, etc. that the word/sentence refer to) is what we call language. Thus, language makes sense of the phenomena in our minds and the world.

#### REFLEXIVITY

Language is also used to make sense of the language itself. For instance, I am making use of the tool called language right now to talk about language itself. This character

is known as reflexivity. The particular language that one uses to talk about language/a language is known as metalanguage. For instance, I am using English as the metalanguage to talk about language in these articles. Thus, reflexivity is yet a significant feature of language.

In today's and the last two articles, we talked about some features that characterize language such as spontaneity, arbitrariness, displacement, redundancy, structure dependency, productivity, semanticity and reflexivity. I hope that this discussion served to have a better understanding of what language is and does to form a sound foundation for the ideas discussed in the articles to come. Now, it is right time for us to start talking about the ideas associated with the process of acquiring a language by us at a very young age as children. In our next article, we will discuss this.

# An appeal for fairness – instead of protectionism currently in play

**Ensuring equitable** access to vaccines globally during a pandemic is not only a moral issue, but an economic imperative to protect the well-being of people everywhere. But when will Africa get the protection it needs? If all lives are equal, why isn't access to vaccines?

he current situation with regard to the access and distribution of COVID-19 vaccines vividly illustrates the decades-old contradictions of the world order.

Rich and powerful nations have rushed to lock up supply of multiple vaccine candidates. Worse, some are hoarding vaccines purchasing many times more doses than they need. This leaves African and other developing countries either far behind in the vaccine queue, or not in it at all.

There are worrying signs of vaccine nationalism in Europe and North America. The pressures on political leaders to vaccinate all their citizens before sharing supplies with others is understandable. But forcing smaller or poorer countries to wait until everyone in the north has been catered for is shortsighted.

Delaying access to vaccines for citizens of developing countries is ultimately many times more costly. The pandemic will rage on, crippling the global economy. New mutations may continue to emerge at a more rapid pace. The world risks reversing decades of human development gains and eclipsing the 2030 sustainable development

In this context, the billions of dollars it

developing world is not particularly high, given the return on the investment. Doing so would unlock global commerce, which would benefit all trading nations during the long road to economic recovery that lies ahead of us. We need global value chains to be fully operational again and to include


Last year, the world came together to provide additional fiscal space for developing countries through the debt service suspension initiative at the G20. This helped governments in Africa pay for their COVID responses and provide additional social protection, thereby preventing the worst outcomes. We shouldn't lose that spirit now and give in to an unfortunate erosion of global solidarity.

The Covax facility, led by the World Health Organisation, was supposed to ensure doses for 20% of Africa's people right from the start and at the same time as richer countries. However, nearly two months after the first vaccines have been administered, it is still not clear when African nations will be able to start immunising people, though the first doses may begin reaching the continent later this month.

#### **Unfair prices**

What can be done in practical terms? The





get the same fair prices that they have already negotiated for themselves. One pharmaceutical firm is reportedly planning to charge \$37 per dose for "small orders". Recently, one African country reported being asked to pay more than double the price that the European Union had negotiated for the same product.

During natural disasters, price gouging for essential supplies is illegal. It should not be tolerated for vaccines during a pandemic either. If prices are fair, and Africa is allowed to place orders, many countries on the continent would be willing and able to pay for themselves. But, given the current market structure, they will need active support from more powerful countries to do so. The African Union and Afreximbank have set up the Africa Medical Supplies Platform to help countries secure financing by providing advance commitment guarantees of up to \$2bn to manufacturers. The platform has negotiated an initial order of 270m doses, but this is still very far from the 60% coverage Africa needs to achieve some measure of herd immunity, and there is no telling when those supplies will be available.

#### **Developing countries**

Vaccine candidates from China and Russia are also coming online and may provide an alternative for some developing countries. However, the reality is that most countries will only be able to procure vaccines that have been approved by the World Health Organisation. The WHO should speed up emergency use approvals for COVID-19 vaccines in line with action taken by major national regulators in Europe and North America.

Africa is not sitting back and waiting for charity. We have learned our lessons from the past. All we ask for is transparency and fairness in vaccine access, not the protectionism currently in play.

Ensuring equitable access to vaccines globally during a pandemic is not only a moral issue, but an economic imperative to protect the well-being of people everywhere. But when will Africa get the protection it needs? If all lives are equal, why isn't access to vaccines?

# **US vet recovers** lost wallet after 53 years

**US:** A meteorologist in the US Navy was pleasantly surprised to recover a wallet he had lost - 53 years ago in Antarctica.

Paul Grisham, 91, did not even remember losing the billfold when friendly strangers contacted him to return it via mail, The San Diego Union-Tribune reported this week.

The lucky discovery was made during the 2014 demolition of the scientific base on Ross Island, where Grisham had been stationed as a weather forecaster from October 1967 to November 1968.

The sailor's wallet was hidden behind a locker and contained, among other things: his Navy identity card, his driver's license, a reference card for what to do in case of a biological or chemical weapons attack... and a ration card for beer.

Grisham said he was "blown away" that so many people had gone to great lengths to reunite the wallet with its owner.

It took a long line of Good Samaritans to return the wallet to him. The head of a research group in Antarctica contacted one of his former employees, who previously had successfully reunited a Navy ID bracelet -- spotted for sale in a store -- with its rightful owner. Along with his daughter, they appealed to a foundation for veterans, who in turn contacted the Naval Weather Service Association, of which Grisham had been a member.

The wallet finally arrived last Saturday in good condition at Grisham's home in San Carlos, north-

# China should expect 'extreme competition' from U.S.- Biden

**US:** US President Joe Biden says China is in for "extreme competition" from the U.S. under his administration, but that the new relationship he wants to forge need not be one of conflict.

In an interview broadcast Sunday, Mr Biden acknowledged that he has yet to speak with Chinese President Xi Jinping since his inauguration January 20, but noted that the two leaders had met many times when both men served their countries as vice presi-

"I know him pretty well," Mr Biden said in an excerpt of the interview aired Sunday by CBS' "Face the Nation." When they do speak, they will have "a whole lot to talk about," Mr Biden said.

President Biden appears to be concentrating his initial telephone diplomacy on US allies. He so far has spoken with the leaders of Canada, Mexico, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Japan, South Korea, Australia and the NATO secretary-general.

He also worked in a conversation with Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Shortly after Biden succeeded President Donald Trump in the White House, a spokesperson for China's Foreign Ministry said that "after this very difficult and extraordinary time, both the Chinese and American people deserve a better future." Beijing welcomed the Biden administration's decision to remain in the World Health Organisation and return to the Paris climate agreement.

The new administration, however, is unlikely to significantly alter US policies on trade, Taiwan, human rights and the South China Sea that have angered Xi's increasingly assertive government.

Biden, in the interview taped Friday, said he has said to Xi " all along, that we need not have a conflict." But, Mr Biden added, there will be "extreme competition. And I'm not going to do it the way that he knows. And that's because he's sending signals as

Biden said he will not pursue US-China relations in the way that Mr Trump did but will focus on "international rules of the road." - AFP

# Trump's falsehoods about election cost taxpayers \$519 mn

**US:** Former US President Donald Trump's onslaught of falsehoods about the November election misled millions of Americans, undermined faith in the electoral system, sparked a deadly riot and has now left taxpayers with a large, and grow-

The total so far: \$519 million.

The costs have mounted daily as government agencies at all levels have been forced to devote public funds to respond to actions taken by Trump and his supporters, according to a Washington Post review of local, state and federal spending records, as well as interviews with government officials. The expenditures include legal fees prompted by dozens of fruitless lawsuits, enhanced security in response to death threats against poll workers, and costly repairs needed after the Jan. 6 insurrection at the U.S. Capitol. That attack triggered the expensive massing of thousands of National Guard troops on the streets of Washington amid fears of additional extremist violence.

Although more than \$480 million of the total is attributable to the military's estimated expenses for the troop deployment through mid-March, the financial impact of the president's refusal to concede the election is probably much higher than what has been documented thus far, and the true costs may never be known. "I think anytime you see an event like we saw on January 6, it changes your perspective going forward. You don't take things for granted like we used to," said Michael Rapich, Superintendent of the Utah Highway Patrol, which spent \$227,000 on January 17 to deploy 300 troopers to the State Capitol after threats of an armed siege by Trump supporters ahead of the inauguration of President Biden. "It is an incredible amount of money to spend."

The cost to the federal government continues to grow daily as thousands of National Guard troops patrol Washington and lawmakers consider supplemental spending to bolster their security.

The 25,000 troops that were deployed in Washington traveled on military planes and stayed in local hotels - their presence aimed at restoring order in the nation's capital after an attempted insurrection that overwhelmed the Capitol Police and led to five deaths.

It is not clear whether the House Democrats managing Trump's impeachment trial plan to bring up the financial costs borne by taxpayers as a result of what critics have called his "big lie." The trial begins Tuesday, and Democrats have focused mainly on Trump's speech to supporters shortly before

Several states are working to calculate the taxpayer costs for additional security and related expenses in the aftermath of the November election and the January 6 protests.

In California, state officials estimated that they spent about \$19 million, deploying 1,000 National Guard troops and hundreds of state troopers from January 14 to January 21 to protect the State Capitol and other locations.

In Ohio, taxpayers spent \$1.2 million to deploy National Guard troops to the closed Statehouse building in Columbus. The New Mexico legislature increased its appropriation for Capitol security during the 60-day session by almost 40 percent this month, handing taxpayers a bill of \$1.5 million for personnel, equipment and other expenses, officials

Taxpayers paid to deploy helicopters to monitor potential demonstrations in Texas and North Carolina, temporary fencing around the capitols in Lansing, Michigan and Olympia, Washington, and extra security details for state lawmakers attending legislative sessions. - NDTV

# Batik dye causes blood-red flood in Indonesia

**INDONESIA:** A surreal, blood-red river inundated the Indonesian village of Jenggot after floods hit a nearby batik factory on Saturday, causing a frenzy on social media.

Thousands of users on Twitter shared photos and videos of the village south of Pekalongan city in Central Java being flooded by crimson-coloured water, which some social media users said reminded them of blood.

"I am so afraid if this photo

gets into the bad hands of hoax spreaders," said a Twitter user Ayah E Arek-Arek. "Fear mongering narratives about signs that it is the end of the world, bloody rain etc".

Pekalongan is a city known for manufacturing batik, a traditional Indonesian method of using wax to resist water-based dyes to depict patterns and drawings, usually on fabric.

It is not uncommon for rivers in Pekalongan to turn different colors. Bright green water covered another village north of the

city during a flood last month. "Sometimes there are purple puddles on the road too," said Twitter user Area Julid, who claimed to be from the area.

The head of Pekalongan disaster relief, Dimas Arga Yudha, confirmed that the photos being circulated were real.

"The red flood is due to the batik dye, which has been hit by the flood. It will disappear when it mixes with rain after a while," he said. - CNN

The couple married in 1964, three years before Humperdinck - born Arnold George Dorsey – first found international popularity with his version of Release Me.

r. Neville Fernando, *Maama*, *Aiya*, *Seeya* or *Uncle* to diverse family members, left on his onward journey leaving his family in shock and grief, as Covid-19 took him completely unexpectedly. Even at 89, he was planning to make his next big dream come true. As the elder statesman in our large family circle, he was adored by one and all due to his magnanimous and loving nature. His smile spoke a thousand words. He was the 'go-to' person for many members of the family for sound and genuine advice because he was a man who was able to be happy seeing the happiness of others. All these qualities and more simply make him a wonderful human being, beyond all else.

Neville Uncle and Swarna Aunty for me were an exemplary couple, who apparently had a roaring love affair before they tied the knot, juicy details of which we used to hear as kids from my mother and grandmother, who had supposedly supported their romance discreetly. While there are many kudos and achievements credited to him, for me, he embodied the true essence of being a wonderful family man. His life's partner of 65 years, Swarna Aunty, will vouch for this while constantly complaining that he was a 'stubborn man'. I would call this trait 'fearless and gutsy' and loved this fighting spirit he embodied in the face of injustice and adversity. Needless to say, he was a force to reckon with even as a husband, a father and a grandfather, because his zest for life I believe was incomprehensible to many.

As a doctor who served the rich and poor alike in Panadura for many years, was sought after by his patients clearly for his well-known athgune (healing hands). I believe this is where he earned his loyal fan base to venture








# Amjad Buksh one of the best scrum halves

Kingswood College, Kandy is the pioneer institution which introduced Rugby in the country in 1891 and has been known as a rugby powerhouse. It has produced several top players who have brought honour and fame to Sri Lanka with their deeds on the rugby field. Amjad Buksh can be considered as one of the best players of Kingswood who played in the pivotal role of scrum half. He was the key link man between the forwards and the back division reaching great heights locally and interna-

Allowdeen Buksh is his father who passed away in 2007 and mother is Doreen Buksh and he has three siblings. His father was an old boy of Zahira College, Gampola and played hockey. He joined the Sri Lanka Navy as a Chief Engineer later retired and joined the Royal Navy in Oman . His elder brother Ansar was a Kingswoodian who donned the college jersey in rugby and motivated Amjad to take up playing rugby. Ansar migrated to Wellington, New Zealand and settled down there. His elder sister Rikaza Alith is a pre-school teacher and owns a day care centre while the younger sister Rizana Liyanage owns a hotel in Kalpitiya . His mother Doreen was a former hockey player who schooled at Kandy Convent. Being a housewife, she was heavily involved with Kandy Malay Association for a long time and

she served as the President from 2015 to 2019.

Amjad started to showcase his talent from the iunior level captaining the Kingswood under-13 side in 1993 and 1994, after he was enrolled as a kid to junior school. Amjad's peerless all-round performances along with his fighting spirit steered Kingswoodians to a President's Trophy title in 2000 beating Thomians 30-26 in the final under coach G.B. Gunadasa and in the same year Kingswood sevens captaincy reins were handed over to Amjad; his trademark of sniping runs and his kicking was vital to secure a second spot finish at Schools Sevens tournament. After finishing off the school's rugby career on a high note, this

exciting player was picked by Kandy Sports Club in 2002.

While he was playing rugby he was engaged in playing hockey for the under-18 team and scooped the highest number of goals for the Central Province team which enabled him to be selected to the National under-18 squad as



a stand by player when he played for Kandy Youth Club. Apart from his brother Ansar Buksh better known as 'Anchu' his cousin brothers Nilufer, RInnie, Ronny Ibrahim had influenced him immensely to handle the oval shaped ball and hinted that one day he will play for the National

Amjad believes that it's all about sheer hard work and sacrifice one has put in to achieve his goal where one could end obtaining the anticipated results.

Kandy SC held all the aces during that period claiming back to back titles and Amjad Buksh got into full swing as a scrum half showcasing few splendid performances in Kandy SC

colours. In 2006, Amjad joined CR and FC and showed his talent as a sevens player clinching the 'Most Outstanding Player' award at Club Rugby Sevens tournament.

Amjad made his international debut in 2003 and was privileged to don the Sri Lankan jersey at numerous International Championships.

He was a part of the Sri Lankan squad in

International Sevens Series, South African Sevens 2003, Hong Kong International Sevens and was also the scrum half for Sri Lanka in Asian Rugby Championships from 2004 to 2007 held in several countries. He has played under two National Captains namely Pradeep Bassnayake and Sajith Mallikarachchi which he says is an unblemished memory in his

Apart from these he has few other distinctive memories in his illustrious career which began in 2003, at the Singer Sri Lankan International Sevens becoming 'Plate Champions' for the first time in history and being adjudged the second runner up player of the tournament followed by Carlton Sevens in the inaugural tournament held in 2011 at Bogambara Stadium. They emerged champions under his captaincy. In 2007, he was a member of the Lankan team which won the first World International match beating the USA side which was a great feeling at the World Series. He also shared his experience with Havelock Sports Club from 2011 to 2012.

He would like to show his sincere gratitude to some of the men who were instrumental in transforming him as a quality rugby player and a coach. This included his own brother Ansar Buksh, if not for his motivation and influence Amjad would never have achieved the present

status. Ansar played for Kandy SC from 1997 to 2006 and represented the National side from 1997 to 2004. His coach in under-13 was Ananda Kasthuruarachchi, under-15 was Asela Muthumala, from under-17 to 19 was G. B. Gunadasa. According to him the late George Simpkin has been one of the best coaches he has ever met in his career.

After retiring, Amjad started his coaching career completing the level 1 and 2 coaching courses in Sri Lanka and has also successfully completed the World rugby level 1 and 2 sevens coaching course in Malaysia. Most importantly, he was fortunate enough to get international exposure as he was a part of the high performance course conducted by former All Blacks sevens coach Gordon Tietjens.

Currently, Amjad Buksh is heading the coaching department of Malay Sport Club and had a successful outing at the recently concluded Club Rugby League winning the championship of 'C' division. This year, Malay SC managed to clinch the title at the Development Sevens Tournament and got the much needed promotion to 'B' Division. Apart from the coaching stint at Malay SC, Amjad has joined TFB Academy and School of Rugby to share his expertise with the

### John de Saram - youngest competitor at 1948 Olympic Games

Sri Lankan Olympic stars of yesteryear

At the age of 20 years, John De Saram was the youngest athlete to represent Sri Lanka at the 1948 London Olympic

He was included in the Sri Lankan contingent after some outstanding performances for Police Sports Club where he excelled in several track events.

In 1948, he helped Police Sports Club to clinch the 4X110 yards Relay Championship after having completed a successful school career at Royal College,

In fact, in 1940 John De Saram became the Under-12 Track and Field champion at Royal College and he was the Under-14 and Under-16 champion in 1942 and 1944 respectively.

He displayed his skills at All-Ceylon level for the first time by securing the second place in the 100 yards race at the Public Schools Meet in 1945. He also helped Royal College to win the 4X100 yards relay event at the same meet.

He soon grew in reputation to annex the Trophy for the Most Talented Under-16 Athlete in 1946.

John De Saram stole the limelight once again when he established a new Public Schools Meet record with a time of 23.3 seconds in the 220 yards event in 1947.

In the same year, he had the distinction of winning School Athletics Colours and went on to claim the 220 yards event while

pushing more reputed John De Saram athletes of the calibre of W. T. Saunders and S. Krishnarajah into

second and third place respectively. At the 1948 London Olympic Games, John De Saram had the honour of competing in the 100, 200 and 400 metres events. He made it to the second-round of the 200 metres but could not qualify for the semi-finals of this event.

He recorded a time of 51.2 seconds but yet he could not proceed beyond the firstround of the 400 metres event.



In 1949, he displayed his talent and potential once again when he ran the 800 metres in two minutes 01.8 seconds as an undergraduate.

He also had the satisfaction of overcoming a couple of more experienced athletes in the form of Oscar Wijesinghe and H. M. P. Perera in the 220 yards both in 1949 and 1950. John De Saram was a proud

member of the Sri Lankan 4X110 Yards Relay Team which won the fourth place in the 1950 Commonwealth

Games in Auckland, New Zealand. The other three members of the Sri Lanka Relay Team were, Summa Navaratnam, Oscar Wijesinghe and Duncan

Thereafter, John De Saram left for the USA for further studies and had the honour of serving as the Permanent Representative of Sri Lanka to the United Nations (UN) in New York.

#### SL cricketers not prioritised for COVID-19 vaccination

**DHAMMIKA RATNAWEERA** Head of the Medical Committee of Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) Professor Arjuna de Silva yester-

day said that the Sri Lankan cricketers are not included in the priority list for the COVID-19 free vaccination.

"We can't include them to the priority list at this moment as the government has already named frontline health workers and security personnel for the vaccination," he said during a discussion with SLC officials.

Professor de Silva, who is also the chairman of the Sri Lanka Anti Doping Agency (SLADA) said that if the private sector start using the vaccination system in future then the cricketers could also make use of that facility.

"We can't list the cricketers for the priority list. They have a minimum risk for this COVID-19 and also they don't have any ailments such as diabetic or kiddiseases," explained.

"They also maintain a good physical fitness always for the sport. So my personal view is that they can't be included for the COVID-19 priority list," he said.

"Not only the cricketers but even other athletes could request to have this vaccine but we have to proceed according to the Government system," added Profes-

sor de Silva. Meanwhile, the Sri Lanka National pool players who are under a quarantine period, are subject to do their PCR tests today.

RAWALPINDI, MONDAY: Medium pacer Hasan Ali took a maiden tenwicket haul to help Pakistan win its first series against South Africa since 2003 with a 95-run victory in the second Test on the fifth and final

day in Rawalpindi on Monday. Hasan finished with 5-60 to record his best match figures of 11-114 and help dismiss South Africa who were set a daunting 370 to chase for 274 before the tea break.

Hasan's new-ball partner Shaheen Shah Afridi finished with 4-51, while spinner Yasir Shah took the last wicket to spark jubilation among the

Pakistan players. Opener Aiden Markram scored a fighting 108 and Temba Bavuma 61. They put on a 106-run stand for

the fourth wicket to give Pakistan a Markram took a single off the last ball before lunch as South Africa reached the break on 219-3, needing

151 for a win. But Hasan ripped through the tourists' batting order, which lost seven wickets for just 33 runs with the second new ball.

Hasan struck with the second over of the new ball to end Markram's resistance by getting the opener caught in the slip and end his 335-minute fight.

Markram's fifth Test century the first outside South Africa included 13 boundaries and three sixes. Next ball, Hasan had Quinton de Kock caught in the slip for nought, ending the South African skipper's miserable series with just 46 runs. Pakistan skipper Babar Azam was delighted with the win.

"Thanks to South Africa for coming and playing competitive cricket," said Azam. "Hasan's comeback after one year was great and he showed great character."

Hasan was sidelined for more than a year with multiple injuries but came back strongly with 12 wickets in the series.

Azam admitted South Africa's resistance provided a tough challenge for his side.

"At one time, we thought the game could've gone either way when Markram and Bavuma were playing well. But we knew, one wicket and we can come back into the game again," he said.

Losing captain Quinton de Kock said his team lacked a killer touch. "The first-innings deficit did play

a big part," said de Kock. "We lost the big moments in the game and that cost us. It's painful at the moment.

"When we get back home, we'll have to look at our performances and improve on the way forward." Hasan dismissed George Linde

for four to record his third fivewicket haul as he improved upon his previous best match figures of 7-83 against New Zealand in Abu Dhabi

In the morning, both teams were involved in a keen battle for victory as South Africa resumed on 127-1, knowing the best chase at Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium in ten previous Tests was the 200 scored by Sri Lanka in 2000.

South Africa saw Dussen bowled off a beautiful inswinger by Hasan only the third ball of the day while

The hosts reached 39 for one at stumps after spinner Jack Leach bowled Sharma for 12 on a deteriorating Chennai pitch.

Shubman Gill, on 15, and Cheteshwar Pujara, on 12, were batting at the close with India needing another 381 runs to win the first of the four Tests.

On a dominant day for spinners, Ashwin claimed his 28th five-wicket haul in England's second innings.

The off-spinner sent back Rory Burns with the first ball of the innings and struck crucial blows, including taking Ben Stokes for

Skipper Joe Root top-scored with 40 off 32 deliveries. He hit 218 in the first innings of his 100th Test.

Root hit seven boundaries before being trapped lbw by paceman Jasprit Bumrah. Ollie Pope (28) and Dom Bess (25) also helped England build a big lead.

Left-arm spinner Shahbaz Nadeem took two wickets and got wicketkeeper-batsman Jos Buttler stumped for 24. Dan Lawrence (18) was Ishant Sharma's 300th Test wicket.

India were bowled out for 337 in their first innings in the morning session, 42 runs short of avoiding

# Djokovic imperious as Covid-delayed Australian Open finally underway

MELBOURNE, MONDAY: Novak Djokovic served a reminder of why he's the greatest Australian Open champion in history as he demolished France's Jeremy Chardy in straight sets in round one on Monday.

The eight-time winner's 6-3, 6-1, 6-2 win showed that normal service had resumed at Rod Laver Arena after the year's first Grand Slam was delayed three weeks over the coronavirus.

Serena Williams, Naomi Osaka and Simona Halep also enjoyed convincing wins as the tournament finally got underway in front of limited crowds after a troubled build-up.

"It feels great, so great to see people back in the stadium," Djokovic said. "This is the most I've seen on a tennis court in 12 months."



The Australian Open was postponed to allow players to quarantine and play warm-up events, which were suspended for a day last week after a coronavirus case at a tournament hotel.

After the tortuous build-up, third seed Osaka struck the first serve on the centre court against Russia's Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova and strode just 68 minutes later as a 6-1, 6-2 winner.

"I was really nervous coming into this match. I just wanted to play dictable at the Australian Open after well," Osaka told a smattering of spectators on the socially-distanced

In addition to this manufacturing cotton buds with plastic stems and inflatable toys will also be banned from this date.

Speaking to Daily News Business, CEA Deputy Director General (Waste Management), Eng. Upali Indraratna said this decision was taken following an extensive study and research done by CEA on the increasing environmental pollution in the country due to excessive use of plastic by citizens without maintaining proper waste management disposal methods.

He said in addition, the ban of pesticide

in plastic bottles made of PET and PVC material will also come under the ban. Eng. Indraratna said all these decisions

had been taken by the CEA since both the soil and the water bodies in the country have faced severe damage and this situation has affected both the environment, its living beings and also the fauna and flora. The CEA, DDG further


explained that manufactur-

ing of certain other items such as single use food wrapping papers made of Polythene and Sili-Sili bags, shopping bags, grocery bags made out of HDPE( High Density Polyethylene) were

banned in September, 2017. "Spoons of yogurt cups, straws of soft drink bottles and similar other items which are harmful to the environment will be banned in future," he said.

Quoting statistics CEA, DDG Eng. Indraratna said more than 70 MT of Single Use Plastic waste are moving into the sea almost every day through major rivers and other minor waterways and such a situation creates problems to people who are carrying sea activities and the ocean liv-

# **English medium a rarity in government schools**



Government schools by language.

Recent statistics show that only 91,645 (2.2%) students of the 4,061,653 students in government schools' study in a medium categorised as bilingual which includes the English medium. There are only 33 schools that teach all three major languages. These statistics were made available in the School Census report of 2019 released recently.

The medium categorised as bilingual includes Sinhala- English and Tamil-English.

There are 542 Sinhala-

English schools and 168 Tamil-English schools.

This is in contrast to the 24.1% of students in Private schools' that study in the Bilingual/English medium. The majority of students in private schools are in the Western Province.

In government schools, he majority of (3.2 million) children study in Provincial schools. National schools make up 798,372 students.

There are 62,467 male teachers and 184,125 female teachers in service. Of these 119,323 are Grad-

uate Teachers, 120,848 are Trained Teachers 4,759 are Trainee Teachers, 1,518 are Untrained Teachers, and 144 are other teachers.

The highest proportion of national schools are in the Southern Province followed by the Western province. 4% of schools are national schools. There are 373 National schools and 9792 provincial schools.

The majority of students (41.5%) are in schools that have Grades 1-13. 16.1% of students are in schools that have Grades 1-5. 18.7% in schools that have

Grades 1-11, and 23.1% in schools that have Grades

Most schools are open to male and female students with only 385 being open to only one gender.

The majority of schools (42.3%) have 10-25 teachers. Schools with less than 10 teachers make up 29.9% of schools.

The majority of students (43.3%) at A level are in the Arts stream. 10.8% of students are in bioscience, 20.1% in commerce, and 7.3% in engineering and technology.


Government to accelerate the relaxing of control measures.

# PUCSL to crackdown on illegal lubricants



The Public Utilities Commission of Sri Lanka (PUCSL), will further strengthen their initiatives to control the sale of substandard lubricants and the sale of illegal lubricants.

This was stated by the new Chairman of PUCSL, Janaka Ratnayake who assumed duties yesterday and launched their work plan for 2021. The PUCSL, as the shadow regulator of the lubricant market, assists the Ministry of Energy in regulating the lubricant

A project is also underway to dispose of used lubricants in an environmentally friendly manner. A system will be introduced to protect the rights of petroleum consumers and to resolve their grievances.

The Annual Activity Plan 2021 of the electricity sector regulator was also unveiled and 111 projects based on service quality and consumer rights protection in the power industry, water service industry and petroleum industry are to be implemented in 2021.

Projects related to the electricity industry have been formulated under four main objectives and four special projects will be implemented this year to expedite the resolution of electricity consumer complaints and disputes.

Around 45,000 electricians have been identified in the country and a project will be launched to provide them with the National Vocational Qualification or NVQ 3, the basic qualification required to obtain a permanent electricity license, quickly and free of charge.

# Lankan businesses not affected in Myanmar

Sri Lankan businesses in Myanmar are not affected in any way though businesses and analysts predict that the coup is likely to damage the country's economy. Companies say the coup has already put many

billions worth of foreign investment at risk according to the BBC report. Former President International Chamber of

Commerce Tissa Jayaweera said that there are over 60 active Sri Lanka businesses in the banking, Micro Finance and import and export of motor vehicle businesses. In addition several Sri Lankans manage top hotels in Myanmar as well."

He said that most of the businesses both local and foreign operating in Myanmar did have connections with the military even before the Coup and hence Sri Lankan and other foreign businesses would not be in any danger of being victimized. "only people with political links are target-

Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) commitments into Myanmar were worth \$5.5bn (£4bn) in the 2020 fiscal year, which ended in September.

However, with the US already considering sanctions against Myanmar due to the coup, these sanctions could have a significant effect on foreign investment, with both Western and Japanese companies thinking twice about projects in Myanmar.

One Yangon-based businessman, who asked not to be named, said he's relieved that the coup so far appears to have been relatively peaceful. "So far it's peaceful, without protests, but emotions are strong and people are upset," he said. (SS)





### Striking pigeon feathers installation

or London-MccGwire, repurposing found materials into illusory works of art is a central part of the creative process. She says, "I gather, collate, re-use, layer, peel, burn, reveal, locate, question, duplicate, play, and photograph." Her recent installation Discharge is a sinuous five-meter-tall

sculpture that cascades from a massive wooden bookcase. MccGwire used approximately 10,000 gray and white pigeon feathers to create the striking curved shape and undulating waves at the base.

The artist amassed her extensive collection of plumage from pigeon racers, which she sorted by curvature in her studio, before collating them into

"When visitors see the piece for the first time they are drawn to the phenomenal scale, rhythmic patterning, movement, and perfection of the piece," MccGwire says. "But are often perturbed and revolted when they understand what the material is."

This twofold experience is intentional, as the artist wants the viewer to see the transformation of overlooked materials into something that is aesthetically fascinating.

Discharge is one of the nine installations MccGwire created for her exhibition Menagerie at the Harewood House in West Yorkshire, England. While this sculpture occupies the library, another piece, entitled Cavort, is displayed on the floor of The Yellow Drawing Room. There, MccGwireconnects pigeon feathers of varying hues to create mesmerizing patterns, as though it were an embroidered tapestry. At the center is a large motif of a flower made of brown plumes, and surrounding it are swirls of gray and white feathers. "Menagerie shines a spotlight on the 'common' bird and connects the themes of nature, sustainability, and art," a statement from Harewood House says.

#### he small town of Nuoro, on Italy's Sardinia island, is home to what many are calling the world's rarest pasta, an intricate, hand-made treat that only a handful of people can make. Known as su filindeu (in Sar-

dinia's Sardo dialect), or Fili di Dio (in Italian), and translated as threads of God, this traditional pasta had been linked to La Festa di San Francesco, an ancient religious ritual celebrated every year, in May. For the past two hundred years, the only way to try threads of god pasta was to complete a 33km pilgrimage on foot or horseback from Nuoro to the village of Lula. But because this sacred dish is in serious danger of becoming extinct, the only three women in the world who know how to make it, have been trying to save it by mak-

ing it more accessible. A 67-year-old named Paola Abraini picked up the skills to make threads of god pasta from her mother, who also learned them from her mother, and so on for many generations. However, only one of her two daughters knows the basic technique, but lacks the passion and the patience necessary to carry on the family tradition.

The only other two women who she managed to pass on her knowledge to - Abraini's niece and her sister-in-law don't have any daughters to to Rome to showcase her



pass the secrets to, so su filindeu is in grave danger of van-

ishing. In recent years, Paola Abraini became so desperate to save the pasta she so loves that she went to local authorities asking her to help set up a school for girls willing to become su filindeu makers. They told her there was no money for schools, so she decided to invite girls into her home and teach them. That didn't go well either, because making the threads of god isn't the easiest thing in the world.

"It didn't go well," Abraini told the BBC, in

"The problem was that once they saw how I actually do it, they'd say, 'It's just too much work', and wouldn't come back.'

But she refuse to give up, and has since been invited

su filindeu making skills, by food and wine magazine Gambero Rosso. She also started making the rare pasta for several restaurants in the Italian capital to have it served to non-pilgrims for the first time, all in an attempt to save the rare dish.

But why is threads of god pasta so difficult to make? It only consists of three ingredients – semolina flower, water and salt – but because every-



thing is made by hand, it's the process itself that's grueling. After mixing the ingredients, the dough is kneaded for a very long time to stretch the gluten, the key to making the extremely long and thin strands. Once it's flexible enough, the stretching begins.

Paola Abraini rolls the dough into 8 long, thin strands, then folds them, cuts them in half and stretches them again. The process is repeated 32 times, until 256 extremely thin threads of pasta are obtained.

Just to get an idea of how thin the pasta gets, they are about half as thin as the more well known angel hair pasta.

Then the strands are stretched over a round, flat tray called a fundu in three overlapping layers, and left in the sun for a few hours, to dry. The layers of pasta stick together, thus creating a

fabric-like design. Pieces of this edible tapestry are then broken and cooked. The process is easy enough

to understand, but getting it just right has apparently been a problem for most people, even seasoned cooks.

"Many people say that I have a secret I don't want to reveal," Abraini told the BBC. "But the secret is right in front of you. It's in my hands." In 2015, a team of engineers from internationally-known pasta brand Barilla visited the threads of god master, hoping to find ways of reproduce the pasta with a machine. They apparently failed. Then, chef superstar Jamie Oliver visited Abraini and tried to learn her technique, but gave up after two hours of trying. And these are only the most notable examples, hundreds others have tried and failed.

According to Slow Food International's Ark of Taste, a project that aims to classify and preserve the world's most endangered culinary traditions. out of the nearly 4,000 listed items, su filindeu is both the world's rarest and most endangered pasta.

"This is one of the most atrisk foods of becoming extinct, in large part because it's one of the most difficult pastas to make that exists, said Raffaella Ponzio, head coordinator of Ark of Taste.

# First female metal soloist in Sri Lanka - Shehara Jayathilake Napoleon

eing recognized as the first female metal soloist is a high honour in one's perspective, and also a challenge in a mostly male dominated society and culture, which prevails especially in a country like Sri

The International music scene includes quite a number of female soloists and bands such as Nightwish, Evanescence and Arch Enemy, (or even the Cranberries) but in

Sri Lanka, it's a rare scene, also in heavy metal. Females entering the metal music scene may not be everyone's cup of tea, though it will be approved by those who appreciate. Most individuals may look at it in different angles. Some might even say that 'Heavy

Metal' is not for women in the Sri Lankan context. In such an atmosphere, you may

not be able to wear tattoos, pierce your nose, wear highlights or leather jackets and boots everywhere, but Shehara Jayathilake Napoleon is one of the Sri Lankan females who changed the trend and made a huge change by indirectly showing that women are capable of anything even Heavy Metal!




