Food Price Order No. BT. 65.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, read with section 12 (1) (b) of that Act, I, Joseph Valentine Fonseka, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Batticaloa District, do, by this Order---

- (1) revoke with effect from May 1, 1959 (in so far as it relates to Raw Brown Sugar and White Refined Sugar), Food Price Order No. BT-54 dated May 11, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* Notification No. 10,930of May 18, 1956, fixing maximum wholesale prices of Raw Brown Sugar and White Refined Sugar, within the Batticaloa District;
 (2) fix prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight gross of Raw Brown Sugar and the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight gross of White Refined Sugar, above which such sugar, further described in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto
- (3) direct that, for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for purpose of resale or any sale of sugar in quantity of one hundredweight gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale; (b) "Sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery;

(4) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell sugar which is adulterated (5) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who has any sugar in his

- (b) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every brader, who has any sugar in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for sugar fixed by this Order in that area;
 (6) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any sugar by whole-sale shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which shall be set out—
- - the date of the sale;

 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight);
 (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold; and
 (d) the nature of transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale.

THE FOOD CONTROL ACT, No. 25 OF 1950

Sale of Rice by Weight

IT is hereby notified in terms of regulation 5 of Part II of Head E and regulation 4 (1) of Part III of Head E of Food Control Regulations, 1952, that, with effect from 25th May, 1959, weekly ration of rice which may be sold or issued by weight to any person who is in possession of a ration book of any class specified in Column I of the Schedule hereto and who is resident in any one of the Administrative Districts of Batticaloa and Puttalam shall be the quantity specified in the corresponding entry in Column II of that Schedule.

Note.—One measure of rice is equivalent to 2 pounds. On this basis, consumers will receive for each rice ration book 4 pounds of rice instead of two measures per week on surrender of coupons.
