Price Orders

Food Price Order No. 3 of 1959.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT. No. 29 OF 1950

RICE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4, read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Mathias Stephen Clitus Goonewardena, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), for the Administrative District of Galle, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from June 15, 1959, my Price Order No. 2 of 1959 dated April 27, 1959, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 11,737 dated May 5, 1959;
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price for one hundredweight (cwt.) nett and the maximum retail price per two pounds nett respectively, above which rice of the first and second pounds of the legal ration shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iii) fix the prices specified in columns 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price for one hundredweight (cwt.) nett and the maximum retail price per two pounds nett respectively, above which rice of the third and fourth pounds of the legal ration shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order-

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 (c) "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;
 (d) the maximum amount that is payable for any quantity of rice which is less than or more than one cwt. nett sold by wholesale should, as usual, be calculated proportionately from the maximum wholesle price per cwt. nett specified hereto;
- (v) direct that no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article, or with rice of an inferior description or grade;
- (vi) direct that every trader who sells rice by wholesale or retail in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at his store or boutique a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;
- (vii) direct that every person who sells rice by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any rice by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale;
 (b) the quantity of such rice sold (by weight);
 (c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
 (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (viii) direct that when rice is sold, the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which such rice is sold.

RICE (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL)

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4, read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Arthur Cuthbert Bartholomeusz, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), of the Nuwara Eliya District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from June 15, 1959, my Food Price Order No. NE/45 dated February 23, 1959, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 11,687 of February 28, 1959;
- (ii) fix with effect from June 15, 1959, the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of Schedule I hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices per hundredweight nett in respect of the first two pounds of rice and of the second two pounds of rice, respectively, issued on each coupon, above which rice shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column I of Schedule I hereto;
- (iii) fix with effect from June 15, 1959, the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of Schedule II hereto to be the maximum retail prices of rice per two pounds nett in respect of the first two pounds and of the second two pounds respectively, issued on each coupon, above which rice shall not be sold by retail in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column I of Schedule II hereto;
- (iv) direct that it is in order for an Authorised Dealer, Co-operative Store or Depot or Estate to issue only two pounds of rice and that the holder of a ration book or a worker on an estate is at liberty to purchase only two pounds of rice, if he so desires, although the legal ration continues to be four pounds per week per person. However, if all four pounds are purchased, the purchaser should purchase the second two pounds together with the first two pounds at the same time;

- (v) direct that for the purpose of this Order-

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 (c) the maximum amount that is payable for any quantity of rice which is less than or more than one hundredweight nett and sold by wholesale should, as usual, be calculated proportionately from the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett;
 (d) "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;
- (vi) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any rice in his posses sion or under his control at any place or in any vehicle shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;
- (viii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rice by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any rice by retail shall on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out-
 - (a) the date of the sale;

 - (b) the quantity of the rice sold;
 (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold; and
 (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
 - (ix) direct that the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which the rice is sold.
