The Court of Appeal yesterday further extended its interim order directing Secretary General of Parliament (SGP) to maintain status quo (maintain existing state of affairs) regarding the Parliamentary seat of Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) Gampaha District MP Ranjan Ramanayake. This interim order will be effective till March 16.

Court of Appeal twojudge-bench comprising Justice (President) Arjuna Obeyesekere and Justice Mayadunna Corea made this order consequent to a writ petition filed by Ranjan Ramanayake claiming his rights to function as a Parliamentarian has been affected.

This petition is to be taken up for support on March 16. President's Counsel M.A. Sumanthiran appearing for Ramanayake sought a further date as Faiz Mustapha PC who is to support the petition was indisposed.

On January 11, the Supreme Court convicted Ranjan Ramanayake for Contempt of Court and sentenced him to four years' rigorous imprisonment.

Ramanayake is seeking an order restraining the

Secretary General of Parliament from taking any steps to inform the Election Commission that he has vacated his seat as a Member of Parliament.

Ramanayake stated that irreparable harm and damage will be caused to him unless the interim relief is granted to him inasmuch as he will be deprived of functioning as a Member of Parliament.

The Petitioner further stated that the People's franchise would also be adversely affected if he is wrongfully prevented as functioning as a representative of his electorate.

It is being implemented under the World Mosquito Control Programme to prevent dengue, Chikungunya, Sika, and Yellow Fever by releasing 'Aedes aegypti' mosquitoes that

carry Wolbachia bacteria into the environment. The mosquitoes carrying the bacterium Nobokia will be released at public places using a container - a "Mosquito Box" (Mozzie box).

The mosquito box is provided free

to the community and in about two weeks the mosquitoes will hatch and fly from the mosquito box. They will produce a new generation of mosquitoes with the Wolbachia bacterium. These mosquitoes help protect the community from dengue.

SC extends Interim Order preventing death penalty

The Supreme Court yesterday extended its Interim Order preventing the Commissioner General of Prisons and the Welikada Prison Superintendent from executing any prisoner consequent to a death warrant signed by former President Maithripala Sirisena, until September 7.

The Supreme Court three-judge-bench headed by Justice Vijith Malalgoda made the order pursuant to 12 Fundamental Rights petitions filed including the one filed by Attorney-at-Law Kavindu Hewa Geeganage.The 12 petitions had been filed in the Supreme Court seeking an Interim Order directing the Commissioner General of Prisons and the Welikada Prison Superintendent from executing any prisoner consequent to a death warrant signed by the former President.

The petitions will be taken up for support on September 6.

The Attorney General, Justice Minister, Commissioner General of Prisons, Welikada Prison Superintendent and several others have been named as respondents in the petitions.

In its petition, the Centre for Policy Alternative (CPA) stated that it has long been recognised that hanging is a cruel and inhuman form of punishment, not befitting a multi religious and civilised society. Though convicts have been sentenced to death, the long recognised practice in Sri Lanka for over 43 years has been that they were not executed.

The CPA reiterates that the implementation of death penalty at this juncture is a violation of fundamental rights guaranteed under Article 11(Freedom from torture) and under Article 12(1) [All persons are equal before the law and are entitled to equal protection before the law] of the Constitution.

Filing another petition, Attorney-at-Law Kavindu Hewa Geeganage stated that selection of specific individuals to impose the death penalty is arbitrary, unreasonable and made on no identifiable criteria and without any justifications for

He argued that purported selection appears to have been carried out contrary to the Law and the Constitution and in particular the proviso to Article 34(1) of the Constitution.

The petitioner stated that purported selection of specific individuals are contrary to international norms and do not meet the relevant threshold for 'most serious crimes':

The State, in taking steps to carry out such executions in haste has caused rise to a situation of imminent infringement of the condemned prisoners' rights under Article 11, 12(1), 13(4), 13(6) and 17 of the Constitution, the petitioner states.

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

The Minister said that it is the intention of the Ministry to involve everyone who is willing to contribute to the decisionmaking.

The Minister said that before COVID and under normal circumstances, approximately 30,000 to 33, 000 have been in prison whereas the capacity of those is only for 11,000. The Minister said that a vast majority of them are remand prisoners and only 8,000 were convicts. He

said that 90 per cent or more in remand prison are drug addicts - not drugrelated criminals.

The Minister said that when the 2018-2019 statistics were called for from the Government Analyst Department, only 114 cases were against those who had a pure quantity of drugs. He said that 99 per cent of those who were arrested - approximately 3,300, had 2-5g of drugs

when they were arrested. The Minister explained how large-scale drug cases are stagnated as the High Courts have been clogged by minor cases

Minister Ali Sabry said that rehabilitating such individuals through community-based correction is important rather than allowing them to mingle with drug criminals paving way for them to convert into a drug-related crimi-

Prison Management and Rehabilitation State Minister Lohan Ratwatte said that 250 acres have been given by the Urban Development Authority (UDA) and measures have been taken to relocate the prisons such as the Welikada Prison, Women's Prison, Magazine New Remand Prison to Horana in commercial areas to increase the capacity of prisons to 10-fold.

State Minister Susil Premajayantha said that there is a considerable delay in receiving the Government Analyst's reports, which causes a delay in hearings. The Justice Minister said that measures have been taken to resolve the issue.

Parliamentarian Weerasumana Weerasinghe said that it is mandatory to include subjects related to Law, Crime and Conviction to the school syllabus since children should be educated in this regard from an early age.

AG's instructions sought to resolve Veragodayaya farmers' issue - State Minister Wimalaweera

MP Ranasinghe said that the farmers had been cultivating there for more than 60 years but the Forest Department acquired the land. The Department officers do not allow them to work on these lands despite the orders by the President and the legislature. He urged the Government to resolve the matter soon.

PMB will buy 300,00 tonnes of paddy directly from farmers - Minister Aluthgamage

Agriculture Mahindananda Aluthgamage said in Parliament yesterday that for the first time in the history of Sri Lanka, 300,000 metric tonnes of paddy will be bought directly by the Paddy Marketing Board (PMB) during the Maha season. Minister Aluthgamage said that Rs. 16,000 million has been allocated in this regard.

Minister Aluthgamage was responding to a question by Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) MP Thushara Indunil during the Oral Question Round.

He said that a very systematic programme has been set up to buy paddy to protect the farmer, PMB and the consumer.

Minister Aluthgamage said that he believed the Board could buy around 500,000 metric tonnes of paddy, not 300,000 metric tonnes. He assured that there will not be any fraud while paddy is bought.

He said that a number of corrupt transactions have




taken place at institutions including at Sathosa that are affiliated to the Ministry

A number of discrepancies had occurred when buying paddy during the last season and although money was given to buy paddy through the Government Agent, it has not been collected properly, Minister Aluthgamage said.

'We have inspected the Economic Centres recently. Thereafter, we decided to provide stalls at the Centres for farmers to sell their vegetables without a mediator," the Minister said.



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National Policy should be set up on granting country's assets - MP Withanage

Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) Ratnapura District Parliamentarian Hesha Withanage yesterday said that the Government led by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa should set up a national policy on matters such as handing the Hambantota Port and the Colombo Port Eastern Terminal over to foreign companies depriving the country of massive revenues.

Then Money and Capital Market and State Enterprise Reforms State Minister Ajith Nivard Cabraal responded that

the Government's policy is not to give strategically important assets to foreign companies.

He said that the grant of the Hambantota Port was incorrect no matter whoever did it and there should be a national policy in this regard. "However, the Hambantota Port was given during the previous United National Party (UNP) Good Governance Government," he

He was responding while President Gotabaya Rajapaksa was present in the House. The President




arrived in the House preceded by Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa and followed by many other Ministers, State Minister and Parliamentarians during the Round of Questions for Oral Answers. said that the Eastern Terminal will not be given to any other country and it will be operated 100 per cent by the country. "The Government has clearly expressed the Government's policy that it would not grant or sell the strategically important assets to the overseas companies," he said.

He agreed with MP Hesha Withanage that it was important to set up a mechanism to allow foreign investors to get approvals and certificates under one roof before they invest here.

MP Hesha Withanage said that such a mechanism would prevent acts of corruption like those happened during the previous regimes. He said that this is much important as foreign investments have become an effective solution for developing the economy.





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


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Previous regime granted H'tota Port to China for 90 years to get meagre income - Minister Rohitha

He said that the previous UNP Government granted the Hambantota Port for such a meager income and it has given nothing for the country.



A question of security

lot of hot air was let off by the Opposition in Parliament on Wednesday over the withdrawal of the special security provided to TNA MP M.A. Sumanthiran following the latter's participation in a protest march in the North in defiance of a police and Court order. It was the contention of Law and Order Minister Rear Admiral (Ret.) Sarath Weerasekara that he cannot permit the police officers guarding the MP to be demeaned and look silly by making them continue to protect the latter who was clearly acting in defiance of a police order. It certainly would have looked funny indeed if the police guarding Sumanthiran, at the time of the protest march, were to confront their own colleagues who were trying to explain to the MP and Co. that they were acting against a police order which technically would have amounted to a Home and Home

Needless to say the entire police service would have been reduced to a laughing stock in the eyes of the public if that had been the case. Hence, the Minister could not have been faulted for acting the way he did by immediately withdrawing the special security contingent deployed to protect Sumanthiran who was said to be under a death threat. It was the foremost duty, as Law and Order Minister entrusted with overseeing the police service, for Rear Admiral Weerasekara to stand by his men in upholding their honour and dignity.

But from the way the Opposition conducted itself, it was apparent that they had failed to cotton on to this reality and was only harping on the security threat to the TNA MP in the wake of the withdrawal of his special security (his normal security is intact). However, as rightly argued by the Minister, what was borne out by the MP mingling among thousands of protestors during the agitation was the fact that he had no threat and in any event the MP should not have participated in such a mass agitation if indeed he was under a death threat. There was also the scant regard for the health guidelines introduced post Coronavirus by a lawmaker, who should be showing the way to others by example.

Sumanthiran's case typifies the bogus security threats cited by MPs from time to time as a means of demanding extra security from the State as an ego-boosting exercise and to aggrandize themselves before the public. This should open the eyes of the authorities to the modus operandi adopted by MPs and other 'VIPs' to avail themselves of additional security which is a ruse in order to remain in the spotlight. In fact, Rear Admiral Weerasekara recently declared that all extra security provided to MPs would be withdrawn and that security details henceforth would only be in proportion to threat assessment on the MP or VIPs concerned. He also enjoined all police personnel providing security to MPs not to engage in tasks other than what they have been strictly entrusted with. This no doubt follows media reports in the past of police officers guarding MPs and Ministers being forced to engage in work outside their main duties such as domestic

Rear Admiral Weerasekara may have also been influenced in his current action by the fact that Sumanthiran had also been attending events in the North that are sympathetic towards the LTTE, with the police security provided by the State, in tow. As a former Navy Commander who was in the thick of battles against the LTTE, it certainly must have rankled him to see that a MP who shows open sympathy towards the LTTE, which killed hundreds of police officers, receiving special police protection, in a classic twist of irony. The Rear Admiral's sentiments in this regard were given full play the other day when he declared that legislation would be brought soon to ban any espousal of the cause of the LTTE in Parliament or any mention of Prabhakaran in the House. This was on the basis that the LTTE was a banned organization and Prabhakaran a terrorist leader. As the Minister pointed out Germany has totally banned any vestiges of Hitlerism in the country and any glorification of the Third Reich.

Sumanthiran says should any harm befall him the Minister should be held totally responsible. Such sweeping declarations have been made by MPs even in the past particularly during the height of the second JVP uprising when the late Ranjan Wijeratne was at the helm of national security and at times slashed the security of certain Members of the Opposition. Government and Opposition MPs have called for the full restoration of the TNA MP's special security. Since Minister Weerasekara has already expressed his opinion that the MP, after all, could not be under a death threat if the latter could freely mingle with thousands of protesters, a fresh threat assessment ought to be made to ascertain if indeed this was case and if not, Sumanthiran could be accorded the special protection demanded by MPs across the floor.

Towards eradicating Digital Poverty

LAPTOPS ON CONCESSIONARY TERMS TO STUDENTS

t is a universally accepted fact that use of information technological tools for education would vastly improve students' capacity to gather knowledge. Although current levels of access to laptops, computers and Internet connections among schoolchildren are very high in affluent countries, access is not evenly distributed across countries or across the population within countries. Less than one fifth of schoolchildren in Sri Lanka have access to a computer at home that they can use for schoolwork.

According to computer literacy statistics for 2019 issued by the Department of Census and Statistics, in Sri Lanka at least one computer is available in 22 percent of households in the country. That is about one out of every five households owns either a desktop or a laptop computer. This percentage is 38 percent in the urban sector, but in rural and estate sectors it is 19.7 percent and 4.6 percent respectively. There is a vast gap between the developed and underdeveloped regions. When the provinces are considered the highest availability is in the Western Province (34.3 percent) while the lowest availability is reported from the Uva (11.8 percent).

DIGITAL DIVIDE

The disparities in access to home computers and the Internet are known as the Digital Divide. A substantial amount of money is spent on technology by the Government and families in developing countries with the hope of improving educational outcomes of the young generation. Despite that, the developing countries are faced with 'Digital Poverty' which is a common problem due to heavy expenses required to fortify the young population with IT capacity. Although it exists all over the world, in advanced countries it is at a manageable level. When in the United Kingdom it was decided to close schools and commence online education, it was found out that 24 percent of the students did not have computers or laptops at their homes. Matt Morden, Co-Head Teacher of Surrey Square primary school, in south London told the media that in his school, 24 percent of pupils are effectively offline, in terms of being able to study from home. "Their families might have mobile phones with internet connections, but for those in low-paid, insecure jobs, data is expensive. If families are struggling, the priority is going to be food, not data," he said. Furthermore, in addition to missing out on learning, those students without online connections miss the sense of belonging from staying in touch with their friends and teachers when they do not attend school. Morden says. "The lockdown and the closure of schools has brought the digital divide to the forefront," he added.

This revelation clearly shows the gravity of the issue for a developing nation, when affluent countries are also faced with a similar issue, though at a lower magnitude. Earlier this week, Sri Lanka took a significant forward step to assist the new batch of university students to obtain much-needed laptops in order to be equipped with knowledge on par with their compatriots in the affluent world.

with their compatriots in the affluent world.

The programme to provide laptops on a concessionary payment scheme to the students who are qualified to enter universities commenced under the patronage of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa. The programme has been formulated by the University Grants Commission in collaboration with People's Bank, to digitalize the entire education system to meet current needs as envisioned in the national policy framework of 'Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour'.

"The 21st Century is known as the knowledge-centric century. In order to remain competitive globally, it is imperative that technology be integrated with every sector of the economy, be it agriculture, industry or the service sector. It is imperative that we invest strategically in new technologies and integrate such innovations with our education system, and economy. In order to enhance the quality of life of our people, we must launch a massive social transformation and create a Culture of Technological Innovation." – Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour.

GOVERNMENT POLICY

The newly-introduced loan scheme gives students the opportunity to buy a laptop, which will be equipped with an Internet connection, software package and a four-year warranty period. A laptop is valued at Rs. 80,000. During their university education, the students are required to pay Rs. 500 monthly. This is an affordable amount as most university students get a Government grant under the Mahapola Scholarship Scheme introduced by the late minister Lalith Athulathmudali. The loan scheme gives students the opportunity to settle the payment within six years following their employment. People's Bank has allocated Rs. 3 billion for this project.

President Rajapaksa symbolically handed over relevant documents to six new students who will be enrolled to Universities for the academic year 2021 at the Presidential Secretariat on Tuesday (9).

This marked a significant milestone in the march towards the Information Age which is also known as Computer Age associated with the Digital Revolution, just as the Industrial Revolution marked the birth of the Industrial Age. The Digital and Information and Communication Technology (ICT) revolutions are twin revolutions. Rapid developments in ICT have greatly contributed in enhancing human living standards worldwide.

When the impacts of technology on educational outcomes are discussed, it is necessary to study two primary contexts in which technology may be used for educational purposes. Those are classroom use in schools, and home use by students. Theo-


retically, computer use by schools and the use of computers at home have ambiguous implications for educational achievements as expenditures devoted to technology necessarily offset inputs that may be more or less efficient, and time allocated to using technology may displace traditional classroom instruction and educational activities at home.

Families also spend a substantial amount of money on computers, software, and Internet connections each year. In the United States, for example, 86 percent of schoolchildren have access to a computer at home, while in some developing countries it is below 10 percent. These disparities in access to home computers and the Internet has created a yawning gap known as the Digital Divide. A better understanding of how computer technology affects educational outcomes is critical because it sheds light on whether such technology is an important input in the educational production process and whether disparities in access will translate into educational inequality. The new scheme will ensure all students, irrespective of their place of origin, will get a laptop and access to online educa-

It is a fact that a substantial number of university students come from rural areas and now they will have equal educational opportunities. In the developed world, most of the key economically effective environments are increasingly ICT dominant. Timely and accurate information on use of ICT itself is essential for justification and proper direction of the Government efforts, private sector investments, to study the changing pattern of the demand for Internet services and for continuous progress monitoring on ICT achievements. For this computer literacy data can contribute immensely to an understanding of the demand and supply of skills in the global, knowledge based economy. Also statistics on the availability of a computer or laptop in households and usage of Internet and email can be used to assess the digital divide.

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa fulfilled the new scheme as promised in his election manifesto to "convert all universities to Smart Learning Universities" and to provide "necessary technical support to students." As he said, now the expectation from the universities is to "produce technocrats to meet the demands of the 21st Century."



end. Turns out, the plaintiff, who was the subsequent appellant when the case was taken up in the Court of Appeal, had burned the house himself! (Tikiri Banda v. Pathuma Beebee and Others - SLR - 46, Vol 3 of 1998 [1998] LKCA 51; (1998) 3 Sri LR 46 (August 17, 1998.)

This is how what transpired was recorded in the Appeal Court judgement.

"The plaintiff-appellant instituted action seeking a declaration of title to the land and ejectment of the defendantrespondents therefrom. The District Judge held that the plaintiff-appellant had set fire to the house in question and observing that the house that was burnt down was renovated subject to an order made by the Rent Board which was based on the premise that there existed a building which could be repaired, dismissed the action of the plaintiff-appellant; on appeal."

In the District Court the plaintiff had contended that the witness had stated he saw one Dissanayake holding the firebrand the day the house was burned down. The plaintiff's lawyer referred to this witness statement to claim that the plaintiff hadn't burned down the house, because there was a discrepancy between the name (Dissanayake) that the witness mentioned, and the real name of the plaintiff.

The Appeal Court did not accept that argument

This is the excerpt on the Appeal Court judgement on that aspect of the case: "Further, attention of the witness was not drawn to this portion of the statement to enable her to explain the dis-

crepancy. It is to be noted that section 145 (1) of the Evidence Ordinance requires that attention of a witness must be drawn to any portion of a statement which is inconsistent, to enable the witness to explain the inconsistency before such portion could be produced as a contradiction. It is regrettable that this procedure was not followed when Pathuma Beebe gave evidence in

the District Court." Apparently the police did nothing to prosecute the plaintiff for setting fire to the house, but the Court of Appeal noted in judgement that this should not detract from the fact that the plaintiff had done so. "Coming to a conclusion about the truth or otherwise of the complaint does not depend on the police attitude in not prosecuting particularly, because there was a background of 'violence against an ethnic group'," the judgement went on to state. Anyhow, the Rent Board

had allowed the tenants to repair the house after an inquiry into the matter, and the plaintiff did not present himself at the inquiry though he had been noticed to be present.

Court of Appeal cited Wille's Principles of South African Law by J.T.R. Gibson (seventh edition) in chapter XXV and held the following in judgement:

"Under contracts in general at page 377 contains the following: Where performance of the obligation by the debtor becomes impossible, either physically or legally, after the contract was made, the debtor is

discharged from liability if he was prevented from performing his obligation by viz major or casus fortuitus but not

if the impossibility was due to his own fault. For instance, if a house is let and it is destroyed by fire without the fault of the lessee, for example, by lightning, the lease is at an end and the lessee need pay no further rent; but if the fire is due to the negligence of the lessee, the lease continues and he remains liable for rent accruing after the fire."

by his own doing.

Basically it meant in the case under review, that if the plaintiff had set fire to his own house, he cannot claim that the contract has ended, because he was himself responsible for the deed.

The plaintiff wanted specific performance of the contract claiming that since the house that was the subject of the contract no longer existed, the tenant ought to be ejected. However, Court of Appeal noted in judgement that it is an accepted principle in this regard that where damages are an adequate remedy, specific performance will not be granted. (Specific perfor-

mance is an equitable remedy in the law of contract, whereby a court issues an order requiring a party to perform a specific act, to complete performance of

the contract. This is as opposed to granting money as damages, for

instance.) After inquiry by the Rent Board by its order dated 11.10.1983, the Board had allowed the application of Sultan who was the tenant of the house to repair the damaged building conditions approved by the Rent Board.

In the circumstances, Court of Appeal saw no basis to interfere with the findings of the District Judge that the plaintiff's case for ejectment of tenant be dismissed – and the appeal was dismissed with costs.

Things would have turned out differently had the house caught fire and burned down accidentally.

In the leading English case of Taylor v Caldwell (1983) 122ER 309, Caldwell hired a music hall to Taylor. Before Taylor could arrange the first performance at the music hall, it caught fire and burnt down. Taylor claimed damages from Caldwell for the expenses he had incurred in arranging several performances. The Court held that since the destruction of the music hall had occurred without the fault of either party, the contract was frustrated and therefore both parties to the contract were In the same way, liability lies discharged from their obligations. Accordingly, Caldwell with the lessor if the fire is caused was not liable to pay Taylor as demanded for breach of contract.

he President of the United States of America, Joseph Biden, outlined his vision for America's foreign policy agenda and reiterated the need for America to strengthen its global alliances after President Donald Trump disparaged those relationships during the last four years.

Biden chose to unveil his foreign policy at the Department of State.

Foreign policies, an integral part of any national strategy, command the highest priority of all nations. As new Presidents take over, whether, in the United States or Russia or China, we look forward to examining their foreign policy views.

Since World War II, several foreign policies of superpowers did not yield expected results even though all policies and concomitant interventions came with guarantees of peace, prosperity and democracy.

History shows us that the policies in the Far East led to the devastation of Vietnam, North Korea and Laos, the policy of containment of communism, and the 45-year Cold War Policy ended the East European bloc and dismantled the Soviet Union, and the policies of pre-emptive strikes and of regime change destroyed the lives of millions of people in the Middle East.

Trump came to power describing the US foreign policy "a complete and total disaster". What he left behind is more than calamitous.

Trump's foreign policy was based on opposition to multilateralism and international institutions; his assumption that the rest of the world was taking advantage of the United States; the American allies should pay for US protection; confront foreign adversaries and eliminate them; stop China from stealing American jobs; take the US out of "bad deals" like the Paris Climate Accord and the Nuclear Agreement with Iran, and make Mexico pay for a wall on the southern border - to name a

Trump withdrew from the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), withdrew from the Paris Climate Accord, abrogated the Iranian Nuclear Deal, reimposed restrictions on travel and trade with Cuba (all issues championed under the Barack Obama administration).

Also, the US either withdrew from or substantially cut the funding of several United Nations agencies such as the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC), ceased funding the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), blocked the appointment of judges to the World Trade Organization (WTO), withdrew from the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and in the midst of the Covid-19 global crisis, Trump notified US withdrawal from the World Health Organization (WHO).

The US relations with its closest ally the Euro-

President Biden vows to 'repair alliances, engage

pean Union deteriorated to the point that German Chancellor Angela Merkel's comments "Europe can no longer rely on the US to protect us", and "Europe must take its destiny in its own hands" speak for itself. The whole world knows how Trump's four-year term ended - with mounting conflicts with allies and adversaries though Trump deserves credit for not waging new foreign wars.

It is in this backdrop that President Biden has a monumental task to rebuild America's alliances around the world, enhance its long-standing good relations with the United Nations and its specialized agencies, and if possible, make peace with Russia and China.

Saying that "America is back" Biden pledged to return to diplomacy.

Before delivering his speech, he made formal remarks to State Department employees, remind-

ing them "As I said, in my inaugural address, we will repair our alliances, engage with the world once again".

American leadership must meet this new moment of advancing authoritarianism, Biden said, "including the growing ambitions of China to rival the United States and the determination of Russia to damage and disrupt our democracy".

We're going to re-engage the world Biden said, and take on the enormous challenges we face dealing with the pandemic, dealing with global warming and again, standing up for democracy and human rights around the world.

Biden proudly noted that on day one, he rejoined the Paris Climate Agreement, and also reengaged with the World Health Organization.

Biden emphasized, "We must start with diplomacy rooted in America's most cherished demo-

cratic values: defending freedom, championing opportunity, upholding universal rights, respecting the rule of law, and treating every person with dignity". During the election campaign, Biden said that he would be tougher on President Vladimir Putin than Trump, who refused to take on the Kremlin and frequently cast doubt on Russian interference in the 2016 elections.

Referring to Russia, Biden said "I made it clear to President Putin, in a manner very different from my predecessor, that the days of the United States rolling over in the face of Russia's aggressive actions — interfering with our elections, cyberattacks, poisoning its citizens — are over. We will not hesitate to raise the cost on Russia and defend our vital interests and our people. And we will be more effective in dealing with Russia when we work in coalition and coordination with other like-

minded partners". Saying that the jailing of Alexei Navalny and the Russian efforts to suppress freedom of expression and peaceful assembly are a matter of deep concern to us and the international community, Biden said "Mr. Navalny, like all Russian citizens, is entitled to his rights under the Russian constitution. He's been targeted for exposing corruption. He should be released immediately and without condition".

He expressed strong words for China as well saying "we'll also take on directly the challenges posed by our most serious competitor, China".

But we are ready to work with Beijing, Biden said when it's in America's interest to do so. "We will compete from a position of strength by building back better at home, working with our allies and partners, renewing our role in international institutions, and reclaiming our credibility and moral authority, much of which has been lost".

With regard to frayed relations with America's allies, Biden said: "Over the past two weeks, I've spoken with the leaders of many of our closest friends to begin reforming the habits of cooperation and rebuilding the muscle of democratic alliances that have atrophied over the past few years of neglect and, I would argue, abused".

He also returned to a vision of the United States as an immigrant nation. Recognizing that there is a crisis of more than 80 million displaced people suffering around the world, Biden pledged to accept more refugees: he said he would increase the number to 125,000 a year after Trump whittled it down to 15,000.

Referring to the military takeover in Myanmar, Biden said: "The Burmese military should relinquish the power they have seized, release the advocates and activists and officials they have detained, lift the restrictions on telecommunications, and refrain from violence".

Biden promised to end the war in Yemen and ensure that humanitarian aid is reaching the Yemeni people who are suffering unendurable devasta-

To underscore our commitment, Biden said: 'We are ending all American support for offensive operations in the war in Yemen, including relevant arms sales".


Time is opportune, however, for the three superpowers — US, Russia and China — to stop demonizing each other, and set an example by peacefully working together to maintain mutually beneficial relations and resolve contentious global

issues as those could only be resolved mutually.

andula Jayasekera is a man of many parts. But he is mostly known for his roles as a Senior Journalist, Newspaper Editor and Diplomat. He has served as a senior journalist, a columnist for several newspapers and was the Editor-in-Chief of the *Daily News* in 2006–2007. He also served as Director General, President's Office Media Unit for some time during President Mahinda Rajapaksa's tenure and Director General (Public Communication) at the External Affairs Ministry. His last foray in media was at $Sirasa \setminus MTV$ where he worked until recently as a talk show host, including for the popular 'Pathikada' programme.

As a diplomat he served in Australia, Canada and also as Sri Lanka's Deputy Permanent Representative to the UN in New York. Throughout his career, either as a journalist or diplomat, Jayasekera's writing and his sharp tongue attracted controversy. Those who knew him know that a battle always brought the best out of him. Jayasekera known among colleagues and friends as BJ is waging another battle today. This is unlike any he had faced before. BJ was diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome, a type of blood cancer in July 2019. His efforts for a cure have not materialized and in BJ's own words, he is now a man 'sentenced to die' as doctors have predicted that his life in this world will not go beyond July this year. BJ was known for his tireless work to achieve either his goals or visions. But in the face of death does BJ have anything more to offer, to the country, to society?

Excerpts of an interview with Bandula Jayasekera from the Palliative Care Centre at Karapitiya Hospital, Galle:

BJ: Dying is one of life's unique experiences; talking about it is difficult for some to initiate and hard for others to hear. I have suffered enough and I like to go as soon as possible. However, until I can I would like to talk about terminally ill people, raise awareness about palliative care, attract more funding and support to build facilities like the one here, a brainchild of senior Cancer Surgeon Dr. Chrysantha Perera. The facilities here are amazing and truly world class.

The doctors and other staff go beyond their official duty to make patients and family members as comfortable as possible. Unfortunately, in Sri Lanka, the focus on palliative care is minimal. Recently the Health Ministry said there is an alarming surge in the detection of cancer patients with 80 patients detected daily. Because of inadequate palliative care, the people who suffer most are from the poorer sections of the society. The rich might be able to have good facilities with their money. But what about the poor people?

This facility is truly world class and is free of charge. This is why I call Dr. Perera a living god. It is not all government money that sustains this facility. Lot of people from outside have helped by way of funding and other efforts. Dr. Perera and the medical staff have also spent their own money to keep people comfortable as well as address the needs of family members of patients. Now I am trying to raise awareness to help these efforts to sustain this facility and also come up with similar facilities elsewhere in the country. This will be my goal during the limited time I

DN: Why is palliative care so important for a terminally ill patient?

BJ: It is important to realize that where we die matters. Just as our living environment influences our quality of life, so does our dying environment, affecting how we and our families experience death. As a terminally ill patient, I want to have a more than dignified death, a comfortable one and that is what I expect from palliative care. It also gives family members peace of mind, because at places like this they can see how well their loved ones are taken care of. Also, the counselling available here helps both patients and family members to prepare for what is to come.

DN: Did you have an understanding about palliative care and dedicated palliative care facilities before?

BJ: I had heard about palliative care, but did not have a proper understanding. I did not know about this place either. Dr Chitra Weerakkody told me about this place and guided me. She introduced me to Dr. Chrysantha, Dr. Gihan Piyasiri and Dr. Rohan Pulleperuma. When I came to see the place for the first time, I was taken by surprise to see the beautiful and peaceful surrounding and the facilities available. However, I felt saddened too because people come here to die.

First, I stayed here for one day and then I thought I will stay for five days. As time went on, I felt very comfortable and was taken care of very well. The medical staff here try to make your death as comfortable as possible. In some overseas countries they have a lot of places like this. Thanks to Dr. Chrysantha this initiative has started and more places are coming up. But we need more. Also, outside, some doctors try to keep us alive. I appreciate their efforts, but that is suffering. They should let us go. Here, the difference is that both sides know what we are up against. So here, doctors and other medical

staff try to make our death or days leading to it as comfortable as possible.

DN: How was your cancer detected and what did you do afterwards?

BJ: A friend of mine who was watching 'Pathikada' from New York called me one day. He told me, "You are having shortness of breath. Why deny it. Go to a doctor." That is how I went to a doctor in the first place. I was diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome, a type of blood cancer in July 2019. I was told a bone marrow transplant was the only option. The doctors said it has to be done in India or Singapore. But because of infections, I opted for Singapore. I could not bear the cost so I appealed for help. Print media including papers at Lake House, electronic media, social media and friends carried my appeal. I received a lot of funding and am grateful to those who helped. Doctors in Sri Lanka were preparing me well. But unfortunately, COVID came and there was trouble in finding a donor as well. Finally, when I went to Singapore, the doctors there said it was too late, the cancer has advanced and the transplant will not help. They told me I was terminally ill.

DN: What thoughts crossed your mind

BJ: When doctors told me, "You are terminally ill," the question sprang to my mind. Why me? But then you have to accept it. You come to terms with it. This is what I have done. I thought about my Mother who in her small ways taught us about life and anithya (impermanence). My brother has been a tower of strength as well as my family and friends. I am not saying that I was brave. I am not brave. Now I take it one day at a time.

DN: Now what do you do in your spare

BJ: I try to raise awareness on the above subject as I said earlier. Now I am getting weaker and I can't write anymore. Also, I do colouring and it is keeping me occupied. A friend of mine fixed Netflix and I watch a movie at times. I watch the animals, birds who roam freely outside my window in the garden of this wonderful facility and it relaxes me.

DN: What do you like most, being a Diplomat or a Journalist?

BJ: I like both. I think in my small way I contributed to my country. I have served my nation in my small way. But I do not want to dwell on the past now. Refusing to let go prolongs life. "It is time to Let Go."

DN: Several questions on international relations, the UN and politics go unanswered. **BJ:** I hardly read news now. Doctors have

advised me to get out of this clutter. I live in the moment. Trying to let go.

DN: What about your stint as Editor of the Daily News?

BJ: Of course, I do not dwell on the past. But the experience was valuable. I had a good team and we worked together well. When I look back, I feel happy.

DN: Any advice for budding journalists?

BJ: Get out of the internet. Don't just copy and paste. Go to the field, do research and raise awareness, give something beneficial to the soci-

DN: Any other thoughts?

BJ: I think authorities should do more to help cancer patients and terminally ill patients. I do not think all roads should lead to Maharagama. At least there should be one hospital in each province dedicated to treat people with cancer. Maharagama hospital is too congested now. I have personally experienced what this can do to

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa called me several times. I told him we should aggressively promote bone marrow transplant in state hospitals to benefit the poor. Also, we do not have a bone marrow registry and I told him to look into that as well. He told me that he will speak to Dr. Jayantha Balawardene at KDU. I think the KDU is the best place to do that as they have the facilities and the personnel. I gave a speech recently at the KDU about my experiences as a terminally ill patient when they opened new palliative care facility. I spoke to the students of the Sabaragamuwa Medical Faculty too after a doc-

I never made money unfairly. I lived a simple life. I collected human beings who later came to my help. I have not worked for one year now. But I have a wonderful chairman who still pays my salary. He keeps my home fires burning. I know so many people who have held high positions being asked to leave after being diagnosed with terminal illness. My last appeal is to raise awareness, help improve palliative care and help medical specialists to improve the quality of life of poor terminally ill patients and their families.

What end-of-life care involves?

Consultant Oncological Surgeon Dr. Chrysantha Perera who is head of the fully-fledged Palliative Care Centre at Karapitiya Hospital, Galle, explains the need for palliative care:

"With increasing numbers of aging and terminally ill patients, our healthcare systems are now under tremendous pressure. Palliative care has long remained a pressing need in Sri Lanka and is fast becoming a vital necessity that can no longer be overlooked in the Sri Lankan health care system. This particular health care provisioning service is already at quite an advanced stage in many countries around the world, but the Sri Lankan health care sector has not yet succeeded in providing adequate palliative care service to people suffering from incurable illnesses.



This, I believe, will not only help improve the quality of care for the patients, but also assist their near and dear ones who would otherwise caring for their incurable family members at great cost to themselves."






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A TRIBUTE TO FALLEN BUDDIES

"GONE, YET NOT FORGOTTEN"



On the 12th of February 2021, we celebrate forty (40) years since we joined the Sri Lanka Air Force in 1981, as the 9th intake of Officer Cadets. We did our basic combat training at Diyathalawa and had a total of 31 cadets and 01 student officer all from leading schools. During the initial weeks of training, one of the Cadets opted to leave as he was selected to the Kothalawala Defense Academy and the remaining continued with the training. By this time, all of the Cadets were allocated to branches that encompassed a majority of the disciplines for the first time in a single intake. Further, our intake was considered a large one since the 1st intake at that

time, as the number was

greater. Also, we were considered as a notorious intake for our mischief and discipline as per the Air Force standards. The intake comprised avid sportsmen that excelled in cricket, rugger, basketball, and hockey who represented the Air Force and some of the sports at the national level. After completing our

basic combat training at Diyathalawa, we were posted to the Air Force Academy China-Bay for our branch training, and the regiment cadets remained at Diyathalawa and continued in their branch training. Besides, five cadets pursued tertiary education as their branch training externally.

Other than the General Duties Pilots (GD/P) branch cadets, the other branch cadets were commissioned on completion of their training after one year and six months. The GD/P cadets were commissioned subsequently, after completing their flying training.

Our career progression

was made in the respective branches with time. Each of us chose the furtherance of the career advancement and some left the service due to various reasons at different times. Let me proudly share the six (06) of us, who were members of the Air Force Board of Management (AFBM) at the zenith and held esteemed appointments of the Commander, the Chief of Staff, the Deputy Chief of Staff, and Directors. A total of eight reached the air ranks of Air Commodore (one star), Air Vice Marshal (two-star), and Air Chief Marshal (four-star).

Our intake comprised individuals unique in their own character with many talents but, fitted well with strong solidarity within the intake. Our good friendship was like stars. You don't always see them, but you know that they are always there in each other's minds. As batch mates, we talked to each other and spent time together. Also, we trusted







Ashean Karthelis the cager and rugby star

ALTHAF NAWAZ

To play in several positions in the game of rugby, one should be blessed with extra ordinary talent and skills while competing in matches. Ashean Karthelis was one of them who turned out to be a prolific player while handling the oval shaped ball as a prop forward, flanker and lock forward from the time he donned the jersey from school level until he represented the country at international competitions maturing as a prominent player in the rugby arena.

Ashean was born in 1985 and his father was late Asiri Karthelis and mother is Jayasika Fernando. He has one sister Menali and grew up in the town of Moratuwa. He was enrolled at S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia from his primary education in1991 and engaged in higher studies until 2004, when he left school.

While having a profound academic career, he had a liking for sports from his younger days. As a result, he started off playing basketball at school. But taking upto rugby was a coincidence, when he participated in the inter-house matches as a wing three quarter in under-13 age category, Until such time he never played rugby.

However, he blossomed out as a quality player and ended up playing in the college first XV rugby team for four years from 2001 to 2004. He ended up captaining the college rugby team in 2003 before his penultimate year in college 2004. He was a fourth year coloursman in College Rugby from 2001 to 2004 for which he was awarded the college colours and also for Basketball and Cadeting as Senior Corporal of the College Cadet Pla-

The year 2001 was a phenomenal

one in his rugby career, when their coach Nimal Lewke (head coach at STC) spotted him while he was playing for the under-17 team for the first year and due to his exceptional skills in winning line outs outjumping the opponents with his unstinted skills in ball handling, resulted him been requested to occupy the wing three quarter position. He was later called to lock horns in the first XV team led by Jivan Goonetilleke in 2001 after engaging in just three games. In his first appearance for that team, where he played the last ten minutes, he was able to score a try as a wing three quarter. Ever since that until his last day at school, he established a regular place both in sevens and XV's rugby

teams, playing in the position of Prop (7's) and Flanker, Second-row (XV's). Some of the best memories of school rugby as a captain was winning the 'Canon R. S. De Saram Trophy' winning 27 - 10 against Trinity (he scored a hat-trick of tries in that game), defeating St. Anthony's College 24 – nil in Nittawela, winning the traditional trophy games against

Trinity, St. Peter's and St. Joseph's College, Colombo only losing to Royal 6-17 while becoming runnersup in the President's Trophy losing 22 - 24 to Kingswood College, Kandy.

He went on to annex several awards at college level for his leadership roles. He was awarded the prize for Best all-round Sportsman in 2003, Best Ruggerite of the Season in 2004,

Winning the Best Defensive Player at the Inaugural Royal-Thomian Basketball match for the D. S. Senanayake Trophy in 2003, He was appointed College Prefect in 2003. As a schoolboy ruggerite he represented under-19 Sri Lanka Schools Team in 2002 in Hong Kong and 2003 in Malaysia.

After his remarkable school rugby career, he was invited to play for CR and FC in 2004 and went on to compete for them until 2010.

He mostly played as a flanker and second row forward in XV's and in the front row as a prop in the sevens

He went onto to captain the Longden Place club in 2009 where they ended up the League and knockout tournament runners-up. He opted to take a three year break due to personal reasons and made a comeback in 2012 to play for Havelock Sports Club, where they emerged League Champions by beating Kandy Sports Club by 50 points to 19 on their ground, where he was instrumental in scoring the final try to reach the half century mark, which he rates as an unblemished memory.

While playing at CR he was entrusted to lead the President's XV's rugby team in 2009.

His National career with the Sri Lanka team started by representing the Sevens Rugby team in 2006 at the Asian Games in Doha.

Sri Lankan Olympic stars of yesteryear

Allan Smith was a versatile diver at 1952 Helsinki Games

Norman Allan Smith participated in the 1952 Olympic Games in Helsinki, Finland in the men's diving events following a successful swimming career at S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia.

He developed a liking to diving competitions and in 1947 for the first time he participated in a National Diving Championship but was defeated by Des Cotton.

Since then, he never lost at any meet. From 1948 to 1966 for a period of 18 years he continuously won the Diving Championship and displayed excellence in performances.

In 1950, at the Empire Games held in Auckland, New Zealand he qualified for the finals. Thus, he became the first Sri Lankan sportsman to be selected for the finalround of an International Diving Competition.

At this meet, Smith was placed eighth. He participated in the Olympic Games held in Helsinki, Finland in 1952 but failed to claim

In 1966, Smith was selected for the Asian Games in Bangkok,

In 10 diving events he obtained a total of 101.72 points while the qualifying timing was 97.73

Smith's score equalled that of the contestant placed sixth in the Asian Games of 1962. Although he could not win the events, he was able to obtain a certificate and was appointed a Referee/Judge in the Women's Diving Competition.

Smith who went as a contestant and returned as a Referee/Judge did not give up the sport. Although he was unsuccessful at the 1966 Indo-Sri Lanka Swimming Meet held in New Delhi he had the honour of winning a Gold Medal in a single event.

In 1967, he won the Indo-Sri Lanka swimming events in Sri Lanka after having learnt bitter lessons from the past experiences.

After having led the Sri Lanka Team for the fourth Indo-Sri Lanka swimming contests in

1969, Smith decided to retire from active sports.

Smith who served in the Sri Lanka Army for quite some time was appointed a Surveyor and travelled widely in Sri Lanka. He came for diving contests in Colombo even from very distant places.

Smith who showed such excellence in this sport had no coach. In 1966, at the Selection Meet, Alan did a wonderful dive from the three-metre springboard merely by learning from the books.

Smith engaged himself in training for over a decade amidst many difficulties, displaying the determination of an outstanding athlete.

His routine training included waking up at 4.00 a.m. and running between Mount Lavinia and Bambalapitiya, a 50-metre speed run and two hours of training in swimming in the evening.

Although he missed this training programme when serving in the outstations, he was able to obtain the required results by coming to Colombo a few days before

Mega development plan to boost sports in Sri Lanka

The Rural and School Sports Infrastructure Improvement State Ministry is planning to invest a sum of Rs. 2,940 million this year for a series of proposed development programmes.

This development programme includes the reconstruction of school playgrounds, national sports schools, public playgrounds, sports clubs, and youth clubs as well as conducting rural and divisional sports tournaments.

These details were revealed by the Minister of Sports Namal Rajapaksa and Rural and School Sports Infrastructure improvement State Minister Thenuka Vidanagamage. The Sports Ministry has already identified that most of the school playgrounds are not up to

for the students' sports activities. There are about 10,175 playgrounds schools all over the country. The Ministry is planning to select one school from each zone and altogether

99 playgrounds to reconstruct and improve the standard with the allocation of Rs. 320m.

The reconstruction work includes the improvement of playgrounds, dressing rooms, and the installment of special drainage systems for the ground.

In addition, the Ministry will invest a sum of Rs. 380m for sports equipment allocated for the schools which will be select on zonal basis.

The Ministry will specially focus on the National Sports Schools for development through this project. Last year, five National Schools were developed by the Ministry and this year the Ministry is hoping to develop a further 12 National Sports Schools with the support of the three forces. They hope to invest a sum of Rs. 250m for this project.



The Ministry is also expected to upgrade 200 public grounds with an investment of Rs. 1,000m.

The Ministry hopes to spend Rs. 5m for each project which includes player sanitary facilities, dressing rooms, sprinkler systems, and a fence around the ground for protection while these projects will be completed through Provincial Councils.

In addition, rural playground development is another area to focus and the Ministry hopes to invest Rs. 500m.

The Ministry also hopes to invest Rs. 15m to conduct rural and divisional level sports tournaments such as marathons and cycling events to provide more opportunities for rural athletes.

The Ministry will also focus on the development of Sports Clubs and Youth Clubs while providing sports equipment to enhance their facilities. Meanwhile, a special focus will be made on

traditional sports to build-up good friendships and to create a good sports culture among the athletes. Rs. 25m will be allocated for this project.

In addition, a sum of Rs. 100m will be allocated for the publicity of this proposed project with the assistance of print and electronic media through the backing of Media Minister Keheliya



Depositors of six failed FCs to receive additional Rs. 500,000

Rs. 12 bn to be used from liquidity fund

The government will look to bail out failed Finance Companies including The Finance Company (TFC) soon and a Cabinet Paper for this has been forwarded, State Minister Money, Capital Markets and State Enterprise Reforms Ajith Nivard Cabraal said

The Central Bank of Sri Lanka had cancelled the license of TFC last May after efforts to revive the company through different strategies had failed. "We are now awaiting the Cabinet approval to go ahead with finding new investors to restart some of these defunct Finance companies," he said.

The State Minister said that this problem of finance companies collapsing aggravated in 2008 but every effort was made using various tools to protect financial institutions and thus protect

the country's financial stability during that period which was not an easy one. He noted that under the previous regime the depositors' monies were not paid despite the Rajapaksa government and him as the Governor of Central Bank starting a 'Deposit Insurance Fund' in 2010 with Rs. 1.1 billion when the current Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa was President."

He also recalled that in 2014 a Financial Sector Consolidation Programme was submitted by merging over 58 financial institutions to 20 making them strong financial institutions. State Minister Cabraal said that unfortunately all of that was set aside in 2015. As a result, financial institutions faced financial crises and some collapsed.

Cabraal said that recently he had a discussion with the



compensate depositors of collapsed finance companies with an additional sum of Rs. 500,000 among the 25,000 depositors of six failed financial institutions. A total of around Rs. 12 billion will be used to pay the additional amounts to eligible depositors. This is in addition to the Rs. 600,000 paid to 147,000 depositors of six financial institutions under the Sri Lanka Deposit Insurance and Liquidity Support Scheme (SLDILSS) which currently stands at Rs. 60 billion.

He also said that the government was making an effort to solve this problem to the best of their ability and paying Rs. 600,000 to depositors shows the commitment towards them. (SS)

here is a quote by Roy Bennett who says – 'No one has ever achieved greatness without dreams'. Our vanity has made us so audacious that we have mastered our environment and created anything that we conceived of in our minds. We can see Colombo growing every day and taking form all around us. However as President, Sri Lanka Institute of Architects, Veranjan Kurukulasuriya points out, there is polarization. Also social issues have sprung up all around us like weeds in a garden.

VANITY

Most of us are vain. Most of us like to drive one of the top 10 luxury car brands. Most of us like to wear designer clothing. But somewhere down the line society split into the haves and the have-nots and this was long before the luxury car brands and designer clothing. It happened long ago when groups decided to set themselves apart from the others. Vanity is truly our favorite sin.

"We see a polarization of people; the city is becoming a place NOT meant for the ordinary men; it is only for the rich; it is also becoming cosmopolitan- international. Even the Chinese national day is celebrated in Colombo. That is a world-wide trend. But in Sri Lanka we have only one primate city (A primate city usually refers to a city that is dis-proportionately large in terms of population size relative to other cities contained within a given geographically bounded area, such as a region, a nation, or even the globe) and that is becoming exclusive leaving out the common man. It is a socio-economic trend. In the West where the middle class is more than 90 percent, this is not an issue. But in Sri Lanka where more than 50 percent are below the poverty line this is a social issue," explained Kurukulasuriya.

Entertainment, sporting events, cinemas, carnivals, parks, festivals and restaurants are what we live for. There's nothing wrong with having fun. Cities should provide enjoyment.


"The City is for citi-zens, i.e. city-people, 'urban men' living urban lives in the city, viz. out-going with a lot of options available - entertainment, sporting events, theatre/cinemas, discussion forums, carnivals, parks, religious festivals, restaurants and street festivals similar to cities that we used to have centuries ago. In short a city is to live-work-play. City is not for millions to come in the morning and leave in the evening. So obviously the role of Colombo needs to change and the built form must change accordingly," pointed out Kurukulasuriya.

CHALLENGES

"Port City will bring in service providing jobs in hotels etc. It will probably bring in money if the world springs back to a semblance of normalcy out of Covid19. It will also be like Las Vegas! But is that what we want? Gambling has always been considered as a vice- not engaged in by those who have self-respect and pride in their capabilities. This country with so much fertility so much culture and so much wisdom need not blindly follow the West," added Kurukulasuriya.

We all talk about Green Cities. But a city is not green if it is polluted. One method to mitigate the problem of greenhouse gases is by fixing the transport problem. Because one major source of greenhouse gases is Transport. More private vehicles on the road with the congestion means more greenhouse gas emissions. If we can have a better public transport system and if we had less congestion on our streets through Decentralization, then we can really reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions.

"Colombo was green anyway and it can become a green city. It is not difficult for us because we have not yet reached the destructive complexity the Western cities (physically, socially and economically) have become. Functions of Colombo must be decentralized to the suburbs. If we want the city to be green, then most of us must

walk to work places which means we must live in the city. The mass movement of people on a daily basis requires complex transport systems. Those are not necessary if we plan properly," said Kurukulasuriya.

WALKING

There is something about walking that makes sense. One is the exercise. It is healthy. It also reduces the Greenhouse gas emissions that you might release if you were driving a private car. Also when you use public transport you develop an understanding of bus routes. So in the event you are stranded without a car, you will have no problem getting from one place to another if you know the bus routes. "Walking should be the major mode of transport to work. If we get that right, parking will sort by itself. For instance, schools need to be decentralized.

Royal College primaries must be relocated in outstations by converting schools outside as Royal Colleges. So those students do not need to come to Colombo. Colombo has less than 100,000 of school going age and that is what Colombo schools have to cater for. However since the government officers from Colombo schools do not want their schools broken into parts, such proposals do not receive any attention," pointed out Kurukulasuriya. He pointed out that he has seen Colombo alive day and night about 40 years ago. It is a dead place today. If you can bring back urban activities to Colombo it will become alive again. "The way things are going, and according to the existing plans, I do not have much hope,"

He added that the main impediment is that we have failed to develop an architectural language of our own- especially for cities. But for that matter most countries in the developing world have also failed in that respect. The world cities are beginning to look alike.

DON'T BE ARTIFICIAL

"We are aping the West. We do not even have a dialogue on these issues. We have taken the Western lifestyles as the ideal to strive for.

But the FACT is if all the people in the world are going to achieve the average standard of an American, then we need the resources of four additional planets. Since we don't have that, it follows that we are after a mirage or that if some reach that goal, then some others would have to slide down the scale of standards. And the city form reflects its life-

So Colombo is becoming an artificial city suitable for only a few who are living American lives.

The main impediment for our development (architecture included) is that most of us are outdated (not the technology). We don't think out of the box. In this age when services are available online and where one is living does not really matter (work-from-home is easy) have we changed our living patterns or our city functions accordingly? It may be difficult for developed countries but it is easy for us with only 600, 000 living in the main city," explained Kurukulasuriya.

n Sunday, President Joe Biden's two German Shepherds were photographed enjoying their time in the snow on the White House South Lawn in a tweet shared by the president's granddaughter, Naomi Biden.

In the snap, Major can be seen running around on the grounds while Champ decided to take it easy, sitting comfortably in the snow.

"Snow day!!!," Naomi captioned the Champ and Major officially moved into

the White House on Jan. 24, just four days after Biden, 78, was officially inaugurated as the 46th President of the United States.

"The First Family wanted to get settled before bringing the dogs down to Washington from Delaware. Champ is enjoying his new dog bed by the fireplace, and Major loved running around on the South Lawn," First Lady Dr. Jill Biden's press secretary Michael LaRosa told CNN at the time.

Champ and Major are the first pooches to live in the White House in four years, as former President Donald Trump was the first president to not have a dog since President William McKinley in 1897, per CBS News.

Major is making history as the first rescue dog to live at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue. The Biden family adopted Major from the Delaware Humane Association (DHA) in November 2018, 10 years after they welcomed their first German Shepherd, Champ.

President Biden and Dr. Biden got Champ around Christmas 2008 and brought the beloved pet with them to the vice presidential residence at the U.S. Naval Observatory during former Vice President Joe Biden's two terms with former President Barack Obama. Both Champ and Major have already made their presence known at their new home. The dogs could be heard barking in the background following a press conference on Jan. 25 from the Oval Office, according to a tweet from C-SPAN Communications Director Howard Mortman.

Dr. Biden has also hinted that she and the president may be looking into getting a cat, as well. "Well, I'd love to get a cat. I love having animals around the house,' she told Fox 5's Angie Goff in November.

COLOUR OF EXCRETA OF DOGS

s a responsible owner you should examine the nature of your dog's excreata because it says a lot about your pet's health. The information regarding the colour of your dog's excreta is very important for the vet to diagnose the illness of the dog.

Dogs' excreta comes in different colours. Normally it should be brown. In abnormal situations the colour can vary from black or very dark to red, pink, purple, grey or greasy, white spotting, yellow, orange or green. Here's how to tell if your dog's excreta is healthy or not.

Black- It could be a sign of blood entering their stomach and getting digested. This can mean that your dog may have an ulcer in its stomach or intestines. It could be a sign that your dog has been poisoned.

Red - Red is a sure sign of blood. This could result from inflammation or bleeding in their gastrointestinal tract, an injury in your dog's rectum, an infection in your dog's anus or anal glands, or the worst scenario could be a tumor

With mucous - A slight mucous layer is normal. When a very substantial, thick layer of mucous covers the stools, your pooch has inflammation in his colon from dietary indigestion, stress, parasites or an infec-

Pink or purple- Stools can be a symptom of gut injury caused by a variety of things, including, diseases of your dog's immune system, intestinal parasites/bac-


Grey or greasy – Stools coming in big, soft mounds, could mean an illness in the pancreas better known as maldigestion. German Shepherds and Collies are especially prone to getting this. A vet can treat this condition in your dog easily.

White spotting - If their excreta has little white spots in it, your dog might have worms. Take your pet to the vet soon for deworming.

Yellow - If your dog's stools are coming out yellow, it could be a sign of an upset stomach due to food intolerance. Be careful of what your dog eats.

Orange —Stools in orange colour could mean problems in their liver, gall bladder or bile ducts. Sometimes, the reason could be that the food it eats passing too quickly through its gut.

Green- Green stools can be a sign that your dog's eating way too much grass. It could signify something much worse, though, like parasites or eating rat poison. If excreta of your dog are not normal, observe and get more information and check if it occurs continuously. If so meet the vet immediately. Better if you can take a photo of it at least in case if you cannot take a sample.




