IT is hereby notified in terms of section 57 (1) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, that the Minister of Local Government and Housing has, under section 56 (1) of the said Ordinance, as so modified, sanctioned the improvement scheme of the type known as a street widening scheme in respect of the street described in the Schedule hereto and submitted to her for sanction by the Kegalla Urban Council.

Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

EXAMINATION FOR RECRUITMENT TO GRADE IV OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAL SERVICE

THE above examination will be held in Colombo, on Saturday, September 5, 1959.

The Examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. *Salary and Conditions of Service.*—(a) Successful candidates will be appointed, as vacancies occur to posts of Secretary, Grade IV, Local Government Service, on the scale Rs. 2,100 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,900 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs. 3,180 per annum. Rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance at Government rates are payable.

(b) All successful candidates will be appointed to Grade IV of the Local Government Secretarial service, subject to confirmation after one year. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulations made thereunder and other conditions of service laid down by the Commission from time to time.

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3. *Applications.*—(a) Applications for admission to the examination must be made substantially on the form given below, and must be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission.

(b) Applications must be sent to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission not later than August 20, 1959. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

4. The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission will issue Admission Forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the Officer appointed to supervise the examination their Admission Forms. A candidate not producing such a form will be refused admission to sit for the examination.

5. *Eligibility.*—The following categories of officers are eligible to sit for the above examination:—

- (i) Grade V Secretaries in Town Councils with not less than 4 years' satisfactory service as a Secretary, Grade V, on or before August 20, 1959.
- (ii) Clerks in E. C. C. (Grade II) of the Local Government Clerical Service and E. C. C. (Grade II) Clerks transferred to P. W. D. or to a Kachcheri who have not less than 3 years' satisfactory service as a E. C. C. (Grade II) Clerk on or before August 20, 1959.
- (iii) Clerks in Grade II of the Department of the Local Government Service Commission who have not less than 3 years' satisfactory service as a Grade II clerk on or before August 20, 1959.
- (iv) Grade I Secretaries in Village Committees with not less than 4 years' satisfactory service as a Grade I Secretary, on or before August 20, 1959.

They should forward their applications through the Municipal Commissioners, Special Commissioners or Chairmen of Local Authorities in which they are serving.

6. Municipal Commissioners, Special Commissioners and Chairmen of the Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to Officers serving in their Councils or Committees, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

7. *Subjects.*—The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

- (i) Local Authority Accounts, Methods of Accounting and financial system and procedure, including the preparation, &c., of the Budget—Annual and Supplementary; Government Financial Regulations, Part II (i.e., Leave, Travelling, Holiday Warrant, &c.) excluding Chapter XIX and XX. All Circulars and instructions issued by the Local Government Service Commission and Commissioner of Local Government (one-and-half hour paper).

(This paper will consist of questions on Urban and Town Councils' Accounts, tots, &c., and will be designed to test accuracy in handling figures and a knowledge of the fundamental rules of accounts and Government Financial Regulations applicable to the above local bodies)

- (ii) (a) Local Government Law including Urban Council and Town Council Ordinances and regulations By-laws made thereunder
- (b) Local Government Service Ordinance, regulations and Circular Instructions (two hour paper) 200

(iii) Sinhalese or Tamil (one hour. paper) ... 100
 (A working knowledge of the selected language will be expected. The Question Paper will include exercises on—

- (a) comprehension of simple prose passages;
- (b) descriptions, letter writing, dialogues, &c;
- (c) translation of (1) easy sentences into Sinhalese/Tamil, (2) a simple passage into English;
- (d) vocabulary.

This paper will be regarded as a qualifying test only, and every candidate will be required to obtain a minimum of 30 per cent of the marks allotted for the paper. The marks obtained in this paper will not, however, be taken into consideration when selecting officers for appointment.

(iv) Viva Voce Test ... 150

8. The examination will be held in two parts. The written examination will be held first and, on the results of it, candidates will be selected to attend the viva voce test, which too will be held in Colombo. The number to be called for this test will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE

BY-LAWS under section 49 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), made by the Village Committee of the Kandepalle Korale village area in the Matale District and approved by the Minister of Local Government and Housing by virtue of the powers vested in her by that section, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 September 24, 1947.

By-laws

1. Every licence issued under the by-laws appearing in Parts VII and XII of the standard by laws adopted by the Committee shall, unless earlier cancelled under those by-laws, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which such licence is issued.

2. Every application for a licence under the by-laws appearing in Parts VII, X, XI, XII, XIII, XV, XVI, XVII, XVIII, XXVI and XXVII of the standard by-laws adopted by the Committee, shall be made in the form provided for the purpose by the Committee, and shall be sent to reach the Chairman—

- where such application is for a new licence, not less than thirty days before the proposed date of commencement of the business in respect of which that licence is required; and
- where such application is for the renewal of an existing licence, on or before the first day of September of the year preceding the year in respect of which the renewal of that licence is required.

3. Part XXI of the standard by-laws, relating to kraals, adopted by the Committee, is hereby amended, by the addition, immediately after by-law 1, of the following new by-laws:—

2. Every permit issued under by-law I shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.
3. Every application for a permit under by-law I shall be made in the form provided for the purpose by the Committee and shall be sent to reach the Chairman—
 - where such application is for a new permit, not less than thirty days before the proposed date of erection of the kraal; and
 - where such application is for the renewal of an existing permit, on or before the first day of September of the year preceding the year in respect of which the renewal of that permit is required.

4. The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 11,328 of May 30, 1958, are hereby amended, under the heading "LAUNDRIES", in by-law 8, by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (2) thereof, of the following new paragraph:—

"(3) Every application for a permit under paragraph (1) shall be made in the form provided for the purpose by the Committee, and shall be sent to reach the Chairman—

- where such application is for a new permit, not less than thirty days before the proposed date of commencement of the business of keeping the laundry; and
- where such application is for the renewal of an existing permit, on or before the first day of September of the year preceding the year in respect of which the renewal of that permit is required."

5. In these by-laws —

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee, and "Committee" means the Kandapalle Korale Village Committee in the Matale District.

By-Laws relating to the Tax on Vehicles and Animals

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has in his possession, custody or control any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, shall furnish to the Chairman a Schedule of particulars substantially in the Form set out in Schedule A hereto, which may be obtained from the office of the Committee.

(2) The Schedule referred to in paragraph (1) shall be filled up and sent to the Chairman on or before the 15th day of August, 1959, in respect of the year 1959, by the person liable to pay the tax under section 47 of the Ordinance, and no such Schedule shall be required from such person in respect of any subsequent year during which he is in possession, custody or control of such vehicle or animal.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1, shall, without further notice, be liable—

- for the year 1959, in respect of the vehicles and animals specified in that Schedule, to pay the tax on or before the 30th day of September, of that year; and
- for every subsequent year, in respect of such vehicles and animals specified in that Schedule as remain in his possession, custody or control for more than thirty days in such subsequent year, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of March of that year.

3. If any person, after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal which is not mentioned in such Schedule and which is liable to the tax under the Ordinance, or if any person who has not furnished a Schedule under by law 1, for the first time acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, he shall, within seven days from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use such vehicle or animal, send a written notice to the Chairman stating the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and further furnish forthwith a written statement of particulars substantially in the Form set out in Schedule A hereto.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the written statement referred to in by-law 3, shall be liable to pay the tax, in respect of the year in which such statement is furnished and in respect of every subsequent year, for the vehicles and animals specified in that statement which are in his possession, custody or control, within such time as may be notified to him in that behalf by the Chairman.

5 (1) Every person who, after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, claims to be exempt, under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance, from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered or referred to in such Schedule or statement, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

(2) Every person who, after having furnished the Schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, ceases to possess, keep or use any vehicle or animal, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman that he has ceased to possess, keep or use such vehicle or animal and shall, if he has transferred such vehicle or animal to another person, notify the Chairman in writing of the name and address of such transferee.

6. (1) On payment of the tax for any vehicle by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person, in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with such distinguishing letters for vehicles specified in Schedule B hereto as are appropriate to that vehicle, and with the figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles.

(2) Where any plate issued under paragraph (1) of this by-law becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on payment of fifty cents, to receive a fresh plate.

(3) The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise, that any plate issued under paragraph (1) of this by-law has been lost or stolen, issued to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on payment by him of sixty cents.

7. (1) The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

(2) A plate issued under by-law 6 in respect of one vehicle shall not be affixed on any other vehicle.

8. The Chairman or any person authorized by him in writing in that behalf may, with the assistance of a Village Headman or a police officer if necessary, enter any land or building between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. of the day to ascertain whether any person has in his possession, custody or control any vehicle or animal for which a tax is payable; and the person in charge of such land or building shall afford such facilities as may be required by the Chairman or such other person for the exercise of his powers under this by-law.

9. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any other person authorised by him in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 7 to be affixed on such vehicle; and the driver or person in charge of such vehicle shall, on being so requested, stop the vehicle and permit the Chairman or such other person to inspect such plate.

10. In these by law-laws—
“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;
“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Netolpitiya village area in the Hambantota District; and
“Ordinance” means the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198).

11. The by-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals made by certain Village Committees in the Hambantota District and published in Gazette No. 9,276 of June 2, 1944, are hereby amended, in so far as those by-laws relate to the Netolpitiya village area, by the rescission of those by-laws.
