Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa yesterday stated that the Government had no plans to curtail development even in the face of the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic.

Prime Minister Rajapaksa recalled that the Government did not halt development activities even during the height of the war from 2005 onwards.

The Prime Minister said that

the Government was committed to create a healthy society and a self-sufficient economy that gives priority to local agriculture and products. He reiterated that whatever comes, either war or pandemic, the Government will not curtail development projects.

It also allows countries to expedite their own regulatory approval to import and administer COVID-19 vaccines.

"Countries with no access to vaccines to date will finally be able to start vaccinating their health workers risk, contributing to the COVAX Facili-

ty's goal of equitable vaccine distribution," said Dr Mariângela Simão, WHO Assistant-Director General for Access to Medicines and

'But we must keep up the pressure to meet the needs of priority populations everywhere and facilitate global access. To do that, we need two things – a scale-up of manufacturing capacity, and developers' early submission of their vaccines for WHO review."

The WHO EUL process can be carried out quickly when vaccine developers submit the full data required by WHO in a timely manner. Once those data are submitted, WHO can rapidly assemble its evaluation team and regulators from around the world to assess the information and, when necessary, carry out inspections of manufacturing sites.

In the case of the two AstraZeneca/Oxford vaccines, WHO assessed the quality, safety and efficacy data, risk management plans and programmatic suitability, such as cold chain requirements. The process took under four The vaccine was reviewed on February 8 by WHO's

Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on Immunization (SAGE), which makes recommendations for vaccines' use in populations (i.e. recommended age groups, intervals between shots, advice for specific groups such as pregnant and lactating women). The SAGE recommended the vaccine for all age groups 18 and above. The AstraZeneca/Oxford product is a viral vectored

vaccine called ChAdOx1-S [recombinant]. It is being produced at several manufacturing sites, as well as in the Republic of Korea and India. ChAdOx1-S has been found to have 63.09% efficacy and is suitable for low- and middle-income countries due to easy storage requirements.

The emergency use listing (EUL) procedure assesses the suitability of novel health products during public health emergencies. The objective is to make medicines, vaccines and diagnostics available as rapidly as possible to address the emergency, while adhering to stringent criteria of safety, efficacy and quality. The assessment weighs the threat posed by the emergency as well as the benefit that would accrue from the use of the product against any potential risks. (WHO)

which imposed certain restrictions on the use of fullface helmets by motorcyclists.

Counsel Dharshana Weraduwage also submitted to court that the relevant regulations is not valid in law since it was not approved by Parliament.

This petition had been filed by Namal Prasanga of Wellawaya, a motorcyclist and a businessman by profession. Prasanga alleged that the Wellawaya police had initiated legal action against him for wearing a full-face helmet in violation of the extraordinary gazette notification.

The Attorney General gave an undertaking not to take any further legal action against the petitioner at the Wellawaya Magistrate's Court as per the regulations.

Accordingly, Prasanga decided to withdraw the petition filed challenging the gazette notification banning the use of full-face helmets since he obtained relief.

Through this Extraordinary Gazette Notification No. 2007/39, February 23, 2017; then Transport Minister had imposed certain restrictions on the use of helmets by motorcyclists effectively prohibiting the use of full-faced

The Petitioner states that he had used a full-face helmet for a period of over a two and a half year period and on December 11, 2018 he was stopped on the roadside by a Police Constable attached to Wellawaya police at Warunagama, Wellawaya, alleging that the use of full-face helmets was banned. He was ordered to surrender his full-faced helmet together with his driving licence. He had handed over his helmet and driving licence and was issued with a permit in lieu of driving licence. However, he was not issued with a receipt for his crash helmet which was taken into custody and was directed to appear in the Magistrate's Court, Wellawaya on January 8 2019.

The Petitioner states that on December 19, 2018, Wellawaya police OIC had reported the facts of the said incident to the Wellawaya Magistrate's Court by case number 15879 and had sought orders from the Court to send the detained helmet to the Sri Lanka Standards Institute for a report on the helmet and clearly had submitted that they suspect a violation of the concerned regulations.

The Petitioner states that the action initiated against him is arbitrary and it violates the equal protection of the law and it also violates the health and safety measures afforded to motorcyclists to protect them from severe facial and other injuries.

At the Committee, when taking up the last meeting's progress regarding the repatriation of Sri Lankan refugees in India, a concern raised by MP Charles Nirmalanathan, Foreign Secretary Admiral Prof. Jayanath Colombage stated that there are a number of camps for asylum seekers in India.

He stated that more than 50,000asylum seekers are in the camps of Tamil Nadu. He also pointed out that there are also people outside these camps whilst measures have been taken to repatriate a considerable number back to Sri Lanka.

Whilst stating that the Indian Government is providing food, shelter, medication, education and the basic needs and welfare for the refugees they are also being monitored by Sri Lanka's Deputy High Commission in Chennai. The construction work of the irrigation projects in the Anuradhapura District will be accelerated parallel to the Wari Saubhagya (Irrigation Prosperity) programme by the Irrigation Department.

Irrigation Minister Chamal Rajapaksa has instructed the Irrigation Director General and Senior Irrigation Engineers to accelerate the Irrigation Development Projects as delaying



Brief family history of Dr. V. Paramalingam

Dr Paramalingam's family comes from the most illustrious Vanni freedom fighters so fought the British in the early part of the 19th Century. From his father's side his family halls from the illustrious Vanni chieftain Pariyari Velon who remained the fiercest fighter opposed to the British rule in the Mullaitivu area circa 1807. The J. P. Lewis manual of Varmi makes mention of him at page 22 as a person sent by Pandara Vanniyan to foment trouble and start a mass rebellion against the British rule in Vanni. Pariyari Velon's son, Pariyari Vinayar held sway in Vanni as the only known freedom fighter in the later part of the 19th Century. There has been a folk song in the name of Kamugamsandai that exists glorifying his exploits as a fighter/rebellious leader against the British. This song remained as a folk song only by word of mouth until 1979 when it was printed for the first time when Dr Paramalingam's father Mr Vinasitham by died and to comme morate him the song was printed in his memorial leaflet. Mr Vinasithamby was the village chairman of Mulliyawallai village council from 1933 to 1947. He also was the registerer of births, deaths and marriages from 1938 to 1965. He was also co-founder of Tanniyutu Hindu Board school along with Mr. S. Rajaratnam the Hindu development board chairman in 1934.

Although Vanni history has not been properly recorded, the new research from historians like Mr Ambalavanar Mayuran and Professor Indragala clearly confirm that the history of the last King of Vanni was not well researched until recently and the history books so far in existence are nothing more than drama narratives with many fictitious characters. Pariyari Velon is from the village of Kanukkerny the research proves it is in this village that PandaraVanniyan's father's family also lived. According to late Dr. V. Pararajasingam of Vavuniya, later Canada, Pandara Vanniyan and Pariyari Velon were half siblings. There are two other illustrious families of Varni chieftains who are represented in Or Paramalingam's family Ponar Vannichchiyar of the Panankamam chief's family also had strong family connections to Panyari Velon's family coming from the same village, Kanukkerny

reference J. P. Lewis manual of Vanni page 19. From his mother's side Dr Paramalingam is a direct descendant of Senathypathy Theorar whose real name was Kanapathipillai who was a heroic military comman der of the Vanni king who had assisted the Kandyan rulers in their fight against the British. Theerar Kanapathipillal according to anecdotal history has marched through the Vanni jungles with a contingent of cavalry forces towards the end of the 18th Century and the beginning of the 19th Century to provide support to the Kandyan King who himself was a Tamil. In that respect, Dr Paramalingam is a remnant of the Vanni aristocracy.

PUCSL approves Kerawalapitiya Natural **Gas Power Plant**

The Public Utilities Commission of Sri Lanka (PUCSL), the electricity sector regulator, approved the power purchase agreement to build 300 MW Kerawalapitiya Liquid Natural Gas Power Plant in Sri Lanka under the new chairmanship and the board members last week. The agreement will be signed by the Ceylon Electricity Board (CEB) and the Lakdhanavi (Pvt) Limited.

"The agreement for the 300 MW Kerawalapitiya LNG that was approved by the PUCSL will be implemented with conditions more favourable to the electricity consumer, the CEB and the Government.

The PUCSL recommended the inclusion of 18 amendments, which were not included in the previous power agreement submitted for approva and the CEB and Lakdanavi have agreed to include those favourable terms. The agreement approved by the PUCSL is more favourable to the consumers, the Government and the Ceylon Electricity Board. The CEB will purchase electricity for 20 years under this agreement," PUCSL Chairman Janaka Ratnayake said.

The unit price of electricity supplied by the power plant is Rs. 14.98. Both diesel and LNG fuels can be used to generate electricity, and the initial phase of generation will continue to use diesel fuel until LNG or natural gas supply begins, the PUCSL in a press communiqué said

The CEB sought the approval of the PUCSL for the tendering of this LNG power plant on November 15, 2016, and the PUCSL approved the process within two days (November 17, 2016). The CEB is responsible for selecting the most suitable party to build the power plant through tendering and has taken about four years to complete the tender process for the power plant.

Following the completion of the tender process and the selection of the eligible party, the relevant purchase agreement was submitted for the approval of the PUCSL on October 9, 2020 by the CEB. However, it was revealed that there were discrepancies between the new agreement submitted by the CEB and the original agreement approved by the PUCSL. In particular, the 18 amendments contained in the original agreement were not included in the final agreement submitted for approval. The PUCSL recommended to the CEB to re-include these conditions in the agreement as the removal of these conditions will be detrimental to the consumer, the Government and the CEB. Subject to those amendments, conditional approval for the final agreement was granted on November 25 last year. Following the recommendations of the PUCSL, the CEB amended the final agreement and submitted the final agreement for the purchase of electricity on December 1 last year, for approval. However, by the time of the submission of the final agreement, the then members of the Commission had resigned from their posts.

The new members were appointed to the Commission in the first week of February and at the first meeting of the new board, final approval was given for the 300 MW LNG power plant agreement.

"The PUCSL expects the CEB will take actions to expedite the construction of this 300 MW LNG power plant to cater to the country's electricity demand," Ratnayake said.

India's overall commitment of development assistance to Sri Lanka stands at US\$ 3.5 billion and among these US\$ 560 million

is under grants. Consul General of India, Hambantota Dipin P.R. represented the Indian High Commission in the event. Parliamentarian Rameshwaran, Senthil Thondaman, Office of National Unity and Reconciliation (ONUR) Member were present.

Additionally, the power plant has been completely aligned with global benchmarks for social, environmental governance, and sustainability during its construction and is set to exceed these standards during operation. The project is also compliant with the UN Sustainable Development Goals as they pertain to the provision of sustainable, reliable, affordable, renewable, modern energy for all. The project provides resilient infrastructure, promotes inclusiveness, ensures sustainable industrialization, and fosters innovation. Tackling unethical conversions

rchbishop of Colombo Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith has taken up the cudgels against Christian fundamentalist groups who resort to unethical conversions via financial and other material inducements. His Eminence quite rightly pointed out that the prevailing economic hardships and the rising cost of living, etc. make it easy for people to be lured to the blandishments of these Christian fringe groups who are mushrooming with vast funds at their disposal.

The Cardinal said the Catholic Church has no connection to these various pastors and Christian sects. In recent times a number of people who call themselves pastors had emerged and they had been targeting senior artistes, sportsmen and business persons. It would not be a bad idea if the bank accounts of these so-called preachers are perused to ascertain their sources of income and other assets as suggested by the Cardinal. The Catholic Church is thousands of years old and they have a coherent organization and structure. To become a Catholic priest, an individual has to go through a rigorous and prescribed process putting in many years of study and training.

In the past few decades a bunch of people have also started preaching and these people are not part of any organization of the established Church. We do not know if they have had any training. Cardinal Ranjith is not the first person from the Catholic Church to express such views against the conduct of these fundamentalist groups. There had been others, notably Bishop Emeritus Oswald Gomis who was a vociferous critic of such segments. These preachers have led to a situation where even the established Church is being viewed with a jaundiced eye by practitioners of other faiths particularly Buddhists and Hindus who are allegedly being lured by material inducements offered to enter the fold of these sects or to use a term in common currency - subjected to unethical conversions.

The Cardinal also rightly stated that if this state of affairs were to continue there was bound to be friction between the followers of the established Church and those of other faiths, which, needless to say, could snowball into religious conflict. Not long ago there were frequent reports in the media of attacks carried out on these so-called preaching centres in villages and also in certain urban areas where the pastors concerned were manhandled. Mercifully such incidents are no longer in the news, but the worst fears of the Cardinal could be realized if things get out of hand. This is because Christian fundamentalist groups are continuing to mushroom at a rate with even ordinary homes being converted into 'prayer centres'. Not just Buddhists, deep inroads are even made by these groups into the Catholic domain to snare away its followers through inducements which may also have prompted a concerned Cardinal to come out with his views.

The development also could impinge on the current efforts now being made to forge religious unity among all, particularly after the Easter Sunday tragedy that saw a deep alienation of the population on religious lines. His Eminence could also have had in mind the rallying support he received and the sympathy extended by members of the Buddhist clergy as one during the hour of peril to his flock and certainly would have wanted no misunderstanding to spoil the confidence built with Buddhists as a whole by setting the record straight as to the identity of the real culprits behind the unethical conversions, by taking pains to explain that Catholics had no hand in it. It is time that this whole issue of Christian fundamentalism is addressed by the established Church itself. The issue cannot be resolved by enacting laws banning conversions to another religion which is against democracy. The Catholic Church should also play a more pro-active role in protecting its flock from straying from the path. It ought to look more closely at means of alleviating poverty among the Catholics. Where these fundamentalist operators succeed is by tackling the core of the problem. There is also lively engagement of the audience in their preaching sessions which makes them attractive. Catholic services in the Churches should also strive to match this enthusiasm instead of the strict solemnity observed in most Services.

Be that as it may, every effort should be made to remove all impediments that stand in the way of religious unity. True, religious tolerance is a fundamental feature in a true democracy. But care should be taken not to cross certain borders that are bound to ignite tensions in a highly pluralistic society. Equally, issues pertaining to Christian fundamentalist sects, as unraveled by the Cardinal, should not be a cause for an open confrontation between groups. As mentioned, the country can well do without such diversions at a time it is neck deep in problems including the deadly pandemic now sweeping the nation. Ideally, all sides should come together in a healthy discussion to sort the problems and iron out differences. The last thing this country needs is a religious conflict.

A session of the UNHRC in progress

A friend in need is a friend indeed

ith barely five days left for Sri Lanka to step into the ring at the **United Nations Human** Rights Council (UNHRC) in Geneva, Switzerland, the Government was reaching out to the Member countries of this UN organ through diplomatic channels to rope in their support to defend the country's

Foreign Ministry officials were drawing up last-minute plans to counter undue international pressure at the UN Human Rights body in close consultation with Government higher-ups. Articulating the country's position on the latest Report on Sri Lanka by United Nations Human Rights High Commissioner Michelle Bachelet, Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunawardena is expected to address the high-level segment of the virtual meeting next week.

The Core Group on Sri Lanka led by the United Kingdom (UK), Canada and Germany has confirmed that it would present a fresh Resolution on Sri Lanka based on the recommendations of the UN Human Rights Chief's recent report, the contents of which have been widely published.

Coinciding with this Forum set to begin next Monday (22), Sri Lanka is to roll out the red carpet for Pakistani Prime Minister Imran Khan, the first State Leader to visit Sri Lanka since the COVID-19 pandemic hit its shores, on February 23. This two-day visit will also be his first foreign trip

Tried and trusted bond

During the brief visit, former cricket star-turned-politician Imran Khan is scheduled to address Parliament. The last such occasion was six years ago when Indian Premier Narendra Modi addressed Parliament on March 13, 2015. The Pakistani PM will call on President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa and Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunawardena for extensive bilateral talks. A number of bilateral trade,

economic and defence cooperation pacts are also due to be signed.

The timing of this state visit is critical to Sri Lanka with the Sword of Damocles hanging over its head at the Geneva-based HR Council. Pakistan has been a long-time friend which has been with Sri Lanka through thick and thin. It provided much needed arms, ammunition and

other military support in the fight against the LTTE. It has stood by Sri Lanka's side at the UNHRC all the

Pakistan is an influential member of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) consisting of 57 Member States. Sri Lanka looks towards Pakistan to lobby the Arab countries and other Muslim nations, which have a formidable clout at the 47-member UN Inter-Governmental body in Geneva, to act in favour of Sri Lanka. However, the Government's mandatory cremation policy of bodies of those who succumb to COVID-19 has become an Achilles' heel when it comes to lobbying the Muslim world.

Confusion reigned in Parliament and the public at large when Premier Mahinda Rajapaksa's recent assurance that the mandatory cremation policy would be relaxed was seemingly clarified by the Government the next day. Primary Health Care, Epidemics and COVID Disease Control State Minister Dr. Sudarshani Fernandopulle told Parliament that a final decision on the matter would still be taken by the Expert Commit-

media and social media have already leaked its contents. As per the information widely published, the Commission has recommended redress for individuals on whom it decided had been politically victimized by the investigations launched by the previous Government.

It has also accused a number of prominent members of the former Government of breaking the law and violating the Constitution mainly through the setting up of new bodies that did not fit into the existing legal framework such as the 'National Executive Council', which included political and civil society groups supportive of the Government change in 2015, 'Anti-Corruption Secretariat' at Temple Trees and the 'Financial Crimes Investigation Division' (FCID) of Police.

According to media reports, among the accused are former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe, and former Ministers Dr. Rajitha Senaratne, Patali Champika Ranawaka, Mangala Samaraweera, Ravi Karunanayake, Arjuna Ranatunga, Field Marshal Sarath Fonseka, Rauff Hakeem and Malik Samarawickrema. Tamil National Alliance (TNA) Leader MP R. Sampanthan, TNA MP M.A. Sumanthiran, PC, and 'Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna' (JVP) Leader MP Anura Kumara Dissanayake have also been faulted by the Commission as they were members of the 'National Executive Council'. The report also includes the names of several prominent lawyers and investigators.

Opposition anxious

The report has recommended the appointment of a Special Presidential Commission of Inquiry (SPCoI), which would have wider powers, to determine punitive action for those accused. Following the Cabinet green light to go ahead with the recommendations of the PCoI report, the President appointed a three-member SPCoI headed by Supreme Court Justice Dhammika Samarakoon late last month.

This move has created ripples in the Opposition camp as the first and the only SPCoI seen by the country until this latest appointment led to the stripping of civil rights of former Prime Minister the late Sirimavo Bandaranaike in 1980 under the then J.R. Jayewardene administration.

The SPCoI law dates back to 1978 and it has the power to subject a person found guilty to civic disability for seven years. An action or recommendation made by a SPCoI cannot be questioned in any Court or tribunal.

The agitation of the Opposition members could be discerned in the tone of JVP Leader MP Anura Kumara Dissanayake, when he raged against the recommendations of the PCOI report earlier this month at a public seminar titled "Kekille Komisama" at the National Library auditorium.

He accused the PCoI report of being a "ruse to white-wash and exonerate" those supportive of the Government of the charges pending against them in Courts of Law. He went on to comment that the above report could be used to unseat a number of Opposition Members in an attempt to stifle their voices.

"What matters to us is championing our cause. We are a political movement that has lived through difficult periods. Losing civic rights for seven years will not stop us from engaging in politics," the seemingly irked MP remarked.

It could be seen that the report on political victimization has acted as a catalyst for fragmented groups of the Opposition to band together as their political survival is at stake. However, how far they can resist the newly appointed Special Commission or other follow up actions based on the report is yet to be seen.

Meanwhile, the recent report of the Presidential Commission of Inquiry (PCoI) into Political Victimization has stirred up a hornet's nest in the Opposition. The Opposition groups were in talks over the past couple of weeks to close ranks in the face of the report's recommendations which could overshadow their political prospects if pursued. Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) General Secretary MP Ranjith Madumma Bandara told the media last Friday that it had decided to work with all other Opposition parties to build a common front to collectively challenge the PCoI report

legally as well as politically. He was of the view that the PCoI on Political Victimization was an effort to manipulate the law to penalize those in the Opposition camp. He complained that it had undermined the judicial process. The three-member Commission headed by retired Supreme Court Judge Upali Abeyratne handed over its final report to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa on December 8 concluding over 10 months of investigations into over 1,900 complaints of political victimization during the period between 2015 and 2019.

The report, consisting of three volumes and 2,043 pages, is not yet officially public, but some mainstream

riters, commentators and all types of Toms, Dicks, Harriets, Girigorises and Haramanises have gone into a state of apoplexy over the President's Independence Day speech. They are levelling a charge of pan-Sinhalaism on the new government, particularly singling out the President for what they say are his exclusionary policies.

They say, predictably, that his pro-Sinhala stand which is simply a long overdue recognition of Sinhala Buddhism as being the fulcrum that holds together Sri Lankan nationalism, is hegemonic. 'Long overdue', because the previous Government so enjoyed kicking the Sinhalese around, period.

The President is on the one hand doing the necessary reset after the Sinhalese had their collective noses rubbed in the mud in the years between 2015 and 2019. Even those who decry the President's current stand and his Sinhala Buddhist orientation acknowledge that the abject mentality of the previous dispensation was reprehensible.

But yet, when the President tries to compensate for these five years of humiliation of the Sinhalese Buddhists, he is accused of 'Sinhala hegemonism', and being unable to read the political barometer. India wouldn't be impressed, we are also told, because we are relying on the Chinese to support us—the 'Chinese backstop'—with this hegemonic agenda that has turned the world against us, or so the story goes.

That is interesting. The last time I checked, India followed a 'Hindutva' or a Hindu majoritarian agenda. One would have thought, what's sauce for the goose is sauce for the gander? "A spate of inquiries into the nature of rising India, specifically under the tenure of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has attempted to examine the role of Hindutva as the guiding philosophical framework for the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) foreign policy orientation," opined the *Diplomat*.

Liberal Interpreter

Writing in the *Hindustan Times*, Swapan Dasgupta, Rajya Sabha MP notes, "The test of success was not what Hindus thought but

how Muslims and other communities felt. Translated into secularist politics, this implied that Hindus must live in a state of permanent magnanimity, and, in the realm of competitive politics, never assert themselves as Hindus.

The Ayodhya movement challenged this pseudo-secularism – L.K. Advani's coinage that acquired popularity in the 1990s – frontally. I met Dasgupta in Colombo in 2011 or thereabouts. No Hindu chauvinist, he. Rajya Sabha MP Swapan Dasgupta is a liberal interpreter of the BJP's policies, states *The Wire*, a respected Indian web publication. He is widely considered to be one of India's foremost centre-right intellectuals.

He views the Indira Gandhi–Nehru secularism of India as a form of pseudo-secularism. Narendra Modi, the incumbent Indian Premier of today became a Premier – then a two-term Premier – and changed all that. The parallels with Sri Lanka couldn't have been starker. Notice that Dasgupta writes about Hindus in India having had to live in a state of permanent magnanimity. Dasgupta engaged the voluble Congress MP Sashi Tharoor in a debate and said, "The country has witnessed a fundamental change. There is a mirror reflection of the confident country. Narendra Modi has cap-

tured the process very well. In 1990, when the entire community was driven out of Kashmir, that was a weak India. The country's evolution into a strong nation is natural. In 1999, the Government had surrendered before the terrorists at the time of the Kandahar plane hijack. Liberalisation has helped India boost its self-confidence."

India as a strong country that harks back to its Hindutva roots, will be Modi's legacy. Premier Modi won a second term with these policies, it must be remembered. That is especially important because some of the pundits who decry President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's policies have already branded him a one term President with the Lankan President having barely completed one-fifth of his first term.

Hindutva Sentiment

If India is comfortable – and if Indians are feeling strong and empowered – after years of forced magnanimity under pseudo-secularist policies which have now been turned back under Modi, why should Narendra Modi or any current Indian leader grudge a reckoning on the same lines for Sri Lanka? Indians have by and large been proud and empowered rediscovering Hindutva roots.

It is obvious from the fact that Modi won his second term.

To be realistic, the Gotabaya version of Sinhala-Buddhist revivalism if one were to draw a parallel, is far less strident than Modi's version of Hindu revivalism in India. Dasgupta is forced to write about "the permanent state of magnanimity of the Indian Hindus." This writer has not heard of any pro-Gotabaya theoretician speaking of anything as patronizing as Sinhala Buddhist magnanimity or Sinhala Buddhist patronage that forces this majority community to be 'magnanimous to the minorities'. The President's views on his Sinhala Buddhist leadership can be distilled essentially to a single sentiment - no longer will the Sinhala Buddhists tolerate institutionalized

It is worth repeating clearly. What Premier Modi and his Government wants for India — which is the reemergence of the quintessential Indian identity as mirrored by the country's core Hindutva past – cannot be grudged by him or any in his Government, for neighbouring Sri Lanka, surely?

Can anybody be heard to say, "Well, that's good for India, because of the country's size – but we cannot aspire to be what Big Brother is to the North?" What has a country's collective sense of self-worth got to do with its geographical proportions? Will Premier Modi deem that the Hindutva that's good for Hindu-majority India under his leadership is fine, but the Sinhala Buddhist resurgence in the neighboring country that is majority Sinhala Buddhist, is abhorrent?

Quite apart from the fact that he will be seen as a tad hypocritical if he does so, it is worth noting that PM Modi is not a leader of the sort that cannot identify with the dilemmas of his fellow leader and President that are extremely similar to his own.

Remember that he has been excoriated in the West, and in liberal intellectual circles everywhere for his pro-Hindutva stance. Proof is hardly necessary for what's common knowledge, but if you need any or have been living under a rock, here are some jottings:

"Modi is going about the ugly business of consolidating a majoritarian idea of India," skulked the *Politico* published in the US.

"Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi now joins the long historical list of tyrants ...," complained the *Washington Post*. "Hindu supremacist Narendra Modi should not be invited to the Commons," admonished the British *Guardian*.

It's the kind of coverage that is familiar from the Western media regarding matters closer to home, but yet we are told the Indians won't empathize and would be worried about our 'Chinese backstop'.

Great Mismatch

Maybe that is how realpolitik works. Unrelenting, projecting power – no matter the niceties. If that is the case, the less said about the optics of that the better.

Already, China uses Buddhist diplomacy far more effectively to project its soft power than India does. Our neighbourly relations with these two giants have far more complicated nuances than may be seen at a first glance. In the backdrop of this complex web, there is Premier Modi establishing a 'Hindutva first' State harking back to the country's historical origins.

Surely, he would see the compulsions in a country to the South of him, to do a somewhat similar reset? Surely, there should be more empathy from his Government for the stance for which the pro-Sinhala President here is excoriated so regularly in certain sections of the commentariat? If there isn't, the mismatch between what Modi wants for India, and what Modi wants for Sri Lanka would be so glaring, it may look a tad sur-

When UN elections were tainted by bribery, cheque-book diplomacy and luxury cruises

hen UN member states compete for the presidency of the General Assembly or membership in the Security Council or in various UN bodies, the voting was largely tainted by bribery, cheque-book diplomacy and offers of luxury cruises in Europe – while promises of increased aid to the world's poorer nations came mostly with heavy strings attached.

In a bygone era, voting was by a show of hands, particularly in committee rooms. But in later years, a more sophisticated electronic board, high up in the General Assembly Hall, tallied the votes or in the case of elections to the Security Council or the International Court of Justice, the voting was by secret ballot.

In one of the hard-fought elections many moons ago, there were rumours that an oil-soaked Middle Eastern country was doling out high-end, Swiss-made wristwatches and stocks in the former Arabian-American Oil Company (ARAM-CO), one of the world's largest oil companies, to UN diplomats as a trade-off for their votes.

So, when hands, both from right-handed and left-handed delegates, went up at voting time in the Committee Room, the largest number of hands raised in favour of the oil-blessed candidate sported Swiss

watches. As anecdotes go, it symbolized the corruption that prevails in voting in inter-governmental organizations, including the United Nations – perhaps much like most national elections the world over.

Just ahead of an election for membership in the Security Council, one Western European country offered free Mediterranean luxury cruises in return for votes while another country dished out – openly in the General Assembly hall – boxes of gift-wrapped expensive Swiss chocolates.

So, it was not surprising that the

Ambassador of a middle-income developing country, who kept losing successive elections, jokingly told his Foreign Ministry officials: "Let's stop running for elections until we can practise the fine art of stuffing ballot boxes – as we do back home."

An age-old anecdote doing the rounds at the UN in the 1980s was characteristically male chauvinist. When a lady says no, she means maybe, when she says maybe, she means yes – and when she says yes, she is no lady.

But election time at the UN is no better – simply because diplomatic double talk is a way of life in an institution where hopes are shattered by false promises.

When diplomats say maybe, they probably mean no, when they say yes, they mean maybe – and when they eventually say no, the message is transmitted via secret ballot.

If you don't read the right signals way ahead of the polls, and if your numbers don't add up, the best strategy is an exit strategy.

During the voting time, ambassadors routinely stick to the advice or instructions from their foreign ministries back home. But when the voting is by secret ballot it is difficult to enforce this rule.



When Sri Lanka's Permanent Representative Ambassador Daya Perera's relationship with the Foreign Ministry soured, he told me: "My Government can give me instructions on how to vote. But my vote will depend on the relationships I build with other ambassadors here." The secret ballot ensured the voting was between him and the ballot box – and no one else was privy to it.

Fathulla Jameel, a former UN Ambassador and later Foreign Minister of the Maldives, recounted a story of how his resource-poor island nation, categorized by the UN as a Small Island Developing State (SID), would appeal to some of the richer nations to help fund some of the country's infrastructure projects.

At least one rich Asian country, a traditional donor, was the first to

respond – and magnanimously too, he said. The project would be fully funded – free, gratis and for nothing. But there was a catch: "If there is a vote at the UN, and it is not of any national interest to your country," said the donor country's foreign ministry, "we would like to get your vote."

UN General Assembly

Perhaps for life – either the life of the Foreign Minister or the life of the island nation itself which was threatened with sea-level rise and in danger of being wiped off the face of the earth. The offer was a clever political payback. Development aid with no visible strings attached.

There was at least once instance when the President of the General Assembly, the highest policy-making body at the United Nations, was elected, on the luck of a draw – following a dead heat.

With the Asian group failing to field a single candidate, the politically-memorable battle took place ahead of the 36th session of the General Assembly back in 1981 when three Asian candidates contested the presidency: Ismat Kittani of Iraq, Tommy Koh of Singapore and Kwaja Mohammed Kaiser of Bangladesh (described as the "battle of three Ks" – Kittani, Koh and Kaiser).

On the first ballot, Kittani got 64 votes; Kaiser, 46; and Koh, 40. Still, Kittani was short of a required majority – of the total number of members voting. On a second ballot, Kittani and Kaiser tied with 73 votes each (with 146 members present, and voting).

In order to break the tie, the out-

In order to break the tie, the outgoing General Assembly President – Rudiger von Wechmar of Germany– drew lots, as specified in Article 21 relating to the procedures in the election of the president (and as recorded in the Repertory of Practice of the General Assembly).

And the luck of the draw, based purely on chance, favoured Kittani, in that unprecedented General Assembly election. But according to a joke circulating at that time, it was rumoured that the winner was decided by the flip of a coin – but the tossed coin apparently had two heads and no tail.

In more recent years, however, the regional groups, including the Asian, African, Latin American and Caribbean and the Western and Other Groups (WEOG) have called for a virtual ceasefire as they took turns according to the geographical rotation. The Groups would name their candidates who gets elected without any opposition.

answer can be surmised in one word, villages. The rural villages are a naturally enchanting paradise. They teach us to calibrate our lifestyle, if we choose to. Whether it is the farmers in the paddy fields ploughing with their robust buffaloes, or an old woman selling fish at the pola or a solitary monk meditating amidst a thicket of trees, the magic of the village is absolutely alluring. The sight of a pious devotee burning incense at a small shrine or a young woman carrying a pot of water as her hair gently blows in the wind or the smiling face of a child picking flowers has a way of making an impression. Riding on a sturdy bullock cart or bathing in a river at sunset are all moments I have cherished, having travelled to every province in my country.

If there is one fundamental truth learnt during the long Covid containment curfew, it is the appreciation of the calm lifestyle in the village, and its unending freedom. Most phone calls I got or Watsapp messages I read reminded me how all the 'Colombo people' were missing their villages, ancestral homes and old friends. We need the city life for various reasons, though some reasons have been induced with unrealistic values and needs. After the lockdown many were unanimous in their opinion that it was the villages that sustained the digitally dominated cities.

The Covid-19 pandemic impacted the world, and has changed our daily routines. But the rural villages continue their healthy lifestyles amidst neighbours and friends, having to make just a few basic changes. There are no apartments here to cause Covid clusters. During the containment curfew people living in modern apartments were going through old albums reminiscing lovely family trips taken to villages. I know many brave frontline staff who were

longing for a break to rush to their villages for a quiet rest and stress relief. This is the charm and natural power of the rural village.

The prudent Mahathma Gandhi once declared, "The soul of India lives in its villages." We can agree that

green villages. In Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs theory, we see that humans need food. It is our beautiful villages that sustained us with food, for centuries. During the time of our ancient kings this island was proudly deemed the 'rice bowl' of Asia, with so much interest and investment in agriculture. Where have we come since then? Sri Lankan cuisine infused with our stellar spices has a special appeal in the global cul nary arena. For centuries our fruits, vegetables, pulses, grains

and paddy (rice) were supplied from the village. It still happens that way, perhaps with a certain decline. Every rural farmer does an important job, this is why US President George Washington once stated, "Agriculture is the most healthful, useful and noble employment of mankind." During the early days of Covid-19 people were longing for the vegetable and fish vendors who came to every home. It was a stark (and should be a thought-provoking) reminder of how our lives were simple decades ago. Whenever curfew was lifted we all lined up at the old bakeries that operated consistently on firewood ovens and gave us bread, as they had done for decades. I was intrigued by manicured Colombo divas who were suddenly learning to make 'village curries' which they had once defiantly relegated

as 'old fashioned cuisine'. Such is the false physical, emotional and social makeup of some ignorant city folk.

The villages not only provide us food. They are the pillars of our bio-diversity systems. They are the regional lungs of oxygen that balance, restore and

renew the ozone layer above Sri
Lanka. Villages
that border forests have an important role in coexistence and the protection of wildlife, including our magnificent elephants and leopards.
How many can say they are a nemophilist (a person who loves the forest, its

beauty and solitude)?

Our forest cover must be increased which in turn augments some villages. The Japanese have appreciated sunlight so much that they coined a word komorebi – the beauty of sunlight filtering through crees.

Villages are deeply connected to tourism in Sri Lanka. Where do tourists spend majority of a holiday? Except for the first and last day (to the Airport) of their visit the entire stay is spent touring our villages. So over the decades our villages laden with culture, history, religious tradition, ayurveda, ancient handicrafts, dance forms and multi-ethnic cuisine are the primary showcase of Sri Lankan tourism. Be it the Kandyan hills, the rice fields of Polonnaruwa, the citadels of Anuradhapura, the magnificent kovils of Jaffna, the blissful beaches of Matara or the salubrious tea plantations in Nuwara Eliya - all of these are village landscapes. There was a surge in eco-tourism a decade ago. On a long train journey to any part of the island, we enjoy the natural undisturbed landscapes. The present global trend is agro-tourism, where families (mainly domestic tourists) visit large farms and cultivations and stay on site, learning about all the activities. The menu is made mainly from all the harvested products on site. A stronger sense of community is important as it enhances mental well being. Ethnic unity is a vital part of national security. Incidentally villages have a lesser crime rate with most crimes amounting to petty theft or a land dispute. Children must have the chance to rear a pet and know the value of a life, like it happens in the villages. It is an envied fact that rural people live healthier and longer than city people. The village diet is full of natural ingredients and devoid of artificial additions. Since last year more people are choosing to spend their retirement in their ancestral villages, especially those who still have a house. It is our duty not to pollute the village lifestyle, especially in a social and moral sense. Strategic development in any sphere must preserve the rural beauty and hold the community together. Our villages are the foundation of Sri Lanka. All these elements of village life must be kept alive for future generations.

COPA to facilitate transporting goods via Railways

The Committee on Public Accounts (COPA) recommended to the Transport Ministry Secretary to implement a plan to streamline and promote transporting goods on trains.

The Committee highlighted the importance of streamlining the transportation of goods by rail to reduce traffic congestion and environment pollution caused by large containers.

A special Audit Report to evaluate the use of the Railway for goods transportation was considered at the COPA meeting on February 11 chaired by State Minister Dayasiri Jayasekara.

when the Railway was started, from 1867 to 1934. the freight revenue of the department was 57 per cent and it has decreased to 9.3 per cent in 2017, 8.5 per cent in 2018 and 7.1 per cent in 2019.

The Department of Railways, therefore, has moved away from transporting goods and it has been identified as a major cause of losses. The importance of taking steps to minimize this loss without placing a heavy burden on the Treasury was discussed at the meeting.



New WTO Chief decries "Vaccine Nationalism"

The World Trade Organization's (WTO) incoming chief has warned against "vaccine nationalism" that would slow progress in ending the COVID-19 pandemic and could erode economic growth for all countries rich and poor.

Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala told the Reuters news agency that her top priority is to ensure the WTO does more to address the pandemic, saying members should accelerate efforts to lift export restrictions slowing trade in needed medicines and supplies.

The former Nigerian finance minis-

was appointed on Monday in a consensus process and starts her new job on March 1.

"The WTO can contribute so much more to helping stop the pandemic," Okonjo-Iweala said in an interview at her home in a suburb of Washington,

"No one is safe until everyone is safe. Vaccine nationalism at this time just will not pay, because the variants are coming. If other countries are not immunised, it will just be a blowback," she said. "It's unconscionable that peo-

ter and senior World Bank executive ple will be dying elsewhere, waiting in a queue, when we have the technology."

Okonjo-Iweala said studies showed that the global economy would lose \$9 trillion in potential output if poor countries were unable to get their populations vaccinated quickly and about half of the effect would be borne by rich countries.

"Both on a human health basis, as well as an economic basis, being nationalistic at this time, is very costly to the international community," she said.

"A very top priority for me would be to make sure that prior to the very

important ministerial conference ... that we come to solutions as to how the WTO can make vaccines, therapeutics and diagnostics accessible in an equitable and affordable fashion to all countries, particularly to poor countries."

Need to reform

Okonjo-Iweala said she was heartened by the administration of US President Joe contribution to the World Health Organization effort to ensure broader distribution of vaccines, and what she called a "fantastic" conversation with trade advisers in the US Trade Representative's office.

"I think our interests and priorities are aligned. They want to bring the WTO back to [its] purpose," she said. "It's about people. It's about inclusivity. It's about decent work for ordinary people," she said. She said she shared the Biden administration's concerns about the need to reform the WTO's Appellate Body, but said that would not be a quick or easy process.

"This is the jewel in the crown of the WTO, and we really need to restore it," she said. The dispute settlement body has been paralysed

since last year after the administration of former US President Donald Trump refused to approve the appointment of more judges.

New WTO Chief

Okonjo-Iweala said there were clearly differences among members but progress was possible, especially given the shift in tone and approach of the Biden administration.

"I'm not daunted. I see a way forward," she said. "With the US administration being willing to engage ... I think the way of working to try and get a solution will be different."

Some COVID-19 patients end up with brain damage

COVID-19 IN THE BRAIN

patients end up with damage to their brains, shedding new light on how the virus impacts the human body.

"I think it is critically important that we study this population properly," said Dr. Avi Nath, the lead researcher on this study and clinical director of the National Institutes of Neurological Disorders and Stroke. "We hope these results will help doctors understand the full spectrum of problems patients may suffer so that we can come up with better treatments.'

Some COVID-19 patients report non-respiratory symptoms after contracting the virus, including headaches, delirium and mental fog.

Nath and his team at the National Institutes of Health used special, highpowered brain scans to look at the brains of people who died after contracting COVID-19. This was the first study of its kind in the country, published in the New England Journal of Medicine. The researchers examined the brains of 19 people who died anywhere from several hours to two months after reporting symptoms. They ranged in age from five to 73 years old.

"Some were found dead in bed by their partner or spouse, some were found dead in a nursing home, one guy was found dead on a subway," Nath

Nath said he was surprised to find almost, all of the patients had abnormalities in the brain.

He said bright spots visible on their brain scans represented areas of inflammation. Dark spots represented bleeding in the brain, which Nath said was likely a result of blood vessels leak-

ing.
"If these patients had survived, let's say, could they have had long-term consequences? And the answer is yes. If you've got that kind of pathology in the brain, you've got damage to the brain," Nath explained.

Nath said he did not discover any signs of COVID-19 in the brain tissue itself, suggesting the damage was not caused by a direct viral attack on the brain, but instead came from the body's inflammatory response to the virus.

"When I sit back sometimes and think about it, I'm just shocked at what this virus does to us," said Dr. Farha Ikramuddin, a physical medicine rehabilitation physician at M Health Fairview and assistant professor at the University of Minnesota Medical School.

Dr. ikramuddin works firsthand with so-called 'COVID long-haulers,' people who have mysterious, lingering symptoms long after recovering from

"Anywhere from impaired cognition such as not being able to remember things to absolute hallucinations and delirium to death. I have seen a few patients with what we can fantasmia, which is basically hallucinations of smell, so they smell things that are not there," Ikramuddin explained. "Patients do not need to be admitted to the hospital to have significant post-COVID-19 syndrome."

Ikramuddin believes it is extremely important to keep looking at the brain, in an effort to understand COVID-19 symptoms and outcomes.

The National Institutes of Health recently launched a new Neuro-COVID Project, which will allow doctors across the country to send data and specimens to a central databank/biobank, in the hopes of tracking neurological symptoms associated with the virus.

Antibody doses for high-risk COVID cases

Tens of thousands of high-risk Israelis can now get an antibody treatment as hospital outpatients as soon as they are diagnosed with COVID-19, in the hope that it will prevent deterioration to serious ill-

The Health Ministry has a supply of thousands of doses of the USmade Bamlanivimab, which is intended specifically for non-serious patients. It has started distributing them to doctors, who are now offering the two-hour infusion-based treatment to outpatients in certain high-risk categories who test positive for the virus.

Jerusalem's Hadassah Medical Center became the first institution to start giving the treatment on Monday, administering it to four outpatients, and other hospitals are expected to follow.

Bamlanivimab is composed of monoclonal antibodies, which are laboratory-made proteins that mimic the immune system's ability to fight off harmful antigens including virus-

"We hope to see this treatment changing the course of illness, and preventing people from deteriorat-

many from getting sicker," he said. "It is believed to slow the growth of the virus and reduce the chances of serious illness.'

It is primarily intended for residents of the Jerusalem area, but if healthcare providers offer to bring people from other areas in Israel, they will be accepted.

Rotstein said he has high hopes for the antibodies, but stressed: "This treatment does not take the place of vaccines.'

Kent variant may be 70 percent more deadly: UK study

The highly infectious variant of the novel coronavirus that is predominant in the United Kingdom may be up to 70 percent more deadly than previous strains, according to a report by the government's scientific

The findings from the New and **Emerging Respiratory Virus Threats** Advisory Group (NERVTAG), published on Friday on the government's website, underscored concerns about how mutations may change the characteristics of SARS-CoV2 – the virus that causes COVID-19 - and alter the course of the pandemic.

NERVTAG's report was based on a dozen studies that found the so-called Kent variant, named after the county where it was first identified, is likely 30 percent to 70 percent more deadly

than other versions of the novel coronavirus in circulation.

Those studies compared hospitalisation and death rates among people infected with the B.1.1.7 variant and those infected with other strains.

NERVTAG includes experts from universities and public agencies across

The results of the group's analysis are worrisome, said David Strain, a clinical senior lecturer at the University of Exeter Medical School and the clinical lead for COVID-19 at the Royal Devon & Exeter Hospital.

'The higher transmissibility means that people who were previously at low risk of catching COVID (particularly younger fitter females) are now catching it and ending up in hospital, Strain said.

"This is highlighted by the latest figures for hospitalisation that now suggest almost 50:50 male-to-female ratio compared to this being predominantly in men during the first wave.

To date, the UK has recorded more than four million cases of COVID-19. The virus has killed more than 117,000 people nationwide, marking one of the world's worst death tolls.

Experts have previously said the B.1.1.7 strain could be between 30 and 70 percent more infectious than other

After first being detected in September, it quickly became the dominant variant in the UK.

It is thought to have been the spark for a rapid rise in the country's COVID-19 caseload in recent months, sending the death toll spiralling and

forcing UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson to enforce a third national lockdown on January 4.

The variant has also spread to other parts of the world, and quickly. According to the World Health

Organization (WHO), 83 countries have reported cases of the strain. It has been detected on every continent on Earth except for Antarctica.

Research suggests the two COVID-19 vaccines in use in the UK – developed by Pfizer/BioNTech and AstraZeneca –

offer some protection against B.1.1.7. But the variant's spread has nonetheless added to fears over emerging

Pelosi's statement on Monday referred to a review that has been under way, led by the retired US army general Russel Honoré.

Pelosi said: "For the past few weeks, General Honoré has been assessing our security needs by reviewing what happened on January 6 and how we must ensure that it does not happen again ... It is clear from his findings and from the impeachment trial that we must get to the truth of how this happened.

She continued: "Our next step will be to establish an outside, independent 9/11-type commission to "investigate and report on the facts and causes relating to the January 6, 2021, domestic terrorist attack upon the United States Capitol Complex ... and relating to the interference with the peaceful transfer of power, including facts and causes relating to the preparedness and response of the United States Capitol Police and other Federal, State, and local law enforcement in the National Capitol Region."

More than a month after the attack, the Capitol complex remains guarded by more than 5,000 national guard troops and ringed with eight-foot fences rimmed with razor wire. The troops are expected to remain through mid-March.

Last month, the US Capitol police head urged lawmakers to add permanent fencing and backup security, noting a 2006 security assessment recommended installation of a permanent perimeter fence around the Capitol. But many members of Congress and the Washington DC mayor, Muriel Bowser, have urged congressional leaders not to adopt permanent

fencing or military security. More than 200 people have been charged with federal crimes in the bloody assault on Congress and a huge investigation is ongoing. (The Guardian)



ki, Finland in 1952. He ended in sixth place in the Men's 400m freestyle event in five minutes and two seconds. Nevertheless,

this was an improvement on his Ceylon record. Although he participated

in the second Asian Games held in Manila, Philippines in 1954, he could not win any of the events.

However, at the Inter-University Swimming Meet held in Calcutta, India in 1955, he won the 1,500m freestyle in 21 minutes and 35.8 seconds while shattering the All-India record of 21 minutes 40.5 seconds.

The challenge which he experienced from the Indian champion Sri Chand Bajaj in this event cannot be ignored as he improved

on the existing record. Marks left the Island after obtaining his Degree from the Colombo University and found employed in Japan in 1959.

In Japan he won a scholarship to study crop diseases at the University of Wisconsin, USA, from where he graduated with a M.Sc. in 1961 and PhD in

He then arrived in Australia in July 1963 when he was appointed to the position of Forest Pathologist with the Forests Commission of Victoria.

Marks had wide interests and he was an active member of the Australia-Ceylon Fellowship and he passed away on August 30, 1990 at the age of 58 years in Melbourne. (C.D)

Milco operating profitably

Milk processing capacity outstrips supply

The milk processing capacity of the country is currently much larger than the milk output of the local livestock. The Milk Corporation (Milco) under the Ministry of Agriculture is currently operating profitably after reforms at the company following new management in 2020.

Milco made a profit of Rs 441 million in 2020 as opposed to a loss of Rs 619 million in 2019. The corporation was last profit-making in 2016 where it made a profit of Rs 339 million.

Chairman Milco Lasantha Wickramasinghe said that Milco had revised the policy of offering the lowest possible price to both farmer and customer and begun a policy of offering better prices to the farmer with a moderate price to the con-

sumer. The corporation has increased the price paid to customers by 15%. Wickramasinghe was speaking to Daily News at the Milco Headquarters yesterday.

Milco has historically faced problems retaining farmers due to the low prices paid and the lack of certainty in payment. Under the new 'Agile Management' system the company has ensured that the industry is more viable for all stakeholders. The corporation is confident of contributing to the government's goal of having self-sufficiency in milk and milk by-product produc-

Under the agile management system, bottom-up discussions have begun with the workforce. Through suggestions alone and with no capital expenditure the Milco Corporation has been able to increase yoghurt production by 10% in the Naraheinpita facility.

Milco monthly revenue has exceeded Rs 1 billion for the last 6 months of 2020. The company has reduced milk output to the ministry of education under the advice of health professionals who feel excessive consumption of milk is harm-

Milco is aiming to pay down longstanding debts with recent profitability. The company is also focusing on creating an ecosystem for increased dairy production.

The company has invested in the backbone infrastructure for cattle feeding, breeding, sharing of best practice, and networking. The company has shared feed production techniques with local

farmers and also created large purchase orders through its net-

The company is also bringing techniques of artificial insemination to the local livestock. The company plans to invest in 10 more chilling centres, 103 more milk collection centres, and 200 more farmer societies.

The company looks to spend Rs 8.5 million for bringing about recognition of best practice.

Wickramasinghe said the issue of cattle diseases though present was not as big as the media was making it out to be. Milco pays out Rs 500 million a month to local farmers. Wickcramasinghe said there was scope to make milk production a more lucrative enterprise than certain office jobs.

Sampath Bank posts Rs. 8 bn PAT against COVID-19 backdrop

Sampath Bank recorded a decline in Profit After Tax (PAT), from Rs 11.1billion in 2019 to Rs 8 billion for year 2020. Despite this being a 28% decline, it is nonetheless a noteworthy result against the backdrop of the COVID-19 induced economic slowdown locally and globally.

Meanwhile, the Bank registered a Profit Before Tax (PBT) of Rs 11.2 billion compared to Rs 15.5 billion recorded in 2019, a decline of 27.9%. The PBT and PAT of the Group for the year ended December 31, 2020 stood at Rs 11.9 billion and Rs 8.4 billion respectively, denoting a decline of 27.2% and 27.6% respectively.

With the governmentled economic stimulus package and interest caps introduced by the regulator bringing pressure on the Bank's Net Interest Margins (NIM), in 2020 the Bank registered a

Property buyers flocking back to market

"Since the turn of the year there has been an increase in real estate activity by property buyers and sellers", said Sri Lanka's leading property portal LankaPropertyWeb.

This trend seems industry wide as another property site, house.lk reported a 26% jump in its visits during January in comparison with December 2020. House.lk also reported an all-time high number of visits to the site in January of this year. With restrictions around

COVID-19 easing and confidence returning to the marincreasingly positive over closing sales since the start recently published data by LankaPropertyWeb revealed that only 8% of its 63,250 2020, with an average reduction of 11%. In some cases, these reductions result from the seller's urgency to sell and further discounts being offered to buyers when clos-

ers did not change their initial advertised price, while 4% of the advertisers increased their initial tagged price by 12%. This shows that despite the pandemic, the real estate market in Sri Lanka has remained stable last year.

Meanwhile, high reduc-

tions in commercial property were seen by advertisers who reduced their property prices by 13% in the last year. This is mainly credited to the price fluctuations and the shift to working from home policies that many businesses

have adopted now.

Commenting on the market, Naveed Zaveer, Director at Menavid Realtors said, "There has been an improvement in the property market since December 2020, with inquiries being made. The opening of the Sri Lankan airport on January 21, 2021 to tourists is also a positive step towards revitalizing the economy. We stay positive and hopeful that this will create a positive mindset in the minds of the investors, motivating them to invest further in the property market".

A study on people's search trends revealed that last year Colombo ranked as the No.1 city in rental property searches. This was followed by Kandy and Dehiwala that

ranked 2nd and 3rd, respectively. While in 2019, Colombo ranked 1st, Dehiwala ranked 2nd, Nugegoda was 3rd and Kandy was in the 4th place in rental searches ranking. This shows that metropolitan areas are yet in demand in renting, irrespec-


tive of the pandemic hit. In the 2020 sales property searches, Colombo ranked number 1 again, maintaining its 2019 position for the same criteria. Kandy and Negombo placed 2nd and 3rd respectively in the sales property search. While the ranking in land searches revealed that Kandy, Kurunegala and Nuwara Eliya placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively.

Overall, since January 2021, the positive sentiment towards real estate has been rising consistently among sellers and buyers. This was especially seen with the number of properties advertised on the site increasing by 54% in January 2021 when compared to January 2020. This

is a 21% growth from last year's December to this January, bearing evidence to the rising trend of advertising property online.

There was also a hike in land searches amounting to 55.8% in January 2021, when compared to last year's January. This shows an increasing trend of people shifting to searching property online versus traditional methods. It is a significant improvement considering that January 2020 saw very little restrictions and impact because of COVID-19 when compared to the last month.

According to the company, based on the feedback they have received from agents and property sellers, the market is seeing a significantly higher number of sales being closed since last month. Therefore, it stated that this would be the ideal time for buyers to finalise their sales and take advantage of the lower prices before they increase.



Property seen as stable investment

Over the years, property has been known to be a stable long-term investment. According to LankaPropertyWeb's market report, during this period it has specifically increased investor confidence when compared with other investment options that have been generating low returns or seen as volatile. 

ROBERT BRESSON

MADAPATHA CHINTAKA

obert Bresson was 98 when he died in 1999. By that time, during a career spanning 50 years, he had made 13 films. His last, L'argent, was made in 1983; his first, exactly half a century before. Considered the definitive patron saint of the cinema, Bresson was nearly the most difficult. So difficult, that within 50 years he changed very little.

Bresson hailed from an inconsequential if not altogether mysterious childhood. After leaving school and college, he briefly turned to painting. That, coupled with his encounters with Catholicism, would prove to be the biggest influence on him later on. It was during the Second World War that he made his first film – Les Anges du Péché. Two years later he made Les Dames du Bois du Boulogne. In both he experimented with the conventional cinema he would, to the point of obsession, evade for the rest of his life.

He began this crusade with *Diary of* a Country Priest in 1951, and from then on - A Man Escaped, Pickpocket, The Trial of Joan of Arc, Au Hasard Balthazar, Mouchette, A Gentle Woman, Four Nights of a Dreamer, Lancelot of the Lake, The Devil Probably, and L'argent – his main preoccupation would remain the divorce of cinema from the theatre.

JUDICIOUS HANDLING

How did he achieve this? Firstly, in my view, with the narrative structure, and the type of stories, that he employed. With the possible exception of Les Dames, none of his stories was based on a "chain-link" that called for plot and event over character. In Pickpocket, surely his masterpiece, the plot, though decidedly like clockwork, is superseded by an acute if not altogether observation of its antihero. The sequence of events which begins at a horserace and ends at a prison is handled so judiciously, that it is impossible at times to attribute to it any dramatic structure. For Bresson the plot was not expendable, but justifiable only in how it revealed its characters. This is why most of his films have such short lengths – *Pickpocket* runs for around 75 minutes, while The Trial, his shortest, runs for 65.

Secondly, there was his attitude to acting. In no other instance in the history of the medium did a director revolutionise the whole approach to acting as did Bresson. Sometimes – as with *Pickpocket* or *L'argent* – one is never sure as to whether the person playing a

role onscreen is acting. In Pickpocket's case it may well be because Martin LaSalle, who played the protagonist, was a relative unknown who had never taken part in a film before. Bresson called his actors "models" – a far less derogatory title than "instruments", which was what another French director called his actors – owing to the stony, sphinx-like expression he got them to maintain on their faces throughout an entire produc-


Notorious for his technique,

he would sometimes shoot up to six or eight takes of a scene before he would be confident that his actors would perform without the least semblance of emotion registered on their faces, the kind of emotionless, un-theatrical acting only to be found in movies. Interestingly enough, in Diary of a Country *Priest* he retained somewhat to his chagrin a theatrical, emotion-ridden type of acting in many of his characters, everyone except the chief player: a perfect enough juxtaposition between the Bresson to come and, in the characters whose rage issue in fits of pomposity, the Bresson past.




And yet this is not of the sort of chamber music austerity of some of Bergman's films, or the Expressionistic cries of pain of Dreyer's. If Bergman's Through a Glass Darkly or Winter Light remain slightly contrived and preconceived, even manipulative, it is because of a naked austerity that leaves little to make up for the thinness of plot that is the hallmark of these films. In Winter Light, surely Bergman's most austere, the 90 minute, real-time journey of a small-town pastor on a Sunday seems too preoccupied with words, dialogues, monologues – words, however well scripted they may be, are not enough. This is something Bresson knew, which is why words never seem to transcend plot in his work.

Also central to Bresson's distinction from these two filmmakers was his refusal to dabble in worldly themes. The Trial is probably the closest he ever got to such a theme. Even in Bergman's best, we see an almost constricting use of words or images to highlight mundane subjects – the interplay between art and real life in Through a Glass Darkly, the fear of nuclear war in Winter Light, or the foreshadowing

of war and chaos in The Silence. Dreyer too showed this quality from time to time – in Ordet, Gertrud, and Day of Wrath. Bresson was distrustful of both introspective speech and excessive action. His refusal to dabble in mundane themes stemmed from this distrust, and it gave him endless opportunities to experiment with things he considered to be more important - like

The aims he set for his career and the sheer determination that went with them narrowed his preoccupation with the mechanics of film down to one goal: the separation of cinema from theatre. The only other mainstream director who devoted his career to the pursuit of a single aim was Alfred Hitchcock. Bresson's pursuit would appear, to discerning film lovers, more noble than Hitchcock's at times callous compromises with the box-office.

With Robert Bresson we lost cinema's truest patron saint, a filmmaker who was not afraid of flouting convention if that served the purposes of his art. Few filmmakers ever sought to divorce the cinema from other art forms, notably the stage. Few filmmakers sought to strike at the heart of the cinema with as much success. And few filmmakers ever had their conception of the medium so recognised, and applauded, as did his. Godard once described his contribution to cinema as akin to Mozart's in music and Dostoyevsky's in literature. No filmmaker can equal him, even after all these years. He was, and, even after his death, still remains, the most unique artist in the history of the film medium.








Wonderful concept of learning with freedom

The cover of a book is a symbol that represents the content of the book. The title of the book states that the concept of 'learning is a concept covered in different aspects' is given the shade of two trees of different sizes and colours. > thing to be done in the book is to analyze the term learning according to the rules of expression. Secondly, it is an analysis based on the five hindrances of Buddhism and the four Brahma commentaries and other related concepts of Buddhism.

Thirdly it is the analysis of the history of education, the principles of education, the objectives of education, the formal-informal concepts, and the overall field of education.

The following is an explanation of what is being done by balancing the concept of wonderful learning with the concept of free-

As readers of the book, we have already come to realize that any concept can be interpreted and understood through different disciplines and that the horizons of our knowledge cannot be expanded without it. The reader is enlightened by a profound philosophy, such as the Buddhist philosophy, and by philosophers representing different cultures and disciplines, such as Krishnamurti and Rousseau. Then the reader will be amazed to enter a totally different field on the theme. That is the learning of the Vedda people.

An interpretation of the concept of learning in association with the Vedda people, who can be considered a hidden part of the Sri Lankan society, reveals another perspective that is clear from the book. As pointed out by Dambane Gunawardena, the table on page 95 comparing formal education and Vedda learning should be considered as a significant aspect when considering modern education reforms.

The book concludes by emphasizing the need to look at education with an open eye and the need to address educational issues in the light of the various currents expressed in the book. The references for each chapter are also included at the end of the book, giving the reader the opportunity to pursue further research on the subject.



Hindu influence during the Polonnaruwa period

ccording to history, Sri Lanka was conquered by the Cholas during the early part of the 10th century. The major part of the island was under their rule for more than five decades. During the period, Polonnaruwa was the centre of administration. Opening years of Polonnaruwa period in Sri Lankan history started with the Chola regime. The recoveries of Chola inscriptions from Mantai have provided some important clues and valuable information about the expansion of the Chola Kingdom from South India to ancient Sri Lanka. It seems that often Cholas sent their officials to the occupied areas in ancient Sri Lanka to coordinate the administration. The Chola areas of ancient Sri Lanka were referred to as Mummudi Chola Mandalam.

When Sri Lanka was under the Chola period, the native artisans including painters had very limited scope to exhibit their own art and culture. During that time no monuments or any native architectural designs were seen. Chola invaders had built typical Hindu temples according to the Dravidian architecture.

Buddhist architecture

During the Polonnaruwa period, the Chola regime or dynasty was dominating South India. Yet it could be noticeable that the ancient architectural style which was based on certain exclusive patterns was found. They had links with Buddhist architecture. Hindu temples of Polonnaruwa were built only during this period. Numerous Saiva bronze statues with excellent images were installed in the Saiva temples in the Polonnaruwa peri-

Chola kings dominated during the Polonnaruwa period after conquering and consolidating their presence in 993 A.D. As soon as they captured Polonnaruwa, it was renamed Janatha Mangalam. After the expiry of the Chola period, one of the Kalinga (Odisha) kings ruled Polonnaruwa for around three decades. The Great



Based on the texture of the material, the statues of the Polonnaruwa period could be divided into two categories. They are made of bronze as well as with various kinds of stones including granite and sandstones. All the Sri Lankan Hindu statues were more or less found in and around the ancient archaeological sites at Polonnaruwa. Generally, the Hindu sculptures of the Polonnaruwa period are popularly categorized as Pancha Deva Sapai or Saba. They include Sivan, Vishnu, Parvathi, (Ma Sakthi), Suriyan and Ganesh.

Chola Chakaravarthies (Majestic or Great Kings) who built the great Thanchai Bragatheeswarar temple in Tamil Nadu also built numerous temples in Polonnaruwa with excellent architecture. They not only built the magnificent temples in Polonnaruwa, but they also built some excellent temples in North West of Sri Lanka.

In memory of Rajaraja's queen, the 2nd Devale was built by the Cholas, and the presiding deity of the temple was Vanavan Madevi - Iswaram Udaiyar. The inner sanctum of the Devale is devoted to Siva Lingam. According to Annada K.Coomaraswamy, it was one of the excellent creations in stone. According to the ancient historical records, another Siva temple

known as Kailasm was built by Vijaya Bahu in Kantale. During the period of Vijaya Bahu, the Hindu religion was well preserved in the country.

Construction plaster

Siva Devale 1 at Polonnaruwa was built with carved stones brought from far off places. The binding agent of construction plaster was not used for the building. The beautification of the external architecture had the lotus design. It has been found that during the periods of Anuradhapura and Polonnaruwa, there was an admixture of Buddhist and Hindu architectures.

Kalinga princes who came after the Cholas ruled the island with Polonnaruwa as the capital. The Chola period was considered the golden period in the history of Tamils of Tamil Nadu. During the period, the Cholas built excellent and huge Hindu temples that reflect Dravidian architecture. The bronze statues of the period were considered as one of the

best in the world. During the Chola occupation of ancient Sri Lanka, art, culture and religion were influenced by the Chola dynasty. During their occupation, they built numerous Hindu temples at Mathota, Polonnaruwa and several other areas of the island. We have enough evidence that they made a lot of endowments to the Buddhist monastery. A temple devoted to Lord Shiva and Lok Mata Sri Parvati was built in Mathota. It was built by one of the Chola kings named Tali Kumaran. Later the temple was renamed Rajaraja Iswarattu Mahadevan temple. Besides this, another temple named "Tiruverameswaran Udaiyar Mahadevan Kovil" was built at Mathota (Rajarajapura).

Royal families

It is interesting to note that Mahindra IV (956 - 972) picked up his bride from South India. Most of the Sinhalese kings had chosen their brides from royal families of South India. For example, Vijayabahu 1 was married to one of the Kalinga princes. In return, he offered his sister Mitta to Pandu prince. According to ancient historical evidence, Parakrama Bahu 1 performed a series of Hindu rituals, including the foremost Hindu ritual known as "Homa yaga."

Based on the texture of the material, the statues of the Polonnaruwa period could be divided into two categories. Besides them, the carved sculptures, exhibiting various postures of traditional dances including Thandava Karnas, beautifully decorated Sabta Mathas, Guards or Duwara Balaks, Nandi, a variety of Parvathi, Ardanatheswar, Joesta, Varahi Avtar of Sri Sarawati Devi, stone slab sculptures, ancient Yapahuva palace ruin structures belong to the same Polonnaruwa period.

It is believed that there was the coexistence of twin worships of Lord Siva and Sri Maha Vishnu during the Chola dynasty in Sri Lanka. The Vishnu statues are divided into three different categories based on their appearances. They include standing, sitting and sleeping or popularly known as "Ananda Sayanam" in Sanskrit. The ancient Maha Vishnu statues found in Sri Lankan archaeological sites exhibit the "standing positions" only. In contrary to this, a variety of Lord Siva's postures were unearthed from the Polonnaruwa period. These postures include various stances of ancient traditional dances. The sculptures are based on ethics or norms of "Saiva Ahama Sastras" (Traditional Hindu principles). Similarly, the "Ma Shakti" or Lok Mata Parvati sculptures at various postures can be observed.

One good example as cited by the writer is the example of ruling doctrinal plans of King Dutugemunu in the conquest of foreign forces that came to be disastrous. The doctrine as laid down by the Buddhist discipline had been shown as the guiding power of the beacon light. But the reader, I am sure, is not misguided by mere historical events, but sensitively feels the necessity to eradicate the evil forces.

s a teenager (18 or 19) I have heard of a Tamil writer by name of Dominic Jeeva. But I happened to read the Suthanthiran (a hard-hitting newspaper of the Tamil Arasu Kadchi) where senior writers were writing to that weekly. This was edited by the late S T Sivanayagam crowned as a doyen of contemporary Tamil Journalism. I wrote a few pieces to the teenager's page Valarmathi. So was Theevaan (Mu. Ponnanbalam). I saw short stories by senior writers but not read them.

Good books

But it was a few years later that I became an avid reader of Lankan and Tamil Nadu fiction writing. Ramanathan, MS Iqbal, Rainbow Kanagaratnam, K Kailasapathy, Sillaiyoor Selvarajan were the people who recommended good books to me.

At that time Dominic Jeeva's Paathukai, his first collection of short stories, came to be published. I read his book critically and wrote a review in English for the then Sunday Times ably edit-

ed by K Muttiah, the well-known writer from the then Madras. (now Chennai). Kasinathan who was a professor of Philosophy at the University of Peradeniya appreciated my review very much. I did not know if Dominic Jeeva had ever read that review.

I wanted to meet him and so I went to Yaalpaanam and stayed at Lake View Hotel in Kasthuriaar Road. Jeeva was having his hairdressing salon just near the hotel.
