THE following amended special regulations made by His Excellency the Governor, with the active of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the 79th clause of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, relating to the entry inwards and outwards, to the landing, shipping, and transhipping of goods, and to business generally connected with steamers, are hereby published for general information and observance.

Regulations referred to.

1. In order that steamers may be permitted relaxations of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 as to the coaling, landing, shipping, and transhipping of targo, when such provisions may, in the opinion of the Collector, be lawfully relaxed, the local agent of a steamer or the local agent of a Company owning steamers shall enter into a bond binding himself in the sum of ten thousand rupees, and by the deposit with the Collector of the sum of one thousand rupees, to hold himself responsible for the payment upon the order of the Collector of any fine or penalty to which the master of such steamer or any person employed in any work on behalf of the agent or master of such steamer shall have rendered himself liable for any breach of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, and for the payment for any fine or penalty on account of the non-delivery of cargo, and for the payment of any other fine or penalty in or about work performed on behalf of the master or agent of such steamer.

Provided that where the local agent of a steamer or the local agent of a Company owning steamers is the local agent for more than one steamer, the property of different owners, or the local agent of more than one Company owning steamers, the local agent shall enter into one bond in respect of the one or more steamers or of the one or more Companies owning steamers of which he is the local agent, and shall deposit only the sum of one thousand rupees, which sum shall be taken to be a deposit in respect of each of the steamers of which he is such local agent. The Principal Collector of Customs shall, in default of payment on demand by the local agent, deduct out of such sum of one thousand rupees any fine or penalty hereinbefore referred to.

- 2. The master of any steamer in respect of which a bond has been given as aforesaid may be permitted by the Collector, upon the application of the agent of such steamer, to begin coaling, landing, shipping, or transhipping immediately upon the arrival of such steamer and before she shall have been entered and reported.
- 3. The agent of the steamer shall, within twenty-four hours of the arrival of the steamer, enter the steamer and deliver the report and manifest, and all other documents required by law; and shall, within seven days of the departure of the steamer, deliver a correct content outwards of the said steamer in such form and manner as shall be required by the Collector.
- 4. All amendments of reports, and all applications required to be made by the master of the steamer, shall be made by the agent of the steamer, who shall for such purposes be deemed and taken to be the agent of the master.
- 5. The Collector may, on the application of the master or agent of a steamer, permit work to be carried on in respect of the coaling, or loading, or unloading of such steamer, or the transhipping of cargo to or from such steamer after 4 P.M. and before 6 A.M. on any day but Sunday, provided that if required by the Collector the agent or master shall deposit before the granting of such permission a sum sufficient for the payment of the charges leviable in respect of such working.

permission a sum sufficient for the payment of the charges leviable in respect of such working.

No work shall be permitted after midnight on Saturday and before midnight on Sunday, except upon the payment of a penalty in addition to the charges aforesaid. Such penalty shall, be calculated at the rate of 38 cents per ton of the registered tonnage of the steamer, but shall not be less than Rs. 50, and shall not exceed Rs. 200. Ships of war and naval transports shall, upon the application to the Collector by the Commander, or the local representative of the nation to which the ship belongs, be allowed to coal on Sundays without payment of the penalty, but upon payment of the charges leviable in respect of such working.

6. The Collector may allow any person exporting cargo, who shall have deposited with such Collector a sum of five hundred rupees, to ship such cargo before entry has been added and person of all dues made, and all requirements and regulations fulfilled. Such person shall, within four days of shipping such cargo, pass all entries and pay all dues and fulfil all requirements and regulations. The Collector may impose a penalty not exceeding one hundred rupees if such person shall not within the four days aforesaid pass all entries and pay all dues and fulfil all requirements and regulations; and such penalty shall be deducted from the sum of five hundred rupees deposited as aforesaid. The Collector may at any time return the sum of five hundred rupees or the balance thereof, and require the person exporting cargo to pay all dues and make all entries and fulfil all requirements and regulations before shipping such cargo.

3.
