PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. West Ridgeway, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Local Boards Amendment Ordinance, 1890," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, exempt the inhabitants of any town from payment of the police tax, and order the withdrawal of the whole or any part of the police force therein:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 22nd day of July, 1895, issued under the provisions of section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," a police force was duly established in the town of Chilaw, in the North-Western Province, within the limits in the said Proclamation set out and described:

And whereas it is expedient to exempt the inhabitants of the said town of Chilaw from payment of the police tax and to withdraw the police force established under the said Proclamation of 22nd July, 1895:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, under the provisions of section 8 of the said "Local Boards Amendment Ordinance, 1890," exempt the inhabitants of the said town of Chilaw from payment of the police tax, and order the withdrawal of the whole of the police force established therein, as from and after the 1st day of July, 1897.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twentieth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-seven.
