3. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the offices of the abovenamed jails and the Inspector-General of Prisons, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form.

4. The under-mentioned deposits, which must be made at the Treasury or Kachcheri, will be required before any form of tender is issued :-

A deposit of Rs. 1,000 for the Convict Establishment, comprising Welikada, Mahara, Mutwal, and Borella Convict hospital; and Rs.200 for the Kandy jails comprising Bogambara and Kandy Old jail.
