














# **Economy strong** despite global **COVID-19** fallout

# - State Minister

# 25 Police Sergeants file FR petition

Twenty five Police Sergeant drivers who discharged duties at different Police Stations around the country have filed a Fundamental Rights petition in Supreme Court directing the National Police Commission to promote the Petitioners to the rank of Sub Inspector of Police Transport.

This petition had been filed through counsel Darshana Kuruppu naming IGP, Defence Ministry Secretary, National Police Commission Chairman and its members as respondents.

The petitioners are also seeking a declaration that inaction on the part of the respondents in failing to grant a promotion have resulted in the infringement of the petitioners fundamental rights guaranteed under Article 12(1) of the Constitution.

The petitioners state that Police Security Assistant Officers who were of a rank below the petitioners have absorbed to the rank of Police Constable in 2018 and now are also a part of the Police Regular Service.

The petitioners state that said absorption over the years will result in the petitioners being overlooked in granting of promotions, even if they belong to the Police Regular Service from inception.

The Petitioners further state that their promotional avenues are limited to the post of Chief Inspector of Police. They further said that in contrast the Police Security Assistant Officers, who were subsequently absorbed to the rank of Police Constable, were also awarded with the ability to rise among the ranks even up to the rank of IGP since they became entitled to all the promotions of a Police Constable. The Petitioners state that these acts of discouragement have frustrated the petitioners leading to severe job dissatisfaction as they also have a legitimate expectation to obtain timely promotions during their tenure of service.

# Two Boossa prison guards suspended

# Pothuarawa residents protest alternative route for Rajagiriya – Athurugiriya Highway

# 'Plan would force resettlement of 1,010 families'

A group of residents from Pothuarawa in Malabe staged a silent protest in front of the Central Environment Authority yesterday, urging them to construct the elevated highway from Rajagiriya to Athurugiriya through the proposed route instead of making lastminute changes.

Pothuarawa residents said they had received information suggesting that a group of influential people were trying to force the authorities to change the proposed route and seek an alternative route over Pothuarawa, which could

displace a large number of families who have lived there for decades.

Letters were handed over to the Secretary of the Road Development Authority, Secretary of the Ministry of Environment, and the Project Director of the Elevated Highway Project, requesting not to change the proposed route, which goes over the Akuregoda paddy fields.

"We are not against the construction of the highway as we know the importance of the minimisation of traffic flow. However, the authorities must concentrate on minimising its social impact as well.

People who would be affected by the alternative route have been living here for ages; where are we supposed to go if we lose our lands?" Kamal Nanayakkara, a Pothuarawa resident and Chairman of the 'Surakimu Pothuarawa Sanvidanava' said.

The four-lane elevated highway, which would be 17.3 km in length and would stretch from Orugodawatte to Athurugiriya, was proposed in

2015 and is to be constructed under two phases. Phase One was planned from Orugodawatte to Rajagiriya, while Phase Two was planned from Rajagiriya to Athurugiriya.

Phase Two, which covers 10.4km, if constructed via the alternative route, would require the resettlement of 1,010 families and the demolishing of around 34 shops, 42 shop-houses, and 42 selfemployed businesses. The

government would have to acquire 750 land lots to build the elevated highway, and this would leave 106 structures partially affected and 634 fully affected.

Meanwhile, the authorities stated that construction of the elevated highway over the initially proposed route (the Akuregoda paddy fields) would not cause any adverse environmental impact or property damage.







# Don't jump the vaccine queue - Health DDG

Deputy Director-General of Health Services Dr. Hemantha Herath said yesterday that there was information suggesting that certain people were trying to get the COVID-19 vaccine by coercing health officials.

He said that everyone should be patient until they get their chance, adding that there was a situation where certain individuals had applied for the vaccine using various identities and posts outside the plan.

Dr. Herath said that people with chronic illnesses must inform officials about their conditions before receiving the vaccine. If there is a problem, there is an opportunity to meet the provincial health officer and take further action, he said.

The Deputy Director-General urged the people to take appropriate precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 even after getting the vaccine.

# **Majority of rural residents** have no access to potable drinking water: Vasudeva

The majority of rural residents have no access to potable drinking water and often fall prey to kidney disease, Water Supply Minister Vasudeva Nanayakkara said. He was speaking at a recent public meeting following the opening of five Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants in Horowpothana, Galenbindunuwewa, and Kebithigollewa.

The minister said that around 20,000 persons were currently suffering from kidney ailments in the North-Central Province alone. He added that the National Water Supply and Drainage Board (NWDSB) recently launched a project to address the issue.

Minister Nanayakkara said that at present, there are around 2,500 cases of chronic kidney disease in the Horowpothana, Galenbindunuwewa, and Kebithigollewa divisional secretariat divisions.

He added that the RO plants, which have been set up at a cost of Rs.10 million, would provide drinking water to 1,250 low-income families in those areas.

Around 300 villages in the North-Central Province lack proper drinking water, Nanayakkara said, adding that the NWDSB has plans to set up another 340 RO plants in those villages at a cost of Rs.680 million. The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) would fund the projects, he said.

These recommendations cannot be successfully implemented by any entity single handedly.

The Presidential Commission of Inquiry (PCoI) into the Easter Sunday attacks was appointed in 2019 by the previous Government.

The Government in power is of the view that the Easter Sunday attacks had a devastating impact on the national security and stability, the economy, religious harmony and the social fabric of the country. The background to these events also opens the door to external interference that is detrimental to the country's sovereignty and stability. In order to ensure peace and security as well as economic prosperity within the territory of the State of Sri Lanka, all avenues leading to recurrence of such extremist violence must entirely be

closed. This requires a complete cessation of religious extremism and associated terrorist violence, hate speech aiming different ethnic communities and foreign funding for such

The PCoI has identified what each state institution and authority should do and the level of priority to be given to each task to achieve these broad objectives. If the existing administrative machinery is not adequate to follow the recommended course of action, necessary amendments need to be made in the administrative mechanism. The responsibility entrusted with the Parliamentary Committee appointed by the President is to study in depth the content of the Report of the PCoI on Easter Sunday attacks and to report on how action should be taken to prevent

such a tragedy from happening again and to ensure the long lasting peace, security and stability in Sri Lanka.

The Parliamentary Committee is not expected to intervene in this process. Adding recommendations to the Commission of Inquiry Report is also not within the scope of the Committee. She further said that the mode of spread of new variants is similar to the virus strain already prevalent in Sri Lanka and new variants may have the ability to be more infectious and therefore will spread more quickly among the community.

When more people are infected, more patients will develop symptoms and complications.

"The same public health measures currently recommended, namely, wearing face masks correctly and consistently, social distancing (more than 1 metre), avoiding crowded places and taking adequate sanitary measures (frequent hand washing) are equally effective in the prevention or transmission of new variants and should be practiced at all times. The alarming increase recently in the number of new cases is most probably due to ignoring these precautions," Dr. Gunaratne said.

Even the South African strain, not isolated in Sri Lanka so far, is known to be covered to a great extent by the vaccine. Therefore, when the vaccine is offered, it is best that all those eligible take the vaccine as it reduces the severity of the illness and prevents deaths. They may even reduce the transmission of the infection.

COVID-19 is caused by SARS-CoV-2, a newly identified virus.

Scientists are learning more about it each day. Although most people have mild symptoms, it can also cause severe illness and even death. Some groups, including the elderly and people who have certain underlying medical conditions are at increased risk of severe illness. As such, it is essential to take all possible public health measures to prevent transmission of this infection.

Natural mutations which change the properties of the virus are known to occur with all viruses, and these are described as variants. To date several new variants of the original virus have been identified in some countries, which have now spread to many countries. We must understand that there may be many more new variants appearing with time either within the country or brought in from outside. Some variants identified so far have originated in the UK, USA, Brazil and South Africa.

Since the first local COVID-19 case was identified in Sri Lanka in early March 2020, most of the virus types isolated in the country are from the old, previously identified type. In the recent past, a few viruses belonging to the UK variant have been identified from a few individuals around the country.

# Welcome PM **Imran Khan**

ri Lanka will today roll the Red Carpet for visiting Prime Minister of Pakistan Imran Khan, which will unfold another chapter in the strong bonds and friendship forged between the two countries over the decades. Pakistan had always been a great friend of this country in both fair and foul

This was proved to the hilt during the separatist war where Pakistan was only one of the few countries which came to our assistance in both financial and military terms which went a long way in contributing to the ultimate military victory over the LTTE.

Of course the assistance came with no strings attached whether it was a civilian or military Government that ruled Pakistan, for which Sri Lanka owes a deep debt of gratitude. Pakistani military academies were also made readily available for military training of our Forces personnel with the latest techniques in warfare that made our men that much skilled and competent. Premier Khan of course would be very familiar with the ground situation having toured this country as Pakistan's cricket captain in 1986 when the war was at its zenith (prior to that he was a member of Pakistan teams to Sri Lanka in 1976 and 1979). Perhaps more than any other visiting leader, Imran Khan would be readily welcomed by cricket mad Sri Lankans for the

lasting impression he made during his visits here as a fast bowler even though our own batsmen were at the receiving end of his thunderbolts, coupled with his flamboyant movie star appearance that left an indelible mark on Sri Lankans. Who among us can forget Pakistan's generous gesture in sending a group of its top cricketers here, who in combination with some of India's leading players featured in an exhibition game with Arjuna's boys when Australia and West Indies snubbed this country by boycotting their World Cup fixtures in Sri Lanka citing the war as an excuse. This stand in solidarity has been symbolic of Pakistan's relations with this country right throughout, which will be cemented by the visit of the Pakistani Premier.

Serious and important business is on the agenda for PM Khan's two-day visit. He is accompanied by a high-powered Pakistani business delegation, along with a ministerial entourage. Promotion of trade and investment is billed to receive top priority. He will hold talks with President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa with several high-level engagements also planned including a Business and Investment Forum. Both Prime Ministers will also preside over an event to sign several mutually beneficial bilateral Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) following official talks.

Discussions are also bound touch on the cultural ties between the two countries taking into account that Pakistan was also home to a rich Buddhist civilization centuries back, traces of which are still evident. PM Khan's visit assumes additional significance at a time when Sri Lanka is once again in the crosshairs of the United Nation's Human Rights Council (UNHRC) which is in the midst of its ritual targeting of this country for alleged human rights violations during the war. Pakistan has always voted against the past resolutions in this respect and there is no doubt it will do so again. Prime Minister Khan's visit at this stage will most likely influence Middle East countries to throw their weight behind Sri Lanka.

The Coronavirus pandemic too will come up for discussion. Pakistan is among the very few countries (Sri Lanka included) which had successfully managed the contagion while the virus continues to rage elsewhere, the ready availability of the vaccine notwithstanding. The prevailing health emergency though regretfully has prevented Premier Khan from addressing Sri Lanka's Parliament. He would have been only the second Pakistani Head of State to have done so after Premier Zulfikar Ali Bhutto in 1975.

Prime Minister Imran Khan's visit to Sri Lanka also comes at a time when the geopolitical picture in the region is taking on a murky shade. Regional powers India and Pakistan had already fought three wars and almost resumed hostilities recently over a border spat. The Kashmir issue too is sticking out like a sore thumb between the two sides. Although Pakistan is a key player in the region it has so far, at least on the surface, not been drawn into the web of geopolitical intrigue, nor shown itself to be proxy player in the region though it has a healthy relationship with China. It is not clear if geopolitical matters would feature in the discussions during Khan's visit although the subject is bound to come up at some point in the natural course of things.

It is incumbent on the Government to derive all benefits and advantages it could out of this visit of the Pakistani Head of State covering all areas of trade, investment and other vital areas of the economy. After all Imran Khan is the first Head of State to arrive in the country following the election of the present Government and also the first foreign leader to come here in 2021, as Sri Lanka strives to recover from the pandemic.

standard of accountability whereby they are answerable and held accountable for their decisions and actions in the exercise of their powers. This principle of accountability is enshrined in legal documents with varying degrees of force in various part of the world, mostly in relation to the prevention of corruption in the public sector. The United Nations Convention Against Corruption 2003 is one such example. This principle however is also given prominent at regional and national levels.

The principle of accountability is often discussed relation to the related principles of integrity and transparency: these principles indicate the standard we need to hold our public officers to a public accountability rest on four fundamental foundations. (a) Appropriate representation (b) citizen participation (c) legitimate conduct (d) liability enforcement. In ensuring that the participation of the citizenry is effective in holding public officials accountable, the public trust doctrine is avidly instructive.

Accordingly the Public Trust Doctrine is based on the notion that powers held by the Executive, Legislature and Judiciary are powers that originate with the people that are entrusted to such organs for the purpose of exercising government and with the sole objective of exercising such powers in good faith for the benefit of the people.

At this stage - three well established aspects of constitutional law which relates to environmental and public law perspectives stated by Sarath N. Silva CJ., in Vasudewa Nanayakkara v Choksy and Others (SC FR No.209 / 2007) may be pertinent.

1. That the Rule of Law is the basis of our Constitution as affirmatively judilaid down in the decision of this Court in Visvalingam v Livanage (1983) 1 Sri LR 236 and Premachandra v Jayawickrama (1994) 2 Sri LR 9 and consistently followed in several subsequent decisions. The rule of law postulates the absolute supremacy or predominance of regular law as opposed to the influence of arbitrary power. It excludes the existence of arbitrariness of prerogative or wide discretionary authority on the part of the government. (vide. Law of the Constitution, A.V. Dicey, p

2. That as firmly laid down in the Determination of the Divisional Bench of Seven Judges of the Supreme Court in regard the constitutionality of the proposed 19th Amendment to the Constitution (2002) 3 Sri LR 85, the principle enunciated in Articles 3 and 4 of our Constitution is that the respective organs of government, the Legisla-

ublic officers are held to a ture, the Executive and the Judiciary are reposed power as custodian for the time being to be exercised for the people. In Bulankulama and Others v Secretary Ministry of Industrial Development (2000) Sri LR 243, this Court observed that the resources of the State are the 'resources of the people' and the organs of the State are the the guardians to whom the public have committed the care and preservation of these resources' (at 253 p) and that there is a confident expectation (trust) that the executive will act in accordance with the law and accountably in the best interests of the people of Sri Lanka.' at 258p.

3. That there is a positive component in the right to equality guaranteed by Article 12(1) of the Constitution as decided in Senerath v Chandrika Bandaranaike Kumaratunga SC FR 503/ 2005 of 03.05.2007 and where the Executive being the custodian of the people's power acts ultra vires and in derogation of the law and procedures that are intended to safeguard the resources of the people, it is in the public interest to implead such action before Court'.

#### **Remedies in Public Law**

A citizen who is aggrieved by a decision of a public body or inaction of a public body has a variety of remedies available under public law. The administrative action and/ or inaction on the part of a judge of any court, tribunal of first instance or other institutions or any person having legal authority to determine questions affecting the rights of subjects having the duty to act judicially may be challenged by way of judicial review. (R v Electricity Commissioner Ex p. London Electricity Joint Committee) The jurisdiction of the Court for an application for cial review is invoked by way of a writ application in terms of Articles 140 or in terms of Article 154P of the 1978 Constitution. In general most of such applications are made by public spirited individuals or bodies as the inaction or illegal action of State institutions affect sometimes large number of citizens or group of citizens living in a particular locality who may not have the means or the awareness to institute action. The English law principles applicable to writ applications in judicial review always permitted citizen action or actiopopularis which is based on the premise that the main aim of public law is to keep bodies within their powers. The presumption is that citizens generally should be enabled to vindicate the public interest without showing individual harm over and above that of the general commu-

The principle governing class action in involving the jurisdiction of Court of Appeal is based on the principle *locus* standi. The public law remedies are different and distinct from ordinary litigation between two parties, whether one party is the State, where one party is seeking to establish a claim or a right against the other. Judicial review is an action whereby the Constitution grants the public the right to challenge a decision of a Court, tribunal or a public officer with a view to protect the statutory or constitutional rights of the public in the interest of good governance. Lord Donaldson M.R. observed in R v Civil Service

...... Public law bodies and the Courts should be regarded as being in partnership in a common endeavour to maintain the highest standards in public administration, including, I would add, the administration of jus-

In Sri Lanka, apart from an application for writ the executive or administrative action that is in violation of a fundamental right contained in Chapter III of the Constitution could be challenged in terms of Articles 17 read with Article 126 of the Constitution. Due to the excessive time taken to reach finality in a writ application, in average three to four years, in appropriate cases, there is a tendency to evoke the jurisdiction of the Supreme

Court by way of a Fundamental Rights Application. Further in a fundamental rights application, the bases of challenge is infringement or imminent violation of a fundamental right recognized under Chapter III of the Constitution by executive or administrative action. Article 12 has been widely interpreted to include any arbitrary or irrational action by the executive would constitute a violation of Article 12 of the Constitution provided the petitioner is entitled to make an application in terms of Article 126(2) of the Constitution. Article 12(1)

of the Constitution, as per several decisions of the Supreme Court attracts almost all principles applicable to judicial review. (Joseph Perera v Attorney General, M.A.K. Jayawardena v Dharani Wijayathilake; Hemasiri Fernando v Mangala Samaraweera and Others; Gunaratne v Sri Lanka Telecom and Others). Compared to the writ jurisdiction, this remedy is relatively new and was effectively introduced by the 1978 Constitution.

#### **Sustainable Development**

Several decades ago, public international law was not much concerned with environmental protection. Later, the Stockholm Declaration of 1972 and subsequent international instruments have enriched the international community on the subject. The term 'Sustainable Development' which includes inter-generational equity was brought into common use by the Brundtland Commission Report in 1987. The Rio Declaration of 1992 which refers to the right to sustainable development seeks to bridge the gap between environmental protection and economic development. Recently, the Paris Agreement of 2015 which deals with global climate change also stipulates that the human right to development is not unlimited and must be persued within the framework of sustainable develop-

Our Supreme Court in Heather Therese Mundy v Central Environmental Authority and Othershas stated that


'the Courts have to balance the right to development and the right to environmental protection. While development activity is necessary and inevitable for the sustainable development of a nation, unfortunately, it impacts the rights of the private individuals but such is the inevitable sad sacrifice that has to be made for the progress of a nation. The Court can only minimize as much as possible the effects to such rights. When balancing the competing interests between public rights and private rights, the conclusion necessarily has to be made in favour of the larger interests of the community who would benefit immensely by such developments'.

Our 1978 Constitution by Fundamental Rights Chapter III even by its later amendments does not surprisingly contain human right to environment or sustainable development despite extensive literature and dialogue on it. Therefore fundamental rights, both procedural and substantive found in our Chapter III of the Constitution are at times applied indirectly to the tribute to the Judiciary, facing legal difficulties as remedies for environmental issues.

A need has therefore arisen and developments taking place towards the emergence of a separate human right - fundamental right to sustainable development - to strongly address environmental issues. This study advocates a right to sustainable development as a fundamental human right for Sri Lanka under the proposed Consti-

# Pakistan-Sri Lanka relations: An exercise in world class diplomacy


ri Lanka is one of the few countries in South Asia with which Pakistan has endeavoured to develop a broadbased relationship covering trade, commerce, culture and defence matters. Successive Governments in Pakistan, whether they were democratic or military dictatorships, have valued this relationship and made efforts to further widen and deepen

This is despite the fact that Sri Lanka's interest in strengthening these relations has varied with the political party or group that has been in power. It would be a fair assumption to say that in South Asia, Sri Lanka and Nepal are the two countries with which Pakistan has sustained relatively the most balanced and cooperative relationship over the past few decades.

Sri Lankan politics and foreign relations, like those of most developing countries, are very much influenced by personalities and family orientations. During previous Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe's term, Pakistan tried to promote goodwill and expand relations despite his known leaning towards India. The Sri Lankan Government supported India's Kashmir policy and generally took a cue from what India desired in this regard. This was also apparent when Sri Lanka decided to stay away from the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) meetings.

Despite differences, Pakistan and Sri Lanka have maintained a mutually cooperative relationship. The recent election of Gotabaya Rajapaksa as the Sri Lankan President is expected to give a boost to relations - the optimism based on his family history, whereby those who ruled Sri Lanka were favourably disposed towards Pakistan.

Besides, for President Rajapaksa Pakistan has been a familiar country. As a young military officer, he has



attended a number of professional courses in Pakistan's training institu-

In 1971, during the civil war in erstwhile East Pakistan, when India imposed a ban on over-flight rights to Pakistan, it was Sri Lanka that granted re-fuelling rights to Pakistan Airlines. Nearly 200 flights took place between the two wings of Pakistan through Colombo that helped to maintain logistics supplies to the former East Pakistan (now Bangla-

#### Military support

Pakistan's association with Sri Lankan Defence Forces was strengthened in 2009 when it was engaged in the civil war with the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). Pakistan supported the Sri Lanka military by supplying them with advanced defence equipment and intelligence support when most other countries had imposed embar-

Pakistani pilots are also believed to have assisted in training the Sri Lankan Air Force (SLAF) and enhancing their capability. China has supplied military equipment and facilitated infrastructure development in Sri Lanka, although certain aspects of it have generated controversy.

Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan

In the field of sports, Sri Lanka and Pakistan have a cooperative relationship. The terrorist attack on the Sri Lankan cricket team in 2009 was a major setback for the promotion of cricket in Pakistan, but to the credit of successive Sri Lankan Governments, relations remained unscathed. Reviving cricketing ties, the Sri Lankan cricket team toured Pakistan in

Sri Lanka's strong relations with China are viewed critically by the United States and India as it reduces their space in the region. In the recent past, China has extended generous loans to Sri Lanka for infrastructure projects. Some of these were inefficiently implemented, resulting in price over-runs that came under criticism. Most of them were later rescheduled and duly completed.

The strategic port of Hambantota located in the Southern tip of Sri Lanka has been handed over to China for 100 years and will be a critical link of the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) of China. These strong links with China have irked India. The deal also raises misgivings in the US - and was perceived as a part of the "String of Pearls" strategy whereby China is spreading its influence in the South China

#### Regional and global powers

Despite these developments, Sri Lanka highly values its relations with New Delhi and the US, and through astute handling, maintains a delicate balance in relations with major regional and global powers. Pakistan expects that linking Gwadar, Karachi with Colombo and Hambantota Ports will result in enhanced regional economic activity. To give practical shape to it would, however, require close cooperation spread over the coming years.

The relationship between Pakistan and Sri Lanka is based on well-recognized principles of international diplomacy. Both countries value this broad-based relationship due to its mutual benefit and hopefully, it will continue to strengthen in the coming years.

wo main factors were stressed by the Sri Lankan health authorities last week but it seems the Sri Lankan public is still totally ignoring those crucial facts connected to controlling COVID-19. The two crucial facts are not treating the vaccine as a permit or a license to ignore all or some health guidelines introduced by the Government and health authorities to control COVID-19 and extending the fullest cooperation by the public to all relevant authorities to control the pan-

Recently health authorities stressed that despite being vaccinated, the transmission of the COVID-19 virus would not halt and people should strictly practice all health guidelines. They stated that there is a possibility that a vaccinated person could contract the virus again but the vaccine would help develop the antibodies to fight the virus

# **Health guidelines**

Therefore they urged people to strictly adhere to all the health guidelines even after being vaccinated and urged everyone to get vaccinated once the vaccines are available. Meanwhile some interested parties are purposely spreading fabricated scary information in connection with side effects of the vaccine and other information related by genuine people are being misinterpreted by some other parties. People do not know what to believe and what not to believe. Therefore they should be educated with accurate and adequate facts on side effects of the vaccine.

The public has other concerns such as obtaining the same vaccine for both doses (this is because some consultants stressed the importance of

Only 50 or the number of invitees permitted by the Public Health Inspectors / MOH should be allowed for any wedding these days according to the latest health guidelines and operational guidelines issued by the health authorities and the Government. What the organisers of wedding do these days in order to 'follow' the rule and invite as many as they want is organising three or four separate 'mini weddings' in addition to the main wedding. This funny and expensive practice was there even before COVID-19 but nowadays this

Usually we can see that couples organise around three or more 'mini weddings'. One mini wedding in one province, another mini wedding in another province and the main wedding in Colombo or a suburb area. Altogether over 150 guests are being invited for the three weddings of the same couple. If the couple/ bride or the groom had COVID-19, only God can help the invitees. Nothing can be done legally until the relevant authorities in relevant three areas coordinate with each other and track down all three mini weddings of the same couple. But in this

busy era relevant authorities hardly have time to tackle cunning plans of irresponsible couples and their parents/ relations. Tracking down contacts takes place only when a large cluster of COVID-19 is created as a result of a wedding or event(s).



tion is only the police and law enforcement officials take action against people who do not follow relevant health guidelines issued by the health authorities and the Government to control COVID-19 and other persons such as Department Heads, Heads of Institutions, bus drivers, bus conductors, etc. do not take any action against those who do not follow health guidelines and do not take any action to protect

guidelines. Many families undergo quarantine because of irresponsible individuals who are not connected to them. During home quarantine, some family members who suffer from other health conditions such as Non Communicable Diseases (NCDs) need to see their regular doctors and some people need urgent medical treatment. The authorities need to make sure that they attend to those urgent needs of the public. Still there is a possibility that healthy and normal people could get infected with COVID-19 due to certain shortcomings and loopholes that exist in the system and ignorance of some health workers.

On the other hand little bit more attention need to be paid for the people who seek medical treatment and healthcare services from the private sector. The very first issue is many private health institutions charge extremely high prices for their services especially certain services such as performing PCR Tests. The only way out is strictly following all health guidelines all the time no matter who says what. It is up to us to protect ourselves from COVID-19 and no one can save us from COVID-19 other than ourselves. You have to do a few simple things. First thing is being mindful all the time. Secondly you need to wear a standard face mask covering both your mouth and nose. The third step is keeping at least two metres of distance from another person all the time and the last step is washing hands with soap and water often. A quality hand sanitizer should be used whenever soap and water are not available.

# GLOBAL COVID-19 death toll nears 2.5 million, US toll tops 500,000

<u>US</u>: The United States recorded over 500,000 COVID-related deaths since the start of the pandemic, while nations globally pressed on with vaccination rollouts, including with Australia giving its first shots

As of Monday morning, the US death toll stood at 511,133. Globally, the figure was approaching 2.5 million.

The number of global COVID-19 cases at present stands at 111,957,494 while the number of deaths recorded is 2,477,839.

The catastrophic US toll comes as some signs of hope are emerging in the world's hardest-hit country, with millions of people now vaccinated and winter's massive spike

in infections dropping.
But deaths are still coming, and Presi-

dent Joe Biden last month warned that "well over" 600,000 people in the US could die from the virus.

"It's terrible. It is historic. We haven't seen anything even close to this for well over a hundred years, since the 1918 pandemic of influenza," Biden's Chief Medical Advisor Anthony Fauci told NBC's "Meet The Press."

"It's something that is stunning when you look at the numbers, almost unbelievable, but it's true," Fauci added.

After America's first COVID-19 death was announced in February last year, it took about three months to pass the 100,000 mark, during a first wave that hit New York particularly hard.

According to the US Centers for Disease

Control and Prevention (CDC), more than 61 million people have received at least one shot of vaccine in the United States, with some 18 million getting the full two doses.

Biden has made it a priority to get 100 million people vaccinated within the first 100 days of his administration.

Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison got the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine at a medical center in Sydney, in what the government said was a bid to boost public confidence in the vaccinations that have been subject to some anti-vaccine protests

More than 17 million people in Britain have now received at least a first vaccine dose — one third of the adult UK population. - AFP

# Canada to provide COVID swab tests at US border

**CANADA:** Canada will provide mandatory swab tests at over a hundred land crossings on its border with the US from Monday, Ottawa said, as concerns over the spread of new coronavirus variants grow.

"Travellers entering Canada at land borders, unless exempt, will be required to take a test using a self-swab kit," a statement from Canada's Public Health Agency said Saturday.

"This test can be taken either at the traveller's quarantine location or at a border testing site." From Monday, air passengers arriving in Canada have to undergo a three-day hotel quarantine at their own expense while they wait for the results of a coronavirus test. - AFP

# Trump to give first post White House speech in Florida

**US:** Former US President Donald Trump will give a speech later this month to a gathering of political conservatives in Orlando, Florida, a source familiar with the plans said Saturday, his first extended public address since leaving the White House on January 20.

The appearance is scheduled for Sunday, February 28 at the Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC), one of the country's largest annual gatherings of political conservatives. Trump will be "talking"

about the future of the Republican Party and the conservative movement," the source told AFP. He is also expected to challenge the "disastrous amnesty and border policies" of his successor, President Joe Biden, the source added. Three-quarters of Republicans want Trump to play a prominent role in the party, according to a poll from Quinnipiac University this week. Since departing the White House on January 20 Trump has largely kept to himself at his Mar-a-Lago estate in Florida. - AFP

# Texas restores power but still struggling with water

**US:** Texas authorities have restored power statewide bringing relief after days of unprecedentedly frigid temperatures, but millions were still struggling without safe, drinkable water.

"Due to lack of power, frozen pipes, high use at certain times, we've seen the number of systems go up that are reporting (water) issues," Toby Baker, executive director of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality told reporters durative director of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality told reporters durative directors.

Democratic congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, a frequent target of Republican criticism, was in Texas Saturday lending support after raising more than \$3.7 million in a few days to help Texas's recovery.

# Malcolm X's family calls to reopen murder investigation

**US:** The daughters of prominent Black activist Malcolm X have called to reopen the investigation into his murder in light of new testimony implicating the New York police and the FBI.

"Any evidence that provides greatest insight into the truth behind that terrible tragedy should be thoroughly investigated," said Ilyasah Shabazz, one of Malcolm X's six daughters, during a press conference on Saturday.

Considered alongside Martin Luther King Jr as one the most influential African Americans in history, Malcolm X was an outspoken Muslim advocate of Black rights, although critics said he preached racism and violence.

He was gunned down during a public speaking appearance in New York in February 1965.

When contacted Sunday by AFP, a spokesman for the Manhattan district attorney said the office's "review" of the case is "active and ongoing."

During the press conference, a letter written by former New York police officer Raymond Wood, now deceased, was read out, in which he accused the NYPD and FBI of being complicit in the killing.

According to his cousin, Wood, who was Black and worked as an undercover operative,

was Black and worked as an undercover operative, claimed to have approached Malcolm X's entourage on orders from his higher-ups.

Wood said he set up two of the activist's bodyguards, who were arrested only a few days before the murder.

On February 21, 1965 – 55 years ago to the day – El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz, Malcolm X's Muslim name, sans the two bodyguards, was shot dead by three gunmen as he prepared to give a speech in the Audubon Ballroom, a theater in Harlem, in the north of Manhattan.

Wood, who did not want his testimony to become public until after his death, maintained that the New York police department and the FBI kept certain aspects of the case secret.

The NYPD "remains committed to assist with that review in any way," a spokesperson said. The FBI's New York office did not respond to AFP's request for comment.



# More rallies despite Myanmar junta's warning

**MYANMAR:** The Myanmar junta warned anti-coup protesters they could die but thousands of people took to the streets again on Monday, with tensions soaring over the deaths of four demonstrators.

Much of Myanmar has been in uproar over the generals ousting and detaining civilian leader Aung San Suu Kyi three weeks

Massive street demonstrations have taken place across the country, while a civil disobedience campaign has choked many government operations as well as

"Protesters are now inciting the people, especially emotional teenagers and youths, to a confrontation path where they will suffer the loss of life," said a statement on state-run broadcaster MRTV on Sunday.

The statement, read out in Burmese with text of the English version on the screen, cautioned protesters against inciting "riot and anarchy".

deadliest weekend since the coup -- two people were killed when Security Forces fired at protesters in the city of Mandalay, and a third man was shot dead in Yangon.

A young woman Mya Thwe Thwe Khaing who was shot in the head just before her 20th birthday died on Friday, the first of at least three people to die in the protests. The woman spent almost a fortnight on life sup-

On Sunday, thousands lined the streets to honour her, some making the three-fingered salutes used by demonstrators.

United Nations special rapporteur Tom Andrews said he was deeply concerned by the junta's new threat.

"Warning to the junta: Unlike 1988, actions by Security Forces are being recorded & you will be held accountable," he tweeted.

But protesters appeared undeterred Monday, with thousands gathering in two neighbour- responded to the uprising by

The warning followed the hoods of Yangon, Myanmar's biggest city and commercial hub.

"We came out today to join in the protest, to fight until we win," said Kyaw Kyaw, a 23-yearold university student.

"We are worried about the crackdown, but we will move forward. We are so angry."

# FOUR EBOLA DEATHS IN DR CONGO

**DR CONGO:** Four people have died from Ebola during a new outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo, where people are resisting measures to contain the disease, officials said Sunday.


Since the epidemic's resurgence this month, "we have already registered six Ebola cases. We have lost four infected people," Doctor Eugene Syalita, the provincial health minister in North Kivu province in the DRC's northeast, told

Syalita said one person died Friday and another on Saturday, while the two others died at the beginning of the month.

Two patients are receiving care at an Ebola treatment centre in Katwa,

he added. Syalita complained that the region's residents were not taking the new outbreak seriously enough.

"Some families categorically refuse to have their homes disin-



fected or to hold dignified and safe funerals," the doctor said.

The tenth epidemic, which was declared on August 1 2018, was only eradicated on June 25 last year because of unrest caused by armed groups and the population's resist-

ance to anti-Ebola measures. With more than 2,200 deaths recorded, it is considered the most serious in the history of Ebola in the DRC since its appearance in 1976.

The Ebola virus is transmitted to people through infected animals. Human transmission is through bodily fluids with the main symptoms being fevers, vomiting, bleeding and diarrhoea. Ebola has also resurfaced in Guinea, where it has already killed five people. - AFP

# Israelis clean beaches after massive tar pollution

**ISRAEL:** Israeli authorities on Sunday warned people to keep away from the country's Mediterranean shore to avoid massive tar pollution, as thousands of labourers and volunteers worked to clean contaminated beaches.

Powerful winds and unusually high waves pummelled Israel's entire Mediterranean coastline over Tuesday and Wednesday, with tonnes of tar staining 160 kilometres (96 miles) of beaches from Rosh Hanikra, just south of Lebanon, Ashkelon just north

# Message from H.E. Sugiyama Akira, Ambassador of Japan to Sri Lanka on the Occasion of the 61<sup>st</sup> Birthday of His Majesty the Emperor

Good afternoon, Ayubowan, Wanakkam and Konnichiwa. Upon this most auspicious occasion of the 61st Birthday of His Majesty the Emperor, it is my sincere wish to convey my warmest greetings to the Government and people of Sri Lanka as well as to the Japanese compatriots in Sri Lanka, and with the blessings of many good friends, I take areat honour in offering my sincere prayer for the health, happiness, and prosperity of His Majesty, together with my best wishes for our everlasting friendship between Japan and Sri Lanka.

The year 2021 marks an important juncture in the history of our valued diplomatic relationship.70 years ago, in 1951, the first bud of our long-cherished friendship began to sprout in the San Francisco Peace Conference, in which the representative of the then Ceylon, His Excellency J.R. Jayawardene, made an ever -memorable speech on September 6th, paving the way for Japan to recover her status in the international community after World War II. Today, that precious bud grew into a firm and robust tree, standing as a testimony to the time-tested friendship that endured through thick and thin for the past 70 years.

The current global pandemic of COVID-19, for Japan and Sri Lanka, presents another circumstance to rise to the occasion, further bolstering the spirit of solidarity with mutual trust and respect in the face of unprecedented challenges. To my honour, Japan's assistance to Sri Lanka in our joint combat against COVID-19 stretches over wideranging areas, in total sum of USD 9.6 million, including essential support for children and expectant women,

welfare of repatriated Sri Lankan nationals, awareness campaign on health and sanitation, strengthening quarantine facilities as well as providing medical equipment and technical assistance to frontline health workers.

Such various supports, on the other hand, are, in fact, a symbolic reflection of Japan's deep appreciation for the vigorous solidarity expressed by our Sri Lankan friends during the pall of the Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami which will mark the 10th anniversary on the 11th of March this year. In order to alleviate our suffering, Sri Lanka sent a disaster relief team, comprising 15 officials from the Ministry of Disaster Management, and donated USD 1 million and 3 million tea bags, sealed and delivered with encouragement. The sympathy and fraternity expressed to our people throughout our hours of darkness were received with ever-lasting thankfulness – etched deeply in our abiding memory. Trials of afflictions, for Japan and Sri Lanka, could not be the source of weakness but must be that of strength.

Sharing the common geographical attributes of being a continental island in the Pacific Ocean and the Indian Ocean respectively, Japan and Sri Lanka are tightly united by shared oceanic interests and experiences, making each

other a natural maritime partner in the Indo-Pacific Region. Our prosperity and welfare rest upon the blessings of the sea, the imperatives of which has figured in the wisdom of promoting freedom of navigation and a rule-based maritime order for the peace and prosperity of the region, which would benefit all the countries, littoral and non-littoral alike. Japan has been making a determined effort to foster Indo-Pacific to be "Global Commons" or "International Public Goods", which is a holding pillar of a Free and Open Indo-Pacific FOIP in short. As is evident from its appellation, FOIP is an inclusive vision open to all countries that share its basic principles, and under this vision, Japan aspires to further consolidate maritime cooperation with Sri Lanka, which is an important partner located at the strategic position on the east-west sea lanes—and that at the very heart of the Indian Ocean.

To date, Japan and Sri Lanka have made steady progress in this area of crucial importance, which has culminated in; a)granting two new patrol vessels to the Sri Lanka Coast Guard, b)extending technical assistance for improving oil spill management to the Sri Lanka Coast Guard, and, c) supporting VBSS (Visit, Board, Search and Seizure) Training Courses conducted by UNODC with close support of the Sri Lanka Navy, to tackle the mounting challenge of illegal drug trafficking plaguing the regions, among others. The said patrol vessels also played an active role in contributing to the joint effort carried out by Sri Lanka and India in successfully extinguishing the fire that broke out on a distressed oil tanker steering off the coast of Sri Lanka last September.

The Government of Sri Lanka and the Sri Lanka Navy have also been facilitating port calls by Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF) vessels, even amidst of the challenging circumstances caused by the COVID-19. Over the last one year, from January 2020 to February 2021, fifteen JMSDF vessels have made port calls at the ports in Sri Lanka. The visit by KAGA, one of the biggest ships of the JMSDF, particularly highlighted the long-time friendly relationship between the JMSDF and the Sri Lanka Navy through conducting joint bilateral exercise successfully.

The grand design of FOIP envisages creating new dynamism by combining "Two Oceans", that is the Indian Ocean and the Pacific Ocean, and "Two Continents" that is Asia and Africa, by, for one, enhancing connectivity through "Quality Infrastructure" development. The "Quality Infrastructure" is a concept originally launched by the Government of Japan, which attaches particular emphasis on; a) open access, b) transparency, c) economic efficiency including life-cycle cost, and, d) financial viability

In the context of Sri Lanka, the new initiatives have culminated in wide-ranging projects, such as: the Bandaranaike International Airport Development Project (Phase 2) and the New Bridge Construction Project over the Kelani River, among others.

Japan, as a long-time development partner, has committed to assisting the socio-economic development of Sri Lanka in response to the genuine needs of Sri Lankan people. As recent studies have shown, Japan's development assistance to Sri Lanka is characterized by; a) high concessionality, b) lower project cost, c) competitive procurement procedure, and, d)high productivity to the economy, which render positive impact to Sri Lanka's GDP and industrial output growth. The "Vistas of Prosperity and Splendor" a peopleoriented, highly insightful manifesto of His Excellency the President Gotabaya Rajapaksa gives special attention to the development of agricultural sector and water resource upliftment – the foundation of governance that, to the best of my knowledge, stems deeply from the ancient statecraft of Taprobane .I am pleased to note that Japan has been extending active support in the respective areas. The most recent achievement in the agricultural sector is "Establishment of Research and Training Complex" at the Faculty of Agriculture, University of Jaffna, which was inaugurated on February 5th. Ongoing projects in the water supply sector are "Anuradhapura North Water Supply Project" and "Kalu Ganga Water Supply Expansion Project (I)". Prime Minister Suga Yoshihide, in his letter commemorating Sri Lanka's 73rd Independence Day, also expressed Japan's categorical support to realize the aspirations envisaged in the "Vistas of Prosperity and Splendor".

# The New Beginning: Exchange of Renewed Commitments

Japan and Sri Lanka have maintained long-standing cordial relations over the decades. Leaders of both countries have always worked with unstinted commitment and mutual respect to further strengthen our bilateral relationship since the two countries established diplomatic ties in 1952.Upon swearing in of the Hon. Mahinda Rajapaksa as the Prime Minister of Sri Lanka in August 2020, the then Hon. Prime Minister of Japan Abe Shinzo sent a congratulatory message to Prime Minister Rajapaksa, reiterating his commitment to strengthening the long-standing friendship between the two countries in the years to come. This commitment was further reiterated through a reciprocal congratulatory message from Hon. Mahinda Rajapaksa to Suga Yoshihide, the incumbent Hon. Prime Minister of Japan, which accentuated Sri Lanka's readiness to further cement the already existing ties.

These commitments at the highest level clearly indicates that the two countries' diplomatic relations, which will mark the 70th Anniversary next year, will continue to grow from strength to strength in the many decades to come.

#### The Second Japan-Sri Lanka Senior Official Level Policy Dialogue

As part of such efforts, the Second Japan-Sri Lanka Senior Official Level Policy Dialogue was held in an online formaton10th February 2021, for the first time in 5 years. During the dialogue, the two sides discussed the regional situation surrounding the two countries and the bilateral cooperation in political and economic areas, and shared the view that Japan and Sri Lanka would continue working together as partners toward a free and open Indo-Pacific.

#### **Maritime Cooperation**

 "The Fourth Sri Lanka - Japan Dialogue on Maritime Security, Safety and Oceanic Issues" On 1st October 2020, "the Fourth Sri Lanka - Japan Dialogue on Maritime Security, Safety and Oceanic Issues" was held on the virtual platform. Both sides agreed to further promote bilateral and multilateral cooperation in the maritime security and the



quality infrastructure development in order to realize a rule-based free and open Indo-Pacific.

2. Pathfinder Indian Ocean Security Conference 2020 On 10th-12thNovember 2020, a three-day on-line conference was organized by the Pathfinder Foundation to discuss Indian Ocean Security, co-sponsored by Japan and the US. Ambassador Sugiyama stressed the importance of realizing a Free and Open Indo Pacific (FOIP) with the Indo-Pacific Oceans as "Global Commons", while appreciating the Pathfinder Foundation for creating a conducive atmosphere for building confidence among different stakeholders.

3. Port Calls by Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF) ships
Since March 2009, the Japan Ministry of Defense and the Self Defense Force (SDF), in accordance

Since March 2009, the Japan Ministry of Defense and the Self Defense Force (SDF), in accordance with the Government of Japan's policy, have continued anti-piracy operations off the Coast of Somalia and in the Gulf of Aden by dispatching the JMSDF ships and aircrafts (P-3Cs.).In Addition, in February 2020, Japan commenced information gathering operations for ensuring the safety of Japan-affiliated vessels in the Middle East by one JMSDF ship and two P-3Cs.

The Government of Sri Lanka and the Sri Lankan Navy have facilitated port calls to Sri Lankan ports (Colombo, Hambantota and Trincomalee) by those JMSDF ships so that the JMSDF can continue the said operations seamlessly even amidst the challenging circumstances caused by the COVID-

Fifteen JMSDF ships (14 port calls) have visited Sri Lankan ports from January 2020 to February 2021(One ship is scheduled to make its port call from 23rd - 24th February.). The visit by KAGA, one of the biggest ships of the JMSDF, on 23rd - 24thSeptember 2020, showcased the long-time friendly relationship between the JMSDF and the Sri Lankan Navy through joint bilateral exercises.

While development assistance and business relations have admittedly elevated our bilateral relationship to a new height, the mainspring has been, and will remain to be, the people-to-people contacts at all levels. Long before the dawn of the establishment of our diplomatic relationship, Srimath Anagarika Dharmapala, one of the leading makers of modern Buddhism, had pioneered connecting our hearts and souls by deepening mutual understanding through the common faith of Buddhism, and had kindled the first warmth of friendship during his first visit to Japan in the late 19th century.

Terming Japan as a "beacon light to Asia", Dharmapala not only promoted spiritual interactions between the two countries but also encouraged his devout followers to learn industrial art, such as weaving, from Japan - while admiring Japanese people's practical wisdom and advanced knowledge in technical science. The new path thus broken by Dharmapala was well beaten by the following generations, turning it into a myriad of bridges that connect the hearts of the two peoples today. The undercurrent of mutual attraction, further strengthened by the shared rich Buddhist heritages, can, by no means, be affected by the prevailing scourge of COVID-19. Though the people-to-people contacts between Japan and Sri Lanka, including tourism, suffered sharp fall in 2020, I do believe it will bounce back with renewed zeal once we redeem the life of normalcy. The Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games will be held in coming summer as proof that humanity has defeated the pandemic of COVID-19. It is expected to further propel people-to-people exchanges to a greater extent. Three registered host towns, Sanmu, Hashima and Maebashi, will receive the Sri Lankan athletes with open arms, and are preparing to make this "global festival of peace" shared memories for both Japan and Sri Lanka.

In recent years, fresh breeze is beginning to blow from the new generations, especially young women. We have come to know a young female gymnast dedicating herself to rigorous training in Tokyo, while living all by herself, aspiring to represent Sri Lanka in the Tokyo Olympic Games. We also know that majority of young learners of Japanese language are female students, who symbolize the "precious buds" in the great tree of friendship, as I described earlier, to one day, spearhead the new frontiers of our bilateral relationship. This year, in the New Year's video message, His Majesty the Emperor offered faithful prayer for tranquility, happiness and peace of the people of Japan and the world, while stating that humanity in the past have overcome great trials, such as numerous pandemics and natural disasters, each time with unwearied spirit of solidarity and perseverance. Keeping in mind the virtuous thoughts of His Majesty, I would like to renew, with all the might of my ability, my commitment to further consolidating our time-honoured friendship in the years to come.

Japanese investors have shown keen interest in Sri Lanka, in view of its geographical location as the hub of the east-west shipping route in the Indian Ocean; its proximity to the rapidly growing Indian Subcontinent and neighboring regions; its strong workforce with diligence and high-level education. Presently more than 70 Japanese companies affiliated with the Japan Chamber of Commerce and

Industry (JCCI) are doing business in Sri Lanka, making a substantial contribution to Sri Lanka's economy through creating employment, generating exports, transferring Japanese technology and introducing efficient work ethics to Sri Lanka.

Motegi Toshimitsu, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan, during his official visit to Sri Lanka in December 2019, expressed his eagerness to promote Japanese investment in Sri Lanka, including in the area of high-tech industry, while making the most of the "Japan-Sri Lanka Investment Promotion Roadmap" to which the Government of Sri Lanka responded with equal eagerness by extending cordial invitation to the Japanese business community to invest in high- tech assembly plants, tech parks and investment zones.

# Japan's development cooperation toward Sri Lanka

Japan has been a strong leading partner for Sri Lanka in advancing its overall socio-economic development, improving quality of life for the people, and enhancing national reconciliation. The partnership dates back to 1954 when Japan became a member of the Colombo Plan, an international organization based in Colombo, and initiated Japan's Official Development Assistance (ODA) to developing countries including Sri Lanka.

Japan provided Sri Lanka with development assistance equivalent to 1,445 billion Japanese

A seminar on "Quality Infrastructure" commemorating the "International Cooperation Day"



On 6th October 2020, a seminar on "Quality Infrastructure" was organized by the Embassy of Japan, with the participation of three prominent economists of Sri Lanka. Prof. W.D. Lakshman, the Governor of Central Bank, graced the occasion as a keynote speaker

October 6th is Japan's "International Cooperation Day", which marks the day when Japan decided to join the "Colombo Plan" on the same day in 1954, while setting a new course for Japan to redefine her role as a major development partner in the international community. The seminar was held in memory of the founding principles of the Colombo Plan, which are deeply rooted in the spirit of mutual cooperation and compassion.

Yen (Approximately Rs. 2,630 billion) since 1965 as of the end of Japanese fiscal year of 2018, in the form of grants, Yen loans and technical cooperation mainly by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). Japan's assistance to Sri Lanka ranges from large-scale infrastructure development to community development at the grassroots level together with human resources development. The construction of Southern Expressway, Baseline Road in Colombo, Upper Kotmale Hydro-electric Power, Sri Jayewardenepura, Anuradhapura and Jaffna hospitals and the expansion of the Colombo Port are a few examples of Japanese assisted projects. In addition, Project for Construction of New Bridge over the Kelani River, Bandaranaike International Airport Development Project and Anuradhapura North Water Supply Project are among currently ongoing projects.

The Government of Japan's assistance is based on its Country Development Cooperation Policy for Sri Lanka, which aligns with Sri Lanka's policies and long-term development needs. Based on the principle of "promoting high quality and inclusive growth", the Government of Japan gives priority to the following three areas:

#### (1) "Promoting quality growth"

In order to help Sri Lanka achieve quality growth, the Government of Japan actively supports infrastructure development in sectors such as transportation, energy, water supply and sewerage, eyeing utilization of Japan's advanced technology, both in hardware (physical) and software (institutional).

# (2) "Development cooperation for inclusive growth"

Reducing regional and individual disparities has been major challenges for Sri Lanka. Japan is, therefore, committed to support development of industries and human resources especially in the conflict-affected areas with focus on agriculture, improvement of basic infrastructure that contributes directly

Leading Demining Operations in the Conflict Affected Areas



Japan is recognized as a leading donor in supporting demining operations in the conflict affected areas. Since 2002, Japan has provided US\$ 38.8 million (approximately Rs. 7.47 billion) for demining activities in the Northern and the Eastern Provinces under its "Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP)" administered by the Embassy of Japan.

to people's lives and industrial activities, and women's economic empowerment, in order to improve livelihoods of the people in these areas.

#### (3) "Mitigating Vulnerability"

Sri Lanka, being an island nation like Japan, is vulnerable to natural disasters such as flood caused by the seasonal monsoons. It is also vulnerable in social services due to the delay in establishing its service delivery system. To mitigate the vulnerability, Japan has been providing physical and institutional assistance to develop and strengthen Sri Lankan government's capacity for tackling natural disaster as well as global issue of climate change. Japan has also extended assistance to improve social services, including medical and health services. At the time of the Indian Ocean earthquake and tsunami in 2004, the Government of Japan immediately dispatched

Japanese Grant Aid for Human Resources Development Scholarship (JDS) Programme



Japanese Grant Aid for Human Resources Development Scholarship (JDS) Programme offers public officers opportunities to study at post-graduate courses in Japan in order to develop their expertise. Since its commencement in FY2010 up to FY2019, 154 officials has completed Masters degree in Japan, while Japan started to provide two officials every year with the opportunity to study at Doctorial courses in Japan from FY2019.

a Disaster Relief Team to be followed by various support in both tangible and intangible ways, including rehabilitation of bridges and mental health care for the affected people.

One of the most remarkable features of Japan's assistance is people-centered development. Capacity building through technical cooperation is a key for achieving sustainable development goals. As of Fiscal Year 2019, over 13,827 Sri Lankans were provided trainings, while 1,148 JICA Volunteers and 3,065 Japanese experts were dispatched to Sri Lanka cumulatively. Japan has a scheme called "Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP)", which extends assistance to grassroots projects mostly through local NGOs in the areas of education, agriculture, water supply, and demining, among others. Through the GGP, the Embassy of Japan provided assistance for nearly 300 projects (US\$ 50 million) from 1989 to 2020.

Solidarity and Assistance in the Joint Combat against COVID-19




The Government of Japan has provided approximately US\$ 9.6 million grant assistance for Sri Lanka's COVID-19 response. Japan's assistance covers wide-ranging areas, including providing critical medical equipment to COVID-19 treatment hospitals and frontline health workers, strengthening quarantine facilities at BIA, renovating hospitals for children and women, supporting repatriated Sri Lankan nationals, and assisting public awareness campaign on health and sanitation. In addition, Japan has pledged US\$ 200 million to the Gavi COVAX Advance Market Commitment (AMC) to support global access to COVID-19 vaccines.

# ICRA predicts 3.6% growth for 2021

# Inflation to remain within target

ICRA Lanka expects the economic growth of Sri Lanka to be around 3.6% in 2021 and hover around 4% for the next four years thereafter.

"In addition, our estimates indicate industry, services, and agricultural sectors to have contracted by 7.3%, 1.7% and 1.3% respectively." According to ICRA Lanka Economy Highlights – February -2020.

Economies of most of Sri Lanka's key trading partners will not return to the pre-crisis level in 2021. Therefore, ICRA Lanka does not expect the export sector to normalize in 2021.

As per ICRA Lanka's estimates, the total revenue and grants of the government have plummeted by nearly 28% in 2020, while total expenditure records a marginal increase. As a result, the fiscal

deficit may have widened by over 63%. In this context, ICRA Lanka expects the total public debt to have reached 97.4% in 2020.

"Unlike exports, imports are clipped by the import restrictions. Therefore, imports are expected to be more or less flat throughout 2021. But we believe it is likely that the government may ultimately be compelled to relax the

restrictions, at least partially, in 4Q. Nevertheless, ICRA Lanka says the import restrictions would increase the trade deficit to about 6.1% of the GDP while generating a current account surplus of about 0.5% of the GDP.

Foreign currency obligations for 2021 is just over USD 6 Bn. This includes the settlement of USD 1 Bn ISB maturing in July. We expect the GoSL to rollover

about USD 2 Bn existing obligations, borrow about USD 2.3 Bn of which USD 2 Bn may come from a bilateral arrangement with China. In addition, FDIs may remain low around USD 200 Mn. As per ICRA Lanka's projections, with the positive current account balance and additional forex borrowings, the total reserves would fall to USD 3.7 Bn by the end of 2021."

On the fiscal front, ICRA Lanka expects the government revenue to gradually return to normalcy by the 2H. The expenditure side of the government may expand at a steady pace throughout 2021. "According to our projections, the budget deficit would reach 10.8% of the GDP in 2021. The government's fiscal policy is also now closely aligned with Modern Monetary Theory (MMT).

The strong performance of the ASPI in 2021 has also frequently placed the ASPI among the best performing primary indices in the world. The S&P SL 20 Index, which includes the 20 largest and most liquid stocks has also indicated double-digit YTD returns over the same period,

The All Share Price Index (ASPI), the imary index of the Colombo Stock schange (CSE) tracking the price overments of all shares listed on the and at present indicates YTD returns of 14.85%. The ASPI and S&P SL 20 closed trading today on 7,597.51 and 3,029.79 respectively.

The ASPI recorded its highest YTD growth of 30.08% on 27January, while the S&P SL 20 Index recorded its highest YTD growth of 33.21% on 29 January.

The stock market has attracted a record-breaking level of trading activity and interest during the first two months of 2021. The daily average turnover figure, which averages the total turnover figure recorded over a particular year over the number of market days, is presently at Rs.8.3 billion, 6.3 times more than the Rs. 1.3 billion recorded at the same point in 2020 in terms of the number of market days.

The total turnover of Rs.275 billion recorded so far this year is already higher than the full-year figures recorded in 2012, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.

Nevertheless, the demand for credit did not pick up as anticipated due to prevailing uncertainty. As a result, the Bank's interest income declined by 10% YoY to Rs 103.9 Bn.

The outstanding growth of approx. Rs 99 Bn in CASA deposits during the year coupled with low interest rates eased pressure on interest costs to a certain extent. However, Net Interest Income of the Bank dropped by 9% YoY to Rs 44.7 Bn. Net fee income declined more steeply by 16% YoY to Rs 7.5 Bn as Import restrictions, depressed demand in export markets ect.

The removal of debt repayment levy and NBT proved to be timely as the banking sector stepped into support the economic reviv-

The Bank's asset base expanded by Rs 167 Bn to Rs 1.3 trillion while the loan book recorded a moderate growth of 5.5%,

Insurance and Investment Banking led contributions from subsidiaries as the HNB Group made Profit Before Taxes of Rs 17.6 Bn.

# Pakistan, Sri Lanka to revive trade talks

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Sri Lanka have agreed to reactivate the Joint Working Group (JWG) for redressal of technical issues pending between the two trading partners, the Ministry of Commerce (MoC) said on Saturday.

The understanding was reached during the seventh session of commerce secretaries level talks between the two countries. The virtual meeting was held on Feb 18, ahead of Prime Minister Imran Khan's visit to Sri Lanka on Feb 23-24.

The delegates engaged in productive and meaningful discussions on strengthening trade ties and resolving issues impeding trade. Prospects of enhancing trade through mutual cooperation and facilitation were also discussed, the MoC announcement said.

The secretaries emphasised on the need to use this forum to further strengthen the existing bilateral trade and investment linkages and expressed their commitment to enhance trade relations by removing various impediments.

There was an era when the game of rugby football was listed as one of the prominent sports in the country, with schools engaged in handling the oval shaped ball producing some outstanding players who had the distinction of making their 'Alma Mater' proud. Thushara Jayalath was one of them who represented St. Peter's College, Colombo, with a sound academic and sporting career and ended up by donning the National jersey.

Thushara who is in 50's hails from a family that had no previous involvement in sports. He was not actively encouraged to pursue or participate in sporting activities. However, as an over-enthusiastic child, he often found much joy in participating in a wide range of sports. His father was a civil servant, and mother was a housewife. His illustrious academic career was at St Peter's College, Colombo, where he joined his first sports discipline, which was basketball and played as a Centre forward.

While being a member of the team, he succeeded in winning the under-19 schools Basketball Championship in 1987, under the coaching of Ajith Kuruppu, one of the renowned basketball coaches in Sri Lanka. During that year, he also went on a tour of Maldives winning the 'Ali Jinnah Trophy'. The year 1988 was another productive year for him where he managed to clinch the title by defeating Dharmasoka Ambalangoda in the finals with a score of 53-46, That team was coached by Sohan Wimalaratne (a past Peterite and National Basketball player). While he was dribbling

the ball for his college basketball team, he was selected for the National schools team. Gradually maturing as a sportsman, he had shown interest in rugby, often playing tag rugby with his friends for fun. Two of his close friends in school-Manoj Bakshani and Harin Perera motivated him to take up rugby, where he finally wore the College jersey representing the school under-19 rugby team in 1989 under the captaincy of Colin Denish. While concentrating on studies, the rugby team was coached by a former rugby referee and coach, S.W. Chang. Under his watchful eyes and guidance, he was able to hone his rugby skills and improvise his techniques, which led the way to a long and successful career in rugby.

While competing in school rugby, he had an opportunity to join the

career came to an end. In 1990, he completed his Advanced Level examination and joined Peterson Rugby Club. During his tenure as a player Petersons went on to win many matches by overcoming several big names in the fray in that era.

Subsequently, in 1991 he rejoined Havelocks and played until 1998 occupying the position of second row forward. Premadasa Trophy Final which they lost to CH. In 1995, he was entrusted as the captain of Havelocks under Ana Saranapala's coaching. In1996, he was a part of the rugby team representing Sri Lanka in the Asian Rugby Football Tournament led by Priyantha Ekanayake. In 1997, he was selected to represent Asian Barbari-Havelocks under-20 Rugby Squad in ans along with Priyantha Ekanayake

he represented the winning team in Asian Quadrangular Tournament under Priyantha Ekanayke's leader-

During the 2000 rugby season, Nazeem Mohamed (the captain of CH) suffered an injury which sidelined him until the end of the season. During his absence, he was made a makeshift captain until Nazim returned after recovery. After leading the Gymkhana club in two matches, he decided to step down from that position feeling uncomfortable due to various reasons.

One of the achievements at CH was winning the Caltex Rugby League in 2000, which was one of the fondest memories of his rugby career whilst demonstrating his rugby skills. In 2000, he represented the Sri Lanka team in Japan under the coaching of Nimal Lewke. In his illustrious rugby career, he was extremely fortunate to be associated with some of the best

# When Ranatunga masterminded first ever 300-plus ODI chase

Batting great Arjuna Ranatunga may be synonymous with Sri Lanka's 1996 Cricket World Cup triumph over Australia at the Gaddafi Stadium in Lahore, Pakistan.

But it was four years ago in 1992, exactly 29 vears from now, on February 23 that this stocky lefthander gave a glimpse of his potential with a brilliant batting performance against Zimbabwe.

Sri Lanka were heading for a humiliating World Cup defeat in their opening match of the tournament against the minnows as Zimbabwe rattled a massive 312 for four wickets in 50 overs at New Plymouth, New Zealand.

In fact, Zimbabwe always had this habit of creating upsets and producing surprises against some of the more fancied opponents in every World Cup they had participated.

In 1983, they edged out Australia by 13 runs and in the next World Cup they almost had the better of New Zealand.

Another major upset was on the cards in 1992 against Sri Lanka as Man-



of-the-Match and opening batsman Andy Flower struck an unbeaten 115 on his debut with the help of one six and eight bounda-

Andy Waller batting at number six then hammered the Sri Lankan bowling to all parts of the ground with a swashbuckling 83 not out from 45

His unbroken partnership with Flower was worth 145 runs as Zimbabwe set Sri Lanka a daunting task of scoring over 300 runs in the second innings of a match for the

first time in the history. No doubt, in the modern era, scoring over 300 runs in a One Day International (ODI) may be a common scenario but down the lane, 29 years ago it was a tough ask for any top team.

The openers Athula Samarasekera and Roshan Mahanama took the Lankans off to a flying start while putting on 128 runs with both completing half centuries.

However, Sri Lanka lost the key wickets of Skipper Aravinda de Silva and

Asanka Gurusinha cheaply and their chances of winning looked almost bleak when they collapsed to 212 for five wickets by the 39th over.

But the situation was tailor-made for Ranatunga who scored more than a unbeaten on 88 inclusive of one six and nine bound-

The feature of his batting was the manner in which he handled the pressure situation and was not prepared to throw his wicket away despite the asking-rate had climbed to nearly 10 runs per over.

The elegant left-hander gave a classic example of playing under pressure as he found the gaps beautifully and hit the boundaries regularly without ever resorting to slogging.

The other significant fact was how he shielded the lower batting order and fittingly, Ranatunga hit the winning runs with four balls to spare in an amazing game that produced the second-highest ODI match aggregate at that time.

Jazz is my inspiration. Pop is my expression of that inspiration. I create music in many genres. Most of my songs these days are EDM and Pop since the charts dictate that. I released a Country Rock love song just a few weeks ago though as well. There is a jazz-funk song I wrote and produced called 'Purple People' where I play each and every instrument. • During your music career, what's the moment you had up to now?

Again, I am grateful to have so many of them. I was fortunate to be invited to the The Beatles reunion in Los Angeles. It was organized by the Grammys, and held the day after the Grammy awards. As a pop songwriter I am a Beatles fan and have always considered John Lennon & Paul McCartney as one of my main influences. At the reunion Sir Paul McCartney & Sir Ringo Starr performed the hits together and that was a very unique moment to see The Beatles back together again. They were also given an amazing tribute by Stevie Wonder, Ed Sheeran, John Legend and a host of A-List celebrities. It was awesome to be among that legendary gathering of talent.

What are your • thoughts on the local music scene and what can we do to make a mark on the international music scene?

Local listenership is key. I think Lankan audiences need to start supporting Lankan talent. That needs improvement here. Also the music scene needs to progress into an industry as a whole, which means better structure and systems in place to ensure artists have the same opportunities like in other industries. Everything from copy rights management, licensing, royalty payments, fair airtime on radio and the list goes on. These are essential.

What do you think • are the similarities • you see in being a corporate professional and a musician?

It depends on what you want from each profession. In my case, I want the best in both, so for me both require the utmost dedication, passion to the craft, endurance, discipline and perseverance more than anything. Both are very demanding.

Who would you like • to thank for your • journey thus far?

First and foremost God for all the blessings, my parents and also my grand parents. Last but not least my mentors in Los Angeles and London who have supported my creative vision throughout.

What are your future plans?

CHRISTCHURCH, MONDAY: A Devon Conway batting masterclass inspired New Zealand to a 53-run win over Australia in the opening Twenty20 international in Christchurch on Monday.

Conway smashed an unbeaten 99 off 59 balls as the Black Caps overcame a shaky start to finish on 184 for five after losing the toss and being put in to bat. In reply, the tourists were all out

for 131 after 17.3 overs, with Black Caps spinner Ish Sodhi taking four wickets for 28 to give the hosts an early edge in the five-match series. Australia captain Aaron Finch

refused to blame the loss on his team's two-week Covid-19 quarantine upon arrival in New Zealand. "It feels like a long time since we

played but we were treated brilliantly (in quarantine)," he said. "They just ran harder and we

didn't get it right." Jhye Richardson, fresh from signing a multi-million dollar Indian Premier League contract, was the pick of the Australian bowlers, taking

two for 31. But the tourists could not dislodge Conway, whose 59-ball knock included 10 fours and three sixes, helping the Black Caps bounce back from 19 for three. Conway said he was "pretty
