In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bith, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

HEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by section 6 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred,

(a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and

(b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such periods have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and

(c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the said last-mentioned Ordinance-have become vested in the Crown,—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder-mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times hereinbefore recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest, as from and after the 15th day of December; 1897.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-seven.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

HEREAS by section 122 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," as amended by subsection 4 of section 20 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, it is enacted that it shall be lawful to the Municipal Council from time to time to make by laws not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Ordinance, for any of the purposes in the said sections set forth and provided:

And whereas by section 124 of the said first-mentioned Ordinance it is enacted that no by-law, or alteration, amendment, or cancelment of, or substitution for, any by-law shall have effect until the same is confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, and that notice of such confirmation shall be given by Proclamation to be made in that behalf; and that such by-laws when so confirmed and published in the Government Gazette shall be as valid and effectual as if they had been in the said Ordinance enacted:

And whereas the by-laws set forth in the schedule hereto have been made by the Municipal Council of Colombo under the provisions of section 122 aforesaid of the said first-mentioned Ordinance, as amended by sub-section 4 of section 20 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, and the same have under section 124 of the said first-mentioned Ordinance been confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim that the by-laws set forth in the schedule hereto have been confirmed by Us in Executive Council, and shall have effect as from and after the 1st day of January, 1898.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws relating to the Removal and Disposal of Night Soil.

- 1. It shall be lawful for the Chairman at any time by notice in writing to require the owner or occupier of any house, outhouse, building, enclosure, or premises within the limits of the Municipality to remove or cause to be removed the contents of any privy, pit, or water-closet in or belonging to such house, outhouse, building, enclosure, or premises, to such place or places and within such time as shall be set forth in the said notice. Should such owner or occupier fail to comply with the requirements of such notice, the Chairman may cause the work to be done, and for that purpose shall have power to enter into and upon any such house, outhouse, building, enclosure, or premises, with such labourers, implements, and things as may be required; and the expenses incurred shall be paid by the owner or occupier, and shall be ascertained and determined and recovered in the manner provided by sections 281 and 282 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," as if the same were expenses directed to be paid by the said Ordinance.
- 2: No person shall without a license under the hand of the Chairman, the burden of proving which shall lie upon such person, bury or cause to be buried the contents of any latrine, privy, pit, or water-closet within any house, outhouse, building, or premises, or in or on any land, well, pond, lake, canal, stream, water-course, drain, or sewer, and the decision of the Chairman refusing or granting such license shall be liable to revision by the Municipal Council.
- 3. The owner or occupier of any house or land within the Municipality who is desirous of removing, or who has been required as provided in by-law 1 of the Municipal Council of Colombo, confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council on the 18th day of March, 1894, to remove the contents of any privy, pit, or water-closet on the said house or land, shall give notice to the Chairman of the time at which he intends to have the work done, upon which the Chairman shall grant a permit to such owner or occupier to have the work done, and upon such terms and conditions as shall be stated in such permit, by a person licensed as provided for in by-law No. 1; and no such owner or occupier shall employ on such work persons other than those so licensed.
- 4. No person carrying night soil through the street shall loiter or deposit any vessel containing or intended to contain night soil on or by the side of any public road or street.
- 5. No person in charge of a cart: wagon, or carriage used for the purpose of receiving and removing night soil, sewage, or other matter from any cesspool, privy, or receptacle shall suffer such cart, wagon, or carriage to stand or remain in any public street, passage, highway, or thoroughfare for any longer time than shall be necessary for the loading thereof.
- 6. No person shall dig or cause to be dug within his premises any pit or excavation for storing offensive matter therein without the permission in writing of the Chairman.
- 7. The night soil in every house, building, land, and tenement assessed for Municipal rates in which the dry-earth system of disposing of night soil is in use shall be removed or caused to be removed from such house; building, land, or tenements at least once a day by the person bound so to do, unless such house, building, land, or tenement is exempted by writing under the hand of the Chairman from the operation of this by-law. The person bound so to do shall be, in the case of any such house, building, land, or tenement comprising more than one dwelling or occupied by more than one household under separate contracts of tenancy, the owner of such house, building, land, or tenement as defined in section 3 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887; and in the case of any other house, building, land, or tenement, the occupier thereof.

building, land, or tenement, the occupier thereof.

In case of a dispute arising between the owner and the occupier of any such house, building, land, or tenement, as to which of them is the person so bound, the decision of the Chairman shall be final.

- 8. Such person shall employ for the purpose of such removal from his premises either an officer of the Municipal Council duly authorized by the Chairman or the holder of a license from the Chairman of the Municipal Council granted under by-law Nor 1 of the said Council, confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council on the 18th day of March, 1894, and shall forthwith furnish in writing to the said Council the names and addresses of himself and of the officer or licensee so employed by him, and all night soil from the premises of such person shall be removed if the same be in one or more standard buckets.
- 9. Each standard bucket shall be made of galvanized sheet iron and shall not exceed 10 lb. in weight and the following dimensions; that is to say, height 14 inches, diameter at the mouth 12 inches, diameter at the base 9 inches.

10. Every person so employing a Municipal Officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the said Municipal Council in advance the sum of two rupees per mensem for each standard bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer, provided that in the case of any house, building, land, or tenement assessed for Municipal rates at the annual value of less than Rs. 400 the sum payable per standard bucket shall be one rupee only per mensem.

The sum payable, if not paid on or before the 10th day of the month in respect of

which it is due, shall be recoverable as hereinafter provided.

- 11. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.
- 12. Any sum payable to the said Council under the foregoing by-laws may, if not duly paid, be reported to the Police Magistrate or Municipal Magistrate, and if after summary inquiry such sum appears to be due such Magistrate shall order the same to be paid by the person liable therefor, and the same shall be recovered as if it were a fine imposed by such Magistrate.
 - 13. The foregoing by-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1898.

· It is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers in that behalf by the said 9th section of the said Ordinance conferred, the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the Ninth day of December, 1897, did by resolution establish a toll on the Watagoda road at its junction with the Gampola-Ramboda road, in the Central Province.

•And whereas by section 9 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that the Legislative Council may by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session of the said Council establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, in addition to the tolls set out in the several schedules thereto annexed, and the provisions of the said Ordinance shall apply to the tolls so established as fully and effectually as if such tolls had been enumerated in the said schedules or in some or one of them:

And whereas the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the 9th day of December, 1897, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the Watagoda road at its junction with the Gampola-Ramboda road, in the Central Province:

WHEREAS by section 10 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the Government Gazette, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and alter such places and other places appoint for the collection thereof:

And whereas by a resolution of the 9th day of December, 1897, the Legislative Council established a toll in respect of the Watagoda road at its junction with the Gampola-Ramboda road, in the Central Province, payment of toll at this place to clear the toll at Ramboda within the same day, and vice versa.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right,

without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
