Sri Lankan migrant workers who opt to return require immediate, medium and long-term interventions to recover from the socioeconomic impact. Upon their return, migrant workers encounter social, economic, and psychological challenges, and require immediate, medium, and long-term interventions for effective reintegration into their communities.

October 10, 2019, the COPE expressed its displeasure that it has not yet been implemented.

The COPE also recommended that the National Environmental Act should be amended

ed the Environment Ministry Secretary Dr. Anil Jasinghe to expedite the revision of the National Environmental Act, which has been in the process of being updated for over 20

He said that although amendments to the Act were dis-

COVID-19 - One year since outbreak declared global

A year has passed since the World Health Organisation (WHO) declared a global pandemic after 121,500 cases of COVID-19 were confirmed across the world.

That figure has increased by nearly a million times in just 365 days as the virus has spread throughout countries and continents.

Normal life has ground to a halt and millions have died.

The US currently has a rate of 161.5 deaths per 100,000 people, according to the Johns Hopkins University which has been tracking the outbreak.

South America has also been badly affected during the pandemic - with Mexico having a slightly lower rate of 152 deaths per 100,000 people and Brazil having a rate of 128.1 deaths per 100,000 people

Peru has 150.6 deaths per 100,000 people while Argentina has 119.7 deaths per 100,000

Europe has also been badly affected by coronavirus - with the UK having 188.3 deaths per 100,000 people.

Italy has 166.8 deaths per 100,000 people and the Czech Republic has a rate of 210.7 per 100,000 people.

China where the pandemic originated is said to have 0.3 deaths per 100,000 people.

The global death toll has escalated rapidly over the past year with 2,610,184 people having died in the pandemic as of 9 March 2021.

This is up from the 3,993 people who had died as of 9 March 2020. The US has recorded the most deaths with

528,287, according to the Johns Hopkins Uni-

It has also recorded 29,113,788 cases. Brazil has recorded the second highest number of deaths with 268.370.

It has recorded 11,122,429 infections. Mexico has the third highest number of deaths with 191,789 fatalities. It has the thir-

teenth highest number of cases with 2,137,884. India has recorded the fourth highest amount of deaths with 158,063. It has recorded 11,262,707 cases. - Sky News

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Educate fishermen on dangers of crossing maritime boundaries - Madras HC

Every effort, sans jingoism, should be made by the Indian Government to persuade Sri Lankan authorities from taking extreme measures against Indian fishers accidentally straying into Sri Lankan waters, the Madras High Court recently observed.

A Bench of Chief Justice Sanjib Banerjee and Justice R Hemalatha added that the same restraint should also be shown by Indian authorities when it encounters Sri Lankan fisherman on Indian waters.

"Without being jingoistic or parochial in the matter, every effort should be made by the Union to persuade the Sri Lankan authorities to desist from taking extreme measures in case Indian fishermen, accidentally or otherwise, stray into Sri Lankan waters. It is the same restraint which ought to be exercised by Indian authorities when it comes to Sri Lankan fishermen", the Court ordered.

The Court also emphasised that Indian fishermen should be educated and, if necessary, gadgets installed that could sound an alarm ahead of the international maritime boundary line. This would guard against any accidental overstepping across the Indian waters, the Court observed. The Court was dealing with a plea calling

for retaliatory and compensatory measures to be taken in the wake of the alleged killing of four Indian fishermen by the Sri Lankan navy upon their crossing the international maritime boundary line. The petitioner, advocate KK Ramesh, also

called for the government to take adequate steps to protect Tamil Nadu Fishermen from such incidents in the future.

In response, the Central government told the Court of the various diplomatic efforts undertaken by the Indian government to ensure that no such incidents recur. The Court also took note that a joint working group on fisheries from India and Sri Lanka met on December 30, 2020 when the issue was discussed. - Barand Bench



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Debunking myths about COVID-19 vaccines

All COVID Vaccines are equally effective in preventing deaths

midst the global pandemic, it was with much anticipation that the introduction of the COVID-19 vaccination took place. While many affluent countries had initiated the vaccination programmes, Sri Lanka launched the COVID-19 vaccination rollout on January 29, administering the Covishield vaccine donated by India under the Vaccine Friendship initiative. By the time of writing more than 700,000 individuals including healthcare workers have been vaccinated across the country.

Vaccinations were initiated at Colombo National Hospital, Colombo North, Colombo South Teaching Hospitals, Mulleriyawa Base Hospital, Homagama Base Hospital and National Institute of Infectious Diseases giving priority for frontline healthcare workers.

However, much hesitancy and doubts are still prevailing among the public on the safety and effectiveness of the vaccine. The aim of this article is to debunk these common myths about COVID-19 vaccine.

What is a vaccine?

Vaccination is a simple, safe, and scientifically effective way of protecting people against harmful diseases. It promotes the immune system (the natural defence mechanism) of the body to fight against the specific

Types of vaccines for COVID-19

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), currently around 200 COVID-19 vaccine candidates are being developed across the globe. Of these, more than 60 are in the clinical development stage. As of last month, at least seven COVID-19 vaccines have been rolled out in countries, giving priority for the most vulnerable individuals.

There are three main approaches in manufacturing a vaccine. Their differences lie in whether they use a whole virus, just the parts of the virus that triggers the immune system or just the genetic material that provides the instructions for making specific proteins. Similarly, vaccines against COVID-19 are also manufactured using these three approaches. The storage conditions requirement differs with the vaccine type.

Did the researches rush to develop a vaccine and is the safety and efficacy of the vaccine reliable?

This is a frequently heard question from the public. When assessing the process of developing the vaccine, it is clear that the researches have never skipped any step in the usual development of vaccines. However the process was made faster as it was promptly funded and the genetic data of the virus were readily available with the scientists. Many companies and research institutes coordinated to manufacture vaccines against COVID-19, sharing a com-

Manufacturing of AstraZeneca

The AstraZeneca vaccine is a viral vector vaccine. In manufacturing this vaccine, the gene (part of DNA of the coronavirus spike protein) has been combined with a harmless virus. The Oxford-AstraZeneca team used a modified version of a chimpanzee adenovirus as the viral vector to deliver genetic materials into

In general, DNA is not as fragile as RNA, and the tough protein coat of the adenovirus effectively shields the genetic material inside. Hence, the Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine for Covid-19 is more stable than the mRNA vaccines. Therefore it does not need to be stored in freezing temperatures and the vaccine is stable at refrigerator temperatures at 38–46 degrees Fahrenheit (2–8 degrees Centigrade).

Are AstraZeneca-Oxford and Covishield—India the same?

On December 30, 2020, the UK authorized the emergency use of the AstraZeneca-Oxford vaccine for



those 18 years and older. This vaccine was developed at the University of Oxford with the collaboration of AstraZeneca. People in the UK started receiving the vaccine from January 4, 2021. Since then, many countries have granted emergency use authorization of the AstraZeneca-Oxford vaccine.

On January 6, the AstraZeneca-Oxford vaccine officially announced that the Serum Institute of India has

obtained emergency use authorization to reproduce and distribute the vaccine. The Serum Institute of India is a leading vaccine manufacturer and has been one of the main vaccine suppliers for Sri Lanka's successful

national immunization programme. The vaccine manufactured by the Serum Institute of India is named Covishield and is a re-branding of the AstraZeneca vaccine manufactured in

The National Medicinal Regulatory Authority of Sri Lanka (NMRA) approved Emergency Use Authorization of the vaccine giving the green light for the national vaccine rollout. What is an Emergency Use Author-

ization?

An Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) is a mechanism to facilitate the timely availability of medical products including vaccines while ensuring the stringent criteria on quality, safety and efficacy. This is especially adopted during public health emergencies such as the current COVID-19 pandemic. In this type of emergency situations, authorities such as the FDA/ WHO use the available evidence and carefully analyses the potential benefits over risks and issue an EUA, only if the benefits of the medicine clearly outweigh

On December 31, 2020, the WHO issued their first EUA for a COVID-19 vaccine by authorizing the Pfizer/ BioNTech vaccine, enabling the vaccine rollout.

On February 15, 2021, the WHO listed the two versions of AstraZeneca vaccine, AstraZeneca-SKBio (manufactured in the Republic of Korea) and Covishield vaccine under the EUA confirmed list. This step initiated the global vaccine rollout through COVAX (COVID-19 vaccines Global Access) facility ensuring vaccine equity across the globe.

On March 7, Sri Lanka received the first batch of COVID-19 vaccines from the COVAX facility. This consignment contained 264,000 doses of vaccines which is the first instalment of the 1,440,000 doses, which will be arriving through May. According to the WHO, the additional doses to cover 20 percent of the Sri Lankan population will arrive during the second half of 2021.

Are there differences in the efficacy levels of the COVID-19 vaccine?

Efficacy levels of different vaccines have been determined by different settings with different criteria with different study populations. Therefore it is not meaningful to compare efficacy levels between different vaccines. Further, there are many other factors such as safety, logistics, and feasibility when selecting a vaccine for a country.

According to the available data. combined average across different dosing regimens has found that the AstraZeneca vaccine was 70 percent effective in protecting against symptomatic disease. The most important finding is that, all commonly used COVID-19 vaccines show almost 100 percent effectiveness on preventing deaths and minimizing severity of the disease.

Ensuring equitable worldwide distribution of COVID-19 vaccine

It is important to remember that unless majority of the individuals are immunized, we cannot assure effective controlling of the disease by the vaccination. This is described as 'herd immunity'. When the majority (over 80 percent) of the population has become immune to the infection, the likelihood of infecting the individuals lacking the immunity is minimized.

Therefore, regardless of the financial status, all countries should receive the vaccine equitably. Only if the vaccine is used correctly and equitably, could we eradicate the acute phase of the pandemic and allow the rebuilding of our societies and economies.

Similarly, since resources remain scarce, immunization programmes will have to prioritize certain groups over others before the distribution is progressively expanded to all population groups.

To make this a reality, COVAX is bringing nations together, regardless of their income level, to ensure the procurement and equitable distribution of COVID-19 vaccines.

Side effects of COVID-19 vaccine

Like all medicines, this vaccine also can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them. Almost all vaccines in use have reported similar side effects. These side effects are normal signs that the body is developing immunity. According to the available data, following are the possible side effects:

- gic reaction (anaphylaxis) after any other vaccine injection.
- If you currently have an infection with a high temperature (over 38 degrees Centigrade).

If you have a bleeding disorder. During the vaccine rollout in Sri Lanka, so far no serious adverse effects have been reported even though there were several reports of high fever, headache and myalgia (body pain).

After completing the vaccination is it possible to go back to normal lifestyle?

Even though vaccine is proven to be effective in reducing severe disease and mortality, so far there is no research data to prove that it can effectively reduce asymptomatic transmission.

Therefore, it may be possible that people vaccinated for COVID-19 can still carry and transmit the virus, even when they themselves do not have symptoms.

Vaccination is an essential preventive strategy. But it is not a replacement for other preventive measures. Hence, adapting to the 'New Normal' is still essential. Wearing a mask, proper hand hygiene and maintaining social distancing are still needed until more is known and enough population has been vaccinated.

Getting vaccinated is part of your responsibility towards society and humanity. It is important to have faith in evidence-based science and trust in the vaccines recommended by the experts, receive it when it is made available, have realistic expectations, and finally, adhere to the 'New Normal' until a significant percentage of the population is immune and safe.

South Asia most polluted region – Report

South Asia has been rated as the most polluted region containing 37 of the most 40 most polluted cities globally despite improvement in air quality as compared to 2019, IQAir's World Air Quality Report has revealed.

The data published in the 2020 report reveals the impact of COVID-19 lockdowns and behavioral changes on global particulate pollution (PM2.5) levels. It highlights unprecedented clean air as a result of short term COVID-19 lockdown measures, as well as extreme pollution episodes related to climate change, such as wild-fires and sandstorms.

As per the report, South Asia is the most polluted region of the world with India, Bangladesh and Pakistan continuing to feature prominently at the top of the most polluted cities.

It stated that in 2020, 84 percent countries recorded air quality improvements due to global measures to slow the spread of COVID-19. The data showed that air quality improvements across major cities in 2020 compared to 2019 include Beijing (-11), Chicago (-13), Delhi (-15), London (-16), Paris (-17), and Seoul (-16).

The 25 most polluted cities in this region observed either direct improvements from 2019 or overall improvements over the last four years. However, only 24 states out of 106 met World

However, only 24 states out of 106 met World Health Organization (WHO) annual guidelines for PM2.5 in 2020.

The report mentioned that climate change continued to wreck havoc affecting air quality in America. Besides, wildfires, sandstorms and changing climatic conditions led to extremely high pollution levels in California, South America, Serbia and Australia.

The report mentioned that in 2020, 38 percent cities in US failed to meet the WHO's guideline for annual PM2.5 levels.

In addition, about half of all European cities exceed the WHO's target for annual PM2.5 pollution

The highest levels of PM2.5 pollution was found in Eastern and Southern Europe, with Bosnia Herzegovina, North Macedonia and Bulgaria taking the lead.

The air quality report mentioned that countries in South East Asia, the Middle East, Africa, South Asia and South America continue to lack the equipment and expertise to monitor and report air pollution. - Business Recorder

Easter Sunday Attacks

'Commission's recommendations unacceptable'

Several leading Muslim intellectuals in a media statement on Wednesday said that some measures recommended in the report of the Commission of Inquiry into the Easter Sunday attack will put the majority community on a confrontational course with ethno-religious minorities, specially the Muslims.

Instead of winning over the Muslim community and establishing unity and peaceful co-existence with all others, many recommendations will marginalise, ostracise, radicalise and counter-radicalise communities. Implementing some recommendations will create an unacceptable situation worse than the reversed enforced cremation policy, M.M MZuhair PC former MP, Latheef Farook, Journalist and Author, Mass L Usuf, Attorney at Law and Advocacy Columnist and Mansoor Dahlan, Theology Scholar in the statement said.

They said that the problem is primarily because the report is inspired by unsubstantiated and unproven speculative narratives, which the right wing extremists in the West, at war with Islam had been marketing since 1992 and not based on critically evaluated evidence led before the Commission taking the Sri Lankan situation into consideration.

The report says, it will not be acceptable to punish the Muslim community or Islam or its time tested institutions for the crimes committed by NTJ's deviant terrorists. Such extended assault on the community will be similar to the US government penalising Sri Lanka's Army Commander's family for the Commander's alleged wrongs or US indiscriminately bombing Afghanistan for the 9/11 attacks committed allegedly by the Saudis.

We need to draw attention to some instances amongst several in the report. The report recommends "preventive detention" (page 454) of persons alleged to be "religious extremists". The country's Criminal Law provides for the preventive detention of Island Reconvicted Criminals (IRCs) at times of visits of foreign dignitaries and serious emergencies. Can we treat religious dignitaries or intensely religious persons on par with IRCs possibly on someone's allegation that some amongst them are extremists? Unlike violent extremism, it is not an offence to have extreme views because that is a universally recognised limb of the freedom of expression! In a country, which gives 'foremost place' to Buddhism, sadly liquor bars, night clubs, gambling dens proliferate without any objection while those engaged in religious activities and invite people to desist from wrong doings are recommended to be possibly detained like

IRCs. This may lead to open conflicts and must be avoided.

The report wrongfully attempts to blame Islam (at page 18- "threat posed by Islam") for the Easter Sunday attacks. It is a shocking accusation that will inevitably be firmly resisted. There is no credible evidence before the Commission to make such a serious, unacceptable and flawed insinuation on Islam with a 1,500 year history. Such recommendations will only lead to conflicts and not solve even present problems. It will be used as cannon fodder in international fora. The Archbishop of Colombo in a globally quoted speech on July 21, 2019 in Katuwapitiya said that the Easter Sunday attacks were an international conspiracy and not merely the work of Islamic extremists. He said Islamic ideology was being used to create mayhem all over the globe.

Blaming Islam is undoubtedly a travesty of justice. Was the Commission regrettably misled by years of malicious propaganda against Islam by the world's notorious war mongers and its agents supported by sections of the international media?

The Commission has also referred to "exclusivism" as the first step to terrorism (page 11).Questions will naturally arise whether priesthood, monkhood, abandoning worldly life, celibacy or even meditation are also evidence of the bizarre theory of 'exclusivism'? Of course there is no priesthood in Islam. These new dimensions laid through agents of the Western arms industry are in conflict with Asian historical norms. They are aimed at conflict creation.

It has also referred to 'Sufism' and its 'meditation centre' at Kattankudy being attacked (page13) quoting journalists. Sufism is a well-recognised facet of Islam as much as 'monotheism' or 'Thowheed' or 'Oneness' of Allah as distinguished from the Christian concept of 'Trinity'. Any attack on Sufism or Thowheed is an attack on Islam.

The attempt to lump the Muslims with terrorists while seeking to divide the Muslims as Sufis, Thowheeds, Thablighs and Jamaaths or more importantly from the other communities in Sri Lanka will be seen only as an extension of the West's war on Islam. It will end as a costly exercise that can destructively contribute to the dismemberment of Sri Lanka on ethno-religious lines that might soon be exploited by the West. Sri Lankans should read in this regard the many great works and speeches of Sri Lanka's eminent jurist Dr C G Weeramantry of International Court of Justice (ICJ) fame or John Perkins (US) "Confessions of an Economic Hit Man".

Japan assists to supply clean water for Ambagamuwa

The Government of Japan granted US\$ 63,197 (Rs. 12 million) through the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) for the provision of "Gravity Fed Water System for Clean Water Supply in the Ambagamuwa DS Division in the Nuwara Eliya

District".

The grant contract was signed on March 9 at the Ambassador's Residence in Colombo between Ambassador of Japan Sugiyama Akira, and W M P R Bandaratilleke, Country Director (Interim) of the Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA) Sri

Lanka.

The ADRA Sri Lanka provides clean water and hygiene facilities for communities in the Nuwara Eliya District for years. The Minna Division of the Strathspey Estate is one of the remotest and isolated communities in the area. The community has struggled to provide access to

clean water for its residents like most other communities in the vicinity. The only available water sources are the natural stream water, which flows through other villages and an old water tank both are unclean and insufficient to cater to the needs of the entire community.

This project will, therefore, improve water supply and the hygiene environment of the plantation community through the construction of a gravity fed water supply system where all members of the division will have access to filtered clean water. The project will also contribute to realising the "Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour," in which the Government of Sri Lanka will provide drinking water to every family. Training on daily hygiene practices for the community will also be provided through this grant for nearly 750 people in the Ambagamuwa Divisional Secretariat Division.

Bandaratilleke said that it was certainly a pleasure to be working with the Embassy of Japan again.

"In 2017, the ADRA successfully handed over two of such water systems in the Alton Estate, Upcot, which were also funded through the GGP programme. The ongoing partnership with the people of Japan is always valued. We have received immense support from the Estate Management and relevant government counterpart in planning this project and we thank them. As always, ADRA will ensure the project is implemented with a high level of accountability and transparency, while promoting strong ownership among the community. Sri Lanka and Japan have a long and rich history of collaboration and we are happy to be a part of this long-term friendship. We thank the people of Japan for their continued support and love," he said.

United States envoy observes demining in Vavuniya



United States (US) Embassy Deputy Chief of Mission (DCM) Martin Kelly visited a Mines Advisory Group (MAG) demining site in Vavuniya on March 8 to observe the measures that have been taken to clear explosives in the area and to speak with several women deminers.

The project is carried out with a part of over Rs. 1 billion that the United States is providing this fiscal year to promote residents' safety and security.

"Clearing the deadly devices takes skill, patience, and bravery," D.C.M. Kelly said. "The women deminers defy stereotype gender roles while performing a courageous service in rebuilding their communities. We are grateful for their contributions to make Sri Lanka a mine-free country," he said.

D.C.M. Kelly met representatives of local and international mine clearing partners including the Delvon Association for Social Harmony (DASH), Skavita Humanitarian Assistance and Relief Project (SHARP), HALO Trust, and MAG that carry out demining operations with the support of US funding. He also had a meeting with the National Mine Action Centre at the Regional Mine Action Office in Kilinochchi.

Since 1995, the US has been the largest donor for demining in Sri Lanka, providing over \$78 million for operations and equipment. US support has helped advance mine clearing in the nine districts affected by landmine contamination and enabled the Batticaloa District to be declared mine free in 2017. US funding has also supported mine detection training and provided demining equip-



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A wise stand

t appears that the Catholic Church has shown a willingness to compromise on its hitherto hardline stance that it would settle for nothing less than the unraveling and unmasking of the masterminds and the true agents behind the Easter Sunday bombings. This stand has been reiterated by His Eminence Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith who had right throughout been maintaining that the suicide bombers were only the tools in what was a larger plot possibly orchestrated by an unseen foreign hand. It is perhaps on this basis that the Cardinal expressed his disillusionment on the Presidential Commission of Inquiry Report on the Easter Sunday bombings, since it had apparently failed to identify the hidden hand responsible for the carnage.

However, the Commission is bound by its terms of reference in conducting its probe on the attacks and could not go beyond its mandate. Besides, trying to ascertain if there were international agents responsible for the episode is a tall order well beyond the scope of the Commission which was only a fact finding body appointed to ascertain the events surrounding the bombings, who facilitated the same and if the attack could have been prevented but for the negligence of certain parties and individuals.

Perhaps this realization had dawned on the Catholic Church which has decided to go soft on the Commission and in fact wants the next stage of the investigations to be guided by the findings of the Commission. The Catholic Bishops' Conference on Tuesday has urged that the Attorney General be given the full power and freedom to prosecute the perpetrators, those who aided and abetted them and those who were found to be negligent in carrying out their duties. It also wanted the 22 volumes of the PCol Report withheld by the authorities on the ground that they contain sensitive information concerning national security to be made available to the Attorney General as soon as possible. Above all, it wants speedy justice delivered on behalf of the victims.

The rest now lies with the investigative process by different branches of the law enforcement under the supervision of the Attorney General. The focus should now move away from the Commission. It has identified certain leading figures who had been remiss in their duty to prevent the attacks and also made certain recommendations on how to counter the threat of extremism. The Commission has recommended the banning of schools based on ethnic and/or religious identities and also the banning of certain Islamic and non-Islamic extremist organisations that have sowed the seeds of ethnic dishar-

The Government can now work on this basis and declare the closure on the Commission. The ball is now in the court of the Attorney General. The Church has now shown flexibility in not demanding the impossible. It is not expecting that the masterminds be traced right away although it certainly would want to explore that possibility after the preliminaries have been done with – to commence investigations on the basis of the findings of the Commission. The Church's request for the AG to be provided with the rest of the volumes too should be viewed favourably by the authorities. No room should be left for lacunae in the investigations due to absence of all available material. Besides the Attorney General who is the State prosecutor could certainly be relied upon to preserve confidentiality and guard against those sections deemed sensitive from entering the public

It looks as if the long wait for justice by the anguished is at last on the horizon with all indications that the investigations into the Easter Sunday carnage are poised to reach a decisive stage with the Church's focus now directed at the available material provided by the Commission on which investigations could commence. Besides, harping on the masterminds and foreign agents can only prolong the process and obfuscate things given the vast complexities. It is the here and now that should receive our attention.

All this should not detract from the almost singlehanded effort by His Eminence Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith to unrelentingly canvass the grievance of his bereaved flock that, no doubt, served to get things moving fast in terms of the restoration of justice. But for his persistent advocacy for bringing the perpetrators to book, the Ester Sunday carnage could well have been consigned as another episode of violence and forgotten with the passage of time.

It is also due to the Cardinal's resourceful leadership that a certain bloodbath was averted in the immediate aftermath of the Church bombings. His outspokenness on most occasions may have not endeared him to certain politicians but through his bold leadership he showed how results could be obtained by being frank and uncompromising. President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, the other day, commiserated with His Eminence opining that his deep anguish and consternation could be understood in the context of what happened on that fateful day in April 2019. There could be no doubt at all that President Gotabaya Rajapaksa would ensure that the investigations are speeded up until the truth is revealed and justice served.

Neocolonialism a UNHRC

f the 47 member nations of the United Human Nations Rights Council (UNHRC), seven are West European countries. Displaying a tendency of neocolonialism, those seven, together with the non-member United States make blatant attempts to dominate the

The latest example of the dominant attitude of the West is the Resolution on Sri Lanka, for which they have roped-in unsuspecting Malawi to show that an African country too is among the co-sponsors. However, the 27 Asia-Pacific and African members of the UNHRC and eight Latin American and Caribbean States, together with the five East European countries could easily resist Western attempts of dominance, if they take a united stand. Unfortunately, some of the vulnerable countries of the Third World are unable to resist the affluent Western countries because of their dependence on

Although the vast majority of UNHRC members belong to the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM), the relevance of the organization has diminished after the collapse of the Soviet Union that marked the end of the alternate super power bloc, the Warsaw Pact. With the transformation of the power equation, new alignments were formed and the United States succeeded in expanding its influence over many NAM members, including its pioneers India, Yugoslavia (now fragmented), Egypt and Ghana.

Sri Lanka is fortunate to get the backing of two of the most powerful countries in the world, China and Russia at the international forum. They, together with Cuba, Pakistan, the Philippines and several other dependable friends of Sri Lanka lodged strong objections to the Resolution, which has already been rejected by Sri Lanka.

Many countries, faced with internal conflicts and terrorism, are determined to solve them without leaving any room for external interventions. Hence, they strongly feel that a UNHRC resolution calling for external intervention on any country could set an unwanted precedent. Many experts of international law agree that such a precedent would allow similar actions against any other country in the future.

Earlier this week, India expressed vehement opposition to the decision made by the British Parliament to discuss the Indian farmers' protest. The British envoy in New Delhi, Alex Ellis was summoned by Foreign Secretary Harsh Shringla and served a demarche or formal diplomatic representation that conveyed India's "strong opposition to the unwarranted and tendentious discussion on agricultural reforms in India in the British Parlia-

ment." During the debate, most of the British MPs acknowledged that the Indian Government's agricultural reforms were a domestic matter but noted their constituents had strong links with India's farm sector and were upset by what they described as the use of force against protesting farmers. India is rightly of the view that farmer reforms were an internal matter and the Government has every right to deal with rioting farmers to maintain law and

Most UNHRC member countries in Asia and Africa look towards India for guidance when there are major political differences over the resolutions

before the Council. Hence, the Indian objection to unwarranted British interference on the farmers' protest could provide guidance to the imperative need for the Third World's opposition to external interventions.

India's opposition to any international debate on Kashmir is well recorded. Similarly any country facing the threat of terrorism and/or internal conflicts do not want the UNHRC to set a precedent by passing a resolution against a fellow-member or recommendations of external interference and sanctions that could pave way for similar resolutions on other countries in

Several influential countries were heavily involved in behind the scene informal consultations to redraft some of the clauses of the Resolution on Sri

There are several countries with internal conflicts wary of strongly worded resolutions on any country and India is among the countries in consultation with others over redrafting the

The Core Group of countries led by the United Kingdom working on Sri Lanka's issue at the UNHRC are currently holding informal consultations with others to draft the final version of the resolution and during those discussions, several Third World countries had major objections to some of the clauses in the proposed draft.

During the informal consultations most of the Core Group wanted a strong wording of the resolution. They were backed by several European countries including Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland and Ireland.

On the other hand, UNHRC member

nations faced with threats of terrorism and internal conflicts expressed concern over some clauses of the draft proposal as they would set a precedent for future actions on any country.

For example, Clause 6 of the draft reads: "Recognizes the importance of preserving and analyzing evidence relating to violations and abuses of human rights and related crimes in Sri Lanka with a view to advancing accountability, and decide to strengthen the capacity of the Office of the High Commissioner to collect, consolidate, analyze and preserve information and evidence and to develop possible strategies for future accountability processes for gross violations of human rights or serious violations of international humanitarian law, to advocate for victims and survivors, and to support relevant judicial proceedings in Member States with competent jurisdiction."

Several Asian and African members pointed out that this would result in the serious infringement on sovereignty of a country. They were of the opinion that several such clauses needed redrafting during informal consulta-

The countries supporting Sri Lanka at the informal discussions pointed out that the Core Group, in its statement, paid tribute to the people of Sri Lanka and expressed the wish to highlight its ongoing commitment to accountability, reconciliation, and inclusive peace in Sri Lanka. "We recognize and welcome the progress made by the Government of Sri Lanka in rebuilding infrastructure, demining, land return and resettling internally displaced persons. However, it is clear that more


needs to be done to address the harmful legacies of war and build a sustainable peace in the country," the Core

In view of the above acknowledgement, the countries supporting Sri Lanka urged the Core Group to be more sensitive to Sri Lanka's difficulties and to collaborate with Colombo instead of acting with high handedness and arrogance. The draft resolution has been revised ahead of a March 16 deadline and further revisions are likely after a third informal consultation between the co-sponsors of the resolution and concerned countries.

When British MPs expressed concern over the safety of Indian farmer protesters and the status of press freedom, India's High Commission in London said the Parliamentary discussion was full of "false assertions." "We deeply regret that rather than a balanced debate, false assertions – without substantiation or facts - were made, casting aspersions on the largest functioning democracy in the world and its institutions," India's High Commissioner said and added, "When aspersions are cast on India by anyone, irrespective of their claims of friendship and love for India or domestic political compulsions, there is a need to set the record straight.

Sri Lanka, as the oldest democracy in Asia, could use the same words with regard to unfounded allegations levelled against this country and the UNHRC Resolution on Sri Lanka. India and other friends should understand the hidden agenda of the West and their neocolonial strategies and resist them collectively for the greater good of all developing nations.

Superior Courts 'laying down the law' to lower Courts









walkout from Court by the plaintiff's Counsel resulted in a plaintiff filing papers before the Court of Appeal to have a case transferred. Subsequently, it was the defendant in the same case that came before the Court of Appeal, appealing the dismissal of judgement made in his favour by a retiring Judge, which was not recognized by the incoming judge replacing him. The appellant wanted the predecessor judge's judgement upheld.

A plaintiff-respondent (the plaintiff) filed action in the District Court of Mallakam against the defendant-petitioners (the defendants) praying for a declaration that the Special Meeting of the Mahajana College Telhppalai Old Students' Association convened by the first defendant and held on 2/11/1996 was invalid. The plaintiff also sought injunctive relief against the Executive Committee elected at the said meeting to prevent them from collecting money on behalf of the Association.

At the trial after the plaintiff's case was closed, further trial was fixed for 6/5/1998 for the defendant's evidence. On a subsequent date, the learned counsel for the plaintiff expressed his dissatisfaction over the manner in which the learned judge conducted the proceedings of the case and requested the learned judge to transfer the case to another judge. When this request was not acceded to, the learned counsel and the plaintiff walked out of Court. The trial continued with the defendants leading their evidence.

In the meantime, the plaintiff filed an application in the Court of Appeal bearing No. 390/98 seeking an order transferring the case. The Court of Appeal, having considered the application, issued an order staying further proceedings in the District Court case until a specified date.

However, despite the stay order, the outgoing District Court judge had issued judgement in the case in favour of the defendant. The incoming District Court judge however refused to enter the judgement issued by his predecessor, stating it was written at the time the Appeal Court stay order was in operation.

Aggrieved by this order, the defendant filed papers before the Court of Appeal for revision,



in Nagarajah and Others vs Rajadurai and Others - SLR - 339, Vol 3 of 2003 [2003] LKCA 74; (2003) 3 Sri LR 339 (January 21, 2003)

The Court of Appeal ruled that the judgement written by the outgoing District Judge when a stay order was in operation, was illegal. The following case was cited:

Edward vs De Silva:

"P. Nagalingam S.P.J. having said that he did not see any difference in principle between appeals and applications for revision, said further that, when this Court by its order of 29th May 1953, directed notice to issue and directed the Registrar to call for the record, this Court had acquired seisin over the case and acquired jurisdiction over it, immediately effecting thereby a limitation of the jurisdiction of the District Judge to continue subsequent proceedings. The learned District Judge's judgment was held to be ultra vires and was set aside."

Court also held:

"In the instant case under review, the defendants' written submissions were filed on 28/5/199 and the judgement was fixed for 1/6/1998. On the same day at 11.00 am, the Judge was informed of the stay order issued by this Court."

The judge had made judgement despite the fact that Court of Appeal had issued a stay order.

The Court of Appeal was unequivocal, and

"Can one contend that the stay order cannot

affect the Judge's freedom to write his judgement either in Chambers or at home? I do not think so. Writing the judgment is a very vital step in judicial proceedings. An order from this Court directing the stay of proceedings has the effect of tying the hands of the Judge as far as that particular case is concerned. Therefore it is my considered conclusion that the learned Judge has written his 'judgment' in violation of lawful order, validly made by this Court, which he was bound by law to obey and as such in the eyes of the law, the purported judgment was *ultra vires* and ille-

The purported judgement is like a confession recorded by a Magistrate at a time when he had no power under the law to record it. In *TheQueen vs Gnarthseeha Thera and Others* (4), the Supreme Court has decided that such a confession has no legal value that follows."

a confession has no legal value that follows." Section 186A of the Civil Procedure Code was cited to bolster the position of the defendant appellant in the Court of Appeal.

The Section reads as follows:

"Where a Judge pronounces a judgement written by his predecessor but not pronounced as provided in Section 185, such judgement shall, if such predecessor was a judicial officer within the meaning of Article 114(6) of the Constitution, at the time such judgement was written, not be deemed to be invalid by reason only of the fact that such predecessor had no jurisdiction to write such judgement."

The Court of Appeal held that this section deals with whether a judge has territorial

jurisdiction or not – and is not applicable to a situation of him having written a manifestly illegal judgement.

The application was to hold the DC judgement by the predecessor judge valid, but the Court of Appeal overruled the judgement and declared it illegal.

In a different case at a different time, Kanthilatha and Another vs Wimalaratne and Others, 2005 1 SLR, (Ameratunga, J) it was held:

"When a party, in the exercise of a right of appeal conferred by law prefers an appeal against any order or a judgment to a higher court, the resulting position with regard to the execution of the order appealed against has been explained by Soertsz ACJ, in *Edward vs De Silva* in the following words.

"The ordinary rule is that once an appeal is taken from the judgement or decree of an inferior Court, the jurisdiction of that Court in respect of that case is suspended except, of course, in regard to matters to be done and directions to be given for the perfecting of the appeal and its transmission to the Court of Appeal"

In short, when a matter is taken for Appeal, the original court has no jurisdiction over it.

However, some original court judges have taken the view that in the absence of a direction from the Court of Appeal specifically directing the stay of execution of the DC order pending appeal, the order appealed against is executable.

The Court of Appeal held that this view is wrong:

"With respect, this is an erroneous view. It appears that the learned Magistrate in this case has fallen into the same error when order was made to execute the order of the High Court pending the receipt of an order from the Court of Appeal. There is no provision or a necessity for issuing a direction to stay execution. The filing of an appeal *ipso facto* operates to suspend the jurisdiction of the original court to execute the order appealed against."

It appears that there have been instances in which judges of lower Courts underestimated the power of the Superior Courts over their orders. The Superior Courts have shown no compunctions laying down the law to the lower Courts, with regard to these erroneous assumptions.

hina–India relations took a turn for the worse in 2020. Intrusions by the People's Liberation Army along the contested border led to a military standoff and skirmishes, the likes of which had not been seen for decades between the two countries. Only recently have they begun the process of disengagement.

India's neighbourhood has increasingly become a space in which the two major powers jostle for influence. Over the last decade, China has become one of the top exporters to South Asia. Chinese investments have poured into infrastructure projects such as railways, ports, highways and economic corridors spanning thousands of kilometres across the region. Except for India and Bhutan, all South Asian countries are members of China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).

The Himalaya frontier

South Asian states have been quietly watching the sparks flying on the Himalayan frontier. Even Pakistan — perhaps China's closest partner globally and with the most to gain from India being distracted on its eastern flank — has done little out of the ordinary to change the status quo. On February 25, 2021, New Delhi and Islamabad unexpectedly recommitted to a ceasefire along their disputed border.

Nepal is an exception, taking the crisis as an opportunity to officially release and constitutionally legitimize a new map claiming three small territories historically disputed with India. India has claimed and controlled these territories for decades, with little official protestation from Nepal. Kathmandu's unprecedented action during the China-India standoff therefore suggested a desire to poke India in the eye while acknowledging Nepal's burgeoning ties with China. This type of signalling was a level up from the China-India military standoff at Doklam in 2017, when Nepali elites blamed India for the crisis but still acknowledged that it would be best for Kathmandu to stay uninvolved.

India's neighbours with scores to settle might similarly seek to exploit any future increase in China–India tensions. The established pattern in the region has been for China to steadily expand and deepen its economic and military ties with smaller states and for India to respond with all manner of diplomatic and financial manoeuvring to undermine Chinese efforts. South Asian countries meanwhile try and play both sides against each other to secure the best deals on development finance, arms sales and diplomatic concessions.

Greater competition might lead to either India or China starting to demand more of smaller states. The party with the most leverage in this three-way interaction will likely have the greatest impact on outcomes. Despite its deep pockets and extensive relationships, China is not that party. Beijing is already experiencing the limits of trying to establish a commercial empire far from home.

Smaller states often do not fall in line, their domestic publics hold China responsible for the negative effects of unsustainable infrastructural projects, and India shows up at every turn to offer a credible alternative

Sri Lanka's current Prime Minister and former president Mahinda Rajapaksa warmed up to China before 2015, but his successor, former Sri Lankan president Maithripala Sirisena pointedly cultivated ties with India. Even after Rajapaksa became Prime Minister in 2019, Colombo has been careful to invite Indian and Japanese infrastructure investment as a geopolitical hedge against China's presence.

Power of small States

In Nepal, far from having an easy ride, China has found itself now embroiled in Nepal's political crisis and labelled an unreliable trade partner for closing certain trade routes during the COVID-19 pandemic.

In the Maldives, New Delhi avoided the trap of military intervention following a constitutional crisis in 2018 precipitated by the China-aligned then president Abdulla Yameen. India instead applied diplomatic pressure and supported the opposition electoral candidate, Ibrahim Mohamed Solih, who promised better relations with India. Solih delivered on his promise after a surprise victory and New Delhi reciprocated with US\$

500 million in infrastructure funding.

Smaller states thus often hold the greatest leverage. Both major powers will want to cultivate strong relationships with them to

ensure diplomatic support and at the very least to preclude opportunism. India has an interest in ensuring peace along its periphery, while China must protect its investments from political risk, especially at a time when the economic effects of COVID-19 have made it much harder for countries to repay Chinese loans.

Smaller states can protect their interests more easily now compared to when India was the only key player. China's deepening economic roots ensure that India cannot exploit its structural economic advantages as one of the largest markets in the world. Meanwhile, India's deep cultural and historical ties to the region ensure that China cannot demand too much diplomatically in return for its invest-

This balancing act is not easy and countries will occasionally overstep and risk drawing the two major powers into more direct contestation, as Nepal did last year. Those moments may offer bargaining leverage to smaller states, but there will be limits to the extent to which most smaller states can bend in one direction.


in one direction.

Even when their territories are directly under threat from a potential China–India conflict, as in the case of Bhutan during the Doklam crisis, states have chosen to stay quiet and leave the two giants to step back from the brink. With the exception of Pakistan, this is likely the ideal strategy for smaller South Asian states going forward, even as China–India relations become tense.

WHEN ANCIENT SERENDIBLURED IEWISH SHIPS

DISHAN JOSEPH

he resplendent island of Sri Lanka has been the envy of many for its strategic maritime position. This geographical position together with our natural resources drew the attention of traders from across the world. Ancient records show details of Arab trading vessels which were later followed by the Portuguese and Dutch. Subsequently the British arrived here lured by our tropical pearls and cinnamon. Many know these stages of our maritime history. The people of Israel had established trading links with ancient Serendib (the Persian name for Ceylon).

It is believed that by the 12th century there were around 3,000 Jews living on this island engaged in business. They had lived in peace, sharing in our prosperity. Jews had resided in Colombo, Kandy and Galle in a bygone era. It is said that a Jewish synagogue had existed along Steuart Place,

KING SOLOMON'S FLEET

Did King Solomon's ships sail thousands of nautical miles to Ceylon? Ruling for 40 years, King Solomon was Israel's wealthiest and isionary king. He was the son of King David who wrote many of the

> Old Testament Psalms and also killed the giant warrior Goliath. The Bible narrates how Solomon (Hebrew name Yedidyah, and in Islam -Suleiman) asked God for wisdom, and in turn was blessed with all things. His father King David desired to build the Temple on Mount Moriah, to keep the Ark of the Covenant, a gold chest containing the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments.

The project was begun and completed by King Solomon. He was able to wield his powerful influence across Israel, and is said to have collected 18,125 Kg of gold (666 talents) in a single year. Extending his prudent diplomacy, he made an alliance with King Hiram, and further consolidated his reign over Israel. It was in this background of blissful abundance that he was ordered by the High Priests to procure cinnamon oil to be used at religious rites in the holy Temple. This custom is found in the Book of Exodus where Moses is directed by God to use cinnamon oil.

Chapter 8) talks about the magnificent feast when the Ark of the Covenant was brought in the month of Ethanim (possibly July) and placed inside the holy Temple. The massive temple was built to a Phoenician design (a clan of people famous for their purple Tyrian dye, who can be traced to present-day Lebanon). After building the Temple, Solomon spent 13 years building a royal palace in Ophel, Jerusalem.

THE LOCATION OF TARSHISH?

King Solomon is said to have sent out his experienced naval fleet to an island in the East. The East in that era referred to the Orient, including Asia. It is from these ports that he obtained his cinnamon oil, along with peacocks and animals. He pro-cured sandalwood, pepper, ivory, pearls and gems - items found abundantly in Sri Lanka. The long return journey took three years, a most daunting voyage (Book of Kings, Chapter 1, verse 23). Solomon had an established naval fleet which empowered Israel to excel in commercial trading. Chapter 9 of 2nd Chronicles talks of Solomon's alliance for trade.

For decades, theologians and historians have intensely debated about the location of Tarshish, on the ancient mariner's map. Many opine it is either the ancient port of Ophir located in India or Galle in Serendib (Sri Lanka). Others opine it could be Carthage (the second largest city in the Hellenistic period) in the sea of Tunisia. Ophir in India is said to be on the Kerala coast, in the Trivandrum District. In contrast, the 10th century lexicographer David Abraham thinks Ophir was an exotic location in old

Psalm 72 says that Tarshish was an island far away; it had rivers and forests. The Old Testament book of Ezekiel mentions trade ties with Tarshish, and ships of commerce. Whether Sri Lanka was known to the ancient Jews as Tarshish we can't confirm, but can we assume that King Solomon got all his tropical delights from here? We must realize that the name Tarsus in the New Testament episode of Saul (who converted as Paul the Apostle) is a different town in south central Turkey.

The old skill of trading in peacocks is attributed to the Dravidian people. Ancient Tamils used this skill, and to date the peacock is a revered bird in the Hindu kovils in India and Sri Lanka. In his book of 1863, Sir William Smith attests that the classical Tamil name for peacock 'thogkai' was assimilated into Hebrew lingo for peacock, as 'thukkiyyim'. This can support the cause that Solomon's fleet sailed to our exotic island which still has thousands of peacocks. In 1845, James Emerson Tennant, the presiding Colonial Secretary also supported the fact that Solomon's fleet had traded in Galle. Samuel Bochart (French Biblical scholar) tries to convince us that the Kudiramalai area of old Ceylon was the port of Tarshish. The old Phoenicians also

recorded their trade in Tarshish where they got ivory and gems, from an island. Some opine the Phoenicians lived in Galilee, Israel, in lands gifted to Hiram by King Solomon. Solomon probably acquired expensive sapphires and rubies from ancient Serandib, which directs us to another fact.

After building the Temple of Jerusalem, Solomon was instructed on sewing of the attire of the high priests (of the chosen Levite clan). Their 'ephod' (breastplate) had to be adorned with 12 gems, one for each tribe of Israel. These gems may have been taken from Tarshish. King Solomon's throne (1 Kings, Chapter 10) was made with ivory and gold and inlaid with precious stones. The arms of the throne depicted two lions. Among the birds and animals engraved into the throne is a peacock. Did Solomon purchase these gems from Serendib?

The Queen of Sheba may have traded with the island of the East. She gifted Solomon with spices and precious stones. She was of Ethiopian descent (old Kingdom of Nubia) but some say she is from Saba (South of Saudi Arabia) towards Yemen. She is depicted in art with exotic animals and birds, including peacocks. Her chief merchant agent was a man named Tamrin.

JEWS: FROM INDIA TO CEYLON

Certain parts of India still have an active Jewish population. The original Jews had


come to Cochin and settled down in Kerala. They were dark skinned Malabar Jews. Their colony was called Anjuvannam, and their leader was Rabban. They lived here for 1,000 years. Later, in the 16th century, Jews of Spanish and British origin came to Madras and engaged in the lucrative diamond business. These migrants learnt to speak Malayalam and Tamil. The third wave of Syrian Jews came to the Kanyakumari region of India. Another segment of visiting Jews settled down in Karachi, Lahore and Peshawar until the Partition of India in 1947. Interestingly there is a small community of Telugu-speaking Jews claiming lineage from Ephraim.

The Jews of Cochin claim that their forefathers supplied King Solomon's Temple with teak trees. The teak was shipped to Judea. It is believed that with time the Jews intermarried and shifted to Ceylon. The Jewish communities in 16th century Ceylon were subject to persecution by the Portuguese. In fear they abandoned their faith and surnames. Among them was a sub clan of Vishvakarma people. They were skilled blacksmiths, metalworkers, goldsmiths and stonemasons. These artisans embellished temples in India. It is said some goldsmiths assimilated into the Tamil community and identified as Thattar (opinions differ on this).

Even today, the Tamil-speaking Thattar caste exists and they are master goldsmiths. They were once moneylenders who made good profit. In addition, there were Burghers in Ceylon who came from Jewish lineage. J.B. Muller identifies some of these surnames as Altendorff, Felsinger, Joseph, Koch, Schneider, Martensteyn, Werkmeister and Oppenheimer. For the record, Ceylon had two Jewish Chief Justices, Sir Alan Rose and Sir Sidney Abrahams.

AJEWISH MEMORY

I was able to locate two other gravestones in the Borella cemetery in Colombo, when I went there with my friend Gunashantha. They had Hebrew inscriptions chiseled into the hard stone. One is of Joseph Bin Boim who died in 1888. The gravediggers said there should be a few more graves but we could not find them on this day. It is rare that someone would venture into the cemetery looking for Jewish graves. Sustaining a solitary flame of Jewish culture in Colombo is Chabad House. This former colonial bungalow is located opposite Cinnamon Red Hotel. Chabad House caters to a few folk from Israel and visiting Jewish businessmen. There was a Rabbi (Jewish priest) but I haven't met him after the Covid pandemic. Was Tarshish an enigmatic port or a real trading paradise? The Jews of Ceylon have disappeared into history. Their ancient generations once enriched our island.

Plea to save Muthurajawela Sanctuary from encroachers

Minister says land area has dwindled to 1,200 hectares

Prof. Tissa Vitarana and Communist Party Chairman D.E.W. Gunasekara met Environment Minister Mahinda Amaraweera to discuss issues related to the Muthurajawela Sanctuary recently.

The discussion was held at the Environment Ministry.Prof. Tissa Vitarana said that the Muthurajawela Wetland is one of the most sensitive ecosystems in the suburbs of Colombo city. Therefore, he requested the Minister to take all possible measures to protect this sensitive ecosystem, the Ministry's media unit said in a statement.

"The lungs of the city of Colombo are the Muthurajawela wetland. Muthurajawela cleans the atmosphere around Colombo city. Muthurajawela is also the best centre for environmental studies for anyone learning about the environment. Muthurajawela is an environmental university. The value of this has not yet been fully recognized by the people," he

Minister Mahinda Amaraweera said that although Muthurajawela was not within his



purview he had come forward to protect the wetland in good faith. "According to the information available to me, the land area of Muthurajawela in 1990 was over 3,000 hectares. But by now it has been reduced to 1,200 hectares. I went Muthurajawela with the Secretary to the Ministry to inquire about Muthurajawela. The underworld, thugs, some government officials and local politicians are behind

the destruction of this wetland. They are forcibly occupying lands in this wetland.

"I discussed this with the President. The President said that conservation work should be started under the Urban Development Authority. The wetland will be handed over to the Wildlife Ministry after conservation work. The Urban Development Authority Act comes into force. Also, some illegal and freehold

lands will have to be acquired when land is acquired for Muthurajawela. But they need to be given alternatives. The President has instructed that if a person resides in a certain place, no one should be forcibly removed".

"All that needs to be done is to provide them with alternative accommodation or housing and then take appropriate action. I think the solution put forward by the President is the best solution to save Muthurajawela for future generations,"the Minister said.

Gunasekera inquired from the Minister regarding the acquisition of 700 acres of Muthurajawela by one businessman."There is a report prepared by that institution. Here are the documents submitted by many government agencies. Regarding the project. If other unauthorized acquisitions are removed while protecting the Muthurajawela wetland, that person will have to enforce that law as well. Therefore, this can only be done in a very formal manner under the Urban Devel-

Godahewa.The President also has instructed him. He is very keen to carry out this task successfully" he said. "As long as I am the Environment Minister, I will not allow any damage to the Muthurajawela wetlands. But I do not know what the next minister will do. Second Wave rips through Brazil

A second wave of Covid-19 is ripping through Brazil, pushing hospitals and ICUs toward collapse and claiming record numbers of daily

While a new variant of the coronavirus spreads throughout the country, many Brazilians continue to defy mask mandates mobility restrictions following the example of President Jair Bolsonaro, who recently said people need to "stop being sissies" and "whining" about the virus.

The consequences of that combination are deadly, experts say. "We are going through the worst-case scenario since the beginning of the pandemic. You just have to look at the trends in the average number of deaths," Gonzalo Vecina Neto, a Sao Paulo University professor of Public Health, recently told Reuters television.

"This could have been avoided and the most important factor is gather-

Brazil has broken its own record three times this month for number of deaths in a 24-hour period. On Wednesday, Brazil's Health Ministry registered a devastating new high --2,286 lives lost to the virus. In total, more than 270,000 people are known to have died due to Covid-19, making Brazil's the second-highest national death toll after the United States.

In 22 of Brazil's 26 states, ICU occupancy has surpassed 80%. In the southern state of Rio Grande do Sul,



hospital patients must line up to wait for beds as occupancy rates in intensive care units soar past 103%. The neighboring state of Santa Catarina has already surpassed 99% occupancy and is on the verge of collapsing, as cases surge throughout the state.

One hospital in Santa Catarina's capital, Florianopolis, is already beyond capacity. David Molin, the hospital's head nurse, tells CNN his team is exhausted and overwhelmed.

"I was here during the first wave and it wasn't like this. We are completely overwhelmed, with our occupancy rate at over 100%. Many of

those patients who are waiting for an ICU don't make it," Molina told CNN during a telephone interview.

Molina and other health care workers blame the recent surge of Covid-19 cases on larges parties and gatherings that began around New Year's Eve and continued through the pre-Lent carnival holiday and into today. Many of these were held in defiance of local city and state restric-

Last week, Rio de Janeiro's Mayor Eduardo Paes announced a new curfew for bars and restaurants throughout the city, limiting hours of opera-

tion from 6:00 am to 5:00 pm. But hundreds of people stayed out anyway - 230 curfew-related fines and closures were issued from Friday to Saturday alone, according to the city government. At one bar, more than 200 mostly-maskless partygoers were found at a party that had been going for seven hours, reported CNN affiliate CNN Brasil.

Many municipal and state health officials and lawmakers blame Bolsonaro's government for undermining their efforts to slow the spread of the coronavirus. And the country's National Council of Health Secretaries (CONASS) has asked the federal government to adopt stricter measures to support hospitals and enforce social distancing.

With Brazilian hospitals overloaded and government officials divided over lockdown measures, the country has few defenses against a coronavirus variant that may be even more contagious.

A preprint of a new modelling study by researchers in Brazil and the UK suggests the variant first detected in the northern city of Manaus late last year, known as P.1, may be up to 2.2 times more transmissible.

The study, which has not yet been peer-reviewed or published in a medical journal, suggests that even people who have already had the coronavirus could be vulnerable. The same study showed that the P.1 variant could

evade immunity from previous Covid-19 infection by up to 61%.

That variant is now prevalent in Covid-19 patients across at least six Brazilian states, according to a study earlier this month released by the Oswaldo Cruz Foundation (Fiocruz), a Brazilian Ministry of Health research institution. P.1 has also been detected in the United States. United Kingdom and neighboring

"The emergence of new variants, which combine both the potential to be more transmissible and the absence of broad and articulated mitigation and suppression measures, are highly worrisome," the study's authors wrote, urging Brazil to encourage behaviors that limit the viral spread.

'The data showing the prevalence of this variant in several states and its ample spread throughout the country, as well as the challenges presented due to its high level of transmission, reinforce the immediate need to adopt non-pharmaceutical measures in order to reduce the speed or its spread and the increases in cases."

Felipe Naveca, virologist and researcher at Fiocruz Amazonia and one of the main authors of the study, told CNN that the Covid-19 virus and the different variants and strains are

likely to get stronger if not stopped. "This is what viruses do: They evolve, they get stronger. The only

way to stop it is to contain its spread, which is why we need restrictive measures -- there is no other solution. Even if the Government decrees a national lockdown, we need the population to adhere. The action of each one of us will impact everyone as a whole," Naveca said.

Hope could be on its way, in the form of vaccines. But Brazil's vaccination rollout was slow in comparison to other countries, including others in the region, like Chile and Mexico.

In January, health regulator Anvisa authorized emergency use of vaccines by Sinovac and Oxford/AstraZeneca. Since then, roughly 4% of Brazil's 211 million citizens have received at least one vaccine dose, according to data from the Brazilian Health Ministry, and 2.3 million have had two

According to the Health Ministry, Brazil is in negotiation to buy Pfizer, Moderna, Janssen, Sputinik and Covaxin vaccines as well, though only the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine among those has been granted authorization from Anvisa. Bolsonaro had long promoted the Oxford AstraZeneca vaccine as the only one he would back, dismissing and discrediting many of the other vaccines on the market, including Pfizer's. Brazil's health minister Eduardo Pazuello even turned down an August offer from Pfizer to purchase up to 70 million doses of its vaccine. (CNN)

Texas reopens '100%' as US vaccination drive gains pace

Texas lifted its mask mandate and capacity restrictions on restaurants and other businesses Wednesday, despite experts warning the "100 percent" relaxation of coronavirus curbs will exacerbate the spread of worrying variants.

The Lone Star State became the fifth to rescind its face covering order in a sign of increasing optimism about the pandemic in the world's hardest hit country, where the infection rate has fallen dramatically since January but still remains high in absolute terms.

"It is now time to open Texas 100 percent," said Governor Greg Abbott when he announced his plans to ease restrictions last week.

The Texas Rangers meanwhile are set to become the first major US professional sports team to welcome back a capacity crowd after announcing ticketing plans for the upcoming baseball season on Wednesday.

The Rangers said their 40,300-capacity ballpark would operate at full capacity for two exhibition games against Milwaukee on March 29-30 and the season opener against

the Toronto Blue Jays on April 5. The moves came as the immunization campaign was gathering momentum, with 62 million people so far receiving one or more doses-about 19 percent of the adult population -- and Alaska became the first state to open up the shots to anyone

aged 16 or over. The White House on Wednesday announced plans to acquire 100 million more vaccines from Johnson &

Johnson, giving the United States contingency capacity as it targets inoculating the adult population of 270 million people by May.

"We need maximum flexibility, there's always a chance that we'll encounter unexpected challenges, or there'll be a new need for a vaccination effort," said President Joe

Biden, explaining the decision. He added: "If we have a surplus, we're going to share it with the rest of the world," stressing the US had committed \$4 billion to Covax, the global initiative to distribute vaccines to lower-income countries.

Biden said he would launch the

next phase of the country's Covid response in a primetime address

Thursday. In downtown Houston, the biggest city of the nation's second most populous state, the overwhelming majority of people continued to wear their masks despite the new order.

Businessman Omar Abu-Shaaban called the move a politically motivated nod to the governor's anti-science Republican base. "I don't think he had the health of the people in mind,"

But 22-year-old Kade Phillips told AFP he supported the decision.

US orders 200m J & J shots

President Joe Biden has ordered almost enough Covid-19 vaccine to fully inoculate every American adult twice, expanding production as he faces both uncertainty about domestic needs and calls from shotstarved allies to share the U.S. supply.

Biden announced Wednesday that he'll double the U.S. order of Johnson & Johnson's singledose vaccine to 200 million shots, after the company struck a deal last week with Merck & Co. to bolster production.

"A lot can happen, a lot can change, and we need to be prepared," Biden said at the White House, praising the companies.

Biden's administration has said its priority is vaccinating every willing American before sending any shots abroad. Wednesday's announcement shows that the president expects a surplus of vaccine before the U.S. begins to help inoculate the world. beyond contributing billions of dollars to a vaccine program for low-income countries.

Administration officials have defended the U.S. approach, saying a vaccine hasn't yet been approved for children and it isn't clear which one will work best for them. Also, they say, booster shots may be necessary if the immunity



that vaccines provide isn't long-lasting or doesn't protect against new variants.

More Than 326 Million Shots Given: Covid-19

One Biden official, who asked not to be identified discussing a sensitive matter. invoked the country's death toll - which stood at 529,000 Wednesday, according to data from Johns Hopkins University. The U.S. has had more Covid deaths than any other country and needs its vaccines to protect against further fatalities, the official said.

Nonetheless, Biden's new order of J&J's shots risks further exacerbating a vaccine gap between have and have-not nations. Mexico last week asked the U.S. to share doses and was

rebuffed, and the European Union has made similar appeals Countries that focus on

immunizing their own populations face a bitter reality that the pandemic will end only when it ends everywhere. Variants of the virus also tend to emerge when it is spreading unchecked -raising the chance that a more dangerous version could pop up abroad and then reach U.S. soil. The EU has exported 34 million doses so far, including nearly a million to the U.S., according to data revealed Wednesday.

Even as Biden said the world will have to wait for help from the U.S., he acknowledged the need. "We're going to start off making sure Americans are taken care of, first, but we're then going to try to help the rest of the world," Biden said. "We're not going to be ultimately safe until the world is safe.'

The White House hasn't said whether any U.S.-produced vaccines have been exported. Moderna Inc. has said its U.S. production is entirely for domestic use. Pfizer Inc. and J&J have declined to say whether they've exported any U.S.produced doses or plan to. An administration official, who requested anonymity to discuss the issue, said there was no outright ban on the export of vaccines. The official added that the companies were free to ship their vaccines abroad, but that they had to complete the requirements spelled out in their contracts with the U.S. Bloomberg

3,000 nurses dead, Covid exodus looming: global federation

At least 3,000 nurses have been killed by Covid-19, the global nurses' federation said Thursday as it warned of a looming exodus of health workers traumatised by the

Exactly one year on since the World Health Organization (WHO) first described Covid-19 as a pandemic, the International Council of Nurses said burn-out and stress had led millions of nurses to consider quitting the profession.

And once the pandemic is over, a dwindling number of experienced nurses could be left to handle the giant backlog of regular hospital care that had been postponed due to the crisis, the ICN warned.

The known death toll of nurses killed by the disease -- compiled from just 60 countries -- is likely to be a gross underestimate of the full total, the federation said.

ICN chief executive Howard Catton said nurses had gone through "mass traumatisation" during the pandemic, being pushed to physical and mental exhaustion.

"They reach a point where they've given everything they can," he told reporters. Catton said the global workforce of 27 million nurses was six million short going into the pandemic - and four million were heading for retirement



by 2030. In a report, the ICN said the pandemic "could trigger a mass exodus from the profession" from as early as the second half of 2021. The global nurse shortage could widen to nearly 13 million,

it added. We could be on a precipice," said Catton, recalling that it took three to four years of training to produce a novice nurse.

He said nurses had done a "phenomenal" job "to lead the world through this pandemic", saying they would share an equal platform with the vaccine creators in the eventual history of Covid-19.

But once the pandemic has passed, frazzled nurses will then have to deal with all the unmet healthcare needs and waiting lists, whilst also facing likely staff short-

Founded in 1899, the ICN is a federation of more than 130 national nursing associations.

It called for governments to invest in training more new nurses to address the global shortage.

It also called for better pay to encourage existing staff to stay on to bolster health systems for future crises, if nothing else.

The WHO wants to see healthcare workers in all countries being vaccinated within the first 100 days of 2021.

Catton said that was the start line rather than the finish line, and voiced "grave concerns" at the unequal distribution of vaccines between rich and poor countries.

For nurses, facing an elevated risk of infection, immunisation "is about their right to being protected at work," he said.

"Not being protected at work adds to their distress." Recalling the public appreciation shown towards nurses in the early stages of the pandemic, Catton said that now, "overwhelmingly, nurses would rather be getting their vaccine than a round of applause".

The ICN strongly recommended that all nurses take a Covid-19 "It is an issue of protection and

safety for patients," Catton said. "If somebody doesn't have the vaccine then it may well be that you have to look at redeploying them to other areas. AFP

Questions raised over missing Tanzania leader

Questions have been raised over the health of Tanzanian President John Magufuli who has not been seen in public for 11 days.

Opposition leader Tundu Lissu has told the BBC that according to his sources the president is being treated in hospital for coronavirus in Kenya.

The BBC has not been able to verify this report independently.

Mr Magufuli has faced criticism for his handling of Covid-19, with his government refusing to buy vac-

The East African nation has not published its coronavirus cases since May. Its 61-year-old president

has called for prayers and herbal-infused steam therapy to counter the virus. Mr Lissu says he was told that President Magufuli had been flown to Kenya

for treatment at Nairobi Hospital on Monday night. According to the opposition leader, the president has suffered a cardiac arrest and is in a critical

There has been no official response from the gov-

condition.

ernment, which has warned against publishing unverified information about the Tanzanian leader, who was last seen at an official event in Dar es Salaam on 27 February.

Nairobi Hospital also said it could not comment. Another Tanzanian poli-

tician told Associated Press, on condition of anonymity for fear of a backlash, that he had spoken to people close to the president who said he was seri-

ously ill and in hospital. Mr Lissu told the BBC that the government's

silence was fuelling rumours and was irresponsible, and the president's health should not be a private matter.




WHAT HAVE WE DONE FOR **RECONCILIATION?**

SURANGA THE CAGER TURNED RUGGERITE

The second row forwards in rugby should be tall, powerful players with excellent scrummaging skills and line out jumping. . In open play the second row forwards should perform the role of support players in rucks and mauls. Suranga Amarasinghe, well-known as Chunchu in the sporting circles, was one of the top players in this position when he donned the College, Club and National jersey.

Suranga was born to a humble family in Mirigama in the Gampaha District in 1977 He had three brothers, His younger brother Chathuranga played for Trinity and St. Peter's and captained Havelocks in 2009. Suranga was enrolled at Trinity College, Kandy and completed his education there from the primary to higher studies from 1985 to 1996, having being boarded at the College hostel. His first appearance in sports was basketball with the under -17 team. He dribbled the ball until he played for the under-19 school team, which won the championship at the All-Island National Games in 1993. He went on to captain the Trinity College Basketball team in 1995, and was awarded basketball colours in the previous year. His coach was DS Pingamage.

He was very keen on sports from his younger days and being at Trinity they were inculcated with the idea of rugby being a "prestigious" sport. He started playing rugby from under-9 age group and surged ahead to represent the school in all age groups. His first year of playing with the first XV was in 1994. That

which was the 50th Bradby Shield with Royal winning the first leg 10-3 and the second leg ended in a draw in Kandy (8-all), which saw Royal retaining the 'Bradby'. Lohan Ratwatte and Janaka Kiridena coached them. In his second year in first XV rugby, the team was captained by Harris Omar, under whom they won the 'Bradby Shield' and De Saram Trophy, where the team was under the watchful eyes of Quentin Israel.

In his third year, he captained the first XV in 1996 and under his captaincy it was an outstanding rugby season. They lost only one game in the League to Isipathana. At half time the score was 13-0, in favour of Trinity but Pathanians bounced back gallantly to win 20-13. They also ended runners up in the Inter Schools 10-aside rugby tournament played in Nittawela. Trinity won both legs of the Bradby Shield with an aggregate of 42-6 (30-3 and 12-3) coached by Quentin Israel. It was the highest score by Trinity against Royal after the 1944 season captained by S.B Pilapitiya. While playing for College, he represented Sri Lanka Schools Rugby Team in 1995 touring Chinese Taipei with the Junior National Rugby

He was awarded the prestigious 'Rugby Lion' in 1995 and 1996 seasons for his unstinted performance, after receiving the rugby Colours in 1994. While he was into basketball and rugby, he excelled in Athletics to receive the award for Champion Athlete in 1996, under-19 age

After his school career, he decided to continue his rugby career with Kandy Sports Club from 1996 until 2000. He continued to bind in the second row along with Asoka Jayasena and his school mate Pradeep Basnayake. He made his debut for Kandy in 1996, played seven games in the same season under Imthi Marikar's captaincy. His second year at Kandy, was under the captaincy of Lasantha Wijesuriya, where they remained unbeaten winning the triple crown in 1997. He had the privilege of playing with some outstanding international players such as Apisai Nagata, Opethi Turuva and Manasa Qoro coached by retired senior

DIG Nimal Lewke. While playing for Kandy, he got the National call in 1996 and locked also a footy player.

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Improving trade deficit, increase in remittances

helps external sector recovery

Sri Lanka's external sector continued to recover in many aspects during January 2021, mainly supported by an improved trade deficit and a notable increase in workers' remittances.

The reduced deficit in the trade account in January 2021 compared to January 2020 was the result of a larger decline in merchandise imports over merchandise exports. Meanwhile, workers' remittances continued to record a notable growth in January 2021, strengthening the external

current account. In the financial account, foreign investment in the government securities market recorded a marginal net inflow while the Colombo Stock Exchange (CSE) recorded net outflows in January 2021

The Sri Lankan rupee experienced depreciation pressure in January 2021, but measures taken by the Central Bank and the continuation of restrictions on nonessential imports by the Government helped contain this pressure.

The deficit in the trade account narrowed in January 2021 by US dollars 63 million to US dollars 667 million, from US dollars 730 million recorded in January 2020, with a larger decline in imports compared to the decline in exports. In December 2020, the trade deficit was US dollars 562

million. Earnings from merchandise exports in January 2021 were 8.0% lower compared to January 2020. Earnings from exports in January 2021 were recorded at US

dollars 924 million compared to US dollars 1,005 million in January 2020 and US dollars 964 million in December 2020. Industrial exports: Earnings from the export of industrial goods declined by 11.4% in January 2021.

Export earnings from agricultural goods increased by 5.9% in January 2021 on a year-on-year basis, mainly due to the increase in the export of spices, such as cinnamon, pepper and cloves. Earnings from tea exports increased marginally due to

the price increase, while volume exported had declined.

Merchandise imports declined by 8.3% in January 2021 compared to January 2020, continuing the yearon-year declining trend observed since March 2020.

Expenditure on merchandise imports amounted to US dollars 1,592 million in January 2021 compared to US dollars 1,735 million. The restrictions imposed by the Government on the importation of non-essential goods mainly contributed to this

Expenditure on the importation of consumer goods in declined by 7.0% compared to January 2020, due to the 27.9% decline in the "nonfood consumer goods' imports, due to reduction in the import of personal vehi-

With the reopening of the country's borders to international tourists, tourist arrivals gradually picked up in January 2021. Accordingly, 1,682 arrivals were recorded in January 2021.

Remittances increased by 16.3% cent in January 2021,

This was opined by Chief Delegate of Delegation of German Industry and Commerce in Sri Lanka (AHK Sri Lanka), Andreas Hergenröther, (AHK Sri Lanka), at a seminar in Jaffna hosted in collaboration with the German Agency of International Development Cooperation (GIZ), to raise awareness among potential exporters

and industry representatives to increase export capacities of organic products to the

Furthermore, he highlighted that the global market for organic food reached EURO 106 billion in 2019. Retail sales in the European Union (EU) were valued at EURO 41.4 billion. As the largest organic retail sales market in the EU, Germany accounted for EURO 11,970 million in

Major Sri Lankan organic products exported to the EU include cinnamon, coconutbased products, organic tea and tropical fruits such as

papaya, pineapple, banana, and vegetables such as potato, carrots, leeks, and legumes. Sivapalan Pakeetharan, Program Officer-Enterprise development, from GIZ introduced the Program to the organic-sector exporters and discussed the criteria required to embark on this area.

During the event, Marvin Woischnik-Lange, Head of Public Projects at AHK Sri Lanka presented information on key topics concerning the EU legislations for organic farming, technical regulations and controls, certifications, standards, packaging, labelling, logistics, risk manage-

ment, and other requirements of the European consumer. S. Maheswaran, President -Thenmaradchi Fruit Producers and Sellers Cooperative Society/ Palamuthirsolai presented a development testimonial and Dr. Prabu Nadaraja, Co-founder of Organic Movement of North & East (OMNE) expounded on the prospects of organic farming in North and East Sri Lanka.

Smarter Food Policy could boost health and economic recovery of Asian cities

Across the world, the COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the critical importance of reliable food systems that provide healthy and affordable diets to all.

That is true also in Asia where cities, large and small, contend with a wide range of food-related issues on a daily basis but often lack a dedicated or coherent set of food policies. Arguing that food systems are central to the topmost priorities of Asian cities, from nurturing jobs and businesses that are core to a city's identity to managing waste and congestion, a new World Bank book

calls for cities to "get smart to get RICH"—that is, to pursue policies that foster

reliable, inclu-

sive, competitive, and healthy ("RICH") food systems that are better

aligned with cities' contemporary challenges and aspirations.

"RICH Food, Smart City seeks to put food on the menu of urban decision-makers in Asia to generate positive feedback loops between healthy people, a healthy



planet, and healthy economies," said Martien van Nieuwkoop, Global Director of Agriculture and Food, World Bank.

Based on the first systematic survey of urban food policies in 170 Asian cities in 21 countries,

undertaken in partnership with the UN Food and Agriculture Organization, the study finds that only 8% of surveyed cities are "food-smart" intervening in the food system in ways that are forward-looking, holistic, and inclusive.

Two ladies at Finlays shattering a 154-year old glass ceiling in Sri Lankan tea

With people the world over celebrating International Women's Day, a collective understanding is beginning to emerge with regard to the tremendous and essential contributions made by women and girls in every aspect of life. One of the key priorities in promoting equal rights and opportunities regardless of gender is in the space of management.

Among the many sectors in which women tend to play such a critical role is in agriculture and plantations, however, typically, even here, they have often been confined to field operations, not management. However, even in this traditionally male-dominated industry, progress is happening, thanks in particular to the efforts of domestic Regional Plantation Companies (RPCs) like Finlays Tea Estates Sri Lanka (Pvt)

Choosing to challenge stereotypes on women in plantations, the Company has set itself the goal of achieving 30% in management positions by 2025. To that end, Finlays commenced actively recruiting women into these critical roles and already, these efforts have yielded tremendous results, as seen in the remarkable stories of two young female Assistant Superintendents at the company - Piriyanthi Makeswaranthan and NavodaVijayagani.

Reject stereotypes - women are more than capable

Born and raised in the relatively conservative society of Jaffna, from a young age, Piriyanthi always sought to challenge herself and never backed away from a task, especially if it was one which 'tradition' dictated should only be taken

Growing up, she would play every sport that her brother and other boys from her neighborhood were engaged in. Eventually, this attitude led her to train in Taekwondo, and even win a bronze medal at the Inter-University championships. Thereafter, she attended group classes on boxing, and trained herself without any formal coaching to compete in the sport as well, and became one of a handful of women to represent the Northern Province in the sport, and even win another bronze medal at a national tournament in 2017.

"I've always wanted to only take up activities that challenged me and required me to think quickly and multi-task. I think this attitude itself came from my family, who always encouraged me and taught me to always believe that there is no limit on what a woman can do. My sports background helped me to really hone this confidence in myself and my abilities," Piriyanthi explains.

Graduating with a degree in Agri-

cultural Technology from the University of Peradeniya, Piriyanthi was surprised to see that Finlays had posted up adverts at her University for management trainees in plantations, and specifically requested women to sign up. Even though previously she had never envisioned a future in plantations, when she saw the listing, she felt the calling to

apply.
"While I was in University I became fascinated with the potential of agriculture as a business is given the most technological advancements we had seen in recent years, but in practice, it definitely took me some time to adjust to the culture, processes, and the kind of work that is required at a management level on a tea estate. But it was exactly because it was difficult and challenging, and the kind of work that people don't associate with women, that I wanted to prove - to myself, and to other women - that we are perfectly capable of succeeding in any business, and that we can work just as

well as a man," she asserts. After receiving 6 months of preliminary training at Newburgh Estate under the guidance of Finlays Estate Superintendent Richard Ohlmus, Piriyanthi quickly learned the ropes before being granted her first

aspirations. We were appointed by our company because they believed in us and because they understand that it does not matter at all if you are a man or woman. If you are determined, and you put your best effort in, you can always succeed."

"It's unfortunate that even today, many in our society think of having a daughter as being a burden. But I am lucky that my parents and my family never sought to impose that kind of thinking on me. I was always encouraged to compete, and so I never felt limited by virtue of being a woman. While I will continue to pursue a career in plantations management, I hope that my example studied Tea Technology and Value Addition, before going on to complete a Post-Graduate diploma in Agriculture at the University of Peradeniya. Thereafter she joined the field of Tea Research, and while completing her training there, she had a chance conversation with her Manager, where she inquired into the kinds of work available to someone of her qualifications.

It was then that she too learned of the female recruitment initiative launched by Finlays, and soon after, was accepted into the company's Management Trainee program.

"A big part of why I was so interested in tea is because I love the upcountry environment and the climate. I also always found the science behind commercial tea cultivation to be fascinating. When I found out about Finlay's looking for recruits, I didn't even know what the position was going to be, I just knew that I wanted the opportunity of working directly in the sector. I also knew that it was a field in which women traditionally do not enter, and I felt like I could be one of the first to challenge that perception," Navoda explained.

Today, she is the very first female Assistant Superintendent to be posted to Alnwick Estate where she manages a team of 130 individuals. While this role has come with its fair share of challenges, Navoda stated that she has grown to relish the complexity of her work just as much as she did her theoretical studies.

"Being part of the management means that we are often called upon to resolve issues between people, not just focus on agriculture. This has been one of the most valuable experiences in my professional development. We are required to be confident, and decisive in all of our actions, and in doing this, I have learned a great deal more about myself, and how much I am truly capable of," she said.

Moving forward, Navoda aims to not only continue to rise up in her career but also apply specialized knowledge of agriculture and science towards the implementation of the latest sustainable agricultural best practices, particularly with regards to soil management and crop health.

"I feel fortunate that I have been able to find a career path that challenges me, but where my contributions and knowledge are valued and appreciated. My passion for agriculture is what led me to where I am today, as well as the decision of my company to recognize that women can make extremely important contributions to this industry. I hope that my story can help to raise awareness of this fact and one day inspire more women to fully pursue their dreams," Navoda stated.

More options from ComBankQ+ payment app 'In-App Bill Payments' feature

Except for her greying hair, her dusky skin was flawless and taut. Engaging men and boys for gender equality

ri Lanka ranks 90 out of 189 in the Gender Inequality Index (2019). Over the years, significant strides have been made to create equal opportunities for women, particularly in terms of free and equal access to education and healthcare. However, in the face of structural barriers and harmful societal norms that perpetuates gender stereotypes - while gender inequalities can affect anyone - evidence points to women facing the most discrimination particularly in their own homes and social spheres.

The Gender Social Norms Index (2020), produced by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), has found pervasive bias - by both men and women against women worldwide. According to the analysis, 30 percent of women and men interviewed across 75 countries agree that it is justifiable for a man to beat his partner. A study titled 'Broadening Gender: Why Masculinities Matter' (2013) highlighted that 20

percnt of men in Sri Lanka indi-

cated that they had committed some form of intimate partner violence in their lifetime and 66 percent felt that this was due to a sense of "entitlement". Similarly, the recently published Women's Wellbeing Survey (2019) found that 35.3 percent of women in Sri Lanka agreed that men can have a good reason to hit their wives. The ongoing pandemic itself has disproportionally affected women with an increase in unpaid domestic work and care burdens, economic
