No truth in Opposition allegations - Yapa

Parlimantarian Anura Priyadarshana Yapa said yesterday that there was no truth in the Opposition's allegations on tax fraud in sugar imports.

He added that the Government has not given any tax concession to any private sugar importer.

He said that in recent years, the prices of essential food items had increased in November and December. "In October last year, our Government made several policy decisions to give relief to the people. On October 13 we issued a Gazette bringing down the Rs.50 import duty on a kilo of sugar to 25 cents. The price of a kilo of sugar between Rs.137 and Rs. 138 at that

time. We thought that bringing down the tax would result in the lowering of the prices of sugar in the market. That did not happen. There had already been stocks of around 150,000 metric tons in warehouses belonging to the importers and they did not release their stocks. So, a private company came forward and imported sugar under the new price and released them to the market. That was what exactly happened.

The price of sugar has gradullay decreased in the market afther the tax reduction. Today, a kilo of sugar is Rs.118. Otherwise, it would have been in the range of Rs.155 to Rs.160 a kilo.

The case was taken up before the Colombo High Court Trial-at-Bar, bench comprising High Court Judges Damith Thotawatte, Manjula Tilakaratne and Mohamed Irfadeen.

The Attorney General had filed 32 indictments against 11 accused, including the former Finance Minister and former Governor of the Central Bank Arjuna Mahendran.

Solicitor General Haripriya Jayasundara appearing on behalf of the Attorney General informed the Court that she was opposed to granting bail to the accused, who had done great harm to the national economy, interest rates and the public.

She strongly opposed bail as it was a special case affecting the national economy, she added.

She further said the public was demanding justice for the Treasury Bond issue and that it was the only case in the Asian region in which a finance minister had been named as an accused in a single

She also sought from the Court to issue relevant orders as the former Governor of the Central Bank and the 9th accused are abroad.

The Deputy Solicitor General pointed out that the accused Ravi Karunanayake had obtained a house as a gift from the 4th accused in the case. She also stated that she was opposed to granting

The Government and the country's banking system suffered losses by conducting three such bond auctions in as little as 23 months, and that the first bond auction was held on February 27, 2015, and the case was referred to the Colombo High Court Trialat-Bar.

The Solicitor General's refusal to grant bail as the former Minister of Finance is a defendant in this case and another case related to the fraud related to the second bond auction on March 31, 2016. She said she was opposed to granting bail to the accused only on the nature of the offence.

President's Counsels Shavendra Fernando, Gam-

ini Marapana, Anil de Silva and Anuja Premaratne appeared for the defense.

The Defence stated that the Attorney General has no right to oppose bail under sub-section 450 (06) of the Criminal Procedure Code against the accused and that the High Court can grant bail under Section 14 of the Bail Act.

The Defence said the allegations made by the Attorney General were incomplete and that it was not justifiable to oppose bail when the Attorney General had not submitted the attachments to the charges.

The Attorney General alleged that the Perpetual Treasuries limited has used Central Bank's important undisclosed information to artificially alter the final outcome of the Treasury Bond auction. The Attorney General further alleged that this fraud has caused injustice to other primary sellers in the bond market and the PTL has acted cunningly and made a huge profit and conspired to cause a huge loss to the Govern-

ment. The charges are to be filed Under Section 56 of the Registered Securities and Exchange Ordinance for conspiracy, criminal misappropriation, cheating and market manipulation in respect of the Bond auctions in March 2016.

The indictments are to be filed against eleven accused. They are; former Finance Minister Ravi Karunanayke, CBSL former Governor Arjuna Mahendran, Perpetual Treasuries Limited (PTL) beneficiary owner Arjun Aloysius, PTL Chief dealer Kasun Palisena, Chairman of PTL Jeffrey Joseph Aloysius, Chitta Ranjan Hulugalle, Muthuraja Surendran, Ajahn Ğardiye Punchihewa, , Sangarapillai Pathumanapan, Badugoda Hewa Indika Saman

The Attorney General alleged that the accused could be charged for conspiracy to commit criminal misappropriation in respect of treasury bonds to the face value of Rs.36.98 billion and Rs.15 billion respectively in March, 2016.

The highest numbers of casualties of road accidents in Sri Lanka are motorcyclists and 950 of them died on the roads last year. During the last year, 638 pedestrians and 159 cyclists were killed in road accidents.

Moreover, motorcyclists are responsible for most fatal accidents causing 5,592 road accidents during the last five years.

This was revealed during an awareness programme conducted by the Transport Ministry for motorcyclists on how to ride safely in keeping with road rules to prevent motorcycle accidents. Motorcyclists were also educated

on the importance of wearing helmets which are on par with international standards.

During the programme, common reasons for the accidents caused by motorcyclists were identified.

The main reasons are not wearing safety helmets, riding at high speed and drunk driving. The authorities urged motorcyclists to purchase and use helmets bearing the SLS 517 certification issued by the SLSI.

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AstraZeneca Vaccine:

A safe vaccine that will help win COVID battle

hen the Oxford/Astra-Zeneca vaccine was first authorized by the UK Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency, it was hailed as a milestone in turning the tide on the coronavirus.

But in the time since, this highly efficacious vaccine has suffered a lot of reputational damage. In January, the German press and French President Emmanuel Macron falsely claimed that it is largely ineffective in people over 65, despite there being no evidence to support this.

Yet, concrete evidence on how protective the vaccine is in older people has been lacking, leading some European countries to restrict the vaccine to under-65s. Together, these factors appear to have created high levels of scepticism in Europe and low levels of

Thankfully, more information on how well the vaccine works is arriving all of the time -- and seeing the vaccine's positive effects, some countries are now reversing their restrictions on giving it to over-65s. Here is what we know so far about the vaccine's effects.

Is the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine as protective as the others?

Trials suggested it is a bit less protective than other vaccines. Pfizer's, for example, prevented symptomatic disease 95 percent of the time in testing, whereas the Oxford/Astra-Zeneca vaccine did so 70 percent of the time.

But recent real-world data from the UK suggests that the Oxford/Astra-Zeneca vaccine might actually be a bit better than Pfizer's at preventing serious disease and hospitalization. However, these studies have not been set up to avoid outside biases affecting results. For example, the Pfizer vaccine was rolled out first, so might have been given disproportionately to more vulnerable people. Also, these studies are pre-prints, meaning they have not been checked by other

scientists yet. So whether the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine is more or less effective than others at preventing COVID-19 is not clear yet. The important thing to remember is that all the authorized vaccines are safe and offer very good levels of protection against COVID-19. If you are offered any vaccine, you should take it

Does the vaccine work in older people?

An early stage of testing - a combined phase 1 and 2 trial -- strongly suggested that the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine would offer protection to older people. It showed the vaccine generated just as strong immune response in older participants as younger ones.

However, as we do not know to what extent different parts of the immune response act against the virus, this alone did not prove that the vaccine would be effective in this age group. And in the final phase of testing - phase 3 trials - which are designed to prove that a vaccine is protective, there were not enough people over 55 to give a reliable estimate of protection for this group.

You might experience some, but they should not be severe or last long. 



ETI case: Edirisinghe siblings remanded till March 30

The former directors of ETI and Swarnamahal Jewellers (Pvt) Ltd, who were arrested on Tuesday under the terms of the Money Laundering Act were ordered to be remanded till March 30 by Colombo Fort Magistrate Priyantha Liyanage yesterday.

Senior Deputy Solicitor General (SDIG) Haripriya Jayasundara appearing on behalf of the prosecution stated that charges have been filed against the suspects in terms of the Finance Business Act and the Money Laundering Act.

Jeevaka Edirisinghe, Nalaka Edirisinghe, Asanka Edirisinghe and Anjali Edirisinghe were arrested on the instructions of the Attorney General on March 16.

SDSG Jayasundara further pointed out that the ETI and Swarnamahal had faced a tinued to accept deposits even after Central Bank regulation.

"By the time the Central Bank appointed a Financial Management Board in 2018 to take full control of the two institutions, ETI had liabilities of Rs 6.4 billion and Swarnamahal Rs 7.2 billion," SDSG Jayasundara stated.

She further explained that the total deposits of Rs. 13.6 billion had been maintained by these institutions as undisclosed accounts in a manner not subject to Central Bank regulation.

Accordingly, the SDSG Jayasundara said that these former directors had committed offences of fraud and breach of criminal trust mentioned in the Penal Code.

SDSG Haripriya Jayasundara also men-

tained black money which is an offence under the Money Laundering Act in maintaining accounts not disclosed to the Central Bank.

Meanwhile, President Counsel Anuja Premaratne appearing on behalf of the suspects informed the Court since January 2, 2018 ETI was handled by the Central Bank and under authorization of Central Bank. Swarnamahal had been also sold to another

"Swarnamahal had been sold and that money was used to repay depositors. Shares were also transferred to the Central Bank," he said.

President's Counsel Anuja Premarathne added that there was no evidence to charge these suspects and to remand them.

Counsel calls for expediting investigation

The Court of Appeal was yesterday informed that former Criminal Investigation Department (CID) Director Shani Abaysekara's life was in danger due to poor health. This was revealed when the revision applications filed by the former CID Director and Sub-Inspector Sugath Mendis were taken up before the Court of Appeal.

Abaysekara was arrested and remanded for allegedly fabricating evidence in the murder of businessman Mohammed Shiyam. Senior Counsel Viran Corea, appearing on behalf of the former CID Director, submitted to court that there was grave urgency as the period the suspect was being held in remand custody was too long.

The Court of Appeal directed the Attorney-General to file objections by April 29 without asking for more time, as a matter of urgency. Corea submitted to court that Shani Abaysekara's life and health are being jeopardised by the officials who are delaying the investigation.

He added that it is an established legal principle of punishment and should only be allowed strictly to the extent absolutely needed. He said that the time taken for the case was too

Meanwhile, the revision application filed by Sub-Inspector Sugath Mendis, seeking an order to release him on bail, was fixed for support on April 1.

Filing revision applications through their lawyers, the petitioners requested the Court of Appeal to revise and set aside the Gampaha High Court's order to refuse bail and sought an order to grant bail to the petitioners on any condition that court shall deem fit.

Shani Abeysekara was arrested by the Colombo Crimes Division (CCD) for allegedly fabricating evidence in the murder of businessman Mohammed Shiyam in 2013, in which then Deputy Inspector General of Police Vass Gunawardena and several others were sentenced to death for committing and conspiring to commit murder. Counsels Chaminda Athukorala, with Hafeel Faris, appeared on behalf of Sugath Mendis.

Guarding against a repeat

he Government has ruled out imposing travel restrictions during the Sinhala and Tamil New Year period but wants the public to observe the prevailing health guidelines. Co-Cabinet Spokesman Minister Dr. Ramesh Pathirana said the Government had not taken any decision to impose travel restrictions during the upcoming New Year season although the health authorities have requested the people to restrict their movements. Dr. Pathirana said it was important that people abide by the health guidelines.

After all, it is business as usual in the country with State and private sector institutions, businesses and commercial enterprises operating at full tilt after the year-long enforced closures due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Schools too have opened and sports activities and tournaments now in full swing. So why, one would ask, place roadblocks in the way of people enjoying the New Year festivities?

But a word of caution will not be out of place here. One only has to recall the steep rise in the COVID cases observed after the Christmas and New Year celebrations to entertain thoughts of optimism that the worst is behind us. On that occasion too, restrictions were lifted against the warnings of the PHIs who took the authorities to task subsequently for not paying heed to their pleas. Now health authorities themselves have cautioned against free movement by the public.

They indeed have a case. The public may well entertain notions of safety following the extensive vaccination programme now underway in the Western Province and likely lower their collective guard as happened before. Also unlike the last Sinhala and Tamil New Year, the pandemic has assumed a complex nature with various strains of the virus to contend with against which the vaccine may or may not have an answer.

We have only administered the first dose yet, with those inoculated still under risk until the second jab is received. Even in the case of those who received the first shot there is a time lag of nearly one month before some immunity could set in, according to experts. Thus we are by no means out of the woods, at least for another one month.

As per the opinion of the health experts a careless act by even a single individual could turn the clock back bringing to naught the entire vaccination programme. This is why the health authorities have sounded a word of caution and want the public to restrict their movements. Their logic could also have been based on the fact that the New Year is marked by a mass exodus from Colombo - that not long ago was teeming with pandemic cases - to the villages and there is no guarantee that among this lot there would not be carriers that could take the pandemic to the hitherto largely untouched hinterland.

Asking these people to observe the distance rule too is of no avail. There are a myriad of events and customs associated with the New Year which would make it impossible to observe certain health guidelines such as social distancing. Unlike Christmas that was largely confined to Colombo and limited areas will the Police and PHIs have the necessary manpower resources to enforce the health guidelines in the far flung villages, home to the 70-75 percent of the population celebrating the New Year? Besides, according to reports a number of positive cases had been detected in the Southern Province in the past few days and there is the risk that those leaving for the main cities in the South for the New Year could bring back the virus on their return in which case the vaccination programme would be in

We are sure that the last thing the Government wants to see is the re-escalation of the pandemic in the Western Province after all the trouble it has gone to and resources expended to arrest the runway trend of the virus there. According to State Minister Dr. Sudarshani Fernandopulle the drop in the number of cases in Colombo was not due only to the vaccine but the realization by the public of the risk they run and their strict adherence to the health guidelines. Will they be as careful once they leave Colombo for the villages to celebrate the New Year festivities with all the fun activities associated with it?

The Government of course is in a dilemma. It cannot impose strict restrictions on what after all is a national festival. At the same time it cannot also afford to have another explosion of the virus as witnessed immediately after the Christmas and New Year celebrations where lockdowns were lifted and restrictions dispensed with. It is not feasible to carry out PCR or Antigen tests *en masse* on those exiting the Western Province as was done before, given the sheer numbers who will be homebound for the New Year. The least it could do is exercise maximum vigilance and have a stepped up campaign to inform the public of the ever present danger of another outbreak of the pandemic if precautions are not taken, as a mitigation measure.

A challenging week for Sri Lanka

Hindsight

ri Lanka faces a challenging task at the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) next week as it takes on Western nations which are proposing to pass a Resolution censuring the country for alleged human rights abuses, mostly during the final phase of the Eelam war 12 years ago.

The 47-member Council will vote on a Resolution, the text of which has been weighted heavily against Sri Lanka. The Resolution is now being led mainly by the United Kingdom, Canada and Germany. North Macedonia, Malawi and Montenegro are the other countries of this so-called 'Core Group'.

In the lead up to the Resolution, the United Nation High Commissioner for Human Rights (UNHCHR), Michele Bachelet had released a report assessing Sri Lanka's human rights record. Colombo considers this report extremely biased and founded on unsubstantiated accusations.

The UNHRC resolution on Sri Lanka, which is likely to be put to a vote on Monday is based on this report. Although Colombo has lodged a strong protest regarding the accuracy of the claims made in Bachelet's report, the 'Core Group' countries and the Council have continued to rely on the report.

It is therefore no coincidence and hardly surprising that the report by Bachelet, a former President of Chile who has been the UN's High Commissioner for Human Rights since 2018, and the resolution on Sri Lanka carry the same title: "Promotion of Reconciliation, Accountability and Human Rights."

Initially there were some attempts to modify the language in the Resolution, in an effort to get Sri Lanka to agree with it. However, these efforts failed when the UNHRC remained intransigent regarding the text of some of the more contentious claims in the Resolution.

Colombo has noted that the conduct of the UNHRC has not been impartial in the events leading up to the resolution and the Government has raised at least two instances where the Council appears to be blatantly acting at the behest of certain countries, ignoring Sri Lanka's requests for impartiality.

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

For instance, the Government of Sri Lanka responded to Commissioner Bachelet's report with a detailed, 30-page rebuttal titled "Observations of the Government of Sri Lanka on the Report of the OHCHR on Sri Lanka" highlighting the ambivalence of the claims in the Commissioner's Report.

Despite this document being a formal response from a Government, this was initially not circulated to the members of the UNHRC. It took a statement from Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunawardena at a session dedicated to discuss the Resolution on Sri Lanka to rectify this serious anomaly.

In another detail that is detrimental to Sri Lanka, the proposed Resolution devotes an entire paragraph to what it calls "marginalisation and discrimination against the Muslim community" in the country. This is with reference to regulations banning burials following the COVID-19 pandemic.

The proposed resolution states that "Cremations for those diseased from COVID-19 have prevented Muslims and members of other religions from practicing their own burial religious rites, and has disproportionately affected religious minorities and exacerbated distress and concerns".

It will be recalled that initial guidelines, formulated by health experts in the country, prevented the burial of those who succumbed to COVID-19. These guidelines were formulated based on the available evidence at the time for an illness that was still evolving and regarding which little was known.

This was however seen by some as a communal issue and the Government was accused of attempting to discriminate against the Muslim community. Since then, with more evidence becoming available, the Government has allowed burials and several such burials have been carried out.

Sri Lanka's Permanent Representative at the United Nations in Geneva, C. A. Chandraprema has brought this to the attention of the UNHRC, noting that this item would be redundant at the time the Resolution is formally considered for adoption. Despite these objections, it is still being included.

This move to retain this clause when it serves no valid purpose has been interpreted in Colombo as a move by the 'Core Group' countries to enlist the support of Islamic nations to vote against Sri Lanka. These countries have historically been supportive of Sri Lanka at previous sessions of the UNHRC.

PRIME MINISTER IMRAN KHAN'S VISIT

It may also be a reaction to Pakistani Prime Minister Imran Khan's recent visit to Sri Lanka. Prime Minister Khan concluded a successful two-day visit to the country where bilateral relations were strengthened. The Pakistani Premier is reputed as wielding considerable influence over Islamic states.

Sri Lanka's other neighbour, India, meanwhile has maintained a studied silence on what stance it will adopt. It is known that voting at the UNHRC often follows a pattern of different countries voting in 'blocs'. As such, India's position will have a significant impact on the votes of other countries.

Relations between Colombo and New Delhi have not been the best in recent months. This was after Sri Lanka refused to lease the Eastern Container Terminal (ECT) at the Colombo Port to Indian interests. It is expected that India will abstain from voting on the Resolution relating to Sri Lanka at the UNHRC.

These events have not helped diplomatic consultations regarding the UNHRC Resolution. The Government has strongly maintained that it will not barter away the country's integrity or be intimidated by the threats of sanctions or proceedings against it in an international court of inquiry.

The Government has felt that the UNHRC, instead of being an impartial body that is focused on justice and fair play not only for all citizens but also for sovereign Governments, is being politicised by interested parties and certain countries to further their own agendas and political gains.

Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunawardena said the lead taken by the United Kingdom in the 'Core Group' was not desirable. "It is an unfriendly act by the United Kingdom as a member of the Commonwealth to lead a group sponsoring the Resolution which is intrusive and violates our sovereignty," he said.

There were also concerns in Government that in an unrelated issue, the United Kingdom may lift the proscription on the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). The ban was imposed in 2001 after lobbying by Lakshman Kadirgamar, then Foreign Minister in Chandrika Kumaratunga's Government.

The United Kingdom's Proscribed Organisations Appeal Commission (POAC), an independent body, has ruled that the Home Secretary must consider taking the LTTE off the Government's list of outlawed bodies. Home Secretary Priti Patel has been ordered to review the ban on the terrorist group.

Also agitating for lifting the ban in the United Kingdom is the self-styled 'Trans-national government of Tamil Eelam' (TGTE), a grouping of LTTE rump organisations. The TGTE has launched legal action against the Home Secretary over the ban, saying the LTTE is no longer engaged in terrorism.

It is no co-incidence that among those campaigning vigorously against the Sri Lankan Government at the UNHRC is the TGTE. Its self-proclaimed 'Prime Minister', Visuvanathan Rudrakumaran was one of the first to respond to Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunawardena's remarks to the UNHRC.

"The TGTE calls upon all Member States to introduce a new revised resolution that provides a clear path to justice, meets the Council's obligations as also the global demand for referral of Sri Lanka to the International Criminal Court," Rudrakumaran said, issuing a statement in response to the Minister.

There was also speculation that, while Sri Lanka remained strongly opposed to the UNHRC, it could potentially invite the UN Human Rights Commissioner Michelle Bachelet to visit Sri Lanka. This is being considered on the basis that the Commissioner could then "see for herself" the ground situation.

DIPLOMATIC SUPPORT

The matter is being discussed at the highest levels, officials said, but added that this has not been finalised. If a formal invitation is extended and High Commissioner Bachelet accepts, she would be the third UN High Commissioner for Human Rights to visit Sri Lanka in the last decade.

In 2013, the then United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights Navaneethem Pillay visited Sri Lanka when Mahinda Rajapaksa was President. Three years later, Prince Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein visited Sri Lanka in February 2016. That was when Maithripala Sirisena was President.

However, officials were quick to point out that any such visit, even if it does eventuate, would be after the ongoing sessions of the UNHRC. As such, it is unlikely to have any impact on the current Resolution before the UNHRC where Sri Lanka would require all the diplomatic support it can muster.

With these developments emerging in the corridors of power both in Colombo and in Geneva, the next days will see hectic diplomacy being conducted. The government is likely to go on the offensive, maintaining its stance that its actions in ending the Eelam war have brought peace to Sri Lanka.

Sri Lanka's detractors consist mostly of the LTTE's rump and, unfortunately, a group of nations that cater to their interests perhaps to seek electoral favours from large numbers of voters in those countries to whom they are beholden. However, Sri Lanka has insisted it will oppose the Resolution.

The next stage would be to assess the aftermath. Even if a resolution unfavourable to Sri Lanka is endorsed by the UNHRC, the real implications are unlikely to be daunting in comparison to setting in motion a chain of events that questions the country's actions in winning the Eelam War.

tary-General is a longstanding myth perpetuated mostly outside the United Nations. As an international civil servant, he is expected to shed his political loyalties when he takes office, and more importantly, never seek or receive instructions from any governments.

But virtually every single Secretary-General—nine at last count—has played second fiddle to the world's major powers in violation of Article 100 of the UN Charter.

Over the last few decades, successive Secretaries-Generals have played ball, particularly with the Big Five caving into their demands – in order to avoid a veto, particularly when their re-election comes up before the Security Council.

The current SG Antonio Guterres of Portugal has declared his intention to run for a second term in office, beginning 2022. But he has to placate the big Five or curry favour with them – whichever comes first in order to avoid a veto.

Boutros Boutros-Ghali of Egypt never got a second term because he was vetoed by the US-even though 14 of the 15 members of the Security Council voted in his favour.

When he took office in January 1992, Boutros-Ghali noted that 50 percent of the staff assigned to the U.N.'s administration and management were U.S. nationals, although Washington paid only 25 percent of the U.N.'s regular budget.

Thomas G. Weiss, Distinguished Fellow, Global Governance, the Chicago Council on Global Affairs, told IPS the Secretary-General "gave away the store as part of his campaign in 2016. His re-election effort will follow the same path. The electoral college has five members".

Competence has occasionally been a qualification for the Emergency Relief Coordinator (ERC), but not always. Make that 50% US and 50% second nationality. And equivalent for all countries, noted Thakur.

"In other words, the primary blame for this continued racist domination lies not with the SG, not with the UNSC, but with the GA and its failure to impose standards and accountability," he declared.

Joseph Chamie, an independent consulting demographer and a for-

mer director of the UN Population Division, told IPS while it is understandable that P5 members may wish to maintain their disproportionate advantages, and in some cases, monopoly with respect to USG and higher UN appointments, the world has changed markedly over the past 75 years and appointments at those high levels need to take those changes fully into account.

Simply in terms of demographics, he argued, the P5 members represent substantially less of the world than in the past. In 1950 the P5 countries represented 36 percent of the world's population; today they represent 26

In addition, he said, the educational levels, career experiences and professional dedication of men and women in developing countries have also increased markedly over the past seven decades and in most instances are comparable to those in developed

"It should be obvious to any impartial observer of the repeated breaches of the 1992 General Assembly resolution concerning no national of a Member State should succeed a national of that state in a senior post," he said.

While it is important to have gender equality at high levels of the UN, it is also important to avoid "ringfencing" roles and posts, which contributes to undermining the credibility, effectiveness and support of the United Nations system, said Chamie.

Future appointments

The Secretary-General's decisions on future appointments to high level positions in the Organisation, he said, would benefit greatly from being transparent, inclusive and merit-based.

Mandeep S. Tiwana, Chief Programmes Officer at CIVICUS, who was one of the signatories to the letter addressed to the British Prime Minister, told IPS a key factor holding the UN back from achieving the aims of the UN Charter is the assertion of narrowly defined geo-political interests by the big powers.

"If anything, the pandemic has taught us, it's the need to invest in people centred multilateralism to meet the demands of the 21st century".

He said "it could be a beautiful thing if senior UN appointments reflected the diversity of member states while demonstrating a strong commitment to core UN values."

Hard-nosed assertion of raw pow by the P5 without consistent fidelity to international norms has caused much suffering in the world, declared Tiwana.

As vaccine production and distribution intensifies, rivalry and competition strengthen and the fight for market share and associated disinformation abound worldwide.

Russian President Vladimir Putin has repeatedly indicated that in order to boost sustainable supplies, the country has to build its domestic production capacity while, at the same time, searching for production partnership in foreign countries.

During a meeting with participants in the nationwide mutual assistance campaign We Are Together on March 4 in the Kremlin, Putin stated that "we still have many problems to deal with, but the fact is we have managed to overcome the challenges at hand far more effectively than many other countries with fairly well-developed healthcare systems.

COVID-19 pandemic

conference held on December 17, Putin explained that as the pandemic spreads, millions of coronavirus vaccine doses would have been produced. "Production of vaccine requires relevant plants, enterprises, and hardware—all that will be scaled up," he said.

With regard to cooperation with other countries, it will boost the technological capabilities of enterprises to produce the vaccine. Foreign countries will invest their own money into expanding their production capacities and purchasing the corresponding

"As for cooperation with foreign countries: nothing is stopping us from manufacturing vaccine components at facilities in other countries precisely because we need time to enhance the technological capacities of our vaccine manufacturing enterprises. This does not hinder vaccination in the Russian Federation," he informed.

competitive trend, there are other vaccines such as Oxford/AstraZeneca, Johnson & Johnson and Moderna that have equally become popular in the world. China has approved four vaccines developed by three Chinese companies for general use.

AstraZeneca is a very good company whose vaccine is 61 per cent effective, and our vaccine has an efficiency of 91.6 per cent. Pfizer is being used, about 16 people died in Switzerland following vaccination. Some European countries have stopped administering Pfizer vaccines, due to fatalities.

Vaccine companies

Pfizer is a global company with a remarkable scientific research base. As well-known, India is home to one of the world's largest vaccine manufacturers, the Serum Institute of India, as well as other vaccine companies producing candidates.

Russia works with AstraZeneca after signing a partnership agreement. They proposed a joint project with the Gamaleya Institute to develop a joint product and improve the level of protection ensured by their vaccine.

According to the data from Russia's Anti-Crisis Centre, there are currently 302,281 active coronavirus cases in Russia.

World Health Organisation (WHO) has declared the coronavirus outbreak a pandemic since March 2020. Since then, nearly 120 million cases have now been reported to this organisation, and more than 2.6 million people have lost their lives.

ASTRAZENECA JAB:

EU regulator 'firmly convinced' benefits outweigh risks

THE NETHERLANDS: The EU's medicines regulator said Tuesday it was "firmly convinced" the benefits of AstraZeneca's vaccine outweigh potential risks, insisting there was no evidence linking it to blood clots after several nations suspended the shot over health fears.

The suspensions have provoked intense debate over whether it was prudent to put AstraZeneca inoculations on hold just as vaccination campaigns were beginning to gather pace.

Experts at both the World Health Organization and the European Medicines Agency (EMA) met Tuesday to discuss the vaccine, with the European organisation expected to publish conclusions Thursday.

While millions of doses of the vaccine developed with Oxford University have been administered, small numbers of people have developed blood clots, prompting countries including the EU's three largest nations - Germany, France

More than 382 million doses of vaccine have been administered globally, the vast majority in wealthier countries while many poorer nations have yet to receive a single jab.

AstraZeneca's shot, among the cheapest available, was billed as the vaccine of choice for poorer nations and the clot reports have had an impact beyond Europe.

Countries that have halted or delayed the rollout range from Indonesia and Venezuela to Sweden and the Netherlands.

But Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau urged his citizens to get the AstraZeneca shot. And Thai Prime Minister Prayut Chan-O-Cha was himself injected as his country lifted its own AstraZeneca suspension. "I am an example today," he said.

Biden tells migrants: 'Don't come'

US: US President Joe Biden urged migrants not to come to the United States on Tuesday, as criticism mounted over a surge in people arriving at the southern border with Mexico -- including thousands of unaccompanied children.

"Yes I can say quite clearly don't come over ... Don't leave your town or city or community," he said in an interview with ABC News, addressing the migrants.

Speaking hours after his head of homeland security defended the administration's imigration policies, Biden also shrugged off claims that his dismantling of former president Donald Trump's tough stance had encouraged the surge, pointing out that there had been similar surges in 2019 and 2020.

The idea that Joe Biden said 'come' - I heard the other day that they're coming because I'm a nice guy... Here's the deal, they're not," he said.

On January 20, his first day in office, Biden scrapped several of Donald Trump's contentious immigration policies, including halting new construction of a border wall and





proposing legislation to create a citizenship pathway for the nearly 11 million people living illegally in the US.

Republican critics say Biden's policies caused a sharp increase in migrants seeking to cross into the US illegally.

The president spoke a day after after top Republican congressman Kevin McCarthy visited the border in Texas with fellow Republican

lawmakers and accused Biden of creating a "crisis."

Biden's Chief of Homeland Security Alejandro Mayorkas on Tuesday also defended the administration's immigration

Mayorkas acknowledged the United States was "on pace" to encounter more migrants at the border than at any time in two decades, but said such spikes were "not new," having also occurred in 2019, 2014 and earlier.

"The situation we are currently facing at the southwest border is a difficult one,' Mayorkas said in a statement.

'We are keeping our borders secure, enforcing our laws, and staying true to our values and principles."

US: Eight people, most of them Asian women, were killed in shootings at three different spas in the US state of Georgia Tuesday, with a 21-year-old white man in custody on suspicion of staging all three attacks, police said.

Trump encourages supporters get COVID-19 jab

US: Former President Donald Trump on Tuesday encouraged his Republican supporters - one of the main groups resistant to COVID-19 vaccines -- to get their shots.

"I would recommend it," Trump said during an interview on Fox News. "I would recommend it to a lot of

people that don't want to get it and a lot of those people voted for me, frankly,' "It's a great vaccine, it's a safe vaccine and it's something that works."

This was Trump's most explicit endorsement for the national mass vaccination campaign since he left office in January

All other living former Presidents, including Democrat Barack Obama and Republican George W. Bush, have delivered high profile public service announcements.

But Trump has largely been silent while the man who defeated him, President Joe Biden, masterminds the vaccine rollout. Polls show that Republican men, who are

overwhelmingly supporters of Trump and his "Make America Great Again" or MAGA platform, are the leading vaccine skeptics. Meanwhile, Trump remained non-committal about seeking to recapture the Presiden-

cy following his one term in office. "Based on every poll, they want me to run



again," he said. "But we're going to take a look and we'll see.'



The old ribbon typewriter battles for life at Hulftsdorp

oday we live in a digitally dominated era. Our communication has rapidly grown to depend on iPhones, tablets, 4G technology and a myriad of social media platforms. People do not write or receive letters anymore, in the true sense of handwritten letters.

Birthday cards often take the form of e-cards. The vibrant city of Colombo has undergone a tremendous and beautiful change. The old colonial buildings have been subdued by stunning high-rise towers. I have not seen a red double-decker bus in a long time. Perhaps one of the refreshing sights in Colombo is the presence of the smart mounted police officers, riding their horses with that dignified colonial charm. At the same time, the machines that once produced thousands of documents and letters - the typewriters have been relegated to the status of vintage antiques. This newspaper, the *Daily* News with a magnificent history of over 100 years, also relied on typewriters for all editorial contents before the desktop computers changed the way we operate. Until the middle of 2020, there were three legal typist clerks still using the typewriter near the vicinity of the esteemed Supreme Courts at Hulftsdorp, Colombo-12. These two men and one lady had been here for decades patiently typing letters for people who would come to

These souls have been vanquished with the arrival of modern technology. With the advent of computers, the once-dominant typewriter has been relegated to an antique in the administrative realms of Sri Lanka although it is still found in some government departments. As a schoolboy, I have seen old men attired in neat white shirts, seated in the shadow of the magnificent All Saints' Church, resting against wooden tables on which stood their precious typewriters. Their fingers moved with efficiency and the gentle clatter of the typewriter resonated as the keys pressed against the ribbon printing black on white. Except for rainy days, these obliging typists attended to many customers. It must have taken a lot of people skills to deal with all sorts of people who came seeking legal redress, displaying many moods. The last time I walked towards the Anglican Church and courthouse was a few weeks before the COVID-19 pandemic suddenly affected our otherwise happy lives. The pavement where they sat and typed was empty. I noticed a large blue carbon stain on the cream coloured wall, the only evidence that they had once been here. Passing the courts complex, I ventured in search of these typists. Modern internet cafes with digital typing and printing service were often found with dazzling neon signboards.

After a few minutes, I was surprised to hear the once-familiar clatter of the manual typewriter. Its sound guided me towards the large Bo tree roundabout. A man wearing black-rimmed spectacles was typing steadily with zest. I stood silently until he finished. He looked up assuming I wanted an affidavit. K. Jayasiri who is an amiable man explained, "I am 78 years old, son. I am from Dodanduwa. After I left school I was advised to learn typing which I did in 1958. However, later, I found a job in the Ceylon Transport Board (CTB) head office. After I retired from the CTB, I came here with my typewriter, and have been here for almost 20 years. I begin work by 8.30 am and leave at 3.30 pm. There were many seniors here in the past, but the computer has uprooted them out of the system." He then placed both hands on the old typewriter fondly and continued, "I can do this maybe for another two years. Who can predict the future?"

The sun spread her rays to dominate the Hulftsdorp area. After walking for about 10 minutes, the second typist was spotted, seated in the verandah of a legal office. I stepped in and introduced myself. The old gentleman behind the desk asked if I wanted to meet a lawyer, and then relaxed when I told him I am from the media. At 70 plus years, G. Hoping to find one more typist I stood up and gazed ahead. An observant three-wheeler driver said, "Sir, walk down this lane. There is an old guy named Upali. He is a

After nearly 30 minutes, a bearded gentleman looking more like a sage walked in and eyed me with profound suspicion, his gaze piercing the thick spectacle lenses. He evaded direct eye contact. With this short introduction, uttered with the speed of typewriter he waved and vanished into the crowded pavement. I patiently waited for this old typist, but I think he willfully avoided me and was not to be seen. These human beings have dedicated years typing for thousands of customers at Hulftsdorp.

They have made a silent contribution in the dispensation of legal redress. The consistent clatter of the Remington, Adler, Imperial, Royal and Olympia typewriters at Colombo-12 has faded into the sunset. The trustworthy typewriters will sit and gather dust. They were the beautiful machines that once empowered the administrative appara-









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Team New Zealand stamp dominance with fourth America's Cup win

AUCKLAND, WEDNESDAY: Team New Zealand beat Italy's Luna Rossa 7-3 to win their fourth America's Cup Wednesday and retain the world's oldest international sporting trophy in front of huge crowds in Auckland.

The defending champions claimed the single win they needed to seal the prestigious, best-of-13 yachting series with a 46-second victory in race 10 on Auckland's Waitemata Harbour.

New Zealand claimed the 'Auld Mug' trophy once again to confirm their dominance in the competition, which dates back

Team New Zealand entered the regatta as heavy favourites

but the Italians matched them in the early stages, taking the scores to 3-2.

our teammates who made such a huge amount of effort to allow us to get out here and fight it out in the America's Cup."

Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern was quick to congratulate the Kiwi team.

"Team New Zealand has once again made us all so proud by retaining the America's Cup as New Zealand's cup," she said in a statement. Ardern also looked ahead to

New Zealand's next defence of the Cup, expected in 2024, saying the government would give the team NZ\$5.0 million (US\$3.6 million) to help retain key personnel and discourage rival syndicates from poaching

42nd Observer-SLT Mobitel School Cricketer of the Year

Mega Show to crown school cricket talent on April 20

The local health authorities have given the green light to go ahead with the postponed 42nd Observer-SLT Mobitel School Cricketer of the Year mega awards ceremony on April 20.

The health authorities have given their approval to the Sunday Observer, together with the sponsors Sri Lanka Telecom Mobitel, to conduct event after the Sinhala and Tamil New Year which also marks the reopening of the schools for the second term.

The officials of the Sunday Observer and Sri Lanka Telecom Mobitel, together with the event organizers, met recently at the Lake House to finalize the date after.

Meanwhile, ex-Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year turned ICC Elite Panel umpire Kumara Dharmasena is set to complete a great milestone in his distinguished career, this time as an international umpire.

The former Sri Lanka Test allrounder, who will celebrate his 50th birthday next month (on April 24), needs to stand in only six more matches as an ICC elite panel umpire to complete the rare milestone of 200 Internationals. So far, he has officiated in 67 Tests, 105 ODIs and 22 T20s to combine 194 internationals as an ICC elite panel umpire.

He will get a golden opportunity to extend this by two more Tests when Bangladesh tour here next month. In fact, Dharmasena will be umpiring the third day of the first Test against Bangladesh on his 50th birthday.

In his last interview with the Sunday Observer, Dharmasena said he was looking forward to that milestone as an international umpire. "I do not have too many future plans as we are getting older. I take it year by year. Everything came to a standstill last year due to the Covid-19 pandemic but now catching up slowly. The ICC recognizes my work and I am happy with it", he said.

After he retired from international cricket in November 2006, Dharma-

after his retirement as a player, he made his international debut as an umpire in 2009, officiating in an ODI between India and Sri Lanka at Dambulla, Thus, Dharmasena became the youngest ever Sri Lankan to umpire in any form of international cricket.

He stood at the 2011 ICC World Cup and in the same year, he had the honour of being appointed to the ICC's Elite Panel of Umpires.

The greatest moment in his career as an international umpire came in 2012 when he was adjudged the ICC's Umpire of the Year to receive the David Shepherd Trophy.

Dharmasena achieved another first when he officiated at the 2015 ICC World Cup tournament as he was called up to umpire the final. Thus Dharmasena became the first person as both a player and umpire in an ICC World Cup final after he played a notable role in Sri Lanka's World Cup triumph as a member of Arjuna Ranatunga's invincible team of 1996.

According to Dharmasena, the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year title he won in 1989 inspired him to excel in the international arena. 'That was one of the greatest moments in my cricket career. It was a big inspiration for me to win the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year title. It helped and encouraged me to work hard to win my Sri Lanka cap in next to no time," he said.

Dharmasena believes that winning a major award such as Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year gives a great confidence for a schoolboy cricketer to go places.

"It would definitely make young schoolboy cricketers more determined to reach the top. It gives tremendous confidence for any cricketer searching sena took to umpiring. Three years for success in the big league", he said.

Dharmasena feels that outstanding cricketers with exceptional performances and milestones are hard to find nowadays, compared to his era. He feels that could be the reason that has prevented schoolboy cricketers marching directly to the Sri Lanka

"In recent times we have not seen schoolboys directly marching to the national team, unlike our playing days," he said.

He is of the view that the present day challenge for schoolboy cricketers is greater in their future careers and as a result, only a few outstanding cricketers would remain in the game once they leave school.

"I was lucky to seek direct employment at Hatton National Bank (HNB) when I finished my school career at Nalanda. The HNB offered me employment and gave all the support to pursue my career as a club cricketer and then as an international cricketer. But present day schoolboy cricketers hardly get that sort of support", he added.

Born on April 24, 1971 in Colombo, Hadunnettige Deepthi Priyantha Kumara Dharmasena is one of the best all-rounders produced by Nalanda. He had four memorable First X1 school seasons for the Campbell Place school.

Dharmasena narrowly missed the chance of becoming the first to win the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer for four successive years.

Apart from winning the prestigious title in 1989, he had been adjudged runner-up thrice to Sanjeewa Ranatunga of Ananda College in 1988, Marvan Atapattu also of Ananda College in 1990 and to Muttiah Muralitharan of St. Anthony's College, Katugastota in 1991. It was a proud record which is hard to shatter.

Having ended his school career,

Dharmasena became a permanent member of Bloomfield Cricket and Athletic Club in the domestic interclub Premier league season. Merely three years after winning the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year title, young Dharmasena made his Test debut in Sri Lanka's second Test against South Africa at the SSC ground in September, 1993.

He made his Sri Lanka ODI debut on August 24, 1994 in the fifth ODI against Pakistan at the Premadasa Stadium capturing 2 for 34 off nine overs. He has aggregated 868 runs in 31 Tests with three half centuries and captured 69 wickets with 6 for 72 as his best innings analysis. Dharmasena represented Sri Lanka in 141 ODIs, aggregating 1,222 runs with four half centuries.

Dharmasena has captured 138 wickets in ODIs with his off breaks, delivered with a slightly unorthodox action that had been a blessing to the Sri

Lankan team in many ODIs. He is better known for his inspiring acts as a team man, motivating his fel-

low players even at difficult times. Hence, he was nicknamed 'Unanduwa' by his teammates.

"If you don't enjoy the game and don't dedicate yourself towards it, you won't be successful. Believe in yourself, work hard with dedication and you will find success", was his advice to the emerging schoolboy cricketers who keep dreaming of a Sri Lanka cap.

Meanwhile, the much looked forward to key matches of the 2020/21 inter-school season are now on, followed by the Sri Lanka Schools Cricket Association (SLSCA) conducted one-day limited over tournament matches. Simultaneously, the contest for the 43rd Observer-Mobitel Most Popular School Cricketer titles would turn out to be a keen tussle.

Clifford Cup remains oldest club rugby tourney

The country's oldest club rugby tournament is the Clifford Cup. Originally, the Clifford Cup, which was donated by Lady Clifford, wife of the then British Governor of Ceylon Sir Hugh Clifford, for a match on her birthday, August 26 1911 to be awarded to the winners of the game between All Ceylon and United Services Kandy. But the game took place a week after the donation of the cup, that was on September 2. The reason for overlooking the birthday request of the donor in the inaugural year was that the venue, Colombo Race Course was reserved

for another sporting event. After 15 years in 1926 the tournament was converted to a quadrangular with four teams, Low Country, Up Country, the Ceylonese and United Services fighting for supremacy. In the first outing United Services Kandy beat All Ceylon by 25 points to 0. In the following year 1912 on September 2 All Ceylon beat United Services Kandy by 8 points to nil. In 1913 Kandy United Services again beat All Ceylon 3-0.

1st World War

The Clifford Cup game was suspended during the 1st World War and not restarted until 1926, when the Ceylonese first came into it. In 1926 Low Country beat Kandy United Services 14-3, in 1927 Up-Country beat Ceylonese 11-8, in 1928 Up-Country beat Ceylonese 15-1, in 1929 Low Country beat United Services 23-3, in 1930 Low Country beat Ceylonese 14-3, in 1931 Low Country beat Ceylonese 27-6, in 1932 Up-Country beat United Services 14-10, in 1933 Up-Country beat Kandy United Services 20-3, in 1934 Low Country beat Ceylonese 17-0, in 1935 Up-Country beat Kandy United services 11-0, in 1936 Low Country beat Kandy United Services 9-3, in 1937 Up-Country beat Kandy United Services 25-0, in 1938 Up-Country beat Ceylonese 10-0, in 1939 match was cancelled with the start of the 2nd World War, from 1939 to 1950.

A new strategy was planned and worked out in the Island's one and only rugby tournament, the Clifford Cup rugby tournament, was the FC (played 7, won 6 lost 1, scored Blue Ribbon of the country's rugby and was introduced to clubs for the first ever inter club championship in

Thereafter year after year it created a tremendous enthusiasm among the spectators, bringing surging crowds to watch the action and also thus creating healthy rivalry among the top contenders

First to win the Clifford Cup

The honour of being the first to win the Clifford Cup went to those gallant set of ruggerites from Havelock town, Havelock SC, led by Ian Labroov.

They went through the tournament without having their try line crossed, similarly the Dimbulla A & CC comprising some of the top players in the country, maintained an unbeaten record at their home grounds, Radella, until the game against Havelocks SC.

It is said that it was the best match ever to be witnessed at Radella. By virtue of their 13 points, two goals and a try to nil victory over the Dimbulla A & CC and Havelocks SC became the first inter club league champions and lifted Clifford Cup.

At the end Havelocks SC gained 14 points, in seven outings, two points ahead of the nearest CH & FC. Dimbulla in 1953 defeated the holders of the Cup, the CR & FC at Radella by 6 points (2 tries) to nil in the finals and became the first club from Up-Country to win the Clifford

Inaugural year

In the inaugural year the tournament kicked off as a league competition. The first game was played on April 29 and the competition ended on July 29. The curtain raiser was between CR & FC and Dickoya MCC. This game was kicked off at Darawella grounds. Dickoya led by D.A. Cook beat CR & FC led by Archibald Perera, which game was refereed by J.M. Stewart. In the inaugural year, CH & FC had the distinction of accumulating the highest score of the season when they beat Dimbulla ACC by 41 points to nil in Colombo.

The final placing - of the league -(1) Havelocks SC (played 7, won 7, points for 100 against 6), (2) CH & once.

123 points for and against 11), (3) CR & FC, (4) Dimbulla A & CC, (5) Kandy SC, (6) Uva, (7) Dickoya MCC, (8) Uva, (9) KV. The champion Havelock SC - comprised players like - Ian Labrooy (Capt), B.S. Hanricus, H. Aldons, F. Aldons, H.E.V. Metzelling, E. Aldons, S.B Pilapitiya, V. Kelly, A. Drienberg, R. Sourjah E. Mathaysz, I. Batholamues, L.Ephraums, D. Ernest, D.K. Goonawardene.

Almost a little over four decades since that auspicious initiative in 1950 is history now and what kind of changes we have seen in the tournament. Who could forget the day that the Air Force team led by Jeff Ratnam stormed into the final in 1965, the Army team entered the final in 1962, the Police team's dramatic entry in 1967 or the Navy SC sensational step-in in 1976, after being promoted to the big league only in the previous year.

In 1985 Sri Lanka's premier league tournament was renamed and the SLRFU decided to award the Clifford Cup to the winners of a separate Knock-out tournament conducted amongst the 'A' Division Clubs, at the end of the season. Thereafter, in 1992, for the first time, the entire tournament was worked off outside Colombo and the venue was Nittawela in Kandy. That year Kandy SC emerged winners of the Clifford Cup for the first time in the history, when it registered a historic 22 points to 9 points victory over the Police SC in the finals, which was the first major cup final to be played outside Colombo since

Only Up-Country club

Incidentally, the honour of being the only Up-Country club to win the Clifford Cup outright remained with Dimbulla ACC for almost four decades, thereafter, uninterruptedly till Kandy SC had their first touch on the Cup in 1992.

Clifford Cup has a long history, with Kandy Sports Club winning it for the most number of times- 21 times, CR & FC 14 times including a tie with Dimbulla ACC, Havelock SC 14 times including a tie with Police SC, Police SC 8 times with a tie with Havelock SC, CH & FC 7 times, Army 2 times, Dimbulla A & CC 2 times. The Prime Minister also pointed out the incident where Arjuna Ranatunga, who despite his father being a Minister at that time, had first visited the residence of late Minister Gamini Dissanayake to pay his gratitude for the ser-



France is ready to provide a grant for the preliminary impact assessments of the proposed cable car project for Kandy.

"The project cost would be financed

at very concessionary terms," said French Ambassador, Eric Lavertu during a visit to Kandy last week. He was accompanied by the French state development arm known as AFD (Agence Française de Développement Group). The French team also met the Governor of Central Province Lalith U. Gamage and Mayor of Kandy, Kesera Senenayake, Kandy's main traders associations during this visit. It was disclosed that a cable car project is a viable solution to being a solution for the heavy traffic congestion in Kandy. It was proposed to link the Cable cars from the Eastern side of Kandy, connecting them via a "park and cable car ride" direct to the Kandy railway station

"This will also be a major tourist attraction for both local and foreign travellers." The initial suggestions was a connection from the Kandy side of the bridge to Kundasale terminating at the Kandy central railway station which will in turn be part of the new bus terminal and railway complex. The suggested route was via the Dharmaraja Hill, and then linked to towers along the borders of the Walker's Estate and down over the former Bogambara Prison complex too was proposed. The del-

egation insisted that these were only very preliminary views.

Country Director for Sri lanka of AFD Reda Souirgi also said that they are keen to assist in other similar projects as well.

During this visit the Ambassador also inaugurated 'The Nawalapitiya Grid Sub Station' along with Minister of Power and Energy Dullas Alahapperuma.

It was part of an ongoing project with the CEB since 2015 costing Euro

30 million loan supporting the construction of four new grid substations located in the Central province, namely, in Maliboda, Wewalwatta, Nawalapitiya and Ragala. Of these, Maliboda and Wewalwatta Grid Substations are already energized.

History was revisited once again when the Commercial Bank of Ceylon returned to the original location of its Jaffna branch recently, resuming operations at an address where banking had taken place since the late 1930s.

Following its ceremonial reopening on March 15, the new five-storey Jaffna branch of Commercial Bank has an Automated Banking Centre (ABC) with five Cash Recycler Machines (CRMs), an eSlip cheque collection facility and a Cheque Deposit Machine (CDM) that together offer access to cash and deposit facilities around the clock, 365 days of the year.

The building will be fitted with rooftop solar panels that will generate a major percentage of the electricity required; a rainwater harvesting facility and its own sewage treatment plant that will recycle sewage into water to irrigate the gardens; and is designed to maximise use of natural light during daytime, further reducing energy consumption. It is also equipped with energy-effi-

cient air-conditioning, and the accessories in the bathrooms are all water-efficient, enhancing the building's 'Green' credentials. Additionally, the Bank said many green and re-usable materials were used in the construction process.

The newbuilding was ceremoniously declared open by Commercial Bank Chairman Justice K. Sripavan accompanied by the Bank's Managing Director Mr S. Renganathan, Chief Operating Officer Mr Sanath Manatunge and members of the corporate management.

Commercial Bank also recently relocated its Trincomalee branch to a purpose-built eco-friendly building on land owned by the Bank.

For first time in over 60 years

Cuba, without a Castro in power

CUBA: Cuba will emerge from the April Congress of its all-powerful Communist Party without a Castro at the helm for the first time in over 60 years.

And while the country is unlikely to abandon its military, socialist approach to government any time soon, observers expect some nods, albeit meek ones, to economic modernization and social liberalization in future.

The country's de-facto leader, Raul Castro, 89, is handing over the reins after 13 years in the seat he inherited from his revolutionary leader brother Fidel, who was in charge for almost 50 years before

In Cuba's one-party system, the Castros have consecutively held the top posi-

tion in the Communist Party and the country -that of first secretary since 1959.

The first secretary is more powerful than the president -- a position both Castros also held.

Then in 2018, Raul Castro ceded the Cuban Presidency to Miguel Diaz-Canel, a major shift for the country that still largely sees Fidel Castro as its revolutionary father and

In a shuffle of the top brass that has long been sewn up, Diaz-Canel will become the first non-Castro elected first secretary at the party's five-yearly congress to be held in Havana from April 16 to 19.

This will see Castro officially enter retirement and voluntarily give up any

claim to political power. A new constitution adopted in May 2019 with almost 80 percent approval among eligible voters 18 and older, states that the country's commitment to socialism was "irreversible."

Yet, there are signs of change to come.

Sixty-year-old Diaz-Canel, like many other members of the party's new decisionmaking politbureau, was born after the Cuban revolution led by Fidel Castro, who died in 2016.

And the new executive team "will have the task of building its own legitimacy, which could come from a political project that brings economic prosperity and social justice to Cuba," said Michael Shifter of the Inter-American Dialogue think tank in Washington DC.

The party has said next month's congress would have to reflect on how to better deal with "politicalideological subversion" on social media.

The country's direction will also largely be shaped by Cuba's relationship with the United States.

President Joe Biden had promised during his election campaign to reverse certain sanctions toughened under his predecessor Donald Trump.

"The United States determines, directly and indirectly, a large part of what happens (in Cuba) even the

decisions taken by Cuban leaders," said Cuban political analyst Harold Carde-

The bulk of the 280 sanctions Washington has in place against Havana targets enterprises managed by Cuba's powerful and omnipresent military.

Conversely, if American hostility continues, "the military will have the perfect justification to continue to play a predominant role in the country's politics and economy," said Cuba expert Arturo Lopez-Levy of the Holy Names University in California.- AFP

Mars' 'missing' water is buried beneath surface - Study

US: Billions of years ago, Mars was home to lakes and oceans -- but. where all the water went to transform the planet into the desolate rock we know today has been something of a mystery.

Most of it was thought to have been lost to space, but a new study funded by NASA proposes that it didn't go anywhere but is trapped within minerals in the crust.

"We're saying that the crust forms what we call hydrated minerals, so min-

erals that actually have water in their crystal structure," Eva Scheller, lead author of the new paper in Science, told AFP.

In fact, Scheller's model suggests anywhere between 30 - 99 percent of the initial water remains trapped inside these min-

Early Mars was thought to have enough water to cover the whole planet in roughly 100 to 1,500 metres (330 to 4,4920 feet) of ocean.

Because the planet lost

its magnetic field early in its history, its atmosphere was progressively stripped away, and it was assumed this was how it lost its water.

But the authors of the new study believe that while some of the water did disappear, the majority remained.

Using observations made by Mars rovers as well as of meteorites from the planet, the team focused on hydrogen, a key component of water.

British Police officer remanded over woman's kidnap and murder

UK: A British Police officer was remanded in custody when he appeared in court on Tuesday charged with the kidnap and murder of a woman who vanished as she walked home.

The disappearance of Sarah Everard sparked outrage and a national debate on women's safety in public places, prompting the government to promise enhanced police patrols at night and funding to make the streets safer.

London police are also under pressure after they broke up a vigil for Everard on Saturday, with widely shared footage showing mostly male officers struggling with and restraining female protesters.

Wayne Couzens, 48, appeared via videolink in London's Old Bailey court to face charges of kidnap and murder of Everard, a 33-year-old marketing executive who went missing in south London on March 3.

Couzens, who serves with the diplomatic protection unit of London's police force, spoke only to confirm his name and date of birth.

A plea hearing is due to be held on July 9 and a provisional trial date has been set for October 25.

FRANCE: Lightning strikes may have supplied primordial Earth with enough phosphorus to

support the emergence of life, according to new research Tues day that offered an alternative explanation as to how living organisms were born.

Phosphorus is a vital building block of life as we know it, forming basic cell structures and the double helix shape of DNA and

Billions of years ago on early Earth, most of the available phosphorus was locked away in insoluble minerals.

However one mineral, schreibersite, is highly reactive and produces phosphorus capable of forming organic molecules.

Since most schreibersite on Earth comes from meteorites, the emergence of life here has long been thought to be tied to the arrival of extraterrestrial rocks. But schreibersite is also con-

tained within the glass-like rock

formed by lightning strikes in some types of clay-rich soils.

Researchers in the US and Britain used state of the art image techniques to analyse the amount of the phosphorus-giving mineral formed in each lightning strike.

"Lightning strikes on early Earth may have provided a significant amount of reduced phosphorus," Benjamin Hess, lead study author from Yale's Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences,

told AFP. "And by synthesising the best of our knowledge of the conditions of early Earth, I think our

results bear out this hypothesis." Writing in the journal Nature Communications, Hess and his colleagues estimated that lightning strikes could have produced

grammes of phosphorus a year. Using simulations of the climate on early Earth, they said that while meteor strikes began to decline after the Moon was

formed 4.5 billion years ago, lightning strikes surpassed space rocks for phosphorus production around 3.5 billion years ago. That timing coincides with the origin of life. - AFP

UK looks to Asia in post-Brexit foreign policy overhaul

UK: Britain unveiled plans Tuesday to pivot its strategic focus towards Asia, counter Russian threats and bolster its nuclear stockpile, in one of the biggest overhauls of security, defence and foreign policy since the Cold War era.

The conclusions of the government's so-called Integrated Review, crafted over the past year as London recalibrates its post-Brexit foreign policy, include labelling China a "systemic competitor".

The document -- entitled "Global Britain in a Competitive Age" - identifies Russia as the "most acute direct threat to the UK" which poses "the full spectrum" of dangers. It also notably announc-

es an increase to Britain's nuclear arsenal, reversing a previous commitment to reduce the stockpile to 180 warheads by pledging to increase it to 260 by the end of the decade, "in recognition of the evolving security environment". "The overriding purpose of this review - the most comprehensive since the Cold War - is to make the United Kingdom stronger, safer and more prosperous while standing up for our values," Prime Minister Boris Johnson told parliament. "(It) describes how we

will bolster our alliances, strengthen our capabilities, find new ways of reaching solutions and relearn the art of competing against states with opposing values.' In a foreword to the

review. Johnson stated that Britain, which formally left the European Union last year, would look to "enjoy constructive and productive relationships" with remaining bloc mem-

But he added the Brexit divorce deal agreed with Brussels "gives us the freedom to do things differently and better, both economically and politically".

The review emerges as Britain seeks to reaffirm its much touted "special relationship" with the




