PADDY (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL)

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Thampiah Sivagnanam, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) for the Administrative District of Hambantota, do by this Order—

(i) revoke with effect from June 2, 1958, the Price Order mentioned below so far as it fixes the maximum prices of paddy, for the Hambantota District—

Food Price Order No. H 23 dated May 15, 1956, published in *Government Gazette* No. 10,932 of May 22, 1956;

(ii) fix with effect from June 2, 1958, the prices specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per 80 measures nett above which paddy shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;

(iii) fix with effect from June 2, 1958, the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per measure above which paddy shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;

(iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

(a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

(b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(c) “measure” shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure; and

(d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of paddy which is less than or more than 80 measures nett shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per 80 measures nett fixed by this Order;

(v) direct that no person shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article;

(vi) direct that when any paddy is sold the maximum price fixed by this Order shall include the price of wrapper or container, if any, in which such paddy is sold;

(vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any paddy in his possession or under his control at any place, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area; and

(viii) direct that every person who sells paddy by retail shall on demand, and every person who sells paddy by wholesale shall, give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of sale;
- (b) the quantity of paddy sold;
- (c) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold; and
- (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

IMPORT CONTROL NOTICE No. 16/58

Imports of Hulling and Polishing Machines and parts thereof

IMPORTERS are informed that a licence is now required for the importation of hulling and polishing machines and parts thereof from any source. The same requirement would apply to General Import Licence holders, who should now obtain individual import licences to import such goods.

2. A statement of confirmed outstanding orders supported by documentary evidence should be forwarded to this Control within 7 days of the date of publication of this Notice in the *Gazette* giving (1) date of order, (2) date of confirmation, (3) country of origin, (4) quantity, and (5) C. I. F. value in rupees.

3. Importers are warned that no orders should be placed on any source unless an import licence has been obtained.
