**PADDY**

**THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950**

**Order**

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Hewa Dennie Weeraratna, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), for the Administrative District of Galle, do by this Order—

(i) revoke with immediate effect my Price Order No. 18 of 1956, dated May 16, 1956, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,945 of June 29, 1956;

(ii) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be respectively, the maximum wholesale price per 80 measures nett and the maximum retail price per measure above which paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;

(iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

(a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

(b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure;

(d) the maximum amount that is payable for any quantity of paddy which is sold by wholesale shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price fixed by this Order.

(iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any paddy in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;

(v) direct that no person shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article;

(vi) direct that every person who sells any paddy by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the date of the sale;

(b) the quantity of such paddy sold;

(c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and

(d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;

(vii) direct that when paddy is sold, the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which such paddy is sold.

BY virtue of powers vested in me by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, read with section 3 (2) of that Act, I, Tampiah Sivagnanam, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Hambantota, do by this Order—

(i) revoke with effect from this date the Food Price Order mentioned below :

dated 17th June, 1958, in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale and maximum retail prices mentioned in columns 2-7 of the Schedule thereto of Masoor dhal, Oorid (whole), Gram dhal and Potatoes mentioned in column I of that schedule ;

(ii) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2-5 and 6 and 7 of the schedule hereto to be the wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross to a retail dealer, and a retail dealer's maximum retail price per lb. nett to a consumer, respectively, above which the articles specified in the corres-

ponding entry in column I of the schedule shall not be sold within the Administrative District of Hambantota;

(iii) direct that paragraphs (iii) to (viii) of Food Price Order No. 45 of 10th June, 1958, relating to Subsidiary Foodstuffs published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,362 of 17th June, 1958, shall apply in the case of articles

mentioned in column I of the schedule hereto as though those paragraphs were incorporated in this Order.
