THE ELECTRICITY ACT

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 59A of the Electricity Act (Chapter 205), as amended by the Electricity (Amendment) Act, No. 59 of 1957, I, Charles Percival de Silva, Minister of Agriculture, Land, Irrigation and Power, do by this notification fix, with effect from January 1, 1962, the charges specified in the Schedule hereto as the charges for supply of electrical energy to all consumers other than consumers supplied by the Jaffna Peninsula Electrical System of the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings.

Schedule

DOMESTIC TARIFF

1. This tariff shall apply to supplies of electricity for domestic purposes to private residences, and to private residences where not more than 400 square feet of floor area are used for professional purposes.

2. The charges for supply under this tariff shall be determined in accordance with a variable block tariff, based on the external floor area of the premises and calculated at the rate of—

- For the first block of units per month at 30 cents per unit
- For the second block of units per month at 12 cents per unit
- For all units in excess of the total units in the first and second blocks of units, per month at ... 7 cents per unit

The number of units in the first and second blocks of units per month shall be in accordance with the following schedule:—

| | Number of units in first block | Number of units in second block |

| Floor area not exceeding 2000 square feet | 21 | 105 |
| Floor area exceeding 2000 but not exceeding 2500 square feet | 27 | 135 |
| Floor area exceeding 2500 but not exceeding 3000 square feet | 33 | 165 |
| Floor area exceeding 3000 but not exceeding 3500 square feet | 39 | 195 |
| Floor area exceeding 3500 but not exceeding 4000 square feet | 45 | 225 |
| Floor area exceeding 4000 but not exceeding 4500 square feet | 51 | 255 |
| Floor area exceeding 4500 but not exceeding 5000 square feet | 57 | 285 |

Thereafter the number of units in the first block shall be increased at the rate of four units per month and the number of units in the second block shall be increased at the rate of 20 units per month, in respect of each additional 500 square feet of external floor area.

Minimum Charge

3. The above charges shall be subject to a minimum charge of Rs. 3 in respect of any month.

4. Where the unit consumption in any month does not exceed the number of units in the first block, the charges in the month will be in respect of the units actually consumed subject to a minimum charge in respect of 10 units.

5. The expression "month" means the period of approximately 30 days from one routine meter reading date to the next routine meter reading date.

6. Where the date of commencement or termination of supply is other than a normal routine meter reading date, the charges for such a period of less than one month, as defined in paragraph 5, shall be calculated on a pro-rata basis.

7. In the application of this tariff to any private residence in which not more than 400 square feet of internal floor area are used for professional purposes, the number of units in the first block of units shall be increased by 20 units and the number of units in the second block of units shall be increased by 100 units per month.

8. The "floor area" of the residence means the aggregate external floor area of all buildings, whether attached to or detached from the main building, within the curtilage of the premises. In case of a building with a number of storeys, the area of such building will be ascertained by multiplying the external area in square feet of the largest storey by the number of storeys, provided that any difference in excess of 200 square feet between the floor area of any storey (other than the largest storey) and the largest storey shall be taken into account in calculating the floor area for the purposes of this tariff.

9. In the case of floor areas exceeding 2,000 square feet, any part of 500 square feet shall be counted as 500 square feet.

INDUSTRIAL TARIFF

1. Rates I.1, I.2 and I.3, set out below shall be applicable to a supply of electricity used wholly or mainly for motive power or for electro-chemical or electro-thermal processes in factories, workshops, foundries, oil mills, spinning and weaving mills, pumping stations, port and dock installations and other similar industrial installations, but shall not be applicable to—

- (a) a supply of electricity for stand-by purposes, or
- (b) a supply of electricity for resistance welding purposes where the rated capacity of such welding equipment exceeds one quarter of the Assessed Demand.

2. Rate I.1—Assessed Demand not Exceeding 25 Kilovolt-Amperes

This rate shall be applicable where the Assessed Demand required does not exceed 25 kVA.

The charges for electricity supplied to each individual point of supply shall be based on the Assessed Demand calculated at the rate of:

Accounts will be subject to a minimum charge in any month calculated at the rate of Rs. 5 for each complete 5 kVA of Assessed Demand or part thereof.

3. Rate I.2—Supplies Delivered and Metered at 400 Volts or less and where the Assessed Demand exceeds 25 Kilovolt-Amperes

This Rate is applicable where the supply is delivered and metered at 400 volts or less and the Assessed Demand exceeds 25 kVA.

The charges for electricity supplied to each individual point of supply shall be the total sum of charges set out in paragraphs (1) and (2) below:—

(1) Maximum Demand Charge

A maximum demand charge calculated in the manner set out hereunder shall be payable in respect of the maximum demand made in each month—

4. Rate I.3—Supplies delivered and metered at more than 400 volts and where the assessed demand exceeds 25 kilovolt-amperes.

This rate is applicable where the supply is delivered and metered at more than 400 volts and the Assessed Demand exceeds 25 kVA.

The charges for electricity supplied to each individual point of supply shall be the total sum of charges set out in paragraphs (1) and (2) below:—

(1) Maximum Demand Charge

A maximum demand charge calculated in the manner set out hereunder shall be payable in respect of the maximum demand made in each month.

Accounts will be subject to a minimum charge in any month at the rate of Rs. 3 for each kVA of Assessed Demand.

5. The expression "month" means the period of approximately 30 days from one routine meter reading date to the next routine meter reading date.

6. Where the date of commencement or termination of supply is other than a normal routine meter reading date, the charges for such a period of less than one month, as defined in paragraph 5, shall be calculated on a pro rata basis.

7. The number of kilovolt amperes of maximum demand in any month shall be:—

- the highest number of amperes registered by the demand indicator multiplied by the declared voltage and by the current transformer ratio and divided by 1000, or
- four times the number of kilovolt ampere-hours supplied during any 15 minutes during the month, depending on the instrument used.

The number of kilovolt-amperes of chargeable maximum demand shall, in the case of a fraction of a kVA, be the next highest whole number of kVA.

8. Assessed Demand

The expression "Assessed Demand" in kilovolt amperes means the service capacity required by the consumer on the date of connection or as subsequently varied at the request of the consumer, such Assessed Demand being not less than the actual maximum demand made or likely to be made from time to time. The Assessed Demand shall not be reduced from any given amount until after the expiry of 12 months from the date at which such Assessed Demand was first provided.

GENERAL PURPOSES TARIFF

1. The Rates GP 1, GP 2 and GP 3 set out below shall be applicable to a supply of electricity to be used in shops, offices, banks, warehouses, licensed hotels, cafes, public buildings, hospitals, educational establishments, places of entertainment and other similar premises, but shall not be applicable to a supply of electricity for standby purposes.

Rate GP 1, Assessed Demand not exceeding 25 Kilovolt-Amperes
This rate is applicable where the Assessed Demand does not exceed 25 kVA.

The charges for electricity supplied to each individual point of supply shall be based on the Assessed Demand, and calculated at the rate of—

Accounts will be subject to a minimum charge in any month at the rate of Rs. 3 for each kVA of Assessed Demand.

2. The expression "month" means the period of approximately 30 days from one routine meter reading date to the next routine meter reading date.

3. Where the date of commencement or termination of supply is other than a normal, routine meter reading date, the charges for such a period of less than one month, as defined in paragraph 2, shall be calculated on a pro-rata basis.

4. The number of kilovolt amperes of maximum demand in any month shall be—

- the highest number of amperes registered, by the demand indicator multiplied by the declared voltage and by the current transformer ratio and divided by a 1,000, or
- four times the number of kilovolt ampere-hours supplied during any 15 minutes during the month, depending on the instrument used.

The number of kilovolt amperes of chargeable maximum demand shall, in the case of a fraction of a kVA, be the next highest whole number of kVA.

5. Assessed Demand

The expression "Assessed Demand" in kilovolt amperes means the service capacity required by the consumer on the date of connection or as subsequently varied at the request of the consumer, such Assessed Demand being not less than the actual maximum demand made or likely to be made from time to time. The Assessed Demand shall not be reduced from any given amount until after the expiry of 12 months from the date at which such Assessed Demand was first provided.

BULK SUPPLY TARIFF

1. This tariff shall apply to supplies to licensees within the meaning of the Electricity Act (Chapter 205) but shall not apply to a supply given to such a licensee for standby purposes.

2. The charges for electricity supplied to each individual point of supply shall be in accordance with Rate B.S. 1 or Rate B.S. 2, set out hereunder.

Rate B.S. 1, Supplies Delivered and Metered at 400 Volts or Less
The charges shall be the total sum of the charges set out in paragraphs (1) and (2) below—

(1) Maximum Demand Charge

A maximum demand charge calculated in the manner set out hereunder shall be payable in respect of the maximum demand made in each month—

The charges shall be the total sum of the charges set out in paragraph (1) and (2) below:—

(1) Maximum Demand Charge

A maximum demand charge calculated in the manner set out hereunder shall be payable in respect of the maximum demand made in each month—

- For each of the first 200 kVA of the maximum demand ... Rs. 12 per kVA
- For each kVA of the maximum demand in excess of 200 kVA but not exceeding 500 kVA ... Rs. 11 per kVA
- For each kVA of the maximum demand in excess of 500 kVA ... Rs. 10.50 per kVA.

(2) Unit Charge

A unit charge calculated in the manner set out hereunder shall be payable in respect of the units supplied in each month—

- For units supplied, not exceeding 150 units for each kVA of the maximum demand made in the month ... 8½ cents per unit
- For units supplied, in excess of 150 units and not exceeding 400 units for each kVA of the maximum demand made in the month ... 6½ cents per unit
- For units supplied, in excess of 400 units for each kVA of the maximum demand made in the month ... 5½ cents per unit

Accounts will be subject to a minimum charge in any month at the rate of Rs. 3 for each kVA of Assessed Demand.

- (a) highest number of amperes registered by the demand indicator multiplied by the declared voltage and by the current transformer ratio and divided by a 10.0, or
- (b) four times the number of kilovolt ampere hours supplied during any 15 minutes during the month depending on the instrument used. The number of kilovolt amperes of chargeable maximum demand shall in the case of a fraction of a kVA, be the next highest whole number of kVA.

(6) Assessed Demand

The expression "Assessed Demand" in kilovolt amperes means the service capacity required by the licensee on the date of connection or as subsequently varied at the request of the licensee, such Assessed Demand being not less than the actual maximum demand made or likely to be made from time to time. The assessed Demand shall not be reduced from any given amount until after the expiry of 12 months from the date at which such Assessed Demand was first provided.

RELIGIOUS PREMISES TARIFF

1. This tariff shall apply to a supply of electricity to a place of public religious worship, and to a single private residence used and occupied by the priest associated with that place of worship provided that the electrical installations of the place of worship and the residence are within the same curtilage.

2. Supply for domestic purposes in a single private residence and occupied by the priest associated with a place of public religious worship.

The charges are as follows:—

A variable block tariff based on the external floor area of the premises at a rate of—

- For the first block of units per month at ... 25 cents per unit
- For the second block of units per month at ... 10 cents per unit
- For units in excess of the total units in the first and second blocks of units per month at ... 7 cents per unit.

Accounts will be subject to a minimum charge in any month at the rate of Rs. 3 for each complete 5 kVA of Assessed Demand or part thereof.

4. Where the supply is used both for a place of religious worship and a private residence, the minimum charge in any month will be at the rate of Rs. 3 for each complete 5 kVA of Assessed Demand or part thereof.

5. Where the supply is for both a private residence and a place of religious worship it shall be metered at one point and the number of units in the first block and the second block in respect of the domestic section and in respect of the place of religious worship shall be aggregated and charged at the rates set out in this tariff.

6. The expression "month" means the period of approximately 30 days from one routine meter reading date to the next routine meter reading date.

7. Where the date of commencement or termination of supply is other than a normal routine meter reading date, the charges for such a period or less than one month as defined in paragraph 6, shall be calculated on a pro-rata basis.

8. The floor area of the residence means the aggregate external floor area of all buildings whether attached to or detached from the main building within the curtilage of the premises. The area of each building shall be ascertained by multiplying the external area in square feet of the largest storey by the number of storeys provided that where the difference between the floor area of any storey other than the largest storey and that of the largest storey is more than 1.00 square feet, such difference shall be taken into account in calculating the floor area for the purpose of this tariff.

9. Part of 500 square feet in the area ascertained shall be counted as 500 square feet.

10. Assessed Demand

The expression "Assessed Demand" in kilovolt-amperes means the service capacity required by the consumer on the date of connection or as subsequently varied at the request of the consumer, such Assessed Demand being not less than the actual maximum demand made or likely to be made from time to time. The Assessed Demand shall not be reduced from any given amount until after the expiry of 12 months from the date at which such Assessed Demand was first provided.

Wimalakirti, 20, Gregory's Road, Colombo 7 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1st respondent" and "2nd respondent" respectively), is whether the termination

Kanagarajah, Proctor, appeared for the 1st respondent, and Mr. Raiph Samarasinghe, Proctor, for the 2nd respondent. After all these three lawyers had opened their respective cases, Mr. Ramanathan marked as P.1 the Last Will of the late Mr. N. D. S. Silva, the father of the 1st respondent and of the late Mr. M. S. **THE PORT OF COLOMBO (ADMINISTRATION)
ACT, No. 10 OF 1950**

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Labour and Nationalised Services, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 13 of the Port of Colombo (Administration) Act, No. 10 of 1950.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Port of Colombo (Petroleum) Regulations, 1961.

GENERAL

2. The agent of every ship engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall, if such ship is due to call at the Port, communicate by notice to the Port Commissioner, the following information at least forty-eight hours before its arrival at the Port:—

- (a) the date and the approximate time of arrival of the ship within the Port;
- (b) the quantity and the nature of the petroleum carried in the ship;
- (c) the manner in which the petroleum is stowed;
- (d) whether or not the petroleum is to be discharged; and
- (e) if the petroleum is to be discharged, the quantity of the petroleum, and the manner in which the petroleum is to be discharged.

3. (1) The master of every ship engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall, while such ship remains within the Port, display at the mast-head by day, a red flag not less than three square feet in size, and by night, a red light at the mast-head, in addition to any navigation lights which may be required under any other regulation made under the Act.

(2) The master of every ship engaged in discharging Class A petroleum at the Oil Dock shall not, while the ship is so engaged, cause or permit any lights other than the approved lighting of the ship to be displayed on the ship until such time as the discharge of such petroleum has been completed.

(3) The master of every petroleum barge engaged in the conveyance of petroleum within the Port shall, while the barge is so engaged, display a red flag not less than eighteen square inches in size on a conspicuous part of such barge.

(4) The master of every tug engaged in towing, within the Port, a barge carrying petroleum, shall, while the tug is so engaged, display a flag of the colour and size specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation at the mast-head of the tug.

4. The Port Commissioner or any officer authorised by him in that behalf may, for the purpose of securing compliance with these regulations or any other regulations made under the Act —

- (a) go on board any petroleum ship or petroleum barge; and
- (b) inspect and examine such ship or barge and any petroleum carried therein.

5. Every petroleum ship or self-propelled petroleum barge engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall, while such ship or barge remains within the Port, be in the control and charge of a competent person.

6. Every petroleum barge engaged in the conveyance of petroleum within the Port shall, while so engaged, be either towed or attended by a tug of such type as may be approved for the purpose by the Port Commissioner:

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not apply in the case of a petroleum barge exclusively engaged in the conveyance of Class C petroleum, if such barge is a self-propelled barge of such type as may be approved for the purpose by the Port Commissioner.

7. The master of every petroleum ship or petroleum barge engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall not move that ship or barge within the Port in a mist or heavy rainstorm.

8. (1) No tug shall tow at the same time more than two petroleum barges which are loaded with petroleum.

(2) No petroleum barge, which is loaded with petroleum shall be towed alongside by a tug.

(3) No tug engaged in towing a petroleum barge loaded with Class A petroleum shall, at the same time, tow any other vessel.

9. Except with the permission of the Port Commissioner previously obtained in that behalf, no petroleum ship engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum in bulk for discharge within the Port shall enter the Port until a berth is ready for its reception.

10. No tug shall be in attendance upon, or shall tow, any petroleum barge loaded with Class A petroleum unless there are on board such tug all such lamps as may be approved by the Port Commissioner for use in case of mist or heavy rain, or any other exceptional circumstances.

11. The master of every petroleum ship or petroleum barge shall, for the purpose of berthing such ship or barge, as the case may be, alongside an oil berth —

- (a) provide an adequate number of suitable fenders; and
- (b) use in addition to the mooring ropes and fenders of such ship or barge, the springs provided on the jetty.

12. The master of every petroleum ship or petroleum barge berthed alongside an oil berth shall —

- (a) take every possible precaution to keep such ship or barge securely moored in order to prevent any damage to the pipes and fittings connecting such ship or barge with the shore pipe-lines; and
- (b) appoint a person to keep a constant look-out on the flexible pipes and to give immediate warning to stop the pumps of the ship or barge in case of an accident to the pipes or shore pumps or for any other reason he may consider necessary.

13. Every lighter engaged within the Port, in the conveyance of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles, shall between sunset and sunrise, be moored fore and aft by chains at the moorings set apart for the purpose by the Port Commissioner.

14. Every petroleum ship engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum which is not intended for discharge at the Port, shall, if such ship enters the Port, depart therefrom on the expiry of such period as the Port Commissioner, having regard to all the circumstances, may determine.

15. (1) The master of every petroleum ship or petroleum barge, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum —

- (a) shall not moor or anchor such ship within one hundred feet of any other vessel; and

(b) shall keep a clear space of one hundred feet round such ship or barge:

Provided however that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not apply in any case where a petroleum barge is alongside a ship for the purpose of loading or discharging petroleum.

(2) No loading or unloading of Class A or Class B petroleum shall be carried out in a petroleum ship or barge lying in the Oil Dock, unless the oil boom or rope boom with red and green flags has been set at a distance of at least one hundred feet from the ship or barge, and no person shall bring any other vessel inside the boom.

16. No person shall export Class A or Class B petroleum in bulk without the written permission of the Port Commissioner.

USE OF OIL BERTHS

17. (1) The owner or agent of any petroleum ship or any other ship intending to call at the Port to load or discharge petroleum in bulk at an oil berth shall, at least three days before the arrival of the ship, make a written application to the Port Commissioner for permission to use the oil berth.

(2) The owner of every petroleum barge intending to use an oil berth other than the South Jetty for the purpose of loading or discharging petroleum in bulk shall make a written application to the Port Commissioner.

(3) Every application for the use of an oil berth shall be made in the form 'A' set out in the Schedule hereto.

18. The master of a petroleum ship or petroleum barge, other than a bunkering barge, shall not bring his ship or barge alongside an oil berth or remove such ship or barge from such jetty otherwise than in accordance with such instructions as may be issued by the Port Commissioner, and at such times of arrival and departure as may be fixed by him:

Provided however that where the loading or unloading of petroleum cannot, owing to unforeseen circumstances, be completed before the time fixed for the departure of the ship or barge, the master of such ship or barge may take such longer time as the Port Commissioner may, upon application made to him in that behalf, permit.

19. If any petroleum ship or petroleum barge does not occupy an oil berth within six hours of the time fixed for the commencement of loading or unloading petroleum, such ship or barge shall be liable to lose her turn.

20. (1) Any petroleum ship in respect of which a period has been fixed for loading or unloading petroleum at an oil berth may be taken to such berth directly on arrival in the Port; but no communication with the shore shall take place until the Port Health Officer has granted pratique.

(2) Where any petroleum ship which is due to load or unload petroleum is placed in quarantine, the master thereof shall move the ship to such berth in the quarantine anchorage as may be fixed by the Port Commissioner and shall keep the ship at such berth until quarantine measures have been carried out and permission is granted by the Port Commissioner to proceed to an oil berth.

21. Except with the written permission of the Port Commissioner, not more than one petroleum ship or petroleum barge shall be moored at any one of the oil berths other than the South Jetty at the same time.

22. The master of every petroleum ship coming alongside or leaving an oil berth shall do so under the power supplied by the ship unless otherwise authorised by the Port Commissioner.

LOADING AND UNLOADING OF PETROLEUM

23. The master of any ship carrying Class A petroleum shall not cause or permit such petroleum to be unloaded between sunset and sunrise without the consent of the Port Commissioner.

24. While any ship is unloading Class A or Class B petroleum or ballasting, the master of such ship shall not cause or permit the loading of water to such ship from a water barge unless such barge is moored outside the boom and the water is supplied to the ship through hoses or permanent pipeline.

25. No person shall discharge any petroleum within the Port unless a sufferance in respect thereof has been granted under section 36 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) and except at the place appointed and expressed in such sufferance.

26. The master of every petroleum ship or petroleum barge in the Port shall permit the Port Commissioner or his duly authorised representative to examine any oil tanks, bunker oil tanks, pumps, pipelines, valves and any machinery of the ship or barge and to take any samples or records he may reasonably require.

27. The master of every ship engaged in loading or unloading petroleum within the Port shall cause an officer of the ship and a crew, sufficient for the safe and efficient operation of loading or unloading, to be on duty while such ship is so engaged.

28. The master of every petroleum ship or petroleum barge engaged in the discharge of petroleum within the Port, shall while such ship or barge is so engaged, take all such steps as may be necessary to ensure that such discharge is effected with all due speed, care and diligence.

29. The master of every ship engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall not cause or permit such petroleum to be transferred from his ship to another ship within the Port without the written permission of the Port Commissioner.

30. (1) The master of a ship engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall not bring the ship into the Port if the petroleum in that ship is leaking.

(2) Where any leakage of petroleum is discovered while a ship is in the Port, the master of such ship shall forthwith report the matter to the Port Commissioner.

31. (1) No person shall allow petroleum to escape into the harbour from any petroleum ship or petroleum barge or any other vessel or from any pipes connected therewith, or from any barrels, tins, drums or other receptacles.

(2) In order to prevent any petroleum escaping into the harbour from a petroleum ship when the sea valve or the cargo pump of the ship is opened, the master thereof shall cause such cargo pump to be run for a short period with all tank suction valves closed before the sea valve is opened and shall cause the sea valve to be closed before the pump is stopped.

32. (1) No person shall pump, throw or allow the flow into the harbour or any waterway connected therewith, any water from any tank, barge or other space in a petroleum ship, petroleum barge or other vessel, which contains or has contained petroleum, unless such tank, barge or other space has been certified in writing by the master of the ship or barge or vessel, as being free from petroleum.

(2) No master of any petroleum ship or petroleum barge shall issue a certificate referred to in paragraph (1) which he knows to be incorrect.

(3) The owner of every petroleum ship, petroleum barge or the vessel which contains or has contained petroleum shall cause a copy of this regulation in Sinhalese, Tamil and English to be displayed in a conspicuous part of such ship, barge or other vessel.

(4) In this regulation, "petroleum", includes oil ordinarily used for lubrication purposes.

33. Where a ship in the Port has completed the discharge of Class A or Class B petroleum in bulk, the master thereof shall cause water to be pumped into the pipe-lines in such manner as may be indicated by the Port Commissioner.

34. (1) From the time when the holds or tanks of a petroleum ship are first opened for the purpose of sampling, dipping or discharging Class A petroleum until such time as loading, discharging or ballasting has been completed and the holds or tanks in the ship shall have been securely closed down, there shall be no fires or lights in the ship other than the approved lighting of the ship and the boiler fires:

Provided however that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not prevent the use of lamps, heaters, cookers or other apparatus, electric or otherwise, designed, constructed, installed and maintained in accordance with Lloyd's requirements or the requirements of any other Classification Society approved by the Port Commissioner.

Provided further that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to prohibit the loading or discharging of petroleum under such conditions as may be approved by the Port Commissioner, by means of steam from the ship's boilers or power generated on board the ship by electrical plant or internal combustion engines, designed, constructed, installed, and maintained in accordance with the requirements of Lloyd's or of any other approved Classification Society.

(2) The master of every petroleum ship, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum, shall not cause or permit any tank lid port or other tank opening of such ship to remain open while the ship is alongside the oil berth, unless it is covered by holders approved by the Port Commissioner and containing wire gauze of not less than twenty-eight meshes to the linear inch.

35. While a petroleum ship within the Port, is discharging Class A petroleum at an oil berth —

(1) no person other than a person engaged on any business connected with the ship or a person approved by the Port Commissioner, shall go on board such ship; and

(2) no person under the influence of alcohol shall proceed beyond the safety barrier on the jetty.

36. If, during the operations connected with the pumping of petroleum through a pipe-line into a storage tank at an installation, the liquid which enters the tank is a mixture of petroleum and water, the owner of the installation shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the pumping is carried out at the rate of one metre per second until the liquid entering the tank is either pure petroleum or pure water:

Provided however that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not apply —

(a) in the case of a tank with a floating roof, if the roof is actually floating; or

(b) in the case of a tank with a fixed roof, if pure petroleum or a mixture of petroleum and water in such tanks is at a level not less than five feet above the top of the inlet pipe.

(2) In this regulation, "petroleum" means Class A petroleum or Class B petroleum.

Precautions against fire

37. The master of every ship or barge, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall, while it is engaged, take every possible precaution to prevent any risk of a fire or an explosion, or any oil leaking or flowing into the harbour, or on to any oil berth.

38. No person shall smoke on any petroleum ship within the Port except at a place set apart for the purpose, and no person shall smoke on any petroleum barge loaded with petroleum or on a petroleum barge which has discharged petroleum but has not been rendered free of gas.

39. While a ship is discharging Class A petroleum at an oil berth, no person shall smoke, or use any light in such ship otherwise than in accordance with regulation 34 (1):

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit the crew from smoking in such part of the ship as may be set apart for the purpose by the master of the ship.

40. While discharging Class A petroleum, or a ship carrying Class A petroleum is at the Oil Dock, no person shall smoke or use any light or fire or keep any matches or other means of ignition within the safety barrier on the Pier or in the pumping installation.

41. The master of a ship at an oil berth shall not —

(a) use any fire or naked light on board such ship, otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of regulation 34 (1) or

(b) permit any person other than a member of the crew to smoke on such ship, otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of regulation 40.

42. From the time when any hold or tank of a petroleum ship within the Port is first opened for the discharge of petroleum until such time as all petroleum contained in the hold or tank of such ship has been discharged, the master of such ship shall not use on board such ship any fire or artificial light other than a safety lamp approved by the Port Commissioner:

Provided however that the preceding provisions of this regulation shall not apply to any ship which, on application made in that behalf, has been exempted by the Port Commissioner from the operation of the preceding provisions of this regulation on the ground that the Commissioner is satisfied that there is likely to be no risk of damage by fire by reason of such discharge.

43. The master of every ship engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum, shall, if such ship is berthed at the Oil Dock, collect all matchers and other means of ignition on board such ship and lock them in an iron box or deposit them in the oil facilities store before any cargo tank or hold of the ship is opened.

44. The master of a ship shall not discharge or permit the discharge of Class A petroleum from that ship during a lightning storm.

45. The master of every ship, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of petroleum in cases, drums, tins or other receptacles shall cause the holds or such ship containing such cases, drums, tins or other receptacles —

(a) to be thoroughly ventilated before the discharge of such cases, drums, tins or other receptacles; and

(b) to be rendered free of any inflammable vapour after the discharge of such cases, drums, tins or other receptacles.

46. (a) The master of any petroleum ship within the Port shall not cause or permit the loading and discharging of petroleum between sunset and sunrise, unless the lighting provided on such ship is of a type approved by the Port Commissioner.

(b) The master of any petroleum ship carrying Class A petroleum shall not cause or permit the rigging or disconnecting of hoses between sunset and sunrise.

(c) The master of any petroleum ship carrying Class B and Class C petroleum shall not cause or permit the rigging or disconnecting of hoses between sunset and sunrise unless the lighting provided on such ship is of a type approved by the Port Commissioner.

47. Where, during the period a petroleum ship within the Port is loading or discharging petroleum between sunset and sunrise, it becomes necessary to repair any machinery, pipes or equipment in that ship, the master thereof shall cause the loading or discharging of petroleum to be temporarily suspended and shall not permit its resumption until such safety measures as may be approved by the Port Commissioner have been taken.

48. While a ship is loading or unloading petroleum at an oil berth, no person shall, on board such ship or within the safety barrier —

- (a) carry out repairs involving the use of machinery without the written permission of the Port Commissioner; or
- (b) use iron or steel tools likely to cause any sparks.

49. The master of any ship in the Port which has discharged Class A petroleum shall not cause or permit the fires of the ship to be lighted until water has been pumped into the pipelines for one hour and until the Port Commissioner is satisfied —

- (a) that all tank openings in such ship are closed and securely fastened and that the escape of any gas due to ballasting or otherwise, is only through the gas line at the head of the ship's mast; and
- (b) that all Class A petroleum in packages or cases, and all petroleum other than Class A petroleum in the same tank or hold as the Class A petroleum, has been discharged and that the holds or tanks of the ship have been closed and securely fastened.

Petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles.

50. (1) No person shall bring into the Port for unloading or tranship within the Port, Class A petroleum or Class B petroleum other than in bulk, except in receptacles which conform to the following requirements:—

Every such receptacle must —

- (a) where its capacity does not exceed 2 gallons, be not less than 27 BWG in thickness;
- (b) where its capacity exceeds 2 gallons but does not exceed 4 gallons, be not less than 22 BWG in thickness;
- (c) where its capacity exceeds 4 gallons but does not exceed 8 gallons, be not less than 20 BWG in thickness;
- (d) where its capacity exceeds 8 gallons but does not exceed 20 gallons, be not less than 16 BWG in thickness;
- (e) where its capacity exceeds 20 gallons but does not exceed 30 gallons, be not less than 14 BWG in thickness; and
- (f) where its capacity exceeds 30 gallons but does not exceed 65 gallons, be not less than 12 BWG in thickness.

(2) There shall be left in every such receptacle at the time of filling an air space, of at least one-twentieth of the capacity of the receptacle.

(3) Every such receptacle must be so constructed and secured as not to be liable, except in circumstances of grave negligence or extraordinary accident, to be broken or become defective, leaky or insecure.

(4) Every such receptacle must bear the name of the importer, the nature of the contents thereof, and the words "highly inflammable".

(5) In this regulation the expression "BWG" means Birmingham Wire Gauge.

51. No person shall unload or load a consignment of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles from or to any ship in the Port without the permission of the Port Commissioner.

52. (1) Subject to the provisions of regulation 57, no person shall unload from any ship within the Port, petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles except into a lighter.

(2) The tinal of every lighter into which petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles is unloaded from any ship shall cause such cases, tins, drums or other receptacles to be placed in an upright position with the cap or lid uppermost.

53. No person shall unload from or load to any ship within the Port, petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles except between the hours of 6.00 a.m. and 3.00 p.m.:

Provided that the preceding provision of this regulation shall not apply in a case where such petroleum is unloaded from a ship directly on to the quays at the Oil Dock.

54. The tinal of every lighter within the Port engaged in the conveyance of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles —

- (a) shall display at the bow and stern of such lighter a red flag not less than two square feet in size at a height of not less than six feet above the deck; and
- (b) shall not convey any other cargo at the same time in such lighter.

55. (1) The master of a ship in the Port engaged in the conveyance of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles shall not cause or permit such petroleum to be unloaded into a lighter —

- (a) unless he has given at least three hours' notice of such unloading to the officer in charge of the Harbour Police; and
- (b) unless a police officer is on board such lighter.

(2) The agent of a ship in the Port shall not cause or permit any petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles to be loaded into a lighter for the purpose of being conveyed to that ship —

- (a) unless he has given at least three hours' notice of such loading to the officer in charge of the Harbour Police; and
- (b) unless a police officer is on board such lighter.

56. The master of a ship within the Port shall not cause or permit the unloading into lighters, of any case, tin, drum or other receptacle containing petroleum, if such case, tin, drum or other receptacle is damaged or leaking.

57. A ship engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles is berthed at the Oil Dock will be permitted to unload directly on to the Pier at any time between 6 a.m. and 5 p.m. provided the Port Commissioner is satisfied that satisfactory and adequate arrangements have been made for their removal from the Quay before 6 p.m.

58. No person shall land from any ship petroleum (other than Class A petroleum) in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles, at any place other than the place appointed and expressed in the licence granted in respect thereof under section 36 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 165).

59. Where a consignment of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles has been discharged from a ship within the Port into any lighter, the tinal of such lighter shall close the hatches or cover such consignment with tarpaulins.

60. The tinal of any lighter into which petroleum (other than Class A petroleum) in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles has been unloaded —

- (a) shall forthwith bring the lighter by the most direct route to the landing place indicated by the Port Commissioner, and shall land the petroleum immediately; and
- (b) shall not under any circumstances cause or permit such petroleum to be transported by water between sunset and sunrise.

61. No person shall smoke, light a fire or expose a naked light or keep any matches or other means of ignition on board any lighter loaded with petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles.

62. (1) The importer of any consignment of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles shall, as soon as such consignment is landed in the Port, remove it forthwith to a place outside the Port or to such place within the Port as may be indicated by the Port Commissioner.

(2) The importer of any consignment of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles shall not permit any truck or vehicle containing such consignment to remain within the Port but shall forthwith remove such truck or vehicle to a place outside the Port.

63. The importer of every consignment of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles, shall, if such consignment is not removed from the Port before sunset of the day on which it was landed, store such consignment in such manner and at such place as may be directed by the Port Commissioner, and shall remove such consignment before sunset of the day immediately following.

64. The importer of every consignment of petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles landed within the Port shall not leave such consignment within fifty feet of a steam crane in which there is a fire.

65. While a ship is berthed at the Oil Dock petroleum in cases, tins, drums or other receptacles which are in a leaking condition may, with the written permission of the Port Commissioner, be landed directly on to the pier for the purpose of repairing such cases, tins, drums or other receptacles or for de-canting.

Petroleum barges

66. (1) No person shall convey petroleum in bulk, within the Port, except in a petroleum barge or petroleum ship.

(2) No person shall convey petroleum within the Port in a petroleum barge without the permission of the Port Commissioner.

67. The owner of every petroleum barge fitted with tanks shall cause to be painted on the outside of the barge, immediately before the licence number painted thereon as required by section 18 of the Masters Attendant Ordinance (Chapter 262), such letters as may be directed, by the Port Commissioner. Each such letter shall not be less than six inches in length and six inches in breadth.

68. Every petroleum barge which is loaded with fuel oil shall be moored at a special place appointed for the purpose by the Port Commissioner.

69. The master of a petroleum barge shall not cause or permit the tank compartment of the barge to be filled above the horizontal bar fixed two inches above the base of the expansion chamber in the barge.

70. Before any petroleum barge fitted with a tank is removed from the place at which it has been loaded, the master of such barge shall cause all manholes in such tank to be screwed down gas-tight, all valves to be closed, and all ventilator openings to be securely stopped or covered with wire gauze.

71. The master of a petroleum barge shall not cause or permit any manhole, valve or ventilator to be opened while such petroleum barge is under way or before it has reached the jetty where, or the ship into which, the petroleum is to be discharged.

72. (1) Every petroleum barge within the Port engaged in the conveyance of petroleum shall, while so engaged, be under the sole control and personal supervision of the master of such barge.

(2) The master of any petroleum barge shall not permit any unauthorised person to have access to his barge, and he shall take all possible precautions against fire.

73. The master of every petroleum barge, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of petroleum, shall immediately after the discharge of the petroleum and before the petroleum barge is removed, securely close, or cause to be securely closed, all manholes, valves and ventilators in the barge.

74. The master of a petroleum barge within the Port engaged in the conveyance of petroleum, shall not permit such barge to proceed to the place of unloading unless he is satisfied that the prompt unloading of the petroleum is possible on arrival at that place.

75. Where it becomes necessary to display lights upon any petroleum barge within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum while such barge is moored or anchored on account of mist, heavy rain or any other exceptional cause, the master of such barge shall obtain the necessary lamps from the person in charge of the tug in attendance, and shall return such lamps to that person immediately after use.

76. The master of a petroleum barge, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum, shall not cause or permit any lamp to be lighted on board such barge under any circumstances whatsoever, while such barge is under way.

77. The master of a barge, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum shall not use any fire or artificial light or keep or permit any person to keep any matches or other means of ignition on such barge, nor shall he smoke or permit any other person to smoke on board such barge.

78. Every person on board or about to go on board a petroleum barge, within the Port, engaged in the conveyance of Class A petroleum, shall submit to being searched by an officer duly authorised by the Port Commissioner for the purpose of ascertaining whether such person carries matches or other means of ignition.

79. (1) No person shall use within the Port, any petroleum barge fitted with a tank or tanks except under the authority of a permit issued in that behalf by the Port Commissioner.

(2) No person shall be entitled to the permit referred to in paragraph (1), unless such barge is in conformity with the following requirements:—

(a) Such barge must not exceed one hundred and fifty feet in length, twenty-six feet in breadth and twelve feet in depth when loaded; and

(b) Such barge must conform to Lloyd's or other accepted Classification Society's rules relating to the construction of vessels intended to carry oil in bulk, and it must be constructed under the supervision of the Classification Society's representative and a certificate stating that the barge has been so constructed must be produced.

(3) Every permit referred to in paragraph (1) shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

Storage of Petroleum

80. The person in charge of, and every person employed by the owner of, every installation or storage-shed shall abstain from any act whatsoever which is likely to cause a fire or an explosion, and shall prevent any other person from doing any such act.

81. (1) No person shall smoke within the premises of an installation or a storage-shed except in such place, as may be specially set apart for the purpose.

(2) The owner of every installation or storage-shed shall display notices with the words "No Smoking" in Sinhalese, Tamil and English in conspicuous places in such installation or storage-shed.

82. The owner of every installation or storage-shed shall not cause or permit any work in connection with the handling of

petroleum to be carried out in such installation or storage-shed except under the supervision of a person authorised in that behalf by such owner.

83. The owner of an installation shall not keep petroleum at such installation except in a storage-shed or a tank without the written permission of the Port Commissioner.

The owner of an installation—

(a) shall keep such installation clean, and free from rubbish and weeds; and

(b) shall not keep at the installation any inflammable goods other than petroleum except with the permission of the Port Commissioner and subject to such conditions as he may impose.

85. The owner of every installation shall provide an efficient fire-extinguishing service at such installation and shall cause all his employees at the installation to be instructed periodically in the use of the fire appliances maintained at such installation.

86. (1) The owner of every installation shall keep in convenient places in such installation an adequate supply of sand or dry earth with means for handling it in readiness for immediate use in cases of a fire.

(2) The owner of every installation—

(a) shall cause every enclosure surrounding a tank to be drained by a pipe fitted with a valve which is easily accessible and easily operated from the outside of the enclosure;

(b) shall cause the valve of the pipe referred to in sub-paragraph (a) to be kept closed except when an operator is present;

(c) shall not permit water to accumulate in the enclosure; and

(d) shall cause every surface water drain to be provided with oil traps at the entrance to the main rain water drains or at any other point approved by the Port Commissioner.

Provided that, in cases where conditions in the vicinity of the installation do not permit the observance of the preceding provisions of this paragraph, the owner may, with the permission of the Port Commissioner, take such other steps as may be approved by the Port Commissioner.

87. (1) The drainage valves controlling the discharge of rain water from the saucer which surrounds each tank in an installation shall not be opened for the discharge of rain water or for any other purpose, except with the prior permission of the Port Commissioner or an officer authorised in that behalf by the Port Commissioner.

(2) During the period such valves are kept open for the discharge of rain water or for any other purpose, it shall be the duty of the owner of the installation to station a watcher at such tank until the valves are closed to the satisfaction of the Port Commissioner.

88. The owner of every installation shall not use on the tanks, in the oil pipes or in the pipes for draining water, any valve other than a valve of a type approved by the Port Commissioner and provided with an indicator so that it can be ascertained from a distance whether the valve is open or shut.

89. The owner of every installation or storage-shed shall cause a copy in Sinhalese, Tamil and English of these regulations relating to the storage of petroleum in any installation or storage-shed, to be displayed in a conspicuous place in such installation or storage-shed.

90. The owner of every installation shall report to the Port Commissioner any leak in a tank as soon as it is discovered, and shall take immediate steps to repair such leak. Where such leak has been repaired, he shall forthwith report that fact to the Port Commissioner.

91. (1) No person shall, without the authority of the Port Commissioner, enter any tank at any installation.

(2) Where the entry of any person into, or the repair of, any tank at an installation is likely to expose the interior atmosphere of the tank to contact with hot rivets or any other possible source of ignition, such tank shall before any person enters the tank or before any repairs are carried out, be thoroughly ventilated and certified as free from dangerous vapour after a test by a person approved for the purpose either generally or specially by the Port Commissioner.

(3) No person shall take into a tank at any installation any lamp other than an oil or electric portable safety lamp of a type approved by the Port Commissioner.

92. The owner of every installation shall not use for the purpose of storing petroleum, any tank other than a tank constructed of mild steel plates properly welded or rivetted together and caulked and designed according to sound engineering practice.

93. The Port Commissioner may at any time enter any installation or storage-shed for the purpose of inspection, and the owner of such installation or storage-shed shall permit the Port Commissioner to make such inspection and to measure the quantity of petroleum in such installation or storage-shed.

94. The owner of every installation shall take every precaution to prevent waste oil and petroleum from passing down drains or water-courses and from reaching the harbour or any other waterway.

95. The Port Commissioner shall calibrate every tank in an installation and issue calibration tables to the owner of such installation; and the owner shall not use at such installation any calibration tables other than the tables so issued.

96. All tanks used for the storage of petroleum shall be calibrated complete, including the bottom.

97. The owner of every installation shall cause to be painted on every tank in such installation, the capacity of such tank in gallons or tons and such letter or figure, as directed by the Port Commissioner, to which the calibration tables refer.

98. (1) The owner of any installation shall not use for the purpose of storing Class A or Class B petroleum any tank or group of tanks situated above the ground level, unless such tank or group of tanks is completely surrounded by an oil-retaining bund or wall. The total capacity of the tank or tanks in any such bund enclosure shall not exceed 25,000 water-tons.

(2) Each such bund enclosure shall—

(a) in a case where only one tank is situated in such enclosure, be capable of retaining the entire capacity of such tank, and

(b) in a case where, more than one tank is situated in such enclosure, be capable of retaining the capacity of the largest tank in that enclosure and ten per centum of the capacity of the remaining tanks.

(3) Where any such bund enclosure contains more than one tank, intermediate bund walls which shall be at least two feet in height shall be provided between individual tanks to act as fire-breaks.

(4) No bund or wall shall be required in the case of tanks which are completely buried or mounded over.

(5) Tanks used for the storage of Class C petroleum shall be surrounded by a wall or bund capable of retaining the capacity of the largest tank in the enclosure, plus ten per centum of the aggregate capacity of the remaining tanks.

99. No person shall use a storage-shed unless it is constructed of masonry, or other non-inflammable material and it has a tiled or paved, or concrete floor.

100. No person shall use any building at any installation as a storage-shed or pump-house for Class A petroleum unless the bottom of each doorway or any other opening of the building is built up to a height of not less than six inches above the level of the ground outside such building or the floor of the building has been sunk to a depth of not less than six inches below the level of the ground, or the building itself is surrounded with a masonry wall or an embankment.

101. The owner of every storage-shed shall take all such steps as may be necessary to provide adequate ventilation in such storage-shed.

102. The owner of every installation shall cause every tank to be fitted with an efficient electrical earth connection at two or more places, and shall cause each such connection to be tested at least once a year, and shall report the results of such test to the Port Commissioner.

103. (1) No person shall construct any installation, and no owner of an installation shall carry out any alterations to such installation, without the written permission of the Port Commissioner.

(2) Every person making an application to the Port Commissioner for the permission referred to in paragraph (1) shall submit plans, in duplicate and specifications or any other information relating to the installation which may be required by the Port Commissioner.

104. The owner of every installation where petroleum, not consisting exclusively of fuel oil, is stored shall not cause or permit any work to be done between sunset and sunrise unless—

(a) the installation is illuminated solely by electricity; and

(b) the Port Commissioner has given special permission for the purpose.

105. The owner of every installation where petroleum, not consisting exclusively of fuel oil, is stored shall not permit any fire, naked light or other means of ignition to be used except in any office, or any shed used for heating soldering irons, or in any can factory, laboratory, living-quarters, engine room, boiler house, smithy or any other place specially authorised in writing by the Port Commissioner.

106. The owner of every installation shall ensure that all electrical equipment within the dangerous area is of a flame-proof type, approved by the Port Commissioner. For the purpose of this regulation "dangerous area" means the area within fifty feet in all directions from any location where leakage or emission of oil is normally likely to occur.

107. The owner of every installation shall ensure that all tanks in such installation are fitted with adequate vents to permit pressure or vacuum release when filling or discharging operations are in progress, or for any extraordinary temperature change due to climatic conditions. In all cases where such vents are fitted with gauze, steps shall be taken at appropriate intervals to ensure that the passage of air through the gauze is unrestricted.

108. (1) The owner of every installation where petroleum, not consisting exclusively of fuel oil, is stored shall cause the roof of each storage tank to be made gas-tight except for the ventilation openings referred to in regulation 107.

(2) The owner of every installation where petroleum, not consisting exclusively of fuel oil, is stored may use tanks with floating or gasometer roofs or of any other special construction as may be approved by the Port Commissioner.

109. (1) No person shall use any tank at an installation for the storage of petroleum unless the distance between such tank and any building or storage-shed, or between such tank and the boundary wall of the installation or any place in which the use of naked lights or fires is permitted, is—

(a) not less than fifty feet, in a case where such tank is used for the storage of Class A petroleum.

(b) not less than thirty feet, in a case where such tank is used for the storage of Class B petroleum, and

(c) not less than twenty feet, in a case where such tank is used for the storage of Class C petroleum.

(2) No person shall use any tank at an installation for the storage of Class A petroleum unless the distance between such tank and any other tank is not less than fifty feet or the diameter of the smaller tank, whichever is less:

Provided however that the distance between such tank and that other tank shall in no case be less than thirty feet.

(3) No person shall use any tank at an installation for the storage of Class B petroleum unless the distance between such tank and any other tank is not less than thirty feet or the diameter of the smaller tank, whichever is less:

Provided however that the distance between such tank and that other tank shall in no case be less than twenty feet.

(4) No person shall use any tank at an installation for the storage of Class C petroleum unless the distance between such tank and any other tank is not less than twenty feet.

(5) The distance referred to in the preceding provisions of this regulation shall be measured between the nearest points of the perimeters of tanks, buildings, or boundary walls, as the case may be.

(6) For the purposes of paragraph (5) of this regulation, a group of small tanks having an aggregate capacity not exceeding one thousand water-tons may be considered as a single tank if such group is separately bounded by a wall or bund of at least two feet in height.

(7) In the case of buried or semi-buried tanks the requirements as to distances specified in the preceding provisions of this regulation may, upon application made in that behalf, be relaxed by the Port Commissioner.

110. (1) No person shall store Class A petroleum except in a tank, or in a metal container the capacity of which does not exceed sixty-five imperial gallons.

(2) The thickness of the metal of every such container shall—

(a) where the capacity of the container does not exceed five imperial gallons, be 20 SWG,

(b) where the capacity exceeds five imperial gallons but does not exceed fifteen imperial gallons, be 20 SWG,

(c) where the capacity exceeds fifteen imperial gallons but does not exceed thirty imperial gallons, be 19 SWG,

(d) where the capacity exceeds thirty imperial gallons but does not exceed fifty imperial gallons, be 18 SWG, and

(e) where the capacity exceeds fifty imperial gallons but does not exceed sixty-five imperial gallons, be 16 SWG.

(3) In this regulation the expression "SWG" means standard wire gauge.

111. The owner of an installation where Class A petroleum is stored shall not permit—

(a) the soldering of tins, whether such tins are empty or not, to be carried out in the storage shed or filling-shed but shall cause such soldering to be carried out in a separate building not less than 50 feet distant from the storage-shed or filling-sheds; or

(b) any soldering iron, other than an electrical iron of a type approved by the Port Commissioner, to be heated in a shed which is less than 50 feet from the shed where the soldering takes place and less than 100 feet from the storage-shed or filling-shed; or

(c) any receptacle to be repaired unless it has been cleared of all petroleum and all dangerous vapours.

112. (1) The owner of any installation shall not cause or permit any tank wagons, tank lorries or other tank vehicles to be loaded or discharged except at a place approved by the Port Commissioner and unless all precautions against fire or explosion have been taken in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

(2) The owner of every installation shall take necessary steps to ensure that—

- (a) the engine of a tank lorry is stopped before any cover is removed or any valve is opened for the loading or discharging of petroleum;
- (b) all the pipe connections are securely made and an efficient electrical earth is connected before any valve of a tank wagon, tank lorry or other tank vehicle is opened, and
- (c) where a tank wagon, tank lorry or other tank vehicle is loaded with petroleum, an air space, equal to at least one-twentieth of its capacity is left.

113. The owner of every installation shall not cause or permit any person to enter a tank, other than a tank which is known to be free of dangerous gas, unless such tank has been tested with an Electrical Explosive Meter and found to be free from dangerous gas: Only persons who have been carefully instructed in the use of safety lamps shall be permitted to enter the inside of a tank for the purpose of ascertaining whether the tank is free of any dangerous vapour.

Use of the Common Facilities Oil pumps and Pipe-lines maintained by the Port Commissioner.

114. No person shall use the Common Facilities Oil pumps and pipe-lines without the permission of the Port Commissioner.

115. Every application for permission to use the Common Facilities oil pumps and pipe-lines shall be made substantially in the form prescribed for the purpose by the Port Commissioner by notice published in such manner as he may consider best calculated to give publicity thereto:

Provided that no such application shall be necessary where an application has already been made under regulation 17 for the use of an oil berth, or where the transfer of Class C petroleum has been arranged with the permission of the Port Commissioner.

116. Every person who intends to use the Common Facilities oil pumps and pipe-line shall—

- (a) if he intends to use them on any Sunday or Monday, give notice of his intention not later than noon on the previous Saturday;
- (b) if he intends to use them on any holiday, give notice of his intention not later than noon on the previous day, and
- (c) if he intends to use them on any other day, give not less than eight hours' notice of his intention.

117. No person shall use the Common Facilities transfer pumps maintained by the Port Commissioner at Kolonnawa, without the permission of the Port Commissioner, except for the purpose of transferring oil from Kolonnawa to the tanks at Bloemendhal. Such permission shall be given only in the case of an emergency.

118. (1) Before any pumping of petroleum takes place through the Common Facilities pipe-lines into any installation, the owner of such installation shall take the necessary steps to ensure that the correct valves are open in such installation.

(2) Before the pumping of petroleum into any installation commences, the Port Commissioner shall seal or lock the valves of the pipe-lines branching from the main pipe-lines, which are not used, in the presence of a representative of the owners of such pipe-line.

(3) When a pipe-line is used for pumping imported petroleum into a tank, a Customs Officer shall be present to witness the sealing or locking of the valves.

(4) During the pumping of petroleum, the valves of each pipe-line branching from a pipe-line leading to a tank which is being filled or of any pipe-line leading out from such tank shall be sealed or locked in the presence of the persons mentioned in the preceding provisions of this regulation.

(5) No person other than an officer specially authorised by the Port Commissioner in that behalf shall break or open any valve which has been sealed or locked under the preceding provisions of this regulation.

119. The owner of every installation who fails to use the Common Facilities oil pumps within the period assigned to him shall be liable to lose his turn.

120. It shall be lawful for the Port Commissioner to give priority to the owner of any installation to use the Common Facilities oil pumps and pipe-lines, notwithstanding that the owner of any other installation has been allotted the use of such pumps and pipe-lines during the same period.

121. While the owner of an installation is using the Common Facilities oil pumps and pipe-lines, he shall cause a person authorised by him to be on duty at each end of the pipe-line

which is being used, and such persons shall supervise the actual process of pumping and, if there is any irregularity in the delivery of petroleum, he shall forthwith report the matter to the Port Commissioner.

122. (1) The oil-pipes belonging to the owner of any installation and the pumps, valves, flexible pipes and other connections shall be laid, maintained, patrolled and operated by such owner to the satisfaction of the Port Commissioner.

(2) Every owner of an installation—

- (a) shall take every precaution to safeguard the equipment and facilities maintained by the Port Commissioner and used by him; and
- (b) shall not permit the leakage or loss of petroleum through his pipes, pumps, valves or other connections.

123. (1) For the purpose of discharging petroleum from a petroleum ship through the Common Facilities pipe-lines into a tank at any installation, the Port Commissioner shall supply, fix and maintain the flexible pipes between the ship and the pipe-lines and shall, after the petroleum has been discharged, disconnect and remove the hoses and fix blank flanges on the open end of the pipes, but it shall be the duty of the owner of the installation to ensure that all the connections are correct.

(2) For the purpose of bunkering, the owner of an installation shall provide, fix and maintain the flexible pipes and couplings and shall also ensure that all the valves and connections on the ship are in order.

(3) The owner of an installation shall not—

- (a) permit petroleum to escape through faulty connections; or
- (b) cause any damage to the flexible pipe through over-pumping.

(4) The owner of an installation shall take all necessary steps to ensure that his telephone is in order during the discharge of petroleum or bunkering.

124. The owner of an installation shall, at the termination of the pumping of petroleum through the Common Facilities pipe-lines to any tank, ensure that there is sufficient space left in such tank to receive any petroleum which may remain in the pipe-line.

125. The owner of a petroleum ship which has discharged Class A or Class B petroleum through the Common Facilities pipe-line shall clear the pipe-line of petroleum by pumping water through the pipe-line into the oil tank unless otherwise authorised in writing by the Port Commissioner.

126. (1) No person shall pump through the Common Facilities oil pumps and pipe-lines any sludge or any liquid of high viscosity which is likely to foul or choke such pumps or pipe-lines.

(2) The owner of every installation shall take every precaution to ensure that the tank swing pipe is kept immersed in petroleum whenever petroleum is being transferred.

127. The person or persons liable for a contravention of such of the provisions of these regulations as are specified in column I hereunder shall be the person or persons specified in the corresponding entry in column II:—

Interpretation

128. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Port of Colombo (Administration) Act, No. 10 of 1950;

“Class A petroleum” means petroleum having a flashing point below 73 degrees of Fahrenheit's Thermometer;

“Class B petroleum” means petroleum having a flashing point between 73 degrees and 150 degrees of Fahrenheit's Thermometer;

“Class C petroleum” means petroleum having a flashing point above 150 degrees of Fahrenheit's Thermometer;

"Common Facilities oil pumps and pipe-lines" means the oil pumps and pipe-lines maintained by the Port Commissioner;

"Competent person" shall be a person adjudged to be competent by the Port Commissioner by reason of his possession of suitable qualifications.

"Discharging" means unloading in bulk.

"Installation" means a place within the premises in occupation, or under the control, of the Port Commissioner which is set apart for the storage of petroleum of a quantity exceeding 200 tons;

"Lighter" means any vessel which is exclusively used within the Port either for the conveyance of cargo, fuel or water or as a floating stage alongside any other vessel;

"Lloyds' Reoresensative" means the accredited representative in Ceylon of Lloyds of London;

"Loading" means loading in bulk or in packages.

"Master" means the person having the command, charge or management of any ship or barge but does not include a Pilot or the Master Attendant;

"Oil Berth" means the Mutwal South Jetty, and North Pier and South Quay of the Oil Dock;

"Petroleum" means any inflammable liquid which is derived from petroleum, coal, shale, peat or any other bituminous substances, or from any of their products, but does not include any oil ordinarily used for lubricating purposes having its flashing point at or above 200 degrees of Fahrenheit's Thermometer;

"Petroleum barge" means any barge used exclusively for the conveyance of petroleum in bulk;

"Petroleum ship" means a ship used exclusively for the conveyance of petroleum in bulk;

"Port" and "Port Commissioner" shall have the same meanings as in the Act;

"Storage-shed" means a building within the premises in occupation, or under the control, of the Port Commissioner which is used for the storage of petroleum otherwise than in bulk and includes a filling-shed;

"Unloading" means unloading in bulk or in packages.

Repeal

129. The Port of Colombo (Petroleum) Regulations, 1950, published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 10,193 of December 21, 1950, are hereby rescinded.

THE ASSISTED SCHOOLS AND TRAINING COLLEGES (SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS) ACT, No. 8 OF 1961

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Education and Broadcasting under section 20 and 26 of the Assisted Schools and Training Colleges (Supplementary Provisions) Act, No. 8 of 1961.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Assisted Schools and Training Colleges (Arbitration) Regulations, 1961.

2. In these regulations—

(a) "Act" means the Assisted Schools and Training Colleges (Supplementary Provisions) Act, No. 8 of 1961; and

(b) "Tribunal" means a single arbitrator or two arbitrators or an umpire, appointed under section 20 of the Act.

3. Every arbitrator or umpire appointed under section 20 of the Act, shall be remunerated at such rates as may be determined by the Minister with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance.

4. (1) The Tribunal shall, in respect of every reference made to it, keep a record of all the proceedings before the Tribunal relating to that reference.

(2) For the purposes of keeping the record referred to in paragraph (1), there may be appointed a Secretary to the Tribunal who shall act under the directions of the Tribunal.

5. The Tribunal shall, for the purposes of the consideration and determination of any objection or matter referred to it, have the power to summon any person to appear before the Tribunal, to examine any person so summoned on oath and to require any person to produce any book, record or other document relating to any matter which is under inquiry by the Tribunal.

6. Every person giving evidence on any matter before the Tribunal shall be bound to state the truth on such matter.

7. (1) The Tribunal shall, by written notice, inform every party to the objection, of the date on which and the time and place at which the hearing is to take place.

(2) Every notice under paragraph (1) shall be sent by registered post not less than 14 days before the date specified in the notice as the date on which the hearing will take place.

(3) The Tribunal may, at its discretion, postpone any hearing.

(4) Where any party to the objection fails to appear on any date fixed for the hearing, the Tribunal may, in its discretion, proceed with the hearing *ex parte*.

8. Subject as aforesaid, the Tribunal shall have the power to regulate its own procedure.

9. The Tribunal shall, before making its determination or decision, give the parties to the objection an opportunity of being heard either in person or by an agent authorised in writing in that behalf.

10. Every determination made by the Tribunal shall contain the reasons therefor and be signed by the person or persons constituting the Tribunal. Written notice of such determination shall be given within fourteen days to every party to the objection.

PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON FOR 1960

THE important features of the Vital Statistics for 1960 are summarised below:—

Population

The estimated population of Ceylon at mid year was 9,896,000 and at the end of the year 10,030,000. The increase in the Island's population during the year was 2.8 per cent. as compared to 2.7 in 1959. The excess of births over deaths (natural increase) amounted to 276,784 while the excess of emigrants over immigrants was 6,022.

The estimates of population given above include corrections for under-enumeration of children under 5 years of age at the Census of 1953. The rates published herein are based on population estimates so corrected.

Marriages

There were 56,152 marriages registered under the General and Kadyan Marriage Registration Acts, 47,674 being under the General Marriage Registration Act and 8,478 under the Kadyan Marriage Act. The corresponding figure for 1959 was 55,633. The

marriage rate per 1,000 of the non-Muslim population was 6.1 in 1960 as against 6.2 in 1959. The number of Muslim Marriages registered in the year was 5,616 while the figure for 1959 was 5,667. The rates per 1,000 of the Muslim population for the two years were 8.5 and 8.8 respectively.

Births

The number of births registered in 1960 was 361,702 (183,799 of males and 177,903 of females), an increase of 5,366 over the previous year's total of 356,336. The sex ratio at birth was 1,033 males per 1,000 females. The rate per 1,000 of the population was 36.6 as against 37.0 in 1959. In Colombo Town 33,652 births were registered during the year. The birth rate for the resident population was 31.2 compared with 32.3 in 1959. Births registered in estates in 1960 numbered 35,718. The corresponding number for 1959 was 34,259.

Deaths

Deaths registered in 1960 numbered 84,918 (44,654 males and 40,264 females) compared with 87,971 in 1959. The death rate for the year (viz 8.6) is the lowest ever recorded.

The rate for the previous year was 9.1. The number of deaths registered in Colombo Town was 7,867 as against 8,227 in 1959. The rate among the residents of the town was 8.1 as against 8.9 in the previous year. 10,835 deaths were registered in estates during 1960 as against 10,911 in 1959.

Infant Deaths

Of the deaths registered in the year under review 20,549 related to infants. The number registered in 1959 was 20,500. The infant death rate computed per 1,000 live births was 57. This compares with 58 in 1959. The rate for 1960 is the lowest recorded in Ceylon so far. The rate relating to the residents of Colombo Town was 61 as compared with 63 in the previous year. In the estates the rate of infant deaths in 1960 was 100 which compares with 99 in 1959.

Maternal Deaths

Causes related to pregnancy and child bearing accounted for 1,094 deaths in 1960. The corresponding number for 1959 was 1,207. The rate of maternal mortality was 3.0. The rate for the resident population of Colombo Town was 1.5. Estates registered a rate of 2.5 per 1,000 live births.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 19 of the Excise Ordinance (Chapter 52) I, Tikiri Banda Wadugodapitiya, Excise Commissioner, with the approval of the Minister of Industries, Home and Cultural Affairs declare under Condition 12 (1) of the Arrack Rent Sale Conditions for 1961-62 and subsequent periods published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,496 of June 24, 1961 and Condition I (ii) of Arrack Tavern Licence specified in “Excise Notification” No. 482 published in *Gazette* No. 11,810 of July 17, 1959, that with effect from January 8, 1962, the bottles in which arrack of the qualities specified in the First Schedule hereto is issued at Government Warehouses specified in the Second Schedule hereto to be the property of the Government.
