Rule

The rules relating to the Government Surveyors' Association, published in *Gazette* No. 10,436 of August 22, 1952, as last amended by the rule published in *Gazette* No. 11,314 of May 16, 1958, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) in Part I—

(a) in rule 3 thereof, by the substitution, for the figures "267/6", of the figures "267/5";

(b) by the substitution for rule 6, of the following rule:—

"6. Membership shall commence on the date on which the application for admission is approved by the Committee."

(c) by the insertion, immediately after rule 11 thereof, of the following new rule:—

"Election of members of Committee, other than Secretary.

11A. (1) In the election of the office-bearers (other than the Secretary), and of the eight other members of the Committee, no person shall be entitled to be a candidate for election unless he is a member of the Association and unless he has—

(a) been nominated as a candidate by means of a nomination paper signed by him, to signify his consent, and by a proposer and a seconder, each of whom is entitled to vote at that election; and

(b) delivered or caused to be delivered such nomination paper to the Secretary at least thirty days before the date of the meeting at which the election is to take place.

(2) Every nomination paper delivered by or on behalf of a candidate for election shall be scrutinized by the Committee, and a complete list of the

candidates who have been duly nominated and who are qualified to be elected shall be sent by the Secretary to each member of the Association when giving notice under rule 21 of the business to be transacted at the meeting.

(3) If not more than one candidate is duly nominated for the post of President, Vice-President, or Assistant Secretary, the person presiding at the meeting shall declare that candidate to be duly elected to that post, and if not more than eight candidates are duly nominated for election as the members of the Committee who are not office-bearers, the person presiding at the meeting shall declare those candidates to be duly elected to be members of the Committee.

(4) If two or more candidates are duly nominated for the post of President, Vice-President, or Assistant Secretary, a poll shall be taken at the meeting, and the votes shall be given by means of ballot papers. Every member of the Association who is entitled to vote and is present at the meeting shall be given a ballot paper in respect of each post for which there are two or more candidates, and the candidate who receives the largest number of votes polled shall be declared to be duly elected to the post.

(5) If more than eight candidates are duly nominated for election as the eight members of the Committee who are not office-bearers, every member of the Association who is entitled to vote and is present at the meeting shall be given a ballot paper on which such member shall write the names of eight different candidates chosen out of the members in the list of candidates referred to in paragraph (2). Any ballot paper which contains more than eight different names or in which the same name appears more than once shall be rejected. The eight candidates who receive the largest number of votes polled shall be declared to be duly elected as members of the Committee.

(6) Where there is an equality of votes polled at any ballot for two or more candidates for a single vacancy, and the addition of one vote would entitle one of the candidates to be elected to fill the vacancy, the determination of the candidate to whom the additional vote shall be deemed to have been given shall be made by lot to be drawn in the presence of the person presiding at the meeting in such manner as that person shall direct.

(d) in rule 12 thereof, by the substitution, for the words "Committee who", of the words "Committee who, for any reason other than his absence from the Island,";

(e) in rule 16 thereof, by the substitution, for the word "thirty", of the word "fifty"; and

(f) in rule 19 thereof, in paragraph (2), by the substitution, for the word "forty", of the word "sixty";

(g) in rule 38 thereof, by the substitution, for the words "show of hands except", of the words "show of hands, except where otherwise provided in these rules, and";

(2) in Part II—

(a) in rule 2 thereof, by the substitution, for the words "shall be eligible for membership of the Fund", of the words "shall be eligible for membership of the Fund:

Provided, further, that any member of the Fund who, having retired from office under section 48B of the Minutes on Pensions, has rejoined the Survey Department, shall be eligible for membership of the Fund if he is not above the age of 40 years. "

(b) in rule 16 thereof, by the omission of all the words and figures from "No extra contribution" to "prior approval of the Committee"; and,

(c) in rule 42 thereof, in the proviso to paragraph (g) of that rule, by the substitution, for the word "recovery", of the words "recovery of enhanced interest"; and

(3) in Part III—

(a) in the proviso to rule 8 thereof, by substitution, for the word "recovery", of the words "recovery of enhanced interest"; and

(b) in rule 17 thereof, by the substitution, for the words "one per centum", of the words "half per centum".
