of such tragedies in the country.


The President said: "Two years ago, when

Committee to present report to President tomorrow

The six-member Ministerial Committee appointed to study the final report of the Presidential Commission of Inquiry (PCoI) that probed the Easter Sunday attacks is scheduled to hand over report to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa tomorrow (April 5).

The Committee has already concluded its investigations and compiled its report which is due to be handed over to the President tomorrow, Tourism Minister Prasanna Ranatunga who is also a member of the Committee told the

Sunday Observer yesterday. The Minister said since various

views were expressed on the final report submitted by the PCoI President Gotabaya Rajapaksa appointed a six-member Ministerial Committee headed by Minister Chamal Rajapaksa with a wide-ranging mandate to carefully study it and make its recommendations.

Minister Ranatunga said the Committee studied the reports submitted by the PCoI, the Special Parliamentary Select Committee that probed the Easter Sunday attacks and the Parliament Sectoral Oversight Committee on National Security.
