

Easter attacks: Catholic Church will continue its struggle - Cardinal

Colombo Archbishop Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith yesterday reiterated that the Catholic Church will continue its struggle to find out who carried out the Easter Sunday attacks that killed more than 260 innocent civilians.

"We are surprised that even after two years, answers to the questions of who and why and what of these attacks have not been found by the relevant authorities," the Archbishop said addressing a special commemoration event held to mark the second anniversary of the Easter Sunday attacks at the St. Anthony's Church in Kochchikade yesterday morning.

He stressed the importance of implementing the recommendations made by the Presidential Commission of Inquiry on Easter Sunday attacks soon. TO PAGE 02

Ship carrying radioactive material sent away from H'tota Port

A vessel carrying dangerous radio-

active cargo had entered the Hambantota Port for an urgent repair hiding the true facts



about the cargo on board on April 20. M.V. BBC Naples sailing under the flag

of Antigua & Barbados had entered the port at 2100 hrs, en route from Rotterdam to China.

Agents for the vessel Ms. Barwil Meridian Navigation had not declared to the port authorities that there was dangerous cargo on board prior to the vessel entering the port.

However, it was later found that they were carrying a cargo of Uranium Hexafluoride via investigations made by the Sri Lanka Navy and the Port Authority.

The vessel was required to leave the port no sooner the facts were verified, the Hambantota Port Authorities said. TO PAGE 02

'President ultimately responsible for Port City SEZ administration'

It is the President who is ultimately responsible for the administration of the Special Economic Zone (SEZ) in Colombo Port City, the President's Secretary informed the Supreme Court yesterday.

President's Counsel Romesh de Silva appearing for the Secretary

to the President Dr. P.B. Jayasundera made these remarks when the 19 Special Determination petitions filed challenging the constitutionality of the Colombo Port City Economic Commission Bill were taken up for oral submissions in the Supreme Court.

Refuting the allegations levelled by

petitioners that there is no regulatory body to scrutinize the activities of the Colombo Port City Project, De Silva said even the Master Plan of the project would be prepared in consultation with the President.

"Even though we do not wish to intervene with the judicial process, as a Government we are ready to provide any assistance required for the success of those actions. The President has facilitated the Crimi-

nal Investigation Department (CID) and the Terrorism Investigation Division (TID) to carry out investigations independently. We are confident that the respective departments will take legal action in the future after concluding investigations," he said.

"Today we commemorate one of the darkest days in the history of Sri Lanka, the Easter Sunday attacks that happened two years ago. We take this moment to remember the locals and foreigners who were killed by the attacks. The Easter bombings took away 259 innocent lives and injured hundreds of people. Hundreds of injured and disabled people are still suffering physically and mentally. I wish them a speedy recovery. We also extend our deepest condolences to the families of all those who died and became disabled.

"The innocent people had to pay from their lives and limbs for the criminal neglect and evasion by the previous Government. They mixed up their political agendas with national security. Parties responsible for the attack are spreading various lies, influencing investigations and diverting social attention even to date. We feel sorry for such groups. While remembering all those who died, we as a Government are taking every step to prevent such an unfortunate situation from ever recurring. I would like to state that we will bring to justice all those responsible for this heinous attack," the PM stated.

The President also underlined the need to monitor the progress of projects implemented under budgetary provisions and foreign loans and expedite them.

"The Government's policy is to generate employment opportunities. We have to create small and medium scale entrepreneurs at village level," the President said.

He further said that the Saudi Government has agreed to release Sri Lankan women in deportation centres and prisons and repatriate them to Sri Lanka through Saudi Airlines.

Accordingly, discussions were held with Tourism Minister Prasanna Ranatunga and the airport officials to obtain permission to land this aircraft carrying detained Sri Lankan women.

The Minister has advised the relevant authorities to repatriate these women to Sri Lanka immediately adhering to health guidelines to prevent COVID-19. The Minister also instructed the officials to provide all required facilities for the repatriates.

Accordingly, 156 Sri Lankan women detained at deportation centers and prisons are awaiting repatriation to Sri Lanka.

Minister Wanniarachchi made these observations in reply to a question raised by the Opposition Leader Sajith Premadasa in Parliament under Standing Order 27(2).

Health Minister Wanniarachchi stated, "Complications can occur not only with the AstraZeneca vaccine but also after any vaccination. For example, one in four million children is at risk of contracting polio after being vaccinated against polio. One in 100,000 people will develop a throat allergy after most of the vaccines currently in use (rarely even fatal).

The Health Minister said: "Some persons vaccinated in some countries were reported to be having blood clots within a few weeks of receiving this vaccine. Six such cases have been reported in Sri Lanka and three of them have been fatal. According to the World Health Organization's Committee on Vaccines and Side Effects, no direct link between blood

clots and vaccines has been identified. The World Health Organization (WHO) has approved the continued use of this vaccine. A similar view has been put forward by the European Union's European Medicines Agen-

Minister Wanniarachchi further stated that the Government has taken several measures to identify such incidents. Wanniarachchi pointed out that a 24-hour hotline has been introduced to report any complications after receiving the vaccine via the telephone Number 011-3415985. The Minister also said that a special unit is ready at the Colombo General Hospital for such patients and those cases are referred to an expert committee.

Minister Wanniarachchi added: "Those vaccinated are advised to diagnose such allergic conditions in advance. Four days after receiving

the vaccine, if there is headache, sore throat, shortness of breath or severe pain in the leg, it is advisable to seek medical treatment. A committee consisting of specialist physicians (AEFI Adverse Event Following Immunization) has been

appointed to look into the case of patients with chronic complications. The committee is chaired by the Director General of Health Services and represents specialists from various fields.'

Minister Wanniarachchi also stated that "the Epidemiology Unit has introduced a very specific methodology for reporting patients and the Ministry of Health accepts information released by the Epidemiology Division as official information. The information will also be released to the Government Information Department and through it to the media. I would like to inform you that data on

a disease that spreads through the respiratory system cannot be hidden. I would like to remind you that such concealment is only for a very short period of time and doing so will result in large scale clusters. Health officials, who take the lead in controlling the disease, continue to make an active contribution to control the epidemic. Front line officers have not been removed from those activities."

Minister Wanniarachchi revealed that several patients infected with South African and English varieties of COVID-19 virus have been identified in Sri Lanka so far. Because they are all properly quarantined, the risk of spreading the disease from them to society is very low. Samples of corona patients are further tested to identify new strains. Laboratory research to identify the virus strain is being carried out by the Department of Molecular Biology, University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

That is in terms of Article 3 and 4 of the constitution. That is the exercise of people's executive power by the President. The president appoints the members of the Commission. What is wrong if the President appoints the members of the Commission in terms of Article 4 of the Constitution, De Silva ques-

In Sri Lanka, the executive power of the people is exercised by the President elected by people. We are now taking away the concept of sovereignty of Parliament which is more applicable in Britain. This is a Commission controlled by the President. The Master Plan of the Port City Project has to have approval of the President, not by anybody else. It is necessary to work within that Master Plan. All the administration activities are within the control of the Commission. It is a very important matter. The Master Plan of the project is prepared in consultation with the President. There will be no master plan if the President does not approve his consent. Subsequently the commission would execute the Master Plan, De Silva further added.

De Silva argued that the President has executive power to appoint a commission to carry out the administration activities of the Colombo Port City Project.

"When the executive power is vested with the President, it does not need anybody else's consent. The establishment of commission is well within the four corners of our Constitution. The executive power of the people is exercised by

the President," he further said. Meanwhile, Romesh de Silva PC informed the Court that none of the petitioners has challenged the concept of Special Security Zone (SEZ) because of its significance for the advancement of the national economy.

"Most of the petitioners including Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB), United National Party (UNP) and the Bar Association of Sri Lanka (BASL) have agreed that it is necessary to have a SEZ. That

is an agreed concept. Nobody is challenging the concept of SEZ.

The main feature of the SEZ is that it creates an area for an economic zone. It should create conditions conducive necessary for a SEZ. We have to attract the investors. We have to give them special intensives," said De Silva.

Expressing views regarding the members of the Port City Commission, De Silva said that his client is agreeable to appoint a few members of the Commission from Sri Lankan citizens.

All Commissions whether it is a Public Service Commission or Election Commission can have non-citizens. In the recent past, there was a dual citizenship holder in the Election Commission. Except for UDA, the President can appoint non-citizens, even to the office of Chief Justice or Judges of the Supreme Court. Why only objections here, De Silva said.

Meanwhile, Romesh de Silva said the appointments made by the President can be challenged in Court.

"Any appointment to this Commission can be challenged by way of a Fundamental Rights petition. If the Court wants, my client will recommend that there will be a minimum of two or three Sri Lankans. However, it would give license to fill the balance from noncitizens. If the criteria necessary for appointments is not followed, it can be challenged through a Fundamental Rights petition. The Fundamental Rights jurisdiction of this Court has not taken away. When the President makes appointments it can be challenged in Courts," said De Silva.

Meanwhile, De Silva said that the Bill has not taken away the iurisdiction of Courts through the arbitration process for the settlement of disputes. The arbitration process was introduced to expedite

financial disputes. Meanwhile, President's Counsel Gamini Marapana and Navin Marapana PC, who are representing Minister Prof. G.L. Peiris, argued

that there is no need to refer the Bill to the Provincial Councils since none of them is currently functioning.

A Supreme Court five-judgebench comprising Chief Justice Jayantha Jayasuriya, Justice Buwaneka Aluwihare, Justice Priyantha Jayawardena, Justice Murdu Fernando and Justice Janak de Silva fixed the petitions for further hearing for today (22). The intervention petitioners are to present their further oral submissions from 9:30 am today.

Nineteen petitions have been filed so far against the Colombo Port City Economic Commission Bill. They are by; Samagi Jana Balawegaya General Secretary Ranjith Madduma Bandara, SJB Parliamentarian Harshana Rajakaruna, former JVP Parliamentarian Wasantha Samarasinghe, UNP Chairman Vajira Abeywardena, UNP General Secretary Palitha Range Bandara, Oshala Herath, Dr. Ajantha Perera, Jeran Jagatheesan who contested the 2020 General Election under the UNP ticket, President of BASL Saliya Pieris PC, BASL Secretary Rajiv Amarasuriya, Engineer Kapila Renuka Perera, Centre for Policy Alternatives and its Executive Director Paikiasothy Saravanamuttu, Transparency International Sri Lanka (TISL), Ven. Muruththettuwe Ananda Thera, G.S. Shyamalee, Nagananda Kodituwakku, Rajika Kodituwakku and Trade Union activist Lesley Devendra.

The petitioners are seeking a declaration that the Bill in whole or in part requires the approval by people at a Referendum and requires a twothirds majority in Parliament.

Meanwhile, 11 intervention petitioners including Minister Prof. G.L. Peiris, Secretary to the President Dr. P.B. Jayasundera, Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) General Secretary Attorney-At-Law Sagara Kariyawasam, Athula de Silva, SLPP Lawyers' Association, Secretary to the Minister of Finance and Secretary to the Cabinet Ministers have sought the Court's permission to present their submissions, in support of the Bill.

The Archbishop while reaffirming that there is no connection with religion and their teachings to murder, urged the Muslim community in the country to rise up against who try to instrumentalize and exploit Islam for their own purposes.

"Rise up and defend yourself against those who try to instrumentalize Islam to fulfill their own purposes. Oppose Wahhabism and organizations that promote such ideologies. Understand the global situation in organizing such crimes. They are not

necessarily in favour of you," he said. He said that the Criminal Investigations Department and other agencies have failed to unearth the Easter Sunday attackers and their purposes. It is surprising that the investigations are carried out to suit day-to-day fortunes, he added.

The Archbishop deplored what he described as the lethargic attitude of the previous Government and the incumbent government in conducting investigations into the Easter Sunday attacks.

"We have to stress that what is happening at this moment is an attitude



of no care, where all the factors are not properly investigated in a coordinated and organized fashion," he said.

He said that there are political reasons behind some of the investigations very often.

"Jesus taught us to forgive and pray for our detractors. Even though we wish to forgive all these things we would like to know what really happened," he added. "We defeated the attempts made by different political and other forces to create animosity between the Christians, Muslims and Buddhists in the aftermath of the attacks. We have not reacted in a way that would lead to such a disaster."

The Archbishop paid his gratitude to the members of Maha Sangha and the Buddhist community who showed solidarity and brotherhood in the aftermath of the Easter Sunday attacks.

He said that he believes that political posturing and the need for safeguarding alliances have impeded the process of finding the truth behind the Easter Sunday attacks.

"It is in this light we organized black Sunday programme in churches in order to stress that we are still looking out for the truth about these events," he told the gathering.

He said that he took every effort to prevent the clashes between the Sinhala and Muslim communities in the aftermath of the Easter Sunday Terror Attacks. He said such subtle manouvres to incite the Sinhalese community against Muslims were negated. What transpired during the parliamentary debate on Easter Sunday attacks should seriously be examined.

It has also been decided to increase the number of PCR tests to a minimum of 15,000 per day.

The Special Performance Review Committee of the Health Ministry chaired by Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi yesterday took several stern decisions in the wake of the growing number of COVID-19 cases in the country, the Minis-

try said in a press release. The meeting was called as there is a risk of spreading COVID-19 again due to irresponsible behavior of the people in the past few

weeks. It has been decided at the meeting to strictly enforce quarantine laws and punish violators of quarantine laws.

Formulation of special quarantine rules for those coming from abroad had also been considered at the meeting.

Other decisions taken at the meeting include strengthening the data collection system and providing more Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to medical staff, including

doctors and nurses. It has been decided to

identify more hospitals at the regional and district level to treat COVID-19 patients in the future and provide them with the necessary medical facilities. It has also been decided to make plans to refer

patients who have been

diagnosed with COVID-19 to the appropriate hospitals individually according to their medical conditions.

It has stressed that strong outpatient and inpatient care must be maintained and surgery services provided to patients who are hospitalized for other

ailments must be continued on a daily basis while maintaining treatment services for COVID-19 patients.

This Special Performance Review Committee is made up of medical administrators, administrative service officers, and specialist physicians. State Minister Dr Sudarshani Fernandopulle, Health Ministry Secretary Major General Sanjeewa Munasinghe, and Health Services Director General Dr. Asela Gunawardena also participated.



orty long years ago, it was one of the peaceful nights in March 1981. I was sitting on the lap of my beloved mother. We were listening to pirith at the giant main middle building of the Alubomulla Maha Vidyalaya which was chanted to mark the school's 100th anniver-

The building looks like a historic old construction at a Purana Raja Maha Viharaya. I have walked into this building several times with my mother to use its library which is at the end of this giant proud structure. I had the opportunity to read many valuable books at this library from 7.00 am to 1.45 pm whenever I cut school due to a minor ailment or some other reason. There were days that the school work did not end at 1.45 pm. So I watched how schoolchildren engaged in various sports activities, band practices, and various rehearsals with my mother and other teachers for another two or three hours.

But I was not angry with my mother for not taking leave and staying at home with me because of the friendliness of the staff and students of her school. The giant historic building has been watching the various changes that took place during the past 140 years in the school and in the lives of all connected well-wishers.

Western Province/ Horana/ Alubomulla Maha Vidyalaya (later named Alubomulla S.

Mahinda Maha Vidyalaya in 2004) was estab lished in March 1881 in a cadjan hut with 20 schoolboys. The first principal of the school was D. Kaldera. D.N. Aron Perera was the first teacher of this school. In the beginning, Alubomulla Maha Vidyalaya was only a boys' school. In 1928, the school became a bilingual high school and in 1946, it became Alubomulla Vidyalaya, a mixed school.

In 1959, Alubomulla Vidyalaya became a Maha Vidyalaya and the school was popular as 'Lassana Iskole' (beautiful school) due to its natural beauty and attractive landscape with buildings. The school commenced Advanced Level classes in both Arts and Commerce streams in 1962. This is how this historical school walked forward during a period of 81 years.

Ven. S. Mahinda Thera, born in 1901, was a world-famous Buddhist monk from Tibet. He was a poet and an author as well. He participated in Sri Lanka's Independence Movement. He lived at Sri Sudharmaramaya, Mahabellana, Alubomulla. He passed away on March 16,

Ven. S. Mahinda Thera arrived in then Ceylon at a young age and was ordained as a Buddhist monk by Ven. Dodanduwa Sri Piyaratana Tissa Maha Nayaka Thera. He was educated at Vidyodaya Pirivena, Maradana. Having learned the Sinhala language, he became a poet, creating several literary works inspiring patriotism among the Sinhalese and urging them to fight for their freedom during Sri Lanka's Independence Movement.

He is considered a National hero of Sri Lanka and one of the greatest Sinhalese poetry figures of all time. Ven. S. Mahinda Thera served as a teacher at Nalanda College, Colombo from 1934 to 1936.

Ven. S. Mahinda Thera wrote over 40 books, most of them are poems inspiring patriotism. His first book was Ova Muthu Dama, written around 1921. His last book is believed to be Sri Pada. He is also believed have written a number of unpublished works. In his works, he had focused on the past glory of the country, and the weaknesses of its people in the present, urging them to work towards their freedom. He wrote several books for children as well, and in these too he tried to inspire patriotism in the reader.

Nidahase Dehena, Nidahase Manthraya, Lanka Matha, Jathika Thotilla, Ada Lak Mawage Puththu, Nidahasa, Videshikayakugen Lak Mawata Namaskarayak, and Sinhala Jathiya are among his literary creations.

NARA and IMR, Norway to cooperate in fisheries research

The National Aquatic Resources Research and Development Agency (NARA) and the Institute of Marine Research, Norway (IMR) joined hands to continue their cooperation in fisheries research in Sri Lankan waters.

The signature event in this regard was held on Tuesday. The two institutions will engage in research on fish stocks in the waters of Sri Lanka, with the aim of improved and sustainable management of marine resources in the country.

Norway's financial assistance enabled an ecosystem survey in the coastal waters of Sri Lanka by the Norwegian Research Vessel Dr. Fridtjof Nansen in Sri Lanka in 2018. After the successful completion of the first phase of the project, the Norwegian Embassy was pleased to approve

the second phase of the project for development of fisheries management tools at a cost of close to NOK 8.75mn (approx.1 Million USD), which will be operational until 2022.

Speaking at the event,

Norwegian Ambassador to Sri Lanka and the Maldives, Trine Jøranli Eskedal, underscored that Norway is "committed to bilateral cooperation on oceans and to helping Sri Lanka put in place data-based management systems for ocean resources, which will enable Sri Lanka to better monitor its fish stocks. She added that the Norwegian fisheries cooperation with Sri Lanka, which dates back to the 1970s, includes fisheries management, research and education, and private sector development. 



Health Ministry has launched project to develop hospitals in tea-growing regions: Pavithra

The Health Ministry has launched a programme to develop hospitals in tea-growing regions, Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi said in Parliament, yesterday. She was responding to a question raised by MP Velukumar regarding hospital facilities for people providing labour in the plantation sector.

The minister pointed out that the total number of hospitals located in plantation regions in Sri Lanka is

494. According to her, only 44 hospitals in those regions have been taken over by the government. The districts in which those hospitals are located in are Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, Badulla, Kegalle, Ratnapura, and Kalutara, she added.

There are 450 health institutions in tea plantation regions which have not been taken over by the government, but are under the control of the plantation companies, Wanniaarachchi said. She added that she is aware of the health problems of estate workers.

The minister pointed out that the Health Officers are currently working in these regions due to the shortage of doctors.

Wanniarachchi informed the House that the Health Ministry is currently preparing plans to take over those 450 private institutions as well.



Tender for liquor bottle stickers granted to foreign company during previous regime

Pathirana urges Government to grant it to State Printing Corporation instead

Samagi Jana Balawegaya Parliamentarian Buddhika Pathirana requested the Government to cancel the Rs.1 billion tender to print stickers for liquor bottles that was granted to a foreign company during the previous government's rule. He asked that it be granted to the State Printing Corporation (SPC) instead.

The Parliamentarian made the request in the form of a supplementary question during the oral questions round.

"The tender was granted to an Indian company that had been blacklisted internationally. If the SPC can print lotteries, it can print these stickers as well. The price may be high, but allow the profit to be pass to a government institution," he

Pathirana said the gazette stating that government institutions should compete for tenders should be amended. He added that priority should be given to state institutions. Minister Chamal Rajapaksa said that he would look into the matter and take the necessary measures.

Minister Rajapaksa also commended MP Pathirana for speaking up against the former government, even though he was a part of it, in order to stand for

MP Pathirana said that certain government officials did not bring such topics up as they would have lost the commis-

sions given to them by private companies. Rajapaksa, in response, said that he would look into the matter to amend the clauses of the said document after a study and invited him to an official discussion on the matter.

Pathirana further said that there was massive corruption related to the tenders procuring food for the Tri-Forces. Products such as tea, milk powder, and yoghurt could be procured by the government itself, but the former Finance Minister did not dare it due to the influence of several officials, he added.

Minister Rajapaksa said that the Government intends to buy the products of state institutions. He added that it has been decided to buy such products from the Mahaweli Authority and the Fisheries Corporation as well.

MP Sarath Fonseka said that the Forces could not buy products from state institutions as they are allocated a limited budget. Therefore,

Indo-Lanka travel bubble on hold

postpone launching the proposed "travel bubble" with India, in the wake of the recent surge in COVID-19 cases in India, officials at the Ministry of Tourism said.

"We are just postponing the bubble, this is not a cancellation. When things get better in India, we look forward to launching the travel bubble," an official at the Ministry told The Hindu. Sri Lanka has been preparing to open up the country for tourists in phases as earnings from the sector, a crucial foreign exchange earner, fell steeply in the pandemic

The two governments have discussed ways to enhance connectivity with the airport to help Buddhist pilgrims in Sri Lanka visit important religious sites in India. "Once the pandemic situation eases, we will be able to finalise that," the official said.

India accounts for one of the highest sources of tourists in Sri Lanka. Following the virus

Lanka closed its borders and reopened it only in December 2020, stipulating protocols for on-arrival testing, quarantine and travel within the country. Witnessing a gradual increase in the last four months, Sri Lanka recorded 4,581 tourists from select countries in March 2021. Just before the pandemic hit, Sri Lanka received 228,434 tourists in January 2020 and the highest percentage of arrivals was from India, at 18 %. (The Hindu)

Ex-Policeman found guilty of all charges for George Floyd's murder

apolis police officer, was convicted Tuesday of murdering African-American George Floyd after a racially charged trial seen as a pivotal test of police accountability in the United States.

The jury deliberated less than 11 hours before finding 45-year-old Chauvin guilty of all three charges against him: second-degree murder, third-degree murder and manslaughter.

Chauvin, who had been free on bail, was put in handcuffs after Hennepin County Judge Peter Cahill read out the unanimous verdicts reached by the racially diverse, seven-woman five-man jury. Wearing a facemask and display-

President Joe Biden called members of the Floyd family to say he was "relieved" by the verdicts, then later he and Vice President Kamala Harris addressed the nation in televised remarks

A prudent move

he decision taken by the Government and political parties not to hold May Day rallies is a prudent one given the dire situation facing the country as a result of an irresponsible public who deigned to ignore all health guidelines during the festive season. At a Party Leaders' meeting at the National Operations Centre for the Prevention of COVID-19 presided by its head Army Commander General Shavendra Silva it was decided to call off the May Day rallies due to the prevailing high risk situation.

Besides, May Day being what it is in this country, it would be well-nigh impossible to expect inebriated crowds bused in from the outstations to city venues to observe the distance rule and other health guidelines. Also with the Workers' Day being made a mockery with politics and politicians playing the dominant role the accent no doubt will be on the crowd sizes that could be drawn by each political party in a show of strength, regardless of the prevailing guidelines. We saw this identical situation during the General Elections where such warnings were thrown overboard by all political parties. Just as in Colombo, the situation could aggravate even in the outstations particularly in the plantations where May Day rallies draw huge crowds.

It would only need one spark to set off a conflagration as far as the relatively virus free outstations are concerned. May Day is rather a redundant event in this country and has lost the allure and attraction from the days when the pro-worker Marxist parties held sway. What was once an event reserved for the workers to air their grievances and assert their rights has today been hijacked by politicians. Workers themselves are partly responsible for this state of affairs in allowing the politicians to ride piggyback on their shoulders and steering their struggles in a different direction.

Hence it is futile in precipitating another health risk in the country through a non-event. The JVP and its offshoot the Peratugamis it is reported are planning to defy the ban and hold their respective May Day rallies. The authorities should come down hard on those acting contrary to the directives of the health authorities from whichever quarter. The New Year fiasco ought to have opened the eyes of the authorities of what is in store if more leeway is granted. Perhaps the Rathu Sahodarayas whose electoral fortunes have plummeted to new lows expect to lift the morale of their cadres by bringing in the crowds.

It was the PHIs who insisted that May Day rallies be cancelled owing to the worsening situation, according to media reports. PHI Union President Upul Rohana predicted a definite rise of COVID-19 cases in the coming weeks due to the callous disregard for health restrictions by the public during the festive season. He did not rule out a situation like in India where the careless conduct by the public who indulged in mass ritual bathing in holy rivers and thronging Hindu festivals and political rallies in their hundreds of thousands have turned that country into a health nightmare today where the daily count of COVID-19 positive cases reaches 300,000 and the daily death toll over 2,000. Rohana said Sri Lanka was also facing a critical situation in terms of the spread of the Coronavirus.

At least on this occasion the authorities have paid heed to the PHIs in clamping down on free movement. It was the same advice that the PHIs gave prior to Christmas only for the authorities to ignore them at a huge cost heralding another outbreak, after the country was relatively free of the virus during the preceding months. The top echelons of the Government have taken a serious view of the situation. Cabinet Spokesman Minister Dr. Ramesh Pathirana said it was regrettable that the public failed to pay heed to the health warnings during the festive season. He asked the people to stay calm assuring that the Government was confident that the rise in the infections will be contained. He said nearly one million people in Colombo and Gampaha have been vaccinated and hence the chances of the virus spreading were limited.

Here a word of caution is in order. The second dose of the vaccine is yet in coming and until then the people are certainly exposed to the risk. There is no guarantee that even after the second dose the vaccine will be foolproof. Some people in India who received both doses of the vaccine had still contracted the virus. India, despite being the largest producer of the AstraZeneca vaccine is now only second behind the US in the number of infected and the numbers are rising each day at an alarming rate so much so it is short of hospital beds and fast running out of oxygen cylinders and ventilators, according to NDTV News. Hence over-reliance on the vaccine would prove to be costly here too and it should be drilled into the minds of the public that strict observance of the health guidelines is the only safe bet for avoiding the deadly virus.

COLOMBO PORT CITY: "Chinese Colony" or "Gateway to South Asia"?

he legal contours of the country's first-ever offshore financial centre have been worked out and that piece of legislation was at the centre of attraction last week leading to a heated political and social debate.

Many will agree that the China-funded Colombo Port City (CPC) is an ambitious and a giant project that has the capacity to be a make or break factor of this island-nation's economy in the years to come. The legal infrastructure carries equal weight as, or even more weight than, the physical infrastructure when it comes to the successful operation of this economic hub-to-be of the country.

If the country is to yield the best out of the proposed international financial centre in Colombo, it is necessary it to have a solid and attractive legal foundation that can compete with other offshore financial centres in the world while having enough safeguards to protect the national economy and national interests.

The country is in dire need of foreign investments as its economy is precariously positioned with countless challenges lying ahead, mainly due to the COVID-19 global pandemic and a debt burden that has worsened due to decades of mismanagement financial under successive Governments. The promising opportunities the Port City offers in this direction could be viewed by the Government and financial analysts alike as a knight in shining armour.

Sri Lanka's strategic location on the modern Maritime Silk Road, the sea route part of the impressive 'Belt and Road Initiative' (BRI) of the Chinese, is an added advantage for the Colombo Port City, South Asia's first offshore financial centre. Built with Chinese funds on an artificially reclaimed 269-hectare land adjacent to the Colombo Port, it is simply the largest foreign investment the country has hitherto received (an initial US\$ 1.4 billion).

The Government at the same time has to be wary of the geopolitical realities in the Indo Pacific Region when moving ahead with the proposed financial hub. Knowing that there is a thinly-veiled power rivalry between China and India, and that the United Stated (US) is frowning at the increased Chinese presence in the Indian Ocean Region with its heightened friendship with India, the Government has to tread carefully not to invite unnecessary troubles by any global super-

power. (China already controls the Hambantota Port in the South under a deal signed by the previous Yahapalana Government). In addition, the Chinese interest in Sri Lanka is unmistakeably intertwined with its long term economic and political plans and goals.

Given all the above considerations, it is apparent that the Government is at a crossroads today. It has its work cut out to set the Colombo Port City wheels turning with a well-knit legislation that goes hand in hand with a well-thought-out strategy for the best interests of the country. As things stand, it is slated for full completion by 2040.

19 PETITIONS

The 'Colombo Port City Economic Commission Bill', which was placed before Parliament on April 8 by Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa, led to a barrage of comments by political parties and civil society activists stealing the media spotlight throughout the 'Avurudu' holiday.

Despite the fact that the holidays outnumbered the working days in the week left aside for public litigation, the Supreme Court received 19 petitions challenging the constitutionality and legality of the provisions in the 76-page Bill. Among the petitioners are representatives of the Samagi Jana Balawegaya

(SJB), Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP), United National Party (UNP), Bar Association of Sri Lanka (BASL), Centre for Policy Alternatives (CPA), Transparency International Sri Lanka (TISL) and several trade unions as well as Abhayarama temple Chief Incumbent Ven. Muruththettuwe Ananda Thera, a politically influential Buddhist monk who headed the powerful Nurses Union. The petitioners seek a declaration that the Bill in whole or in part requires the approval by people at a Referendum and a two-thirds majority in Parlia-

The draft Bill, which is now in the public domain, has proposed a Special Economic Zone with a low tax regime to magnetize Foreign Direct Investments (FDIs) to kick-start the operations of the Port City Colombo. It has proposed a 5-7 Member Commission appointed by the President to manage the administrative and business affairs of the Zone. The Commission, which invokes memories of the Greater Colombo Economic Commission (GCEC) of 1978, will serve as a "single window" facilitator that provides one-stop-shop clearance for potential foreign inves-

The CPC will initially need investments to develop its infrastructure and its Master

Plan includes offshore banks, trusts and international companies, condominiums with timeshares (an arrangement whereby several joint owners have the right to use a property as a holiday home under a timesharing scheme), parks, international hospitals and recreational facilities. The Project aims to develop the CPC as a world class 'Smart City' in South Asia. Obviously, its products and services are targeted at high-net-worth individuals and corporate clients.

OPPOSITION'S

The Government fought tooth and nail last week to defend the draft Port City legislation by dispelling misinformation, allaying doubts and fears and clarifying any grey areas associated with it. The Opposition parties took up a collective slogan stating that the proposed Bill makes the CPC a "Chinese Colony".

One major concern raised by the Opposition is that the Port City does not come under the jurisdiction of the Colombo Municipal Council (CMC) or the Western Province, and this coupled with the non-application and exemption of many local enactments makes it similar to a separate territory. However, several analysts pointed out that the GCEC, which later became the basis for the Board of Investment (BOI), had a similar arrangement.

"One law and one country was what the ruling party campaigned for prior to the election. The Port City Bill runs contrary to this concept. This Bill also betrays the country's sovereignty. This attempt of the Government has to be defeated," Opposition Leader and SJB Leader Sajith Premadasa commented.

More concerns raised by the Opposition include that the CPC funds are not audited by the Auditor General and those do not come under the scope of the Parliamentary watchdog committees. Parliament is only notified of the President's Gazettes relating to the future affairs of the CPC and Parliament's nod is not needed for them to be operative.

The Opposition has also alleged that only foreigners can invest in the Port City, that even foreigners can be appointed as Members of the high-powered Port City Economic Commission, and that any item bought by the locals at the Port City premises would be taxed at the exit point.

In an interesting development, US Ambassador to Sri Lanka Alaina Teplitz was one among the first to raise concerns that "the nefarious actors" may attempt to turn the CPC in to a "money-laundering haven" exploiting the sweeping tax breaks. Her comments in an online discussion with a group of journalists in Colombo received wide publicity, and the Government promptly countered those negative sentiments stressing that the Port Citycentric new Financial City would not allow investments by way of money laundering or funds which were raised from any form of terrorist activities.

SMART CITY

Last week, the Government made an all-out effort to negate the allegations against the Bill by taking the time to directly respond to those concerns one by one. Strongly backing the proposed Port City legislation, Money, Capital Markets and State Enterprise Reforms State Minister Ajith Nivard Cabraal viewed that it would be a "turning point" for the country's economy and that the President has been given wide ranging powers to oversee the functions of the CPC to ensure that its activities do not impede nation-

"The CPC is not limited to China but open to all countries. It will help jump-start our ailing economy. Claims of a 'Chinese Colony' are unfounded. The Project will bring in US\$ 15 billion as FDIs in the next five years and will generate 83,000 new jobs. Legal reforms are needed because Sri Lanka has dropped in the World Bank's Ease of Doing Business rankings to the 99th position, behind India, Bhutan and Nepal in the South Asian region,' underlined the State Minister.

al interests.

Cabraal explained that the CPC would be under Sri Lankan jurisdiction and its investment approvals would be presented to the Cabinet by the President. "The Port City Economic Commission will be audited by an international auditing firm. The Police will oversee security in the Port City premises. There will not be a different system in place," he commented observing that the shape of this Project is no different to similar projects in other parts of the world.

Last week, Attorney General Dappula de Livera informed the President that the Port City Bill is not inconsistent with the Constitution. The Government is seen determined to push the legislation through Parliament subject to any revisions as deemed fit by the Supreme Court. No doubt, the CPC legislation will be a game-changer in the country's economy, and it is up to the Government to craft a success story out of it to elevate the country's economy to a whole new level.



Easter attacks:

Wheels of Justice begin to move swiftly



ri Lanka yesterday commemorated the second anniversary of the Easter terror attacks that cost the lives of more than 250 people. Answers to many questions arising from the attacks remain elusive despite numerous efforts of the incumbent Government to resolve issues.

Security was strengthened ahead of the anniversary. Earlier this week, Police Headquarters issued a special notice to all senior police officers to provide maximum security during the special church services and other religious ceremonies that were to be held to commemorate the victims.

The attacks occurred during the government of then President Maithripala Sirisena when he headed a Cabinet that consisted of members of the United National Party (UNP) with Ranil Wickremesinghe as Prime Minister. It was well known that the relationship between the duo was strained at the time.

That was because of events that had occurred six months earlier, when former President Sirisena 'sacked' Premier Wickremesinghe and swore in Mahinda Rajapaksa as the Prime Minister, a decision that was later overturned by the Supreme Court who deemed the President's acts 'unconstitutional'.

In such a context it was not surprising that, following the Easter attacks, the President and the Cabinet engaged in rhetoric aimed at shifting blame to each other. Former President Sirisena who was visiting Singapore when the disaster unfolded, professed ignorance to intelligence warnings of the attacks.

A series of inquiries followed. There was public pressure to unearth the facts related to the attacks. Leading the call for an impartial investigation was the Archbishop of Colombo, His Eminence Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith who has been outspoken in his criticism of the security lapses that enabled the trag-

On the day after the inci-

dents, then President Sirisena appointed a three-member committee to probe the attacks. It comprised of Supreme Court Judge Vijith Malalgoda, former Inspector General of Police N. K. Ilangakoon and former Law

Parliamentary Select Committee (PSC)

and Order Ministry Secretary

Padmasiri Jayamanne.

Similarly, a month after the attacks, then Speaker of Parliament Karu Jayasuriya appointed a separate Parliamentary Select Committee (PSC) to probe the attacks. This was widely interpreted as a manifestation of the lack of trust between the President and the ruling UNP at that time.

The eight-member PSC was chaired by Deputy Speaker Ananda Kumarasinghe and comprised of parliamentarians Rauff Hakeem, Field Marshal Sarath Fonseka, Ravi Karunanayake, Kavinda Jayawardana, Ashu Marasinghe, Jayampathy Wickramaratne and M. A. Sumanthiran.

The committee appointed by the President handed over its final report on June 10, 2019. While the committee's report offered insights into the attack and the prevailing security climate at that time, it did not make any specific recommendations regarding any individuals, institutions or culpability.

Meanwhile, Sittings of the PSC were conducted in public. From what emerged at the hearings it was evident that there was a significant lack of communication and cooperation between the various government agencies tasked with ensuring the safety and security of the nation, enabling the

Some examples were then Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe describing how he was not invited to meetings of the National Security Council after the constitutional crisis six months earlier. Then Defence Secretary Hemasiri Fernando recalled difficulties he had in meeting with President Sirise-

With proceedings of the PSC being broadcast to the public, the then opposition accused the PSC of attempting to shift the blame on President Sirisena instead of taking responsibility for its own lapses. President Sirisena was also summoned before the PSC and was subjected to rigorous questioning.

A day after the PSC recorded the evidence of President Sirisena, he appointed a five-member Presidential Commission of Inquiry (PCoI) on September 22, 2019 to probe the attacks. It was tasked with identifying those responsible for the attacks, in carrying them out and through negligence.

The five-member Commission was chaired by Justice of the Court of Appeal Janak de Silva. Its other members included Justice Nissanka Bandula Karunarathna, Retired Justice Nihal Sunil Rajapaksa, Retired Justice Bandula Kumara Atapattu and retired Ministry Secretary Ms. W.M.M.R. Adikari.

The PCoI handed over its final report to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa earlier this year. By virtue of President Rajapaksa assuming office following the presidential elections in 2019, the PCoI, though appointed by former President Sirisena, handed over its report to President Rajapaksa.

Ironically, the PCoI appointed by former President Sirisena has now recommended criminal proceedings against him, holding that the then President was guilty of 'criminal liability' for his part in the acts or omissions which resulted in the tragedy. This has led to controversy in political circles.

The PCoI recommended that

the Attorney General consider instituting criminal proceedings against the former President under "any suitable provision in the Penal Code". Among the issues the PCoI held the then President liable for was the nonappointment of an acting Minister of Defence.

The Commission also recommended that the Attorney General consider criminal proceedings against several others including former Police Chief Pujith Jayasundara, former Defence Secretary Hemasiri Fernando and senior Police officers Nandana Munasinghe and Deshabandu Tennekoon.

The PCoI was also quite critical of the conduct of the former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe, particularly for not keeping Parliament informed about not being invited for meetings for the National Security Council. However, it stopped short of recommending action against the former Pre-

The Government has responded to the PCoI report by appointing a ministerial committee to study its findings. This committee was headed by

Minister Chamal Rajapaksa and included Johnston Fernando, Udaya Gammanpila, Ramesh Pathirana, Prasanna Ranatunga and Rohitha Abeygunawardena.

Second anniversary of Easter attacks

Since then, as the second anniversary of the Easter attacks approached, there has been much public discussion about who was responsible for the attacks. Cardinal Ranjith has asked on several occasions that justice be done for the victims of the attacks before the second anniversary of the tragedy.

Two weeks ago, Minister of Public Security Sarath Weerasekara told Parliament that a person known as Nawfer Moulavi has been identified as the mastermind behind the attacks. Minister Weerasekara said Nawfer Moulavi had been propagating extremist Islamic ideology for several years, since

Nawfer Moulavi who was initially based in Qatar, had instigated and provoked the 'leader' of the attacks, Zahran Hashim and his followers into carrying

out the attacks by indoctrinating them, the Minister said. Nawfer Moulavi is in custody and action will be taken against him, Weerasekara said.

Despite these revelations, Justice Minister Ali Sabry was to say a few days ago that it was unlikely that any action could be taken by the second anniversary of the attacks. Minister Sabry said that framing charges was not the duty or the responsibility of the government but of the Attorney Gen-

"Soon after assessing the evidence collected by the Police and if the Attorney General is satisfied that there is a prima facie case against any suspect, charges will be framed against him or her. The Government must not or should not join in these tasks," Minister Sabry, a President's Counsel, said.

However, the Minister noted a team of ten senior Counsel from the Attorney General's Department had been appointed to assist investigations into the Easter attacks and added that the Government was also keen to see legal action being taken against the suspects who have been involved in this crime.

On Tuesday, a day before the second anniversary, Attorney General Dappula De Livera filed indictment in the Kegalle High Court under the Prevention of Terrorism Act (PTA) against several persons including Nawfer Moulavi. However, these indictments were not regarding the Easter attacks.

Cases will be filed against them for conspiracy to cause violence and thereby incite religious ill feeling and disharmony amongst communities by the destruction of five Buddha statues in the Mawanella area in December 2018, the office of the Attorney General announced on Tuesday.

The opposition also raised events leading up to the attack in Parliament this week. Samagi Jana Balavegaya (SJB) Parliamentarians Harin Fernando and Manusha Nanayakkara made several claims in Parliament on Tuesday which they alleged related to the origin of the attacks.

Justice for Easter attack victims

In response, Chief Government Whip Johnston Fernando urged the two Parliamentarians to provide information they disclosed in Parliament to the Police and support the Government's efforts to find out those responsible for the attacks. "There is no need to politicise the issue," the Minister said.

His Eminence Malcolm Cardinal Ranjith meanwhile has continued his campaign to seek justice for Easter attack victims. "No one should harm anyone who does not belong to his religious or ethnic group," Cardinal Ranjith said this week while unveiling a monument for victims at the Colombo ceme-

Considering the events of the recent past related to the aftermath of the Easter attacks, it is clear that there will be more developments in the coming weeks and months. The attacks received global attention at the time and the outcome of investigations is being awaited internationally as well.

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has pledged to allow the law to take its course. This was reiterated by Justice Minister Sabry. It is likely that the Government will go ahead with the recommendations of the PCoI, despite the fact that this may have significant political implications for the ruling coalition.

Negativity has not been an option except for the critics

he most scenic highway in Sri Lanka — the Central Expressway — is to be opened in May. The 'ambul thiyal' offensive-play is now over. It is remembered that the JVP started a campaign claiming the Southern Expressway when it was declared open in 2011, was built to transport ambul thiyal, a fish preparation famous in the South, as a privilege for 'the ruling Rajapaksa family.'

There is no talk about this sour fish preparation anymore. The traffic on the Southern highway reaches 'spill level' when there is a national holiday such as the Aluth Avurudu. The income for the two days is in the tens

of millions, as seen this year. The reader gets the idea. The Central Expressway will be declared open despite the setbacks of COVID that basically shuttered a good part of the economy. Despite all this, the JVP is whining once more. This time they have 'ambul thiyal-fied' the Port City. It won't be long before they find something to cry about in the Central Expressway as well. They may say it was built to bring brides from Matale. Or as it is said in the local idiom, 'ket-

tles from a basket' (Kethalen mallak). The Central Expressway was a project that should have seen fruition before the end of the tenure of the previous Yahapalana dispensation. They had five years in which to do it. But the project was buried in endless indecision about who should complete which stretch of the highway. Disputes were rife with the foreign — mainly Japanese — contractors. The then powers that be did not have the necessary focus or ambition to see it to a finish.

That's their style. They also call it democracy not because they are in love with misnomers, but because they need some PR verbiage to cover up their lack of resolve, or their



incompetence. They say that they are wedded to a democratic administrative style, which leads to equitable decision making with various involved parties such as contractors.

The scenic highway never got built. But it got built in the very short time period in which this Government had been in power. Basically, a year and a half. The highway, as will the Port City, would be reaping the rewards for future generations. It would also reap some rewards for those who will start using it now — for instance, in the tourism trade, when travel begins in earnest because the pandemic and its hangover would not last forever.

Work gets done. Jobs are provided for locals — and in this regard the decision taken in the teeth of the pandemic to restrict the last phase of construction to local contractors was a bold one that took some courage. The local firms have rewarded that move by delivering on time, and with exceptional sangfroid.

The nerves of the carping critics are frayed these days. They see things happening despite their forecasts of doom, gloom and disaster. The Port City Bill has been like some javelin driven right between their eyeballs. As someone quipped, they expected the artificial island that was built to vield a few thousand rupees with a

few coconut trees planted here and there on the reclaimed terrain. When there are billions of dollars in investment on the cards, they wonder how this happened in a pandemic damaged economic climate.

Central Expressway, Port City projects

A lot of these ventures — the Central Expressway, the Port City and more — represent projects the previous dispensation did not want to complete, and/or could not complete. That indecision was partly a compact with certain other parties which were against these projects. Suffice to say here that there is a certain visceral resistance among some Sri Lanka watchers abroad about the country dealing with the Chinese in any way, shape or form. Let us leave that aside for the moment.

What of the Central Expressway? There was resistance to that too. It was after all a project begun by the previous dispensation — the Mahinda Rajapaksa Government before the advent of the 2015 Yahapalana regime.

If the country is interconnected by an efficient highway network, that would give traction to the new rural based agrarian and small industry based economy that if not front and

centre of the State's economic plans, are at least a major component. The British opened up tea plantations, but this new estate economy would have amounted to nothing if they had not conceptualized and implemented the plan for a brand new railway network. The construction was through difficult hilly terrain, and the engineers did not have the benefit of modern equipment. But yet a spectacular railway was built through one of the most scenic routes. Not even the most hard boiled of cynics and negativists could avoid a lump forming in their throats when they traverse that part of the railway from Ella, Talawakele up to Badulla, which has been called the most beautiful train route anywhere in the world by more than one international travel writer.

There was no JVP at that time to stage protests to say that the track was an excuse for the Governors to haul mineral water from St. Clare's falls. Or golf balls from Nuwara Eliya. After the British built the railways, the highway network conceptualized by the Mahinda Rajapaksa administration was the first national project that was ambitious enough to join the entire island in one interconnected grid. The scenic aspect was a byproduct of the ambitious scheme, as it was during the British era.

Yahapalana years

The British were exploitative — they certainly wanted to siphon off the tea earnings to England, and that was what being a colonizer was all about. But they knew how to build and manage things, even if it was for themselves. In contrast, these days we have a people's administration — elected — that wants to grow the economy. There is no easy estimate on how much the national economy would be enhanced with the highway project. But certainly, once the pall cast by COVID is lifted there will be growth, and that will be seen in the numbers. That evidence will be incontrovertible and as incontrovertible as the regressive growth line that was evi-

dent in the Yahapalana years. There is also the tangible growth that is more in the realm of perception than in the numbers. That is the single biggest difference between a right wing SJB/UNP type of regime, and a progressive regime of the sort in power now. There is an almost touchable, solid perception of growth even in the most difficult of times. Take the current conjuncture. It bears repetition that within a space of two months the Port City and the Central Expressway both became functional realities. The Port City was already in existence in physical form but it was just this month that it was given the legal go-ahead to begin func-

tioning as a fully operational business oasis. What's more, these two months referred to, are not quite in the 'out of danger time zone' as far as the pandemic is considered.

But that's a tangible outcome is all about. People are seeing results. That immediacy is more potent than mere numbers on a graph. After the long hiatus of stagnation under UNP rule, it's as if a dam burst. The JVP and the SJB opposition seem to be flailing in the floodwaters that have resulted. They are clutching at straws mouthing the sovereignty argument, which is a joke coming from folk who have demonstrably shown serial disrespect for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of this country. Those facts have been gone through elsewhere in previous articles by this writer.

Besides, the Port City is a new additional land mass added to the island, which was not even on the map. It is truly 'offshore' in that sense, and even though it does not mean that it should function as a separate entity that does not fall under the sway of the Executive and Legislature, such a scheme of things would by definition have a great degree of autonomy. Such is a sine qua non. Those who have no understanding of that fact are either pretending to be daft, or are being blinded by the spite engendered by success of the Port City and highway projects.





A reiteration of Sri Lanka's commitment to peace, reconciliation and non-violence

uring the early 80s period Sri anka was very much ahead of the crowd, a trailblazer in thinking, when President J.R. Jayewardene came up with a bold idea to suggest creating a United Nations Anti-Terror Organisa-

If you read this carefully this is why Japan should have voted at the UN Human Rights Council in favour of Sri Lanka rather than abstaining. After all, J.R. Jayewardene at that time defended Japan against the intentions of the Western powers and prevailed with his intellect and rationale not to impose punishment on Japan. After the First World War in 1919, the victors demanded reparation from Germany to the value of 269 billion gold marks to be exact the equivalent of around 100,000 tonnes of gold, during that period.

Ronald Reagan, the late USA President, was full of praise about Sri Lanka's potential and the richness of its society during the state visit to the USA by the President of Sri Lanka President Jayewardene and Mrs Jayewardene on June 18, 1984.

The following quotes are from the speech delivered by President Ronald Reagan: "Although our two countries are on opposite sides of the globe, we share a common bond in the great institution of democracy. You have held elections at regular intervals with almost equal regularity. Losers as well as winners accept the verdict of the people and the true winners are the people of Sri


It is a pleasure for us to have you as our guest. You underscored this heartfelt commitment during your first visit here in September of 1951 during a gathering of the representatives of nations who had fought in the Pacific War. Some at that San Francisco Conference insisted that Japan should not be given its full freedom. They argued that Japan should remain shackled as a punishment for its role in World War II, but as the representative of Sri Lanka, you spoke out for the principle of freedom for all people including the Japanese. You quoted the Buddha, the great teacher and said that hatred ceases not by hatred but by

We share your dedication to freedom and goodwill. This is more than political theory. It is a way of life. This spirit makes it natural that our two nations should be friends. I hope that the international community will be able to eradicate terrorism which has become a major challenge to those of us who believe in the democratic process.

I know this sentiment is shared by the people of all the democracies - when I say the free men and women of this planet will never cower before terrorists. Human liberty will prevail and civilisation will triumph over this cowardly form of barbarism. We applaud your determination not to yield to terrorism in your own country as well as your efforts to find through the democratic process a peaceful resolution of communal strife. There is no legitimate excuse for any political group to resort to violence in Sri

Lanka, a country with a strong democratic tradition and a nation of many races, reli-

gions and ethnic groups. We Americans know from experience that there is room for all in a democracy Dividing your country into separate nations, as some would have you do, is not the solution. Instead of separating people, now is the time to bring them together in the same spirit you spoke about in San Francisco three decades ago of love, not hatred. A united progressive Sri Lanka can flourish and live in peace with itself and the rest of the world. We wish you every success in your search for reconciliation and a better life for all your people. Sri Lanka is among those enlightened nations that understand incentives hold the key to greater economic growth and personal opportunity.

Sri Lanka is an example of independent people determining their own destiny and a country which the United States is proud to count among its friends. Welcome to

This is how Sri Lanka was received by President Ronald Reagan and his wife Nancy Reagan.

Then it was the turn of President Javewardene to make his opening speech and I quote: "This is not our first visit. We came in September 1951 to your West coast to attend the Japanese Peace Treaty Conference held in San Francisco. I came as my country's representative. I received then a full measure of praise and gratitude from members of the United States Government of the day - Dean Acheson, John Foster Dulles and others who attended the conference - for helping to secure the acceptance

by the conference of the peace treaty with Japan. The Japanese leaders

Prime Minister Yoshida and others are equally grateful. The thinking of the people of my country which was expressed by me on that occasion was that we should not ask for reparations from a fallen foe, who had harmed our land and people also; that we should forgive those who were enemies quoting the words of the Buddha that hatred ceases not by hatred but by love, which you also just quoted. We should restore to Japan the freedoms of democracy. Those were the ideas which inspired us then and inspire us now.

Our history and civilisation have survived unbroken from the fifth century BC for 2,500 years. There were glimpses of modern democracy even then, as in the appointment of mayors to our ancient cities. We were the first in Asia in 1865 to select members to the municipalities that governed our major cities and in 1931, under universal franchise, we exercised our right to elect the government of our choice. I happen to be the 193rd in the line

of heads of state from 483 BC to date. We had ambassadors of the court of Claudius Caesar - you find it recorded in Pleiade's letters - he even mentions the name of the ambassadors. We had sent delegations to China in 47 AD. The great Chinese pilgrims Xuanzang and Faxian came to our country in the fourth century AD and the sixth century AD. So did Sinbad, the sailor Marco Polo and Ibn Battuta.

For the first time, Westerners came in the 16th century and the Portuguese came as tourists but stayed for 150 years, after that, came the Dutch and then came the English and we are now once again a free country. We wish to be friendly with all and the enemies of none - that is my policy and the policy of our people. We would like the people of America to understand us through the long history of Sri Lanka.

In our modern history, we cannot forget the contribution made by an American, Colonel Henry Steel Olcott, when he helped the Buddhist leaders of Sri Lanka hundred years ago to establish a movement for the revival of education through schools owned and managed by the Buddhists themselves.

Sri Lanka has been for 53 years a practising democracy, where the freedoms of speech and writing, of electing governments at regular intervals and the independence of the judiciary and of the opposition are safeguarded.

In the non-aligned world of developing nations, which covers the whole of Central

and South America, the whole of Africa, the whole of Asia from the Mediterranear Sea to the Seas of China and Japan, there are very few countries which could be called a democracy. Ours is one. That is why the assistance that developing nations of the world received from the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund is appreciated though there are many matters which we feel should be changed to help them to exist as free countries.

We have been able to commence and have almost completed the largest development programme which in our long history has ever been attempted by King or President. We have, however, problems. Some of them are unique to our country - excessive rains, sometimes floods, landslides, and cyclones. A modern problem and one of universal occurrence today is terrorism. This happens in the extreme north of our country where a group of misguided people seeks separation from a united Sri Lanka. There are more Tamils living in the East and among the Sinhalese, the major community, than in the regions that seek separation who do not support them. My party holds 10 out of 12 seats in the Eastern

The terrorists are a small group who seek by force including murder, robberies and other misdeeds to support the cause of separation including the creation of a Marxist state in the whole of Sri Lanka and in India, beginning with Tamil Nadu in the South. I am glad that your country is taking a lead in creating an international movement to oppose terrorism. If I may suggest, it may be called the United Nations anti-terrorism organization. It is

vital that the developed world helps us with finances in this sphere and that all nations cooperate to eliminate the menace of terrorism from the civilized world.

I was very happy when I heard your address to the Irish Parliament on June 4. You made an appeal to Nations to reaffirm the principle not to use force in their dealings with each other. You said the democracies could inaugurate a programme to promote the growth of democratic institutions throughout the world. You spoke on behalf of hundreds of millions who live on the borderline of starvation while nations will spend next year a trillion dollars on the manufacturing of armaments for the destruction of human beings and their

products. I have never failed to express similar ideas. Non-violence is compassion and the Great Teacher whom I follow, the Gautama Buddha, and the Great Teacher you follow, Jesus Christ, and India's great son, Mahatma Gandhi, preached and practised the doctrine of non-violence successfully.

I remember when one of your representatives came to see me, I told her, a leader must know only two words - yes and no. I think President Reagan knows those two words very well. Once you say "yes", or "no" stick to it whatever hap-

We all are human beings. We extend our affection not only to human beings but also to animals - to the little elephant that we gifted to you. That is the philosophy which we have learnt in our country. That is the philosophy which if I can spread throughout the world and I find in you and Madam Reagan - very good disciples.'

Winning ICC T201 World Cup in 2014 was special - Sangakkara

Sri Lanka marked their Silver Jubilee celebrations of winning the 1996 Cricket World Cup in March this

And on April 6, the country celebrated another significant triumph in their historic achievements as they marked the seventh anniversary of winning the ICC Twenty20 World Cup in Bangladesh.

Sri Lanka led by Lasith Malinga defeated India by six wickets in the final played in Mirpur, Bangladesh.

The Indian Team led by M. S. Dohni were the favourites to win the title with their strong batting line-up which included Rohit Sharma, Virat Kholi, Ajinkya Rahane, Yuvraj Singh and Suresh Raina.

However, Sri Lanka with a good bowling line-up restricted the Indians to 130 for four wickets in 20

Kulasekara, Malinga and Herath took one wicket each but more importantly all the bowlers were able to finish their overs while conceding under 30 runs.

Kumar Sangakkara led the run chase with an unbeaten 52 in 35 balls inclusive of six fours and one six while Mahela Jayawardene made a valuable 24 in 24 balls with four fours. Thisara Perera struck the winning runs with a six off Ravichandran Ashwin in the 17 th over as Sri Lanka celebrated a magnificent victory. It was a special moment for Jayawardene and Sangakkara as both veterans decided to call it a day on their T20I careers after the 2014 T20 World Cup. Sangakkara won the Man-of-the- Match Award for playing a vital role in their success.

But Sangakkara felt Malinga and Kulasekara played a crucial role in Sri Lanka's success.

Describing how the two Sri Lankan pacers restricted India to 130 for four in the first innings, Sangakkara said: "The best death bowling that I have ever seen in my life."

"I have seen Waqar Younis and Wasim Akram bowl in the death but the overs from Kulasekara and Malinga to two of the biggest hitters and two of the best finishers in the short-

er version, I have never seen anything like that before or since."

'Twenty-four yorkers on the spot, ball after ball. Walking into the dressing room after that, we knew the momentum was with us.

"The 2014 ICC T20 World Cup in

Bangladesh was very special. I have said every tournament is special but this was much more so because it was going to be my last T20 World Cup. It was going to be Jayawardene's last T20 World Cup."

Thilaka was the very first female Olympian to represent Sri Lanka in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games and is also a double International athlete who represented Sri Lanka in both Athletics and Netball. She is the only Sri Lankan athlete to have represented the country in five consecutive South Asian Games and won medals in all Games including one gold, four silvers

IOC Women and Sport Award and four bronze medals. She was also the Sri Lankan netball team vice captain when the team won the Asian Netball Championship title in 1997 in

The versatile sports veteran Thilaka expressing her feelings on this nomination said: "I feel it is a great honour and privilege for being nominated as the IOC nominee of the Women and Sport Award.

I have been involved with two sports at the very top level – as an athlete and an administrator cum coach and my greatest passion in this is my ability to uplift the cause of women's sport in this country and fight towards equality in sport."

While she was an athlete, she

felt there was a lack of women participation in sports in Sri Lanka; therefore, she decided to become a coach to promote women in sports. She turned her experience gained in sports to role model top athlete in the country to serve and enrich the lives of athletes in rural parts of Sri Lanka with her new role, coaching girls in netball and

As she dreamed, Thilaka became an International Netball Coach, IAAF Level-1 Athletics Coach and Australian Strength and Conditioning Level-1 Coach to empower women through sports. Under her guidance, as a national netball coach, Sri Lanka won the Asian Netball Championship title twice in 2009 and

2018. Also, Sri Lanka qualified on both occasions to compete at the World Cup Netball Championship in 2011 and 2019. Her coaching career spans for over two decades and she has immensely contributed to uplifting women's sports in Sri Lanka. Her achievement was recognised by the SLT SLIK Sports Awards and awarded as the Outstanding Coach of the Year in 2018.

Thilaka accounts for international experience as well in coaching when she was sent by the International Netball Federation to India to conduct netball coaching workshops for coaches

She also served as National Netball Coach for the national teams of Maldives and Brunei Darussalam where she shared her expert knowledge to uplift girls' sports with the limited resources in those countries.

Under her guidance, Brunei Darussalam Netballers were exposed to international experience playing netball in the international arena and won their very first medal at the South East Asian Games, which was a molestone in Brunei Netball. Moreover, Thilaka also

As a role model in society she

St. Sylvester's reigns supreme in Kandy sports

St. Sylvester's College has produced some of the top class sportsmen. This school is situated in the heart of the ancient Sinhala Kingdom and remains as the one and only World to have produced a sportsman who was selected to represent two different countries at two different Olympic Games. That is none other than boxer Malcolm Bulner. He was brothers. He represented Ceylon at the Olympic Games in Tokyo and was later selected to represent Australia at the following Olympic Games. But was deprived of achieving this rare feat owing to technical reasons.

Malcolm who became an Australian national later qualified as a world class boxing judge and officiated at several boxing meets in Australia. He also boxed for the country at the Empire Games in Perth and the Asian Games in Bangkok. He was a south paw was the best boxer produced by Derrick Raymond the famous coach who was in England and passed away a few years back. Bulner won several national titles before migrating to Australia. His three brothers Michael, Noel and

Boxing was synonymous with St. Sylvester's which was in the forefront of schools boxing winning the coveted Stubbs Shield several times - within fourteen years they won on 12 times. Origin of St. Sylvester's dates back to the early 1940's. St. Sylvester's began as a separate institution on November 1, 1940 with very Rev. Fr. D. Robert. Perera O.S.B. as the principal. The college owed its inception to the foresight of his Lordship Bishop Regna and Abbot Weerasinghe, the heads of the Sylvestro-Benedictine congregation.

They felt that a good catholic

need. Once St. Anthony's College completely shifted to its home on the banks of the Mahaweli at Katugastota. Rev father Robert was given the tremendous task of seeing to progress of the new school. St. Sylvester's had made a name for itself in the field of education. Not only in Kandy but also throughout the length and breadth of the island. Starting with a mere 250 pupils and 12 teachers in 1940. Father Robert was not expected to do big things at St. Sylvester's. The buildings were not teeming with scholars the laboratories were empty, and libraries were without books. I t is said that he had to start with an over draft. But the picture of the institution now is a very different one. It is full to capacity, and its financial stability is assured.

The authoritarian of the Sylvestro-Benedictines intended originally to develop St. Sylvester's only as a junior school and affiliated to St. Anthony's. But such restrictions did not dampen the spirit of Father Robert. He had early visions of his institution as a collegiate school, second to none in the Island. Later during the Primer ship of late S.W.R.D. Bandaranaike the school was taken over by the Government. A big hand should go to principals like late D.J.N. Senavirthne who did yermon service followed by Clifford too wee good fighters in the school in Kandy town was a prime K.S.Gunaratne, W.B.Goppallawa, late

Bertie Nillagoda, and Asoka B. Hearth, T.R. Meetiyagoda gave their best and the present principal continues the good work.

St. Sylvester's continues to produce boxers, cricketers, footballers, hockey players, athletes, ruggerites with limited facilities. It is said that during the early years after the second World War, St. Sylvester's was entitled to use the Police Barracks. The pint sized ground was expanded with the help of Sylverstain students and also the Principal of Trinity College permitted the Sylverstians to use the Asgiriya Grounds for athletic practices and sports meets free of charge. In athletics, Sylverstians produced an athlete who broke a public schools record and was one of the country's crack sprinters. Felix Samarawickrema, who later crossed over to St. Joseph's College. He lowered the Public Schools 440 yards record with a timing of 51.8 seconds in 1948. At the same meet he won the 100 yards sprint with a timing of 10.6 seconds. Felix Samarawickrema was chosen to represent the country at the Empire Games in 1949 along with Trinity College's Duncan White. But had to pull out due to a muscle injury and Vivian Blaze took his place. Other top athletes to come out of this school, in the 1950's were Cyril Ranatunge, P. Thagavelu, Ananda Daswatte, G.S.Fernando, M.E.Marikar, S.Wickremasuriya, Leslie and Malcolm Marshal. later there were several others like L S.B ince at cricket.

Football was another popular sport from from 1940's to 1960's. Some of them played for the country and others for Kandy, Up-Country and work places among them were Mahinda Aluwihare the first Sylverstian to lead the Country. The other who shone in the early days before Mahinda Aluwihare first Sylvestrian to lead the country were N.E.Perera, I.M.Saheed, Edmun Samarawera, A.H.M.Jabar, Jaya Aluwihare, R.P.Wijasiri, Tony Dircekz, Percy Samaraweera, Rukman and Rajendra de Silva, M.E.Marikar led in 1953, Donald G. Labrooy, Abdul Razak, Gerad David, I.M. Anver, Hector

Galuge, M. Ayub. In the recent years they have won many at cricket acolades. It was M.E. Marikar who first played premier cricket without playing for the school. He was followed by Abdul Razak. Nihal Samarasekara was the first to play for the Ceylon before Sri Lanka gained Test status. Ishak Shabdeen was the first to play for the country after gaining Test status. Later the school produced galaxy of cricketers. The man who reached the top in coaching is Malcolm Perera who hit the highest spot in coaching, though he did not play for the country. He rose to be Sri Lanka Cricket Coaching Director and later Manager. He had the privilege of leading Kandy CC, Kandy and Central Prov-

In hockey they have produced top teams and players, coaches and administrators.

Hockey is one of the oldest sports at this school. Moot of the products have done their best in this sport by representing Combined Schools, Kandy and the country. To name some of the hockey players - Malcolm Marshal, Lesley Marshal, M.E. Marikar, P. Thangavelu, T.D.S. Perera, T. Murigesh, Lakshman Kultunge, C. Paramasivam, Nihal Samarasekara, Malcolm Perera has played in 23 hockey nationals. Anton Perera, M.Ayub, I. M. Anwer, A.G.T. Soloman, S. Sundaranayagam, H.C. Rangith, H.C. Edward, David brothers, Rodney, Kinsley and Gerard, Anton Perera played for the country as a schoolboy, D.G. Tilkarathne, M.A.M. Saheed, R. Maheswaran, M. Ashroff, Chandra Mohan are some of the names which came to mind.

Though rugby is new, some of the Sylverstians who played club rugby without playing for the school are Malcolm Marshal, Cyril Aluwihare, Hector Galuge, Sarath Basnayake, Gerad David, Tony Direckez, Nimal Leweke, Hafiz Marikar, M. Jamilon, Vasantha Ratnayake, Anton Fernando and Manjla Pathirane became the first to play for the combined school after rugby was started. They first played rugby in 1954 under the leadership of Malcolm Marshal and after two years they had to give up due to lack of facilities.

Apparel sector aims at cost cutting by reducing centre operations

Survey data showed that the Sri Lankan apparel sector aimed to cut costs mainly by reducing the level of centre operations.

The sector was impacted due to lockdown measures and a disruption in supply chains. The industry is looking to build supply chain resilience. Institute of Policy Studies Economist Kithmina Hewage noted that during the downturn some leeway was given to firms with regards to labour law. The leeway has since been tightened.

Hewage was speaking on a webinar titled 'Recovery of the Apparels Sector of Bangladesh and Sri Lanka: Is a Value-chain Based Solution Possible?'on April 20. The survey data is part of research by the Institute of Policy Studies in collaboration with Bangladesh based Centre for Policy Dialogue.

Sri Lankan firms are seen to have reduced tasks at large central headquarters. Companies are also increasingly using online platforms and online sales mechanisms. The industry is

looking to improve sourcing initiatives and capacity development to ensure more resilient supply chains.

The procurement of apparel has also changed with the pandemic. The sale of US clothing stores had declined by 79% in April 2020. This caused fiscal constraints throughout the supply chains.

The research showed that the coordination of inventory levels has been insufficient to allow for smoothening within the supply chain.

Price competitive production centres noted the highest reduction in order reductions. The proportion of firms that recorded order reductions were highest in Bangladesh (93%), Vietnam (80%), China (74%), and India (61%).

Bangladesh lost over 360,000 jobs in the apparel sector. Only 14% of the laid-off/retrenched workers in Bangladesh received their statutory dues. It is estimated that 58% of Bangladeshi apparel sector workers were put in financial difficulty. 82% saw a reduction in food intake.



Hewage said, "We saw several brands reconfiguring their supply chains. They have given greater importance to the country team." Companies were also facing difficulties in selling their product. Hewage said, "Certain suppliers are trying to cater to the domestic market.


Bangladesh was able to provide US\$ 1.2 billion in subsidised credit to the sector. Sri Lanka adopted policies of debt moratorium that were rolled over three times.

For the sector, globally national level policies were not possible because of the lower income nature of the apparel manufacturing sector.

WindForce shares off to strong start on CSE

The WindForce Limited IPO of Rs. 3.2 billion, the largest at the CSE since 2011, attracted 1,654 applications amounting to a value of Rs.25.7 billion. company offered 202,615,341 shares at an issue price of Rs.16 per share and was oversubscribed by nearly 8 times on the initial day. Wind-

Force has been issued a [SL] AA- (stable) credit rating by ICRA Lanka, which is the highest rating given to a corporate in Sri Lanka at the time of the issuance by ICRA Lanka Limit-

WindForce is able to handle the entire life cycle of a power project. Over the years through its investments in the renewable energy space, the company has transformed to become the largest IPP in the renewable energy sector in Sri Lanka and has expanded operations globally, becoming the first Sri Lankan company to set up solar plants in Pakistan, Uganda and Ukraine. Overall, the company currently operates 27 power plants with an installed capacity of 218MW of which 55.4% of

the capacity (120.8MW) is based in Sri Lanka while the rest is based internationally.

WindForce plans to allocate Rs. 2,310 million as the equity investment for a wind power project in Mannar and a solar power project in Senegal. Remaining funds of Rs.932 million will be utilized for future projects the company intends to undertake in Sri Lanka or in other countries. The total installed capacity of the company will increase from 218MW to 263MW with the completion of the projects in the immediate pipeline which would further strengthen the Company's position as the largest renewable energy Independent Power Producer (IPP) in Sri Lanka and one of the largest in the region.







DEFINING WINE

Wine is made with grapes, but not typical table grapes you'll find at the grocery. Wine grapes have thick skins, are small, sweet, and contain seeds.

There are many different kinds of wine grapes - over a thousand, - but there some common choices you'll find in the grocery store.

All wines can be organized into five basic groups. Within each group there are hundreds of different grape varieties and winemaking techniques!

- * Red wine * White wine * Sparkling wine
- * Rosé wine * Dessert wine

WINE AND THE BEAUTY INDUSTRY

As an antioxidant, resveratrol is able to fight oxidative stress and mitigate the damage it causes in the body. Though a glass of wine a day isn't going to fend off your body's natural aging process on its own, it could help when combined with a healthy lifestyle and proper

VITAMINS AND INGREDIENTS

For centuries, winemakers have relied on oak barrels to flavour wine with notes of vanilla or subtle spices, but since only some of the wine comes into contact with the wood, some producers will add oak chips, powders or staves to a barrel to help evenly distribute the flavours.

Found more frequently in supermarket wines, grape juice concentrate is sometimes included to boost the colour of red wine and add a bit of sugar to smooth out the mouthfeel. It's usually derived from Teinturer grapes.

Artisan winemakers opposed to adding enzymes may instead use non-vegan material as a fining agent and clarifier. These can include egg whites, bentonite clay and mammal proteins - all of which are filtered out before bot-



Tannins naturally occur in the skins of the grapes and are good for adding complexity to wine. But the crushing, maturation and climate change that takes place during winemaking can make them tricky to handle, so powdered tannins may be added early in the process to help add balance.

Potassium sorbate and potassium

Both of these ingredients are used to guard against bacteria and protect the yeast from spoiling, and are commonly used together during the fermentation process as they help the yeast ferment efficiently while improving the overall flavour.

Sulfur dioxide

This is one of the most common additives in wine, usually known simply as 'sulfites'. It's used to preserve the grapes and prevent oxidation during the winemaking process. It's also one of the few additives that has to be displayed on a wine bottle's label, but only if the sulphur dioxide exceeds 10mg per litre.

You might assume that sugar is added to

help sweeten a wine, but it's actually used to help boost its alcohol content. The process is called 'chaptalization' and also assists the yeast during the fermentation process.

No, water isn't added by wily producers looking to make their wine go further, it's actually added at the beginning of the winemaking process to help bring down high alcohol levels and add balance to the wine.

The key ingredient in winemaking, yeast helps convert sugars into alcohol. Some producers will use cultured yeasts to enhance certain flavour profiles, or use yeast in a second fermentation called malolactic fermentation, where naturallypresent bitter malic acids are converted into softer lactic acids.

The reason that red wine and skin health go hand in hand is thanks in large part to an antioxidant called resveratrol. Resveratrol protects the skin from free radicals - unstable molecules that can lead to lines, wrinkles, and sunspots – by restoring collagen and elastic fibers in the skin.

SKIN TYPES

The antioxidant properties of wine help in getting the toxins out of the skin. Wine facials are also great for skin tightening. Every wine has a different composition and should be used according to skin type.

If you have acne-prone oily skin, go for a red wine facial, since it has a high concentration of polyphenol resveratrol, a chemical that helps reduces inflammation. Most commonly used red wines for facials are Sula Rasa (Shiraz) and Indus Cabernet Sauvignon.






