**GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS

1. *Allowances.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of

1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulation made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,429 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of one year unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should annex copies of their birth certificates in proof of age. No affidavits will be accepted. If no copies of birth certificates are attached, the applicants will be considered as ineligible.

4. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

5. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service

(commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

6. Age Concession.—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

By-laws

1. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any premises for the purpose of any public entertainment, unless he has obtained from the Special Commissioner a licence authorising the use of premises for the purpose.

2. (1) Every person desirous of using any premises for the purpose of any public entertainment shall, before applying for a licence, make public his intention of using the premises for such purpose by exhibiting a notice on the premises in such position that it can be clearly seen from the public highway and by advertisement in three newspapers having a large circulation in Colombo. Such notice shall be exhibited on the premises until the application for a licence has been disposed of by the Special Commissioner. The application shall not be disposed of by the Special Commissioner until the expiration of a period of fourteen days after the receipt by him of a copy of such notice and of each such advertisement.

(2) Every application for a licence to use any premises for the purpose of any public entertainment shall be made to the Special Commissioner. Every application for a licence—

(a) shall specify—

- (i) the name and address of the applicant and, where the applicant is not the owner of the premises to be licensed, the name and address of the owner of such premises;

(ii) the situation of such premises;

- (iii) the nature and extent of the applicant's interest in such premises ;
- (iv) the character of the public entertainment for which such premises are to be used ; and
- (v) the purpose for which the proceeds of the public entertainment are to be used ; and

(b) shall be accompanied—

- (i) by a lay-out plan of the premises to be licensed drawn to a scale of one-eighth of an inch to a foot, and showing the buildings or other structures proposed to be erected on such premises and the provision to be made in such premises for car parks and sanitary conveniences ;
- (ii) by a separate block plan, drawn to a scale of not less than one inch to one chain, showing the position of the premises to be licensed in relation to the other premises and the public roads adjoining the first-mentioned premises ; and
- (iii) where the applicant is not the owner of such premises, by a declaration from the owner thereof to the effect that he consents to the premises being used for the purposes of the public entertainment specified in the application.

3. (1) The Special Commissioner may, after such inquiry as he may consider necessary, grant or refuse a licence to any person making an application therefor.

(2) Every licence granted under paragraph (1) shall—

- (a) be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto ;
- (b) be valid for such period not exceeding ninety days as may be specified in the licence ; and
- (c) be subject to the conditions set out in the licence.

(3) The fee payable for a licence shall be determined in accordance with the scale set out hereunder :

Provided, however, that the total amount of the fee payable for a licence shall not exceed one thousand rupees.

4. No licence granted under by-law 3 shall be transferable.

5. It shall be lawful for the Special Commissioner, the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, or any other person authorised in writing by the Special Commissioner or such Superintendent, at all reasonable times to enter and inspect any licensed premises and the furniture and equipment therein, and the licensee or other person for the time being in charge of those premises shall permit the Special Commissioner or such Superintendent or such authorised person to make such inspection and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

6. The Special Commissioner may cancel or suspend any licence granted under by-law 3 for non-compliance with the provisions of any of these by-laws.

7. Any contravention of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees and in the case of a continuing offence, with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after a conviction or after service of a written notice from the Special Commissioner directing attention to such contravention.

8. In these by-laws—

“licensee” means the holder of a licence issued by the Special Commissioner under by-law 3 ;

“licensed premises” means any premises in respect of which a licence has been issued by the Special Commissioner under by-law 3 ;

“public entertainment” includes any carnival, fete, circus, variety show or exhibition of games of skill, dancing, conjuring, juggling, wrestling, or acrobatic performances but does not include—

(a) the exhibition of pictures or other optical effects by means of a cinematograph, magic lantern or other similar apparatus ; or

(b) the staging of any play ; and

“Special Commissioner” means the Special Commissioner appointed under section 277 (2) (a) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, to have, exercise, perform and discharge all the rights, privileges, powers, duties and functions conferred or imposed upon, or vested in, the Colombo Municipal Council by that Ordinance or other written law.

9. The by-laws relating to public performances published in *Gazette* No. 6,956 of July 12, 1918, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended as follows :—

(a) by the substitution in the paragraph immediately above the heading “Definitions”, for the words “any dramatic representation or exhibition of dancing, conjuring, juggling, acrobatic performances, or other stage entertainment in which stage effects are used”, of the words “the staging of any play” ; and

(b) in by-law 89 by the omission of paragraphs (a) and (b) of that by-law.

Conditions of the licence

1. The licensee shall not keep the licensed premises open to the public for any of the purposes of the licence after midnight or before noon.

2. The licensee or a person nominated by him in writing shall be in charge of the licensed premises during the period such premises are open to the public.

3. The licensee shall not permit any improper language, dress, dance or gesture on the licensed premises.

4. The licensee shall take all such precautions as may be necessary to ensure the safety of persons in the licensed premises and he shall not permit in such premises any performance which is likely to endanger the safety of such persons.

5. The licensee shall cause to be exhibited above each exit door on the licensed premises a notice bearing the word "Exit" in block letters of not less than seven inches in height. The notice shall be so exhibited as to be readily seen by the persons using the licensed premises and it shall be illuminated throughout the period during which the public are on the licensed premises by a system of lighting separate from that which is used for the illumination of the platform.

6. The licensee shall cause to be placed above every door in the licensed premises other than an exit door, a notice indicating the use of the portion of the premises to which such door leads. Where any portion of the premises is not open to the public, a notice bearing the word "Private" shall be placed above the door leading to such portion of the premises. The licensee shall not place above any door a notice bearing the words "No Exit".

7. The licensee shall not use on any exit door or gate in the licensed premises any flush bolt, barrel bolt and lock or any other fastening which cannot be released by horizontally applied pressure.

8. The licensee shall keep all the exit doors and gates on the licensed premises which open inwards fully open and free from obstruction during the period such premises are open to the public.

9. The licensee shall take all necessary steps to ensure that all gangways, corridors, staircases and external passageways intended for exit in the licensed premises are kept entirely free from obstruction, whether permanent or temporary.

10. The licensee shall not allow, within the licensed premises, any person to stand or sit in any gangway intersecting the seating, or to sit in any of the other gangways. The licensee may allow persons to stand along the sides of the gangways or at the rear of the seating, if sufficient space is left in the gangway to enable other persons using it to do so without being obstructed.

11. The licensee shall not allow any part of the licensed premises to be overcrowded in such a manner as to endanger the safety of the public.

12. The licensee shall not construct any shed or temporary building on the licensed premises without the prior permission of the Municipal Engineer, Colombo.

13. The licensee shall not use any inflammable material in the construction of any shed or temporary building on the licensed premises.

14. The licensee shall not use, or permit the use of, any naked light inside, or within a distance of ten feet from, any shed or temporary building on the licensed premises.

15. The licensee shall cause all scenery, draperies, properties and decorations used on the licensed premises to be rendered and maintained satisfactorily non-inflammable.

16. The licensee shall cause all lamps, lanterns, lighting appliances and other apparatus liable to become heated, whether under normal or abnormal conditions, to be fitted with suitable guards to prevent contact with any combustible material.

17. The licensee shall not use, sell or exhibit on the licensed premises any toy balloon filled with inflammable gas.

18. The licensee shall cause all joints of electrical wiring on the licensed premises to be properly insulated.

19. The licensee shall not use on the licensed premises any merry-go-round operated by steam unless he has installed an efficient spark arrestor.

20. The licensee shall install all dynamos and other engines required for use in the licensed premises in a separate part of such premises.

21. The licensee shall make suitable provision for securing and maintaining adequate ventilation in the licensed premises throughout the period such premises are open to the public.

22. The licensee shall provide on the licensed premises a sufficient number of sanitary conveniences of a type approved by the Chief Medical Officer of Health, Colombo.

23. The licensee shall not within the licensed premises, by operating or causing or permitting any other person to operate any gramophone, wireless loudspeaker, amplifier or other similar instrument, produce or reproduce or cause to be produced or reproduced any sound which, by reason of its volume or its repetition or its continuous nature, causes a nuisance to the occupants of the other premises in the neighbourhood.

24. The licensee shall not permit gambling of any kind whatsoever within the licensed premises.

25. The licensee shall make suitable arrangements for the purpose of communicating with the Police and the Fire Brigade in any emergency.
