THE AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by Act No. 25 of 1956, Act No. 14 of 1957 and Act No. 62 of 1957.

2. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services by his Order dated the 11th of September, 1958, made under section 4 (2) of the above Act, referred this dispute between the Ceylon Workers' Congress (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") and the Superintendent of Waharaka Estate, Dedugala, to this Court. The Commissioner of Labour has by his statement of the 5th of September, 1958, stated that the matter in dispute is the non-employment of the 60 workers whose names are mentioned in that statement.

3. After some discussion Counsel have agreed that the matter be settled as set out below.

The terms of settlement are—

(1) The 17 workers (the statement made in the course of the address that they were 18 is now found to be an error) who are still resident on the Estate and whose names are set out in the Schedule below are to be taken back into the employment of the Estate as from the 20th November, 1958.

(2) The management of the Estate and the Union will arrange among themselves the allocation of work for these workers who are taken back, until reviewed at a later date when the circumstances of the Estate improve.

(3) The management will make an ex-gratia payment of Rs. 40 each for the ten male workers and Rs. 30 each to the seven female workers, mentioned in the Schedule.

(4) The Union, on behalf of these 17 workers, agrees that the workers will undertake to perform all the work allocated to them by the Superintendent.

(5) The Union withdraws all allegations of mala fide made against the management of the Estate in the statement filed by them and declares that it has no further claim against the management either on behalf of these 17 workers or on behalf of any others.

THE AWARD

This is an award under the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by Act No. 25 of 1956, Act No. 14 of 1957 and Act No. 62 of 1957.

2. It relates to a dispute between the Eksath Mudrana Sevaka Samithiya (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") and Messrs. Harrisons and Crosfield Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company").

3. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services, by his Order dated October 15, 1958, made under section 4 (2) of the Act, referred the dispute to this Court for settlement. The order of reference was accompanied by a statement dated 10th October, 1958, wherein the Commissioner of Labour had set out the matter in dispute between the parties. According to this statement the matter in dispute is—

"The non-payment of the basic wage increase awarded by the Printing Trade Wages Board to work categories B, C1, C2 and D amounting to Rs. 5, 10, 10 and 6 respectively with effect from 1st February, 1958."

4. This dispute has been settled by the parties and the terms of settlement have been notified to me. The terms are as follows:—

- (1) The Union admits and agrees, as a matter of principle, that there is no right or entitlement for a demand that an increase in the minimum basic wage as prescribed by the Wages Board should be correspondingly reflected in a wage structure where that wage structure is above the minimum wage as prescribed by the Wages Board.
- (2) The Company in October, 1957, agreed to implement an incremental scale based on the years of service, and after negotiation with the Union agreement was reached and the matter was finalised in March, 1958. Between these two dates, viz., 1st February, 1958, the Wages Board for the Printing Trade increased the minimum basic wage for the printing trade, and the Company agrees to base the new incremental scale on the new minimum basic wage, as prescribed, with effect from 1st February, 1958.
- (3) The Company reserves to itself the right to review and revise the incremental scale if a further increase in the minimum basic wage is prescribed at some future date by the Wages Board for the Printing Trade.

The above terms of settlement appear to me as being just and equitable and I make award accordingly.

The Award

An Industrial Dispute between the Hotel, Bakery and Beverages Workers' Union of No. 124, Kumaran Rutnam Road, Colombo 2 and Messrs. City Bakery Limited, No. 11, Sea Street, Colombo 11 was referred to me by the Commissioner of Labour by his letter dated 22nd September, 1958, for settlement by arbitration under section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, No. 25 of 1956, the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, No. 14 of 1957, and the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, No. 62 of 1957.

In his statement the Commissioner of Labour has specified that the matter in dispute between the parties is the non-employment of:—

Proceedings commenced on the 13th October, 1958, were continued on the 15th and 16th October, 1958 and were concluded on the 21st October, 1958.

Mr. K. Kulaveerasingham, General Secretary, Hotel, Bakery and Beverages Workers' Union assisted by Mr. A. M. A. Azeez, a Representative of the same Union appeared for the petitioning Union (hereinafter referred to as the Applicant); and Mr. Dias Abeysinghe, Proctor S. C. Appeared on behalf of Messrs. City Bakery Limited (hereinafter referred to as the Respondent).

It was agreed between both parties that the issues in all the eleven cases were to be:

- (1) Was the termination of employment of Messrs. B. G. Karunaratne, E. Dissanayake, L. H. Bandula, D. C. Pathirana, K. D. A. Prematillake, U. K. Piyasiri, D. B. Atapattu, J. M. Banda, Sumathipala and L. G. Samie, respectively, for sufficient and reasonable cause?
- (2) If not what relief are they entitled to?

The case of Mr. B. G. Karunaratne was taken up first. The charges made against Mr. Karunaratne by the Respondent are that (1) he did on 19.7.1958, have in the Cash Register a sum of Rs. 39.94 in excess of the amount indicated in the Cash Register; (2) he failed to insert a paper roll into the Cash Register on the evening of 18.7.1958, which was part of his duty.

The Respondents witnesses were Messrs. P. A. S. Perera, Chairman, Board of Directors; Sudharman Perera, Managing Director; S. Dias Jayamanne and Kingsley Perera. The Applicant called only Mr. B. G. Karunaratne as a witness. The Applicant produced no documents; the documents produced by the Respondent were marked 1P1, 1P2, 1P3, 1P4, 1P5, 1P6, 1P7 and 1P8.

Charge (1) against Mr. Karunaratne, Cashier, is that on the evening of 19.7.1958, at or about 7 p.m. he had in the Cash Register excess cash in a sum of Rs. 39.94 for the presence of which he could not give any satisfactory explanation.

The Cash Register maintained at City Bakery Limited is operated by a lever. Once a cash sale is made, the lever, which is operated manually, performs three functions, viz: (1) opens the drawer containing the cash; (2) registers the cash sale for which payment is being made and (3) alters the Grand Sale Total for the day. Item number (3) takes place irrespective of the fact whether a paper roll is present in the Cash Register or not.

According to 1P1, which is a record of total collections for 19.7.1958, and which is prepared at the end of each day, the total collection in cash found in the Cash Register is Rs. 1,713.88; while the total registered as the Grand Sale Total is Rs. 1,673.94. This gives an excess of Rs. 39.94. This amount had been checked and the statement prepared in the presence of Mr. P. A. S. Perera, Chairman, Board of Directors and Mr. B. G. Karunaratne, by the Acting Manager Mr. Dias Jayamanne.

Various defences were taken up by the Applicant, each of which I shall deal with separately. One defence taken up was that Mr. Karunaratne was not the only Cashier to work at the Cash Register and that he alone should not be responsible. There has been no dispute as to the fact that Mr. Karunaratne

is the Chief Cashier, and that the others are only relieving Cashiers. It is therefore his responsibility to see that at each time he takes over from the relieving Cashiers that the cash in the Cash Register tallies with the Grand Sale Total; which amount is clearly visible to him.

Another defence taken up by the Applicant is that this Cash Register is operated by a Master Key, by the help of which the Grand Sale Total could be altered. This key had been found by Mr. Karunaratne in a drawer of the Cash Register. He has stated in his evidence that this key was given to one Mr. Piyasena, a new employee, who has in turn returned the key to Mr. Kingsley Perera. The motive suggested by Mr. Karunaratne by this transaction appears to be that Mr. Kingsley Perera handed the Master Key to Mr. Piyasena to alter the Grand Sale Total because of a row Mr. Kingsley Perera had with him five days ago. No details of this 'row' were forthcoming. That there appeared to be a plot between Mr. Kingsley Perera and Mr. Piyasena to put Mr. Karunaratne into trouble is without foundation and is a figment of Mr. Karunaratne's imagination.

In charge (2) against Mr. Karunaratne the case made out against him by the Respondent is that on the evening of 18.7.1958, Mr. Karunaratne had neglected his duty by failing to introduce a paper roll into the Cash Register. The evidence available on this point is that of Mr. Dias Jayamanne who states that on the morning of 19.7.1958, Mr. Kingsley Perera the relieving Cashier had complained to him that there was no paper roll in the Cash Register and that this had been attended to by him only in the morning. This is corroborated by Mr. Kingsley Perera himself. The evidence of both these witnesses stands uncontradicted. Mr. Kulaveerasingham tried to make out that the Management of City Bakery Limited, had not made available to Mr. Karunaratne paper rolls to be used in the Cash Register for the period 9.7.1958 to 19.7.1958. I do not think that the Management of City Bakery Limited, where the cash sales for a day averages Rs. 1,500, would neglect the elementary precaution of keeping in stock for the use of the Cash Register an essential item as paper rolls, when they would have known very well that in the absence of such rolls no correct accounting of the day to day sales could be maintained. I accept the evidence given by Messrs. Sudharman Perera and Kingsley Perera when they said that over half a dozen rolls for the use of the Cash Register were available at the establishment. From the evidence led I hold that Mr. Karunaratne had neglected his entrusted duty of ensuring that there was a paper roll in the Cash Register on 18.7.1958.

I therefore answer the issues in this case as follows:—

- (1) The termination of employment of Mr. B. G. Karunaratne on 24.7.1958, was for sufficient and reasonable cause.
- (2) This issue does not require any answer.

The case against Messrs. E. Dissanayake, L. H. Bandula, D. C. Pathirana and K. D. A. Prematillake was dealt with next. According to Mr. Dias Abey-singhe these four workers had on 30.7.1958, between 9 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. assaulted Mr. Kingsley Perera, Cashier. Mr. P. A. S. Perera, Chairman Board of Directors of City Bakery Limited had held an inquiry into this allegation of misconduct against these four workers on 3.8.1958. On the evidence led before him he had found them guilty of the charge of misconduct and their services had been terminated from 3.8.1958.

According to the petitioning Union, Mr. Kingsley Perera had provoked the workers by the use of improper language and there had merely been an exchange of words between Mr. E. Dissanayake and Mr. Kingsley Perera on this date and assault had taken place.

The documents produced by the Respondent were marked 2P1 and 2P2; no documents were produced by the petitioning Union. The witnesses called by the Respondent were Messrs. P. A. S. Perera, Chairman Board of Directors, who produced the Notes of Inquiry, Sudharman Perera, Managing Director; E. C. Peiris, Manager and Kingsley Perera, Cashier. The petitioning Union called as its witnesses Messrs. V. W. S. Gunawardene and E. Dissanayake, waiters.

I shall now examine the evidence led before me in this case. Mr. Kingsley Perera in his evidence stated that on 30.7.58, while he was on duty between 6 a.m. and 9 a.m. some of the customers had complained to him that they had not been served and had as a consequence of this neglect left the establishment without having had their tea. Mr. Perera had conveyed this complaint of their patrons to Mr. Sudharman Perera when he came to the establishment at about 9.30 a.m.

It was while this information was being conveyed to Mr. Sudharman Perera that Mr. E. Dissanayake intervenes and tells Mr. Kingsley Perera that he had nothing to do with the latter. This intervention of Mr. Dissanayake, while the Cashier Mr. Kingsley Perera was making a report to his lawful superior was itself unwarranted and uncalled for. According to the evidence of Mr. Dissanayake he himself had been aware of the fact that on that particular morning, viz: 30.7.1958, patrons who had come to this establishment for their morning tea had left, after complaining that they had not been served.

All this is the first part of an incident that was to take place later. While Mr. Kingsley Perera was returning to his seat after using the bathroom Messrs. Dissanayake, Bandula, Pathirana and Prematillake had assaulted him. There is the evidence of the eye witnesses Messrs. Sudharman Perera and E. C. Peiris and, of course, of Kingsley Perera himself who was the object of the assault. The evidence as to the assault is clear and uncontradicted on all the material details.

The petitioning Union led the evidence of Mr. V. W. S. Goonewardene, who rather than explaining away the reasons for the assault, proved by his evidence that it was Mr. Dissanayake who offered any provocation and not Mr. Kingsley Perera.

It is strange that the petitioning Union failed to call Messrs. Bandula, Pathirana and Prematillake either to deny the accusation made against them or even to deny any knowledge of the incident.

I therefore accept the evidence given on behalf of the Respondent and answer the issues as follows:—

- (1) The termination of employment of Messrs. E. Dissanayake, L. H. Bandula, D. C. Pathirana and K. D. A. Prematillake on 3.8.1958, was for sufficient and reasonable cause.
- (2) This issue does not require any answer.

The case of Messrs. U. K. Piyasiri and D. B. Atapattu was taken up next.

According to the Respondent these two workers were discontinued from service with effect from 6.8.1958, on the following grounds:—

- (1) Their inability to maintain discipline among the workers;
- (2) Their inability to get the workers to obey instructions;
- (3) Failure to obey instructions themselves;
- (4) Aiding and abetting looting;
- (5) Dishonesty and absence of trust.

The petitioning Union denied all these several allegations and put the Respondent to the proof thereof.

The documents marked 3P1, 3P3, and 3P4 were produced by the petitioning Union; the document marked 3P2 was produced by the Respondent.

I shall now deal with the evidence led on each of the above charges which were jointly and severally made against Messrs. Piyasiri and Atapattu.

Charges (1), (2) and (3) were made against Mr. Atapattu merely because he failed to obtain the signatures from the workers who spent their nights at the premises of City Bakery Limited. This practice of obtaining signatures was introduced by the Management of City Bakery Limited as from 3.7.1958, with a view to maintaining a check on the movement of the workers at these premises at night. It appears from the evidence led and from the examination of the attendance register itself, that the workers, including Mr. Atapattu, had neglected to comply with this request. The explanation given for this neglect, according to Mr. Atapattu is, that this request of the Management, made at a time when the civil commotion in this country was at its peak, was viewed with suspicion by the workers and hence they declined to sign. Mr. Atapattu himself had not signed the register for the same reason.

At a time, when on the Managing Director's own evidence, indiscipline was prevalent the Management should have been wary of the restrictions imposed on their staff. This request of the Management however well intentioned I think had been made at an inopportune moment and Messrs. Atapattu and Piyasiri should not have been punished with dismissal on that score.

The more serious charge made against these two workers is that they aided and abetted in looting the cash and articles belonging to Mr. S. J. N. Rasanayagam who was engaged in the sale of cigars and occupied the front portion of City Bakery Limited. There is not an iota of evidence that these two workers aided and abetted anyone. On the contrary the Management of City Bakery Limited admit in their evidence that it was their Manager Mr. E. C. Peiris who had removed all the articles including cash, cigars &c., belonging to Mr. Rasanayagam for safekeeping.

The evidence, the Respondent relies on, to establish this charge is that of Mr. P. A. D. Perera who states that 'one day' when he came to the establishment he found Messrs. Piyasiri and Atapattu near the front counter and that Atapattu had a screw driver in his hand. When he made further investigations he found that the drawers of the counter were already open. This fact is correct because these workers themselves had assisted the Manager Mr. E. C. Peiris to remove Mr. Rasanayagam's articles for safe keeping.

Mr. Rasanayagam's evidence was unhelpful to the extent of maintaining any charge against these workers. This charge must therefore necessarily fail.

The 4th charge is that these two workers were dishonest. This charge requires little examination. Mr. P. A. D. Perera in his evidence stated that he saw Messrs. Piyasiri and Atapattu were removing 'large' quantities of food on 11.5.1958, to be given to the workers of Hasthagiri Hotel, Colombo who were out on strike. The Management of City Bakery Limited has waited very nearly two months to confront these two workers with this charge. The petitioning Union produced Cash Memo No. 5359 of 11.5.1958, which indicates the item sold viz: bread, seeni sambol, for a sum of Rs. 8.98. The bill has been made out in favour of 'employers' staff'. This charge that the workers were dishonest must therefore fail.

In the light of the evidence led before me I answer the issues in this case as follows:—

- (1) The termination of employment of Messrs. U. K. Piyasiri and D. B. Atapattu on 6.8.1958, was not justified;
- (2) These two workers should be re-employed forthwith, with the payment of wages for the period of non-employment. 'Wages' would include the cost of meals provided by the employer which is fixed at the normal accepted average of Rs. 45 per month.

During the proceedings the parties intimated to me that as regards Messrs. J. M. Banda, Sumathipala, L. G. Samie and D. D. Karunaratne they have reached a settlement on the following terms:—

- (1) It was agreed that these four workers were to have considered as having vacated their posts;
- (2) The Management of City Bakery Limited consents to re-employ these four workers as from 1.11.1958;
- (3) It was agreed that the salaries and other conditions of service will remain the same, subject to condition (4).
- (4) Messrs. Sumathipala, L. G. Samie and D. D. Karunaratne will be on probation for a period of three months; while J. M. Banda's period of probation will be for a period of four months.

In my opinion these terms of settlement are fair and equitable and I make Award accordingly.

The wages payable to Messrs. U. K. Piyasiri and D. B. Atapattu should be paid to them within two weeks of the publication of this Award.
