MINUTE ON THE CEYLON CIVIL SERVICE

THE Public Service Commission has been pleased to order the publication of the following Minute on the Ceylon Civil Service.

1. The Civil Service consists of officers who have been appointed to any of the classes and grades of the service enumerated below—

2. Appointments to Class I will be made by the Public Service Commission to whom recommendations will be made by the Secretary to the Treasury. This Class will ordinarily be filled as vacancies occur by promotion from Class II. Grade I of Class I will consist of 12 members of the Class selected by the Public Service Commission to whom recommendations will be made by the Secretary to the Treasury. Appointments to this Grade will be personal. Appointment to this Grade will not be made unless the services of the officers merit it.

Officers in Class I Grade II will be required to reach the maximum of Grade II before they are eligible for promotion to Grade I.

3. Appointments to Class II will be made by the Public Service Commission to whom recommendations will be made by the Secretary to the Treasury.

This Class will be filled by the appointment of Cadets, who are qualified for promotion, and by the promotion of officers from Class III. At any time the number of officers promoted from Class III should be at least 12.

4. Cadets will be appointed by the Public Service Commission on the results of the open competitive examination (Section 12). They will be on probation for a period of three years but on passing the 1st Efficiency Bar and on the completion of two years from the date of appointment Cadets will be eligible for appointment to Class II of the Civil Service on the initial of that Class. Their confirmation at the end of the probationary period of three years will depend, among other circumstances, on their passing the Proficiency examination in Sinhala (Ordinary Level) which is of the standard of the Junior School Certificate. If at the end of 3 years an officer has not passed the Examination in Sinhala his appointment is liable to be terminated. Officers who qualified for entry into the service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Examination

in Sinhala. Seniority on promotion to Class II and on confirmation will normally be governed by order of merit in the open examination.

- 6. The payment of officiating salary to officers in Class II gazetted to act in posts graded in Class I, to officers in Class II who have not yet reached the salary point of Rs. 13,800 per annum gazetted to act in posts graded in Class II Grade I, and to officers in Class III, shall be governed by the Financial Regulations. For this purpose the salary attached to Class I Grade II will be Rs. 17,400—600—Rs. 18,600 and that attached to Class II Grade I will be Rs. 13,800—600—Rs. 16,200.
- 7. Salaries will be paid to those on Sterling salary scales in rupees at a rate of exchange periodically fixed and proclaimed. Leave pay and pension will be calculated according to the sterling salaries fixed by this Minute.
- 8. In the event of there being no member of the Civil Service available to fill any post which is graded in the Service, the Public Service Commission on receipt of a recommendation from the Secretary to the Treasury will decide how the vacancy shall be filled.
- 9. Promotion to or within the First Class will depend on merit, and seniority will be a secondary consideration.
- 10. Efficiency Bars occur at the following points in the Civil Service salaries scale:—

No officer will be promoted beyond an efficiency bar unless the Secretary to the Treasury is satisfied that he is in every respect qualified to perform efficiently any duties which may be assigned to him in the period which will elapse before he reaches the next efficiency bar or the maximum salary of the time scale. In addition an officer will be required to pass the first examination before he can be promoted beyond the first efficiency bar, and to pass the second examination (Section 18) before promotion beyond the second bar. Before promotion beyond the third bar, an officer will be required to satisfy the Secretary to the Treasury that he has kept up an adequate knowledge of the languages.

11. The Public Service Commission will, as vacancies occur, appoint to the Third Class of the Civil Service, without examination, members of the Public Service possessing aptitude for public business. In appointing such men regard will be had to their ability, high reputation, and long experience.

An officer in Class III will be eligible for appointment to Class II provided that he is considered in every respect suitable for promotion.

The passing of the first examination is not required before promotion to Class II can be considered.

Cadetships in the Civil Service

12. (i) Cadets who must be Ceylonese are selected. by open competitive examination. The examination will be conducted by the Public Service Commission. The term "Ceylonese" means a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

A married candidate will not be appointed without the explicit consent of the Public Service Commission. No pledge of eventual appointment will be given to such a candidate in anticipation of the result of the examination.

- (ii) The examination for these appointments will as a rule be held in Colombo in or about the month of October. Candidates must be between the ages of 22 and 24 on the 1st August in the year in which the examination is held.
- (iii) The number of Cadets to be selected at any one time will be decided by the Secretary to the Treasury.
- (iv) (a) The method of application for nomination to sit for the examination will be fixed by notification in the Government Gazette. Nomination to sit for the competitive examination will be limited to candidates who have passed an Honours or Pass Degree Examination of the University of Ceylon or any other examination which may be deemed to be of at least equal standard.
- (b) Every candidate must produce satisfactory evidence that he has attained the age of 22 and had not attained the age of 24 on the 1st day of August in the year in which the examination is held, and that he is duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- (c) Every candidate must be of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and otherwise physically qualified for service, and will be called upon to undergo a medical examination to test these points.
- (d) The fees required from candidates for the competitive examination and for the medical examination will be indicated in the notification calling for applications.

Examinations for Cadets before Promotion over the 1st Efficiency Bar and for Class II Officers before the 2nd Efficiency Bar

FIRST EXAMINATION

13. Every Cadet will be required, before promotion over the 1st Efficiency Bar, to pass an examination

in the subjects specified below in order to become eligible for appointment to Class II of the Civil Service:—

- 1. Law.
- 2. Accounts.
- 3. Public Service Commission Rules and Manual of Procedure.

In their First Examination candidates must sit for all the subjects at the same time, but should they pass in one subject and fail in the others they are not required to sit again for the subjects in which they have passed.

Note.—Before confirmation in Class II, Cadets are also required to pass a Proficiency Examination in Sinhala as laid down in Section 4 of this Minute.

14. A Cadet who is (a) a qualified Barrister-at-Law or an Advocate of the Supreme Court of Ceylon, (b) a qualified Proctor of the Supreme Court of Ceylon, or (c) who has obtained a Degree in Law of a recognised University shall be exempted from passing the prescribed examination in Law.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

1. Law

- 15. In the First Examination in Law, candidates will be examined in the following subjects:—
 - (i) The Penal Code and the Evidence Ordinance.
 - (ii) Outline of the Legal system of Ceylon and the organisation of the Courts.

Candidates will be expected to be familiar with the following:—

The Courts Ordinance (Cap. 6).

(iii) The Constitution of Ceylon.

Candidates will be expected to be familiar with the following Acts and Orders in Council (including amendments):—

The Ceylon Independence Act, 1947.

The Ceylon (Constitution and Independence) Orders in Council, 1946 and 1947.

The Citizenship Act, No. 18 of 1948.

The Ceylon (Parliamentary Elections) Order in Council, 1946.

Candidates will be required to obtain a minimum of 33 per cent of the marks in each subject and an average of 40 per cent.

Books recommended.—

Papers (ii) and (iii)—The Dominion of Ceylon by Jennings & Thambiah.

2. Accounts

- 16. The First Examination in Accounts will be based on the following:—
 - (a) The Financial Regulations of the Ceylon Government—Part I except Chapter X.
 - (b) The Estimates of the current year, e.g., their arrangement, the heads of revenue, &c.
 - (c) Ordinances relating to specific accounts dealt with in Kachcheries.

Candidates will be required to obtain 40 per cent of the total marks for a pass. A candidate who obtains 75 per cent of the total marks in this first examination will be exempted from the second examination in Accounts

3. Public Service Commission Rules and Manual of Procedure

17. Candidates will be examined in the Public Service Commission Rules and the Manual of Procedure. Candidates will be required to obtain 40 per cent of the total marks for a pass.

SECOND EXAMINATION

- 18. Members of the Civil Service will be required before they can be promoted over the 2nd Efficiency Bar, to pass a Second Examination which will consist of papers in the following subjects:—
 - (1) Sinhala.
 - (2) Tamil.
 - (3) Accounts.
 - (4) Law.

Candidates may take up each of these subjects if they so desire, on four separate occasions, provided that—

- (a) Officers who qualify for entry into the Civil Service through the Sinhala Medium shall be exempted from passing the prescribed examination in Sinhala.
- (b) Officers possessing the qualifications set out in Section 14 shall be exempted from passing the prescribed examination in Law.
- (c) Officers promoted to Class II from Class III of the Civil Service shall be exempted from passing the prescribed examinations in law, Sinhala and Tamil.

I. SINHALA AND TAMIL

- 19. The Examination in Sinhala and Tamil shall consist of test in the following Sections:—
 - (a) (i) Grammar.
 - (ii) Translation into English of petitions or reports from Headmen written in different running hands.
 - (iii) Translation into Sinhala/Tamil from an official paper or document in English.
 - (iv) Dictation of official material from English into Sinhala/Tamil so that the passage can be understood and taken down in writing by a Sinhalese or Tamil.
 - (v) Reading of a petition in Sinhala/Tamil.
 - (vi) Parsing.
 - (vii) Conversation and Interpretation.
 - (b) The test in conversation and interpretation will be to satisfy the examiner of the candidate's power of understanding Sinhala and Tamil of different classes and of making himself understood both in common conversation and in the usual course of official business.
 - (c) The marks required for a pass in this second examination will be 60 per cent in conversation and interpretation and an average of 50 per cent in all sections of this examination.
- 20. For officers recruited into the Civil Service after September 24, 1956, the examination in Sinhala will take a different form from that described in Section 19. The examination in Sinhala for such officers will be of the level of the Proficiency Examination in

Sinhala (Advanced Level) which is of the Standard of the Senior School Certificate Examination. The marks required for a pass in this examination will be 40 per cent.

II. ACCOUNTS

21. The Examination in Accounts will be identical with that prescribed in Section 16 for the First Examination but a mark of 66 per cent will be required for a pass in the Second Examination.

III. Law

- 22. The Second Examination in Law will consist of papers in the following:—
 - (i) Law of Contracts and Torts.
 - (ii) The Law of Property.

Candidates will be expected to have specialised knowledge of the law relating to Crown lands in Ceylon.

Candidates will be expected to be familiar with the following Ordinances and Acts (including amendments):—

The Prescription Ordinance (Cap. 55).

The Prevention of Frauds Ordinance (Cap. 57).

The Matrimonial Rights and Inheritance Ordinance (Cap. 47).

The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 32 of 1946.

The Crown Lands Ordinance, No. 8 of 1947.

The Land Acquisition Act, No. 9 of 1950.

The Land Development Ordinance (Cap. 320) and all other statutory provisions dealing with Crown lands and referred to in the Land Manual.

The Paddy Lands Act, No. 1 of 1958.

(iii) Administrative Law.

Candidates will be required to obtain 40 per cent of the marks in each paper and an average of 50 per cent in all three papers for a pass.

By my award dated 29th November, 1956, I as District Judge of Colombo, I set out the superannuation schemes which I recommended for the members of the Ceylon Bank Employees' Union. By his letter dated 15th October, 1957, the Acting Commissioner of Labour referred the award to me for my interpretation of two questions that have arisen, namely:

- (a) Whether the pension scheme set out in the award has effect from 1.4.56.
- (b) Who are the workmen to whom the award relates.

By another letter of the same date the Acting Commissioner of Labour referred two entirely new matters for my arbitration, namely:

- (a) Dearness allowance should be paid on pensions at the rates paid by Government to its pensioners; and
- (b) The practice of granting 3 months' leave preparatory to retirement should be continued.

The matters were argued before me on 5.3.58. Mr. Advocate Nadesan Q.C. with Mr. Advocate Thurairatnam instructed by Mr. Felix Perera appeared for the Ceylon Bank Employees' Union and Mr. Advocate Gratiaen Q.C. with Mr. Advocate Kadiraman instructed by Mr. Advocate Kadiraman instructed Mr. Advocate Mr. Advoc gamar instructed by Messrs. Julius and Creasy appeared for the Commercial Banks' Union.

As to the date from which the pension scheme recommended by me is to take effect, I had imagined that the matter was beyond doubt. I had in my award fixed the date for the Provident Fund as from 1.4.56, but unfortunately I had omitted to state expressly that the pension scheme was also to start from the same date. My intention was that both schemes were to take effect from 1.4.56. Mr. Gratiaen argues that functioning as I do, as an arbitrator, I must interpret the language of the document and not what was in my mind at the time I made the award. He referred to section 18 (2) of Act No. 43 of 1950 and contended that if no date is fixed, the date shall be the date on which the award was made namely 29.11.56.

With respect I am unable to agree. The award is not a document like a deed; I am interpreting what was in my own mind at the time and supplying an omission I had inadvertently made. I fix the date for the pension scheme as 1. 4. 56.

On the second question as to which workers the award applies the answer is clear. The dispute referred to me for arbitration was between the Ceylon Bank Employees' Union and the Commercial Banks' Union. The award is binding on the two unions, and will apply to all who are members of the unions, to all workers who are in the Ceylon Bank Employees' Union. I understand that the Banks are ready and willing to extend the benefits of the schemes suggested by me to all employees but were hesitant because they were not sure if the award applied to all cate-gories of employees. I hope the matter is now beyond doubt.

The demands for dearness allowance and for three months' leave preparatory to retirement are entirely new ones. They were not discussed before me when I made the first award. Mr. Gratiaen argued as a preliminary objection that so long as my award is in operation and as that award has no reference to dearness allowances or to three months' leave before retirement, I have no power now to add to or subtract from that award in regard to these particular matters. My award he submitted contains a complete super-annuation scheme and therefore I have no jurisdiction to vary it by adding to it any new superannuation benefits. He reserved to himself the right to argue on the merits after I have decided the question of jurisdiction.

I am not now functioning as District Judge of Colombo, and I have other onerous duties to perform; it will not be possible for me to hear argument and make an award on these new matters. They should be referred to the officer at present acting as District Judge of Colombo. I therefore leave the whole question open to be argued both on the law and on the merits before the District Judge.

Award

Commissioner of Labour,

By order dated 24.7.58, you empowered me to settle by arbitration the following matters in dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union and the Ceylon Hotels Ltd., Colombo:

- (1) Was the discontinuance of Mr. Nissanka de Silva justified?
- (2) If issue No. 1, is answered in the negative, what lesser alternative punishment should be meted out to Mr. Nissanka de Silva?

Both parties appeared before me on Saturday, 11th October (Mr. Ediriweera, Managing Director, representing Ceylon Hotels Ltd., Colombo, and Mr. P. B. Thampoe, General Secretary, representing the Ceylon Mercantile Union), and placed their respective versions in regard to the incidents which culminated in the discontinuance of Mr. Nissanka de Silva

For the purpose of my inquiry, Mr. Thampoe was agreeable to treating the evidence recorded by Mr. Ediriweera as factually correct but proceeded to dispute the justifiability of the conclusion arrived at by Mr. Ediriweera in all the circumstances of the case. In fact, it was the Union's contention that on the facts which transpired at the inquiry, there was no conclusive evidence to show that Mr. Nissanka de Silva's presence behind the cashier's counter was for a dishonest purpose. The only person whom I considered necessary to examine at my inquiry was Mr. Nissanka de Silva himself.

The facts of the case are briefly as follows:-

On the 30th June, 1957, Mr. Nissanka de Silva had finished work at about 3 a.m. in the morning and his colleague and room-mate Mr. Amarasekera who was the cashier of the hotel, finished work at about 4 a.m. after which both of them decided to go on a spree to Wellawatte by taxi in order to get some hoppers and tea. They went to Wellawatte and Bambalapitiya and were unable to get their hoppers, so they turned back and went to Ratmalana where they had some light refreshments and returned to the Hotel at about

5.10 a.m. Immediately after this, both Mr. Amarasekera and Mr. Nissanka de Silva went to their room in the staff quarters and lay in their beds to snatch a little sleep. Mr. Amarasekera dozed off but Mr. Nissanka de Silva could not get any sleep, so, according to him, he decided to have some fun at Mr. Amarasekera. He placed a broom stick and a shoe by the side of Mr. Amarasekera on his bed, hid the other shoe somewhere near the bathroom, and went to the pantry to have a cup of tea. On the way, while passing the cashier's counter, he decided to have a little more fun at Mr. Amarasekera and so he jumped over the cashier's counter with the intention of hanging a waste paper basket at the door of the counter to surprise Mr. Amarasekera when he came on duty. While he was still there near the counter, he was discovered by the porter and the cleaners whose suspicions were apparently roused at the presence of Mr. Nissanka de Silva in a plain sarong at such an hour in the morning as it was an unusual occurrence. They therefore promptly reported this to Mr. Felix de Silva who proceeded to the spot, and having discovered Mr. Nissanka de Silva near the counter, wearing only a sarong and bare bodied, went up to Mr. Amarasekera's room and asked him to check up and verify whether his keys were safe. Mr. Amarasekera thereupon lifted his pillow and found that the keys of the door of the counter as well as the safe were where he had left them.

Mr. Ediriweera had after his inquiry come to the conclusion that Mr. Nissanka de Silva had gone to the counter armed with the keys of Mr. Amarasekera with the intention of theft and that his attempt was unfortunately foiled by the cleaners. His reasons for arriving at this conclusion are first because Mr. Nissanka de Silva saw him at the G. O. H. on the day of the incident and told him that Mr. Amarasekera and he were playing "hide and seek" after they returned from the feed, but changed this story at the inquiry by saying that his presence behind the counter was in pursuance of a prank. Secondly, Mr. Ediriweera argues that Mr. Nissanka de Silva had selected the precise time at which the watcher had gone to the lavatory, to enter the hotel.

It is in evidence that the watcher first went to the lavatory in the clerks staff quarters and finding it closed, he went to the one near the engine room. He had seen Mr. Nissanka de Silva standing in the verandah and it is presumed that Mr. Nissanka de Silva could have seen the watcher. There was a third suspicious circumstance which had influenced Mr. Ediriweera's thinking and that was the fact that Mr. Nissanka de Silva had not thought of playing a further prank on Mr. Amarasekera till he passed the cashier's counter on his way to the pantry and even after jumping over the counter, he was not sure what form it was to take. Once behind the counter, he saw the waste paper basket and thought of hanging it on the door latch so that it might fall on Mr. Amara-sekera as he opened the door of the counter. He had not realized that when Mr. Amarasekera opened the door from the normal entrance in the grill room end, the basket would not fall on Mr. Amarasekera. Then, again, when Mr. Nissanka de Silva was discovered by the watcher, the cleaner and Mr. Felix de Silva, he did not tell them, "look here I am only playing a prank on Mr. Amarasekera, don't you go and tell him that I was here ", which Mr. Ediriweera considers would have been the natural thing to say.

I have given my most anxious consideration to the facts of this case and the circumstances involved which have given rise to the suspicion in the mind of Mr. Ediriweera and I consider that there is one significant link in the whole chain of incidents which is missing and without which, I am of opinion, it is not possible to conclude that Mr. Nissanka de Silva's presence behind the cashier's counter was clearly for a dishonest purpose. The fact in itself, that Mr. de Silva was found behind the cashier's counter at an

unusual hour does not constitute any fault on his part or any breach of the management's regulations. The question which comes up for decision is whether his presence behind that counter was with a dishonest intention. Intentions are very difficult to prove. Mr. Nissanka de S lva's position is that he was engaged in playing a prank on Mr. Amarasekera. They had been out together till about 5 a.m. in the -morning, and seem to have been in a gay and playful mood. Both of them were room-mates and knew each other intimately. Mr. Nissanka de Silva stated that he placed the broom stick and a shoe near Mr. Amarasekera on his bed and hid the other shoe somewhere close to the bathroom. If the other shoe was hidden elsewhere which is uncontradicted testimony, it is difficult to believe that Mr. Nissanka de Silva's intention in placing the broom stick and shoe on ·Mr. Amarasekera's bed was to see whether he was sufficiently asleep to remove the keys from under the pillow. A point was made of the time which Mr. Nissanka de Silva selected to enter the hotel. It was stated that he chose precisely the time at which the watcher went to the lavatory. Here again, it is only a presumption that Mr. Nissanka de Silva must have seen the watcher going out to the lavatory. In any event, the precise times at which various incidents happened are not clear. If Mr. Nissanka de Silva and Mr. Amarasekera returned to their quarters at 5.10 a.m. and thereafter Mr. Nissanka de Silva lay in his bed till Mr. Amarasekera went off to sleep and Mr. Nissanka de Silva completed his first prank of putting a shoe and broom stick by his side and hiding the other shoe elsewhere, these things must have taken some little time and probably, thereafter, there was not much time left for Mr. Nissanka de silva to carry out his dishonest design well before 6 a.m. when the hotel is alive and busy. Then again, the incident of the waste paper basket appears to me to be a silly, irrational joke. I could not help feeling, after I listened to Mr. Nissanka de Silva's evidence that he is one of those individuals whose mental make-up is such that he relishes meaningless and irrational pranks. All these incidents, however, will have meaning and significance, if Mr. Nissanka de Silva was found to be carrying the keys of the cash box or the safe-which were in the custody of Mr. Amarasekera. In fact, even if the other circumstances were not known, and the only evidence was that Mr. Nissanka de Silva was found near the cashier's counter with the keys of the cash box or safe at that hour in the morning, I would have had no hesitation in concluding that Mr. Nissanka dé Silva's intention was clearly a dishonest one. In this case, neither Mr. Felix de Silva nor the watcher nor the cleaners discovered the keys of the safe or the cash box in his possession. When Mr. Felix de Silva went up to Mr. Amaraşekera, who was still sleeping in his room and asked him to verify whether the keys were safe, Mr. Amarasekera lifted his pillow and found them there. Mr. l'elix de Silva says in his evidence, that when he asked Mr. Amarasekera whether he had the safe keys with him, Mr. Amarasekera did not take it seriously. When he told him further, that Mr. Nissanka de Silva was found under the counter, Mr. Amarasekera took it as a joke. Mr. Felix de Silva goes further and says in his evidence that when he spoke to Mr. Amarasekera, Mr. Amarasekera thought that he was also playing the fool. All this shows the mood in which Mr. Amarasekera and Mr. Nissanka de Silva went to bed. Apparently there had been some fooling on the part of Mr. Nissanka de Silva before Mr. Amarasekera went to bed or that it was a customary trait of Mr. Nissanka de Silva's which Mr. Amarasekera, as his room-mate was well aware of, so much so that when Mr. Felix de Silva came to him with the report that Mr. Nissanka de Silva was found under the cashier's counter, he not only did not take it seriously, but thought that Mr. Felix de Silva was also playing the took.

I consider that in all the circumstances of this case, and in accordance with accepted tenets of justice, it will be unfair to come to the conclusion that Mr. Nissanka de Silva's intention was clearly a dishonest one. I therefore recommend that he be re-instated.

The next question which arises for decision is whether Mr. Nissanka de Silva should be paid his salary from the date of his discontinuance up to the date of his re-instatement.

The Managing Director of the Ceylon Hotels Ltd. had, by his letter dated 14th March, 1958, addressed to the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, expressed his willingness to submit the dispute which had arisen over the discontinuance of Mr. Nissanka de Silva to me by arbitration. The inquiry into this case had for reasons beyond my control and due to the fact that I was out of the island, to be postponed till up to 11th of October. I feel this should not affect the position of the management which was prepared as early as 14th March, 1958, to have the dispute settled by arbitration.

I recommend therefore, that Mr. Nissanka de Silva should be paid wages from the time of his discontinuance only up to 14th March, 1958.

REFERENCE UNDER THE FISHERIES ORDINANCE

No. GE/1618. December 1, 1958.

SIR.

IN terms of section 18A (1) of the Fisheries Ordinance, No. 24 of 1940, as amended by the Fisheries (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 25 and 30 of 1952 and 1956 respectively, I refer to you a dispute that has arisen between the local fishermen of Ambalangoda and the local fishermen of Hikkaduwa and Dodanduwa area on the one hand and the migrant fishermen from Gandara, Dondra, Kudawella, Mirissa, Kottegoda and other adjoining villages on the other with regard to their respective fishing rights, in the waters adjoining the Ambalangoda Urban Council limits, Madampe Village Committee limits and the Hikkaduwa-Dodanduwa Town Council limits, for public inquiry and report.

2. The subject matter of the dispute is as follows:

The local fishermen of Hikkaduwa-Dodanduwa claim the exclusive right of fishing in the waters adjoining the Hikkaduwa-Dodanduwa Town Council limits. The local fishermen of Ambalangoda claim the exclusive right of fishing in the waters adjoining the Ambalangoda Urban Council limits and the Madampe Village Committee limits. Both these groups of local fishermen request that migrant and non-resident fishermen be prevented by regulation from migrating to their beaches and from exploiting these waters by any mode of fishing.

3. Since all matters in disputé may not have been specified in the representations already made, I request you to inquire into any matters incidental or related to the dispute as outlined above and to make your report on all such matters.

The accounts of the Fund shall be audited by the same auditor as provided in Section 45 of the Agricultural and Industrial Credit Corporation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1943, and shall mutatis mutandis be published as provided in Section 49 of the aforesaid Ordinance.
 - (ii) The General Manager shall cause the books of the Fund to be balanced on the thirtieth day of September in each year and shall, as soon as may be thereafter, cause to be prepared a statement of the income and expenditure and a balance sheet containing a summary of assets and liabilities of the Fund made up to the date aforesaid. The statement so prepared shall be signed by the trustees and shall be forwarded to the auditor mentioned in the preceding paragraph".

 - "19. Life Insurance—(i) A member effecting one or more policies of insurance on his own life with any insurance company approved by the Board of Trustees may at any time whilst such a policy remains in force, request the Board of Trustees to pay the premium payable in respect of each such policy out of the contributions made to his account in the Fund provided the aggregate amount of premium payable shall not exceed seventy-five per centum of the total annual contributions made to his account in the Fund.
 - (ii) Every policy of insurance effected in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph shall be assigned to the Corporation by every such member in order to conserve to the Corporation its rights under rule 12.
 - (ii) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of rule 7 interest on contributions to the account of every member who has effected an insurance policy in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this rule shall be computed only on the net amount lying to his credit in the Fund after deduction of the premium payable on each such policy of insurance".

Rule 20 .
