GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishments (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made

or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular N. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

in the above scale. If an officer with lower qualifications is selected the salary payable will be settled in consultation with the Treasury. Salary payable to a pensioner, if selected, will be determined by the Treasury.

The selected candidate may, after consultation with the Treasury, be placed at a point in the scale appropriate to his age, qualifications and experience.

Posts of Chief Storekeeper, Storekeepers and Assistant Storekeepers

Posts of Soil Conservation Aides

APPLICATIONS are invited for vacancies in the Grade of Soil Conservation Aides in the Department of Agriculture. Those applicants who were interviewed on 12th November, 1958, and 13th November, 1958, need not apply.

- (b) the successful bidder who becomes a tenant shall at all times maintain the building rented out to him in good repair at his expense, pay all rates and taxes and erect and keep in good repair a substantial fence or boundary wall around the tenanted premises ;
- (c) the successful bidder who becomes the tenant shall at the termination of his tenancy surrender the tenanted premises to the Commissioner for National Housing, together with all buildings erected thereon and all additions, improvements and fixtures in good repair and condition and shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the said buildings, additions, improvements and fixtures on any account whatsoever ;
- (d) rents will be revised, if necessary, every five years.

Rent-Purchase Houses for the Middle Income Groups

APPLICATIONS are invited from citizens of Ceylon who have a monthly income of not less than the amounts stated against each type of house available, for houses that have been constructed and are available at Aruppola in Kandy. There are 4 houses of Type 3B and 6 of Type 3A.

Description of Houses.—The houses are situated at Aruppola, Kandy, within the Kandy Municipal limits.

The 3A houses have two bedrooms and cover an area of 763 square feet. Income qualification minimum Rs. 300 per mensem.

The 3B houses have two bedrooms with an additional store room and back verandah and larger dining and sitting room and cover an area of 1,015 square feet. Income qualification minimum Rs. 350 per mensem.

2. These houses are constructed on extents of land varying between 17 and 26 perches and will be provided with electricity. Until a permanent pipe-borne water supply is provided, a temporary water service will be made available. Drainage has been installed and could be immediately utilized.

3. The immediate amount of initial deposit required from the applicants would be one month's rent and Rs. 200 in the case of 3A houses, and one month's rent and Rs. 300 in the case of 3B houses. There is no objection to applicants making a larger deposit than this. The applicants should state in the application forms the amount of deposit that they would be prepared to make.

4. The houses will be made available to applicants on terms of rent purchase and the approximate amounts that applicants would be required to pay monthly would be—

- (i) in respect of 3A houses Rs. 90 per mensem ;
(ii) 3B Rs. 125 per mensem.

5. Applicants who are resident or employed within the Kandy Municipal limits will be given preference.

6. Applicants will be required to perform the maintenance and repairs to these houses, insuring them against fire and pay any rates required by local authorities and enter into an agreement with the Commissioner with regard to the terms under which they would be permitted to obtain these houses on rent-purchase.

7. The selection of occupants will be made by the Commissioner for National Housing. Any attempt at canvassing will disqualify the applicants.

8. Applications should be made on forms obtainable at the Department of National Housing, Colombo, to reach the Commissioner for National Housing, on or before 4.30 p.m. on December 19, 1958.
