GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS
IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE
“CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. *New Entrant Officers.*—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made

or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of subparagraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular N. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other Requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release

the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

Training of a Dental Sister Tutor and Dental Surgeon in the Teaching of Dental Nurses in New Zealand under the C'Plan

APPLICATIONS are invited from (i) Tutor Sisters, Dental Nurses Training School, and (ii) Dental Surgeons of this Department who are interested in teaching the basic sciences as well as dental subjects to Dental Nurses in training for the award of fellowships under the Colombo Plan for a period of 6 months for undergoing a course of training in the Teaching of Dental Nurses at the School for Dental Nurses, New Zealand.

2. The conditions of eligibility are as follows :—

- (i) (a) Tutor Sister, Dental Nurses Training School.
- (b) should have a minimum of 1½ years' experience in the teaching of Dental Nurses at the Dental Nurses Training School, Maharagama.
- (c) should be under 35 years of age on the closing date of applications.
- (d) should be a Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" means a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration.
- (ii) (a) Dental Surgeons under 45 years of age on closing date of applications.

- (b) should possess the minimum qualification of L. D. S. (Ceylon or any approved British University.)
- (c) should have three years' service as a Dental Surgeon on the closing date of applications.
- (d) should be a Ceylonese. "Ceylonese" means a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration.

Note.—Experience in teaching will be an added qualification.

3. A high standard of both mental and physical fitness is necessary. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination by a Board of Government Medical Officers as to their mental and physical fitness.

4. The selected candidates will be required to—

- (a) enter into agreements with the Government of Ceylon undertaking, among other things, to follow the prescribed courses and complete satisfactorily their courses of studies and to serve the Government for specified periods (to be decided by Government) on the satisfactory completion of their courses of studies.
- (b) enter into personal bonds undertaking to refund to the Government of Ceylon the full cost of training (i.e., salary, allowances, cost of passages, &c., paid on account of the course of training from Ceylon Government funds and/or the Awarding Agency), in the event of their failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the agreement.

5. The award of the fellowship includes cost of travel to and from country of study, cost of internal travel in New Zealand, and a maintenance grant as may be decided by the Government of New Zealand.

6. Study leave on full pay will be granted. However no rent or separation allowance is payable.

7. The proposed training will not entitle the selected candidates for enhanced emoluments or promotion to the higher grade.

EXAMINATION FOR INTERPRETERS, 1959

Date of Examination :

An examination for officers of the General Clerical Service, officers of the Government District Clerical Service and officers of the Quasi-Clerical Service, who wish to qualify for appointment as Interpreters in Courts, will be held in Colombo by the Commissioner of Examinations, commencing on February 14, 1959.

Eligibility :

2. Officers of the General Clerical Service holding appointments as Interpreters in Courts, officers in Grade II of the Executive Clerical Class and in the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service, officers of the Government District Clerical Service and officers of the Quasi-Clerical Service under the control of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury will be eligible to take this examination.

Note.—District Clerks who are successful in this examination will be liable to serve as Interpreters in Courts in any part of Ceylon, irrespective of the Administrative Districts for which they have been recruited for service.

Applications :

3. Forms of application for admission to the examination may be obtained from the Department of Examinations, Malay Street, Colombo 2, from December 1st to December 20, 1958.

4. Each candidate must forward by Registered Post his completed application form through the Head of his Department to reach the Commissioner of Examinations, Colombo 2, on or before December 22, 1958. The name of the examination should be given on the left-hand top corner of the cover enclosing the form.

Leave, Batta and Travelling Expenses.

5. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been accepted by the Commissioner of Examinations, leave as on duty to present themselves at the examination.

6. Batta and travelling expenses will be paid to outstation candidates who obtain the following minimum marks at the examination :—

30 per cent. of the aggregate marks in Tamil Language.

Scheme of Examination :

7. The subjects of the examination and their syllabuses will be as follows :—

Subject A—English Language : (A paper of two hours' duration).

Questions will be set to test the candidates'—

- (a) power of expression ;
- (b) comprehension of passages of average difficulty (selected from newspapers, official publications, or books by modern authors) ; and
- (c) knowledge of the idiom and vocabulary of the language.

Subject B—Sinhala Language :

There will be two written papers and an oral test.

- (a) Sinhala Language I (translation from Sinhala to English—one and a half hours' duration).

Candidates will be required to translate into English—

- (i) an extract from a newspaper or modern prose book ;
- (ii) a letter, petition, deed or report of average difficulty.

Questions will also be set to test the candidate's ability to translate idiomatic expressions into correct idiomatic English. The passages for translation will be given in manuscript form.

- (b) Sinhala Language II (translation from English to Sinhala—one and a half hours' duration).

Candidates will be required to translate one or more of the following :—A judgment in a Magistrate's Court or District Court case ; an extract from an Ordinance, By-law, *Gazette* Notification, Hansard or other Government publication.

Candidates will also be required to translate English idiomatic phrases.

- (c) Oral Test : The following will receive attention :—Translation of ordinary technical terms in current use ; facility of expression in Sinhala ; pronunciation and knowledge of idiomatic phrases in Sinhala and in English.

Candidates will be expected to dictate *ex tempore* the translation of an English letter, report or other official paper put into their hands for the first time.

Subject C—Tamil Language :

There will be two written papers and an oral test.

- (a) Tamil Language I (Translation from Tamil to English—one and a half hours' duration) ;
- (b) Tamil Language II (Translation from English to Tamil—one and a half hours' duration) ; and
- (c) Oral Test.

The syllabuses in Tamil Language I, Tamil Language II and the Oral Test in Tamil are the same as those in Sinhala Language I, Sinhala Language II and the Oral Test in Sinhala, respectively.

8. To obtain a pass in the examination, a candidate must obtain the following marks :—

- 40 per cent. in English Language.
- 40 per cent. of the aggregate marks in Sinhala Language.
- 40 per cent. of the aggregate marks in Tamil Language.

9. Candidates who pass in *two* of the subjects A, B and C will be permitted to take the third subject again *at the next succeeding examination only*, provided they have obtained 50 per cent. of the aggregate of the marks in each of the two subjects in which they passed.

10. Candidates will be bound by the Rules and Regulations prescribed by the Commissioner of Examinations for the conduct of examinations.

Allowances :

11. An allowance of Rs. 20 per mensem will be paid to officers of the General Clerical Service (other than members of the Special Grade), to officers of the Government District Clerical Service and to officers of the Quasi-Clerical Service controlled by the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, under the following conditions :—

- (i) The officer should be employed as a Court Interpreter. Officers employed as Additional Interpreters are not entitled to the allowance.
- (ii) He should have passed the examination for Interpreters. Officers already employed as Interpreters are not entitled to the allowance till they pass the examination.
- (iii) He should have interpreted the proceedings of the Court to the satisfaction of the Magistrate or Judge during a period of three months. The allowance will not be paid to him during this period. Failure to satisfy the Magistrate or Judge will debar him from entitlement to the allowance even if he had already passed the Interpreters' Examination. Such failure may also result in his transfer to some other post in the General Clerical Service or the Government District Clerical Service or the Quasi-Clerical Service, as the case may be. Where the officer satisfies the Magistrate or Judge, the allowance is payable to him with retrospective effect from the date of passing the Interpreters' Examination or of appointment to the post, whichever is later.

(iv) If an officer who has passed the Interpreters' Examination and drawn the allowance is transferred to some other work, he may, on being re-transferred to an Interpreter's post, be paid the allowance without further examination, provided that his absence from the post of Court Interpreter is less than one year. If such absence is over one year, the officer must again satisfy the Magistrate or Judge in regard to his proficiency in terms of (iii) above, before he becomes eligible for the allowance.
