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


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## Special Pooja, *Rathana Sutta* recital to bless Indians

## **Two more COVID wards** at Karapitiya Hospital

Two more wards have been allocated for COVID-19 patients as at May 1 as Ward No. 36 of the Galle Karapitiya Teaching Hospital is filled to capacity, the Acting Director of the Karapitiya Teaching Hospital, Consultant Dr. K.H.G Jivaratne said.

"By last Saturday night, 55 COVID patients were reported from Ward 36 of the hospital. In consideration of the situation, as a temporary measure, wards 46 and 25 of the Karapitiya Hospital were booked for COVID patients. Moreover, the Akmeemana Maliban Hospital will be used to treat COVID patients," the Acting Hospital Director said. In fact, some stumbling blocks have been caused as more COVID-19 patients are being reported daily. Measures have been taken to reserve two wards at the Karapitiya Hospital and Maliban Hospital in Akmeemana for COVID patients to reduce congestion. The Akmeemana Maliban Hospital can accommodate 50 beds.

"In addition, the main Intensive Care Units of the Karapitiya Teaching Hospital with seven beds has been allocated for the critically ill COVID-19 patients. The separate wards had to be reserved for patients at the Karapitiya Hospital as the Quarantine Centres of the province were filled to capacity," Dr.Jivaratne said.

## Introduction of Korean Language to A/Level curriculum

## Ambassador praises Sri Lankan Govt's decision

Korean Ambassador to Sri Lanka Santhush Woonjin Jeong expressed his pleasure regarding the Sri Lankan Government's decision to officially adopt the Korean language as a foreign language for the Advanced Level curriculum from this year onwards.

"This has paved the way for the expansion of Korean language education in Sri Lankan schools. By this decision, students entering the 12th Grade of national schools can choose the Korean language as a foreign language this year and in 2023 they will be able to sit for the Advanced Level examination in the Korean language to enter the universities in Sri Lanka," Ambassador Santhush said.

"It is wonderful that the Korean language was adopted in the advanced level classes this year and can be adopted in the examination in 2023, when students who have learned Korean as a foreign language will sit for the university entrance examinations," he

Ambassador Santhush Woonjin Jeong expressed these views during discussions with Education Minister Prof. G.L. Peiris.

The Ambassador was of the view that this decision will contribute to the promotion of our bilateral ties. The Korean Embassy will extend its

fullest support by coordinating online capacity building programmes for teachers of Korean Language in Sri Lanka with the National Institute of Education to ensure a strong foundation for Korean languageeducation".

The Ambassador elaborated that learning the Korean language would open the window to many job opportunities in Korea. The Korean Government policy of "equal pay for equal work" has further elevated the engagement in labour cooperation in recent

About 23,000 Sri Lankan employees are presently in Korea. Around 520 million US dollars were remitted by them from Korea to Sri Lanka in 2019. The migrant workers bridge both countries in more ways than one, as they continue to contribute to the economic advancement of both Korea and Sri Lanka.

The discusiins between Ambassador Santhush Woonjin Jeong and Education Minister Prof. G.L. Peiris centred around the close cooperation with the National Institute of Education and National Education Commission on how to promote Korean language education in Sri Lanka. Based on these fruitful commitments, the Education Ministry and the Education Institutes have been very cooperative and instrumental in the decision to adopt Korean as a foreign language for the advanced level classes from this

Currently, Korean language is taught as a foreign language for secondary classes up to ordinary level examina-

Sri Lankan students have rapidly grown interest in Korean culture including K-pop music, K-dramas and K-movies, and it led to a growing desire to learn the Korean language. It is noteworthy that the Korean language learning in a classroom has exposed the students to a variety of other parts of Korean studies, including politics, trade, history, and more.

Until last year, however, Korean Language was not offered as a foreign language option for Advanced Level classes, so students had to take a two year break after ordinary level studies in learning Korean, even though they wished to pursue Korean Language studies in the Uni-

## **Unawatuna hotel employees** test positive for COVID-19

Habaraduwa Medical Officer of Health (MOH) Dr. Pramoda Siriwardana instructed the management of the newly opened hotel in Unawatuna to temporarily shut down for 14 days after 22 employees were confirmed to be COVID-

19 infected. "Initially, seven employees of the resort hotel were detected with Corona and were hospitalized. Subsequently, 15 more employees tested positive after undergoing PCR tests. Over 150 employees of the same hotel are under quarantine, the Dr. Siriwardana said.

"Meanwhile, 16 out of the 200 garment factory employees of the Koggala Free Trade Zone (FTZ) who underwent PCR tests tested positive for COVID-19, Dr. Siriwardana added.

The Mahaweli Development Authority was given further time to present its report including a plan pertaining to the land area cleared for cultivation.

On a previous occasion, the Attorney General informed Court that the concerned lands allocated for cultivation belonged to the Mahaweli Development Authority.

However, the sixth respondent, RAN Plantations (Pvt) Ltd had told Court that the Company utilised abandoned lands which were earlier used for Chena cultivation.

Uruwarige Wannila Aththo and the Centre for Environmental Justice filed this petition seeking an interim order staying the validity of approvals granted to Mahaweli Authority for the proposed Agriculture, Livestock Development Project. The petitioners are further seeking an order to halt the clearing of the lands at Pollebedda-Rambakan Oya, one of the traditional homelands of indigenous popula-

Filing this petition through counsel Ravindranath Dabare, the petitioners have named Central Environmental Authority, Mahaweli Development Authority, Department of Forests, Department of Wild Life Conservation, Minister of Wildlife and Forest Conservation, RAN Plantations (Pvt) Ltd and several others as respondents.

The petitioners are also seeking an order in the nature of a Writ of Mandamus directing Central Environmental Authority to take actions in terms of the National Environmental Act for the illegal clearing of the lands without conducting an Environmental Assessment.

Petitioners state that Pollebedda is a remote village in the dry zone

situated at Mahaoya and is found on the way to Rambakan Oya Reservoir. Pollebedda is one of the traditional homelands of indigenous population known as Veddhas of Sri Lanka.

The petitioners said that deforestation and development have greatly contributed to the shrinking of their traditional lands. This has caused a progressive decline in their number, and the community is at risk of losing its ancient traditions, which have been handed down from generation to genera-

Petitioners state that an area of approximately 500 ha had already been cleared for the Proposed Agricultural and Livestock Development Project at Pollebedda-Rambakan Oya according to the site inspection carried out by the petitioners.

The petitioner states the Central Environmental Authority is the apex body for the protection of the Environment in Sri Lanka and they have failed in their statutory duties to take cognizance of the clearing taking place in the said area and had permitted to proceed with the proposed project without an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) instead of taking action against the relevant parties for clearing amounting to 500 acres of forest cover in a water catchment area without obtaining the approval in terms of the National Environmental Act.

Counsel Ravindranath Dabare appeared for the petitioner. Additional Solicitor General Parinda Ranasinghe PC appeared for the Attorney General. Counsel Pulasthi Rupasinghe appeared for RAN Plantations (Pvt) Ltd.

The relevant inspection was carried out by the National Post Harvest Management Institute (Rice

Processing Centre) in Anuradhapura at a cost of Rs. 5.35 million during the tenure of the previous Government.

According to the audit report conducted on 31st December 2018, it has been confirmed that a number of irregularities, corruption and frauds have taken place

and it has been revealed that the Auditor General's Department has also submitted a report to the Parliamentary Accounts Committee.

"This report is based on the results of the Food Standards Test during the previous Government, but they did not disclose the toxins contained in seven foods.

Although the results were obtained after that test, the previous Government did not take any action in this regard.

He also added that the present Government won the election with the slogan 'system change" yet none is prevalent. "The farmers are struggling to sell their harvest as well as facing difficulties with obtaining fertilizer.

Currently, the Dambulla Economic Centre is closed for 14 days, yet we suspect whether it will be reopened after 14 days due to the rising COVID-19 situation. The farmers are vulnerable. They do not even reap the harvest, instead letting the harvest ripe on the trees itself," he said.

He also added that closing the Dambulla Economic Centre is

acceptable, but the Government should set up a method for farmers to trade their harvest. "During the last COVID-19 waves too the Dambulla Economic Centre was closed.

If the Government had a proper vision with mechanisms to face the situation, they should have prior plans to face this situation as this did not occur for the first time," he added Moreover, he said that the lack

of fertilizer in the market has put the farmers in difficulty.

"The Government pledged to provide fertilizer free of charge. Anyhow the Government cannot even buy fertilizer," he said.

In a press release issued on April 29, the Commission pointed out that the ban on Burga would (a) violate the Muslim women's freedom to manifest their religion (ICCPR Art. 18(1); and exercise their choice for identity as guaranteed under (ICCPR: Art. 17(1); (b) expose them to religious discrimination (ICCPR: Art. 2(1), Art. 26); and (c) violate the rights of its minorities 'to enjoy their own culture, and to profess and practice their own religion' (ICCPR Art. 27). Such discriminatory measures will also cement negative stereotypes against Muslim women, disproportionately restrict their freedom to manifest their religion, cause intersectional discrimination and greater marginalization as well as stoke undue hostility/physical violence because of their clothing, it added.

The Commission indicated that such majoritarian rhetoric and discriminatory measures are contrary to the ideals of pluralism, counterproductive to societal cohesion and clear manifestations of Islamophobia. It, accordingly, urged the Sri Lankan Government to fulfill its international human rights obligations by ensuring to protect the rights of its Muslim minority to practice their religion, free from any coercion or discrimination. The Commission also urged the (a) Sri Lankan Muslim community and human rights organizations to exhaust all available domestic remedies including domestic courts for the redress of grievances and repeal of discriminatory laws; and (b) international community to engage with Sri Lankan authorities to seek redress for the aggrieved minority including by punishing those found guilty as per international human rights law.

## River Conservation Zones to be designated

## - Environment Minister Amaraweera

Environment Minister Mahinda Amaraweera has instructed that River Conservation Zones be designated for all rivers under the Surakimu Ganga Programme implemented by the Environment Ministry.

Minister Amaraweera stated that steps will be taken to remove those people encroaching on lands along the river

"No constructions or cultivations will be allowed up to at least 150 metres from a river," he said.

He said that steps will also be taken to relocate people living along the river basins to other locations.

"If not, the entire river system, which is the basic drainage pattern of our country, is in danger of being destroyed in a

few years due to the misuse of river water," the Minister said.

There are 103 rivers in the river system in Sri Lanka. The majority of this river system originates in the central highlands and the rest originate from various sources. But so far no river conservation zones have been designated to protect the river system in our country.

The Central Environmental Authority (CEA) has collected more information on all river basins in the country, indicating that various individuals are engaged in illegal activities to destroy river conservation lands.



Activities in this regard have been videotaped and the Central Environmental Authority has observed that there are more than 10,700 destructive places in rivers alone.

It has also been confirmed that no river has been designated as a River Conservation Zone so far and various individuals have been occupying lands

close to the river for housing, business premises and cultivation. It was revealed that the chances of the banks breaking and damaging public lives as well as property are increasing.

The Minister has instructed the Cen-

tral Environmental Authority to pay close attention to this situation.

It has been decided to commence a programme to designate River Protected Zones immediately.

The size of river basins in our country is between 10 to 10,000 square KMs. In addition to this river system, our country also has a large spring system. One thousand five hundred and forty four water sources have been identified in the Nuwara Eliya District, 204 in the Kandy District, 19 in the Kurunegala District, 210 in the Moneragala District and two in the Matale District. The Minister of Environment said that these protected areas also need to be designated to protect these water sources

## **EU funded STRIDE** programme holds first **National Steering Committee**





The European Union (EU) and the State Ministry of Provincial Councils and Local Government Affairs co-chaired the first National Steering Committee for the Strengthening Transformation, Reconciliation and Inclusive Democratic Engagement (STRIDE) programme recently.

STRIDE is a multi-stakeholder initiative worth over 9 billion rupees, funded by the EU to promote dialogue between communities and local governments by improving access and quality of services at local level. The activities are implemented by the World Bank (WB), United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the British Council together with The Asia Foundation (TAF) in partnership with the State Ministry of Provincial Councils and Local Government Affairs as well as the Ministry of Justice.

Under the STRIDE umbrella, the World Bank provides small grants to local authorities, UNDP provides capacity building, and the British Council together with TAF promotes mediation as an alternative dispute resolution mechanism at the community level.

Speaking at the Steering Committee meeting, Frank Hess, Head of Development Cooperation at the EU Delegation to Sri Lanka and the Maldives said "In the EU, we believe that good governance and community participation in the planning and decision-making processes will contribute to everybody's benefit. Local authorities should engage with people, mobilise and listen to their opinions and act as catalyst for change in every community, and in this programme we are seeing this happening. Therefore, I am glad that the EU is funding this programme with 40 million euros (over 9 billion rupees).'

Commenting on the STRIDE Steering Committee S.D.A.D. Boralessa, Secretary, State Ministry of Provincial Councils and Local Government Affairs, noted "It is a great honour to Co-Chair the National Steering Committee for the STRIDE programme which is aiming to improve the access and quality of Local Government services in 134 Local Authorities in Northern, Eastern, North Central and Uva Provinces in Sri Lanka.

This Steering Committee will definitely enhance the results for assistance made by European Union and the World Bank and also minimize the bottlenecks at the implementation. I believe that the valuable guidance by the steering committee will generate more benefits to the people in the country.

Speaking on UNDP's role, UNDP Project Manager in Sri Lanka Navaneethan Vijayakumar said "It is a pleasure to see stakeholders with diverse backgrounds coming together to provide important feedback to improve the implementing partners' efforts and maximize the finite resources available. We are confident that with the guidance of the Steering Committee, we can work towards reaching our project goals that will in turn bring local authorities to the forefront in the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)."

An important part of the programme and its National Steering Committee is to listen to voices from local authorities at national, provincial, district and local levels. Executive Director of Women in Need (WIN) Savithri Wijesekara, a member of the Committee noted that "the programme initiated at the Local Government level has to be inclusive, responsive and accountable and build institutional capacity to provide good and effective service delivery to benefit cross communities of people.

The inclusivity and engagement of the local government with civil society, the poor and the marginalized in development plans will strengthen and help in reconciliation, gender responsiveness and local needs."

Asoka Gunawardana, Chairman, Marga Institute, fellow member of the Steering Committee sharing his thoughts stated that "bringing together government and civil society representatives at the Steering Committee is a valuable chance to exchange views and share experiences".

The STRIDE programme is expected to run until 2023 and to benefit approximately one million Sri Lankans under over 100 Local Government authorities in the Northern, Eastern, Uva and North Central Provinces.



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
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# JUSTICE all what they want now

he arrest of the two media personnel operating the Tube Tamil YouTube channel and Facebook page has left their families in disarray. While diaspora groups exploit the youth in the North to promote the LTTE ideologies, in many instances, these vulnerable youngsters fall prey to their sinister plots. It has also been found that many diaspora groups identify avenues where they can donate funds for either building of homes for the needy or other community programmes, but sneakily encourage these vulnerable youngsters to promote the LTTE.

However, in this instance, pro-LTTE material had been posted on the Tube Tamil website which was hacked, according to Tube Tamil channel owner, Ravishankar Sugathevan. In an exclusive telephone interview from Denmark with the *Daily News*, he said that the Tube Tamil web domain had been hacked and taken over by a person from Tamil Nadu, India.

"We have made several complaints regarding this and currently, we only operate the YouTube channel and the Facebook page. I have been living in Denmark for over 25 years and I started this website around 14 years ago. My website Tube Tamil.com was hacked and taken over by someone from Tamil Nadu, India. This person contacted me and demanded Rs. one crore (Indian currency) (approximately US\$ 140,095) to give it back. During this period he has misused my website and posted all pro-LTTE material. But, this website is not under my control," he explained.

Ravishankar claims that he has nothing to do with the LTTE and in fact, is against them as they had targeted him as well. He had also written a book which is against the LTTE. However, he extended an apology for any issues that have arisen as a result of pro-LTTE material that has been posted on his website, for which he has no control over. On the contrary, unlike the Tamil politicians who try to use the plight of the Tamil people and try to gain their support by promoting the separatist ideologies, Ravishankar has been engaged in promoting racial harmony among all people of this country.

He said his news channel translates news from international channels such as BBC into Tamil and publishes them for the benefit of Tamils overseas. Through his Tube Tamil channel, he also provides food and other essentials to around 600 needy families on a daily basis. He said that he spends around Rs. 3.5 million on a monthly basis to support and feed these families, with monies donated by people and proceeds of his channel.

"In addition, during the COVID-19 pandemic, my staff worked 16 hours per day to provide food to the low-

income families in the North. I also donated 10 washing machines to hospitals treating Corona patients and these were handed over to Army Commander General Shavendra Silva. A minister from Badulla also contacted me and wanted equipment

for schoolchildren in the area which I obliged. I have also donated school essentials and assisted around 6,000 schoolchildren not only in the North but also in the estate areas. In addition, we are supporting around 340 children monthly with their educational expenses. We have also built houses for low-income families in Jaffna, Vavuniya, Killinochchi and Mannar," he added, emphasizing that he has no intention of promoting or supporting the LTTE.

He noted that in fact, when he had wanted to make a movie during the LTTE period, they had blocked it and refused to allow him any access to invest in Sri Lanka. Hence, he said he

even wrote a book against the LTTE and had no connection with them. The LTTE supporters in Denmark are also trying to influence the Tamil Diaspora community to follow their ideology.

Ravishankar said that he initially started this channel as a hobby and when he realised he would be able to support many needy communities through this venture, he had expanded its operations. He said that even for the opening of the Tube Tamil office in Jaffna, a Denmark Minister had accompanied him to Sri Lanka to participate in the ceremony. He said that his sole aim is to use his connections

and privileges in order to help those in need in his home country. However, despite not being responsible for the material published on his hacked website, he extended his apologies to the authorities and people of Sri Lanka for the issue that has Ravishankar



Appealing to the authorities, Divania's father said, "My daughter got involved in this mess not out of her fault. But I appeal to the authorities to please consider the plight of my granddaughter Aarani and please release her from detention. This is a mistake and my daughter had no involvement in any LTTE activities. The LTTE did nothing for the people but only created misery for the people. Divania's only intention was to serve the people due to her ambition to get involved in politics like her mother. I apologize to the authorities and to anyone concerned if any misunderstanding had taken place, but I assure everyone that my daughter had no LTTE affiliation nor did she believe in any LTTE ideology. Vimalraj was the breadwinner of their family and his wife is unemployed making it very difficult for them to survive. Vimalraj too has no connection with the LTTE and has been engaged in broadcasting social issues and facilitating community activities through the channel ensuring that monies sent by members of the Tamil Diaspora for the needy are channelled to the right projects.

As for Vimalraj's son, his mother says that the five-year-old child does not eat properly and cries for his father especially at bedtime.

Meanwhile, moved by the plight of Divania's autistic daughter Public Security Minister Rear Admiral Dr. Sarath Weerasekara had made arrangements for Divania to see her daughter and pacify the child. Through his mediation, permission was granted for the two detainees to see their children for a few minutes. It is commendable that even under the current situation, the law enforcement officials had shown com-

passion and allowed these children to see their parents.

## **More COVID treatment centres for SP**

The mbracing the unpredictability of life was a lesson Lakshitha De Zoysa learned quite unexpectedly. ✓ Had he been told he would leave his successful IT career in the US to camp out in Lunugamvehera and grow crops while elephants walked past his tent, he would probably have laughed.

But a desire to return home resulted in the impossible. Having realized the potential in agriculture, Lakshitha purchased land to start his own farm. At first, he camped out among his crops sacrificing the comforts of city life, away from his family. Lakshitha knew he had to work exceptionally hard to succeed.

"When I was selling my first harvest of watermelons I was offered Rs. 12 per Kg even though they were sold at Rs. 60 in the market!"

Frustrated at the little to no profit, he loaded the fruits into his trucks and transported them to Colombo where he sold them at 3 am for Rs. 40. This experience marked a turning point for Lakshitha.

"I realised that farmers faced such severe financial losses because middlemen were retaining most of the profit."

He began actively studying the life of farmers to better understand their financial troubles and formulate a solution an out-grower model.

"I wanted to help them forego middlemen and earn close to the retail prices." Initially partnering with 4 farmers, Lakshitha rapidly expanded his outgrower network to over 200 farmers. Next he created DZ's Fresh Box - a farm-to-doorstep delivery service on WhatsApp, where his customers could pay for the fresh produce via #HNBSOLO. Lakshitha has continued to grow his business while empowering and uplifting the farming communities he works with.



## **DR. NEVILLE FERNANDO**

## Man of unblemished integrity

"In the end, it's not the years in your life that counts, it's the life in your years.

- Abraham Lincoln.

It is with gratitude that I write these few lines in remembrance of our loving leader Dr.. Neville Fernando. He passed away on the February 4, one month short of his 90th birthday, but left a rich legacy of positive experience with all those who came to know him.

My association with Dr. Neville Fernando goes back to 2003, when he invited me to join the Asha Central Hospital at Horton Place, Colombo 7. It is he who turned the establishment into a most sought-after private hospital in Colombo.

He devoted his entire time and effort to develop the hospital in to a fully-fledged, multi-specialty private hospital. He was not a mere manager or a team leader to the hundreds of medical and non-medical staff. He was a father figure to all, loved by everyone: from the housekeeping assistant to the operating surgeon.

The staffers were not simply employees of Dr. Neville Fernando, but followers of this great personality. People mostly referred to him as a 'Living God'.

He struggled against unacceptable transgressions of some of the values that his principled mind accepted as inimical: trust and honour of one's word. Greed and duplicity were anathema to him. His humanity extended not only to all the employees of the hospital, but also to all patients who sought medical attention. People liked him for his sincerity and enthusiasm.

Dr. Neville Fernando was generous to the core. His charismatic smile and his ability to attract the people around him made him a truly inspirational leader. Managing a large-scale, multi-specialty hospital was a huge burden on his shoulders, but with the unique management style he had overcame all obstacles.

Silently, carried a heavy cross at every stage of his life. In 2008, Dr. Neville Fernando designed and built The Central Hospital on Norris Canal Road, Colombo 10, creating a benchmark in the private healthcare industry of Sri Lanka. Due to his passion for education and creating higher educational opportunities for younger generations, he embarked on his vision, creating SAITM (the South Asian Institute of Technology and Medicine) in 2009 and the NFTH (Dr. Neville Fernando Teaching Hospital) in 2011, in Malabe, after selling the Central Hospital to the Asiri Group of Hospitals. The Central Hospital was then renamed as the Asiri Central Hospital.

Designing and building SAITM gave Dr. Neville Fernando immense pride. He pumped all his wealth, time, sweat, and effort to this mas-

sive institution. Thousands of students were privileged to study at this great institution, which produced hundreds of doctors, engineers, and IT professionals who serve not only in Sri Lanka, but all over the world. The theme of SAITM, 'Education with Character', clearly reminds us Dr. Neville Fernando's vision.

Designing, building, equipping, staffing, and operating a thousandbedded hospital was no easy task. Dr. Neville Fernando, embarking on a hospital project and creating the Dr. Neville Fernando Teaching Hospital at the age of 80, was unbelievable to many. He never calculated any

returns on investment. This extraordinary and stubbornly-principled man had only one vision: to create a space for private medical education in Sri Lanka. I am eternally grateful to him for selecting me and giving me the opportunity to lead the hospital from its very inception. His advice helped me immensely to improve my knowledge and develop my skills in managing a hospital. He was a stern disciplinarian who taught me the correct way of doing anything.

Dr. Neville Fernando wanted his hospital to be a model and a benchmark in health care. The designing layout of the hospital was second to none. The materials which were used for construction and furnishing were the best in the industry.

He never believed in shortcuts, but instead guided me and my team to do the correct thing at all times. The medical equipment which were bought were the best of the range and the most technologically-advanced from world-renowned manufacturers.

I still remember the pride he had when he inspected the operating theatre complex and intensive care units, attending to every detail, which were the most modern units in Sri Lanka to match any international standards.

He was so generous to waive the hospital charges of many patients who had financial difficulties, sometimes making the situation difficult for the finance team. Hundreds of

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

## **Expedite battle** against COVID-19

ith large swathes of territory going under lockdown by the hour and medical experts vocal in their assertions that the country needs to be shut down at this critical stage the authorities, indeed, would have to reassess their options if we are not to witness a situation similar to

According to President of the Sri Lanka Medical Officers Association Dr. Padma Gunaratne, the next two weeks are going to be decisive. If the people fail to change their lifestyles, set routines, and ignore the health regulations there is nothing to prevent the scenes in India being replicated here as well. She said the detection of nearly 2,000 patients a day could only be the tip of the iceberg and there could be around 6,000 who were not subjected to PCR testing and going under the radar. Worse, the new strain has even made children who were earlier deemed immune to the virus vulnerable, with young students in many Colombo schools reportedly being infected. Even those who received the first jab too are now in the risk category with between 60 percent to 65 percent susceptible to contracting the virus, according to Chief Epidemiologist Dr. Sudath Samaraweera.

The delay in the arrival of the AstraZeneca vaccine has further complicated matters as it could outlive the gestation period of 12 weeks for those who received the first jab. The new variants too have added another layer of complexity. The Association of Medical Specialists has warned that stocks of Oxygen are likely to be in short supply and asked the authorities to prepare for any contingency. President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has reportedly been updated on the availability of Oxygen supplies with plans also being made to import Oxygen should the need arise.

There is no denying that the situation is grim. For the first time since the outbreak of the virus, the daily number of positive cases has topped the 1,500 mark and deaths too are rising. The authorities are going to great lengths to control the spread of the virus even to the extent of erecting makeshift hospitals and earmarking space for Coronavirus patients in all other hospitals in the country with even the Avurveda Hospitals coming to the rescue.

Unfortunately though little is witnessed by way of cooperation from the public, who, from what we are seeing, has failed to realise the gravity of the situation. Television showed a police team swooping down on a huge party of river bathers while playgrounds are being cleared of crowds participating in sports activities with no regard for restrictions.

Market places and public transport too are being subject to regular raids where many are hauled up for either not wearing face masks or failing to comply with the distance rule. The mass arrest of offenders is apparently having no deterrent effect which should make the law enforcement think of more drastic measures if we are to avoid falling into a dark abyss. Those who may have witnessed TV footage of the scenes in India could not have failed to grasp the reality. Or are the violators of health guidelines unaware of the unfolding situation in our neighbouring

Today the Indian Capital New Delhi is threatened with being completely wiped out with the city turned into a mass funeral house. Does the public here want a similar situation here?

Meanwhile, a fervent appeal has gone to the public and politicians of all hues from Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa to treat the present health catastrophe as a national emergency, calling on all sides to act with a sense of responsibility. He stated that this was not the time to oppose every move made by the Government to combat the Coronavirus, with a view to scoring political points and by not cooperating to tackle the problem, the true intentions of certain political parties are being exposed.

"At this moment some are criticizing certain actions taken by the Government to control the Coronavirus. In a crisis of this proportion it is not the right thing to take political advantage. Instead, all should act exemplarily by putting aside criticisms and helping to control the Coronavirus by placing the country and the people before everything else," the Premier stated.

In a welcome development, Opposition Leader Sajith Premadasa has struck a conciliatory note by hinting at giving politics a moratorium to see off the crisis. In a televised address, the Opposition Leader said they of the Samagi Jana Balavegaya (SJB) have gone into a political truce and are ready to do their utmost to save the lives of the 21 million people of this country. "I urge all political parties to do the same and forget their differences at a time such as this when the country has come to a standstill as a result of the pandemic," he said.

This ought to be the standpoint and spirit of the Opposition at a time the country is in grave peril. Hopefully, the rest of the members of the SJB will be of the same thinking as their leader.

# How do we produce speech sounds and speak?

## LANGUAGE MATTERS

'n the last article, we discussed that specific regions in our brain play crucial roles in language comprehension and production. Broca's area was particularly shown to be responsible for language production while Wernicke's area was shown to be mainly responsible for language comprehension. Arcuate Fasciculus was claimed to play a role in connecting processes between Broca's area and Wernicke's area. However, as we cannot really dig into the brain to identify the functions of different parts of the brain, the exact specific functions of these areas are not fully understood yet. With the advancement of knowledge and technology, it is hoped that we will be able to understand more about the language related roles and functions of these specific areas in our brain. In fact, the brain and its specific regions play crucial roles in transmitting and receiving signals from the human body organs involved in the production and control of speech.

In today's article, we are discussing the roles of specific organs and mechanisms such as the lungs, larynx, the egressive air stream, etc., involved in the production of speech sounds in language.

#### **Sound is the primary** medium for language

It is a well-known fact that the basis of all human languages is sound. From a diachronic perspective, all human natural languages originated as sounds and speech while writing systems developed later in the processes of the evolution of different media of language. From a synchronic perspective, speech is the primary method of communication among human beings today. Many communities with speech but without any writing system exist in the world today. But, we do not find any society where a written form of language exists without a spoken form. Thus, speech is primary, and writing is secondary in the ways of communication among human beings.

At the same time, as we discussed in one of our previous articles, language has duality in structure. Language exists on two different levels of structure. At one level we have sounds as a discrete and closed set of items called **phonemes**. For instance, the English language has only about 40 phonemes. Sinhala also has about 40 phonemes. At the other level, these sounds as phonemes are structured in specific ways to form words. For example, the phonemes (i.e., discrete sound units) such as /t/ /i/ /n/ are combined to form the word tin and my is a succession of three phonemes /m/ /a/ /j/. These words produced with sequences of sounds can in turn be combined to form larger meaningful units such as phrases as my tin and so on.

#### **Production of** speech sounds

Speech production is a complex process which involves several organs in the human body. Primarily, we produce speech manipulating an airflow that originates in the lungs and goes through the mouth by disturbing it at various places with different organs in our mouth, nose and throat. Thus, the air that flows from the nasal and oral cavities is crucial not only for our survival (i.e., breathing) but also for speech production. Accordingly, the following that affect the air stream are vital organs for the sound production processes:

**Lungs** – For its outward flow of air **Larynx** - For the alterations it does to the airstream

**Vocal tract and the tongue** – For alternations they create





Diagram A - Organs involved in the egressive and ingressive air streams.

Specifically, the organs such as Teeth (Upper and lower), Tongue (tip, front and back), Lips, Velum, Uvula, Hard palate and Alveolar ridgeplay some crucial roles in the process of obstructing and modifying the out-flowing airstream to produce speech sound.

The manipulation of air begins

from the lungs. The airstream that originates in the lungs is called a **pul**monic airstream. The flow of this stream of air is supported by the diaphragm that is located below the

chest and rib cage and above the abdomen. Though we are aware of the outgoing stream of air during speech, we must also know that sound can also be produced from ingressive air. Ingressive air is the air which flows inward while the air which flows outward is termed as egressive air. Although ingressive air is used to produce a limited number of sounds in English it is more frequently used in African and Arabic languages. However, as it is clear by now, the above facts verify that the respiratory system is the main component in speech production. Diagram A illustrates the organs involved in the creation and modification of egressive and ingressive air streams.

#### Role of the larynx in modifying the air stream

From the lungs, the air flows towards the larynx. Situated above the trachea, this manipulates the received air by introducing a controlled resistance.

This control is created through vocal cords that clench and tense based on the speed of vibration as the air flows through. The positioning of vocal folds affects this phenomenon. The outcome of this process is articulatory and is called voicing or full voice. Depending on the intensity of vibration, a buzz is created after certain sounds which is phonetically defined as voicing. While all vowels are voiced, consonants can either be voiced or voiceless. For example, we label the /z/ sound as "voiced" and the /s/ sound as "voiceless" because /z/ vibrates and does not end abruptly like /s/.

In today's article we talked about some of the speech organs and mechanisms involved in the production of human speech sounds. We saw that speech sounds are produced by manipulating an air stream that flows out of lungs and through our vocal tract. Particularly, we discussed the roles of the lungs and larynx in expelling and modifying the air stream to produce the desired sounds and effects on the sounds.

n recent months, there has been alarming one-sided reporting in the so-called mainstream media—both internationally and nationally—that sounds more like public relations handouts from the big pharmaceutical companies from the West. This 'vaccine consent' journalism and the labelling of anyone questioning the safety or ethics of the vaccine roll out as "conspiracy theorists" is slowly but surely killing the "watchdog" role of journalism.

The Libertarian Media Function Theory (LMFT) that we have been teaching in mass communication courses for over half a century as the basis of a 'free media', says that the media should have absolute freedom to play the role of a "watchdog" and there should be no censorship because the people are rational, and they should be allowed to make up their minds once they receive a diversity of viewpoints from the news media.

The theme of this year's UNESCO's World Press Freedom Day (May 3) is 'Information as a Public Good' and is focusing on topics such as transparency of online platforms and the importance of media and information literacy. But it is equally important to focus on the transparency of mainstream corporate media and whether they are acting in the public good, when labelling those who wish to raise concerns about the COVID-19 vaccine roll out as "conspiracy theorists"?

The "watchdog" model of journalism has been on the decline around the world in the past two decades and the 'manufacturing vaccine consent' journalism we see today vindicates Noam Chomsky's theory that the libertarian model is dead in the West. He argues, that as the power of corporate media increase, what we have is a "manufacturing consent" model of "propaganda" journalism to promote the interests of whoever owns or funds the media—be it governments or corporations or powerful interest groups.

Robin Marantz Henig writing in the National Geographic in July last year noted that, except for AIDS, other recent epidemics—such as severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) in 2003, Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) in 2012, and Ebola in 2014—did not go global. "It was easy to attribute susceptibility in other countries to behaviours that didn't exist in ours," argued Henig.

#### "Chinese Virus"

Thus, when COVID-19 spread to the West, the Anglo-American (as well as the Indian) media was quick to grasp US President Donald Trump's assertion that this is a "Chinese Virus" and politicized the pandemic with reporting sprinkled with racism. This mentality has continued to this day, when non-Western vaccines are dismissed as "untrustworthy" even though medical evidence seems to indicate that these are safer (because these uses tested technology, not new experimentations) and as effective as the Western ones.

This racism led to the initial Chinese concerns of a possible American or European origin of COVID-19 were not taken seriously while calling for an investigation of American concerns about the virus escaping from the Wuhan Institute of Virology was considered —even by the World Health Organisation (WHO). Among Chinese concerns was the closing down of a US army deadly germ research centre in Fort Detrick, Maryland in August 2019 by the Centre for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) over safety concerns

In October 2019, an exercise called "Event 201", organised by John Hopkins University's Centre for Health Security, was held, simulating a pandemic, which causes 65 million deaths. The press release said: "Event 201 simulates an outbreak of a novel Zoonotic Coronavirus transmitted from bats to pigs to people that eventually become efficiently transmissible from person to person, leading to a severe pandemic".

It goes on to describe the virus as originating in pig farms in Brazil and quietly spreading to the community. It then spreads by air travel to Europe, the US, and China, and ultimately creates health scare chaos globally. The event was funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, which is also a huge donor to the WHO contributing over \$400 million a year.

While promoting COVID-19 vaccination with evangelical zeal, in an interview with Britain's *Sky News* on April 25, Gates opposed the lifting of patents on COVID-19 vaccines, which countries like South Africa and India have been pressing for, to make these more widely available and especially at cheaper prices.

"The thing that's holding things back, in this case, is not intellectual property," Gates said. "It's not like there's some idle vaccine factory, with regulatory approval, that makes magically safe vaccines. You've got to do the trial on these things. And every manufacturing process needs to be looked at in a very careful way."

# Is 'Vaccine Consent' Journalism Killing The "Watchdog" Model?

## A taboo subject

But questioning or investigating the effectiveness of the trials done on the Western vaccines is a taboo subject in the mainstream media today. Even when development of blood clots or deaths following the taking of these vaccines are reported, it is dismissed as "insignificant" compared to millions that have been vaccinated.

In New Zealand, when an airport cleaner who had taken a Western vaccine was diagnosed with COVID-19 in late April, the media covered it up arguing that no vaccine will give 100 percent protection. At the same time, when a Chinese medical officer said that their vaccines don't yet give protection in the 90 per cent range, this was amplified in the Anglo-American media as an admission of the ineffectiveness of the Chinese vaccines.

But, when a peer reviewed article in the British medical journal Lancet said

Russia's Sputnik V was found to be about 95 percent effective after clinical trials, that news was basically ignored or downplayed by the same media.

According to an analysis released on April 22 by the People's Vaccine Alliance, major western vaccine producers—Pfizer, Johnson & Johnson, and AstraZeneca—have paid out a combined \$26 billion in dividends and stock buybacks to their shareholders over the past year. The new report notes that Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna are projecting revenues of \$33.5 billion this year from their mRNA vaccines.

In recent weeks, there have been many video clips circulated through social media sites where Western activists have accused the rich pharmaceutical companies of using their financial resources to influence the mainstream media to promote their vaccines. UNESCO should be investigating these as part of their media literacy programmes.

Many of the western countries' inability to control the pandemic compared to initial successes in Asia (except for India), has badly dented Western egos. As 2020 was coming to an end, it seems they were racing to prove that they were still the masters of knowledge and the sciences.

But when the Russians beat them by launching the Sputnik V vaccine the Western media dismissed it as not properly tested.

But no such questions were asked when the Pfizer vaccine was launched a couple of months later. President Trump hailed it as a "medical miracle" and said the vaccine "will save millions of lives and soon end the pandemic."

Writing in the South China Morning Post recently, Chandran Nair, the founder and CEO of the Hong Kong based Global Institute for Tomorrow noted that for months, the Russian, Chinese, and Indian vaccines have been dismissed

as a serious option to combat COVID-19 and viewed with suspicion.

## Deep-rooted racism

Looking at the way the world talks about non-Western vaccines shows "structural Western privilege and deep-rooted racism" argues Nair. He adds that when Sinovac's Brazilian partner noted an efficacy rate of around 50 percent for preventing mild illness, Western commentators jumped on it while ignoring the far more positive news on Sinovac's ability to stop moderate and severe illness.

"However, when Johnson & Johnson released similar numbers in their trial, the vaccine was still hailed as an important addition to the vaccine portfolio ... in preventing moderate to severe illness—much like Sinovac's offering" Nair points out.

According to *Bloomberg's* 'Vaccine Tracker' 6 of the 10 top countries in the world on a dose per capita basis, use the Russian, Chinese and Indian vaccines. 57 countries according to recent statistics have ordered Russia's Sputnik V and this includes three European countries —Austria, Hungary and Slovenia—even though EU medical authorities are yet reviewing it

While the international media focused on whether the WHO would approve a proposal to investigate the origins of COVID-19, the World Health Assembly in November 2020 adopted a much more important resolution that the international response to the pandemic should be considered a "global public good" and any unjustified obstacles must be removed. It was specifically pointed out that flexibilities allowed in the World Trade Organisation's TRIPS (Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights) need to be strengthened.

On October 2, 2020, India and South Africa had presented a proposal for a waiver of a number of provisions in the TRIPS agreement as a legal-institutional response to fight the COVID-19 pandemic. Western nations, particularly the US, UK, Canada, and EU are resisting such changes to the IPR regime that favours big pharmaceutical companies.

While 'Big Pharma' resists shedding any of their controls over IPRs, the media need to investigate how much public monies have been spent on vaccination development that these companies are benefiting from. This is "watchdog" journalism in the public interest.

#### **Beneficiaries of research**

In an article in the *World University News* (WUN), questions were raised on who is benefiting from years of research in public funded universities in vaccine development since the SARS and MERS epidemic. For example, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines use what is called mRNA research. "Basic research on DNA vaccines began at least 25 years ago and RNA vaccines have benefitted from 10 to 15 years of strong research," says immunologist Akiko Iwasaki of Yale School of Medicine.

WUN also points out that the Moderna vaccine has benefited from university research that used RNA sequencing to attack earlier Coronavirus strains such as SARS and MERS. Thus, Moderna has collaborated with Harvard University and the University of Pennsylvania to develop their vaccine, while Astra Zeneca use a different 'viral vector' technology, it has worked with Oxford University and benefitted from years of research into selecting the vector.

WUN points out that Pfizer has not taken any US federal government money to avoid any government control of their IPR, but Bill Gates Foundation has helped to "surcharge the research". With Gates so passionately promoting the uptake of Western vaccines, the media needs to question his financial stakes in such vaccines. He also needs to be questioned about what made him fund "Event 201" and his continuing advocacy of vaccines that benefit a handful of pharmaceutical companies. After all, a major emphasis of the "watchdog" theory is that journalists must question people in powerful positions.

Meanwhile, the Asian Development Bank (ADB)—which is controlled by Japan and Western governments—announced on March 12 that they will be giving a loan of US\$ 400 million to the Philippines to buy vaccines and the vaccines they could buy are only the ones approved by the WHO (so far it is only Western ones). The ADB will pay the vaccine manufacturers direct, and the Philippines has to pay back the loan within 10 years. Philippines is the first recipient of ADB's new \$9 billion Asia Pacific Vaccine Access Facility (APVAX).

If the Chinese offered such a loan to buy Chinese vaccines the Western media will be shouting their guts out claiming this is a "debt trap". The ADB loan sniff of such a trap and the ethics of this should be questioned.

"The big question is whether Western nations can shed their sense of superiority and moral authority which is integral to their approach to actively retaining and preserving economic power within the globalised system, at a time when they are feeling most insecure from the rise of others such as China," argues Nair.

## **Media focus on COVID-19**

As we focus on press freedom on May 3, it is also important to question the focus of especially Western mainstream media reporting of the COVID-19 pandemic.

There has been far too much focus on deaths and COVID-19 test results, and the recovery rates have all but ignored. Currently in India, some 19 million have tested positive to COVID-19 and about 200,000 have died, but that means 18.8 million have recovered. Same applies to the US, where 33.1 million have tested positive and just over 590,000 have died, which means about 32.5 million have recovered.

If the recovery rates were emphasized instead of death rates, would there have been less fear generated in the community? After all, every year most countries go through a flu epidemic where thousands die, and millions recover. We have learned to live with it because the media has not focused on death rates.

There is also another important issue that needs to be addressed on World Press Freedom Day. That is how, civil liberties have been curtailed around the world to fight the pandemic. Forget the Global South, Western nations have used "biosecurity" protocols or laws to muzzle the media that question government policies such as lockdowns, vaccine passports and freedom of assembly.

As mentioned earlier, the very essence of a "free media" is access to a diversity of viewpoints. The media need to facilitate it if it is going to be the "watchdog".



Chinese Ambassador to Sri Lanka

n February, Chinese President Xi Jinping solemnly declared that China has secured a victory in its fight against poverty and the arduous task of eradicating extreme poverty has been accomplished. That means the largest developing country, home to nearly one fifth of the world's population, completes the first target of the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development 10 years ahead of schedule, which is an outstanding achievement in the history of humanity.

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, in his phone conversation with President Xi Jinping on March 29, expressed a wish to learn governance experience from the Communist Party of China (CPC), strengthen exchanges and cooperation on poverty alleviation, and promote alignment of the "Gama Samaga Pilisandarak" (Dialogue with the Village) together with China's "Targeted Poverty Alleviation" and "Rural Vitalization" strategy. The Government of Sri Lanka has also established two specialist Presidential Task Forces, on Economic Revival and Poverty Eradication, and for "Gama Samaga Pilisandarak" rural development. Poverty alleviation has become another important field of China-Sri Lanka cooperation.

What is the secret behind China's victory in eliminating extreme poverty? I would like to bring your attention to the white paper "Poverty Alleviation: China's Experience and Contribution" issued recently by China's State Council Information Office and share some of China's practices and experiences, in hope of contributing to Sri Lanka's pursuit of reducing poverty.

China is the world's largest developing country, with a population of 1.4 billion. In addition to its weak foundations and uneven development, the nation had long been plagued by poverty. From the middle of the 19th century, foreign aggression and the decadence of the imperial dynasty reduced China to a semi-colonial, semi-feudal society, and hundreds of millions of its people were plunged into poverty or even extreme poverty. Poverty in China is at a scale and a level of severity that has rarely been seen anywhere else in the world. As a result, the challenge of poverty alleviation in China almost defies imagination. But the Chinese people have fought with fortitude to realize their dream achieving economic prosperity, national rejuvenation, and a happy and better life.

Getting rid of poverty is not only an assiduous goal of Chinese people, but a solemn commitment made by the Communist Party of China. This year marks the 100th anniversary of the founding of the CPC. The CPC has taken the happiness of the people and rejuvenation of the nation as its aspiration since its founding. Always regarding poverty alleviation as an important task for ensuring national peace and stability, the CPC has highlighted poverty alleviation at national level when setting its guidelines, principles and policies, and when formulating national plans for medium- and long-term development, and has pooled national resources to advance this cause. China's historic poverty alleviation achievement is a result of strong and outstanding leadership of the CPC.

ating the political conditions it needed to eradicate poverty.

Since the founding of the PRC, the CPC led the people to complete the Socialist Revolution (1949–1956), establish the socialist system and promote socialist development. Those people have guarantees of adequate food and clothing, access to compulsory education, basic medical services, safe housing for impoverished rural residents, and safe drinking water. Some 19.36 million impoverished people have been covered by rural subsistence allowances or extreme poverty relief funds. nursing subsidies for severely disabled persons cover more than 24 million. The poverty-stricken areas get rid of backwardness, with 1.1 million km of reconstructed highways and 35,000 km of new railways. More remote areas are connected to power grids, and almost all rural areas enjoy a steady power supply. Over 98 percent of poor villages have access to optical fibre communications and 4G technology. A total of 25.68 million poor from 7.9 million households have had their dilapidated mud-and-straw cottages renovated. More than 9.6 million people have moved into new resettlement houses. Millions upon millions of children from poor families have fair access to education, and no longer need to walk across mountains and river to their schools, being able to live and eat there

Looking back, the past 100 years have witnessed the strenuous and difficult process whereby the CPC has led the Chinese people in the battle against poverty. The Party has committed itself to the original aspiration of seeking happiness for the people, taken on its responsibility for the people. honoured its promise to the people, and made huge sacrifices in fighting to win national independence and people's liberation, to make China prosperous and strong, and to bring common prosperity to all. In the process it has won the support and trust of the people. ## Stalin set to be Tamil Nadu Chief Minister as DMK wins after 10 years

Kazhagam (DMK) led by M K Stalin was on Sunday elected to power in Tamil Nadu after a gap of 10 years. The Secular Progressive Alliance led by it either won or established leads in 156 seats in the 234-member House in an election held for the first time without the towering presence of two stalwarts, DMK president M. Karunanidhi and AIADMK leader Jayalalithaa.

Stalin, who was Deputy Chief Minister in an earlier DMK regime [2006-11], is set to become Chief Minister, as the DMK moves towards a majority of its own, expecting to bag 125 seats late on Sunday night.

The DMK fielded candidates in 173 seats [including some of its allies who contested on rising sun symbol], while 15 candidates from alliance partners

**INDIA:** The Dravida Munnetra contested on their respective symbols. The AIADMK under outgoing Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami put up a decent fight and as per trends was expected to bag about 66 seats, while its allies PMK and BJP were leading in five and four seats respec-

It was a creditable performance, as it came just two years after it was routed by the DMK alliance in the Lok Sabha elections. The National Democratic Alliance led by it and comprising the BJP and Pattali Makkal Katchi was expected to win 78 seats.

The election results reinforced the bipolar nature of Tamil Nadu politics dominated by the DMK and AIADMK as like in 2016, this time too no candidate outside this alliance is set to enter the Assembly. All candidates of

fielded by the alliances led by Makkal Needhi Maiam of actor Kamal Haasan; Naam Tamilar Katchi led by Seeman and Amma Makkal Munnetra Kazhagam founded by TTV Dhinakaran were headed for defeat. This was a repeat of 2016 when only candidates of AIAD-MK and DMK fronts won.

The Congress, which is part of the DMK alliance, performed well, and as per trends is touted to increase its presence in the Assembly to 17 from a mere eight seats in 2016. The party, in the process, redeemed its name as a creditable performer, as it was seen as pulling down the alliance when it won only eight out of 41 seats last time. This time, it was allotted 25 seats and it also won the Kanniyakumari Lok Sabha seat, where a bypoll was held. - THE HINDU



## BJP, ALLIES RETAIN POWER IN ASSAM

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and its regional allies retained power in Assam, staving off the challenge of a 10-party grand alliance led by the Congress and a new regional front sired by the 2019 protests against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA).

The BJP and its allies, the Asom Gana Parishad and the United People's Party Liberal (UPPL), had won 46 of 68 seats declared at the time of reporting, and were leading in 27 other

The Congress and its two major allies — the All India United Democratic Front (AIUDF) and Bodoland People's Front (BPF), an estranged partner of the BJP — had won the remaining 22 declared so far.

## Deadly boat collision River Shibchar BANGLADESH AFP

## 26 killed in Bangladesh boat accident

At least 26 people were killed when a speedboat packed with passengers collided with a vessel transporting sand on Monday in the latest maritime disaster to hit Bangladesh.

Police said the speedboat carrying about three dozen passengers from the town of Mawa rammed into the other vessel in the Padma river as it neared the

main river station in the central rural town of Shibchar.

"We have so far recovered 26 bodies including a woman. We have also rescued five injured people including three chilpolice official Amir Hossain told Agen-

Hossain said the bow of the passenger boat was destroyed when the speedboat smashed into

the side of the transport vessel, sinking in the river in minutes.

"Police, the fire brigade and army rescue teams are on the spot, conducting search and rescue work," he said.

Witness Abdur Rahman said there was a loud noise when the boats collided and the vessels then overturned.

"When we rushed to the spot we found the

speedboat torn into two pieces. Hundreds of villagers immediately started conducting rescue work before they were joined by police and the

The border restrictions were announced Sunday as the country prepared to mark the Muslim holiday of Eid al-Fitr, which usually sees the mass movement of people between cities and villages as well as the return of migrant workers and overseas Pakistanis for celebra-

Pakistani officials have anxiously watched the coronavirus crisis unfolding in neighbouring India.

The Civil Aviation Authority said Saturday that from Wednesday, 80 percent of flights would be suspended for two weeks, mainly from the Middle East, until mid-May when the Eid holidays are


over. Foot crossings with Iran and Afghanistan would also be sealed, the country's coronavirus task force adding said, trade that would exempt.

# In recent years, the Internet has been alight with speculation that a chart-like carving in Anuradhapura is a stargate: An ancient gateway through which humans can enter the Universe.

Sri Lanka's STARGATE

ri Lanka's Sacred City of Anuradhapura is an unlikely place to be enmeshed in a fantastic tale of UFOs and otherworldly happenings. Locally known as Rajarata (Land of Kings), the UNESCO World Heritage Site was the first established kingdom on the island (in 377 BC) and is at the heart of Sri Lanka's Buddhist culture. Today, it is one of the nation's most visited places, attracting devoted pilgrims from around the country to its ancient Buddhist temples and giant dome-shaped stupas.

But this holy city is also home to something far more curious. Here, in Ranmasu Uyana (Golden Fish Park), a 40-acre ancient urban park surrounded by three Buddhist temples, is a chart that is alleged to be a map to unlock the secrets of the universe.

Measuring around 1.8m in diameter, Sakwala Chakraya (which translates to "Universe Cycle" in Sinhalese) is shallowly carved onto a low rock face among the protected park ruins. Its front facade can only be seen from ground level. In fact, four seats have been sculpted into a flat rock surface opposite that provide the ideal viewing area. Both the map and seats, which are also of mysterious origin, have puzzled historians, archaeologists and academics for more than a century.


"Ranmasu Uyana was used for a prolonged period in history," said Professor Raj Somadeva, Senior Professor of Archaeology at the Kelaniya University. "The second major developmental phase seems to have begun in the Seventh Century CE. During that period, several new buildings were added to the earlier garden layout. The chart could be a work of this period, but it is impossible to know because its existence, function or anything related to it is not mentioned in any historic records, which were meticulously kept by Buddhist monks."


While little is known about the chart and its purpose, the iconography is incompatible with other carvings of the Anuradhapura period (3rd–10th Century AD). The chart's centre is made up of seven concentric circles divided by parallel vertical and horizontal lines. Rectangular compartments contain small, crossed circles. To the untrained eye, there are figures resembling umbrellas or bow and arrows, a kite, wavy lines and cylindrical shapes. An outer ring depicts marine animals: fish, turtles and seahorses.


When compared to other carvings from the same period such as the Sandakada Pahana (moonstone), which depicts vines, swans and a lotus, all typical of Buddhist iconography, the chart is without religious context, leaving it without an obvious explanation as to why it is here.

This has left it wide open to online speculation. Before the dawn of the internet, the chart garnered little attention in Sri Lanka. It is thought to have survived here, tucked away at the edge of a boulder, after the fall of the Approach to the Approach of the Approach to the Approach

the Anuradhapura Kingdom; unremarkable in comparison to its breath-taking surroundings complete with twin ponds and bathing pavilions believed to have been used by kings. In fact, if aliens did arrive on Earth through here, they couldn't have picked a nicer place – these sacred temple grounds, cloaked in thick, tropical jungle, are mostly uninhabited and protected by the authorities.

The first academic to note the chart's archaeological importance was H.C.P. Bell, a British civil servant appointed as the first Commissioner of Archaeology of Ceylon (Sri Lanka's former name). Bell included a description of the chart in his 1911 report for the Governor of Ceylon, where he concluded that, "This ancient 'map of the world', perhaps the oldest in existence, is of quite extraordinary interest. Its presence... testifies to the antiquity of that astronomical lore still pursued in some of the Buddhist monasteries of Ceylon."

While the chart does not resemble a map in a modern sense, Bell wrote that it depicts "an old-time cosmographical chart illustrating in naivest simplicity the Buddhistic notions of the universe". He interpreted the circles, the symbols and marine life on the chart, based on his knowledge of Buddhism on the island, to mean the Earth, the Seas, Outer Space and the Universe.

While discussions around the chart for many years were mainly confined within academic circles due to its historically important location, the explosion of photo-sharing on

explosion of photo-sharing on social media over the last few years has shone a global spotlight on the mystery. Eagle-eyed tourists have remarked on parallels between the chart in Anuradhapura and similar sites in other countries that are believed by some to be stargates – ancient gateways through which humans could enter the universe. Their theory goes that the chart holds the secret code for unlocking the portal.

Conspiracy theorists noted that the stargate of Anuradhapura had near-identical shapes and symbols to those found at Abu Ghurab in Egypt and La Puerta

de Hayu Marka in Peru. The most striking similarity, it was said, as speculation around Sri Lanka's stargate reached its peak, is its proximity to water. The nearby Tissa Weva reservoir, built in 300 BC, has been thrown around as conclusive evidence, since both Abu Ghurab and La Puerta de Hayu Marka were also built near water, which, according to the stargate theory, allowed extra-terrestrial beings to process gold from Earth's water.

This otherworldly theory has been further fuelled by the chart's proximity to Danigala Mountain, also known as Alien Mountain, in the nearby sacred city of Polonnaruwa. Danigala, which lies deep in the jungle and is pop-

Sigiriya is one of Sri Lanka's most recognised ancient landmarks, a Fifth Century BC rock fortress, complete with flowing water, landscaped gardens and multiple living quarters. It lies just half an hour away from Anuradhapura within Sri Lanka's Cultural Triangle, which is made up of three important ancient cities: Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa and Kandy. "Given that the three seats carved in front of the chart appear to slightly face toward each other, it makes me think that it was a place for discussion - an ancient architect's office if you like," she said. "If the seats were built for a religious purpose, such as meditation, they would be in a straight line instead."

According to Somadeva, the greatest challenge in identifying the function of the chart

has been the lack of evidence to correctly date it. While Ranmasu Uyana and other parks and stupas in Anuradhapura are mentioned in chronicles and inscriptions dating as far back as 250 BC, the Sakwala Chakraya is not described in any historical records. "There would definitely have been a practical use for this diagram but it is a huge challenge to figure out

what that might have

been when we cannot correctly date it," he said.

So it seems that Sri Lanka's enigmatic alleged stargate remains shrouded in mystery, its purpose and meaning still lost to time. The chart's newly acquired cult status amongst sci-fi enthusiasts, however, has finally given it some well-deserved public attention. Thanks to their enthusiasm and the power of social media, it has finally stepped out of the shadow of larger-than-life Anuradhapura to stand apart on its own. (BBC)

ular with hikers, has a unique circular shape and an entirely flat top. This led internet sleuths to conclude that it must have, at one time, been used for UFO landings. Strangely, according to Sri Abeywickrama, a local tour guide, "villagers in the area do believe that the Alien Mountain attracts more shooting stars and thunder and lightning above it than anywhere else."

However, according to Somadeva, "There is little archaeologically to suggest that it is a stargate." Instead, Somadeva believes a more sensible conclusion is that the chart is an early map of the world, as suggested by Bell, because that explanation has religious and cosmological context that is logical, given the period and place in time.



According to Somadeva, "At least since 250 BCE, Sri Lankans had a clear idea of objects in the sky and outer space. In early Brahmi inscriptions, found in Sri Lanka, there are a number of names that refer to specific stars and concepts related to astronomy. One of the inscriptions in Kirinda, a religious and historic site on Sri Lanka's Southern coast, contains the phrase 'aparimita loka datuya' meaning 'the infinite universe'. What it suggests is that the person who engraved it had a very good understanding of the nature of the universe they lived in."

However, Shereen Almendra, senior lecturer of landscape design at the Moratuwa University, offers a different, more earthly perspective. "I think the Sakwala Chakraya chart is a plan for a complex project similar to the enormous stupas that were being built at the time," she said. "I lean towards it being a plan for the Sigiriya rock."

# UK to send 1,000 more ventilators to Indian hospitals

## Modi-Johnson virtual talks today

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson will hold a virtual meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday to agree a "huge range" of commitments to deepen cooperation between the two countries, including on combating the coronavirus pandemic, Downing Street said on Sunday.

The Government confirmed the talks schedule as it said that 1,000 more ventilators will be sent from the UK's surplus supply to Indian hospitals to help the most severe COVID cases, in addition to 200 ventilators, 495 oxygen concentrators and three oxygen generation units the UK announced as part of the assistance package last week.

"On Tuesday the Prime Minister will hold a virtual meeting with Prime Minister Modi to agree a huge range of commitments to deepen cooperation between the UK and India, including on fighting the coronavirus pandemic," Downing Street said.

"During his call with Prime Minister Modi, the Prime Minister will emphasise the importance of working with India to promote our shared values," it added.

Besides the offer of much-needed equipment, the UK government said that England's Chief Medical Officer Chris Whitty and Chief Scientific Adviser Patrick Vallance have spoken to their Indian counterparts to provide advice, insight and expertise to the Indian healthcare system as it deals with one of the world's worse surges in COVID levels. It has been agreed that the National Health Service (NHS) is to establish a clinical advisory group led by NHS England Chief People Officer Prerana Isaar to support India's COVID response.

"The UK will always be there for India in its time of need," said Johnson.

"The terrible images we have seen in India in recent weeks are all the more powerful because of the close and enduring connection between the people of

the UK and India. I am deeply moved by the surge of support the British people have provided to the people of India and am pleased the UK government has been able to play our part in providing life-saving assistance," he said.

The new NHS advisory group effort will work with Indian institutions such as the All India Institute of Medical Services (AIIMS) to share experience on managing COVID outbreaks.


The group will include researchers in public and global health, alongside nursing and other health professionals who have experience of the Indian health-care system.

"This support will help urgently meet some of India's acute needs, particularly oxygen for patients. We are determined to help our Indian friends in their hour of need," said UK Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab, who will be hosting External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar in Britain for the G7 Foreign and Development Ministers Meeting and bilateral talks next





Indian scientists flag virus mutations that could 'evade immune response'



A forum of scientific advisers set up by the Indian government has told authorities about minor mutations in some samples of the coronavirus that could "possibly evade immune response" and require more study, a leader of the forum has told Agencies.

However the advisers said while they were flagging the mutations, there was no reason currently to believe they were expanding or could be dangerous.

Scientists are studying what led to the current surge in cases in India and particularly whether a variant first detected in the country, called B.1.617, is to blame. The World Health Organization has not declared the Indian variant a "variant of concern," as it has done for variants first detected in Britain, Brazil and South Africa. But the WHO said on April 27 that its early modelling, based on genome sequencing, suggested that B.1.617 had a higher growth rate than other variants circulating in India.

The forum of advisers, known as the Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genetics Consortium, or INSACOG, has now found more mutations in the coronavirus that it thinks need to be tracked closely

need to be tracked closely.

"We are seeing some mutation coming up in some

samples that could possibly evade immune responses," said Shahid Jameel, chair of the scientific advisory group of INSACOG and a top Indian virologist. He did not say if the mutations have been seen in the Indian variant or any other strain.

"Unless you culture those viruses and test them in the lab, you can't say for sure. At this point, there is no reason to believe that they are expanding or if they can be dangerous, but we flagged it so that we keep our eye on the ball," he said.

INSACOG brings together 10 national research laboratories.

India reported more than 400,000 new COVID-19 cases for the first time on Saturday. The rampaging infections have collapsed its health system in places including capital New Delhi, with shortages of medical oxygen and hospital beds.

## India administers over 140 COVID-19 vaccines in 99 days

India has become the fastest country in the world to administer over 140 million COVID-19 vaccine doses, done in just 99 days, the Union Health Ministry said today.

Eight states -- Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, West Bengal, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh and Kerala -- account for 58.83 per cent of the total doses given so far in the country, it said.

So far, 14,09,16,417 vaccine doses have been administered across the country through 20,19,263 sessions, the ministry said citing a provisional report till 7 am.

These include 92,90,528 healthcare and 1,19,50,251 frontline workers who got the first dose, and 59,95,634 healthcare and 62,90,491 frontline workers who have taken the second dose. Among the senior citizens, 4,96,55,753 have got the first dose and 77,19,730 the second done. Among beneficiaries aged between 45 and 60 years, 4,76,83,792 got the first dose and 23,30,238 the second dose. "In another significant development, India has now become the fastest country in the world to cross the landmark of 14 crore COVID-19 vaccine doses. India achieved this feat in just 99 days," the ministry highlighted. Over 25 lakh vaccine doses were administered in a span of 24 hours.

On April 24, day 99 of the vaccination drive, 25,36,612 vaccine doses were administered. While 16,43,864 beneficiaries were vaccinated across 25,732 sessions for the first dose, 8,92,748 received the second dose of the vaccine.- NDTV

# India's vaccine czar leaves country due to "unprecedented" threats

India's COVID-19 situation is so dire that the rich are fleeing the country. And among them is vaccine czar Adar Poonawalla.

Foreign aid pours into India.

Ponawalla, the CEO of Serum Institute of India (SII) that manufactures the AstraZeneca vaccine, has moved to the UK with his family for "an extended period of time," according to an interview in The Times. He did so just as the UK put India on its "red list" and banned all travellers from the country.

Poonawalla said he made the move because there was a grave threat to his life in India.

These alleged threats likely come from the fact that India is yet to vaccinate a large majority of its population, and vaccines are in short supply. SII's Covishield is the more common vaccine in the country, and Poonawalla has had to balance international contracts and domestic commitments in the past two months. India's central gov-

## India's infection tally nears 20 million

India on Monday reported more than 300,000 new coronavirus cases for a 12th straight day, taking its overall caseload to just shy of 20 million, while deaths from COVID-19 rose by 3,417.

With 368,147 new cases over the past 24 hours, India's total infections stand at 19.93 million, while total fatalities are 218,959, according to Health Ministry data.

Medical experts say real numbers across the country of 1.35 billion may be five to 10 times higher than the official tally.

Hospitals have filled to capacity, medical oxygen supplies have run short and morgues and crematoriums have been swamped as the country deals with the surge in cases.

At least 11 states and union territories have imposed some form of restrictions to try and stem infections, but Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Government is reluctant to impose a national lockdown, concerned about the economic impact.

"In my opinion, only a national stay at home order and declaring medical emergency will help to address the current healthcare needs," Bhramar Mukherjee, an epidemiologist with the University of Michigan said on Twitter.

"The # of active cases is accumulating, not just the daily new cases. Even the reported numbers state there are around 3.5M active

The spike in infections is India's biggest crisis since Modi took office in 2014. Modi has been criticised for not taking steps earlier to curb the spread and for letting millions of largely unmasked people attend religious festivals and crowded political rallies in five states during March and April.

of the coronavirus taking hold in the country, five scientists who are part of the forum told Agencies.

Despite the warning, four of the scientists said the federal government did not seek to impose major restrictions to stop the spread of the virus.

It remains to be seen how his handling of

the crisis might affect Modi or his party politically. The next general election is due in 2024. Modi's party was defeated in India's West Bengal state in results declared on Sunday, although it won in the neighbouring state of Assam.

Leaders of 13 opposition parties on Sunday signed a letter urging Modi to immediately launch free national vaccination and to prioritise oxygen supply to hospitals and health centres.

Several states have postponed widening a vaccination drive for adults that was to start on Saturday due to a lack of vaccines. The national health ministry says states have 10

million vaccines stockpiled and 2 million more coming in the next three days.

Despite being the world's biggest producer of vaccines, India does not have enough for itself - undermining a plan to ramp up and widen inoculation from Saturday. Only about 9% of its 1.4 billion people have had a dose.

India has struggled to increase capacity beyond 80 million doses a month due to lack of raw materials and a fire at the Serum Institute, which makes the AstraZeneca vaccine. International aid has been pouring into

Britain will send another 1,000 ventilators to India, the government said on Sunday. Prime ministers Boris Johnson and Modi are scheduled to talk on Tuesday.

The Indian COVID-19 variant has now reached at least 17 countries including Britain, Switzerland and Iran, leading several governments to close their borders to people travelling from India.- THE HINDUSTAN TIMES

He was able to gain the exposure by competing against the top countries like Japan, Korea, Hong Kong subsequently went on to beat Malaysia and won the

Amid a "global reckoning" for the sport, the Australian Human Rights Commission said it found a culture that tolerated emotional, verbal, physical and sexual abuse, as well as medical negligence and bodyshaming directed at young athletes over decades.

The commission recommended an independent investigation into

specific abuse allegations and a formal apology from gymnastics authorities, as well as stricter screening and a national register of coaches, who often have an outsized influence over vulnerable young women.



## ADB commits US\$ 17.4 bn grants, technical assistance, loans and \$12.8 bn in co financing

## Provides assistance for developing tech related education programs in Sri Lanka

Since announcing ADB's \$20 billion support package in April last year, the Asian Development Bank has already committed \$17.4 billion out of that package through grants, technical assistance, and loans to governments and businesses and also mobilized \$12.8 billion in cofinancing, Masatsugu Asakawa, President, Asian Development Bank, told the ASEAN+3 Finance Ministers' and Central Bank Governors' Meeting (AFMGM+3), aired virtually yesterday.

ADB's COVID-19 Pandemic Response Option, or CPRO, provides quick-disbursing budget support for countercyclical economic stimulus in our developing member countries (DMCs). So far we have provided \$10.2 billion in CPRO to 26 countries, including \$5.0 billion for five ASEAN economies.

"We are also helping our DMCs procure and deliver safe and effective vaccines, swiftly and equitably. Last December, we launched our \$9 billion vaccine initiative the Asia-Pacific Vaccine Access Facility, or APVAX. We recently signed a \$425 million loan for the Philippines and \$450 million for Indonesia. We also provided grants to Afghanistan and Pacific

Fourteen additional APVAX projects, worth more than \$3.8 billion, are in the pipeline. Unfortunately, supply shortages are limiting vaccine availability in the region. ADB recently revised its vaccine eligibility criteria so that vaccines can be procured swiftly from more diverse sources, while also ensuring safety and efficacy aligned with the World Bank and COVAX."

Asakawa said the ADB was also providing technical assistance to strengthen digital literacy in education projects in Bangladesh, and developing technology-related education programs in Sri Lanka.

The tax-to-GDP ratio averages 14% for ASEAN and 18% for the Plus three economies lower than the average for developing Asia and OECD, respectively. This suggests ample room for boosting revenues and strengthening tax collection in ASEAN+3 economies, he said.

Digitizing tax systems and international tax cooperation can help mobilize revenue and fight tax avoidance. Multinational investments are growing in ASEAN+3 markets, but an increasingly borderless digital economy is making it easier for firms to shift profits to low-tax jurisdictions.

We need to ensure all parties pay their fair share of taxes by closing cross-border tax loopholes through collaboration.

"As a next step, we propose establishing a Steering Committee to bring together key development partners and DMCs that are willing to actively engage in the Tax Hub. We will then organize a first High-Level Conference under the Tax Hub later this year to share the progress and plans on the three building blocks, including details of the operations of the Secretariat and Steering Committee," he

## How will the second COVID-19 wave affect India's economy?

The curve of Covid-19 cases and mobility trends will have a direct bearing on the level of economic activity. India's GDP went down by 24.4% in the quarter ending June 2020. According to the second advance estimates, 2020-21 is expected to suffer a GDP contraction of 7.96%

India is currently experiencing a massive second wave of Covid-19 infections. An HT analysis of sevenday average of cases shows that the current wave is nowhere near its peak. The weekly moving average of daily new cases has increased 14 times since February 11, when it started rising again after declining for five months. India's first Covid-19 wave rose for 29 weeks (or 33 if the first case reported on January 30 is taken as the starting point) before it peaked. As has been pointed out in an HT analysis by Abhishek Jha, the second wave is far steeper in nature than the first wave.

The curve of Covid-19 cases and mobility trends will have a direct bearing on the level of economic activity. India's GDP went down by 24.4% in the quarter ending June 2020. According to the second advance estimates, 2020-21 is expected to suffer a GDP contraction of 7.96%. The 2021-22 Budget projected a nominal GDP growth of 14.4% for the year. In its latest meeting, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of RBI, had the following to say about the growth outlook of the Indian economy, "the projection of real GDP growth for 2021-22 is retained at 10.5 per cent consisting of 26.2 per cent in Q1, 8.3 per cent in Q2, 5.4 per cent in Q3 and 6.2 per cent in


Assuming these growth rates hold. the 2021-22 GDP will have a distribution of 23%, 24.1%, 25.8%, and 27.2% in each quarter in terms of contribution to the whole. In comparison, the 2019-20 GDP had a distribution of 24.5%, 24.4%, 24.8%, and 26.3% and the 2020-21 GDP had a distribution of 20.1%, 24.6%, 27%, and 28.3%. This suggests that any adverse effect on eco-



current fiscal year will affect a significant portion of the year's GDP. The effects of any significant economic disruption, if it were to happen,

will not be limited to the first quarter itself. It can have a cascading effect through both demand and supply channels. If supply chains get hit and inflation starts rising — it has already been on an upward trajectory — purchasing power and therefore demand is bound to come under squeeze. Similarly, any cutback in economic activity, especially in sectors which are being forced to do so because of social distancing requirements, will adversely affect incomes and hence demand.

It is to be expected that the worst affected quarter in fiscal year 2021-22 because of the second wave will be the one ending in June 2021. Because, unlike the first wave, we have vaccines this time, it is reasonable to expect that the pace of new infections will slow down as vaccinations pick up. An HT

adverse economic effect of the sharp spike in Covid-19 infections. This will have a bearing on GDP levels, and therefore tax revenues, in the current fiscal year. While the official revenue figures for 2020-21 will only be available by April end, media reports have said that both direct and indirect tax collections have exceeded the Revised Estimate (RE) targets for 2020-21. To be sure, the 2020-21 RE targets were scaled down significantly from the Budget Estimates (BE) which were presented before the pandemic erupted.

What is more important is the fact that even the 2021-22 BE targets assume lower tax buoyancy compared to previous numbers. When GDP declined in 2020-21, the government expected the fall in tax revenue to be 1.28 times the fall in GDP, but it has estimated tax revenue to grow only 1.16 times the GDP growth in 2021-22. Indirect taxes, which were expected to grow 3.6% in the RE despite a contraction in GDP, are expected to grow less than the GDP growth in 2021-22.

One reasons for this could be the dominance of petroleum taxes in the indirect tax basket, which is more a function of increased tax rates rather than a sharp rise in consumption of petroleum products. In fact, consumption of petrol and diesel is likely to be

lower than 2019-20 in 2020-21. Whether or not India's favourable GDP revisions undergo a downgrade will depend on how fast vaccinations pick up, which will determine the time it will take to flatten the second wave.

Experts believe that the second wave will extract a significant economic cost. A research note by Pranjul Bhandari, Chief Economist, India HSBC Securities and Capital Markets (India) Private Limited, said the following.

"It is likely that reported year-onyear GDP growth in the quarter ending March will dip into negative. Even before the second wave struck, the Statistics Office was forecasting GDP growth at -1.1% year-on-year for the quarter. And now with GVA likely to be weaker, GDP growth for the quarter ending March could come in even more

sequential momentum in the quarter ending June will likely come in negative. Led by favourable base effects, the year-on-year growth number will be a large positive (over 20% y-o-y versus -24.4% in the June quarter last year). But what matters more is the seasonally adjusted q-o-q momentum. That we think will dip into negative after consecutive positive prints over the last three quarters, led by weaker momentum in high-touch services like trade and tourism, as well as construction".

"To be fair, once the second wave subsides and a larger proportion of the population are vaccinated, pent-up services demand could push GDP growth back up. But that is likely to be delayed to 2HFY22," the note added.

While there is a debate on cancer creating substances in coconut oil, various kinds of unhealthy vinegars too have invaded the market by unregistered mushroom companies with the tag, 'natural coconut vinegar'

"These are made using synthetic toddy and acetic acid with coconut water which is not good for the health," said leading natural coconut vinegar manufacturing house with a history of over 125 years C.D. de Fonseka & Sons (PVT) LTD Managing Director/CEO, Dilanga de Fonseka. "According to our information some of these products are local businesses and some are island wide. Most of these suppliers under value the product price and sell at drop bottom prices even below marked MRP. Hence the customer should be aware when buying Vinegar at lower prices. We really do not know which authority should control this. However the Standards Institution, Consumer Protection Authority

should take action to identify these illegal producers and inform the Law Enforcement Authority to take necessary legal action before a major health hazard unfolds."He said the main raw material for vinegar is coconut toddy (SAP). We tap organic SAP at our own land at Panadura and from a leased property in Halawatha under excise department controls. For our patented coconut water vinegar, the main ingredient, coconut water is sourced

from certified copra mill owners Island wide and are collected in our own bowsers and do not use any synthetic toddy or raw material for our production at any stage. In order to produce natural vinegar, you have to have a facility to ferment the raw material into vinegar. For this purpose, you need to have wooden/fiberglass vats which are stored in a large area in a warehouse. We have over one million liters of wooden ND fiberglass for fermentation

and maturation. We hold the 'patent' for the manufacture of vinegar out of coconut water and we have the excise license to tap toddy trees for coconut toddy vinegar. We also held a distilled white vinegar license to make in Sri Lanka out of ethanol, however, the white vinegar manufacturing was shut down due to our inability to procure alcohol locally. It is our duty to bring to the notice of the general public that we produce natural vinegar out of

## Proceed with caution: Is Sri Lanka's approach to import substitution sensible?

## **A Pathfinder Perspective**

n the immediate aftermath of the onset of the Covid19 pandemic and the unprecedented health and economic crises it unleashed, there was a widespread backlash in sentiment against globalisation and open economic policies. The greatly increased human mobility associated with these phenomena were blamed for the rapid spread of the virus to all parts of the globe. The supply-side shocks, related even to basic goods, such as food and medicines, as well as demand pressures emanating from a rise in protectionism, were seen as being the result of

the complex supply chains that underpinned the web of crossborder production networks that constitute a major part of the global economy on the one hand and the destruction of employment and incomes in an integrated world economy on the other. However, as time passed, there

has been a shift in sentiment. The focus has shifted to seeking ways and means of maintaining the substantial gains of globalization, while reducing the risks that were exposed and amplified by the pandemic. On the health front, the extraordinary achievement of scientists in developing highly efficacious vaccines, in record time, has created the very real prospect of opening up global mobility again.

This has been supplemented by the exponential acceleration of remote working and living. On the economic front, the focus has been shifted from efficiency to

resilience in maintaining global supply chains. There has been diversification as well as shortening of supply chains.

On the demand side, the unprecedented policy actions of Treasuries and Central Banks around the world has propped up businesses and livelihoods to an extent where a relatively strong recovery, though multi-speed, is being seen in the world economy. These trends explain why there has been a shift in sentiment, as mentioned above.

While protectionist pressures are still present, the case for an open and rules-based international trading system is being reinforced, led by China. The Biden administration has also taken measures to revive the World Trade Organisation, including through the appointment of a former Finance Minister of Nigeria, and Managing Director of the World Bank, as the first female head of the institution.

The dispute resolution panel of

the WTO is also being reconstituted. Protectionist sentiments and a shift to autarkic policies were also ascendant in Sri Lanka. The world seems to have realized that it is not advisable to "throw the baby out with the bath water." It is important that Sri Lanka absorbs this lesson as well.

It would be useful to trace the evolution of the thinking on import substitution and to examine briefly some of its sub-optimal practical outcomes. A paper by Douglas A Irwin, titled "The Rise and Fall of Import Substitution," (Working Paper, Peterson Institute for International Economics; July 2020) traces the evolution of the thinking on import-substitution. Import substitution policies initially came to the fore in the early 1950s. It is probably no coincidence that they gained salience at a time when decolonisation was gathering momentum. The ex-colonies sought to augment their political



freedom with policies that reduced their dependence on the metropolitan centers.

#### **Import substitution** best trade strategy?

Many developing countries came to the conclusion that import substitution was the best trade strategy to promote industrialization and economic growth within a global economic system based on colonial structures that was geared very much against them through exploitative trading

Raoul Prebisch, based at the UN Economic Commission for Latin America, is widely recognized as the father of the importsubstitution industrialization (ISI)

However, he and other leading contemporary figures in development economics, in the 1950s, identified fairly quickly some of the weaknesses of import substitution policies in practice.

Import controls, particularly on manufactured goods, did not necessarily conserve foreign exchange as intended; rates of tariff protection were high, resulting in a misallocation of resources and higher priced and poor quality products for consumers; small and inefficient firms were created that served only domestic markets, and taken together, these policies became an obstacle to promoting exports. These shortcomings are relevant

Prebisch's own views changed

by the 1970s. It can be argued that the intellectual demise of import substitution had taken place by the 1970s.

The Pathfinder Foundation believes that there is considerable evidence that openness to trade increases the growth, employment and incomes trajectories of economies. It is noteworthy that the unleashing of the potential of Asian economies (particularly in East and Southeast Asia) was greatly facilitated by two of the key pillars of globalization: liberalization of trade and capital

This enhanced the capacity of countries to take advantage of the opportunities created by rising external demand. The successful countries of Asia were able to attract FDI, with its capital, market access and know-how, to drive export expansion and take advantage of this increasing external demand brought about by globalization.

#### **Increased FDI, rising exports**

In practice, countries as large as China or as small as Singapore have been able to transform their economies through this combination of increased FDI and rising exports. In this context, it is noteworthy that the coastal regions of China, which were significantly more integrated with the world economy, have experienced far more dynamic growth and development than the hinterland, which is significantly

## less integrated, and more back-

The experience in China vividly illustrates within one country

the tangible benefits of policies

which are open to greater integra-

tion with the global economy. It is also important to learn lessons from historical experience closer to home. The inwardlooking policies adopted by Sri Lanka in the 1970s resulted in a low-investment, low growth and high unemployment syndrome. Long queues for even essential goods were emblematic of this

The benefits of liberalizing the economy in 1977-78 have been curtailed by the three- decadelong civil conflict and the partial nature of reforms due to a lack of political consensus around policies that attract FDI and promote exports. Weak implementation has also amplified poor overall performance.

The time has come to have a concerted and holistic approach to transforming the Sri Lankan economy.

#### High priority to food security

In today's world of everincreasing climate and other risks, there is a case for attaching high priority to food security.

Well-targeted import substitution policies in agriculture can be justified on these grounds. However, the overarching focus should be on increasing productivity to avoid imposing high prices and poor quality on the consumers.

The paddy sector reveals what should not be done. Sri Lanka has now reached self-sufficiency in rice production in most years. However, the outcome has been a long tail of low productivity, low income farmers whose subsistence has to be secured by inefficient and costly subsidies as well as guaranteed prices. Lessons need to be learned from past experience to avoid the same mistakes in the present and future.

In conclusion, the Pathfinder Foundation believes that it is encouraging that the most senior policy-makers have been stressing the need to develop "a production economy" driven by FDI and exports, along with a highproductivity agricultural sector.

These goals should not be derailed by vested interests which focus on rent-seeking activity based on import restrictions. History, in Sri Lanka and elsewhere, teaches us that the outcomes will inevitably be bad.

eparating good from evil and using that knowledge to defeat evil is the message we need to give out says Head Prefects Vismi Amada and Pasindu Haputhanthri of Dharmapala Vidyalaya, Pannipitiya. Perfect Prefects features the two heads who strongly believe in this message of hope.

Both Head Prefects agreed that Hitler is one of the most evil leaders the world has ever seen. He was the evil genius responsible for the holocaust - the genocide of European Jews during World War II. He was the instigator of the murder of six million Jews and some 5 million others. More than one million of those who perished were children.

Hundreds of thousands of Jews died due to the horrendous conditions in the ghettos (starvation, disease, and poor living conditions) in German occupied Poland and other parts of Eastern Europe. Possibly more than 2 million holocaust victims died in mass shootings or gas vans (outfitted with engines that pumped carbon monoxide into sealed passenger compartments).

But if you can separate the leader from the monster you can learn a lot. One lesson we can learn from Hitler is the power of persuasive speech. He was a master of propaganda. In his meetings his audiences grew from a handful to thousands. Just think about the impact a good man or woman can create if he/she was as eloquent as Hitler? As impassioned as Hitler?

Both Head girl Vismi Amada and Head Boy Pasindu



"I agree that Hitler was a cruel leader but his leadership skills were outstanding. It is extremely regrettable that he used those leadership skills to create untold suffering. But if we can separate the leader from

the monster, we can create a better world by applying these examples of leadership to our day to day lives," said Head Boy Pasindu Haputhanthri.

He further went on to explain that you need that spark of creativity. You need that originality of thought. Never be afraid to do something anew. Always try to think outside the box. Society changes when people think differently and see things in a way that others do not. Isaac Newton was an English Mathematician, physicist, astronomer, theologian and

author who is regarded as a key figure in the scientific revolution. Legend has it that Isaac Newton formulated gravitational theory after watching an apple fall and asked why the apple fell straight down, rather than sideways or even upward. He showed that the force that makes the apple fall and that holds us on the ground is the same as the force that keeps the moon and planets in their orbits. There is even a joke which probably might not be true that passers by said – 'why is this fool looking at the apple, why doesn't he eat it?

He points out that he tries to be a friend to everyone at school. Because of the trust he has gained, students ask him for advice and even confide in him. This allows him to effectively lead the student population. When solving problems he believes in being systematic. With the members of the Prefect guild behind him and along with the Head Girl, they solve problems one at a time while keeping in mind the old adage – haste makes waste.

Haputhanthri from a very young age had just one goal in mind and that was to be a lecturer at University. He is

leadership qualities," explained Haputhanthri.

His message to the youth is to set targets and then deliberate on the path that must be taken. You have to decide on the path you will have to take to achieve your goals. It won't be a walk in the park says Haputhanthri. "You will have to push through adversity. You will have to jump hurdles and navigate around roadblocks. You need mental fortitude. Never be afraid to ask for help. Never be afraid to ask for advice.

You have the power to change your life.'

"When a lot of people hear the name Hitler, it fills them with dread. But I agree with Pasindu, that as a leader he was exceptional. Because of his charisma and eloquence he mesmerized the German people. But if we can separate the leader from the devil incarnate, we can learn a lot," said Head Girl Vismi Amada.

She feels that we should try and create a civilized society that always gives prominence to ethical behavior. From a child's school days, the child must be taught to think about others. The reason for this is, changing a person's attitude is extremely difficult once they are in adulthood. "From early childhood through to the boy/ girl's formative years that child should understand or be taught the importance of ethical behavior. He /she should have a positive mindset. That is the responsibility of society - inculcating a positive mindset in the child.'

She believes that any individual in a position of leadership needs to be straightforward and as a leader he or she needs to be there to help others while at the same time

allowing that person to be independent and discover his/her strengths.

Amada believes that unity is absolutely essential when dealing with any problem not only at the school level but when one leaves school and joins the workforce. When you share the work load and trust one another, it really minimizes stress and pressure.

"I believe in a change from the inside. I have many goals in life but what really motivates me is self-improvement. There always is a quality of mine that I can improve on, so I really do not believe there is a point of no growth for me," said Amada.

Apart from reading books and stamp collecting another one of her outside interests is the popular sport of rifle shooting. This year she will be selected to the National Pool. In the year 2019 she toured Germany. At present she occupies the 7th position at National Level.

"Rifle shooting has really contributed to my selfdevelopment and confidence. I have benefited in so many ways. I started during my O/Ls and I have seen a positive change in me. When you train yourself to be mentally strong, it even helps you in your studies," explains Amada.

Her message to the youth is that your individuality should be preserved. "Do not try and be a copy of someone else. What works for one person does not work for someone else. Stand away from the crowd and from what they are doing and visualize your own unique path. Become the person you want to be. You need to have faith in yourself and you need to understand that if you want to reach your dreams you need to put in the hard work and forge your own path – a path that will lead to those dreams," pointed out Amada.

She points out that her inspiration in life has been her parents. However, she wishes to be an inspiration to oth-

look like just another Whippet, but to connoisseurs of the dock diving circuit, he is an incredible athlete in the same league as icons like Michael Jordan, Tiger Woods or Babe Ruth.

Before the Covid-19 pandemic hit, eight year-old Spitfire and his 16-year-old handler, Sydney, dominated the dock diving circuit like never before in the history of the

If you're unfamiliar with the sport of dock diving, it's essentially canines running on a wooden dock and jumping as far or as high as possible before diving into a pool of water. And no dog does this better than Spitfire. Between 2016 and 2019, he broke a whopping 21 world records, jumping farther and higher than any other competitor and securing his status as the GOAT of dock diving.

Spitfire came into the Mackey family in 2013. Back then, he was just an adorable pooch with big puppy eyes that Sydney instantly fell in love with, but his athletic qualities were undeniable. The whippet was bred by a heritage breeder, inheriting great genes from both par-

surprised everyone.

Sydney and her mother learned about dock diving in 2016, from a family friend who encouraged them to try it with Spitfire. In May of that year, they decided to give the sport a try and their pet proved to be a natural.

"He wasn't shy, or scared or reserved about it, he just humped into the water," Sydney's coach recalls about Spittfire's first ever dock dive. "Right away I went 'just hold on, because this is gonna be fun, like that dog is going to take you places that you would have never imagined."

It wasn't long after that very first jump that Sydney and Spitfire started making waves in the world of dock diving. They took the sport by storm and they dominated events across the United States like no team had ever done before. In three years time, they broke no less than 21 world records, and became known as an unbeatable duo.

Before he leaps into the air, the world's best dock diver reaches a speed of about 30miles per hour, and when he takes to the air he can reach a distance of 31 feet before hitfor height. It's no wonder they call him the flying dog...

But while Spitfire is undoubtedly the star of the show, most dock diving experts are convinced that despite his athletic abilities, he would have never reached his true potential without his young handler's guidance. Sydney's "Ready? READY? GoGoGoGoGOGOGOGOG-OGOGO" pep-talk to get Spitfire fired up has become famous on the dock jumping circuit, and everyone acknowledges her merits.

Even though the pandemic really took its toll on dock diving as a sport, Spitfire has been keeping himself busy by winning new titles and setting new records. Even though he's not as young as he used to be, he continues to dominate the sport and has already cemented his legacy as one of the best ever, if not the great-


