

The first consignment of Russian COVID-19 vaccine Sputnik V arrived at the Bandaranaike International Airport at 2 am on a Qatar Airways flight yesterday. The vaccine consignment containing 15,000 doses was symbolically handed over to Production, Supply and Regulation of

Pharmaceuticals State Minister Prof. Channa Jayasumana by Russia's Deputy Russian Ambassador to Sri Lanka Alexei Brudanov.

Sri Lanka has decided to purchase a total of 13 million doses of the Sputnik V vaccine from Russia.

The National Medical Regulatory Authority (NMRA)

approved the emergency use of Sputnik V COVID-19 vaccine in Sri Lanka in March.

Cabinet approval was granted to purchase 7 million doses of the Sputnik V vaccine at a cost of US\$ 69.65 million.

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SC tells IGP must ensure officers adhere to laws

Attorneys win FR case on obstructing duty inside police station

The Supreme Court has observed that Inspector General of Police must take steps to adequately train and supervise all police personnel whether gazetted or non-gazetted to adhere to the laws practiced in this country, to show professionalism in policing and to be trained to provide a people friendly police service to the public.

Supreme Court Judge, Justice S. Thurairaja made these remarks while delivering a judgement in connection with a fundamental rights petition filed by two lawyers for obstructing them from representing and looking into the interests of their client at the Ambalangoda Police Station in 2010.

Accordingly, the Supreme Court has ordered two police officers to pay Rs.30,000 each to the two attorneys for obstructing them from representing and looking into the interests of their client at the Ambalangoda Police Station in 2010. The Supreme Court further ordered the two police officers to pay Rs.10,000 to each petitioner as litigation costs.

The Supreme Court three-judgebench comprising Justice S. Thurairaja, Justice Buwaneka Aluwihare and Jus-



tice L.T.B. Dehideniya held that two police officers attached to the Ambalangoda Police Station have violated petitioners' Fundamental Rights enshrined in Article 12 and 14(1)(g) of the constitution after interference with their freedom to engage in their occupation.

Two lawyers Chandima Samanmalee de Zoysa and Sudusinghe Liyanage Pubudu Kumara filed this petition naming Don Saman Harishchandra Malaweera, Inspector attached to the

Ambalangoda Police Station, Liyana Arachchige Chandrarathna, a Sub-Inspector attached to the Ambalangoda Police Station and several others as respondents. The Attorney General had refused to appear for these 1st and 2nd Respondent police officers.

The petitioners allege that the behavior of these two police officers during the primary incident took place at the police station on February 28, 2010 using abusive language and the harassment afterwards caused them

severe pain of mind and humiliation. The petitioners further said two respondents caused the Petitioners severe embarrassment and humiliation and to the legal profession at large.

Petitioners submits that such treatment meted out to the Petitioners amounts to cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment and is a clear violation of the rights guaranteed under Article 11, 12(1) and 14(1)(g) of the Constitution.

As per the findings of the investigation conducted by the Superintendent of Police at Ambalangoda Division, it is established that the 1st and 2nd Respondents have shouted at the two Attorneys-at-law, and thus has disrespected their integrity and disregarded their

dignity as persons and professionals. Upon the actions taken by the Superintendent of Police, the 1st and 2nd Respondents were interdicted from service. In his submissions, Senior Counsel Viran Corea appearing for the petitioners submitted to court that the Respondents' conduct was in violation of 'Police Rules 2012'. These rules were published in the gazette notification bearing no. 1758/36 dated 18-05-2012.

Clause 3. (1) of the rules is reproduced below: 'Every Attorney-at-Law, who enters the precincts of a police station established under the Police Ordinance situated in any part of Sri Lanka, in his capacity of an Attorney-at-Law for the purpose of representing and watching the interests of a

person who is the client of such Attorney-at-Law, shall be treated cordially and courteously and given a fair and patient hearing by the police officers attached to such Police Station, whatever their rank'.

The government has observed that students are aged 19 or 20 years by the time they complete their school education and they reach 25 or 26 years when they finally conclude their university education.

This is due to the extended period spent on issuing the A/L and O/L exam results and it also leads to delays in beginning A/L classes and the undergraduate selection process. The Education Ministry has taken several decisions to mitigate this situation in future. A decision has been taken to restructure the syllabus of Grade 10 and 11 for one year and nine months.

The G.C.E.(Ordinary Level) and G.C.E.(Advanced Level) Examinations will be in August and December respectively and results will be issued within three months of each exam, so that a total of 45 months at present can be reduced to 32 months.

Selection of students to universities based on the Z score without waiting for the conclusion of the re-correction process of the G. C. E. Advanced Level examination will also be made.

If there are students whose results are upgraded after the re-correction process, they will be awarded new marginal Z Scores so they can undergo the relevant degree courses and this method will be applied from the 2020 Advanced Level examination.

He added that a two-day debate on the Bill requested by the JVP was turned down by the Government at the Party Leaders' Meeting citing COVID-19 as a reason.

"The debate on the Bill has been postponed because the Speaker has not yet received the Supreme Court determination. The Supreme Court only considers whether the Bill's provisions are consistent with the Constitution, but a broad public dialogue is needed on the Bill's

We have been educating the masses in the last couple of weeks, but those had to be abandoned due to COVID-19. The Government must be transparent and allow a public dialogue if it has no hidden motives in rushing this Bill through," he commented.

people away from the scene on stretchers. "A support beam gave way," Mexico City Mayor Claudia Sheinbaum said at the scene.

She said a beam collapsed just as the train passed over it. The accident occurred on the metro's Line 12 around 10:30 p.m. The mayor told reporters at the site that 65 people have been taken to hospitals, and 7 are in a serious condition. Sheinbaum earlier said that one of the victims was in a car underneath the collapsed metro overpass and he is alive at a hospital.

A crane is being used to hold up the train so rescue workers can continue to work, she said. Of the dead, some are minors, she said without specifying a number.

Sheinbaum also called for an investigation into the incident. "If there's a need for an external investigation, there

will be one," she added. "We will get to the truth and we will get justice." The metro's Line 12 was built when now Foreign Relations Secretary Marcelo Ebrard was Mexico City's mayor, Associated Press reported.

"What happened today in the metro

is a terrible tragedy. My solidarity with the victims and their families," Ebrard tweeted. "Of course we need to investigate

cause and determine responsibility. I reiterate to all authorities my complete willingness to contribute to everything necessary," he wrote.

A section of the overpass appeared to completely collapse, and another part was partially collapsed at an angle, photos and video showed. Video from Telemundo showed rescuers using ladders to reach train cars that hung from the overpass at a downward angle. (NBC)

n the contemporary world of journalism, female reporters face a double jeopardy: they are increasingly targeted both as journalists and as women - particularly in repressive regimes and misogynistic societies.

As the United Nations intensifies its campaign for women's rights worldwide even as it annually commemorates World Press Freedom Day on May 3 - one of the questions lingering in the minds of women activists is: Is press freedom incompatible with gender empowerment?

Marianna Belalba Barreto, Civic Space Cluster Lead at CIVICUS, the global civil society alliance based in Johannesburg, told IPS the CIVICUS Monitor has documented many cases of women journalists facing online harassment and the gendered nature of it.

In its annual report: People Power Under Attack (PPUA) 2020, CIVICUS documented the use of intimidation as a tactic to deter journalists and human rights defenders (HRDs).

In particular, several cases of intimidation of women journalists were documented in the Balkan region, with threats often gendered in nature.

In North Macedonia, a woman journalist received messages via Facebook and Twitter containing verbal abuses and hate speech. She received dozens of messages threatening her with rape as well as death in response to her work

In Bosnia and Herzegovina a woman journalist was threatened for reporting on an environmental rights story.

In Bulgaria, a woman journalist, whose story portrayed a far-right group in a negative light, had to flee the country with her family after allegedly receiving threats from unknown people against her and the family, with her personal information leaked online.

The UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in Paris and the Washington-based International Center for Journalists (ICFJ) conducted a global survey last year to assess the scale and impacts of online violence targeting women journalists, "and to help identify solutions to this pernicious problem."

ICFJ says it is the most comprehensive and geographically diverse survey ever undertaken on the theme, having been offered in five languages and receiving responses from 714 women journalists across 113 countries.

The top findings include: Nearly three in four women respondents (73 percent) said they had experienced online violence; threats of physical (25 percent) and sexual violence (18 percent) plagued the women journalists surveyed; and one in five women respondents (20 percent) said they had been attacked or abused offline in incidents seeded online.

Lucy Westcott, James W. Foley Emergencies Research Associate at the Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ), told IPS women journalists around the world face a number of safety hazards while reporting, and risk having their voices silenced for being both journalists and women in public life.

CPJ has spoken to women journalists across the world - including in many of the countries highlighted from the UNESCO-ICFJ report, such as Brazil, South Africa, the UK and the US –who described dealing with threats to their safety while reporting, online harassment, misogynistic attacks, and threats of sexual violence and death.

She said women journalists are also at risk of physical attack while reporting in the field, especially if they are reporting alone. Freelance women journalists face a particular risk, as they lack the backing of a traditional newsroom and its support.

"Online harassment continues to be one of the biggest risks to the safety of women journalists globally, and online threats can and do spill over into a real-life setting. The impact of online harassment is farreaching, and can also result in trauma and mental health difficulties, said Westcott, a former staff writer for Newsweek, and UN correspondent for Inter Press Service (IPS) news agency.

She added: "Journalist safety is a press freedom issue, and women journalists should be able to do their job and report the news without fearing for their safety and livelihoods. Editors need to be aware

of the risks their female journalists face, and help them take steps to mitigate those

Tara Carey, Head of Media at Equality Now told IPS women journalists around the world are speaking out about their experiences of online violence and harassment, and studies are reporting a disturbing increase in misogynistic digital abuse targeting female journalists.

"Online trolling and psychological abuse manifests in various ways and is carried out to intimidate, stigmatize and silence women. It can range from sexual harassment, and threats of sexual and physical violence, including murder, through to privacy violations such as hacking, non-consensual dissemination of intimate images, and 'doxing', which involves personal information and contact details being leaked to the public.

"Trolling is sometimes part of an orchestrated campaign involving multiple attackers, and abuse is often worse when it intersects with other forms of discrimination, such as associated with race, nationality, religion, caste, ethnicity, and sexual orientation," she said.

Online violence and harassment can take a heavy toll, leaving those who are targeted feeling stressed, scared, depressed, and in some instances, at greater risk.

Worryingly, digital abuse is closely asso-

ciated with offline violence, with many women journalists confirming they have experienced threats, abuse or assault in face-to-face encounters whilst working, said Carey.

'This onslaught is curtailing women's participation in the media and undermining our ability to engage freely in public debate, report on contentious issues or challenge discrimination. Some women are being pushed to censor what they say withdraw from public online conversations and frontline reporting, or even abandoning journalism entirely.

"Online abuse against women journalists is an attack on freedom of speech and expression. A reduction in female representation in news reporting erodes gender diversity in public discourse and risks marginalizing gender-sensitive reporting on issues impacting women and girls," declared Carey.

Meanwhile, on the occasion of International Women's Day last March, UNESCO launched a campaign to highlight the specific risks faced by women journalists online.

Guy Berger, Director for Policies and Strategies, Communication and Information, at UNESCO, says, "This violence harms women's right to speak and society's right to know."

"To tackle this increasing trend," he adds, "we need to find collective solutions to protect women journalists from online violence." This includes strong responses from social media platforms, national authorities and media organizations.

Belalba Baretto said CIVICUS also continues to document cases in different regions of the world, as indicated by the following examples:

1. Three women journalists in Lebanon, Dima Sadek, Luna Safwan and Mahassen Moursel, have been subjected to an intense hate campaign.

2. Geri Scott, the Yorkshire Post's Westminster correspondent, faced online harassment following her appearance on the Andrew Marr Show TV programme on BBC One. Following her appearance on the show, Scott was targeted by an

In addition, a report published by the Associação Brasileira de Jornalismo Investigativo (ABRAJI) on violence against women journalists in Brazil, identified 20 attacks on Brazilian women journalists between January 2019 and February 2020, including misogynistic and sexist offences, smear campaigns and disclosure of personal information. Of the 17 cases recorded in 2019, 13 were carried out by members of the federal and state congress, ministers and President Bolsonaro himself. A total of 84 percent of the journalists interviewed in the study also said they had faced gender-based violence at

4. News outlet Prensa Comunitaria and their women journalists were subjected to a smear campaign in conservative media and on social media for their coverage of the International Women's Day march held on March 8, 2020 in Guatemala City.

Carey of Equality Now said: "Dealing with online abuse mustn't fall on the shoulders of those being targeted. Media houses need to develop and implement genderspecific guidelines and training that incorporate anti-harassment policies. Women journalists should feel comfortable raising concerns about abuse and newsrooms should take responsibility for ensuring they feel safe and supported.

"Laws need to be updated and implemented to address this problem. Criminal justice systems should be providing support and redress to victims and punishing perpetrators. Justice being done, and being seen to be done, is important both for the individual and because consequences can act as a deterrent for others.

"There also needs to be better awareness and understanding amongst law enforcement agencies and social media companies, along with the adoption of zero-tolerance policies that involve duty bearers taking swift and appropriate action against perpetrators."

UNESCAP 77th session on Zoom

Premier says COVID pandemic here being controlled effectively

Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa at the inauguration of the 77th Session of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) outlined Sri Lanka's successful approach in controlling the COVID-19 and called for renewed "South-South" cooperation, to recover from the pandemic. The session was held virtually in Bangkok from April 26 to 29 on the theme 'Building back better from crises through regional cooperation in Asia and the Pacific'

Prime Minister Rajapaksa said that even during the pandemic, economic and export sector continued to function, tourism restarted in January and the Central Bank reduced policy rates and implemented several concessionary refinancing programmes in Sri Lanka.

The Prime Minister said that Sri Lanka is deeply committed to

achieving Sustainable Development Goals and toward this end, an Interministerial Steering Committee on Sustainable Development and Sustainable Development Council have been established and 2021 to 2030 has been declared as the 'Decade of Skills Development' in Sri Lanka.

Foreign Secretary Admiral Prof. Jayanath Colombage said that the Government of Sri Lanka mitigated the speared of the pandemic and keep the death rate comparatively low against the high recovery rate due to its "Whole of Government and Whole of Society" approach, "Preemptive Strategy", and "matured Public Healthcare system". He said that to date 130,000 stranded Sri Lankans were brought home from over 120 countries and that Sri Lanka continues to provide quarantine facilities free especially for migrant workers.

Foreign Secretary Colombage requested that Member States of economic strength in the Asia-Pacific region should provide smaller economies like that of Sri Lanka with

ter from crises. Reaffirming its commitment to international cooperation, along with Indonesia, Japan, Mal-dives, Pakistan and Vietnam, Sri Lanka co-sponsored the resolution put forward by Thailand. It was adopted by the Commission on the theme "Regional cooperation to build back better from crises in Asia and the Pacific" in support of all similar efforts of Member States.

Over 50 member States participated in the four day online session and Heads of State/ Government of Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Indonesia, Kiribati, Kyrgyz Republic, Marshall Islands, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Cambodia, Fiji, Pakistan, Thailand, Tuvalu and Uzbekistan addressed the inauguration of the 77th Session.

United Nations Under-Secretary-General and Executive Secretary of UNESCAP Armida Salsiah Alisjahbana emphasized that "As we move towards recovery, our efforts must take into account the aspirations of all countries, including the least developed countries, landlocked developing countries and small island developing States, of Asia and the Pacific. More than ever before, the full potential of inclusive and networked multilateralism should be tapped. International development cooperation, including South-South and triangular co-operation, must be further harnessed".

Colonne, Director General Chamindry Saparamadu of Sustainable Development Council, senior officials from the Foreign Ministry, Central Bank, Department of External Resources and Sustainable Development Council of Sri Lanka were in the delegation.

Cabinet approval has been granted for the lifetime salary and allowances payment for war hero dependents Defence Secretary Gen. Kamal Gunaratne (Retd) said.

Approval has been granted for the Cabinet Paper submitted by the President in his capacity as the Defence Minister seeking avenues to facilitate the war hero dependents, the Defence Secretary stated.

Gen. Gunaratne expressed these remarks while addressing a media brief at the Defence Ministry to announce the Cabinet approval and said over 30,000 countrywide war hero dependent families will benefit with the move.

"A number of facilities are now available as pledged," the Defence Secretary stressed recalling futile protests staged demanding those despite the

The Cabinet approval granted relief measures are as follows:

• The payment of salaries and allowances currently paid to the Tri-Forces/ Police members who have been discharged following disability owing to terrorist acts, to their dependents at the time of death of the war veteran.

• Relief measures will be granted to the members of the Armed Forces and Police who were disabled and to the dependents of deceased veterans when the incident is attributed to operational activities under the category of nonterrorist nature whilst on duty, following an investigation by a committee.

• Relief measures will be granted to the Armed Forces and Police personnel who were disabled and deceased as a result of post-war activities (such as demining) following an investigation by a committee.

• Entitlement of salary and allow-



ances to the dependents of the Tri-Forces and Police war veterans who have received disable discharge due to terrorist acts, if the member dies before reaching the age of 55, considering that they live until age of

• Entitlement of salary and allowances to the dependents up to 55 years of age of a member who commits suicide as a result of a mental disorder caused due to a disability following a terrorist activity, assuming that they are alive.

Free press 'cornerstone' of democratic societies - UN

The United Nations (UN) Secretary-General on Monday urged governments to "do everything in their power" to support free, independent and diverse media, which the UN's top human rights official highlighted as "a cornerstone of democratic socie-

In a message on the World Press Freedom Day, marked annually on May 3, Secretary-General António Guterres underscored the importance of reliable, verified and accessible

information. "During the pandemic, and in other crises including the climate emergency, journalists and media workers help us navigate a fast-changing and often overwhelming landscape of information, while addressing dangerous inaccuracies and falsehoods," he said.

"Free and independent journalism is our greatest ally in combating misinformation and disinformation.'

UN General Secretary Guterres said that the personal risks journalists and media workers face, including restrictions, censorship, abuse, harassment, detention and even death, "simply for doing their jobs", and that the situation continues to worsen.

The economic impact of the coronavirus pandemic has hit many media outlets hard, threatening their very survival, he added.

"As budgets tighten, so too does access to reliable information. Rumours, falsehoods and extreme or divisive opinions surge in to fill the gap", the Secretary-General said, urging all governments to "do everything in their power to support a free, independent and diverse media"

UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Michelle Bachelet also highlighted the importance of free, uncensored and independent press as "a cornerstone of democratic societies", conveying life-saving information, improving public participation, and strengthening accountability and respect for human rights.

"Around the world, people have increasingly taken to the streets to demand their economic and social rights, as well as an end to discrimination and systemic racism, impunity, and corruption," she said.

However, journalists fulfilling their fundamental role of reporting on these social protests have become targets, with many becoming victims of

of force, arbitrary arrests, and criminal prosecution, Bachelet added.

In addition to dissuading other journalists from critically reporting on relevant issues, such attacks weaken public debate and hamper society's ability to respond effectively to challenges, including COVID-19, she said.

Marked annually on May 3, the World Press Freedom Day celebrates the fundamental principles of press freedom. It is also an occasion to evaluate press freedom globally, to defend the media from attacks on their independence, and to pay tribute to journalists who have lost their lives in the exercise of their profes-

The date marks the adoption of the landmark Windhoek Declaration for

unnecessary and disproportionate use the Development of a Free, Independent and Pluralistic Press at a UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) conference in the Namibian capital, in 1991.

This year, the World Day focuses on the theme of "Information as a Public Good", affirming the importance of information as a public good, and exploring what can be done in the production, distribution and reception of content to strengthen journalism, as well as to improve transparency and empowerment.

The theme ties in with UNESCO's work to ensure the long-term health of independent, pluralistic journalism, and the safety of media workers everywhere, Audrey Azoulay, Director-General of the UN agency tasked with defending press freedom, said.

So they want to destabilise ours. The Opposition does not like to see any economic progress in the country. The Government has provided numerous relief packages for small and medium scale entrepreneurs in this pandemic.

Don't undermine health experts' recommendations – MP Rajitha

The MP blamed the Government for being at loggerheads with the Public Health Inspectors (PHIs) who are better informed regarding the real situation on the ground as they are directly involved with the people, instead of giving ear to their recommendations.

He said, therefore, the only course of action to prevent the spread of the virus is to break the chain of infection. He said that the only way to do that is to impose travel restrictions and limit direct

MP Senaratne recommended that the public transport system should be better monitored to prevent close contact and break the cycle of infection. He said that by Monday, the daily infection rate in the country had reached its highest with over 2000 cases and 13 deaths reported. The Committee said that in spite of dedicated efforts by the Wildlife Conservation Department in the last 70 years to drive away elephants are forced to live in residential areas.

All elephants driving away operations have proven failures and failed to remove the main problem confining male elephants to reserved

There has been ample evidence that the rogue elephants are not vulnerable to the driving operations and they respond to the humans and the other mitigating strategies violently and in a highly invasive manner.

A majority of the male elephants have become more and more invasive and hateful towards the humans thereby speeding up the conflict at present. The report has stressed that continuing to pursue an objective of con-

driven in to protected landscapes and fenced die of starvation. Such a move would cause severe escalation of the conflict as the elephants remain outside become extremely aggressive towards people.

"Within two years, we will fully convert to organic farming. This is a difficult task, but we will do it," he added.

"Sri Lanka has become the top chemical fertiliser user in South Asia. We use 284 kg of chemical fertiliser per hectare. Australia uses only 64 kg of chemical fertiliser per hectare, but they take better yield compared to ours," he added.

GMOA presents 11-point plan to contain COVID spread

The Government Medical Officers' Association (GMOA) has issued an 11-point plan for containing COVID-spread on Sunday. The proposal has been submitted to President Gotabaya Rajapaksa.

"We believe that the grassroots level delivery of care contributed very much to control the pandemic, whereas contribution at the centre, at Ministry level, as well as the testing scheme has not been adequate for the lateral decision-making. Army intelligence reports, too, are in part based on suboptimal analysis provided by the Epidemiology Unit," GMOA said.

'We emphasise on inadequacies in testing as well as hospital capacity to successfully face the crisis situation. The GMOA has always joined to shoulder the burden created by the COVID 19 pandemic upon all aspects of the country and its citizens to controll the pandemic while maintaining day to day affairs with minimal disruption as we elaborated. The absolute necessity of making appropriate strategy decisions on accurate facts to mitigate COVID 19 should never be underestimate," the GMOA's letter to the President said.

The measures proposed by the GMOA include, Establishment of accurate data handling at the Epidemiology Unit, mobilising necessary manpower to the Unit, increasing the testing capacity to an adequate level while minimising discrepancies and establishing a mechanism to accurately amalgamate testing data from both public and private sec-

The GMOA proposes to share data with GPS mapping to all relevant stakeholders including grassroots level preventive and curative services and establish and implement a strategic plan to expand intermediate, hospital and ICU care capacity depending on forecast projections.

It requests to strictly implement guidelines, zonal lockdowns and restrictions based on accurate real time data and projections while enhancing social capital by accurate, effective and cohesive risk communication while negating contradictory statements by authorities.

It stresses the importance of making every effort to procure COVID vaccines in adequate quantities with rational administration according to local and international recommendations. It recommends home isolation of asymptomatic patients on scientific criteria, considering both individual and social factors.

Cabinet approval has been granted to declare an Annual Road Safety Week from this year for drawing special attention of society on minimising motor accidents, Co- Cabinet Spokesman Plantation Minister Dr Ramesh Pathirana said.

He was speaking at the weekly Cabinet media briefing yesterday at the Government Information Department.

Minister Pathirana said that about 8-10 lives are lost every day in motor accidents while most of the victims are men. Therefore, their dependents fall helpless and the number is increasing every year.

Last year, 2,023 fatal accidents have been reported and 2,114 died in them. Of them, 963 were motor-

cycle accidents and 987 died in them. Around 500 deaths are reported annually in three-wheeler and lorry accidents, the Minister said.

The National Council on Road Safety, therefore, has paid their attention on implementing a Road Safety Week from November 21, which is the International Day for commemorating the victims of road accidents and to take necessary action to make aware the private institutions, schoolchildren, drivers and the public to minimise motor accidents.

The Cabinet granted their approval to the proposal by the Transport Minister for declaring a National Road Safety Week from Sunday November 21 and conducting it annually in the future.

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A silver lining

silver lining has emerged across the dark clouds with several congested areas in Colombo city which were hitherto reeling under the Coronavirus now reporting a much reduced number of cases, no doubt a direct result of the first vaccine dose administered to a large segment of the City populace.

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa is heavily relying on vaccines to bail the country out of the pandemic and first signs appear to be favourable if the result in Colombo city is anything to go by. Of course, to be completely immune from the virus the second jab is necessary and the delay in the arrival of the second dose is going to hamper the vaccine programme. The Mix and Match option is now being researched to ascertain if the administering of different vaccines to the same individual will work. This is going to take time and in the meantime, we must make do with what is available.

The dire situation is India has slowed down the arrival of the vaccines on time although 15,000 doses of the Sputnik V vaccine were delivered to Colombo on Monday. The recovery in Colombo though is an indicator that the first jab has proved its efficacy at least to some degree in preventing the spread of the virus. It was feared that those who received the first jab were vulnerable until the second dose was received. The opinion of medical experts that 60 percent immunity could be expected after the first jab seemed to be having a ring of truth vis-a-vis the diminished case numbers in Colombo.

However it is too early to draw conclusions if the good showing in congested areas in Colombo was indeed owing to the fist jab or if this was the result of city folk strictly abiding by health protocols. State Minister Dr. Sudarshani Fernandopulle has stated that the vaccine alone cannot do wonders and that discipline on the part of the public was equally vital in preventing the virus spread. She was among the medical fraternity who recommended restrictions of movement during the New Year festival, echoing the sentiments of the PHIs.

If Colombo city is showing encouraging results the same could not be said of the rest of the country where a runway spread of the contagion is being witnessed with lockdowns being imposed in different locations in rapid succession. For the first time since the outbreak of the Coronavirus, the number of cases has topped 1,000 each for five days running with the highest ever yet of 1,891 cases reported on Monday. That the situation is grim is driven home by Dr. Fernandopulle who asserts that the number of cases within the next two weeks could rise to between 8,000 to 10,000 if the people drop their guard and conduct themselves irresponsibly. If the worst scenario comes true, will our hospitals be able to cope?

Already reports indicate that bed capacity is fast running out and even if cases are accommodated in makeshift or improvised hospitals, if the numbers keep multiplying the way it does medical care is bound to reach a breaking point and medical staff pushed to the wall. Already Deputy Director General of Health Services (DDGHS) Dr. S.M. Arnold has warned against overtaxing the Health Sector's capacity to increase ICU care to COVID-19 patients. He cautioned that if the number of cases increases exponentially they would be hard put to cope with the demand, although there was no immediate alarm on this score with the occupancy rate of ICU beds at 35 percent.

It is not just the case of ICU beds alone, as explained by the doctor, but the question of manning them with competent staff. According to reports there is only one nurse for every 12 ICU beds. It is also not just a matter of deploying any nurse to handle the task but the problem lies in finding competent ones. After all, it takes a couple of years to master the workings of say, an ICU ventilator. With the pandemic swooping on us without warning there indeed was insufficient time to train nursing staff on these lines.

India has deployed interns and final year MBBS students to assist in the fight against COVID under the supervision of senior medical officers to cope with the dire situation in the country with dozens of medical professionals in the field themselves dying from the pandemic. If push comes to shove we too should adopt a similar course, because with the increasing number of positive cases the doctors and medical staff may well reach a crisis point.

How things pan out though will depend on the conduct of the general public. But it appears that little heed is being paid in certain quarters to the stern warnings. With wedding receptions banned in hotels for two weeks the merriment it appears is being shifted to private homes. Police have also raided spots where drinking sprees are held by large gatherings not paying any heed to the health warnings. What danger point are we to reach for the people to realize their folly?

of loud cries and silent sighs of the people in the pandemic-hit neighbouring country have laden the air causing grim feelings and ominous thoughts on how disastrous COVID-19 could be if its shackles were loosened.

Locally, alarm bells have sounded due to a fresh wave of COVID-19 in the post-Sinhala and Tamil New Year season, for which the fingers have been pointed, in hindsight, on the people's unrestricted behaviour and the authorities' lack of timely actions.

It has now been confirmed that the highly infectious UK variant (B.1.1.7), which also has a high mortality rate, is responsible for the current spike of COVID-19 cases in the country, leading to the isolation of over 60 Grama Cabinet has approved the import of 13 Niladari Divisions and Police areas. For the week ended last Sunday, an average of 1,450 new infections of the Coronavirus had been reported daily, consecutively breaking the records of the highest number of daily cases, with an average of about 20,900 daily PCR tests, according to the statistics.

The new cases have been grouped under 'New Year COVID-19 cluster', a name that does not associate with any location but an event celebrated countrywide, giving an impression that the long-denied community transmission has befallen. Having said that, it is no time to hit the panic button as it will only complicate the situation further.

Even in the global context, there is no sign of easing the pandemic with new potent mutations hitting one after the other in different parts of the world. Many countries are seeking solace in COVID-19 vaccines to build herd immunization against this infectious disease, but supply shortfalls compared to the global demand and the emergence of apparently vaccineresistant virus variants have acted as setbacks.

VACCINES

The Government has faced a challenging environment when confronting the more virulent Coronavirus wave in the country. Last week, it decided to add more hospital beds, especially the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds, as many Government hospitals were stretched to the limit with the number of COVID-19 in-patients passing the 10,000 mark. It also assessed the oxygen supplies available for the future use of needy patients.

Weighing its options on how best to tackle the current epidemic situation, the Government last week issued revised restrictions under 'Alert Level 3' and the public have been asked to postpone all functions and events at least for two weeks starting from last Monday. Schools islandwide have been closed and workplaces have been requested to call the minimum staff required for duty, while implementing the 'Work from Home' (WFH) concept as far as possible once again. Many offices duly complied with these directives

The country's COVID-19 inoculation drive, which was started in late January with 500,000 Covishield jabs received as a donation from India under its 'Vaccine Maitri' programme, has run in to a snag as the Serum Institute of India (SII), the world's largest vaccine maker, is not in a position to deliver the ordered stocks of vaccine on time for the second dose. This is understandable as India

he harrowing scenes full has to give priority to vaccinate their population given the dire situation in that country. In a recent interview, the SII Chief Adar Poonawalla detailed the immense pressure he is facing from Indian politicians over vaccine supplies.

As a result, the Sri Lankan Government has been forced to look for sources outside India to meet a shortage of 600,000 AstraZeneca shots for the second dose before the effectiveness of the first dose fades. The roll-out of the second dose for the frontline workers of the military and health sector started last Wednesday with the remaining 300,000 dose stock of the vaccine.

Health authorities are awaiting the World Health Organization's (WHO) approval to go ahead and administer the Sinopharm vaccine, a donation from China, to the locals. At the same time, million doses of the Russian-made Sputnik V, which is said to have a high efficacy rate (92 percent), and the first batch of 15,000 doses arrived in the country yesterday. Made by the famous Gamaleya Institute in Moscow, the vaccine is marketed by the Russian Direct Investment Fund (RDIF). It has now been approved for Emergency Use in nearly 50 countries. In addition, the Government also intends to procure the mRNA-based Pfizer/BioNTech COVID vaccine as soon as possible. Pfizer was incidentally the first vaccine to be introduced to fight COVID.

COMMON ENEMY

"To overcome this challenge, the people must strictly follow all the rules and regulations recommended by the health authorities, as they did in the first wave of the COVID-19 epidemic. Developing countries such as Sri Lanka cannot take lockdown measures or impose curfews that obstruct economic activities. The majority of our country's income earners depend on informal livelihoods. Only a vaccine can end the COVID-19 pandemic. The Government has a systematic programme in place for that. While the Government is fulfilling its responsibilities, the people must fulfil their respective responsibilities for the betterment of the country as well as themselves," reiterated President Gotabaya Rajapaksa recently.

Meanwhile, Opposition Leader Sajith Premadasa has decided to call for a cessation of political hostilities to work together to fight the common enemy. He might have realized that constant criticisms of the Government actions to fight the deadly disease would only depict the Opposition in a bad light in the eyes of the public. In a video statement on Sunday, he expressed the Opposition's support to the Government's efforts to save the

lives of 21 million Sri Lankans from the Coronavirus pandemic.

"I personally phoned the Ambassadors in several key foreign countries requesting their support to secure enough COVID-19 vaccines. I have also requested the diplomats of the United States (US), Australia and the United Kingdom (UK) to help us to obtain mobile hospital units. This is not a time for political power rivalry," he commented.

Several diplomats called on the Opposition Leader, hours before Chinese Defence Minister Wei Fenghe's visit to Sri Lanka last Tuesday. The Opposition Leader had two meetings, the first with a delegation comprising countries of the European Union (EU) including the Ambassadors of France, Germany, Italy and Romania and the second with another group of diplomatic heads representing the UK, Canada, the US, Switzerland, Norway and Australia.

Interestingly, all those countries were co-sponsors of the Resolution on Sri Lanka at the recently concluded session of the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC). The Opposition Leader told the media that a broad range of topics was discussed at the two meetings, but little has come out on the specifics. In an apparent move to balance his foreign relations and thereby to ward off any unfavourable comments, he also met the Russian Ambassador on Monday. Premadasa told the media that he requested health supplies needed for the country from all the envoys.

DIPLOMATIC TALKS

Sri Lanka saw another high-profile visit from China last week led by Chinese Defence Minister Wei Fenghe, in the background of the Government finalizing and going ahead with the 'Colombo Port City Economic Commission Bill' to pronounce the legal framework of the China-funded Colombo Port City. Again, there were not much detail of the talks between the

Chinese delegation and the leaders of the Government. It was reported that the two countries agreed to enhance pragmatic cooperation in all sectors including defence. Many foreign policy analysts observed this visit as a further consolidation of already flourishing ties between Sri Lanka and China.

"Noting that Sri Lanka has prioritised developing the relations with China and firmly supported China's positions on issues concerning its core interests, President Rajapaksa said his country has been pursuing an independent foreign policy and would never bend to pressure from major powers outside the region as well as never forge an alliance with any country," China's Xinhua news agency reported following the meeting.

Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa flanked by several ministers holding key portfolios, including Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunawardena, also met the Chinese delegation for a roundtable discussion.

Hot on the heels of this visit of a high-level Chinese delegation, Indian High Commissioner in Colombo Gopal Baglay called on Prime Minister Rajapaksa last Thursday. The particulars of this meeting were also not expressly stated to the media.

"The Indian High Commissioner met me to brief me regarding the COVID-19 humanitarian crisis that is ongoing in India. I conveyed our sentiments of solidarity to PM Narendra Modi. The Government and people of India are in our prayers. We wish them a rapid recovery from this crisis," PM Rajapaksa tweeted after the meeting.

Moreover, President Rajapaksa wrote to PM Narendra Modi last Wednesday expressing concern about the COVID-19 surge in India. "I am confident that under your able leadership and with the resolute support of dedicated experts and professionals, India will soon thwart the current havoc of the pathogen," he said in the letter.

The President added that Sri Lanka's Buddhist clergy would recite the 'Rathana Suthra' to invoke blessings on the leaders and people of India. According to Buddhist chronicles, the Buddha first delivered the 'Rathana Suthra' to ease the fears and agony of the people hit by famine and plague in India's ancient city known as 'Vaishali'. Several religious ceremonies were thus held at a number of cities in Sri Lanka to invoke blessings on the leaders and people of India, where the monks chanted the Rathana Suthra.

In fact, the time demands words and actions of solidarity among the nations in the name of humanity, surpassing the man-made geographical boundaries. After all, COVID-19 has taught us the important lesson that "nobody is safe until everybody is safe".

hose who contribute to the economy or seek to contribute to the economy during the pandemic should be celebrated. Those who sow panic and advocate hermit-like antisocial behaviour on social media should be rapped on the knuckles, if not censured. But in most societies, these verities are turned on their head during this so-called global event of the Covid coronavirus.

However, the pundits have come out in full force in an attempt to censure those who in small ways at least, patronize a restaurant, go to the corner shop and physically leave the 'virtual world' that is being imposed on them these days. Those who engage with other people and contribute to the economy do so in a technical sense at least at some risk to themselves.

But those who are germaphobic and cloister themselves at home contribute nothing most often, except to the spread of bad news. There is a 'pandemic' of bad news out there that is even more dangerous than the pandemic itself.

Twenty-five years down the road, when the story of the pandemic so called of 2020 and 2021 is written, it would be reviewed very differently in the rear view mirror of history. Similar retrospectives in the past looked at Y2K, for instance, as a fiasco. In the rear view mirror, Japan and Germany's World War II conduct is seen as a mere aberration. These are today two of the most celebrated nations for the capitalist cause, and are held up as examples to Russia, which was considered an invaluable partner of the victorious Allied Forces during WW II, but is now considered errant.

Lived reality

The point is that the lived reality of today celebrates some people and some causes because society still worships at the god-

head of bad news. But it is not the bearer of bad news but the silent worker and the silent delivery person and the rather intrepid patron of a restaurant that has kept especially a country of this sort, sustained during the pandemic.

Meanwhile it has been revealed — due to the pandemic — that so-called Western liberal democracies are mostly Police States. This has been the reality, but it has been suppressed by the news media that has wanted to portray China as authoritarian and regimented, but the West as being liberated and free to the point of being idyllic.

All this has been revealed to be absolute

nonsense because the Police States in some industrialized Western nations have imposed the same if not more severe restrictions to contain the spread of Covid, than China. Moreover, the Western media has been powered by bad news that has celebrated arbitrary rule creation, such as the so-called two-metre distancing that is now supposedly being contemplated, in contrast to the one-metre distancing that was earlier

Those who are calling for total lockdowns are not doing themselves or anybody else any good. The sheer volume of traffic on the streets confirms the fact that people are not about to opt for a shutdown when they know that most of the reactions to this socalled 'new Covid strain', etc., is by way of panic. Even in India, where the bad news machinery of the Western media in particular portrays a picture of misery with queues for wayside cremations, etc., the fatalities from Covid per day stands at 0.0007 percent of the population. For hundred days, it would still be 0.007 of the population, which is not a number for Arundhati Roy to go to an insane fit over.

Hollowed out

Roy, novelist turned social commentator contributed a diatribe to the British Guardian recently calling India's Covid response a "crime against humanity". It was mostly an attack on the nationalist politics of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, but what it ignored was the fact that spreading bad news is not in and of itself a suitable response to the spread of Covid. She never tried to put those numbers in perspective in a country of a teeming population of over

The panic contributes to the slowing down of the economy — and ironically Roy is complaining of the Indian economy, which she writes, has been hollowed out by the Modi Government.

Her brand of bad news contributes more towards the negative economic fallout and all these Cassandras everywhere whether it is Roy in India or any similar NGO hack in Sri Lanka are guilty of making the lot of the poor and the middle classes they are complaining about even worse. It is because they contribute to the negative perceptions that keep economies suppressed during the spread of the so-called global contagion.

The Sri Lankan people have begun to realize that the more they sacrifice ostensibly because of the pandemic, the more they hurt themselves. They have also realized that it is easy for the cunning with political agendas, and other misguided busybodies who do not answer to the general population because they do not face elections, to get around generating bad vibes, and generally attempting to spread panic.

It is also a pity that India has to get such a bad rap over the pandemic. Roy says that there was no "system" in India to collapse, but she knows the country — with a massive population, can sometimes be unwieldy. John Kenneth Galbraith called it a functioning anarchy. To take some endemic issues and to try to pin them on Modi and say that India failed miserably in the face of the pandemic is a stretch. By the same yardstick or at least much similar yardsticks, the United States also failed miserably in the face of the

the beginning. But there cannot be too long a learning curve when running a country is involved — governing is not an experiment, and prescience and wisdom is called for. As for India, "India has possibly saved hundreds of thousands of lives with its decisive (albeit imperfect) interventions.'

That is the dispassionate verdict in a book India's Fight Against The Covid-19 Pandemic, by Chandrakant Lahariya, Gagandeep Kang, and Randeep Guleria. They are not Modi supporters. These are physicians who can make a neutral assessment of things, and do not have to rant as Arundhati Roy does, because she is more interested in a political agenda than she is about

We in Sri Lanka have been fortunately able to avoid all the negative imagery, but the burning bodies in "Covid pyres" in India were bilked by the news industry to create a very alarming picture, which is not the need of the time, because Indians need to be helped to get over the current phase with minimum damage.

Instead, the world is enjoying whipping up maudlin hysteria over our neighbour to the North. Fortunately, the Modi Government is too clever to be tripped up by the negative imagery of these news-cycle theatrics. The Indian PM has weathered many storms before, and he will likely weather this one too, and that is what is most likely despite the fact that those such as Roy have already nailed him to the cross. Besides, she is a novelist, and her imagination keeps running riot. But, by the way, look at Australia. The Aussies will fine and jail their own citizens if they return from India. Talk about Police States.

THE MANY DIMENSIONS OF VACCINE MAITRI

Vaccination in progress in India

s oxygen becomes a luxury for a majority of the populace in New Delhi, . India is gravely reeling under the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. Hailed as the world's third largest pharma hub and positioned at the forefront offering gratis (and also commercial) medical equipment and vaccines to a host of countries, India is now itself scampering across the globe for COVID-related aid. In fact, its flagship initiative Vaccine Maitri aimed at steering forward New Delhi's foreign policy, giving it a robust presence thereby creating a safe spot in the neighbourhood and beyond might just have fallen

As India currently sits at the top of the highly infected countries across the world with cases soaring at the rate of 169 infections per 100,000 people, aid has acquired an altogether new dimension in such testing times. Intended towards building positive synergies in tackling the intricate nexus of sociopolitical and environmental challenges, particularly COVID-19, development partnerships can be viewed from the lens of a realistcum-idealist approach.

Idealists will call New Delhi's vaccine friendship initiative as a thought process embedded in our cultural values and principles. Assisting those in trouble is one such example. On the contrary, realists would argue that this initiative ensures India's firm presence and visibility in the geopolitical canvas. In fact, development partnerships can be termed as a refined version of aid in contemporary times. Has India's vaccine diplomacy under the broader umbrella of development partnerships nosedived, in turn jeopardising its national inter-

A strategic gameplay

Although New Delhi's move to join the bandwagon of vaccine



multilateral institutions, such as the United Nations (UN) and World Health Organization (WHO) failed in responding promptly to the pandemic, one cannot possibly ignore the sustainable partnerships that were led and built by India. However, it was carved out of strategic geopolitical interests. In a bid to appease and woo the hearts of its immediate neighbour Nepal, Vaccine Maitri was kick-started earlier this year by dispatching one million doses to the Himalayan nation. This can be particularly viewed in the aftermath of the burgeoning Chinese influence in the region and also the recurrent territorial squabbles between New Delhi and Kathmandu. In addition, India's vaccine outreach was not restricted only to the South Asian nations but also extended to a multitude of countries in Africa, the Caribbean, parts of Eastern Europe and some regions of Central Asia; an astounding 66 million doses have been distributed to 95 countries so far.

diplomacy came at a time when the



Considering the massive outbreak of the deadly pandemic, international cooperation definitely holds the pivot in solving this crisis; an opportunity which New Delhi has rightly identified and gladly grabbed at the right time. Gaining strategic leverage for its foreign policy goals in the geopolitical context is also acceptable. However, compromising on the inoculation demands of its own citizens is a glaring mistake from New Delhi's side. Early into the first stages of the pandemic when scientists were rushing to develop



a vaccine, India, taking advantage of its pharmaceutical bent, should have systematically charted its distribution amongst the ailing population. Although Vaccine Maitri is rightly being hailed as an "out-ofturn" humanitarian gesture displayed by India, its focus remains primarily on the commercial side. For instance, the commercially sold COVID-19 vaccines by New Delhi stands at 35.7 million compared to the free offerings of 10.7 million.

COVID Aid: Lessons for India

Given the current upsurge in COVID cases resulting in a colossal breakdown of the country's health infrastructure, New Delhi is compelled to now seek assistance from other nations. Responding to New Delhi's plea, the EU, for instance, has extended its support through Team Europe by pledging to provide oxygen and medicines. The USA's COVID aid, on the contrary, came after a series of backlashes. It initially refused to lift the embargo on export of raw materials required for manufacturing the vaccine but in a turnaround, ultimately agreed to dispatch testing kits, ventilators and PPEs. Although President Biden has brought a whiff of fresh diplomacy in comparison to his

INDIA STANDS WITH MAURITII predecessor Trump especially on climate change and migration, their realist "America first" attitude remains intact.

Giving precedence to its own citizens, Washington ensured that vaccinating Americans topped their priority list. This is something that India should have done for its bustling population right in the beginning, instead of doling out vaccines all around the globe. Agreeably New Delhi has been partnering quite handsomely well with major economies of Japan, Australia and the USA, for instance as part of the QUAD. Here, it has pledged to work towards boosting the manufacturing of COVID vaccines in the region. But then again foresight on the vulnerable and susceptible domestic front is also equally essential. With the basket of vaccines now gradually growing, India's development partnership must take a balanced view so as to fulfill its international friendship initiatives and also the national inoculation demands. It is necessary to churn out an appropriate solution which ensures that the world is protected against Coronavirus and at the same time, one's own people are covered as well. GUARDING OUR OCEAN'S DOMAIN

trategically located on the maritime map, Sri Lanka commands an important segment of the majestic Indian Ocean. Maritime security is a vital part of our overall national security objective. The Sri Lanka Navy has faithfully guarded our island for seven decades, and continues to augment its deep sea capacity. Cruising majestically at a speed of 28 knots is the formidable addition to the naval fleet, the SLNS Gajabahu. I went onboard this amazing vessel which has nine floors and two masts. As she cut through the waves, she unleashed a ripple on the waterline and the spray covered her pennant number P-626. This vessel once belonged to the American Coast Guard and was named USCGC Sherman.

She was subsequently handed over to the Sri Lanka Navy. Enhancing the goodwill between both nations the first batch of Sri Lankan officers and sailors visited the port of Honolulu in Hawaii where they trained for almost eight months with their American counterparts. This was undoubtedly an inspiring experience for our Navy's sailors. They had to sail this massive vessel to Colombo. Incidentally, the sea passage from Hawaii to Colombo took 40 days and is the longest recorded sea passage of the Sri Lanka Navy. This voyage had the distinction of crossing the International Date Line (IDL) on April 6, 2019. This remarkable achievement was celebrated at sea in keeping with naval traditions. The ship sailed 8,455 nautical miles to reach Colombo, having crossed the Pacific Ocean, South China Sea, Singapore and Malacca Straits and the Andaman

Today, the vessel proudly displays the crest of a tusker symbolizing the



power of King Gajabahu. The elephant is synonymous with the armies of our ancient monarchs. Commanding Officer of SLNS Gajabahu, Captain H.S.E. Silva leads a crew of 21 officers and 114 sailors. A senior officer explained, "This vessel has a displacement of 3,300 tons. She is 115 metres long and has a beam of 13 metres. She is also equipped with a helipad." I walked the length and breadth of this floating armed fortress along with her Executive Officer and Navigation Officer. The AOPV (Advanced Offshore Patrol Vessel) has five levels below deck and four levels above deck. The flight of ladders is quite confusing for a first timer and only accentuates the magnitude of such a large ship, almost equal to a frigate. Young sailors were moving back and forth through the hatches. The bosun's pipe sent out its high pitched signals above the winds. We walked on to Level Two where the ship's main gun is mounted in a sealed dome-like turret. This is a MK 76mm gun which can accurately fire salvos from a remote controlled firing system. Unlike other vessels in the fleet, this main gun does not require a gunner to be physically present on deck

The target acquisition and firing is done from the Combat Information Centre (CIC) under the command of the Principal Warfare Officer. In addition, the vessel has medium and small guns fitted to enrich her firepower at sea, including a 23mm double gun at the rear. Life on SLNS Gajabahu has its own rewards for the crew. This is the first naval vessel in the Sri Lankan fleet that comes with her own mini cinema and salon. The cinema has cozy blue cushioned seats. We stopped by at the galley (ship's kitchen) where cooks were setting up lunch. Cooking on a ship is not like cooking on firm land. The pitch and roll of the vessel impacts the galley, for which naval cooks are well trained.

Some sailors were on their tea break and shared their experience of being in Hawaii, USA. It had been a rewarding experience for these young men, though for the first few days they missed their rice and curry. However, soon they were able to indulge in Sri Lankan food onboard, with the Americans also happily enjoying some spicy food. During their training, the Sri Lankan crew had to suddenly prepare for an incoming hurricane, which was another new experience. The men also recollected seeing dolphins on their long voyage from Hawaii.

We mounted some ladders and were in the MCR- Main Control Room which is the heart of the ship with her engines and roaring turbines. This vessel has two Fairbank Morse 12 cylinder engines and two Pratt & Whitney gas turbines. Technical crews in blue overalls were busy checking the many valves and indicators. From here we safely passed through a hatch and entered the cabin of some junior sailors. Each air conditioned cabin had space for 14 men with bunk beds. One must learn to live in close quarters, unlike on land. Working on a ship amplifies teamwork which fosters camaraderie. These sailors undertake deep sea patrols that last 11 days and if required can be at sea for 21 days. The ship is well stocked with food and water.

The crews train every week maintaining their safety and firefighting drills. The bosun's pipe delivered another shrill signal, as we found our way to the medical station. This room has the equipment required for basic surgery. After enjoying some tea, we visited the wheel house. This location has a clear vantage point of the forecastle (where the main gun is positioned). An officer explained, "We have two kinds of radar onboard. One is the X-Band radar which can scan the horizon for 96 nautical miles and picks up the heat signatures of any vessel.

Small luminous yellow blips appeared on the screen, indicating the presence of fishing boats and trawlers. The double masts fitted on *SLNS Gajabahu* have an array of antennas. One of the masts had an unusual green garland. It was later explained that this was a naval tradition, to indicate that one of the ship's young officers was getting married on shore.

This was a simple but beautiful gesture of naval brotherhood. After her commissioning parade at Colombo, *SLNS Gajabahu* set out on her maiden deep sea patrol for 11 days. During this time she was able to rescue a sick fisherman at sea and transfer him to hospital. Over the past year the AOPV has engaged in numerous deep sea narcotic detections, foiling various smuggling operations. This vessel represented Sri Lanka at the AMAN 2021 multinational maritime exercise in Pakistan.

This magnificent vessel has specialized sailors on board – divers, marines and members of the Navy's Special Boat Squadron (SBS). She is fitted with a rubber boat that has an endurance of 220 nautical miles. This boat can be launched by automatic hoists while the ship sails holding a cruising speed of five knots.

The naval boarding party is armed and ready to approach and investigate suspicious vessels encountered at sea. It was an awesome experience to be on this vessel and meet her motivated crew. *SLNS Gajabahu* is fitted with a stabilized electronic horizon that can enable a pilot to land a helicopter on the rear heli deck at night. With her motto of 'One Ship, One Crew' this formidable vessel is the pride of the Sri Lanka Navy and our nation's first line of defence.

Nomination of a road security week for drawing special attention of society on minimising motor accidents.

Around 8 to 10 lives are lost per day due to motor accidents at present while most of them are males. Due to this situation, their dependents fall helpless and there is an increasing trend of this number every year. Fatal accidents experienced last year amounted to 2023 while 2114 individuals died from them. 963 out of the amount are due to motor bicycle accidents and 987 individuals died due to them. Also, around 500 deaths are reported annually from three wheel and lorry accidents. Considering all these facts, the National Council on Road Safety has paid their attention on implementing a road safety week from November 21 which is the international day for commemorating the victims of road accidents and to take necessary actions to make aware the private institutions, school children, drivers and the public in order to minimising motor accidents. Accordingly the Cabinet of Ministers granted their approval to the proposal furnished by the Minister of Transport for declaration of a national week on road safety with effect from the Sunday November 21, 2021 and conducing such a week in November annually in

G7 leaders to discuss range of issues

Foreign ministers from the Group of Seven (G-7) developed nations were to meet in London on Tuesday to discuss the most pressing geopolitical challenges facing the world, including Russia and China.

The U.K. is hosting G-7 foreign and development ministers in the first faceto-face meetings since the coronavirus pandemic began, and the first gathering of the group's foreign ministers since 2019.

Geopolitical issues that the U.K. said "threaten to undermine democracy, freedoms and human rights" will be on the agenda Tuesday, including "relations with Russia, China, and Iran, as well as the crisis in Myanmar, the violence in Ethiopia, and the ongoing war in Syria," the government said in a state-

Russia's "ongoing malign activity," the U.K. said, including the build-up of troops on the border

with Ukraine, its imprisonment of opposition figure Alexei Navalny and the situation in Belarus, are high on the agenda.

On Monday, British For-

eign Minister Dominic Raab met with U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken. At a press conference, they reiterated their shared commitment to "maintaining transatlantic unity in defense of our common values and in response to direct threats,' Blinken said.

The talks come ahead of a larger G-7 summit in Cornwall in early June, which will be attended by G-7 leaders including U.S. President Joe Biden who will make his first scheduled trip abroad since taking office.

The G-7 is an alliance of the world's most industrialized nations: the U.K., U.S., Canada, France, Germany, Italy and Japan. The EU participates in all discussions as a guest.

Following talks through

the day Tuesday, the foreign ministers will then hold a dinner discussion with guest countries Australia, India, South Korea, South Africa, and Brunei as the current ASEAN Chair.

Diplomatic relations between the G-7 with Russia remain strained since its 2014 annexation of Crimea from Ukraine which led to Russia's suspension from what was then the Group of Eight (G-8) and international sanctions being imposed on Russia.

Since then, Russia's interference in the 2016 U.S. election, a 2018 nerve agent attack in the U.K., a cyberattack on U.S. government and corporate networks and alleged interference in the 2020 election have prompted further sanctions on the country. The Russian government has repeatedly denied all of the allega-

Meanwhile, relations



between the West and China remain at an impasse since the departure of former U.S. President Donald Trump, yet questions remain over the future of international trade.

International relations with Iran are also in the

spotlight after the Biden administration said it was willing to hold talks to potentially revive the 2015 nuclear agreement with the Islamic Republic. Trump withdrew the U.S. from the accord in 2018.

The U.K. currently holds the rotating presi-

dency of the G-7 and Foreign Minister Raab commented that the U.K.'s presidency "is an opportunity to bring together open, democratic societies and demonstrate unity at a time when it is much needed to tackle shared

threats." Tuesday's discussions will also cover tensions and escalating conflicts in other parts of the world, including the coup in Myanmar.

The U.K. said it would urge G-7 nations to take stronger action against the military junta, including expanding targeted sanctions against those connected to the junta; support for arms embargoes; and increased humanitarian assistance for the most vulnerable in the country.

The situation in Libya, and the ongoing war in Syria are also on the agenda. On Tuesday afternoon, the group will discuss the situation in Ethiopia, as well as Somalia, the Sahel, and Western Balkans.

The London meetings take place as developed nations slowly resume inperson diplomacy after a hiatus due to the pandemic; the last meeting of G-7 foreign ministers took place in April 2019 at

Dinard and Saint-Malo in France.

The U.K. said Tuesday's meeting was a crucial opportunity to revitalize in-person diplomacy and, in addition to geopolitical matters, "will look to establish a shared approach among the world's leading democracies on equitable vaccine access, to agree global girls' education targets, rigorous goals on climate finance and new measures to prevent famine and food insecurity.'

The talks in London come ahead of a high-profile G-7 leaders summit in Cornwall on June 11-13 where U.K. Prime Minister Boris Johnson will gather leaders of member nations, the EU and guest countries.

Covid-secure measures are in place for the London talks, including daily coronavirus testing. All domestic social distancing guidelines will be in force.

India scrambles to treat COVID patients

For three days, Goldi Patel, 25, went from hospital to hospital in New Delhi's oppressive summer heat, frantically trying to find one that would keep her husband breathing.

Four hospitals turned away Patel, who is seven months pregnant with the couple's first child, before she finally found one that would take him. But the level of care at Sardar Patel Covid Care Centre and Hospital, a makeshift pandemic facility on the outskirts of the capital, is so lacking that her husband is begging to leave.

Around Sadanand Patel, 30, people are dying. He has barely any contact with doctors, and limited medicine. With 80% of his lungs already infected, he's terrified of what happens if his condition gets worse.

"I am very scared," Sadanand saidSaturday from his hospital bed, through labored breathing. "If my health gets critical I don't think they will be able to

save me. As coronavirus cases spiral in India, the country's health care system has been stretched beyond breaking point. Beds, oxygen and medical workers are in short supply. Some Covid patients are dying in waiting rooms or outside overwhelmed clinics, before they have even been seen by a doctor.

Only some Covid-19 patients manage to get admitted into India's overburdened hospitals. But once inside, some face a different kind of terror: an absence of medical care or supplies as people die around them.

In February officials ordered the closure of the Sardar Patel Covid Care Centre, believing India had conquered the virus.

When it became abundantly clear that was not

the case, the 500-bed facility reopened on April 26, to chaotic scenes.

Local media reported that despite huge lines of patients outside the hospital, far fewer people were admitted than capacity. Senior officials from the Health Ministry and the Indo-Tibetan Border Police, who run the center, did not respond to CNN's request for comment.

Sadanand was admitted the day after the hospital opened. When Goldi visited a few days later, the facility was crowded, she said.

In the cavernous, warehouse-style facility, some patients lie on beds made of cardboard. There is limited medicine, and Sadanand said he had only interacted with a doctor once or twice in three dayssince he was admitted last Tuesday. He watched two men in beds nearby scream for medicine only to die within hours when their oxygen

appeared to run out. By Saturday, his fifthday in the center, at least five people around him had died, he said. One dead body lay on the bed next to his for hours before it was removed.

India's Ministry of

Health and Family Welfare said last month that it would "swiftly" expand the facility to 2,000beds with oxygen supplies to help address the city's lack of hospital space. About 40 medical doctors and 120 expert paramedics had already been dispatched to the center.

But that target doesn't tally with Sadanand's experience. "The gov-

ernment thinks that they have opened this hospital, the patients here are getting treated," he

like that is happening.' The doctors check on patients infrequently, Sadanand said. He's worried that if he needed medical attention, he would be too ill to call for help. Sometimes he talks with a patient in a nearby bed who

advised him to get out of

the center if he feels even

said. "But actually, nothing

slightly better. You will die lying on your bed because there's no one to call the doctor," he said. Others have had the same experience. Sarita Saxena told CNN Friday her brother-in-law was admitted to the center after being turned away by at

least seven hospitals. She doesn't believe any doctors are treating the patients the only people caring for them are family and friends. Those people risk catching Covid as there are no walls within the center to stop the spread. Others outside the hospital are so worried about the lack of care that they are trying to get their relatives discharged.

Sadanand says he is so scared he repeatedly asked a doctor to shift him to another hospital. He made the same plea to his wife -but nowhere else will take him, Goldi says.


"He was asking me to take him away from this place, that he'll stay home, he doesn't feel good here and he's very scared," Goldi said Saturday.

"I kept trying to explain that if you stay here, at least you will get oxygen."

Lala Lajpat Rai Memorial Medical College (LLRM), a hospital in the city of Meerut, in the neighboring state of Uttar Pradesh, is inundated.

People are everywhere -on stretchers, on tables, on the floor - moaning and desperate for oxygen. There are about 55 beds for 100 patients, according to hospital staff. There are just five doctors. Some patients lie on the floor.

One of those is 32-year-



"I'm getting anxious," she said. "I'm scared that I'll stop breathing," she

Oxygen is a scarce commodity in India, which has reported more than 2.5 million cases in the past week.

Other countries have sent oxygen cylinders and concentrators to India that can help produce oxygen, and the government is ferrying supplies around the country using its train network. Dr. Harsh Vardhan, the Minister for Health and Family Welfare, said Thursday there was adequate oxygen in the country and no

need to panic. "Oxygen was available in adequate quantity earlier and now there is even more," he told reporters outside a hospital. "We have so many more sources of oxygen available in the country ... Whoever needs

oxygen should get it." But hospitals are still struggling.

Some hospitals have tweeted SOS messages, tagging official accounts as they plead for more oxygen to help patients gasping for air. Family members of patients queue for hours outside oxygen refilling centers, holding empty oxygen cylinders. Twelve people -- including a doctor -died at one New Delhi hospital Saturday after the facility ran out of oxygen, according to Dr. SCL Gupta, the medical director

of Batra Hospital. Some hospitals have warned patients that if they want to be admitted for treatment, they will have to source their own oxygen. (CNN)

Australia retracts 'racist' India ban after backlash

fended off accusations of racism and having blood on his hands Tuesday, as he retreated from a threat to jail Australians trying to escape Covid-wracked India.

Scott Morrison's government moved to ban travellers from India from entering Australia until May 15, threatening rule-breakers -including Australian citizens - with prison time. Amid a widespread backlash, Morrison on Tuesday said it was "highly unlikely" that Australians who skirted a ban would be

"I think the likelihood of any of that occurring is pretty much zero," Morrison said in a breakfasttime media blitz on Tuesday. Around 9,000 Australians are believed to be in

dreds of thousands of new coronavirus cases are being detected every day and the death toll is soaring. Among those

trapped are some of Australia's most high profile sporting stars -cricketers playing in the lucrative Indian Premier League. Commentator and former Test cricket star Michael Slater was among those who pilloried Morrison's decision, saying it

was a "disgrace" "Blood on your hands PM. How dare you treat us like this," he tweeted. "If our Government cared for the safety of Aussies they would allow us to get home."

Morrison said the idea he had blood on his hands was 'absurd".

"The buck stops

here when it comes to these decisions, and I'm going to take decisions that I believe are going to protect Australia from

a third wave," he said. "I'm working to bring them home safely," he added, indicating that repatriation flights could begin soon after May 15.

The decision came into force on Monday and was denounced by rights groups and some of Morrison's most prominent allies including Sky News commentator Andrew Bolt who said it "stinks of racism". Australia has largely

avoided the worst of the pandemic through some of the strictest border controls in the world. There is a blanket ban

on travel to-and-from the country unless an exemption is secured. Non-residents are mostly banned from entering and anyone who does come into the country must carry out a mandatory 14-day hotel quarantine. But that system has come under increasing strain as the virus has jumped from quarantine facilities and caused a series of outbreaks in the largely unvaccinated community. The conservative prime minister faces reelection in the next 12 months, and had hoped Australia's relatively successful handling of the pandemic would propel him to victory. (Yahoo)

Former Justice Minister berates Netanyahu

Senior Yamina MK Ayelet Shaked described Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his wife, Sara, as "dictators" and "tyrants" with a "lust for power," and said the premier only cares about his ongoing corruption trial, in bombshell recordings aired on Monday.

The recordings were played on Channel 12, as Netanyahu was engaged in a last-minute attempt to draw Yamina into a rightwing coalition, with his deadline for forming a government set to expire on Tuesday night.

According to Maariv, the comments by Shaked, a former justice minister, were made earlier Monday during a meeting with national religious rabbis, one of whom chose to record her. Channel 12 did not specify who she was talking with. Shaked has been reported to prefer a coalition with Net-

India marks 20 million **COVID** cases

India crossed 20 million reported cases of Covid-19 on Tuesday.

There were 357,229 new cases reported over a span of 24 hours, bringing the total to 20.28 million, according to health ministry

India's first cases were detected in late January last year and the country's total did not cross 10 million infections until December, according to Johns Hopkins University data. But the next 10 million cases were reported in the span of just under five months, mostly in April.

So far, at least 222,408 people have died from the disease, but that number is likely lower than the actual death toll. Media reports suggest crematoriums and burial grounds are overwhelmed with bodies of those who died from Covid-

"The pandemic has now entered the small towns and the villages, and we are now quite worried about how much of a devastation it will cause in those areas where the health systems are not well developed enough to provide support, when even some of the big metros are struggling with the case load on hospitals," K. Srinath Reddy, president at the Public Health Foundation of India told CNBC's "Capital Connection" on Monday.

During the first wave last year, India imposed a strict national lockdown between late-March and May, which derailed the country's growth trajectory and left millions without a source of income.

While the central government appears reluctant to impose a second nationwide lockdown, several states have stepped up restrictions in recent weeks, including local lockdowns and curfews. That includes Maharashtra, which is India's worst-hit state, Delhi, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Karnataka and others.

Some health experts have suggested that India needs a national stay-at-home order and a medical emergency declaration to address current health-care needs.

India's health-care system has been overwhelmed by the sharp rise in cases as it faces a shortage of hospital beds, oxygen supply and medicines to treat patients.

Public Health Foundation's Reddy told CNBC that India needs a two-pronged approach to fight the second wave. First, efforts to vaccinate more than 1.3 billion people must continue.

India faces at least near-term vaccine shortages and just over 2% of the population has received both doses. Starting in May, India is opening vaccinations to anyone age 18 and

Second, India needs a "very strong" containment strategy to reduce the spread.

"What we need to do immediately is to cut down the transmission from person to person, by ensuring that there are no large crowds," Reddy said, adding that India should not allow more than four people to

gather in public places and areas with high positivity rates should be put into full containment

He added that India needs to ensure

adequate social support for people who are recovering at home from milder symptoms.

India's second wave began some time in February when cases started rising again. Before that the country reported about 10,000 infections a day, on average. April saw a steep spike in the curve, with nearly 7 million reported cases. The Indian government is facing criticism for letting large crowds gather for religious festivals and elec-

tion rallies earlier this year. Those mass gatherings likely turned into super spreader events. Scientists say the spike in cases is also partially due to variants of the coronavirus circulating in India at the moment. That includes a local variant called B.1.617 that has multiple sub-lineages with slightly different characteristic mutations. (CNBC)

The Covid outbreak in India is putting the rest of the world at risk and is leaving a 'humanitarian catastrophe" in its wake, the dean of Brown University's School of Public Health warned.

"India is a big country, and if there are large outbreaks there, of course we're going to worry about more variants, which will be bad for Indians, and ... it will spread around the world," said Dr. Ashish Jha. "So part of keeping America safe is vaccinating the whole

The White House pledged to send more

than \$100 million worth of medical supplies to India as the country breaks global infection records on a near-daily basis. The country recorded more than 300,000 new cases for 12 straight days, but experts fear the real numbers could be much higher. Data shows that only about 2% of India's population is fully vaccinated against Covid.

Jha told CNBC's "The News with Shepard Smith" that because the U.S. is now at a point where it has a greater supply of vaccines than demand, that the U.S. should distribute them





Twenty five year old, Dilanka Isuru Kumara, a weightlifter attached to the Sri Lanka Army as a Lance Corporal of the Panagoda Camp won a Silver Medal for clean & Jerk lifting 137 Kg. and won a Bronze Medal lifting a full total of 241 Kg. in the 55 Kg. weight class at the Asian Weightlifting Championship held from 16th to 25th of April, 2021 at Tashkent, Uzbekistan.

He is an old boy of Gettumana Maha Vidyalaya, Kurunegala from Grade One to Eleven and joined the John Kothalawala National School to do higher studies. After leaving school he joined Sri Lanka Army in 2016 and now he is stationed at Panagoda Army Camp.

Isuru Kumara started weightlifting under the coaching of Rukshan Gunathillake, a talented Weightlifter in the year 2010 when he was studying at Gettumana Maha Vidyalaya. At the start he participated at the Junior National Weightlifting Championship from 2011 to 2016 under the 50 Kg. weight class and 55 Kg. weight class without much success. He proved his class at the National Weightlifting Championship when he won his weight class of 55 Kg.continuously from the year 2016

Some sportsmen follow and are inspired by certain popular figures who excel in that particular sport in the International arena. Hasitha Perera was a player who was a great fan and followed Sebastien Chabal the French national rugby player whose performance encouraged him to take up rugby from the school level to compete in the International arena donning the Nation-

Hasitha Perera had a nickname called 'Hassa' in the rugby circles. He was born in 1985 in Colombo and his father was late Gunapala Perera worked as a Mechanic while mother Somawathi was a housewife. He has an elder brother Jeewaka, a former under-19 national football player currently working as assistant swimming coach at St. Peters College, Colombo. Hasitha was over six feet in height and had a playing weight of 120 kgs.

He started his school career with Lumbini College, Colombo from 1991 to 2003 later was offered a scholarship at Ananda College, Colombo to play Rugby whilst continuing his Advanced Level studies from 2003 to 2004. Even though he became the cynosure of all eyes in rugby, he initially competed in other sports like swimming from the age of six followed by football at the age of 12 and then stormed in to handling the oval shaped ball. The body structure of him gave the added advantage in participating in rugby at college where he went on to lock horns in the pack as a second row player.

He played a pivotal role by winning the ball for his team in line outs while giving that extra strength in the rucks and mauls. China's foreign trade surplus likely widened in April, after narrowing to US\$13.8 billion in March. According to Moody's Analytics Asia Pacific Economic Preview China's exports will remain elevated in year-over-year terms due to low base effects as the pandemic wreaked havoc on foreign demand.

But beyond that,pent-up foreign demand is expected to ease over the year, particularly for audio and video equipment and parts, lighting devices, and furniture. Factories have reopened in many major economies, and their domestic manufacturing is picking up speed, squeezing demand on China's exports. The domestic market will play a more important role in digesting and supporting production this year, backing import growth and likely keeping the trade balance relatively narrow. The surge in China's imports in March was largely due to rising prices. The import volume of refined oil and pharmaceutical products slipped compared with December, but their import value soared by more than 35%.

ComBank's turtle protection project sees over 8,000 hatchlings released

Thousands of turtle hatchlings have been safely released to their natural habitat under an initiative supported by the Commercial Bank of Ceylon to protect these endangered mariners and promote biodiversity.

In the past eight months 8,490 hatchlings from 70 protected turtle nests in Panama in the Ampara District were returned to the ocean through the Bank-funded marine turtle conservation project of Wildlife and Ocean Resource Conservation (WORC) of Sri Lanka, a project

Commercial Bank has supported since 2019.

The immediate objective of the project is to protect the nests and eggs of sea turtles within the identified territory from predators such as pigs, foxes, mongoose, spotted iguana and dogs. With Commercial Bank's participation, WORC expanded its efforts to three kilometres of previously unprotected beach last year and another three kilometres in

The initiative benefits four species of turtles including the Videlicet

Green, Olive Ridley, Loggerhead, and Leatherback turtles that call this stretch of beach their home. The success of the collaborative conservation activities last year inspired the Bank and WORC to extend the term of the MoU governing the project. The protection of nests persisted despite interruptions to night patrols, owing to frequent leopard visits at night in the past few months, according to the nest protectors.

f the cinema by definition belongs in halls and not TVs, David Lean was a definite purveyor of the cinema. In a career spanning half a century, Lean directed 17 films, editing 24 others. David Puttnam called him "the greatest storyteller on film", Walter Kerr perhaps "the best British film director", and the New York Times "a meticulous craftsman noted for technical wizardry." These are fragmentary judgments, yet they are right.

Lean is known today for three films in particular: two of them won for him the Best Director Oscar: The Bridge on the River Kwai (1957, shot in Sri Lanka), Lawrence of Arabia (1962), and Doctor Zhivago (1965). Lean perfected the epic form, and these are some of the greatest epics to ever grace the screen. He attempted a comeback after Zhivago, a romance set in the time of the Russian Revolution, with Ryan's Daughter (1970), a similar romance, though not quite on the s scale, set in the time of the Easter Rising.

The result was not to Lean's liking: critics across the Atlantic, including Roger Ebert and Pauline Kael, lambasted it, the latter going as far as to claim it had was "no artistic or moral rationale." Beyond the Atlantic, it proved to be more popular: even in Sri Lanka, where Sunil Ariyaratne saw it at the Quinlon in Nugegoda; he argued that it influenced his work. Dayan Jayatilleka saw it too; he called "forgettably anodyne." Both were correct.

Ryan's Daughter won two Oscars, fewer than the five Doctor Zhivago received: Best Supporting Actor for the person who played a village idiot, and Best Cinematography. Lean vowed never to make a film again: the critics had been too harsh, and perhaps he knew that as cruel as some of their judgments may have been, they were not wide of the mark when they claimed that the historical backdrop of the story, 20th century Ireland, did not cohere with the epic scale of the movie. He had attempted a square peg in a round hole.

Like any perfectionist, he viewed this as an aberration from which he could not recover. He very nearly did not: for the next 12 years, barring a minor work on James Cook, he spent time from the cinema, until, in 1984, he returned with an adaptation of E. M. Forster's A Passage to India. Critics liked it: both Ebert and Kael gushed positively in their reviews. It also won three Oscars. It was to be his last work. Eight years later, while plans were underway for an adaptation of Joseph Conrad's Nostromo, he died in London at the age of 83.

Of his early work as director, two stand out: Brief Encounter (1945) and Great Expectations (1946). Like most of his films




scripts. Brief Encounter is hailed today as a landmark in his country's cinema: the British Film Institute's list of the 100 Top British movies puts it at number two. Great Expectations, number five on that list, is considered a superior, authentic, and moving adaptation of a Dickens story. It also has the most effectively terrifying encounter between Pip, the narrator, and Magwitch, the escaped convict who figures in his life, from any adaptation of that story I've seen.

What intrigues me more than these accolades and achievements, however, is not so much how they are different to his middle period (Kwai-Lawrence-Zhivago) as why they are different at all. The devil is in the detail, the clue in the credits: he wrote them. Lean was an exceptional director in the epic vein, but as a writer, he preferred pianissimos to fortissimos; that quality surfaces discernibly in Brief Encounter's restrained ending.

What was true of Lean was true also of other British directors who migrated to Hollywood: what they directed back home felt more sensitive to the vagaries of the human condition than what they churned out in Tinsel Town. Insofar as this quality distilled Lean, it put him in the same league as Carol Reed and Alfred Hitchcock, not to mention Ridley Scott.

Such comparisons go deep once you see the first few films these directors made in the US, especially Lean: one his first Hollywood ventures was Summertime (1955), a love story centring on an unmarried, middle-aged woman (Katharine Hepburn) and her paramours in Venice, where she spends her money and time in fulfilment of a lifelong dream.

There's nothing in Summertime which suggests the bombastic dialogues, wide landscapes, and symphonic crescendos of



Wilder, the Coen Brothers, Woody Allen, and Quentin Tarantino, his most nuanced work came out in the movies he co-wrote, even in Hollywood. When responsibility for the script shifted to another, Lean, like Ezra Pound translating classical Chinese poetry and Boris Pasternak translating Shakespeare, turned into a versatile conduit for another's vision.

It is hard, if not impossible, to square the Lean of these formative years with the Lean of The Bridge on the River Kwai and Lawrence of Arabia. The latter, the greatest epic ever made, in fact combines two genres: the Western and the war film. Influenced heavily by the films of John Ford, the plot sways from grand desert battles to quiet moments, with a

What is interesting and evocative about after traipsing for days in the desert, when the quietness and the solitude of the moment yield to a symphonic cacophony, only to hold back.

go; it's nowhere to be found in Ryan's Daughter. One can discern a swelling of confidence in these works. The source material doesn't provide the sort of backdrop for them in the same way it did for Lawrence: Zhivago is a love story set in the time of revolution based on a novel that only pretends to know about love or revolution (Regi Siriwardena called it one of the world's most unreadable novels), while Ryan is based, loosely, on Flaubert's Madame Bovary, anachronistically transposed to Ireland.

There's hardly any depth of character in Ryan's Daughter, and the little there is in Doctor Zhivago comes, not from the protagonists, but from characters on the side: even the hero's brother, who in the story's flashbacks does not speak one word, seems more solid.

Zhivago, however, proved to be Lean's biggest box-office draw: it elevated Julie Christie, the lover of the hero, to stardom (she won an Oscar for another movie the following year), and did the same with Omar Sharif, the hero. Depicting communist Russia was not easy in those Cold War days, and Lean had to replicate the entire country in anticommunist Spain. Not surprisingly, like the novel, the film was banned in Russia, drawing polarising responses from Western critics: Pauline Kael went as far as to suggest that it pro-



vided a postcard version of Soviet life, a view I highly doubt the Soviets shared.


Of course these hardly mattered to popular audiences: what caught them wasn't so much the characters, or the authenticity of the locations, as the landscapes and the music. Lacking even this crutch, Ryan's Daughter sagged and meandered badly.

Given Lean's diminished reputation at the time of its release, A Passage to India goes down as one of the more notable comebacks in film history. The movie does its best to conform to the E. M. Forster story, though it deviates from the plot. It ends on a plaintive note, the most discernible departure from the novel, but still strikes the right chord.

On the other hand, it also succeeds, as Lawrence of Arabia did and Zhivago failed to do, to strike a balance between the nuanced sensitivity of his early years and the visions of grandeur of his middle period. The only dissonant chord in the movie is Alec Guinness's performance as a Brahmin, who waxes eloquently and convincingly on Hindu philosophy, but whose face, and accent, betrays the actor beneath the

Satyajit Ray, one of the few detractors of the film, lambasted the acting, the music, and the direction of the plot: he accused it of glossing over Indian life. Was this a mere difference of opinion? Had Ray directed it, and A Passage to India was a project he had wanted to work on long before Lean, it would have been Ray's film, in the same way it is Lean's. Of course, this is not to deny the validity of Ray's criticism, for he was correct: as a South Asian, I find the film's characterisation of Indian life, particularly Alec Guinness's Orientalist ramblings, too misplaced to authenticate anyone but the British characters.

Yet in that he merely shared the one shortcoming of the novel: as Regi Siriwardena observed once, E. M. Forster fails to get into the Indians in the book, in the same way Lean fails to in the movie. Are we being too harsh by both, adopting a criterion for a work of art that may be irrelevant and invalid? Perhaps. Without getting into cultural polemics, then, it would do well to watch Lean's swansong, and his oeuvre, on Lean's terms, in the same way we watch Ray's work on Ray's terms, as part of his own distinct vision.

ut of the many dramatists known to the world at large, three or four major American playwrights are well known to the local theatregoers over four decades. Presumably, they are, to my best observation, are Tennessee Williams, Arthur Miller, Thornton Wilder and Eugene O'Neill. Most of these plays written by them have been adapted to suit either the local perceptive awareness or for the sake of a better rapport between the characters and the intended audiences.

The thematic awareness of most of these plays remains to be assessed as they take the change of audience from different cultural groups. When my friend, late Dhamma Jagoda adapted Street Car as Vesmuhunu to the local audience, there were startling controversies that sprang up. The same happened where the late Sugathapala de Silva adapted another play of the Williams as Hele Negga Dom Putha. Perhaps this embedded theme had not been fully well transformed.

But my basic notion is that the attempt enabled the audiences to grasp the differences in cultural groups and the reasons why those should be transformed into local theatrical creations

HUMAN CONDITIONS

Perhaps the play of Garcia Lorca that came to known to the world as Yerma has been adapted by Gunasena Galappatti as Muhudu Puttu, the veterans of the calibre of late Martin Wickramasinghe and Prof Ediriweera Sarachchandra were enraged. One of the reasons being the gross distortion of the salient human conditions laid in the original works. This perhaps paved the way for Professor Sarachchandra to translate Yerma in association with Professor Sunil Ariyaratne. The playscript was accredited with the honour of a State Literary Award.

I was for a moment reminded of all these nuances as I went on reading the translation of Eugene O'Neill's celebrated play Desire Under the Elms by a well-known performer cum playwright Mahawedage Champa Pushpa Buddhispala. The Sinhala play script that has come out as a printed text is titled Elm Thuru Yata Snehaya as an author publi-

I sincerely felt that the attempt on the part of Buddhipala is perhaps a welcome variant to the availability of the classics around the world. This playscript of Eugene O'Neill (1888 - 1953) was written as far back as 1924. But it remains as I feel the pulse of it as a most modern expressionistic model for the local experimental dramatist as well as the intended performer.

I grip into the conceptual frame that demands more and more translated works in order to ascertain this value of the original creations. This view cannot be undermined in the theatrical activities as we need more and more examples to be drawn into the concept of teaching and learning cross-cultural communi-

cation patterns. In this direction, the translators of the original theatrical works have been lined up as an esteemed team of recreators. The original play of Eugene O'Neill rests on several humane layers of existence. On one hand, it is a calm and serene climate that paves the way for better human relations. In this context, it is a farmyard.

BOOKMARK

O'Neill in his narrative written in a mixed creative form selects more than ten characters. But he temps to focus attention on three humans: one a female and two males. The playscript is packed with human pathos that changes from moment to moment. For me, the entire play in the form of a creative work rests on the two forms, the narrative form fused in the dialogues, songs, dances and musical rhythms.

There is not a single moment of dullness in the reading process. This gives ways to feel that if the script is turned into a theatrical form as selected by a particular director, the result could be a yielding outcome of a meritorious series of performance. The two characters, Cagot and Eben are prominent in the subtle changes that take part in the entire human experiences that address issues of love, hatred, passion and desire. The entire gamut of the experience in the process of reading these lines and perceiving the inner layers or the subtext one may feel that the culmination of the actions ought to take various forms devoid of placing with an assassination of a baby born to the world as a gift.

This may be a point of debate when the play is performed. It had happened in the case of Yerma the Spanish play when it was performed in London on the pulsating womb theatre. I have not seen this particular play as performed on a more modern stage with all the theatrical facili-

But I had the chance of seeing the play at Vanbarsh playhouse as an amateur production. But I sincerely feel that the element that has gone into the creative text needs a healthy discourse, transcending the cultural and racial barriers. Eugene O'Neill has written several plays that had gone into discussions.

STAGECRAFT

One of his major plays titled The Hairy Ape is expressionistic and paves the way for several experimentations that deserve on the stagecraft. O'Neill continued, like Ibsen, the tradition of realism in varying patterns. The play titled Ann Christie that I saw in London is one such example as directed by Paul Davee. In this direction, the play of O'Neill titled Lon Day's Journey into Night was seen as one of the most searching plays of the postwar era in the development of world theatrical patterns. The fairly long preface written to the translation of Buddhipala is a commendable effort that impacts various dimensions in the scriptwriting process of the original playwright Eugene O'Neill. The need for good translations is a lesson in itself.



INDIAN DANCES

ost of the Indian classical dances are deeply rooted in Hinduism and promote spiritualism. Inside the temple courtyard, various religious, cultural and ritual activities were carried out. These activities were directly involved with the moral, spiritual, and upliftment of the individuals. For these purposes certain halls were built up, to hold the kathapirasangaas (sermons). These Katha piarasangaas imparted religious values and epics. Similarly to protect and promote the dance through religious worships, dance halls were built in Tamil Nadu, Orissa, Kerala and Manipur.

Temples played an important role in Hindu society. These temples were built not only for religious worship



Earlier there was a belief that the devadasis were formally married to the god of the temple where they served. And those who were serving in Vaishnava temples were called Sri VaishnavaManikam and the male dancers were called Ari-

Leela dances took place as a form of worship. Each temple had its dance hall, called Nat Mandapa. Even today dancehalls the Nat Mandapas are decorated with leaves, colourful flowers, and white cloth. It is a large Mandapam which accommodates from 2500 to 3000 audience.

In Orissa Maharis held their dance at Nat Mandapa. There is a reference, that at the sun god temple in Kon-

arak, dances took place. The temple was built during the 13th century with Nat Mandapa. This Nat Mandapa was fully and thoroughly decorated with beautifully carved dancing figures. Now it provides an opportunity for dance researchers, art lovers, and foreign tourists to enjoy ancient Indian architecture.

The structure of the Konarak temple resembles the sun god's, chariot driven by seven horses. The Maharis were allowed to perform not only inside the Nat Mandapa but they were allowed to enter the inner temple, with a certain discipline.

In Tamil Nadu, dance halls were built up to promote dance and drama inside the temple premises. These dance halls were very well administered and maintained by the temple authorities. The classical dances of India are based on spiritual and religious philosophy. The female temple dancers were called devadasis, kuthier and Sri Vaishnavamaikam in different temples and different regions.

Hence most of the Indian classical dances were originated in temples and promoted spiritualism. Through spiritualism, these dance forms uplift the souls towards salvation.
