Report

The Honourable the Minister for Agriculture, Land, Irrigation and Power has, by virtue of the powers vested in him under section 18A (1) of the Fisheries Ordinance, No. 24 of 1940, as amended by Fisheries Acts, Nos. 25 and 30 of 1952 and 1956, referred to me for public inquiry and report a dispute that has arisen between certain groups or sections of persons in regard to the operation of madel nets at Kudawa Waraya, Maggona, by his letter No. GE. 2022 of 26th July, 1961.

The subject matter of the dispute is as follows:—

i. S. D. Patrick, S. D. Andrew, S. D. Juan, S. D. Gerard, S. D. Michael and Ana Madappuli of Maggona, on the one hand and C. Don Gerard Madappuli, C. D. Carmel Madappuli and C. D. Stephen Madappuli of Maggona, on the other claim the right to operate madel nets at Kudawa Waraya, Maggona.

The aforesaid parties are unable to agree on the division of turns for the operations of madel nets at Kudawa Waraya, Maggona.

ii. Mrs. T. M. Reginald Cooray, M. D. Andrew Adian Arasecularatne of Maggona, M. S. M. Razeen of Maggona, J. A. S. Jayaweera also claim the right to operate madel nets at Kudawa Waraya, and request that arrangements be made for them to operate madel nets at the said Waraya.

M. D. J. Arasecularatne who claims the right to operate madel Nets on his behalf as well as his two brothers also request that arrangements be made for them to operate madel nets at the said Waraya.

I have also been requested to report not only on the subject matter of this dispute but also on all such matters relating to connected with, or arising from that dispute as may be made in the representations.

I fixed the public inquiry for 9th October, commencing at 10 a.m. at the Divisional Fisheries Office, and the procedure indicated in section 18A sub-section 3 was followed to give due publicity to this inquiry. Written representations made to the Director of Fisheries were also sent to me for my information before the date of inquiry.

At the public inquiry all persons who had made written representations to the Director of Fisheries were present, so were also present a large number of other persons interested in the matters pertaining to the dispute.

The inquiry was conducted on seven different dates and was concluded on 12th January, 1962.

The Kudawa Waraya Bay is a prolific source of fish for a well populated part of the country with spending capacity. The madel operators of the harvest from this bay look upon it as a gold mine and in consequence anyone taking a claim is viewed with hostility.

About twenty years before the dispute concerned in this inquiry there had been a contest over fishing rights between one T. M. R. Cooray an influential headman on the one hand, and another group consisting of S. D. Abraham, S. D. Patrick, S. D. Andrew and S. D. Juan, on the other. The dispute was settled by the Police and the amended agreement, as approved by the A. G. A. Kalutara, was signed by the contesting parties on 18.2.40.

Thereafter the arrangement worked apparently without much conflict until T. M. R. Cooray died in April, 1945.

Shortly after T. M. R. Cooray's death and when his widow started to carry on the madel operations some unknown persons had cut the tackings and ropes of the boats with the object of preventing the widow from carrying on the madel operations. Complaints had been made to the Police on three occasions and a petition had been addressed to the A. G. A. that the other party to the agreement of 1940, desired the monopoly by these sabotage activities. Whether these allegations are true or without foundation. Mrs. Cooray abandoned these operations and gave up any hope of conducting the madel net fishing thereafter.

In 1947, Gerard Madappuli had purchased a net and boat and started to fish with a madel on 28th March, 1947. Thereupon Patrick and his brothers the sons of S. D. Abraham disputed Gerard Madappuli's right to fish, Madappuli instituted proceedings in January, 1948, against Patrick, Juan and Andrew in Case No. D. C. Kalutara 26,779 claiming the right to fish on 3 days a week and for damages at Rs. 150 per day for preventing his fishing. The defendants pleaded that T. M. R. Cooray and their ancestors had exclusive rights to cast madel nets (IC 2). The District Court decreed that Gerard Madappuli was entitled to fish with a madela and that his turn to fish must be regulated between himself and the defendants (IC 5). In appeal the Supreme Court held that the position taken up by the defendants was ill founded, that the monopoly shared by Cooray and themselves cannot be sustained, and amended the decree as follows:—

1. The plaintiff is not entitled to the exclusive right to fish with a madela on 3 days a week and that the defendants are also not entitled to the exclusive right to fish at the Kuda Waraya.

2. The plaintiff and the defendants as members of the public are equally entitled to fish with a madela net at the said Kudawa Waraya.

Whilst keeping the decree of the Supreme Court prominently in mind it is now necessary to advert to the considerations which should weigh in the allocation of the common law rights to the mutual advantage of the groups, so as to be beneficial to the public, and so as to eliminate friction; from whence to discover some common denominator between the various procedures indicated in the evidence which would remove conflict and at the same time ensure an abundant supply of fish.

In these proceedings I have had the advantage of discerning views born of long experience and much reflection from Members of Parliament; Queen's Counsel and members of the legal profession for whose assistance I record my grateful appreciation here and now.

It is now convenient to consider the claims of Mrs. Cooray and her brother A. A. Arasacularatne, Razeem and others. Their present claim is the only matter that may be considered. Their rights are just like the rights of any other person in the country. Mrs. Cooray admitted that her nets were sold. Merely because she alleges her nets were cut she now claims a right which she has abandoned. She has not possessed a boat or a net since 1945. From the time her paru was cut she has not done fishing anywhere. Her position is that if she gets

a right she will buy a boat. Even when Gerard Madappuli instituted a case against Patrick brothers she did not intervene to assert her rights. Nor did she file a separate case claiming rights under the agreement pleaded by the 3rd defendant in his answer (IC 4). In these circumstances her claim to a turn to fish by madel nets is superseded by others who are more vigilant and in possession of boats and nets.

For similar reasons and considerations the claims of Patrick brothers and Gerard Madappuli prevail over those of Razeem, M. D. J. Arasacularatne and his brother.

Mr. Weerasooriya and his associates raised an objection that there was no dispute between persons and groups engaged in fishing. I am of opinion that this objection is of no avail. Whether the Hon'ble Minister was satisfied or not that there was a dispute it is not for me to go behind the terms of reference and question the Hon'ble Minister's reference in these proceedings. My own view is that there is overwhelming evidence that there was a real and substantial dispute among groups and persons which needed investigation and report.

The Kudawa Waraya is a very valuable harbour for the supply of fish to the consumer public. Everything possible should be done to provide an abundant supply of fish on all days when fish is available for harvesting. It is agreed that any person who has the capacity, competence and equipment should be given a turn to fish.

Madel operations must be economical both to the man who conducts the operations and to the consumer public. The operator has to maintain an establishment involving heavy expenditure. He must be competent in the type of fishing. He must be capable of a certain amount of investment.

In his opening address Mr. Weerasooriya stated that there was no objection to any genuine fisherman claiming rights in the Kudawa Waraya and that this right should not be denied to a person who is in possession of a net and boat in a sea-worthy condition. He further stated that there was no objection to Gerard Madappuli getting a turn to fish.

In his evidence Gerard Madappuli said that he already had a paru and a net and that he was making another paru and a net which would be completed by the 15th December, 1961. He further stated that it is sufficient to own two parus and two nets if a person is fishing for the entire three days.

It was also stated that the third 'pola' is worked very rarely and that for the entire season the third turn is worked for only about 10 days. There was also good deal of evidence that the third pola is not favourable for madel fishing. In the result if a person possess a paru and two nets its is not difficult for a person to operate the first and second polas of a day.

There is also the further evidence of Gerard Madappuli to the effect that he was making one additional paru and one additional net. "Once I have the additional paru and net I can operate not only on 4 days but on all 6 days". He said.

Mr. Weerasooriya stated that if we reckon a paru and a net as one unit a person operating one paru and one net would be entitled to one pola out of three polas. On that basis a person like Gerard Madappuli who owns two nets and two parus would be entitled to two polas out of three polas, the third pola having very little value.

On the question of allocation of turns there was a profound and sustained all round attack by all members of the Patrick brothers to show why the "polas" are more profitable than days. Every conceivable argument, legal, financial and political was employed to show that polas were more profitable, more practical and more customary than days but I was convinced that those arguments were addressed with the ultimate idea of concerted action against Gerard Madappuli if he was obliged to take his turn by polas. It appeared to me that allocation by days was more conducive to harmony and less liable to friction during madel operations.

In this connection, I would refer to the amended agreement (X I.C. 10) signed by T. M. R. Cooray and the Patrick brothers who were old campaigners in the madel operations. Furthermore according to the family arrangement between the Patrick brothers and their mother dated 21.5.47 and approved by the A. G. A. the turns were according to days and not polas. In the evidence given by the 3rd defendant in D. C. 26,779 (I. C. 11) "the arrangement among our family that is the 2nd agreement that is 6 days were divided among the 6 of our family". As additional proof that days are more conducive to harmony and peaceful operations I would refer to the representations made by S. D. Andrew, a brother of S. D. Patrick to the Director of Fisheries by his letter dated 29.9.61 and marked X. According to this letter he is the owner of a boat and a net since 1946 and worth about Rs. 8,000. He begs that the owner of each boat and net be given one day in the week to fish in the waraya as the "Pola" system is difficult to manage.

As regards Sundays and Church Festival days, I am of opinion that the public would be benefited by madel operations conducted by those who are willing to work on those days.

Having considered all the evidence and the submissions placed before me, my recommendations to Hon'ble the Minister are as follows:—

- (a) The fishing season at the Kudawa Waraya Bay is deemed to commence on 1st October and terminate on 30th April of the following year.
- (b) A day during the fishing season for the purpose of madel operations commences at 5 a.m. and ends at 5 p.m.
- (c) No madel net is to remain in the waters of the Kudawa Waraya Bay at any time before 5 a.m. or after 5 p.m.
- (d) The allocation of turns during fishing season is by days and not by "Polas" thus:—
 - (i) Every *Thursday* of each of every week commencing 1st October and ending on 30th April of the following year is allotted for madel net operations by C. D. Gerard Madappuli, C. D. Carmel Madappuli and C. D. Stephen Madappuli.
 - (ii) Every *Monday* of each and every week as set out above is allotted to S. D. Patrick.
 - (iii) Every *Tuesday* of each and every week is set out above is allotted to S. D. Andrew.
 - (iv) Every *Wednesday* of each and every week as set out above is allotted to S. D. Juan.
 - (v) Every *Friday* of each and every week as set out above is allotted to S. D. Gerard and S. D. Michael.
 - (vi) Every *Saturday* of each and every week as set out above is allotted to Ana Madappuli.
- (e) If a church festival day falls on a day other than Sunday a person to whom that day is allotted may assign it for madel operations to any other person or persons who are willing to work on such days.
- (f) As regards Sundays I would allot them in rotation to Mrs. T. M. R. Cooray, Mr. Razeem and to M. D. J. Arsecularatne (Mr. Jayaweera having withdrawn his claim) in the following manner:—
 - (a) the first Sunday in the first week of the Fishing season to Mr. Razeem the next Sunday to Mrs. Cooray and the Sunday thereafter to M. D. J. Arsecularatne and so on in rotation.

I would also suggest to Hon'ble the Minister that these recommendations if adopted be reviewed after two years.

FINAL AWARD

The Honourable the Minister of Labour, by his Order made under section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 25 of 1956, 14 of 1957 and 62 of 1957, dated November 18, 1959, referred the dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") and the Associated Newspapers of Ceylon Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") to this Court for settlement. According to the statement of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour dated November 14, 1959, which accompanied the Minister's Order, the matter in dispute between the parties is the termination of the services of the 200 persons mentioned therein.

2. At our inquiry Mr. P. B. Tampoe, General Secretary of the Union, appeared for the Union. Mr. Advocate S. Nadesan, Q.C., with Mr. Advocate M. Rafeek instructed by Mr. C. S. de Seneviratne appeared for the Company. At the request of Mr. Tampoe, agreed to by Mr. Nadesan, an interim award was made with regard to the termination of the services of 190 persons out of the 200 persons mentioned in the reference, reserving for consideration at a subsequent and final award the cases of the 1st to the 9th persons and the 200th person. The interim award dated June 23, 1961, was published in *Government Gazette* No. 12,508 of July 7, 1961.

3. This is the Final Award under section 24 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act described above and it relates to the industrial dispute mentioned above in regard to the termination of the services of the 1st to the 9th persons and the 200th person named in the reference.

4. The inquiry in regard to these persons commenced on December 18, 1961. On that date Mr. Advocate V. Karalasingham instructed by Mr. S. baghawan appeared for the Union assisted by Mr. J. C. Hatch and Miss May Wickremasuriya, Vice-President and Assistant Secretary, respectively, of the Union. Mr. Advocate S. Nadesan, Q.C., with Mr. Advocate M. Raieek instructed by Mr. C. S. de Seneviratne appeared for the Company assisted by Mr. E. E. C. Abayasekara, Secretary of the Company. On the subsequent dates of inquiry Mr. P. B. Tampoe, General Secretary of the Union, represented the Union, while the appearance for the Company was as above.

5. On the first day of hearing it was reported to the Court that the case of the 2nd person mentioned in the reference, Mr. H. S. Peiris, was dropped by the Union and that it was not to be considered. It was also reported to the Court that the parties had arrived at a settlement in regard to the 3rd to the 9th and the 200th persons; that they are not to be reinstated; that they are to be treated as retrenched and that they should be paid in terms of the interim award in regard to those who were considered as retrenched, to wit, 2½ months' wages each, less any ex-gratia payment which might have been received by them. That agreement has already been implemented by the payment to the 3rd person mentioned in the reference, Mr. C. Schokman, of the sum of Rs. 467.63 less Rs. 187.05 previously paid, totalling Rs. 280.58. The 4th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. R. M. Punchibanda, has been paid Rs. 348.75. The 5th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. D. A. Weeratunga, has been paid Rs. 363.75. The 6th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. J. Ariyadasa, has been paid Rs. 442.63 less Rs. 177.05 previously paid totalling Rs. 265.58. The 7th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. J. D. Aloysius, has been paid Rs. 311.15 less Rs. 124.46 totalling Rs. 186.69. The 8th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. H. Anthony Perera, has been paid Rs. 423.88. The 9th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. W. A. Jayaratne, has been paid Rs. 423.88 less Rs. 169.55 totalling Rs. 254.33. The 200th person mentioned in the reference, Mr. S. Gunasekera, has been paid Rs. 1,110.25.

6. The inquiry continued in regard to the 1st person mentioned in the reference, to wit, Mrs. Jeanne Moonesinghe. On the last day of inquiry, the 12th February, 1962, the Union and the Company arrived at a settlement in regard to Mrs. Moonesinghe too. The settlement is as follows:—

- (i) It is agreed that the termination of the employment of Mrs. Moonesinghe shall stand with effect from 30th November, 1959, on the sole basis that the Company was unable to provide Mrs. Moonesinghe with full-time research work of the character for which she was originally recruited.
 - (ii) The Company agrees to make an ex-gratia payment of three months' gross salary to Mrs. Moonesinghe, in addition to all other amounts due to her up to 30th November, 1959, less all amounts received by her on the basis that she has continued in employment up to the 30th November, 1959. This ex-gratia payment is made for the reason that Mrs. Moonesinghe was recruited for a special post of research officer and the payment should not be considered as a precedent in respect of other employees.
 - (iii) Out of the three months' gross salary referred to above, the Company will be entitled to deduct and pay to the Company's provident fund and the Staff Benefit Fund all dues from Mrs. Moonesinghe up to the 30th November, 1959.
7. In the view of this Court the settlements entered into between the parties, as set out above, are just and equitable and the Court makes award accordingly. The termination of the services of Mr. H. S. Peiris, the 2nd person mentioned in the reference, is justifiable for the reasons already set out in the interim award, and the Union has rightly dropped the case so far as he is concerned. He is not entitled to any payment.

8. In the interim award in paragraph 4, the 188th and 199th persons have been mentioned among those whom the Company had stated that they had re-employed. In paragraph 15, through inadvertence, they have not been mentioned among those re-employed. It is therefore necessary to make it clear that the 188th and 199th persons have also been re-employed by the Company and that they are not entitled to the compensation granted to those regarded as having been retrenched. Final award is made accordingly.
