THE EMPLOYEES' PROVIDENT FUND ACT, No. 15 OF 1958

REGULATION made by the Minister of Labour and Nationalised Services by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 46 of the Employees' Provident Fund Act, No. 15 of 1958.

Regulation

The Employees' Provident Fund Regulations, 1958, published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 11,573 of October 31, 1958, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) by the substitution, for regulation 7, of the following new regulation:—

“7. (1) Every employer, other than an employer referred to in paragraph (2), who is liable under the Act to pay contributions to the Fund shall, in respect of each month he is so liable—

(a) send to the Central Bank of Ceylon, together with the contributions payable in respect of that month, a return substantially in Form C of the Second Schedule hereto, and

(b) send at the same time to the Commissioner a duplicate of such return.

(2) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (3), every employer who is liable under the Act to pay contributions to the Fund and who has employed on an average not less than 150 employees in a covered employment during three consecutive months after he first became or becomes so liable, shall—

(a) in respect of each month he is so liable—

(i) send to the Central Bank of Ceylon, together with the contributions payable in respect of that month, an advice of remittance substantially in Form C (1) of the Second Schedule hereto, and

- (ii) send at the same time to the Commissioner a duplicate of such advice of remittance together with a return of changes in respect of that month substantially in Form C (2) of the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (b) in respect of each continuous period of six months ending in June and December respectively, of each year—
 - (i) send to the Central Bank of Ceylon before the last day of July of that year and before the last day of January of the succeeding year respectively, a return substantially in Form C (3) of the Second Schedule hereto, and
 - (ii) send at the same time to the Commissioner a duplicate of each such return.

(3) The Commissioner may, if he considers it expedient or desirable to do so, by order in writing, direct any employer referred to in paragraph (2) to comply with the provisions of paragraph (1). Where any such employer is so directed, such employer shall, instead of complying with the provisions of paragraph (2), comply with the provisions of paragraph (1), until such time as such order is rescinded by the Commissioner.”;

- (2) in regulation 9, by the substitution, for all the words from “ Form C of the Second Schedule ” to the end of that regulation, of the following words:—

“ Form C or Form C (3) of the Second Schedule hereto, as the case may be, a record of the contributions remitted to the Fund by such employer in respect of each month.”

- (3) by the insertion, immediately after regulation 17, of the following new regulation:—

“ 17A. (1) Where the Commissioner is of the opinion that any employee is employed simultaneously under two employers, both of whom are liable to contribute to the Fund in respect of such employee, the Commissioner may direct in writing both such employers or either of them to obtain from such employee a declaration, which shall be substantially in Form R of the Second Schedule hereto, and transmit such declaration to the Commissioner.

(2) Where the Commissioner has given a direction under paragraph (1) to any employer to obtain the declaration referred to in that paragraph from an employee, such employer shall comply with such direction.”;

- (4) in regulation 26, by the substitution, in paragraph (1) thereof, for the words “ his family.”, of the words “ his family, or of his father, mother, brother or sister.”;

- (5) in regulation 29, by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (3) thereof, of the following new paragraph:—

“ (4) Where a member has failed to appoint a person to receive on behalf of a minor any benefit in accordance with the preceding provisions of this regulation, the Commissioner or any officer authorised by him may pay the benefit due to the minor to any person whom the Commissioner or such officer considers in the circumstances of the case to be the guardian of such minor.”;

- (6) in regulation 42 (1)—

(a) by the substitution, in item (k) thereof, for the words “ seventy-five per centum ”, of the words “ forty per centum ”; and

(b) by the insertion, immediately after item (k), of the following new item:—

“ (kk) the purposes for which loans are granted to members must be approved by the Commissioner.”;

- (7) in regulation 60, by the substitution, in paragraph (3) thereof, for the words “ piece rates ”, of the following:—

“ piece rates and the remuneration, if any, paid to him by way of commission for any services rendered to the employer ”;

- (8) in regulation 61, by the substitution, for paragraph (1) thereof, of the following new paragraph:—

“ (1) Every payment made to the Fund under the provisions of the Act or under these regulations shall be made in cash paid into the Cash Branch of the Central Bank or by money order, postal order or cheque made in the name of the Central Bank Account Employees' Provident Fund, and drawn on any commercial bank or in such other manner as the Monetary Board may, from time to time, determine either generally or in the special circumstances of any particular case.”;

- (9) in regulation 62—

(a) in paragraph (1) thereof—

(i) by the substitution, for the words “ Where any contributions ” of the words “ Where any sums have been paid by employers in error to the Fund or any contributions ”, and

(ii) by the substitution, for the words “ being satisfied that such contributions ”, of the words “ being satisfied that such sums or such contributions ”;

(b) in paragraph (2) thereof, by the substitution, for the words “ any contributions ”, of the words “ any sums or contributions ”;

(c) in paragraph (3) thereof—

(i) by the substitution, for the words “ any contributions ”, of the words “ any sums or contributions ”, and

(ii) by the substitution, for the words “ the contributions ”, of the words “ such sums or contributions ”.

The Award

The matter in dispute between the management of Yeepeyem Oil Mills, Limited, 139, Bankshall Street, Colombo, and T. Celis Silva, and others, former workers of Yeepeyem Oil Mills, Limited, is whether the non-employment of T. C. Celis Silva and others is justified and to what relief each of them is entitled, referred for settlement by order dated 21st August, 1961, made by the Hon'ble Minister under section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act.

1. This dispute took a longer time to settle than a similar dispute would take under normal circumstances. The workers were not organized and were not represented by any Union. After their discontinuance from service they had left their villages in search of employment and their new addresses were not known. Hence there was some difficulty in communicating with them and getting them to appoint a representative. The employer appears to have business interests both in Ceylon and in India and it was found difficult to fix dates suitable to him. His Manager is said to have disappeared after the closure of the Mill without delivering to the employer some of the account books and other documents.

2. In the course of the proceedings the parties agreed to a settlement whereby the workers were to receive one and a half months' wages as compensation. Except H. P. Pedrick Appuhamy, the other employees had no claim against the employer for contributions to the Provident Fund as the money had been remitted to the Central Bank. H. P. Pedrick Appuhamy stated that he did not agree to joining the Employees' Provident Fund but the Manager made deductions from his salary promising to have a special provident fund for him. The employer accepted this statement and offered to pay him Rs. 30 which offer Pedrick Appuhamy accepted. The employer prepared a statement of the compensation payable to the employees according to this agreement. This statement was based on the copies of the C form returns in his possession. The employees requested that this statement be checked with the original in the Central Bank. On a comparison it was found that there were differences, some of which were in favour of the employees and others against them. The employees opted to accept compensation based on the statement in the Central Bank. As the employees had not been given work on all normal working days but only on days when work was available the average monthly wages of the last three months are regarded as the monthly wage. Where an employee's wage for a period less than three months appears in the returns the monthly average of the shorter period is taken as the monthly wage.

3. The following employees do not appear to have received any wages during the three months, and accordingly no compensation is payable to them: V. S. Fernando, S. Piyasena and K. Punchigura. It is noted that the names of H. P. Pedrick Appuhamy and L. P. Aron Appuhamy occur twice in the reference. Against H. P. Pedrick Appuhamy's name there is a note that he did not wish to join the Employees' Provident Fund. For this reason the wages drawn by him are not indicated in the returns. Accordingly he is given the average of compensation payable to the others.
