Order

Every person who is a bona fide tourist and who is a citizen of Switzerland shall be exempt from the requirement of possessing a visa for entry into, and stay in Ceylon for a period not exceeding one month if such person is in possession of a valid passport and, where so required by the law of the country to which he is ultimately bound, a visa authorising his entry into that country.

THE REGISTERED STOCK AND SECURITIES ORDINANCE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance (Chapter 420), I, Felix Reginald Dias Bandaranaike, Minister of Finance, do by this Order direct that, of the sum of seven hundred million rupees for the raising of which by way of loan authority has been given by the Appropriation Act, No. 64 of 1961, the sum specified in the Schedule hereto shall be raised in Ceylon in the mode and upon the terms and conditions specified in that Schedule.

Schedule

1. The sum of money to be raised shall be twenty million rupees, and it shall be raised by way of a 21/25 year loan issued at par.
 2. The loan shall be raised by the creation and issue of registered stock only.
 3. The rate of interest payable on the loan shall be 4½ per centum per annum.
 4. The dates in each year on which the half-yearly interest on the loan shall be payable, shall be the first day of June and the first day of December.
 5. A half-yearly appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of Ceylon as a contribution to the sinking fund to be established for the purpose of redeeming the loan shall be made at the rate of 3 per centum per annum, and such contribution shall commence on the first day of June, 1963.
 6. The date of redemption of the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising the loan shall be the first day of June, 1987.
- Provided, however, that the Government shall have the option of redeeming any such registered stock at par on such date subsequent to the thirty-first day of May, 1983, as may be appointed by the Minister of Finance by notification published, not less than six months prior to that date in the *Gazette* and in at least two newspapers circulating in Ceylon.

PROSPECTUS

The List will be opened on June 1, 1962, and will be closed on July 2, 1962, or earlier if the loan is fully subscribed.

Issue of Rs. 20,000,000

CEYLON GOVERNMENT 4½ PER CENT. LOAN, 1983/87, "D" SERIES

Issued at par—Repayable at par

The Central Bank of Ceylon, on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, invites applications for a 4½ per cent. Loan of Rs. 20 millions. The loan is repayable at par on June 1, 1987, but the Government will have the option of repayment at par on such date subsequent to May 31, 1983, on giving 6 months' notice.

Authority.—The loan is raised on the authority of the Appropriation Act, No. 64 of 1961, and under the provisions of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance (Chapter 420).

Purpose.—The loan is raised by the Government of Ceylon to meet expenditure for the service of the financial year 1961–62, under section 2 (1) (b) of the Appropriation Act, No. 64 of 1961.

Form of Issue.—The loan will be issued in the form of Registered Stock. (Leaflets containing the general conditions applicable to Registered Stock are available on application to the Department of Public Debt, Central Bank of Ceylon).

Issue Price.—The issue price is Rs. 100 per cent. payable in full at the time of application. The minimum holding is Rs. 100.

Applications.—Applications will be received by the Registrar from June 1, 1962, and until the list is closed. Applications must be on the proper form and must be accompanied by a remittance in full. Depositors of the Ceylon Savings Bank and Post Office Savings Bank may, by arrangement with these Institutions, forward their applications through these Institutions.

A commission of 1/16 per cent. on the nominal amount of subscription accepted will be allowed to bankers (including the Ceylon Savings Bank and the Post Office Savings Bank), recognised stock-brokers and brokers in respect of applications bearing their stamp. A negotiating fee of the same percentage on the amount of subscription accepted will be allowed to Proctors in respect of applications bearing their stamp.

Payment for Stock.—Payment should be made by cheque drawn in favour of the Central Bank of Ceylon and crossed "on account of Ceylon Government Loan".

Scrip.—Stock Certificates will be issued after receipt and acceptance of the applications.

Interest.—Interest at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum will be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of June and the 1st day of December in each year. The first payment of interest will be on the 1st day of December, 1962, and will be for the period commencing on the date on which the application is accepted up to and including the 30th day of November, 1962.

Taxation.—(i) *Stamp Duty.*—All documents used in the issue, transfer or redemption of the loan will be free from stamp duty.

(ii) *Income Tax.*—Interest to resident holders will be paid without deduction of income tax, but resident holders liable to income tax should include such interest in their income tax returns. Deduction of tax at source will be made from holdings of non-residents. (Current rate of income tax is 33½ per cent. in the case of non-resident individuals, 39½ per cent. in the case of Hindu undivided families and 62 1/9 per cent. in the case of non-resident companies). Persons who are exempt from Ceylon income tax will be entitled to claim repayment of the tax deducted.

(iii) *Wealth Tax.*—Under section 6 (1) (g) of the Personal Tax Act, No. 14 of 1959, investments in securities of the Government of Ceylon are excluded from the wealth of a person, and are thus exempt from Wealth Tax.

(iv) *Estate Duty.*—Government accepts in payment of estate duty such Ceylon Government stocks as may be prescribed. In the case of fully paid stock issued and repayable at par, the stock will discharge an amount of estate duty equal to the aggregate of its face value and the accrued interest thereon. In the case of stock not fully paid, or issued below par, or repayable at an amount other than par the amount of estate duty to be discharged per Rs. 100 nominal stock, together with accrued interest thereon, will be announced from time to time in the *Government Gazette*, but the amount to be discharged per Rs. 100 nominal stock will not be less than the amount originally subscribed or the amount repayable on maturity, whichever is less. The acceptance of any stock in lieu of cash for payment of estate duty is conditional on its being either (a) subscribed for by the deceased when first issued, or (b) purchased by the deceased not less than one year prior to date of death.

Security.—The loan is secured on the Consolidated Fund of Ceylon. A separate sinking fund will be established towards the redemption of the loan under the management of the Monetary Board of the Central Bank of Ceylon, who are the Trustees of the sinking funds. Half-yearly contributions at the rate of 3 per cent. per annum to the sinking fund will be commenced on June 1, 1963.

Public Debt.—The present gross funded public debt of Ceylon is Rs. 1,773,375,377. The approximate market value of the accumulated sinking funds amounts to Rs. 321,797,384. The net funded public debt is thus Rs. 1,451,577,993.

ment) Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957. It relates to an Industrial Dispute between the Democratic Workers' Congress and the Superintendent of Pettigalla Estate, Balangoda.

2. The Hon'ble the Minister of Labour, by his order dated the 12th May, 1959, made by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, referred the dispute to this Court for settlement. The Acting Deputy Commissioner of Labour, by his statement annexed to the reference, set out the matters in dispute as the following demands made by the aforesaid Congress:—

- (1) Over pound rate to tea pluckers should be increased to 9 cents per pound on a daily intake of over and above 23 pounds;
- (2) Weeding contract rates should be increased to Rs. 11 per acre;
- (3) Spraying workers should be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage rate;
- (4) Pruners should be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage rate;
- (5) Letchumanen Kg. should be given back Supervisory Kangany work with back wages;
- (6) Perumal Kg. should be stopped from supervisory work.

3. Since the court was engaged in inquiring into an industrial dispute between the Ceylon Workers' Congress and the Ceylon Estate Employers' Federation, in I. D. 143, in regard to a demand that the over pound rate paid to tea pluckers in 121 estates situated in the Nuwara Eliya and Dimbulla planting districts be increased to 12 cents per pound, the representatives of the Democratic Workers' Congress and the representative of the Superintendent of Pettigalla Estate agreed that the inquiry into the matters in dispute in this case be postponed till an award was made in that case.

The award in that case was published in *Gazette* No. 12,395 of 28th April, 1961. The inquiry into this case was commenced on 11th July, 1961. On that date the court was informed that a Committee of the Ceylon Estates Employers Federation was considering the question as to whether the rate fixed in that Award should not be made applicable to estates throughout the Island, and the representatives of both parties wanted an adjournment. The hearing thereafter commenced on 9th December, 1961, and was continued on the 27th January, 1962 and 3rd February, 1962.

4. At the hearing Mr. Advocate N. Nadarasa with Mr. Advocate Kandasamy instructed by Mr. M. P. Sundaram appeared for the Democratic Workers' Congress. Mr. Advocate G. E. Chitty, Q. C., with Mr. Advocate C. Ranganathan instructed by Mr. Fred Wirasekera appeared for the Superintendent of Pettigalla Estate.

5. The Democratic Workers' Congress, hereinafter referred to as the Union, filed its statement, under regulation 20 of the Regulations framed under the Act, in which it set out that the present rate for over pound is 4 cents per pound; that the norm is 26 pounds for women and 35 pounds for men; that this is irrespective of the number of hours the workers have to work overtime; that the workers get no increments and no bonus although the estate has done much better than other estates where the norm is lower and the rates for over pounds is higher; that the demand of the Union is for the norm for over pounds to be fixed at 23 pounds and for over pounds to be at the rate of 9 cents per pound. The statement in regard to the demand for higher weeding contract rates, the reinstatement of Letchumanen Kangany, and the demand for punishment of Perumal Kangany, need not be set out for reasons which will be clear on reading the later paragraphs. In regard to the demand that spraying workers be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage, the statement set out that the demand was made on account of the strain on the workers and the bad effect of the work on the health of the workers. With regard to pruning, it was alleged that the work was very strenuous and the task set was high.

6. The statement filed by the Superintendent of Pettigalla Estate, Balangoda, hereinafter referred to as the Superintendent, set out that the present rate of 4 cents a pound has been fixed with reference to the conditions prevailing on the estate, both in relation to the terrain, yield and weather conditions over the year, as well as the capacity and efficiency of the pluckers, in such a manner as to ensure a rate which is an incentive to willing workers and provide them with a generous level of earnings over the statutory wage. No reason exists for the lowering of the normal task to 23 pounds as this would only encourage slackness even in normally efficient pluckers. With regard to spraying workers the statement sets out that they were unskilled workers and there appeared to be no reason for differentiating between them and other estate workers. Similarly with regard to pruners, the statement set out that they have no claim to special differentiation.

7. Neither party called any witnesses. Counsel on both sides argued and addressed the court and placed certain documentary evidence before us which will be referred to in due course.

8. With regard to the matter in dispute No. 2, concerning Weeding Contract rates, Mr. Nadarasa stated that the claim might be dropped if the Superintendent would undertake that there would be no compulsion to make the labourers take the

weeding contracts on the threat that if they did not accept the weeding contracts they would be deprived of other work. Mr. Chitty replied that on Pettigalla estate there was no question of any compulsion at all as the labourers always had six days work available in the week and that the work in regard to weeding was done during their spare time on a contractual basis. He guaranteed that the Superintendent would not compel anyone to take up weeding contracts and that the past practice would continue to prevail. The demand in regard to weeding contract rates was then dropped.

9. With regard to the matter in dispute No. 5, Mr. Chitty stated that Letchumanen Kangany left the estate with effect from 29th March, 1960, having given notice of termination of employment and having apologised to the Superintendent. Mr. Nadarasa stated that he dropped the claim in regard to Letchumanen. Mr. Nadarasa also stated that he dropped the claim in the matter in dispute No. 6 in regard to Perumal Kangany.

10. With regard to the matter in dispute No. 1, on the question of rates of over pounds, counsel on both sides repeatedly referred to the Award in I. D. 143 mentioned above. There also appears to be some misunderstanding of the substance of that award. It would therefore appear desirable to make a brief review of that award.

The dispute in that case was in regard to a claim by the Ceylon Workers' Congress that the tea pluckers in 121 estates of Nuwara Eliya and Dimbulla planting districts mentioned in the reference be paid 12 cents a pound as over pound rates on a norm of 23 pounds on a daily intake. The Estate Employers Federation resisted that demand. As stated in paragraph 11 of that Award, the Ceylon Workers Congress had in the statement filed under regulation 20 given no reasons for demanding that the over pound rate should be fixed at 12 cents a pound. The statement only said it was just and equitable and it was left to the astuteness of learned counsel to find reasons for saying that the rate of 12 cents was just and equitable. The arguments advanced and reasons given by Mr. Nadarasa who was counsel for the Ceylon Workers' Congress fell under three categories:—

- (i) Workers on tea estates are grossly under paid. By increasing the over pound rate the deficiency should be made up to enable them to earn a reasonable living wage.
- (ii) Estates make large profits. The profits depend on the production of the workers. The workers therefore have a right to share in the prosperity by being paid higher over pound rates in the absence of a bonus scheme.
- (iii) The current over pound rate is inadequate having regard to the long hours of work, the strain on the worker and the climatic and other conditions in which she has to perform her labour.

All these grounds set out by Mr. Nadarasa were closely examined and analysed at some length and were rejected as unsound in principle. The Court could then have dismissed the claim and made its award accordingly; but, the Court in fairness and justice to the workers proceeded to examine the prevailing rates to see whether the desire of the workers to supplement their normal daily wage by exerting themselves beyond normal was being exploited by the employers to the workers' disadvantage. The evidence showed that 91 of the estates paid an over pound rate of 6 cents per pound while 3 estates paid 4 cents, 8 estates paid 5 cents, and another 8 estates paid 7 cents. Since the vast majority of the estates paid 6 cents per pound the court applied its mind to see whether by paying that figure the employers were exploiting the workers. The Court applied two tests to see whether the payment of 6 cents amounted to exploitation. The evidence was that on the estates in Nuwara Eliya and Dimbulla, during the rush period, the workers keen on earning over pound bonus did not stop work at the normal hour of 4 p.m. but worked for about two hours longer till day light lasted. Mr. Nadarasa asked that the leaves plucked for over pounds, above the norm, be apportioned at 50 per cent as having been plucked during normal working hours and the balance 50 per cent as having been plucked after normal working hours. The court acceded to that request. Now the evidence was that for cash plucking the rate was 7 cents. That is to say, if a worker was engaged not on a time basis but on a piece rate basis the worker was paid 7 cents for every pound plucked. Since half the over pounds plucked in a day was plucked during normal working hours for which labour the daily rate was paid, and half outside normal hours, the rate of 6 cents for the entirety composed of leaves plucked during normal working hours and leaves plucked after normal working hour appeared fair and did not amount to exploitation. That was one test that was applied. The other test was as to whether a fair cross section of the workers who endeavoured to earn something more than the normal wage by an increased output received a reasonable extra sum for their extra effort. The average earnings of the best 20 pluckers during the best cropping months were examined. It was found that they earned 50 per cent or more more than the normal days wage. Hence it was held that there was no exploitation and that the payment at a rate of 6 cents a pound as an inducement bonus was fair. The estates which paid less were asked to bring up their rates to this level for the sake of uniformity in that area whether the rates they paid amounted to 50 per cent more than the daily wage or not while estates which paid higher rates were asked not to reduce so that the reference to the court may

not operate to the detriment of the workers who were getting more. What the court said in that case was "So, when the problem is approached in this way too, 6 cents a pound cannot be said to be an unfair rate." The award should be interpreted in that spirit.

11. Now with regard to the case before us, the ruling rate for the payment of over pound is 4 cents for leaves plucked over a norm of 26 pounds for women and 35 pounds for men. On this subject what the Union says is, "this is irrespective of the number of hours the workers have to work overtime. The workers get no increments and no bonus although the estates have done much better than other estates where the norm is lower and the rate of over pound is higher. The demand of the Union is for the norm for over pound to be fixed at 23 pounds and for payment for over pounds to be at the rate of 9 cents per pound." The words "this is irrespective of the number of hours the workers have to work overtime" is meaningless in view of the admission at the hearing that workers are not called upon to work overtime at all even during the best cropping months. The plucking ceases at 4 p.m. every day and the weighing is over in about half an hour after that. This is an important point to remember when we come to consider whether the 4 cents rate now prevailing is inequitable and unfair. With regard to the demand that the norm be fixed at 23 pounds neither in the statement filed under regulation 20 nor in the arguments advanced by Mr. Nadarasa has any reason been supplied for choosing this particular number. The rate of 35 pounds for men may be ignored because it is mostly women who are employed as pluckers and the norm that has been prevailing on the estate is for them 26 pounds. The Court thinks that norm should be fixed on the basis of some reasonable principle and will consider the principle in a later paragraph. With regard to the demand that the over pound rate be paid on daily intake it would appear that the prevailing basis is a monthly basis. In I. D. 143 the Court examined the question as to whether the over pound rate should be based on a monthly basis or a daily basis and gave its reasons for directing that payment for overpounds be on a daily intake and directed accordingly. It is therefore not necessary to repeat the reasons. The Court grants the claim that payment be made on a daily intake.

12. In I. D. 143, as stated earlier, the Court adopted two tests to see whether the rate of 6 cents per pound resulted in an unfair and inadequate reward for the extra effort of a worker put in in order to produce over pounds and was tantamount to exploitation. One of the tests was on the basis that half the over pounds were plucked during the normal working hours for which a worker received the daily wage and the other half were plucked outside normal working hours for which the prevailing rate was 7 cents, that being the cash plucking rate, what would be a fair wage for plucking the entirety. That test is not available in this case because, as stated earlier, all the plucking is done during normal hours. Every employer has a right to expect that every employee would do an honest day's work during the normal working hours. An honest day's work would mean in the case of a plucker that she would pluck all she can according to her ability during the allotted time. It is for this that she is entitled to the wage which has been fixed by the Wages Board. If that wage is inadequate the matter should be raised before the Wages Board. An Industrial Court cannot usurp the functions of a Wages Board established by law. A worker has a right to be paid the wage fixed by the Wages Board for a normal day's honest work. The employer is under no obligation legally or morally to pay anything extra. But, with the object of stimulating a worker to make an extra effort, beyond her normal best, an inducement bonus is offered in the shape of payments for leaves plucked above a certain norm. The Court should satisfy itself that the desire of a worker to earn something more than the daily wage by putting in this extra effort is not exploited by the employer. For this purpose the second test applied in I. D. 143 is applied in this case. That is to say, does a fair cross section of the workers who endeavour to earn something more than the normal wage by an increased output receive a reasonable extra sum for this extra effort.

13. Document R.4 produced by the Superintendent shows the earnings and out turn of the 30 best pluckers for the 3 best cropping months of November, 1960, April, 1961, and May, 1961. This shows an average earning of Rs. 3.12 by workers per diem. R. 5 also produced by the Superintendent shows the earnings and out turn of the best 20 pluckers for the 12 months July, 1959 to June, 1960. This shows an average earning of Rs. 2.95 per worker per diem. The daily average wage of a woman worker as fixed by the Wages Board including allowance is Rs. 1.89. So that it will be seen that those who are classified among the best 20 workers earn an average during a whole year of a little more than 50 per cent over the daily wage while the best 30 pluckers earn very much more during the 3 best cropping months. We are unable to say that this is exploitation. The Superintendent has produced marked R. 1 a statement showing comparative figures of average earnings by workers per diem of the best 20 pluckers on 8 other estates in the same planting district as Pettigalla setting out in addition the basis of computation, whether monthly or daily, norm, over poundage rate and the 3 best months. A close study of R. 1 is profitable. On estate No. 1 the over pound rate is 6 cents but the average earning is only Rs. 2.67 for the best three months. On estate No. 6 the over pound rate is 8 cents but the average earning is only Rs. 2.82. Estate No. 5, where the rate is 3½ cents under

800 pounds (on a monthly basis) and 4 cents over 800 pounds gives an average of Rs. 3.50. Pettigalla comes second best with an average of Rs. 3.42 for a worker among the best 20 for the three best cropping months. This therefore confirms our view that the rate of 4 cents per pound for over pounds is fair and equitable. The demand that the rate be increased to 9 cents is rejected.

14. The next question that requires consideration is whether the norm of 26 pounds is too high and ought to be reduced. R. 1 shows that on estate No. 1 the norm is 25, on estate No. 2—35, on estate No. 3—25, on estate No. 4—15 to 30, on estate No. 5—30, on estate No. 6—30, on estate No. 7—30 for women and 36 for males, on estate No. 8—24 for women and 26 for males.

So that the rate of 26 for women fixed at Pettigalla compares favourably. We have also shown that on a norm of 26 pounds the average earnings for over pounds are fair. But we do feel that the fixing of norms should be based on some principle. In I. D. 143 the evidence was that while in a large number of estates the norm varied periodically in a small number of estates there was a fixed norm throughout the year. This system in a small number of estates was explained as due to the practice of paying certain sums of money for plucking over and above a particular quantity as an inducement to make an extra effort commenced within the last few years; the experiment was on a trial and error basis. At the time of commencement of this practice certain estates fixed a certain quantity as a norm and paid an incentive bonus for those who plucked over and above that quantity; the fixing of the norm for a whole year was an error; for fear of discontent and dissatisfaction among the workers if this norm is raised at certain times and lowered at other times the estates have left untouched the norm that the workers had got used to. On account of the multifarious changing conditions on the estates in the planting districts of Nuwara Eliya and Dimbulla during the course of a year in the matter of production of flush the Court held that a fixed norm throughout the year was unscientific. The Court also pointed out that during certain seasons of the year the norm fixed by some estates was much less than the 23 pounds demanded by the Ceylon Workers' Congress as an universal norm and to grant the demand would result in the norm operating harshly on the workers themselves. For these reasons the Court refused the demand for an universal fixed norm of 23 pounds for the whole year. The court held that the ideal was for Superintendents to fix the norm daily exercising their experience and knowledge and having regard to the prevailing weather conditions and other factors. In the case of Pettigalla Estate and other estates in that planting area, it would appear that a fixed norm throughout the year has been always in vogue. The explanation given was that except for a small increase during about three months in the year flush is fairly constant throughout the year. So the conditions which apply for the estates in Nuwara Eliya and Dimbulla Districts for the Court's refusal to order a fixed norm do not apply in the case of Pettigalla. As observed earlier, the fixing of a constant norm must be based on some principle. It should not be arbitrary or capricious. The Court cannot think of a better principle than the one set out by the Ceylon Estates Employers Federation in I. D. 143. This is what it said in the statement filed under regulation 20 "An assessment is from time to time made of what a plucker should be capable of plucking within his or her normal eight hour day In regard to green leaf plucked in excess of such normal quantity the plucker is allowed a rate per pound The minimum figure of pounds to be plucked before over pounds are earned is called a norm."

The principle then is that the norm should be fixed by an estimate of what a normal plucker plucking in a normal way within the normal hours can achieve. Now what is the estimated figure in this case? Mr. Nadarasa has produced as P. 1 details of pluckers earnings for 1959/1960 and 1960/1961 in respect of the Upper Division and in respect of the Lower Division of Pettigalla. We do not know how he was able to get these figures but since their accuracy was not questioned we accept them as correct. With regard to the Upper Division for 1950/1960 total pounds of green leaf plucked "for name" is given as 1,227,691 and the total plucking "name" earnings as Rs. 100,801/25. This was earned on the daily wage, including allowance, of Rs. 1.89 for women. Since the number of men employed for plucking is usually insignificant we will calculate on the basis that all the pluckers were women. Rs. 100,801.25 divided by Rs. 1.89 will give the number of man-days worked. This comes to 53,333. When the total pounds plucked for "name" 1,227,691 is divided by 53,333 one will get the average quantity of leaf plucked by a worker in a normal working day working normally. This figure is 23. A similar calculation in regard to 1960/1961 gives the figure of 24. Calculations for the lower division produced figures lower than 23. So that 23 may be taken as a fair average. We would therefore concede the Union's demand that the over-pound rate be based on a fixed norm of 23 pounds for women. We are not fixing the norm for men because we do not have separate figures for men. We leave it to the good sense of the Superintendent to fix the norm for men calculated on the principle we have set out. We realise that in reducing the norm for women from 26 to 23 the enthusiastic worker desirous of supplementing her normal wage by extra effort would earn 12 cents a day more than what she has been earning in the past. There is no question of the estate's inability to bear this extra burden.

The Award

This is an award under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments, Ceylon, (Revised Edition 1956) as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957 and No. 4 of 1962. It relates to an industrial dispute between the Hotel, Bakery and Beverages Workers' Union, 123, Union Place, Colombo 2, and the Proprietor, The Chinese Great Wall Hotel, 491, Galle Road, Colombo 3. The dispute has been referred to me for settlement by arbitration under section 4 (1) of the aforesaid Act. The matter in dispute is whether the dismissal of P. G. Piyadasa on the 17th September, 1960, by the Proprietor of the Great Wall Hotel was justified and, if not, to what relief the said Piyadasa is entitled.

2. Most of the facts are admitted. P. G. Piyadasa was a waiter employed at the Great Wall Hotel. It is alleged by P. G. Piyadasa that he was employed at the said Hotel from March, 1960, till the 17th of September, 1960, on which date he was dismissed. At the inquiry the position taken up by the lawyer of the Proprietor of the Hotel was that he was not dismissed but that he walked out and never came back. In view of the statement filed by the Proprietor of the Great Wall Hotel in which he says that for various reasons enumerated and mentioned therein he had no alternative but to dismiss Piyadasa, I am bound to hold that he was dismissed. Whether he was dismissed on the 17th September, 1960, or as his Advocate, Mr. Nagendra, contended it was on the 18th, makes very little difference. There are only two questions for determination. (1) Was his dismissal justified; (2) if not, what relief is he entitled to.

3. A great difficulty I found in this case is that the Proprietor of the Great Wall Hotel, Mr. Sung, appears to know scarcely a word of English. Mr. B. F. L. Perera, Assistant Commissioner of Labour, who presided over a conference between the parties seems to have found the same difficulty. When cross-examined by Mr. Advocate Nagendra he stated that Mr. Sung was not very conversant with English, but had another gentleman to assist him. Mr. Perera had referred the matter in dispute to Mr. Serasinghe, a very competent and experienced officer, whom he appointed Inquiring Officer in an attempt to settle the dispute. The attempt having failed, the matter has now been referred to me for arbitration. The dismissal having been admitted, it only remains to consider the reasons Mr. Sung gives for having done so. He states that Piyadasa was lazy, inattentive to customers, used to keep away from work, and made his way into the bedroom of the Proprietor at a time when the latter was away, and his wife was resting in bed. The other charges have not, in my opinion, been proved. But with regard to the charge that he entered the Proprietor's bedroom, I am compelled, for the reasons that I shall presently state, to hold that the entry did take place. Mrs. Sung's account of what took place was very convincing and is corroborated by Mr. Moo. But what compels me to hold that the incident did take place is the fact that the Union which represented Piyadasa had the means of refuting the charge if it is false, but did not avail itself of it. Mr. Seneviratne, a representative of the Union, and a very reliable one too, was present at the time of the alleged incident. He is said to have gone upstairs with Piyadasa. According to Mr. Serasinghe it was Mr. Seneviratne who went to open the door to see whether Mr. Sung was there. It was Mr. Seneviratne who attempted to see whether Mr. Sung was available. If that was so, why did Mr. Seneviratne not give evidence and state that Piyadasa did not enter the bedroom? As this alleged conclusive bit of refuting evidence is lacking, though available—Mr. Seneviratne was present throughout the inquiry—I hold that Piyadasa did enter the bedroom. But though he did so, there is no evidence that he said or did anything to insult or annoy Mrs. Sung. He entered the room, I was told, "he went straight inside the store room, then the bath-room, and was searching". It may be that he thought Mr. Sung was inside. It is true, no doubt, that Mr. Sung was generally away on Saturdays. Piyadasa may have, owing to the perturbation caused by the events that preceded his action, forgotten that it was a Saturday. There is also no doubt that the lady occupant of the room was greatly embarrassed and distressed. But whatever Mrs. Sung's reactions were, I am unable to hold that Piyadasa's entry into the bedroom merited summary dismissal, as there is no evidence that it was improperly motivated. What then is the relief that Piyadasa is entitled to? I entirely agree with Mr. Serasinghe that considering the strained feelings between parties it would be inadvisable and even unwise to reinstate Piyadasa. Payment of compensation is what the circumstances of this case indicate. Mr. Livera asks for 6 months' wages. But on what principle can I award Piyadasa this amount? Not only is there no evidence, there was not even a suggestion that he was without employment for a single

15. With regard to the third demand, that spraying workers be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage, as stated earlier, the Union supports the demand on the ground of strain of work and the bad effect of the work on the health of the workers. The Union has not taken the trouble to place before us any medical evidence as to the bad effect on the health of the workers by spraying the chemical composition that is given to them to be sprayed on the tea plants. We therefore reject this ground. With regard to the strain, we have had the container and the fluid weighed together and found it to be 48 pounds when full. No doubt this weight would get reduced as the spraying goes on, but when a container is empty it is immediately refilled. The work is on a task basis. It is done between 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. with a half hour break and the acreage to be sprayed between these hours is 2½ to 3 acres. R. 9 is a list of 9 estates in the area where Pettia-galla is situated and this shows that 2 estates pay 10 cents each beyond the normal wage. On Pettia-galla itself we are told that there are two classes of sprayers. One set operates an ordinary machine while the other operates a motorized machine. The latter class is paid 10 cents a day because it is supposed to exercise some degree of intelligence. We had no demonstration of this motorized machine and we are unable to appreciate the allegation that some degree of intelligence is required. All these motor machines are operated mechanically. Therefore, we are unable to see why any distinction should be made. 48 pounds is a good weight to carry, and when one has to carry that weight or nearly that weight and walk about from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. it is in our view a strain which justifies the demand that something extra should be paid. We direct that without any discrimination between one class of sprayers and another they all be paid the extra 10 cents. We are told that this payment is withheld for about three months to see whether the sprayed plants develop the disease called Blister Blight. If they developed this the extra sum is not paid because the disease is attributed to bad work. We think that the development of the disease need not necessarily be due to bad work. It can be due to some defect in the composition of the material that is sprayed. However, in the absence of any expert evidence on the point, we will not direct that the existing practice be changed.

16. With regard to the demand No. 4, that pruners be paid 25 cents above the minimum wage, the demand is supported by the Union on the ground that pruning is very strenuous work and that the task set is also very high. If the task set is too high that could have been made the subject of a separate demand. We do not propose to go into the question of task. That ground has to be rejected. With regard to the strain on the pruners we think there is a strain. The work involves a degree of concentrated application of the mind, keen observation and constant turning and twisting of the wrist both ways and slashing at the tender growth of branches. R. 3 shows that of the 9 estates referred to there are 6 estates paying an extra sum to pruners; 3 pay 5 cents, and 3 pay 10 cents. We direct that pruners be paid 5 cents a day above the normal wage.

17. We direct that the new norm be adopted and the change over from computation on monthly basis of intake of leaves to daily basis and the new rates for sprayers and pruners do take effect from the 2nd May, 1962.

18. We make award accordingly.

4. Mr. Livera asked for costs of the first day's inquiry as I had postponed the inquiry on the ground that Mr. Sung, the Proprietor of the Great Wall Hotel, was unable to express himself in English and a date had to be given for him to retain a lawyer to represent him. I had stated that I would award costs if I disbelieved the story of Piyadasa's entry into Mr. Sung's bedroom on the day he is alleged to have been dismissed. As I accept the story of his entry into the said bedroom I do not award costs of the first day's inquiry.

5. The compensation of Rs. 200 payable to Piyadasa by the Proprietor of the Great Wall Hotel should be paid through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo Industrial Relations, 21, Vauxhall Street, Colombo 2, within one month of the date of publication of this award in *Government Gazette*.

THE RUBBER REPLANTING SUBSIDY ACT

REGULATION made by the Minister of Agriculture, Land, Irrigation and Power by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 8 of the Rubber Replanting Subsidy Act (Chapter 437).

Regulation

The Rubber Replanting Subsidy Regulations, 1953, published in *Gazette* No. 10,594 of October 3, 1953, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 11,741 of May 8, 1959, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) by the substitution, for regulations 4 and 5, of the following new regulation:—

" 4. (1) The amount of the subsidy payable in respect of areas authorised for replanting on replanting permits issued on or after November 1, 1961, shall be computed in accordance with the following rates:—

- (a) where the area to be replanted forms part of a small-holding, the rate shall be one thousand two hundred rupees in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted;
- (b) where the area to be replanted forms part of an estate not less than ten acres but under one hundred acres in extent, the rate shall be one thousand one hundred rupees in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted;
- (c) where the area to be replanted forms part of an estate not less than one hundred acres in extent, the rate shall be one thousand rupees in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted.

(2) The subsidy referred to in paragraph (1) (a) shall be paid in six instalments in the following manner:—

- (a) the first instalment of one hundred and fifty rupees for each acre shall be paid after the eradication of the existing rubber trees and other vegetation in the area to be replanted;
- (b) the second instalment of two hundred and fifty rupees for each acre shall be paid after the completion of the replanting;
- (c) the third instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than one year after the completion of the replanting;
- (d) the fourth instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than two years after the completion of the replanting;
- (e) the fifth instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than three years after the completion of the replanting; and
- (f) the sixth instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than four years after the completion of the replanting.

(3) The subsidy referred to in paragraph (1) (b) shall be paid in six instalments in the following manner:—

- (a) the first instalment of one hundred and fifty rupees for each acre of the area to be replanted shall be paid after the eradication of the existing rubber trees and other vegetation in the area to be replanted;
- (b) the second instalment of two hundred and fifty rupees for each acre shall be paid after the completion of the replanting;
- (c) the third instalment of one hundred and seventy-five rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than one year after the completion of the replanting;

- (d) the fourth instalment of one hundred and seventy-five rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than two years after the completion of the replanting;
- (e) the fifth instalment of one hundred and seventy-five rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than three years after the completion of the replanting; and
- (f) the sixth instalment of one hundred and seventy-five rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than four years after the completion of the replanting;
- (4) The subsidy referred to in paragraph (1) (c) shall be paid in five instalments in the following manner:—
- (a) the first instalment of one hundred and fifty rupees for each acre shall be paid after the eradication of the existing rubber trees and other vegetation in the area to be replanted;
- (b) the second instalment of two hundred and fifty rupees for each acre shall be paid after the completion of the replanting;
- (c) the third instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than one year after the completion of the replanting;
- (d) the fourth instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than two years after the completion of the replanting; and
- (e) the fifth instalment of two hundred rupees for each acre shall be paid not earlier than three years after the completion of the replanting.
5. (1) The amount of the subsidy payable in respect of areas replanted on replanting permits issued prior to November 1, 1961, shall:—
- (a) where the area to be replanted forms part of a small-holding, the rate shall be one thousand rupees in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted;
- (b) where the area to be replanted forms part of an estate not less than ten acres but under one hundred acres in extent, the rate shall be nine hundred rupees in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted;
- (c) where the area to be replanted forms part of an estate not less than one hundred acres in extent, the rate shall be seven hundred rupees in respect of each acre of the area to be replanted.
- (2) The subsidy referred to in paragraph (1) (a) shall be paid in five equal instalments in the following manner:—
- (a) the first instalment shall be paid after the eradication of the existing rubber trees and other vegetation in the area to be replanted;
- (b) the second instalment shall be paid after the completion of the replanting;
- (c) the third instalment shall be paid not earlier than one year after the completion of the replanting;
- (d) the fourth instalment shall be paid not earlier than two years after the completion of the replanting; and
- (e) the fifth instalment shall be paid not earlier than three years after the completion of the replanting.
- (3) The subsidy referred to in paragraphs (1) (b) and (c) shall be paid in four equal instalments in the following manner:—
- (a) the first instalment shall be paid after the eradication of the existing rubber trees or other vegetation in the area to be replanted;
- (b) the second instalment shall be paid after the completion of the replanting;
- (c) the third instalment shall be paid not earlier than one year after the completion of the replanting; and
- (d) the fourth instalment shall be paid not earlier than two years after the completion of the replanting. "
- (2) by the re-numbering of regulations " 6, 7, 8, 8A, 9, 10, 11 and 12 ", as regulations " 7, 8, 9, 9A, 10, 11, 12 and 13 ", respectively.
- (3) by the insertion, immediately after the new regulation 5, of the following new regulation:—
- " 6. In computing the amount of subsidy payable in any case where the area to be replanted is less than one acre in extent, or where such area includes an outstanding part which is less than one acre, the rates specified in such provision of regulation 4 or regulation 5 as is applicable to that extent or outstanding part of the area shall apply in the proportion that such extent or outstanding part of the area bears to an acre "
- (4) by the substitution, in paragraph (b) of the re-numbered regulation 8, for all the words and figures from " 240 at the time of replanting " to the end of that paragraph, of the following words and figures:—
- " 220 at the time of replanting, 200 at the end of the first year after the completion of the replanting, 180 at the end of the second year, 180 at the end of the third year, and 160 at the end of the next succeeding two years "
- (5) in the re-numbered regulation 9—
- (a) by the substitution, in column I of that regulation, for the figures and words " 8½ inches and 11 inches ", of the figures and words " 10 inches and 12½ inches "; and
- (b) by the substitution, in column II of that regulation, for the figures and words " 7 7/8 inches and 9½ inches ", of the figures and words " 9 inches and 11 inches ";
- (6) in re-numbered regulation 10—
- (a) by the substitution, in paragraph (a) of that regulation, for the figure " 6 ", of the figures and word " 7 and 8 ";
