Regulations

1. The Tax leviable and payable under section 2 (1) of the Act, shall not be levied or paid in respect of any of the following persons:—

- (a) Any person leaving Ceylon from any airport which is not controlled, either wholly or partly, by the Director of Civil Aviation.
- (b) Any person leaving Ceylon by an aircraft belonging to the Royal Ceylon Air Force, where such aircraft is engaged in military purposes.
- (c) Any person leaving Ceylon by a military aircraft belonging to a foreign Government, where such aircraft is engaged in military purposes.
- (d) Any person leaving Ceylon by a civil aircraft owned by a foreign Government, where such aircraft is engaged in a non-commercial flight carrying officials or persons constituting a mission.
- (e) Any person leaving Ceylon by any ship belonging to the Royal Ceylon Navy.
- (f) Any person leaving Ceylon by any ship belonging to a foreign Government, where such ship is engaged in military purposes.
- (g) Any person leaving Ceylon by any ship belonging to a foreign Government, where such ship is engaged in a non-commercial voyage carrying officials or persons constituting a mission.
- (h) Any person who is a guest of the State.
- (i) Any person who leaves Ceylon within 3 days of his arrival in Ceylon.
- (j) Any person embarking at Talaimannar for the purpose of proceeding to Dhanushkodi.

2. (1) The operator of every ship or aircraft shall, before the departure of such ship or aircraft, furnish to the competent authority or to his authorised representative, a list of the passengers due to leave Ceylon by that ship or aircraft, indicating whether each such passenger is liable to pay the Tax or not, and shall also furnish a certificate signed by such operator that the Tax has been recovered in respect of every passenger who is liable to such Tax.

(2) The list of passengers and the certificate referred to in paragraph (1) shall be substantially in Form A specified in the Schedule hereto.

(3) Where the certificate referred to in paragraph (1) is not furnished by the operator to the competent authority or his authorised representative, the competent authority or his authorised representative shall have the power to detain the ship or aircraft in question until such certificate is given.

3. (1) Every operator shall forward to the competent authority, in respect of each fortnight, a statement, substantially in Form B specified in the Schedule hereto, showing the number of passengers who left Ceylon by ship or aircraft of which he was the operator, the names of the ships or aircraft, the dates of departure and the sums collected by the operator by way of Tax from the said passengers.

(2) The statement referred to in paragraph (1), together with the total sum of money collected by way of Tax during the fortnight to which that statement refers, shall be sent to reach the competent authority within 16 days from the end of that fortnight.

4. In these regulations—

“ Act ” means the Embarkation Tax Act, No. 19 of 1961;

“ Director of Civil Aviation ”, “ competent authority ” and “ operator ” have the same meanings respectively as in the Act; and

“ Tax ” means the embarkation tax leviable and payable under section 2 (1) of the Act.

THE Report of the Arbitrator appointed to inquire into the dispute that has arisen between the fishermen permanently resident in the Mannar Divisional Revenue Officer's division, Musali Divisional Revenue Officer's division, Mantai Divisional Revenue Officer's division and the migrant oru and mechanized boat fishermen from Negombo and other areas, in regard to their respective fishing rights in the Ceylon waters adjoining the coastal areas of the Divisional Revenue Officers' divisions of Mannar, Musali and Mantai, is hereby published for public information.

Any person who is affected by this fishing dispute or any matter relating to or incidental to this dispute and who desires to make representations on any matter dealt with in the Report, should do so in writing to the Minister of Agriculture, Land, Irrigation and Power, before the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notification in the *Gazette*.

Mannar Fishing Dispute Report

The above dispute was referred to me for enquiry by a letter dated March 6, 1961, from the Minister of Agriculture, Land, Irrigation and Power. The text is as follows:—

"In terms of section 18A (1) of the Fisheries Ordinance No. 24 of 1940, as amended by the Fisheries (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1952 and 30 of 1956, I refer to you a dispute that has arisen between the fishermen permanently resident in the Mannar Divisional Revenue Officer's division, Musali Divisional Revenue Officer's division, Mantai Divisional Revenue Officer's division and the migrant oru and mechanized boat fishermen from Negombo and other areas in regard to their respective fishing rights in the Ceylon waters adjoining the coastal areas of the Divisional Officers divisions of Mannar, Musali and Mantai.

2. The subject matter of the dispute is as follows:—

The fishermen permanently resident in the Mannar Divisional Revenue Officers division, Musali Divisional Revenue Officers division and Mantai Divisional Revenue Officers' division claim the exclusive right to fish in the Ceylon waters adjoining the coastal areas of Mannar, Musali and Mantai. They allege that the fishing operations by migrant oru and mechanized boats fishermen from Negombo and other areas in these and adjacent waters adversely affect their own fishing operations. They request that migrant oru and mechanized boat fishermen should be prohibited from fishing in the Ceylon waters adjoining the coastal areas of the Divisional Revenue Officers divisions of Mannar, Musali and Mantai and from operating from these waters.

Some of the migrant oru fishermen from other areas allege that they have been fishing in these waters for a long time but all of them claim the right to fish in these waters. They also allege that their mode of fishing does not adversely affect the fishing operations of the fishermen permanently resident in the Divisional Revenue Officers Divisions of Mannar, Musali and Mantai.

3. I have to request you to hold a public inquiry into and report not only on the subject matter of this dispute but on all matters arising from this dispute which may be mentioned in any representations to you in accordance with the provisions of this section.

I have to add that in the 1956 revised edition of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon the Fisheries Ordinance appears as Chapter 212 and that the section which authorizes the Minister to refer a dispute to a person for public inquiry and report is now numbered 20 (1). I mention this because this latest edition of Legal Enactments was used at the inquiry and will be used by me in my report on all matters other than those relating to the preliminary formalities.

In terms of section 18A (3) of the Fisheries Amendment Act, No. 25 of 1952, I issued a notice dated March 7, 1961, and appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 12,314 of March 10, 1961, inviting all persons interested in the dispute to make written representations to reach on or before March 17, 1961. I also stated that I would be commencing the public inquiry at Mannar on March 28, 1961. Thirteen (13) representations were received.

The public inquiry which was initiated on March 28th could not be continued owing to restrictions of movement which had been prescribed by emergency regulations. However the opportunity was taken to allow representatives of the parties to make addresses which gave the gist of their case. It was soon apparent that the local fishermen had no serious complaint against the migrant oru fishermen from Negombo, in fact they wished to make common cause against the mechanized boat fishermen from Negombo.

As no regulations had been laid down, I had to devise my own procedure. It was agreed that the local fishermen should state their case first. As Commissioner, I summoned public servants whenever necessary. But generally the form of inquiry of courts of law was followed.

After the stringencies of the "emergency" had abated a further session of public inquiry was held on November 15, 1961, Mr. Navaratnam who appeared for the local and oru fishermen pleaded that his clients had not been able to engage senior counsel as the migrant mechanized boat fisherman from Negombo had done and requested a further postponement. Eventually by consent, future sessions were held in Colombo.

This explains why I have taken so long to finalise my report. In summary I held sessions of enquiry on March 28, November 15 and December 13, 14, 15 in 1961, and on January 17, 18, 19, 20, 22, 23 in 1962—11 days in all. In addition I made personal inspections of the Mannar coast on November 14, 1961, and on January 30, 1962.

Fishing Rights.

Before I discuss the facts, I think it desirable to make a few observations on fishing rights. Learned counsel explained the law to me and brought a number of Supreme Court judgements to my notice. The law is fully expounded on *Madappuli vs. Patrick* 54 N. L. R. 366 and is confirmed in *Modera Patuwata Co-operative Fishing Society Ltd. vs. Gunawardena* 62 N. L. R. 189. Both the judgements are comparatively recent, and were made after the Fisheries Ordinance came into effect.

It is there laid down that under the common law, every member of the public has an equal right to fish in any part of the open sea.

However the rights may be curtailed, regulated or even abrogated by statute. This is actually the case in Ceylon. Section 33 (1) of the Fisheries Ordinance Cap. 212 for instance empowers the Minister to make regulations "for the regulation and control of the fishing industry, for the protection of fish in Ceylon waters, and generally for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to the principles and provisions of this Ordinance".

It is therefore clear that notwithstanding rights over the use of Ceylon waters by individuals, the Minister in charge of Fisheries has the power to reduce or even abrogate such rights. It is to be noted however that the Fishing Ordinance does not confer any power to the Minister to control fishing beyond, "Ceylon waters".

As for custom the judgement in Madapulli vs. Patrick makes it clear that custom can regulate rights but never extinguish them. A custom can have the force of an agreement only if it is proven to exist long established and reasonable. But even then custom is an arrangement between parties to solve problems in a particular situation. It cannot bind other parties who might subsequently choose to exercise their rights in the same waters. "Custom cannot create a rule to deal with a future difficulty". The Minister in charge of Fisheries has, of course, the power to perpetuate an existing custom by framing regulations.

Ceylon Waters.

The waters in respect of which regulations may be made under the Fisheries Ordinance are "Ceylon Waters" section 35 of Cap. 212 defines the phrase as follows:—

"Ceylon Waters" include

- (a) the territorial waters of Ceylon, and
- (b) all public bays, rivers, lagoons, estuaries, streams, tanks, pools, ponds and channels and all other public inland waters.

"Territorial Waters" means the part of the sea within a distance of three nautical miles from any point of the coast of Ceylon measured from low-water mark of ordinary spring tides.

So far the law is clear. But counsel for the local fishermen drew my attention to a proclamation by His Excellency the Governor-General in the name of Her Majesty the Queen dated December 19, 1957, and appearing in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 11,222 of December 20, 1957. It reads as follows:—

"Whereas international law recognizes that the sovereignty of a State extends to the belt of the sea adjacent to its coast, commonly known as the territorial waters of that State, and as international practice is not uniform in regard to the extent of the territorial waters of a State, it is necessary to declare the extent of the territorial waters of Ceylon.

Now therefore, I, Oliver Ernest Goonetilleke, Governor-General of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare that notwithstanding any rule of law or practice to the contrary which may have been passed in relation to Ceylon or any part thereof, the territorial waters of Ceylon shall extend into the sea to a distance of six nautical miles measured from the appropriate baseline".

I have considered the terms of this proclamation carefully. It appears to me a mere declaration of the sovereignty of Ceylon over a belt of six miles of sea water adjoining its coast. It does not seek to amend existing law but claims the right to introduce legislation if necessary to any operations within the extended belt of territorial waters.

I therefore conclude that the proclamation does not supercede the restricted definition of the Fisheries Ordinance. All it does is to make it open to the Legislature to amend the limits of territorial waters in the Ordinance. This has not been done and the Fisheries Ordinance cannot therefore empower the framing of regulations to control fishing operations beyond the limit of three nautical miles.

Beach Seine Fishing.

The local fishermen who are parties to this inquiry use a large net called the beach-seine (Madal in Sinhalese and "Karavalai" in Tamil). Such a net is set in the sea opposite a stretch of sea shore called a "padu" and hauled in by ropes attached to the net. The length of a padu on Mannar island is about a quarter of a mile and the furthest end of the seine may be two miles or more from shore. It will be seen that this mode of catching fish is an encircling movement to trap fish which are occupying a large area of water.

The fish caught may well be local inhabitants but by and large success depends on the trapping of shoals of fish which wander round the continental shelf for purposes of food breeding, etc., and tend frequently to approach the shore. Sometimes these fish are caught after prior spotting and at other times by blind routine. It is only necessary to point out that any other form of fishing which deviates fish away from the shore will have a disastrous effect on beach-seining which depends on fish entering its area of coverage.

Beach-seining may be primitive in origin and capable of improvement but the fact remains that it makes the most important single contribution to Ceylon fishing. It has been admitted that the figures in P.20 are not accurate but I think they are sufficiently reliable to give a general idea of the scale of operation. It would appear that beach-seine fishing contributes between 40 to 50 per cent. of the total landings in Ceylon of which about 10 per cent. comes from Mannar District, which produces about 5 million pounds per annum including fish for curing. This comes (vide P.30) from 68 padus. Allowing for inefficient padus, a good padu should produce fish to the order

of say 100,000 lbs. a year: The average catch per year in the chief area of dispute, i.e., the southern coast of Mannar island is probably higher.

There are no reliable figures of beach-seine population in Mannar district but on a basis of 50 per padu the amount of direct labour is 3400. This makes the catch per man about 1,500 lbs. a year, say 7 lbs. a day as fishing cannot be carried out in all places throughout the year. This tallies closely enough with the figures in table III of P. II—Ceylon Beach Seine Industry so that the estimate of population employed is probably not far wrong. It does not, of course include dependents or those who get indirect employment.

The sea shore is the property of the Crown. On Mannar island the Government Agent has issued a few padu licences to persons who are inhabitants of villages who have taken to fishing only in recent times. But most padus have not been licensed at all. Fishing villages have enjoyed the right of using continuous stretches of beach, in order to prevent disputes, land-marks have been placed to separate padus of different villages. The beach attached to a particular village is divided among Samatis by agreement. These are persons who own nets and manage fishing operations. As it happens, there are more samatis than padus and it is necessary to use a system of rotation. In other words all suitable padus on Mannar island have been and are utilized.

These considerations indicate that it would be unwise and uneconomic to disturb the main features of what is a well organized industry. At the same time, one cannot reasonably suggest that the status quo should be completely preserved. It is clear from the evidence of Dr. Canagratnam, Research Officer that there is room for improvement in beach seine fishing technique, it is equally clear that there is no question of any exclusive right for beach-seine fishermen in Mannar. There has to be provision for the development of other forms of fishing. In this connection I would refer to my earlier comments on the force of custom. Custom cannot bind fishermen who take to new forms of fishing and wish to make use of Mannar waters.

Oru Fishing.

"Orus" are outrigger canoes with sails. An oru is capable of going up to twenty-five miles from shore but does not generally proceed so far. Its mobility is limited by wind and current. The orus operating near Mannar do not appear to go beyond the horizon, i.e., about 8 miles. Orus use both lines and drift nets, the latter being used in coastal waters.

It has been the notice for oru fishermen of Negombo to fish in Mannar waters. In the year 1944 there was a dispute between them and the local fishermen. Their complaint was that oru fishermen (who came to Mannar from January to Easter and July to September) set drift nets in gaps in a reef that runs parallel to the Mannar island south coast and reduced the beach seine catch.

The matter was taken up by the Hon. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike on January 6, 1944. His decision was recorded in the following form:—

"The Minister's decision with regard to the Negombo fishermen is to issue 23 licences this year on the basis that the same number of boats use the kottus i.e., 23 boats and that they should not come too close to the shore, ordinarily within three miles. The Minister will start framing regulations to make it illegal to use drift nets except on licence from the A. G. A., subject to conditions regarding distance from the shore, season, hours of fishing and transferability, etc., and that only fishermen who came regularly previously be issued licences. Such licences be issued by the A. G. A. to local fishermen at his discretion. The object of the regulation would be to safeguard the interests of local fishermen while preserving interest acquired by individual migrant fishermen over periods of years. It is obvious that the intention is to restrict straight away and to bring about a steady diminution of the number of licences. A hereditary right from father to son for issue of those licences is not recognized though exceptional circumstances may be taken into consideration.

Regulations were drafted out were never passed probably because there was no need for them. Both groups appear to have discovered a modus vivendi so much so that on this dispute, the oru fishermen have sided with the Mannar beach seiners and not with the Negombo mechanized boat owners.

Mechanized Boats.

These are a recent introduction. Mechanized boats (the smallest about 26 feet long) have a theoretical range of 30-35 miles but in practice keep to about 15 miles from the shore. They can use both lines, gill nets and drift nets. They are much more mobile than orus and less affected by weather conditions.

It is hardly possible to ascertain the average catch of a mechanized boat. Evidence indicating considerable variations were given by different witnesses varying from 350 lbs. to under 100 lbs. of fish a day. B.22 gives the catch at Negombo to be 1,400,000 lbs. in 1960 and 600,000 lbs. in 1961. The latter figure is perhaps incomplete. I do not have the figures for 1960 but there were according to P.27 161 mechanized boats in Negombo on December 13, 1961. On this basis the average catch is of

the order of 10,000 lbs. per boat. At any rate a number of boats will be required to produce the effort of a single Mannar padu.

My estimate is rather confirmed by the evidence relating to loans for boats. The full cost including equipment is about Rs. 17,500 and repayments amount to Rs. 500 per mensem. Many apparently find it difficult to find this sum in addition to the running costs of about Rs. 400 per mensem and may default on monthly payments.

I need only add that little purpose is served by mechanized boats fishing just outside beach-seine waters. There seems no dispute on this point. Mr. Stanislaus Fernando one of the Negombo mechanized boat fishermen stated that his normal field of operation was 10 to 20 miles from shore. This is sound practice on general principles, as the mechanized boat then taps waters which are difficult even for orus to reach.

The policy quoted by the Ministry in charge of fisheries is at P.7. It states that mechanized boats should have the freedom to fish in any particular area provided that they do not interfere with or adversely affect the fishery of any particular area. It also states that until an adequate number of fishery harbours are built, mechanized fishing boats should be allowed to come ashore at any (Sec.) point. I presume any "point" means "some point".

The Reef.

Before I come to the actual facts of the dispute I have to mention that there has been continual reference at the inquiry to a reef which is 2½ to 4 miles away from the shore and runs from Nadukuda eastwards parallel to the southern shore of the island of Mannar. It does not appear on the nautical map P2 although the part further south in the pearl bank area is indicated.

But there has been common agreement among the witnesses from Mannar and Mr. Lanza oru fisherman as to the existence of this reef. Chevalier Feldano a Samati gave evidence that he had visited and seen the reef a few feet under water. I note in passing that this reef was mentioned (apparently without protest) even at the 1944 inquiry held by the Hon. Bandaranaike and that the Director of Fisheries pointed out that the reef did not exist for 10 miles from Talaimannar. This is consistent with the statement that the reef commences at Nadukuda.

I accept the evidence of Chavalier Feldano that this reef actually exists with gaps in it.

The dispute between oru and beach seine fishermen.

As I have suggested earlier there is no dispute. It is true that on their own admission oru fishermen fish by the gaps in the reef south of Mannar island and this must cause some interference with the movements of fish towards the shore, and it was hardly possible for the beach-seine fishermen to make a protest that the mechanized boats were interfering without bringing in the oru fishermen.

The general tenor of the evidence was that the agreement of 1944 was in force and was honoured by both parties. Moreover in terms of the agreement the oru fishermen are a dying group.

In these circumstances, I recommend that the status quo be maintained and that no regulations be framed to give legal force to the existing arrangements. It would be a pity to disturb the harmony which now exists and it will be time to introduce regulations if and when serious disputes arise.

The dispute between mechanized boat and beach-seine fishermen.

This dispute arose out of the arrival of some sixteen, possibly eighteen mechanized boats from Negombo, which beached at Talaimannar near the old light-house on or about the 14th February, 1961. This was the area where the oru fishermen kept their boats and the arrival of the mechanized boats was looked upon as an unjustifiable intrusion.

Mr. Pietersz, Assistant Director happened to be on circuit and held an inquiry at the Kachcheri. The evidence of Mr. Gowth. Divisional Fisheries Inspector is that the Government Agent persuaded the migrants not to fish from Talaimannar and create a breach of the peace.

Without notice the mechanized boats set out for South Bar which guards the entrance to the Mannar Lagoon. They beach their boats about half a mile from the western entrance to the lagoon, opposite the end of the road that leads from Mannar to the shore. According to the sketch produced by the D.R.O. Mannar (P.31) it looked as though the half mile west of the entrance referred to was not padu at all. But I verified on inspection with the Government Agent that the padus extended up to the entrance itself. In fact I saw a beach-seine operated across the entrance.

The mechanized boatmen stayed here for sometime and were prosecuted and fined for using Crown land for the erection of huts.

This brief summary gives the general background. The months mid January to mid April are the best months for inshore fishing and the Mannar beach-seine fishermen consider that the migrants are interfering with and reducing the best catches of the year.

Interference with beach-seine fishings.

There was some sort of evidence that the mechanized boats (like the orus) lay in wait at the gaps in the reef referred to and laid drift nets to entangle fish that were making their way to shore. Mechanized boats can carry a bigger array of nets than orus and I am satisfied on the evidence, especially that given by Dr. Canagaratnam, that such nets while catching a limited number in a shoal are liable to deviate the course of the rest of the shoal away from the reef and from the beach seines. Such a practice is therefore uneconomic and wasteful.

Whether such interference actually took place is difficult to determine. What is important is that the local fishermen were aware of the effects of interference and rose in fear and protest. This explains possibly why the fishermen of Mantai and Musali (rather away from the field of operations) joined vigorously in the protest.

Bearing in mind the policy of the Ministry, I consider that mechanized boats should seek to fish six miles and more from the shore. This will permit the beach-seiners and those who use smaller nets to exploit the first three miles of water from the shore. The next three miles subject to suitable restrictions would be available for oru fishermen. This pattern follows the evidence of the oru and mechanized boat fishermen as to where they fish as it suggests nothing new.

Unfortunately there is no legal sanction to bring this into effect as the Fisheries Ordinance does not provide for regulations to cover fishing beyond the three mile limit. I therefore recommend that—

- (1) The Minister should consider the advisability of extending the limits of territorial waters to six miles from the shore.
- (2) Fishing of any kind by mechanized boats in the present territorial waters adjoining the coastal areas of the Divisional Revenue Officers Divisions of Mannar, Mantai and Musali should be prohibited.
- (3) That owners of mechanized boats should be asked not to fish within six miles of the coastal areas referred to and that those who transgress this request should not be given landing or other facilities by Government.

Arrangements for landing fish.

The terms of reference of my inquiry relate primarily to interference, but I have also been asked to report on "all matters arising from this dispute which may be mentioned." I have therefore to make some observations on the anchorage of boats and the landing of fish.

I have already indicated the conditions under which I consider mechanized boats should operate around the coastal areas of Mannar District. It is well that sound principles be adopted before the virgin expedition of 1961 becomes a permanent practice. Migrant fishermen should not expect to be allowed to create "confusion worse confounded" merely because they possess common law rights. But they are entitled to fair treatment in the area which they visit.

In other words there is no point in permitting Negombo migrants to fish around Mannar district unless they are allowed some place to land. The ambit of mechanized boats is limited and they have no facilities for refrigerating or insulating fish. Thus temporary "harbours" have to be found on Mannar Island either on the southern coast or the western tip.

Even though it be feasible from a technical point of view, there is no case for beaching mechanized boats between, padus.

Such a practice will be unworkable and strongly resented. The only possible places for beaching or anchorage mentioned were the coast near the old Talaimannar lighthouse and the South Bar. Unfortunately no technical evidence was led, nor was any available as far as I could ascertain in the Fisheries Department.

I inspected the coast near Talaimannar old lighthouse but I cannot recommend its use for the following reasons:—

- (1) All available Crown land has been allotted for fishermen's huts and the local inhabitants will not be willing to give theirs;
- (2) The oru fishing boats are already beached there;
- (3) The spot is remote and difficult to keep under surveillance; an important factor in view of the proximity of India and international traffic.

For these reasons the site appears to be unsuitable but if my objections can be overcome, there is no reason why it should not be used.

None of these objections apply to South Bar. I do not mean the coast on the two sides of the South Bar which are padus and cannot be occupied. I mean rather the waters of Mannar lagoon which has two entrances to the sea. One the western entrance already referred to and another more to the east. Between these entrances and the town is the railway bridge nearest the station. To the west of the bridge on both sides of the railway line are long stretches of flat unused Crown land which can be used as a fishing camp. Though no definite road exists, the site is accessible to a van.

The water by the bridge is quite deep. A passerby in a canoe said it was two fathoms. The only point, and a difficult one, is to find a suitable pathway from the sea to the railway bridge.

The one inch map shows a channel through the eastern entrance and which passes under the bridge. But there may be difficulties in using it for mechanized boats requiring 4-5 feet of water. For one thing local opinion says it is silted; for another the bar has this year not washed away as completely as usual.

The other entrance leads by a circuitous route to the other side of the bridge. It would appear that this route will be navigable at high tide.

The prospects of using the site I have mentioned cannot be gauged with any accuracy. If it fails to provide a practicable solution, and no other place can be found, I see no alternative to holding up the Negombo expedition. In this matter, I sympathise strongly with the fishermen of Negombo. They have shown enterprise and a sense of adventure. If they fail to achieve their object it is only on account of adverse geographical factors and it is up to Government to consider constructing a navigable passage to the camping site as early as possible, or provide other suitable harbours.

I therefore make the following recommendations:—

- (1) that regulations be framed prohibiting the use of beach seines or other fishing across the two entrances to Mannar lagoon on the South Coast and any navigable channels;
- (2) that the land on both sides of the embankment to the Railway bridge nearest to Mannar be reserved as a camping site;
- (3) that immediate steps be taken to ascertain whether the bridge can be reached from the sea through either of the two entrances. Boats can be anchored near the bridge;
- (4) that for such purpose two or three boat owners for Negombo be invited to make the experiment;
- (5) that if the experiment succeeds, 20 boats be licensed to operate from the camping site at times prescribed by the Government Agent;
- (6) that if the experiment fails, migrants be not permitted to beach their boats in the Mannar coast this year and that steps be taken immediately to dredge, if possible, a channel up to the bridge so that migrants may operate in 1963;
- (7) that if any other suitable site for anchoring or beaching other than the Mannar lagoon be found, the migrant fishermen be permitted to use it on licence;
- (8) that the Department of Fisheries should survey the coast and coastal waters and endeavour to estimate the number of mechanized boats that can economically operate from Mannar District and to locate suitable harbours to house them;
- (9) that the inhabitants of Mannar be given encouragement to use mechanized boats themselves to exploit the waters beyond the limits of beach-seine fishing.

My recommendations are the best I can make but do not solve the entire problem for a number of reasons—

- (1) the problem is a long term one;
- (2) the development of mechanized boats has proceeded without a corresponding development in harbour facilities. (In Negombo, the harbour facilities were already present and so difficulty arises);

(3) technical evidence on the nature of the coastal waters was not available.

My solution is intended to be a temporary expedient until a permanent solution on the basis of my report is found. There is no doubt, and the policy prescribes it, that migrant fishermen must be found harbour facilities and that if they do not exist, they must be provided. But as the migration is of very recent origin, it is important that it should not be permitted to disturb a well developed local industry and to prejudice the establishment of a permanent arrangement by which all types of fishing can exist side by side to the advantage of Ceylon.

I had hoped to find a solution by compromise. Counsel for the local fishermen suggested working on issues and admissions but this was not acceptable to Counsel for the migrant fishermen. I did not feel entitled to insist on this procedure and evidence was recorded (though without full formalities) as in a Court of law. I consequently found myself personally responsible for the final recommendations. They will, I suppose, please neither side, but I have tried my best to be fair and to fall in line with Government Policy.

I have many persons to thank; learned Counsel who were of great help to me in expounding the law and drawing attention to pertinent facts; Government servants and members of the public who gave evidence; officers of the Department of Fisheries and the Government Agent, Mannar, who accompanies me on inspection; and last but not least the Stenographers and Interpreters who worked with high efficiency and goodwill.

Lastly, I should mention that the migration season is already on. The Negombo migrants agreed to stay action till this report was made. It is therefore necessary for the Ministry to take such steps as may be necessary without delay.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS "Haemorrhagic Septicaemia" disease has broken out among cattle in the Villages of Nildandahinna, Kalaganwatta and, Amban-Ela in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Walapane in Nuwara Eliya District of the Central Province, I, Ariyadasa Amarasinghe, Chief Government Veterinary Surgeon, by virtue of the powers vested in me under the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance (Amendment) Act, No. 33 of 1957, and in terms of section 4, sub-section (1) of the said Ordinance (Chapter 327), do hereby declare an "INFECTED AREA" the area bounded on

North by: Weduruwa Korale, Gampaha Korale West, Gampaha east and Kandapahala Korale.

South by: Kandapala Korale and Talpitigam Pattuwa.

East by: Wiyaluma Korale, Gampaha Korale, Medapalata Korale, Yatipalata Korale, Udapalata Korale, and Dambawinna Palata Korale.

West by: Ambagamuwa Korale, Dimbula Korale, Udapane Korale, Ramboda Korale, Maturata Korale, Kohake Korale and Ganga Palata Korale.

2. Under section 7 of the same Ordinance, I proclaim that no movement of cattle or cart traffic from and to these areas shall be allowed, until this proclamation is revoked.

3. The attention of all cattle owners and carters in the area, is drawn to the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, which lays down the actions which persons are by law required to take in an "INFECTED AREA". Details of these Regulations can be obtained from the Government Veterinary Surgeon Nuwara Eliya and the Divisional Revenue Officer Walapane.

This declaration shall take effect from the date hereof.
