ORDER No. 146

The power to reprimand, or to impose a fine not exceeding one week's pay on any officer of the Forest Department specified in Column I of the Schedule hereto, whose pensionable emoluments do not exceed Rs. 2,700 per annum or whose non-pensionable emoluments do not exceed Rs. 3,180 per annum, is hereby delegated to the officers of that Department specified in the corresponding entry in Column II of that Schedule, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) those powers shall be exercised according to such instructions as may be issued from time to time by the Public Service Commission;
- (b) any person dissatisfied with a decision made by an officer under any power delegated to such officer under this order may appeal therefrom to the Public Service Commission; and
- (c) in any case where the Public Service Commission decides that any power of punishment delegated to an officer shall be exercised by the Public Service Commission, such officer shall not exercise that power in that case.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed or construed to derogate from, or to affect in any other way, the right of appeal to the Public Service Commission conferred by section 61 of the Ceylon (Constitution) Order in Council, 1946.

3. The Order No. 112 published in *Gazette* No. 11,465 of August 1, 1958, as last amended by Order No. 121 published in *Gazette* No. 11,814 of July 24, 1959, is hereby further amended in the Schedule thereto, by the omission of the items relating to the Forest Department.

PART IV

Overtime Rate

In respect of each hour of work in excess of the normal working day, the minimum overtime rate shall be the minimum hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum daily rate by eight) increased by 50 per centum of such minimum hourly rate.

PART V

Weekly Holiday (section 24)

Every employer shall allow each Sunday as the weekly holiday to all workers employed under him :

Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on a Sunday, subject to the following conditions :—

- (1) that a day within the six days next succeeding such Sunday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday ;
- (2) that in respect of work done on a Sunday that worker shall be paid as remuneration one and a half times the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day ; and
- (3) that no worker shall be employed on such Sunday for more than nine hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal).

The remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid along with the wages payable for that period.

PART VI

Annual Holidays (Section 25)

1. (a) If a male worker, not under 18 years of age, has worked under the same employer for more than 228 days in any year, he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of four days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 228 :

Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 284 days.

(b) If a female worker, or a worker (irrespective of sex) under 18 years of age has worked under the same employer for more than 204 days in any year, such worker shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of four days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 204 :

Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any period of work in excess of 260 days.

(c) If a male worker, not under 18 years of age, has hackled and tied for the same employer more than 9,576 pounds of bristle fibre in any year, he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of 180 pounds by which the number of pounds of bristle fibre hackled and tied by the worker exceeds 9,576 pounds :

Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any quantity of bristle fibre hackled and tied in excess of 12,096 pounds.

(d) If a female worker, or a worker (irrespective of sex) under 18 years of age, has hackled and tied for the same employer more than 8,568 pounds of bristle fibre in any year such worker shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of 180 pounds by which the number of pounds of bristle fibre hackled and tied by the worker exceeds 8,568 pounds :

Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on an employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any quantity of bristle fibre hackled and tied in excess of 11,088 pounds.

2. For the purpose of sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph 1, " days on which the worker has worked " includes—

- (a) every holiday allowed by the employer to the worker under section 25 of the Wages Boards Ordinance (Chapter 136) in any year under consideration ;
- (b) every day of absence on any grounds approved by the employer ;
- (c) every day of absence due to any injury to the worker caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment ;
- (d) every day of absence due to any occupational disease specified in Schedule III of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 139) ;
- (e) every day on which the employer fails to provide work for the worker ;
- (f) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal, provided such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days in any year ; and
- (g) every holiday or day of absence from work to which a worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance ; but shall not include the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24 of the Wages Boards Ordinance.

3. For the purposes of sub-paragraphs (c) and (d) of paragraph 1, a worker shall be deemed to have hackled and tied 42 pounds of bristle fibre on—

- (a) every day allowed as a holiday by the employer to the worker under section 25 of the Wages Boards Ordinance (Chapter 136), in any year under consideration ;
- (b) every day on which the worker is absent on any grounds approved by the employer ;
- (c) every day on which the worker is absent on account of any injury caused by an accident arising out of and in the course of his employment ;
- (d) every day on which the worker is absent on account of any occupational disease specified in Schedule III of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Chapter 139) ;
- (e) every day on which the employer is unable or fails to supply raw materials sufficient for the worker to hackle and tie 42 pounds of bristle fibre ;
- (f) every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal, provided such days do not in the aggregate exceed 30 days a year ; and
- (g) every day of absence from work to which the worker is entitled by or under the provisions of any written law other than the Wages Boards Ordinance ; but shall not include the day fixed as the weekly holiday under section 24 of the Wages Boards Ordinance (Chapter 136).

4. A worker shall be allowed his holiday or holidays on a day or days to be mutually agreed upon between him and his employer.
5. The remuneration for each holiday shall be the average daily wage of the worker obtained by dividing the total wage (excluding overtime) earned by the worker for the days on which he has actually worked in the last six months of the qualifying year by the number of such days.
6. Payment for the holiday or holidays shall be made before the commencement of such holiday or holidays.
7. Where a worker intends to leave his employment of his own accord or is to be discontinued or dismissed from employment on any date, he shall be entitled to take and shall take before that date—
(a) every holiday which he was entitled to in respect of the last preceding year and which he has not already taken; and
(b) where the worker has during the current year complied with the provisions relating to employment and work set out in paragraph 1, every holiday which, but for the termination of his employment, he would be entitled to in the next succeeding year;
and he shall be remunerated for such holidays in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of these decisions.
8. The foregoing decisions shall not apply in respect of employment at any time prior to January 1, 1960.

(e) throughout Friday in every week.
(ii) Every hairdressing saloon, barber's shop, laundry, dry-cleaner's shop and dyer's shop situated within the area specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be closed for the serving of customers—
(a) until 7 a.m. on each day except Friday in every week,
(b) at and after 5 p.m. on Thursday in every week,
(c) at and after 7 p.m. on Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday in every week, and
(d) throughout Friday in every week.
(5) (i) Save as otherwise expressly provided in paragraphs 4 and 5 of this Order, every shop other than a hairdressing saloon, barber's shop, laundry, dry-cleaner's shop and dyer's shop situated within any of the areas specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto (other than a shop to which the provisions of paragraph 3 apply) shall be closed for the serving of customers—
(a) throughout Sunday in every week,
(b) at and after 2 p.m. on Saturday in every week,
(c) at and after 7 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday in every week,
(d) at and after 8 p.m. on Wednesday and Friday in every week,
(e) until 9 a.m. on Saturday in every week, and
(f) until 10 a.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in every week.
(ii) Every hairdressing saloon, barber's shop, laundry, dry-cleaner's shop and dyer's shop situated within any of the areas specified in the

Fifth Schedule hereto shall be closed for the serving of customers—

- (a) until 7 a.m. on each day except Sunday in every week,
(b) at and after 5 p.m. on Saturday in every week,
(c) at and after 7 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in every week, and
(d) throughout Sunday in every week.";
- (3) in paragraph 3, by the substitution, for all the words from "whether" to "Third Schedule", of the words "and situated in any area specified in any of the Schedules";
- (4) in paragraph 4—
(a) by the substitution, for the words "in the First Schedule or in the Second Schedule or in the Third Schedule", of the words "in any of the Schedules";
(b) by the substitution, in sub-paragraph (b) thereof, for the words "five hours", of the following:—
"ten hours in the case of a hairdressing saloon, barber's shop, laundry, dry-cleaner's shop or dyer's shop and five hours in the case of any other shop"; and
(c) by the substitution, in sub-paragraph (c) thereof, for the words "nine hours", of the following:—

(ii) by the addition at the end of that paragraph of the words "Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia".
- (7) in the Third Schedule thereto, in paragraph (1) thereof, by the omission of the word "Kadugannawa"; and
(8) by the addition, immediately after the Third Schedule, of the following new Schedules—

The Quarantine Regulations, 1930, published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 12,125 of May 6, 1960, are hereby amended by the substitution, in Part V thereof, for regulations 69, 70 and 71, of the following regulations:—

" Vaccination Certificate Requirements for International Travel

69. No person shall enter Ceylon by steamer or air or rail via Mandapam and Talaimannar unless he has in his possession—

- (i) a valid certificate of immunisation against smallpox in Form C set out in the Third Schedule hereto;
- (ii) a valid certificate of immunisation against cholera in Form A set out in Third Schedule hereto, if such person not being a child under one year of age, is arriving from any infected country; and
- (iii) a valid certificate of immunisation against yellow fever in Form B set out in Third Schedule hereto, if he is arriving from any infected country.

70. Any person without a valid certificate of immunisation is liable to be kept under quarantine for the requisite period on his arrival in Ceylon. Where such person arrives by rail via Mandapam, South India, he will not be issued the Clearance Certificate to board the steamer at Dhanushkodi, which will be issued by the Medical Officer at Mandapam Camp railway station only to those passengers who satisfy the requirements of the Ceylon Government Quarantine Department.

71. Any person arriving by steamer or air or rail via Mandapam from any infected country may, notwithstanding that he is in possession of valid certificate of immunisation, be liable to be kept under surveillance for the requisite period."

**CONTROL OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC AT THE RAILWAY
LEVEL CROSSING ON AVISSAWELLA ROAD AT
URUGODAWATTA**

WITH effect from 28th June, 1962, the existing wooden gates at the above level crossing will be removed and MOTOR WORKED BARRIERS (of the Toll-Bar Type), will be installed. The roadway over the level crossing would be divided into a dual carriage way with colour light road signals for the control of vehicular traffic. Drivers of all vehicles shall obey the light signals which will operate in accordance with the following system :—

1. At a distance of 15 feet ahead of each barrier, a white line hereinafter called the STOP LINE drawn across the highway is provided in conjunction with each road light signal.

2. At a distance of 9 feet to the rear of the stop line, a Colour Light signal consisting of three lamps, one Red, one Amber and one Green, facing the stream of traffic which the signal is intended to control is erected.

3. The lamps are arranged vertically, with the lamp showing the red light being the uppermost and that showing the green light the lowermost.

4. The sequence of the signal lights for the purpose of controlling vehicular traffic will be as follows :—

- (i) Red with the word "STOP" on the lense of the lamp.
- (ii) Amber and Red together.
- (iii) Green with the word "GO" on the lense of the lamp.
- (iv) Amber.

5. The significance of the light signals aforesaid is as follows :—

- (i) The Red signal indicates that no vehicular traffic is to proceed beyond the stop line until the Green signal is shown.
- (ii) The Amber with Red signal indicates an impending change in the signal from Red to Green ; but does not alter the prohibitory significance of the red signal.
- (iii) The Green signal indicates that traffic may pass the signal and proceed straight on with due regard to the safety of other users of the highway and subject to any directions which may be given by a Police officer or other duly authorised person engaged in the regulation of traffic.
- (iv) The Amber signal shown alone indicates an impending change in the signal to Red and shall be taken as prohibiting all traffic from proceeding beyond the STOP LINE.

6. If and when these light signals be defective, drivers of all vehicles shall obey hand signals exhibited at the level crossing gate.
