Africa, North-east—Red Sea, Eastern Shore—Kamaran Bay Approach—Bank North-eastward of Okban.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 168 of 1897) that the Master of the Rotterdam Lloyd steam-vessel Borneo reports that on February 5, 1897, he passed a bank or reef, at the southern end of which the depth was apparently 7 to 8 fathoms, situated in a position with peak of Okban bearing S. 49° W., distant about 3½ miles; and peak of Kotamah N. 38° W.

From this position the bank trended in a N.N.E direction.

Approximate position, south end of bank: lat. 15° 33' 30" N., long. 42° 23' 10" E.

Variation, 3° westerly in 1897.

Africa, North-east—Red Sea, Eastern Shore—Sunken Rocks in Kamaran Bay.

The British admiralty has given notice (No. 170 of 1897) of the existence of the under-mentioned rocks in Kamaran bay:—

1. A depth of one fathom in a position with Ras Harifih bearing N. 84° E., distant about 3¼ miles; and point westward of Jebel Mahasin S. 22° E.

Approximate position: lat. 15° 21' 45" N., long. 42° 37' 30" E.

2. A depth of 3½ fathoms, in a position with Ras Harifih, bearing N. 79° E., distant about 4 miles; and point westward of Jebel Mahasin S. 35° E.

Variation, 3° westerly in 1897.

China Sea—Malay Peninsula—Lights at Endau and Rumpin Rivers discontinued.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 174 of 1897) that the light (fixed white) at the entrance to Endau river, and the light (fixed blue) at the entrance to Rumpin river, have been discontinued.

Approximate position, Endau light : lat. $2^{\circ} 40' N.$,
long. $103^{\circ} 37' E.$

Approximate position, Rumpin light : lat. $2^{\circ} 49\frac{1}{2}' N.$,
long. $103^{\circ} 28' E.$

BENGAL.—No. 89.

*Africa, East Coast—Birikau River (Port Durnford)—
Beacons at entrance.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 176 of 1897) that the under-mentioned two pairs of beacons have been erected on either side of the entrance to Birikau river to facilitate the navigation over the bar :

Each beacon consists of an iron framework, 8 or 9 ft. high, surmounted by a white triangle.

1. Yunda point beacons.—The front beacon is situated on the coast, with Birikau flagstaff bearing No. $63^{\circ} W.$, distant $9\frac{1}{2}$ cables ; and centre of Kuapisi island S. $54^{\circ} W.$ Approximate position : lat. $1^{\circ} 13' 20'' S.$, long. $41^{\circ} 51' 10'' E.$

The rear beacon bears N. $27^{\circ} W.$, distant 110 yards from the front beacon.

2. Birikau beacons.—The front beacon is situated with Birikau flagstaff bearing S. $20^{\circ} W.$, distant about half a cable ; and Yunda point S. $55^{\circ} E.$

The rear beacon bears N. $47^{\circ} W.$, distant 540 yards from the front beacon.

Caution.—It is not known whether proper supervision over these beacons can be carried out.

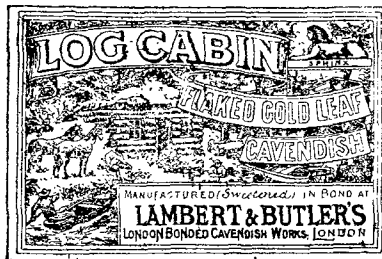

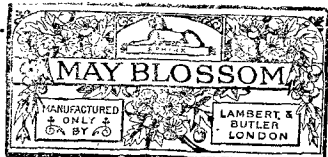
