It is moored on the contour 20-fathom line, magnetic, south of the rock.

Africa, North-East—Red Sea, Western Shore—North Massawa Channel Approach—Search for certain dangers.

The following Notice to Mariners (No. 274 of 1897) issued by the British Admiralty is re-published:—

The under-mentioned information relating to a recent search for King Arthur shoal and Akbar rock, and an examination of Gannet bank, has been received from Lieutenant and Commander H. J. Gedge, H.M. surveying vessel Stork:—

1. King Arthur Shoal.—With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 205 of 1889, on the steam-vessel King Arthur striking on a shoal with a depth of about 2½

fathoms on it, reported to be situated in approximately lat. 17° 10' N., long. 39° 10' E.:

In the search by the Stork for this danger the least water obtained was ten fathoms, in approximately lat. 17° 8' N., long. 39° 8' E.; it is, however, considered probable that the rock exists and is small. Consequently the words "Rock reported hereabout" have been retained on Admiralty Chart against the above position of the ten fathoms.

2. Akbar Rock.—With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 448 of 1892, on the steam-vessel Akbar (draught 20 ft.) touching on a shoal in a position (considered very doubtful) in lat. 16° 47' N., long. 39° 12' E.:

This rock was not found by the Stork, the least depth obtained being ten fathoms, in approximately lat. 16° 44' 30' N., long. 39° 12' 45' E. In this case also it is considered probable that the rock exists and is small. Consequently the words "Rock reported hereabout" have been written on the Admiralty Chart against the above position of the ten fathoms.

3. Gannet Bank.—A coral head with a least depth of 3½ fathoms over it, was found on Gannet bank; and the position of this head was determined to be about 1½ mile, N.W., from its previously charted position, or approximately in lat. 16° 59' 55' N., long. 39° 12' 25' E.

This bank is about 6 cables in length north and south, and 3 cables in breadth, within the 5-fathom line, deepening quickly to the westward and southward, and having soundings less than ten-fathoms for some distance from it in other directions.

Class No. 15.—Glass.

Class No. 16.—Porcelain and earthenware.

Class No. 17.—Manufactures from mineral and other substances for building or decoration.

Class No. 18.—Engineering, architectural, and building contrivances.

Class No. 19.—Arms, ammunition, and stores not included in class 20.

Class No. 20.—Explosive substances.

Class No. 23.—Cotton yarn and thread.

Class No. 24.—Cotton piece goods of all kinds.

Class No. 25.—Cotton goods not included in classes 23, 24, or 38.

Class No. 26.—Linen and hemp, yarn and thread.

Class No. 27.—Linen and hemp piece goods.

Class No. 28.—Linen and hemp goods not included in classes 26, 27, and 50.

Class No. 31.—Silk piece goods.

Class No. 32.—Other silk goods not included in classes 30 and 31.

Class No. 33.—Yarns of wool, worsted or hair.

Class No. 34.—Cloths and stuffs of wool, worsted or hair.

Class No. 35.—Woollen and worsted and hair goods not included in classes 33 and 34.

Class No. 36.—Carpets, floor cloth, and oilcloth.

Class No. 37.—Leather, skins unwrought and wrought, and articles made of leather not included in other classes.

Class No. 38.—Articles of clothing.

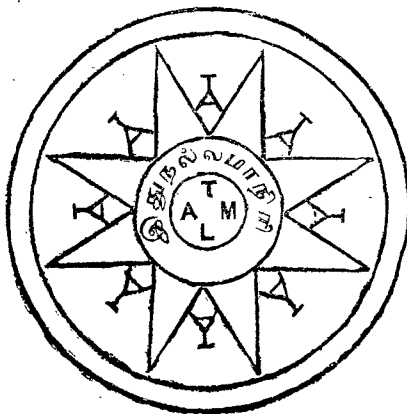
Class No. 39.—Paper (except paper hangings), stationery, and bookbinding.

Class No. 40.—Goods manufactured from indiarubber and guttapercha not included in other classes.

Class No. 47.—Candles, common soap, detergents, illuminating, heating, or lubricating oils, matches, and starch, blue, and other preparations for laundry purposes.

Class No. 49.—Games of all kinds and sporting articles not included in other classes.

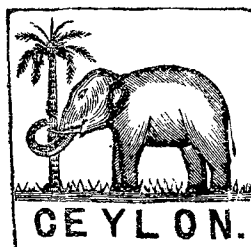
Class No. 50.—Goods manufactured from ivory, bone, or wood not included in other classes. Goods manufactured from straw or grass not included in other classes. Goods manufactured from animal and vegetable substances not included in other classes. Tobacco pipes. Umbrellas, walking-sticks, brushes, and combs. Furniture, cream, plate powder. Tarpaulins, tents, rick-cloths, rope, twine. Buttons of all kinds other than of precious metal or imitations thereof. Packing and hose of all kinds. Goods not included in the foregoing classes:—
