The Order made under regulation 4 of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations, and published in the Supplement to Gazette, No. 8,855 of January 30, 1942 (as amended by any subsequent Order), is hereby further amended, in the Schedule thereto, as follows:—

(1) by the insertion, immediately after item 23E, of the following new item:— "23F. Cigarette tobacco .. I .. F"; and

(2) by the substitution, for item 24, of the following new item :

"/24. Tobacco (unmanufactured) other than cigarette tobacco .. F". L. D.—B. 22/59.

THE EMPLOYEES' HOLIDAYS ACT, No. 6 OF 1969

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Labour and Nationalised Services by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 17 of the Employees' Holidays Act, No. 6 of 1959, and approved by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

Regulations

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Employees' Etolidays Regulations, 1960.
- 2. (i) The remuneration which an employer is liable to pay to any employee in respect of any day allowed as a holiday under section 3 or section 4 of the Act to that employee shall—
 - (a) (i) where that employee is entitled to be paid remuneration for work at a time rate, be not less than the remuneration which that employee would have been entitled to had that day been not a holiday and that employee had worked for the normal period of work for that day;
 - of work for that day;

 (ii) where that employee is entitled to be paid remuneration for work at a piece rate, be not less than the average remuneration earned by that employee in the remuneration period in which that day occurs, or, if no work is done in the remuneration period in which that day occurs, in the preceding remuneration period during which work was last performed by that employee, the average being obtained by dividing the total remuneration for the days actually worked by the number of such days; or
 - (iii) where that employee is entitled to be paid as remuneration for work, the amount calculated at a time rate or the amount calculated at a piece rate, whichever amount is the greater amount, be not less than the average remuneration earned by that employee in the remuneration period in which that day occurs, or if no work is done in the remuneration period in which that day occurs, in the preceding remuneration period during which work was last performed by that employee, the average being obtained by dividing the total remuneration for the days actually worked during the remuneration period by the number of such days.
- (2) The remuneration payable in respect of any day allowed as a holiday under section 3 or section 4 of the Act shall be paid with the remuneration for the remuneration period in which that day occurs.
- (3) For the purposes of this regulation, the remuneration period in relation to an employee shall—
 - (a) in a case where the employer is required under the provisions of any written law to fix the period in respect of which remuneration for work is payable to such employee, be such period; and
 - (b) in any other case, be the period commencing on the first day of a month and ending on the last day of that month.
- 3. Every employer of employees to whom a Holiday Order under section 2 of the Act applies shall keep exhibited in the place where such employees are employed a notice showing the holidays allowed to such employees under the Holidays Order and the class or description of employees specified in such Holidays Order.
- 4. Where any employer is under any written law required to maintain any register or record relating to remuneration and hours of work of his employees, he shall include in such register or record particulars of every holiday allowed to his employees under the provisions of the Act and the amount of remuneration paid in respect of that holiday and, where the Commissioner of Labour has, under the provisions of section 4 of the Act, permitted any employee to be employed on any day declared to be a holiday by a Holidays Order and the employer has not allowed to such employee a holiday in lieu thereof, the amount of remuneration paid to such employee for his employment on that holiday. that holiday.
- 5. For the purposes of section 7 of the Act every Labour Officer shall be a prescribed officer.
- 6. Every notice required to be given under section 10 of the Act shall be substantially in the Form set out in the Schedule
- 7. The Act shall not apply to employees employed on any ork which is usually performed by the day or by the job or by the journey.
- 8. In these regulations "Act" means the Employees' Holidays Act, No. 6 of 1959.

THE AWARD

This is an Award in an industrial dispute between The Ceylon Air Transport Employees' Union, 240, Manthrimulla, Attidiya, Dehiwala, hereinafter referred to as the "Union" and The Indian Airlines Corporation, Gaffoor Building, Colombo 1, hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation".

- 2. By his Order dated 24th October, 1960, made under section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, Chapter 131 of the Legislative Enactments, Ceylon (Revised Edition), as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957, and No. 4 of 1962, the Minister of Labour and Nationalised Services referred the said dispute to this Court for settlement.
- 3. According to the statement of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour, the matters in dispute between the Union and the Corporation are as follows:—
 - (1) The following demands made by the aforesaid Union:-
 - (a) Formulation of a wage and salaries structure which will be on par with that of the national airline; such formulation to be made in such a manner that the basic salaries, salary scales, designations, gradings and so on would be identical with those of the national airline.
 - (b) Mr. D. A. Gomes to be promoted with retrospective effect to the post of Chief Cashier which fell vacant in November, 1956, on the resignation of Mr. A. J. de Saram.
 - (c) Mr. D. F. O. Perera to be promoted with retrospective effect to the post of Senior Leading Hand which fell vacant on the transfer of Mr. M. K. Mahajan.
 - (d) Mr. D. R. Gurusinghe to be promoted with retrospective effect to the post of Chief Traffic Assistant
 which fell vacant in November, 1959, on the promotion of Mr. W. W. Dissanayake to an Officer cadre.
 - (e) (i) Salary due to Mr. C. Sarnelis Fonseka for work performed by him as Head Peon should be paid with retrospective effect.
 - (ii) The restoration to Mr. C. Sarnelis Fonseka of the allowance of Rs. 5 for banking work during the period 1955-1958.
 - (f) Removal of the salary anomaly of driver-mechanic Mr. R. A. D. Perera. Mr. Perera should be placed on an appropriate point in the salary scale and arrears paid to him.
 - (g) Increase in the age of retirement and the granting of a gratuity on retirement.
 - (h) Any employee called upon to perform duties other than his normal duties should be remunerated.
 - (i) Festival advances should be recovered in small instalments.
 - (j) A shift allowance of 25 per cent. of the basic wage for all employees who work on shifts to be granted.
 - (k) Rent allowance of peons, loaders, porters and cleaners should be increased to Rs. 10.
 - (l) A suitable medical officer should be appointed.
 - (m) Removal of anomalies in the I. A. C. categorisation of employees at Colombo with effect from 1st January, 1955.
 - (n) Elimination of factors that have caused stagnation in pay and position of staff at Colombo.
 - (o) Paying up of allowances now withheld; the fixing of proper rates for existing allowances, and the granting of other allowances.
 - (p) Increase in the number and items of uniforms now "issued; and the issue of uniforms to the two employees at Colombo now deprived of uniforms.
 - (q) Improving the existing items of staff welfare and ensuring their implementation, and the granting of other welfare facilities.
 - (r) Drivers should be exempted from assuming responsibility for the safe custody of freight in the freight coach.
 - (s) Porters/Cleaners should be relieved of the duty of removing the Ground Power Unit as this work is injurious to their health.
 - (t) Outstation allowance to drivers during Katunayake operation.
 - (2) The Union's allegations of victimisation of Messrs. D. R. Gurusinghe, M. M. M. Shankar and A. L. T. Ponnuswamy.

- 4. At the hearing before us Mr. Advocate Nimal Senanayake with Mr. Celsus Perera, instructed by Mr. T. D. N. de Silva, appeared for the Union, Mr. Advocate G. E. Chitty, Q.C., with Mr. Elmo B. Vanniathamby, instructed by Messrs. F. J. & G. de Saram, appeared for the Corporation.
- 5. We regret to record the death of Mr. C. V. Ranawake, the third member of the Court, before the proceedings were over. He had taken a great interest in the dispute and we are sorry that we did not have his services in determining this award.
- 6. The Indian Airlines Corporation is a State Corporation with its headquarters in India. It has a Branch Office in Colombo where the majority of the employees are Ceylonese.

where the majority of the employees are Ceylonese.

There were in Ceylon a number of Indian Companies which operated airlines. In India, immediately after the last war, the Indian Government considered it desirable that a nationalised undertaking should be formulated to attend to all aviation work. Two companies were formed, namely, The Air India International and the Indian Airlines Corporation. The air routes to Ceylon were taken over by the Indian Airlines Corporation. The process of amalgamation various employees of private companies enjoying different privileges were absorbed in the Corporation. For the purpose of revising salaries and terms and conditions the Indian Government appointed a Services Committee which finalised its Report in 1954. The Report laid down the principle that nobody should be deprived of his existing rights; but, there were certain difficulties in fitting the various employees into the different grades. The Services Committee recommended that with regard to Colombo and the other stations outside India it might be necessary to formulate a special basic wage taking into consideration the living conditions in these places. But, as a matter of fact, the employees in Colombo were paid the same basic wage as employees of the same grade in India. They continued to receive the same allowance till 1957, although there was a great disparity in calculating the living allowance according to Indian rates and Ceylon rates. For instance an employee who was entitled to a basic wage of Rs. 70 received, in India, an allowance of Rs. 41. In Ceylon, on the other hand, an employee in receipt of a salary of Rs. 70 received an allowance of Rs. 75. The Ceylonese employees of the Indian Airlines made several representations and in March, 1957, it was decided that these employees should be granted the same living silowances Ceylonese were entitled to in Ceylon.

7. The employees continued to make representations that the

- 7. The employees continued to make representations that the 7. The employees continued to make representations that the basic wages should be increased and brought into line with the basic wages paid to comparative grades in Air Ceylon. But, this request was not entertained by the Corporation. When this question came up for discussion before us Mr. Chitty mentioned that the Corporation was prepared to give these employees the same basic wages as were prevalent in Air Ceylon, but he mentioned that at present employees in the Corporation received certain benefits which employees in Air Ceylon did not receive. For instance, Peons and Loaders were given a small house allowance, whereas no house allowance was paid to employees in Air Ceylon. Mr. Senanayake, on behalf of the Union, mentioned that the employees were prepared to forego any allowances which were not paid to employees of Air Ceylon.
- 8. During the pendency of these proceedings the Corporation made certain offers to pay the employees certain higher wages as a result of negotiations which had been conducted with the employees in India. These offers were not accepted by the Union.
- 9. We have considered very carefully the various matters that were mentioned and we consider that the employees of the Corporation should be graded in the same manner as employees in Air Ceylon and that they should receive the same salaries. We have considered carefully the grade into which each employee in the Corporation should be placed and the salary point which he would receive as from 1st October, 1960. The present grades and salaries applicable to Air Ceylon are given in the Schedule annexed to this Award.
- 10. It was mentioned in evidence that the Corporation does not employ peons but that as there was insufficient work for a peon, peons were employed as loaders, etc. We would therefore combine H. I and H. II into one grade, the salary scale starting at Rs. 40 and ending at Rs. 110 with increments of Rs. 60 per annum.
- 11. In view of our decisions above the various employees would be placed in the categories mentioned below, with the salaries indicated against each name.
 - Mr. C. S. Fonseka-H. I-Salary Rs. 95 p.m.
- Mr. S. S. Perera, Mr. A. S. Dabare, Mr. A. Somapala, Mr. A. Peter Perera—H. I—Salary Rs. 90 p.m.
- Mr. A. Simon Perera, Mr. W. J. Fernando, Mr. L. Wilson, fr. E. C. Fernando, Mr. D. W. Fernando, H. I.—Salary Mr. E. C. Rs. 90 p.m.
- Mr H. L. Silva, Mr. P. R. H. Perera, Mr. H. Amaradasa-H. I.—Salary Rs. 90 p.m.
- Mr. R. A. D. Perera, Mr. P. K. Jinadasa, Mr. E. K. Fernando,—The salary scale for drivers in Air Ceylon is Rs. 90 to Rs. 160. In the Corporation the maximum salary of drivers

- was much higher. They were offered Rs. 190, Rs. 200, and Rs. 190 by the Corporation. It was mentioned that Mr. R. A. D. Perera was actually senior to Mr. P. K. Jinadasa but by some error Mr. Jinadasa had been paid a higher salary. Our Award is that the persons recruited as drivers in future should be remunerated on the scale Rs. 90 to Rs. 160 by 7 increments of Rs. 10, but these three employees should receive Rs. 200 per mensem each from 1st October, 1960, and will not be entitled to increments.
- Mr. S. M. de A. Samaranayake and M. M. M. Shankar will be placed in Grade F. II, on the salary scale Rs. 100—Rs. 200 with annual increments of Rs. 10. Each of them will draw Rs. 130 from 1st October, 1960.
- Mr. A. H. Chandradasa and Mr. G. H. Morrias will also be placed in the same grade, F. 2, from 1st October, 1960. Mr. Chandradasa will draw Rs. 150 per month from 1st October, 1960, and Mr. Morrias Rs. 130 per month.
- Mr. T. J. Peiris and Mr. D. R. Gurusinghe will be placed in Grade E. I, on the scale Rs. 220—Rs. 400 with annual increments of Rs. 15. Mr. Peiris will be entitled to receive Rs. 265 per month from 1st October, 1960, and Mr. Gurusinghe Rs. 250 per month from 1st October, 1960.
- Mr. H. Hughes will be placed in Grade E. II, on the scale Rs. 200—Rs. 300 by increments of Rs. 10, and will be entitled to a salary of Rs. 200 per month from 1st October, 1960.
- Mr. D. F. O. Perera is, we consider, a very capable and industrious worker. He has had a special training and deserves better treatment than he has had so far. He will be placed in Grade D. H on the salary scale Rs. 300—Rs. 480 with annual increments of Rs. 15. He will be entitled to a salary of Rs. 375 per month from 1st October, 1960.
- Mr. E. V. Harris will be placed in Grade D. II, on the salary scale Rs. 300—Rs. 480 with annual increments of Rs. 15. He will receive a salary of Rs. 360 per month from 1st October,
- Mr. A. L. T. Ponnuswamy will be placed in Grade E. I, on the scale Rs. 220—Rs. 400 with annual increments of Rs. 15. He will be entitled to a salary of Rs. 295 per month from 1st
- Mr. M. Canagaratnam and Mr. H. R. H. Dissanayake will be placed in Grade D. II on the salary scale Rs. 300—Rs. 480 with annual increments of Rs. 15. Each of them will receive a salary of Rs. 375 per month from 1st October, 1960.
- 12. The demand 1 (b) with regard to Mr. D. A. Gomes was dropped, as he had been discontinued from the service of the Corporation prior to the date on which this dispute was referred
- Demand 1 (c): There is no grade of Senior Leading Hand in Air Ceylon. We have placed Mr. D. F. O. Perera in grade D. II which is the appropriate grade in Air Ceylon for Senior Mechanics.
- Demand 1 (d): We are unable to grant this demand. The mere fact that there was a Chief Traffic Assistant in 1959 does not mean that at all times there should be a Chief Traffic Assistant. The Corporation is entitled to reorganise its staff according to the exigencies of the service.
- Demand 1 (e) (i) & (ii): It is not possible for us to make an order with effect from any date before this present dispute arosc. The demands 1 (c) (i) and 1 (c) (ii) are rejected.
- Demand 1 (f): We have adjusted the salary of Mr. R. A. D. Perera at an appropriate point. We do not consider that he should be paid any arrears prior to 1st October, 1960.
- Demand 1 (g): At present, in Air Ceylon, an employee can retire at 55 years, but he may be continued in service till he is 60 years of age. The Corporation agreed that the same terms will apply to employees of the Corporation in future.
- Demand I (h): Ordinarily an employee who attends to the work of an absent officer is remunerated if he works overtime. If, however, he is able to attend to the duties of himself and the other officer within his normal hours of duty he is not entitled to extra remuneration. When an office falls vacant and an officer is not fully competent to be appointed to that office he is appointed to act for certain periods. In such a case an appropriate allowance should be granted to the acting officer for attending to work of greater responsibility.
- Demand 1 (i): It was agreed that in future Festival Advances would be recovered in six monthly instalments.
- Demand 1 (i): This demand was dropped in view of the fact that the employees would be paid the same rates of pay as employees of Air Ceylon.

Demand 1 (k): No rent allowance is paid to employees of Air Ceylon. This demand was therefore dropped.

Demand 1 (1): It was mentioned that a medical officer had been appointed.

Demand I (m): It is not possible for us to give effect to any variation of salaries or grades from January, 1955. We have made the necessary amendments as from 1st October, 1960.

Demand 1 (n): The demand was an extremely vague one and the only point that was urged was that in certain cases when a senior officer was appointed to a higher post his post was not immediately filled. It is difficult to lay down exactly when a particular post should be filled but we have no doubt that in future all vacancies will be filled unless there is some special reason why a particular post should not be filled.

Demand I (o): The question of allowances would not arise in view of our decision that in future all employees of the Corporation will receive the same salaries and allowances as employees in Air Ceylon.

Demand 1 (p): With regard to uniforms our award is that the employees will receive the same number of uniforms as are issued to employees in Air Ceylon.

Demand 1 (q): This demand was dropped.

Demand 1 (r): At present the drivers of vehicles have to be responsible for the safe custody of parcels entrusted to them. The number of parcels appeared to be small and we do not consider that a separate officer should be appointed to take charge of the parcels and deliver them after they have been passed by Customs Officers. The demand is rejected.

Demand 1 (s): No evidence has been placed before us that the work done in removing the Ground Power Unit was injurious to the health of the employees. This demand is therefore rejected.

Demand 1 (t): At present the planes of the Corporation come to Ratmalana only. Thus the question of an allowance to drivers who work at Katunayake does not arise.

Demand 2: The demand with regard to victimisation was withdrawn.
